


#### **STORY LINES**

- The Miami Hurricanes will resume their rivalry with Florida State for a nonconference weekend series at Dick Howser Stadium in Tallahassee, Fla., beginning Fri., Feb. 28. First pitch for the three games are: 4 p.m., 2 p.m. and 1 p.m.
- Due to conference scheduling, the series will not count against either team's ACC record. Miami has not faced Florida State in
  a game without conference implications since a meeting at the College World Series in Omaha, Neb., in 2008.
- Miami is ranked in the top 20 in every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 14 in Baseball
   America, No. 17 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's rankings, No. 14 in Baseball America and No. 17 in the USA Today.
- The Hurricanes enter another marquee nonconference set with momentum after capturing their weekend series with then-No. 16 Florida last weekend. Miami won game one (6-4) and game two (5-2), but dropped Sunday's finale 6-4.
- · Miami exploded for six homers in the team's series against the Gators, and now has seven home runs this season.
- Zack Collins became the first Cane since Yonder Alonso (2006) to record a homer for his first hit in Saturday's 5-2 win.
- Florida State took two of three from Miami in the 2013 regular season series. Bryan Radziewski pitched seven
  dominant innings in Miami's game two win, striking out eight batters while allowing just four hits in a 6-0 victory.
- The Seminoles reached the postseason in 2013, but dropped their Super Regional to visiting Indiana in two straight games.







#### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 891-349-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,395-617-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,526-656-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

#### MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,395-616-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,526-656-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



#### **MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

#### **WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**

#### **RIVALRY RENEWED...**

- The No. 14 Miami Hurricanes continue their challenging start to the 2014 season with their annual series against rival No. 2 Florida State.
- Due to conference re-alignment and scheduling, the series will not count towards ACC standings. Miami has not played Florida State in a game without conference implications since the 2008 College World Series.
- Florida State holds the all-time series advantage 145-122-4, including a 76-54-2 mark at Dick Howser Stadium. The Seminoles took two out of three on their most recent trip to Coral Gables in 2013.
- Miami snapped a four-game losing streak to the Seminoles with a 6-0 win in game two of last year's series. Bryan Radziewski pitched seven shutout innings in the win, striking out seven batters.

#### STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Miami won its annual nonconference series with in-state foe Florida for the first time since 2009, capturing the first two games of the series (6-4, 5-2) but dropping the finale (4-6).
- The Hurricane offense exploded for six home runs off Gators pitching, the most for a Miami team in a single series since an April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.
- Senior outfielder Dale Carey and junior catcher Garrett Kennedy helped spark the fireworks, hitting two home runs apiece in the series. The two players combined for just four home runs in all of
- Boosted by their series win, Miami climbed to No. 14 in the Baseball America top 25 rankings - its highest position in the poll since 2012.
- Miami fell in its annual exhibition against the Miami Marlins 5-2

#### FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Three freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' Opening Day lineup: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (designated hitter) and Johnny Ruiz (second base). Laz Rivera (shortstop) and Jacob Heyward (designated hitter) have also earned starts through the first two weeks.
- Freshman reliever Bryan Garcia recorded the first two saves of his career in back-to-back wins over Florida. Fellow freshmen Danny Garcia and Cooper Hammond have also seen innings out of the bullpen.
- Two Hurricanes connected on their career-first home runs in the series against Florida: Abreu (solo, Friday) and Collins (three-run, Saturday). Collins' blast proved to be the game-winning hit.

- Four players from the recruiting class were selected in the 2013 MLB Draft but opted to play collegiately: outfielder Willie Abreu, first baseman/catcher Zack Collins, righthanded pitcher Derik Beauprez and outfielder Jacob Heyward.
- The freshman class was rated No. 4 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 by Baseball America - its highest ranking from the publication since 2006.

#### CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- Fernandez and Fiore join former head coach Ron Fraser (Class of 2006), assistant coach/player Skip Bertman (2006) and pitcher Neal Heaton (2008) as University of Miami inductees into the College Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341), runs (258), doubles (63), runs batted in (235) and total bases (506).
- The 2014 class will be inducted into the National College Baseball Hall of Fame as part of the annual Night of Champions event on June 28 in Lubbock, Texas.

#### RADZIEWSKI EARNS PRESEASON ACCLAIM...

- Redshirt junior LHP Bryan Radziewski ended the 2013 season as the only Hurricane to earn All-ACC recognition (first team), and was named a 2014 preseason All-American by a number of publications, including Collegiate Baseball, The Sporting News and NCBWA.
- In 2013, Radziewski became the Hurricanes first All-American since 2010 with Louisville Slugger second-team honors from Collegiate Baseball and Rawlings third-team honors from ABCA.
- Radziewski finished the 2013 season with a 9-3 record and 1.78 ERA across 14 starts. He struck out a career-high 109 batters in 91.0 innings, including a 16-strikeout gem against Virginia Tech in his return to the weekend rotation.

- Junior LHP Andrew Suarez delivered four impressive innings in his start for the Hurricanes, allowing just one hit while striking out six, in a 12-0 victory over the Alumni at last week's Fan Fest.
- Miami fans were treated to a touch of nostalgia when the 2001 National Championship starting infield took the diamond in the bottom of the first. Third baseman Kevin Howard, shortstop Javy Rodriguez, second baseman Kris Clute and first baseman "Downtown" Kevin Brown received a warm round of applause.
- A fourth-inning grand slam from sophomore slugger David Thompson blew the game open, while pitchers AJ Salcines, Bryan Garcia, Adam Sargent, Enrique Sosa and Cooper Hammond combined to hold the Alumni to just one hit the rest of the way.
