#### **REGIONAL STORYLINES & NEWS**

- After finishing the 2016 season with a 45-11 record, Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.
- The top-seeded Hurricanes will host No. 2 FAU, No. 3 Long Beach State and No. 4 Stetson in the Coral Gables Regional.
- With its selection as regional host, UM extended its NCAA-record streak of postseason appearances to 44 straight years.
- Miami, the No. 5 national seed in 2015, earned back-to-back national seeds for the first time since 2003 & 2004.
- UM has never missed the College World Series when earning a national seed (1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2008 & 2015).
- The Coral Gables Regional will mark Miami's 27th year as a regional host; Miami's all-time Regional record is 123-46.
- Mississipped (40.000 to mississipped to a degrada host, which is all this regional record to 10.000 to mississipped to 10.
- Miami was one of 10 ACC teams to earn a postseason berth, tying the record total from one conference in NCAA history.
- Miami's regional was paired with the Oxford Regional hosted by Ole Miss and featuring Tulane, Boston College & Utah.
   UM ended the season ranked as high as No. 2 (by D1Baseball) and was ranked No. 3 in most major top-25 baseball polls.
- The top-seeded Canes won their first two games of the ACC Championship in Durham, N.C., but fell in their finale to FSU.
- . With a 21-7 record in conference play, UM won the ACC Regular Season Championship for the second time in three years.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,000th game at the University of Miami in a 5-4 walk-off win over Clemson on March
   26. With a victory over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved past Larry Hays (1,508) into fifth place in all-time Division I wins.
- Morris became just the sixth head coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone on March 18.
- Miami had seven players earn All-ACC honors: junior Zack Collins (first team), junior Johnny Ruiz (second), and junior Willie Abreu, sophomore Carl Chester, junior Bryan Garcia, senior Brandon Lopez & sophomore Michael Mediavilla (third).
- Righthander Frankie Bartow was named to the All-ACC Freshman Team after leading the team in relief appearances (36).
- . Junior closer Bryan Garcia now ranks first in Miami history with 40 career saves; he is the nation's active saves leader.
- . Junior catcher Zack Collins ranks fourth among the nation's active leaders in career home runs (38) & career RBI (176).
- Sophomore lefthander Michael Mediavilla became UM's first 10-game winner since Chris Hernandez in 2010 on May 21.
   Miami's .983 fielding percentage through May 29 was the third-best mark in the country & the ACC's best percentage.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing 50-17 overall and 22-8 in ACC play.

## **JIM MORRIS**

## **HEAD COACH**

#### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,026-416-3 (.709) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,530-660-4 (.697) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,660-699-4 (.700) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

#### CANES OPEN POSTSEASON IN TOP EIGHT

- After posting a 45-11 overall record and winning its second ACC Regular Season Championship in three years, Miami was named one of 16 Regional host sites for the 2016 NCAA Baseball Championship and earned one of eight coveted national seeds (No. 3).
  - UM's No. 3 national seed is its highest since a No. 1 seed in 2008.
- The Coral Gables Regional will mark Miami's **27th year as a host** in the postseason, and its 44th consecutive postseason trip the longest active streak in Division I athletics. Miami's **45 total NCAA appearances** is the third-most of any baseball program nationwide.
- Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the group six other years: 1999 (No. 1), 2001 (No. 2), 2003 (No. 8), 2004 (No. 3), 2008 (No. 1) and 2015 (No. 5).
- Miami has an all-time record of 123-46 (.728) in the NCAA
   Regional round, including a 3-1 mark in the Coral Gables Regional in
   2015. Miami's all-time mark in the postseason stands at 187-96 (.661).

#### **WELCOME TO THE LIGHT**

- The Coral Gables Regional consists of No. 1 Miami, No. 2 Florida Atlantic, No. 3 Long Beach State and No. 4 Stetson. Play begins Friday, June 3. All games (1 p.m. / 7 p.m.) will be broadcast on ESPN3.
- Stetson (29-29), Miami's opening opponent, won the **Atlantic Sun tournament** to capture an automatic bid. **Florida Atlantic** and **Long Beach State** were both at-large selections for the postseason.
- The Coral Gables Regional was paired with the **Oxford Regional** hosted by **Ole Miss**, and consisting of the top-seeded Rebels, No. 2 **Tulane**, No. 3 **Boston College** and No. 4 **Utah**.

- Miami had seven players recognized with All-ACC honors on May 23, the second-most among all teams in the ACC (Louisville - 9).
- Zack Collins (first team, C), Johnny Ruiz (second team, 2B),
   Brandon Lopez (third team, SS), Willie Abreu (third team, OF), Carl
   Chester (third team, OF), Michael Mediavilla (third team, SP) and
   Bryan Garcia (third team, RP) were all recognized by the ACC.

## **ACC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS**

- For the second time in a span of three seasons and for the third time in history, Miami won the ACC Regular Season Championship.
- The Hurricanes clinched the title during a doubleheader at Florida State. Miami won its third straight ACC Coastal Division title on May 15 during its series finale with Pitt at Mark Light Field.
- The division crown was the **fourth all-time for Miami**, who have also claimed titles in **2008**, **2014** and **2015**.

#### NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS AND NOTES

### MIAMI RANKED IN TOP THREE OF EVERY POLL

- The Hurricanes were ranked as high as **No. 2** in polls released on May 30; Miami was ranked No. 2 by D1Baseball and NCBWA and No. 3 by Baseball America, Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and the USA TODAY Coaches Poll.
- Miami was ranked No. 1 in five of six polls released Monday, April 25 - marking the first time the Hurricanes were No. 1 in back-to-back weeks (April 18, April 25) since June 3, 2008 and June 10, 2008.

#### ALONE AT THE TOP

- Junior closer Bryan Garcia set the Miami record with the 40th save of his career on May 26 vs NC State. His 15 saves are the most in the ACC and tied for the fifth-most in the nation.
  - 40 career saves are the most by any active pitcher in the nation.
- Garcia moved past Rick Raether (1984-86) into sole possession of second place (38) with a save against Florida State in Game 1 of the series, and tied Georgia Huguet (2001-2004) for first in Game 2 (39).

#### A PERFECT TEN

• With a win in his final regular season start against Florida State on May 21, Michael Mediavilla became Miami's first 10-game winner on the hill since Chris Hernandez in 2010 (10-3).

#### ONE OF THE ACC'S COMPLETE TEAMS

- Miami & Louisville enter the postseason as the only two ACC teams to rank in the top five of all major statistical categories in the conference: batting average, earned run average & fielding percentage.
- The Hurricanes were **fourth** in team average (.300), **third** in team ERA (3.54) and first in team fielding percentage (.983).

#### MORRIS EARNS MILESTONE WINS IN STYLE

- With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the sixth coach in history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone.
- A little over a week later, Morris became the second coach in the history of Miami baseball to win 1,000 games when the Hurricanes walked off against Clemson 5-4 on March 26 (Ron Fraser - 1,267).

#### **SENIOR SHINES AT THE PLATE**

- Entering the NCAA postseason, senior Brandon Lopez ranks third in the ACC with a .388 batting average and has been among Miami's top contributors at the plate in his final year.
- Known more for his glove during his first three seasons, Lopez has set career highs in hits (73), doubles (13), home runs (2) and RBI (41).

#### COLLINS, GARCIA AWARD CANDIDATES

- Miami juniors Zack Collins and Bryan Garcia were among the 60 players named to the midseason watch list for the 2016 Golden Spikes Award on April 20; Collins was named a semifinalist on June 1.
- Miami was one of just eight schools to have multiple players on the watch list; former Cane David Thompson was a 2015 Golden Spikes Award semifinalist. Pat Burrell (1998) was UM's only winner.
- On May 20, both Collins and Garcia were named among 43 semifinalists for the 2016 Dick Howser Trophy.

## **NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS AND NOTES**

#### **USA TODAY** TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by "athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership," Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today.
  - Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

#### **COLLINS AMONG NATION'S BEST**

- As of games through May 30, junior **Zack Collins** ranked among the nation's **active career leaders** in a number of hitting categories: **home runs** (38, fourth), **RBI** (176, fourth) and **walks** (165, 1st).
- Collins has begun his ascent into the Miami record books, and is now alone in 10th in career RBI, tied for 10th in career home runs, and ranks seventh for walks in a single season (66).
  - Collins is projected to become a 2016 MLB Draft first-round pick.

#### **GOLD GLOVE DEFENSE**

- In the newest NCAA Division I statistics released May 30, Miami had the third-best fielding percentage in the country and the best fielding percentage in the ACC at .983.
  - Miami has made just 37 errors, compared to 86 by opponents.
- The Hurricanes' starting infield of third baseman Edgar Michelangeli (3), shortstop Brandon Lopez (5), second baseman Johnny Ruiz (7) and first baseman Christopher Barr (2) have combined for just 17 errors.

#### **WOODREY SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST**

- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** was recognized as one of 10 finalists for the **2016 Senior CLASS Award** an acronym standing for "Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School"
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

#### MIDWEEK WARRIORS

• Miami finished the year **12-1 in midweek games**, including a 10-1 home mark. UM beat FGCU **8-3** in its final midweek game on May 17.

## **WALK-OFF WILLIE**

- Junior right fielder Willie Abreu earned the nickname "Walk Off Willie" after connecting on walk-off home runs on back-to-back Friday nights vs. Louisville (March 18) and Clemson (March 25).
- Abreu's first walk-off was a grand slam against Cardinals All American closer Zack Burdi, the second shot was a two-run HR vs. Clemson.
  - Miami had five walk-off wins, including three via homer, in 2016.

#### HAPPY HOMECOMING FOR HEYWARD

- Largely thanks to a career day from junior **Jacob Heyward**, Miami won its rubber game with host **Georgia Tech** at Russ Chandler Stadium Monday, May 9 to secure its **tenth series victory of 2016**.
- Heyward, a native of McDonough, Ga., had five RBI one shy of his career high with a pair of two-RBI doubles and a solo home run.
- Heyward would continue his flare the following weekend at home, crushing a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th to seal a series victory over Pittsburgh on May 14.

#### **NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS AND NOTES**

## **DESTINATION: OMAHA**

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program.
- The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the fourth-most of any program nationwide: Miami's four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank fifth-most.

### CANES HAND CARDS 1ST ACC SERIES LOSS

- By capturing the first two games of a weekend series against #4 Louisville (8-4 in Game 1, 6-3 in Game 2) from March 18-20, Miami handed UofL its first ACC series loss since joining te conference.
- UM is now 19-6 in ACC play through its first nine weekends, having won eight of its first nine ACC series.

#### MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

• Miami dropped two of three in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes won **Game 2** by a final score of **5-3**, but dropped Games 1 and 3.

#### HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper was its highest from the publication since 2005; its No. 6 ranking from Baseball America was its highest from BA since 2007.

#### MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger Peter O'Brien became the 53rd former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a group that now includes Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jay & infielder Jemile Weeks, Dodgers All-Star Yasmani Grandal, new D-Back Chris Herrmann, and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

# **DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON**

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with a 44th consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2016. Miami has made the postseason each year since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 44 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program all-time, trailing only Texas.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 32 straight years - all 23 years at Miami & final nine years at Georgia Tech.
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
