UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI
SHATTERED RECORDS IN 1966

A number of records fell and a couple were tied by University of Miami's Liberty Bowl bound football team in 1966.

By holding the opposition to 882 yards rushing, Miami set a season defense record and the 88.2 yards per game was another mark. The average of 2.25 yards per carry allowed the opposition, equalled the mark of the 1950 team. The old defense against rushing record was 998, set in 1957.

Ray Harris kicked seven field goals to break Don Curtright's one season record--and he equalled Bob Wilson's two year career mark.

All-America defensive back Tom Beier set a new all-time record in making tackles (for a defensive back) with a total of 108.

For a single game, Miller's 251 yards total offense in the Florida clash is the eighth best ever at Miami. He and Jimmy Cox teamed up on a 69 yard touchdown pass against Pitt to equal the sixth longest in UM history. By catching nine passes for 128 yards against Florida, Cox equalled the second best mark both for catches and yards gained on receptions in one game. His 117 yards in the Pitt game is the fifth highest in the UM record books.

In the career marks, Miller is third in completions with 156, just 31 behind Fran Curci in second place. Miller is second in yards gained on passes with 1970 for his two years.

Bill has an outside shot at one of George Mira's records. Mira tossed 28 touchdown passes in three years while Miller has thrown 16, second best in UM history. Miller also has boosted his career total offense yardage to 2,042, which trails Mira, Curci and Eddie Dunn.

Receivers Cox and Daanen rank well up in the career records with one season to go. Cox has caught 58 passes, ranking him fourth. Daanen, with 46, is next in line. Cox has raced 912 yards on his receptions, third high behind Bill Miller who had caught 1,448 and Nick Spinelli, 1,104. Daanen, at 559 yards, is fifth.

Cox has caught eight TD passes, one shy of Nick Spinelli's career mark of nine, Daanen has seven TD catches to his credit.

Only records set by the opposition against Miami were established by Florida. Florida fired 51 passes against Miami, breaking the old mark of 39 held by Holy Cross in 1954. The Gators had 28 completions, wiping out the 25 completion mark set by Georgia in 1963.

And Miami is half way to another record--the Hurricanes went from the latter part of 1955 into 1956 for a 14 game stretch without losing a game. The Hurricanes finished 1966 without a loss in their last seven battles.
