THE OPENING TIP

- The Blue Devils are ranked No. 3 in the AP Poll and the USA Today Coaches Poll. Duke is 1-1 this season and 110-23 overall when ranked No. 3 in the country.
- The Blue Devils have been ranked in the AP top 10 for 110 consecutive weeks. Duke had been ranked in the top five in 14 of the 17 polls this season.
- Duke is playing its 205th straight game as a top-10 team in the AP poll. Duke is 170-34 in that span.
- Head coach **Mike Krzyzewski** ranks third for most wins by a coach at one school with 878 career victories at Duke. He is one win shy of tying Dean Smith for second on that list.
- The Blue Devils are one league win shy of winning 12 or more ACC games for the fourth straight season.
- Duke is the only team in the top 5 of the Associated Press Poll (No. 3), Coaches Poll (No. 3), NCAA RPI (No. 1) and Strength of Schedule index (No. 2).

The Last Time Out

- Virginia guard Joe Harris scored 36 points to lead the Cavaliers to a 73-68 upset over No. 3 Duke in Charlottesville Thursday. Harris grabbed seven rebounds, including four offensive, while adding two blocks, a steal and an assist. Harris shot 12-of-20 from the floor, 2-of-5 from three-point range and 10-of-12 from the free throw line.
- Harris' performance was enough to overcome a 28-point effort from Duke's **Seth Curry** and a 22-point showing from **Quinn Cook**.
- Virginia led by as much as 16 points with less than seven minutes remaining before Duke closed the gap to seven points with 40 seconds left. Cook scored 11 points in the final two minutes to cut the deficit.
- Virginia outrebounded Duke 36-25 and scored 18 points on second-chance opportunities.
- Duke outscored Virginia 24-9 from three-point range, but Virginia outscored Duke 34-22 in the paint.

Numbers Game

● Head coach Mike Krzyzewski is one win shy of matching Dean Smith for the second-most wins at one school. Coach K is also one win shy of joining Smith as the only coaches in league history to amass 400 or more ACC victories.

● Duke, ranked No. 3 in the latest AP Poll, has been ranked in the top 10 of the poll 110 consecutive weeks. The last time Duke was not ranked in the top 10 was Nov. 19, 2007.

● Duke is the only team in the top 5 of the Associated Press Poll (No. 3), Coaches Poll (No. 3), NCAA RPI (No. 1) and Strength of Schedule index (No. 2). Miami and Louisville are the only schools to rank in the top 10 in all four polls.

● Duke is 14-0 in Cameron Indoor Stadium this season. The Blue Devils have gone undefeated at home 16 times, including nine under Coach K.

● The Blue Devils lead the ACC in three-point percentage (.411) and three-point field goals per game (7.7 3pg.). The .411 clip would rank as the third-best in school history.

● Duke is on a four-game win streak over top-5 teams with wins over No. 2 Louisville, No. 3 Kentucky and No. 4 Ohio State this season as well as last year's 85-84 win over No. 5 North Carolina. Duke has won five of its last six games over teams ranked in the top 5 of the AP poll.

● Mason Plumlee is tied for the ACC lead with 16 double-doubles on the year. Plumlee is averaging 17.3 points and 10.5 rebounds per game and is attempting to become the second Blue Devil (joining Shelden Williams in 2005 & 2006) under Coach K to average a double-double for a season.

● Seth Curry has scored in double figures in 10 straight contests, including six games with 20+ points in that span. He is averaging 19.6 points per game, while shooting 44.9 percent (27-of-61) from three-point range over the last 10 outings.

● Rasheed Sulaimon is shooting .475 (28-of-59) from three-point range at home this season. He has hit multiple three-pointers and shot .500 or better from long range in four of his last five home games.

● Duke is one win shy of posting 25 or more victories for the sixth straight season and the 22nd time overall under Mike Krzyzewski. One more win would also give Duke 12 ACC victories for the fourth straight season.

Duke-Miami Series History

- Duke and Miami have met 19 times leading into Saturday's meeting with the Blue Devils holding a 15-4 lead in the series.
- Duke is 7-1 against Miami in Cameron Indoor Stadium. Six of those eight meetings have been decided by 10 or more points.
- Duke has won 15 of the last 18 meetings with Miami but has lost two straight. Duke has never lost back-to-back meetings against Miami.
- Duke is 15-3 against Miami under Coach K.
- In the first meeting of the 2012-13 season between Duke and Miami, the Hurricanes held Duke to .297 shooting from the field on the way to a 90-63 win in Coral Gables, Fla. Duke hit just 4-of-23 (.174) shots from three-point range in the loss while Miami 9-of-19 (.474) from beyond the arc.
- Freshmen Amile Jefferson and Rasheed Sulaimon combined to score 29 points in the last meeting against Miami with Sulaimon netting 16 and Jefferson 13. Redshirt freshman Alex Murphy scored 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting and grabbed five rebounds.

- **Mike Krzyzewski** is the winningest coach in NCAA Division I history with 951 career victories. He passed mentor Bob Knight with a 74-69 win over Michigan State at Madison Square Garden Nov. 15, 2011 in the Champions Classic.
- With 878 wins as the Duke head coach, Krzyzewski ranks third all-time in wins at one school behind only Dean Smith (879) and Jim Boeheim (911).
- Krzyzewski is the winningest coach in NCAA Tournament history with 79 tournament wins.
- Krzyzewski ranks second all-time in ACC history with 399 conference wins.

- Seniors **Mason Plumlee** (1,252) and **Seth Curry** (1,248) became members of Duke's 1,000-point club this season. Classmate **Ryan Kelly** (858) is also within reach of becoming the 63rd Duke player to reach that mark.
- Only three other trios have each topped the 1,000-point plateau during the same season at Duke (Kyle Singler, Jon Scheyer & Gerald Henderson in 2008-09; J.J. Redick, Daniel Ewing & Chris Duhon in 2003-04; Phil Henderson, Robert Brickey & Alaa Abdelnaby in 1989-90).

Scoring by Starters

- Duke has the most productive starting lineup in the country with an average of 68.0 points per game coming from the starting five.
- The group has combined to account for 86.7 percent of Duke's total scoring this season, which is the second highest clip in the nation.
- Duke's starters have scored 49 or more points in every game this season, including a season-high 92 in a 98-85 win over N.C. State on Feb. 7.
- All five Duke starters have scored in double figures three times this season, while at least four have scored 10 or more points 14 times.

Plumlee Posting Impressive Numbers

- **Mason Plumlee** ranks second in the ACC and eighth nationally in rebounding (10.5) and tied for second in the league in scoring (17.3). He also ranks among the national leaders in field goal percentage (7th, .592), defensive rebounds (t-4th, 7.6) and double-doubles (t-5th, 16).
- Plumlee is one of 15 players nationally averaging a double-double on the season.
- Plumlee has scored in double figures in 25 of 28 games with seven 20+ point games and two 30+ point games.
- Plumlee ranks fourth in the NCAA in field goal percentage (.592) among players with 10 or more field goal attempts per game.
- Plumlee ranks tied for eighth in the nation with 7.6 free throw attempts per game.
- Plumlee was named the National Player of the Month for November by ESPN.com after averaging 19.9 points and 11.0 rebounds for the Blue Devils with four double-doubles over Duke's first seven games. Plumlee was named USBWA National Player of the Week on Feb. 12 after averaging 24.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in wins over N.C. State and Boston College.

Curry Producing Despite Nagging Injuries

• Senior **Seth Curry** is tied for second in the ACC in scoring at 17.3 points per game despite being limited in practice throughout the season with a right leg injury, missing the Delaware game Dec. 1 with a left ankle injury and leaving the N.C. State game Jan. 12 early with another injury to the same ankle.

• Curry has scored 10 or more points in 22 contests with a team-high 14 20-point efforts and a career-best 31-point outing against Santa Clara.

• Curry also ranks among the ACC leaders in field goal percentage (9th, .462), three-point field goals (2nd, 2.7 3pg), three-point percentage (3rd, .440) and free throw percentage (3rd, .827).

• Curry was named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 31, 2012 after his performance against Santa Clara.

• Curry has topped the 20-point mark nine times in league play. He is third in scoring (18.1 ppg.) in ACC games only, while shooting 46.1 percent from three-point range and making 3.1 threes per game.

• Over his last 10 games, Curry is averaging 19.6 points per game with six 20-point efforts.

Curry Lethal From Deep & From the FT Line

• **Seth Curry** ranks third in the Duke record books in three-point field goal percentage (.419, 201-of-480) and fifth in free throw percentage (.834, 261-of-313).

• Curry has connected on three or more three-point field goals in 15 games this season and 39 times in his Duke career.

• Curry tied the school single-game three-point percentage record (min. 5 attempts) by going 6-of-7 from beyond the arc on Jan. 17 against Georgia Tech. He finished the game with 24 points.

• Curry is only the 12th Duke player with 200 three-pointers and the fifth to do it within his first three years.

• Curry is the fifth player in Duke history to make 60 or more three-pointers in three straight seasons. Other Blue Devils to accomplish the feat were **Kyle Singler** (2009-11), **J.J. Redick** (2003-06), **Jason Williams** (2000-02) and **Trajan Langdon** (1997-99).

Kelly Nears Return From Foot Injury

- Senior **Ryan Kelly**, sidelined since Jan. 8 with a right foot injury suffered in the win over Clemson, is nearing a return to the court for the Blue Devils. He started Duke's first 15 games, averaging 13.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game.
- Kelly ranked among the ACC leaders in scoring, rebounding, free throw percentage and blocks while shooting a team-high .521 (25-of-48) from three-point range prior to the injury.
- Kelly is among the winningest players in Duke history and owns a 105-13 (.890) record in his Duke career. He ranks third all-time at Duke in career winning percentage.
- In the first three games without Kelly, Duke went 1-2, averaged 70.7 points per game, gave up 77.0 points per game and shot .379 from the floor. In the last 10 games without Kelly, Duke is 8-2 while scoring 79.7 points per game, allowing 68.8 points per game and shooting .498 from the floor.
- Kelly is 146 points shy of joining the 1,000-point club and needs just eight more three-point field goals to become only the second Duke player 6-10 or taller to make 100 or more career threes. He would join **Danny Ferry** on that list.
- Kelly has scored 10+ points in 13 games this season and 40 times in his career. Duke is 39-1 when Kelly scores 10 or more points in a contest.

Cook Emerging at the Point for Blue Devils

- Sophomore **Quinn Cook** has emerged as one of the ACC's best point guards in his second season. He is averaging 12.4 points, 5.4 assists, 3.8 rebounds and 1.6 steals per game.
- Cook is attempting to join **Dick Groat** (1952), **Jason Williams** (2000, 2001) and **Chris Duhon** (2004) as the only players in Duke history to average at least 10.0 points, 6.0 assists and 4.0 rebounds per game.
- A finalist for the Bob Cousy Award, Cook ranks second in the ACC in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.3:1) and fourth in steals.
- Cook was named MVP at the Battle 4 Atlantis where he led Duke to wins over Minnesota, VCU and No. 2 Louisville. Cook averaged 13.7 points, 6.3 assists, 3.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game at the tournament.
- He was named ACC Co-Player of the Week following his efforts at the Battle 4 Atlantis as well.
- Cook has posted double-digit assists in two games this season, including a career-best 14 assists in a Jan. 5 win over Wake Forest.
- Against Clemson on Jan. 8, Cook totaled 27 points, five rebounds, five assists and four steals. It was the third time in school history that a Duke player posted at least 25 points, five rebounds, five assists and four steals in a game.

- Freshman **Amile Jefferson** and sophomore **Josh Hairston** have stepped up in place of injured starter **Ryan Kelly**. Since Kelly went down with a foot injury prior to the N.C. State game on Feb. 7, Jefferson and Hairston have averaged 10.4 points, 6.9 rebounds and 1.2 blocks while shooting .535 (53-of-99) from the floor.
- Prior to Kelly's injury, Jefferson averaged 3.1 points, 1.9 rebounds and 0.3 blocks per game and Hairston averaged 1.7 points, 2.1 rebounds and 0.1 blocks per game.
- Jefferson has scored in double figures five times during that 12-game span, including a career-best 14 points against Boston College Feb. 24. He scored in double figures just once over his first 14 games.
- Hairston has a pair of double figure scoring efforts in Kelly's absence, scoring 11 points against Maryland on Feb. 16 and again at Virginia Tech on Feb. 21.
- Hairston has also taken a team-high 16 charges this season.

Instant Impact in the Backcourt

- Freshman **Rasheed Sulaimon** is one of five Blue Devils scoring in double figures. He is tied for 25th in the ACC (tied for second among freshmen) at 12.1 points per game.
- Sulaimon has scored in double figures 19 times, including 10 times in league play.
- Sulaimon leads all ACC freshmen with 44 made three-pointers and is shooting 39.6 percent from beyond the arc.
- Sulaimon scored a season-best 27 points on 10-of-15 shooting in a Feb. 24 win over Boston College.
- Against Maryland on Jan. 26, Sulaimon hit a Duke freshman record-tying six three-pointers and finished with a career-high 25 points.
- Sulaimon scored 19 points in Duke's win over Florida Gulf Coast. He knocked down three three-pointers in the game and has made multiple treys in eight games this season.
- Sulaimon scored 17 second-half points in Duke's win over Ohio State after being held scoreless in the opening half of play. He was 7-of-10 from the field over the final 20 minutes to help Duke overcome a 10-point deficit.
- Sulaimon has been named ACC Rookie of the Week twice this season (Dec. 3 & Feb. 25).
- Sulaimon earned a start in his first career game, marking the third straight season Duke has started a freshman in the backcourt of the season opener. He is the ninth freshman guard (Dawkins, Amaker, Hurley, Langdon, J. Williams, Scheyer, Irving and Rivers) to start the season opener for **Mike Krzyzewski** at Duke.

Thornton Brings Energy & Defense

- Duke junior point guard **Tyler Thornton** has been a key contributor to Duke's success this season. Thornton has appeared in all 28 games this season, drawing four starts while averaging 21.6 minutes per game. His 21.6 minutes per game is the highest average of any Duke player off the bench.
- The 6-1 sophomore is tied for seventh in the ACC in steals (1.4 spg.), while averaging 3.3 points, 2.2 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game.
- Thornton sparked Duke's comeback win over North Carolina on Feb. 13 with three consecutive made three-pointers. He finished the game with nine points and also had two offensive rebounds in the second half that led directly to five Duke points.
- Thornton, who recorded a career-best 10 assists against Delaware, has been Duke's first option off the bench 11 times.
- Thornton has played in all but three games during his three-year Duke career.
- Thornton was recently named to the Allstate NABC Good Hands Team for his community service involvement with the Read with the Blue Devils program, Duke Children's Hospital and SONS (Students Of New Success) program at CC Spaulding Elementary School.

Balanced Three-Point Shooting

- Duke has four players shooting .400 or better from three-point range – **Ryan Kelly** (.521, 25-of-48), **Seth Curry** (.440, 73-of-166) and **Quinn Cook** (.412, 47-of-114).
- The only other Duke team to have three players shoot .400 or better (minimum 25 made three-pointers) from long range was the 1991-92 NCAA Championship team.

- Duke, in its 108th season of basketball in 2012-13, has compiled a 1,995-838 record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- Duke is five wins shy of joining Kentucky (2,111), Kansas (2,094) and North Carolina (2,085) as the only schools with 2,000 wins all-time.

Cameron Indoor Stadium

- Duke has posted a 798-153 record in Cameron, including a 440-58 mark under Coach K.
- The Blue Devils have 16 undefeated home seasons, including nine under Coach K.
- Duke has won 231 of its last 234 non-conference games at home.
- The Blue Devils have won 247 of their last 265 games in Cameron.

Selling Out

- The Blue Devils have sold out 353 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The last time Duke did not have a sellout at home was Nov. 16, 1990 against Boston College.
- Duke has played in front of a capacity crowd 19 times this season.

Duke on the Road

- Duke has a 246-70 record outside of Cameron Indoor Stadium since the 1997-98 season.
- The Blue Devils are 135-25 in neutral settings and 109-45 in road games played since 1998.
- In ACC play, Duke is 124-42 away from home since 1997-98.

- Duke has been ranked No. 1 five weeks this season. Of the 103 recruited scholarship players to play at Duke under **Mike Krzyzewski**, 95 have been on a team that was ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll for at least one week.
- The last Duke recruiting class to not achieve a No. 1 ranking in the AP poll was the three-man class of Todd Anderson, Jay Bryan and Danny Meagher (1982-85). Those three played as the No. 2 team in the country for nine consecutive weeks during their senior season in 1984-85. Since that class graduated, every one of Coach K's recruiting classes has played as the No. 1 team in the nation for at least one week.

Non-Conference Home Win Streak

- Duke has won a school-record 101 straight non-conference home games, the longest current streak in the NCAA. The last home loss against a non-conference opponent for the Blue Devils was Feb. 26, 2000 against St. John's, 83-82.
- The Blue Devils have won 94 straight home games against unranked non-conference foes.
- Duke won 95 consecutive non-conference home games from Feb. 2, 1983 to Dec. 2, 1995.

Vs. Non-ACC Opponents

- Duke is 475-73 vs. non-conference opponents under **Mike Krzyzewski**, including a 246-11 mark in home games.
- In neutral settings, Duke is 166-42 vs. non-league foes. Duke is 63-20 on the road under Coach K in non-conference tilts.

Wins Over Top-Five Teams

- Duke is 3-0 against teams ranked in the top 5 of the AP poll.
- Duke has wins over No. 2 Louisville, No. 3 Kentucky and No. 4 Ohio State, marking the fifth time in school history (also accomplished in 1965-66, 1985-86, 1990-91 & 1998-99) the Blue Devils have posted three or more wins over top-5 teams. Vic Bubas' 1965-66 team and the 1985-86 NCAA runner-up squad recorded four wins over top-5 opponents.
- Duke recorded three wins over top-five teams (Kentucky, Louisville & Ohio State) in a 16-day span from Nov. 13-28. During the 1965-66 season, Duke topped No. 1 UCLA (twice) and No. 3 Michigan in a 12-day span from Dec. 10-21.
- According to AP research, Duke is the first team to register three wins over top-5 opponents before the start of December.
- With wins over No. 2 Louisville and No. 4 Ohio State in consecutive games, Duke became the first team since Ball State in 2001 to record back-to-back wins over AP top-5 teams
- Duke won back-to-back games against AP top-5 opponents for the second time in school history with wins over No. 2 Louisville and No. 4 Ohio State. Duke also won back-to-back wins over No. 1 UCLA on Dec. 9, 1965 and Dec. 10, 1965.

More on Wins over Top-5 Teams

- Duke is on a four-game win streak over top-5 teams with wins over No. 2 Louisville, No. 3 Kentucky and No. 4 Ohio State this season as well as last year's 85-84 win over No. 5 North Carolina. The four-game win streak is tied for the fourth-longest in program history.
- Duke won six consecutive games over top-5 teams Jan. 19, 1991 to Dec. 5, 1992 and also had four-game streaks from Dec. 10, 1965-March 11, 1966 and from Dec. 3, 2003-Feb. 20.
- With three wins over non-conference top-5 teams, the 2012-13 Blue Devils join Duke's 1965-66 team as the only units to accomplish that feat.
- Duke has won five of its last six games over teams ranked in the top 5 of the AP poll.

National Exposure

- Duke will play at least 27 games on national television (ESPN networks, CBS & NBC Sports) this season.
- All 31 regular season Duke games will be televised with the Blue Devils also appearing on AXS.tv, the ACC Network and Regional Sports Networks this season.

- Duke reeled off a 30-0 run over a 7:25 span in the win over Florida Gulf Coast, marking the most consecutive points scored in a game by Duke.
- Duke went on a 23-0 run to close the first half and turn a 30-29 deficit into a 52-30 lead at intermission. **Ryan Kelly** (10) and **Mason Plumlee** (7) combined for 17 of Duke's points in that span.
- The Blue Devils also recorded a 23-0 run in their Dec. 19 win over Cornell.

Plumlee & Curry Wooden Award Top 25

- Seniors **Mason Plumlee** and **Seth Curry** were named to the John R. Wooden Player of the Year Award Midseason Top 25. Duke was one of only three schools (Kansas, Missouri) to place two players on the list.
- Duke has won five Wooden Awards, the most of any school. Past winners of the Wooden Award include Christian Laettner (1992), Elton Brand (1999), Shane Battier (2001), Jason Williams (2002) and J.J. Redick (2006).

Plumlee Named Academic All-America

- For the second straight year, **Mason Plumlee** was named to the Capital One Academic All-America first team.
- Plumlee is the 11th Blue Devil to earn Academic All-America recognition (18 honors). Coach K has now mentored eight Academic All-America honorees, including four first-team selections. Mike Gminski (1978 and 1979), Jim Spanarkel (1978 and 1979) and Shane Battier (2000 and 2001) join Plumlee as Duke's two-time first-team Academic All-America selections.

Duke Inks Two During Early Signing Period

- Duke received national letters of intent from two top-50 prospects with the signing of shooting guard **Matt Jones** and small forward **Semi Ojeleye**.
- Jones, a 6-4, 180-pound guard from DeSoto High School in DeSoto, Texas, is ranked as a top 10 shooting guard by ESPN, Rivals and Scout. Overall, ESPN ranks him as the No. 36 overall prospect, Rivals ranks him 35th overall, and Scout ranks him 30th overall. He plays for Texas powerhouse DeSoto, which enters the 2012-13 season ranked No. 2 in the Texas Coaches 5A Preseason Rankings. As a junior, Jones averaged 19.4 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.6 steals per game. With Jones leading the way, DeSoto has strung together three consecutive 30-win seasons, including a 33-6 record in 2011-12 and an appearance in the Region 2 Final. Jones also played for the Texas Titans and averaged a team-high 17.0 points per game to lead the group to a 15-5 record in the Nike Elite Youth Basketball League and qualify for the Nike Peach Jam. Jones is the younger brother of Jordan Jones, a McDonald's All-American and freshman guard on the Texas A&M women's basketball team.
- Ojeleye, a 6-6, 220-pound product of Ottawa High School in Ottawa, Kansas, is ranked as the No. 10 small forward in the class of 2013 by ESPN and No. 8 at his position by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. Overall, he is the No. 41 prospect in ESPN's ranking, No. 30 by Rivals.com and No. 25 by Scout.com. With Ojeleye leading the way, Ottawa reached the Kansas 4A State Championship game last season and got 32 points from Ojeleye in a 56-52 loss to Basehor-Linwood. Ojeleye averaged 32.5 points per game as a junior while playing all five positions for Ottawa. Ojeleye also played for MoKan Elite, leading the team to the U17 Kansas City Classic title and an appearance in the semifinals of the Nike Elite Youth Basketball Peach Jam. Ojeleye's older brother, Victor, played for Kansas State from 2008-12 and was a team captain.

Tournament Victories Under Krzyzewski

- Duke has had a high level of success in tournaments under Coach K, winning 16 regular-season, 13 ACC and four NCAA Tournaments for a total of 33 tournament championships during his 33-year tenure.
- The Blue Devils own a 75-15 record in regular-season tournaments with 23 consecutive regular-season tournament victories. Duke has won six consecutive in-season tournaments since 2007, including the 2012 Battle 4 Atlantis.

Duke Wins Close Games

- Duke is 5-1 this season in games that are within one possession within the final three minutes of play. Duke has defeated No. 2 Louisville (76-71), No. 3 Kentucky (75-68), No. 4 Ohio State (73-68), Wake Forest (75-70) and Boston College (62-61) in those games while losing in the final three seconds at Maryland (81-83).
- Four of those five wins have come on the road or at neutral sites.
- Against Kentucky in the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Ga., Duke led 64-61 and rode six points from **Seth Curry** in the final three minutes to win 76-68.
- Against Louisville at the Battle 4 Atlantis, Duke led 68-66 with 1:25 remaining before **Quinn Cook** scored eight points the rest of the way to hold on for a 76-71 win.
- Against Ohio State in Cameron, the Buckeyes came back to within two points at 66-64 with 29 seconds remaining, but Cook hit six straight free throws to secure the 73-68 win. Cook scored eight points in the final three minutes that day.
- Against Wake Forest in Winston-Salem, N.C., Curry put Duke ahead 69-66 with a three-pointer at the 3:01 mark and **Mason Plumlee** came through with a layup at the 1:15 mark to put Duke ahead 71-68. **Rasheed Sulaimon** would hit a jumper 46 seconds later to make it a two-possession game in the eventual 75-70 victory.
- Against Boston College on the road, Duke trailed 61-56 with 2:15 remaining before **Quinn Cook** hit a three-pointer and **Mason Plumlee** made three of his last four free throws to put Duke ahead.

Seniors Equal Success for Blue Devils

- **Mike Krzyzewski** has had great success with senior-laden teams throughout his career. The Blue Devils have five seniors on the 2012-13 roster with three as regulars in the starting lineup.
- Seniors **Seth Curry** and **Mason Plumlee** combine to average 34.5 points this season, while fellow senior **Ryan Kelly** averaged 13.4 points and 5.4 rebounds before succumbing to a foot injury prior to the Jan. 12 game versus N.C. State.

Mike Krzyzewski

Head Coach • Army '69 • 38th season (33rd season at Duke)

951-295 overall • 878-236 at Duke

Winning seasons, superb graduation rates for his players and a basketball team that is as close as family are all attributes that reflect on the man who is in his 33rd year as the head coach of the Duke Blue Devils, Hall of Famer **Mike Krzyzewski**.

Coach K became the winningest coach in NCAA Division I history, passing his mentor Bob Knight, with a 74-69 win over Michigan State on Nov. 15, 2011. Krzyzewski now has 951 career wins, while also ranking third in wins at one school (878), second in career ACC wins (399) and first in NCAA Tournament victories (79). He owns a 951-295 career record while attaining an 878-236 mark at Duke.

Krzyzewski's record as Duke's all-time winningest coach offers further evidence of his success: 878 total wins; 503 weeks ranked in the top 25; 442 weeks ranked in the top 10; 109 weeks ranked No. 1; 11 Final Four berths in the last 27 years, including five straight appearances from 1988-92; 29 seasons with at least 20 wins; 12 regular season ACC crowns and 13 Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament titles, including 10 of the last 14 years (a record five in succession from 1999-2003). Coach K has also led the Blue Devils to an NCAA-best 12 seasons with 30 or more wins.

But most impressive are the four National Championships (1991, 1992, 2001 and 2010) that make Coach K one of only three coaches in NCAA history to earn four or more NCAA titles. In addition to Krzyzewski, only John Wooden (10), and Adolph Rupp (4) have accomplished that feat. With back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992, Coach K became the first coach since Wooden in 1972-73 to earn consecutive NCAA crowns. The Blue Devils grabbed their third title in 2001 with an 82-72 win over Arizona in Minneapolis, Minn. Duke defeated Butler, 61-59, in the 2010 championship game in Indianapolis, Ind. to give Krzyzewski his fourth NCAA Championship.

Krzyzewski and the Blue Devils have been a fixture on the national basketball scene with 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament berths from 1996-2012 and 28 in the last 29 years. Overall, he has taken his program to postseason play in 29 of his 32 years and is the winningest active coach in NCAA Tournament play with a stunning 79-24 record for a .767 winning percentage. He also ranks first in NCAA Tournament history in wins (79) and games (103).

From 1999-2002, Duke finished number one in the nation in the final Associated Press poll for a record four consecutive seasons. In 2003-04, the Blue Devils reached the nation's top spot in the AP poll, marking the seventh straight year they had been number one (only UCLA's string of 12 consecutive years reaching No. 1 from 1964-75 was longer).

Krzyzewski has mentored seven National Players of the Year (nine selections), 25 All-Americans (39 selections), eight ACC Players of the Year (10 selections) and 78 All-ACC selections during his tenure at Duke. In the past 14 years, four different Blue Devils — **Elton Brand**, **Shane Battier**, **Jason Williams** (twice) and **J.J. Redick** (twice) — have earned National Player of the Year honors.

Coach K has coached 45 NBA Draft picks, including a record 25 first round selections. An NCAA-best 17 Blue Devils have been NBA Lottery picks with Elton Brand (1999) and Kyrie Irving (2011) being taken No. 1 overall in their respective drafts.

Krzyzewski earned his 900th career victory on March 20, 2011 with a 73-71 win over Michigan in the third round of the NCAA Tournament. On March 1, 2008, Krzyzewski became the sixth coach in Division I history to reach 800 wins with an 87-86 victory at N.C. State. Coach K became just the fifth coach in NCAA history to record 800 wins at one school with a win over Kansas State on Nov. 23, 2010. On Nov. 17, 2000, Krzyzewski earned his 500th win at Duke with a 98-85 triumph over Villanova. That night, the fabled floor of Cameron Indoor Stadium was dedicated as Coach K Court. On Feb. 13, 2010, Krzyzewski became the eighth coach in Division I history to coach 1,000 games at one school.

In all, Coach K has been named the National Coach of the Year 12 times in eight different seasons, including *Basketball Times*, UPI and Chevrolet (1986), Naismith (1989), the NABC (1991), *The Sporting News* and Naismith (1992), *Basketball Times* (1997), the NABC and Naismith (1999), Chevrolet (2000) and the Victor Awards (2001). He was named Coach of the Decade for the 1990s by the NABC and was the second recipient of the John R. Wooden Legends of Coaching Award. On October 5, 2001, Coach K was presented by his college coach Bob Knight as one of three members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame class of 2001.

Krzyzewski was named *Sports Illustrated* Sportsman of the Year on Dec. 5, 2011. In 1992, *The Sporting News* named him the Sportsman of the Year, becoming the first college coach to win the honor. Krzyzewski also received another prestigious honor in 2001 as he was named "America's Best Coach" by *Time* magazine and CNN.

On the court, Coach K has averaged more than 25 wins a season during his career at Duke. The Blue Devils have won at least 30 games in 11 of the past 22 seasons. He directed his teams to nine straight trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 from 1998-2006, as well as joining Wooden as the only coach to guide a team to the Final Four five consecutive years.

Krzyzewski added to his already impressive list of accomplishments on Oct. 26, 2005 when he was named head coach of the USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team program for 2006-2008. With Krzyzewski at the helm, Team USA won the gold medal at the 2008 Beijing Summer Olympics with a 118-107 victory over Spain. In the summer of 2007, he guided the USA squad to a gold medal victory and an unblemished 10-0 record in the FIBA Americas Championship. Krzyzewski has been honored by USA Basketball as the National Coach of the Year four times.

On July 21, 2009, he resumed his role as head coach of the USA Basketball Men's Senior National Team through 2012. Coach K guided Team USA to a 9-0 record and gold medal at the 2010 FIBA World Championships. Krzyzewski guided Team USA to an 8-0 and a gold medal at the 2012 London Olympics to become the first coach since Henry Iba (1964 & 1968) to lead the program to back-to-back Olympic gold medals. Coach K posted a 62-1 record as head coach of Team USA, including 50 straight wins to close out his tenure leading the program.

The Duke basketball program has held a prominent spot in the national basketball scene since the beginning of the post-World War II era. The final national rankings are just one measuring stick in which the Blue Devils are among the elite in the history of the sport.

In the Coach K era, which began in 1980-81, Duke has finished in the Associated Press top 25 a total of 26 seasons, including seven times as the No. 1 team in the nation. With consecutive AP number one finishes from 1999-2002, Duke became the first school in college basketball history to be ranked at the top of the final AP poll for four straight years.

- Duke has been ranked No. 1 at some point in the season in 18 of the past 28 years (AP & USA Today polls).
- **Mike Krzyzewski** has spent more weeks ranked in the top 25 (503 weeks), top 10 (442) and No. 1 (109) than any other active coach (AP poll only).
- Duke has been ranked No. 1 in 96 weeks since 1990, the most by any school in the nation. The next closest school is North Carolina at 52 weeks during the same time period.
- Duke has been No. 1 109 weeks (216 games, 189-27) in the AP poll since 1986.
- Of the 1,114 games coached at Duke by **Mike Krzyzewski**, 973 of them have come as a ranked team (87.3 percent). Duke's record as a ranked team since 1981 is 801-172.
- Under Coach K, Duke has played more games as a No. 1 team (217) than it has as an unranked team (141).
- The Blue Devils were ranked in the top 25 of the AP poll in 380 consecutive games (Nov. 20, 1996-Feb. 11, 2007).
- Duke has been ranked No. 1 in the nation 127 weeks overall, the second-highest figure in NCAA history behind only UCLA (134).
- Duke finished in the top 10 for 10 consecutive seasons from 1997-2006 — second all-time behind UCLA (13 straight years - 1967-79).
- Duke's 1991-92 team is one of only 12 schools in college basketball history to be ranked No. 1 for the entire season.
- Duke has been ranked in 314 of the last 316 AP polls (dating back to the start of the 1996-97 season) The Blue Devils have been ranked in the top 10 for 289 weeks in that span.
