

UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION



DR. JULIO FRENK

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL **AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979**

Dr. Julio Frenk, a noted leader in global public health and a renowned scholar and academic, was named the sixth president of the University of Miami in April 2015. He assumed his leadership post on August 16, 2015.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, Dr. Frenk was Dean of the Faculty at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health since January 2009. While at Harvard, he was also the T & G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. He pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal health insurance, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for tens of millions of uninsured Mexicans.

Dr. Frenk was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of health education and research in the developing world. In 1998 Dr. Frenk joined the World Health Organization (WHO) as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy, WHO's first-ever unit explicitly charged with developing a scientific foundation for health policy to achieve better outcomes.

He also served as a senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and as president of the Carso Health Institute in Mexico City. He is the founding chair of the board of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington. He also co-chaired the Commission on the Education of Health Professionals for the 21st Century, which published its influential report in the leading journal The Lancet in 2010, triggering a large number of follow-up initiatives throughout the world.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint doctorate in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He has been awarded honorary doctorates from several institutions of higher learning. In September of 2008, Dr. Frenk received the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing "the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health."

He is a member of the U.S. Institute of Medicine, American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and National Academy of Medicine of Mexico.

In addition to his scholarly works, which include more than 140 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, he has written two best-selling novels for youngsters explaining the functions of the human body.



DR. MARVIN DAWKINS

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his fifth year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and ACC.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports. He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in American Behavioral Scientist (2012). His research on golf includes book chapters, scholarly articles, and the book African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era (Praeger 2000), coauthored with Graham C. Kinloch. Dawkins was recently appointed to the United States Golf Association Museum Committee and is currently completing a study on the media treatment of black golfers from the Jim Crow era to the present.

BLAKE JAMES

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MINNESOTA STATE-MANKATO, 1992

Since taking over as the University of Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013, Blake James has transformed The U, spearheading significant advances in all aspects of the department, including postseason appearances, student-athlete support, facility upgrades, ticket sales, broadcast capabilities and academic achievement.

Miami's recent success continues to garner both James and UM national recognition. This past summer, James concluded a two-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division I Council, the group responsible for the day-to-day decision-making for all of Division I Athletics. This year he was one of five nominees for the 2019 SportsBusiness Journal Athletic Director of the Year. In 2017, James was selected as one of four Division I recipients of the 2016-17 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year award from the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA).

In the most recent academic year, Miami continued to achieve excellence both on and off the field. Hurricane student-athletes earned four Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year honors, 68 All-ACC selections, 11 individual ACC titles and 35 All-America accolades. Two Hurricanes captured individual NCAA championships – Michelle Athlerley in the women's indoor pentathlon and Estela Perez-Somarriba in women's tennis. Two UM divers – David Dinsmore and Briadam Herrera – placed second at the NCAA Championships. Miami has now captured five NCAA individual championships, six ACC team titles and 62 individual ACC titles since James became Director of Athletics.

James has always placed a strong emphasis on academics and community outreach during his six-plus years as Miami's Director of Athletics. A record 200 UM student-athletes made the 2017-18 ACC Honor Roll. In the most recent Graduation Success Rate figures released by the NCAA, Miami student-athletes posted a GSR mark of 90 percent. Nine programs were recognized for perfect single-year scores of 1,000 in the 2017-18 Academic Progress Report (APR). In addition, six of those programs – men's and women's cross country, golf, men's and women's tennis and volleyball – earned perfect multi-year scores of 1,000 for the four-year period from 2014-15 to 2017-18.

In 2018, Hurricane student-athletes ranked first among all Division I schools in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition and posted another Top 10 finish in 2019 – logging more than 3,600 hours of service.

On the development front, the Hurricane Club continues to support UM's student-athletes and coaches in record numbers. The Hurricane Club raised more than \$16 million in 2018-19 and now boasts a record 12,500 members, an increase of 140 percent since 2010. Philanthropic annual fund gifts increased to \$5.9 million in 2018-19 and the Hurricane Club secured 10 seven-figure leadership gifts.

In August 2018, the new, state-of-the-art Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility opened for use. The \$40-plus million facility encompasses not just indoor practice fields for football, but also new football coaches offices, new football reception and recruiting areas, weight room renovations and new coaches offices for golf,

rowing, soccer and volleyball.

During James' tenure, Miami has completed several other facility enhancements, including the opening of the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence; the completion of the student-athlete training table, fueling station and dining hall; new artificial and natural playing surfaces and lights on the Greentree Practice Fields; a center-hung scoreboard inside the Watsco Center; renovations to the men's and women's basketball offices at Watsco Center; renovations to the Hecht Athletic Center; and a new videoboard for the Neil Schiff Tennis Center.

In 2018, UM set a record for season tickets at Hard Rock Stadium (46,738) and also posted the school's highest average attendance at Hard Rock Stadium (61,469). Since James took over as athletic director, football season ticket sales have increased 101 percent. From 2015-18, men's basketball tickets sold out for three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

In addition, Miami has built its broadcast, communications and marketing departments into one of the nation's leaders in digital media and video production. Miami has continually ranked at the top of the conference in number of live ACC Network Extra broadcasts each year as it gears up for the launch of the new ACC Network, which debuts in August. James was also instrumental in helping Miami strike one of the largest apparel deals in the country with adidas.

Prior to being named AD, James served Miami Athletics in the roles of Interim AD and Senior Associate AD for Development and Ticket Operations, where he oversaw the day-to-day operations of development, ticket sales and ticket operations. He also was a member of the Hurricanes' senior staff and provided sport supervision.

James returned to UM after spending seven years at the University of Maine, where he first served as Senior Associate Athletic Director before serving as Director of Athletics from 2005 to 2010. During his tenure at Maine, athletics experienced tremendous success, including three trips to the Frozen Four for the men's ice hockey program and NCAA playoff berths for football, baseball (two), women's basketball and softball. James implemented a comprehensive \$17 million facility improvement plan at Maine, which included an indoor practice facility and numerous other facility upgrades and renovations. Academically, the program flourished, earning the conference academic cup twice and student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 GPA or above.

Prior to his stint at Maine, James worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund.

James is no stranger to South Florida, beginning his athletic career with UM, working in ticket sales, corporate sales and athletic development. In 1995, he was hired as Miami's Director of Ticket Sales, serving in that capacity until 1997, when he was named an athletic development officer at the University of Nebraska. He returned to Miami in 1998 as the Director of Major Gifts and Corporate Sales and was promoted to the Director of Athletic Development at Miami in 2000 before moving on to Providence in 2002.

James graduated from Minnesota State University - Mankato with a Bachelor's degree in Marketing in 1992, and later received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in 1994. He and his wife, Kelly, have two children -- daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.



JENNIFER STRAWLEY

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER / SWA PENNSYLVANIA, 1998

Jennifer Strawley joined the University of Miami on June 18, 2012 and currently serves as Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer. She is also the department's Senior Woman Administrator.

Serving as the second-in-command, Strawley provides strategic direction for the department and assists the Director of Athletics with the day-to-day operations. She is the sport administrator for football, women's basketball and women's tennis. Strawley leads the department's strategic planning initiatives, policy development and implementation, coordination of department and coaches meetings and gender equity and inclusion initiatives. She oversees the areas of human resources, sports medicine, academic services, equipment / Adidas, video services and student-athlete development, as well as serves as a liaison to various campus groups, the ACC and the NCAA.

Strawley played a key role in the hiring of head football coach Mark Richt, serving on the selection committee. In addition, she was instrumental in the development of Miami's annual Celebration of Women's Athletics recognizing the achievements of Miami's female student-athletes while raising money to support women's athletics.

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC. She currently serves on the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball foresight committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee, the ACC Football Schedulers Group, and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. She also serves on the board of directors for Women's Leaders in College Sports and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to UM, Strawley concluded her second tour with the NCAA as the Director of Academic and Membership Affairs. In this role, Strawley was instrumental in providing leadership in the areas of academic governance and development of academic policy. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 2007-10. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the

NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the student-athlete reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees and task forces, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees and the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. Strawley was inducted into the William Tennent High School Hall of Fame in of 2014.



JASON LAYTON

CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICERST. LEO, 1999

Jason Layton serves as the University of Miami Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Financial Officer, a position he took over in August 2017. He initially joined Miami in December 2014 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's business office, marketing, digital strategies, communications, ticket sales, ticket operations, client experience, video production and broadcast departments.

Additionally, Layton has oversight of all departmental licensing matters, Hurricane Sports Properties, serves as the department ACC Network liaison and is the sport administrator for men's basketball.

Since his arrival, Miami has seen exceptional growth in ticket sales and video production services in both content and broadcast with ESPN and the newly formed ACC Network.

Under his watch, Miami has seen an increased level of season ticket sales in football and men's basketball. Under Layton's guidance, Miami saw an unprecedented growth in football attendance during the 2016 season, as the Hurricanes totaled 42,000 season ticket holders and averaged 58,572 fans per game – the 27th-highest total in the nation and leader among all Power Five schools in percentage increase on a year-to-year basis (23 percent).

In addition, Miami sold out its entire 2015-16 and 2016-17 men's basketball season ticket allotment, marking the first time in Hurricane Athletics history that a team has sold out its entire season ticket allotment in back-to-back seasons.

Layton also serves as the primary contact for ESPN with the recent launch of the ACC Network, first in digital format in August 2016 and building to the linear network in fall of 2019. Since 2015,



Miami has produced over 200 live events on ESPN3/ACC Network Extra – a figure that ranks near the top of all ACC schools.

Layton, a Florida native, arrived in Miami after spending the 2013 and 2014 seasons at Colorado State University where he served as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing. During his time in Fort Collins, Colo., Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

Before his arrival at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled a variety of responsibilities from sales, marketing, ticketing and luxury suite operations to advertising, accounting, finance and purchasing. Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011. Layton received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Saint Leo University in Saint Leo, Fla.

SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD ACADEMIC SERVICES FLORIDA A&M, 1994

David Wyman has empowered over 2,000 student-athletes with his signature creed. Now in his 24th year, Wyman has advised and mentored a diverse population of student-athletes to become skilled professionals in many different careers.

Wyman is the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Academic Services at the University of Miami, a position he was promoted to in August 2017. Wyman is also the sport administrator for Miami's volleyball program.

He began his own career as an intern, and was quickly promoted to the full-time staff after working just two months in the academic services division. Wyman became the assistant director two years later, supervising the tutorial program and advising both the football and men's basketball teams. He was then promoted to associate director, taking on the responsibility of coordinating the NCAA eligibility certification for all 400 student-athletes.

PAIGE YAROSHUK-TEWS

HEAD COACH

23RD SEASON (19th as HC) | UCLA, 1996

An outstanding recruiter with unrivaled knowledge of the game and passion for teaching, the 2018-19 season marked the 18th illustrious year for Paige Yaroshuk-Tews as the head coach of the University of Miami women's tennis team.

The program's all-time winningest coach, Yaroshuk-Tews has turned the Hurricanes into a force nationally, leading Miami to the NCAA's Elite Eight in eight of the last 16 seasons, tied for the sixth-most quarterfinal appearances in the nation during that span. The Hurricanes have also made the Sweet 16 in 12 of the past 14 years, one of six programs

In her 18 years at Miami, Yaroshuk-Tews boasts an overall record of 356-119 (.749) and an ACC career record of 144-37 (.796). As a result of her unparalleled achievements, Yaroshuk-Tews was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 2012.

Yaroshuk-Tews' desire to make Miami a national title contender on a yearly basis has helped the program consistently flourish with all-conference and All-American talent. The Hurricanes have not only made the NCAA Team Championship in each of her 18 years as head coach, but have also won at least one NCAA match every season. UM qualified for the ITA National Team Indoor Championships 12 straight years, from 2005-16, and was ranked in the top 10 at some point during the season in each of those campaigns. Yaroshuk-Tews annually brings in some of the top prep talent, reloading year in and year out for a program consistently ranked among the nation's best.

Since taking the head coaching position for the women's tennis program at Miami in 2001, Yaroshuk-Tews has led the Hurricanes on an unprecedented run in Coral Gables, Fla. In total, she has directed Miami to 13 Sweet 16 berths, eight Elite Eight trips and an appearance in the 2006 NCAA final, the program's first since 1985.

Miami hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Team Championship 13 times under Yaroshuk-Tews, including 12 straight years each from 2005-2016. The Hurricanes have turned in 17 straight ITA top 25 finishes including 13 in the top 15.

have turned in 17 straight ITA top-25 finishes, including 13 in the top 15. In eight of the last 14 seasons, Miami has ended the year in the top 10.

Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews has guided two players to NCAA Singles Championship crowns, as Audra Cohen won the hardware in 2007 and Estela Perez-Somarriba did so last year, in 2019. Miami is one of just three schools with two NCAA singles titles in the past 13 seasons, alongside Stanford and Virginia. Six Hurricanes have combined for eight

semifinals berths during that stretch, with both totals the highest marks of any program since 2007.

Fifteen different Hurricanes have gamered a total of 32 ITA All-American honors under Yaroshuk-Tews, the former a program record for a coach. In 15 of her 18 seasons, at least one Hurricane has been named an All-American, with multiple players receiving the honor in nine of them. Under Yaroshuk-Tews' watch, 17 Hurricanes have combined for 36 All-ACC distinctions and 26 Miami players have totaled 47 Academic All-ACC recognitions. In addition, four Hurricanes have totaled six ACC Player of the Year plaudits and four have combined for five ACC Scholar. At blots of the Year bears.

Most recently, the Hurricanes logged a 19-8 ledger in 2019, finishing 9-5 in ACC action and falling one point shy of the NCAA Sweet 16. Miami posted five top-25 wins, including defeating ninth-ranked NC State, 4-2, to reach the ACC Championship semifinals for the sixth time in seven years and fourth in a row. Yaroshuk-Tews guided her team to the No. 20 spot in the final ITA rankings, the 15th top-20 finish in a 16-year period. Estela Perez-Somarriba won the NCAA Singles Championship title and went 43-5, claiming ACC Player of the Year, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, ITA All-America and ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award honors, while ending the season ranked second nationally. Freshman Daevenia Achong earned Second Team All-ACC accolades, as well as joined Perez-Somarriba and three other Hurricanes on the All-ACC Academic Team. Miami posted an 18-8 mark in 2018, including an 11-3 record in ACC play. After a one-year hiatus, the Hurricanes again hosted the opening two rounds of the NCAA Team

Championship and advanced to the Sweet 16. Yaroshuk-Tews' team ended the season ranked No. 17 nationally, good for a 14th top-20 finish in a 15-year span. Estela Perez-Somarriba was named the ACC Player of the Year and the ITA National Player to Watch, finishing with ITA All-America accolades, First Team All-ACC distinction, a 39-8 record and the

Somariba was named the ACC Player of the Year and the TIA National Player to watch, finishing with TIA All-America accolades, First Team All-ACC distriction, a 39-8 record and the fifth spot in the final ITA rankings. Sinead Lohan, who finished her career with the fourth-most singles wins in school history (130), became Miami's third four-time All-ACC honoree and won the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award.

Despite dealing with significant injuries throughout the 2017 campaign, Yaroshuk-Tews oversaw the team's 22nd consecutive NCAA Team Championship berth and 21st winning season in a row. The Hurricanes finished 13-12, concluded the campaign ranked No. 25 nationally and reached the second round of NCAA play. Miami had two First Team All-ACC honorees for the second straight year, as Sinead Lohan and Estela Perez-Somarriba both garnered the recognition. Perez-Somarriba, an ITA All-American, became the first Hurricane tranship to season to recognition. freshman to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, giving Miami a semifinalist for the third season in a row.

Yaroshuk-Tews guided Miami to a 21-6 record in 2016, the team's 11th 20-win season in a 13-year span. The Hurricanes went 12-2 in the ACC for the third year in a row, finishing in second place, and reached the ACC Championship final for the sixth time in 12 seasons in the ACC. Miami advanced to the Sweet 16 for the 11th year in a row and ended the campaign ranked No. 10 in the nation, its 13th straight top-15 finish and eighth top-10 finish in the last 11 years. Sinead Lohan, Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang combined for a total of four ITA All-American distinctions. Wagner, the ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year, broke the program's career wins record, finishing with 134. The All-American trio combined for six ACC Player of the Week honors, with Wagner winning four, the most by anyone since 2012, to conclude her career with eight. Lohan went 40-6 in singles, tied for the third-most wins in a season by a Miami player, and became the seventh different Hurricane to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, including the sixth under Yaroshuk-Tews.

The Hurricanes went 18-7 in 2015 and finished second in the ACC at 12-2. Miami reached the Sweet 16 for the 10th year in a row and earned a 12th consecutive top-15 finish. The team also finished in the top four of the ACC for the 11th straight year, each one since it joined the conference. On an individual level, Yaroshuk-Tews guided both Sinead Lohan and Stephanie Wagner to ITA All-American honors. Both of them reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the third time ever–all under the direction of Yarosuk-Tews–two Hurricanes did so the same year. Wagner was also named the ITA National Player to Watch. UM set a program record with five nationally-ranked singles players in

the year-end rankings and tied the top mark set the previous season with six different players ranked in either singles or doubles.

In 2014, Miami posted its sixth consecutive 20-win season and 10th in the last 11 years, finishing at 21-6, with a 12-2 mark in the ACC to tie for first place. The Hurricanes hosted the NCAA Team Championship first and second rounds for the 10th consecutive year and reached the NCAA round of 16 for the ninth straight time. Additionally, UM made the ITA National Team Indoor Championships for the 10th season in a row. Miami ended the year at No. 12 in the nation and two Hurricanes, Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno, earned ITA All-American recognition. Six different Hurricanes ended the season ranked in either singles or doubles, a new program record.

The 2013 season saw Miami win its first ACC Championship title, as the Hurricanes knocked off a trio of top-30 teams in Cary, N.C., including second-ranked North Carolina in the semifinals. Miami went on to finish 23-6, marking the most wins for the program since 2009 and the third-most during Yaroshuk-Tews' tenure. The season also marked the fifth consecutive trip to the Elite Eight for the Hurricanes, then the longest streak in the country. UM concluded the year ranked eighth, its fifth straight top-10 finish, and Yaroshuk-Tews was named the ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, while her assistant coach, Alex Santos, was chosen as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

During the 2012 season, the Hurricanes advanced to their fourth consecutive NCAA Team Championship Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion Florida.

Miami played host to North Florida and Utah in the first two rounds of the tournament, winning both matches, 4-0. In the Sweet 16, the Hurricanes exacted revenge on ACC foe North Carolina, winning 4-2 to erase the memory of a 4-3 loss to the Tar Heels in the regular season. Miami wound up ninth in the final national rankings, and Anna Bartenstein was named an ITA All-American making it nine straight seasons Yaroshuk-Tews coached a player who received the honor. an ITA All-American, making it nine straight seasons Yaroshuk-Tews coached a player who received the honor.

In 2011, Yaroshuk-Tews led Miami on another deep run in the NCAA Team Championship, winning at home in the first two rounds before taking down Michigan in the round of 16 in Stanford, Calif. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked seventh nationally. Also in 2011, senior Bianca Eichkorn became the program's all-time winningest singles player (133 victories) en route to numerous All-America and all-conference honors. Among them, Eichkorn became the fourth UM player in the last seven seasons to be named ACC Player of the Year under Yaroshuk-Tews, who surpassed 200 career wins with Miami's NCAA-opening 4-0 victory May 13 against FIU. Anna Bartenstein was also named an ITA All-American in 2011, making it four straight years the Hurricanes had at least two players garner the accolade.

In 2010, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to the NCAA quarterfinals, a No. 10 final ranking and a 20-6 record, UM's sixth 20-win season in the last seven years. Miami also posted a 10-1 mark in ACC play to finish in second place. For the second straight year-the first time that happened since 1985-86-three Hurricanes earned ITA All-America honors, this time Bianca Eichkorn, Gabriela Mejia and Laura Vallverdu, who also won the Honda Sports Award. Vallverdu was an All-American in singles and doubles, giving Miami four All-America honors for the first time since 1988. Additionally, Vallverdu set the program record for singles wins (131) and became the fourth four-year All-American in program history and the first under Yaroshuk-Tews. Eichkorn and Vallverdu both reached the NCAA Singles Championship quarterfinals, the second straight year two Hurricanes did so after it had not previously happened in program history. Vallverdu made the semifinals, to become the program's first two-time semifinalist.

During the 2009 season, Yaroshuk-Tews claimed the ACC Coach of the Year award after leading UM to a 26-5 mark, its second-best record ever during the NCAA era (1982-present). The Hurricanes went 16-0 at home, captured the ACC regular season title at 10-1 and registered 12 consecutive victories leading into the ACC Championship final. Yaroshuk-Tews saw her team advance to the NCAA quarterfinals and concluded the season seventh in the country, its second best finish of the last 32 years. For the first time since



1988, three UM players were named ITA All-Americans, in Bianca Eichkorn, Julia Cohen and Laura Vallverdu. All three reached the NCAA Singles Championship round of 16, a first in school history. Cohen and Eichkorn became the first Hurricane duo to make the semifinals the same year, and Vallverdu finished as the second finalist in program history. In total, four Hurricanes played in the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the first time that happened, and four Miami duos were listed in the final ITA doubles rankings for the first time ever.

In 2008, Miami finished with a 17-6 overall mark, snapping a string of four consecutive 20-win seasons. The Hurricanes faced 18 ranked opponents and went 12-6 against them. UM hosted the seasons. The numbers faced to farked opponents and went 12-6 against them. Ow nosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship for the fourth straight year and reached a third consecutive Sweet 16. The Hurricanes' 6-1 win over No. 45 NC State April 12 gave Yaroshuk-Tews her 132nd victory to pass legendary Miami coach Ivan Duvenhage (1982-88) for the program record. Miami ended the season at No. 14 in the nation and Laura Vallverdu was named an ITA

During the 2007 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to a 22-7 mark, the team's fourth straight 20-win season and to the NCAA quarterfinals for the second straight season. Miami went 17-1 at home, with the lone loss against eventual NCAA champion Georgia Tech. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked ninth in the nation, their second straight top-10 finish. Audra Cohen and Laura Vallverdu were both named ITA All-Americans, making it three straight years UM had multiple honorees for the first time since 1986-88. Cohen went 42-2 in singles, became the first player in program history win the national title in the NCAA Singles Championship and was also the first to win the Honda Sports Award. She also won her second consecutive ITA National Player of the Year Award and ACC Player of the Year award, making it three straight years a Hurricane earned both accolades. It marked just the second time ever a school had three straight ITA National Player of the Year was the second time ever a school had three straight ITA National Player of the Year was fifth was not to win the award in back to back Year winners on the women's side, and Cohen was fifth women to win the award in back-to-back years. Cohen ended the season at No. 1 in the nation for the second year in a row, marking the third straight time a UM player finished first, and she was selected to the ITA All-Star Team as well. Three Hurricanes made the NCAA Singles Championship for the third time ever, and first since 1985. Yaroshuk-Tews reached 100 wins with a 6-1 win over eighth-ranked Baylor Feb. 3, becoming the third coach in program history to get to triple digits. Her assistant coach, David Anderton, garnered the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year award for his work with the team.

The 2006 campaign was a special one for the Miami program, as the Hurricanes advanced to the final of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time since 1985 and the second time ever.

UM upset second-ranked Notre Dame in the quarterfinals and third-ranked USC in the semifinals. The impressive run came to an end in the championship match against two-time defending champion and top-seeded Stanford. The Hurricanes finished the season at 24-7 and shared the ACC regular season title for the second straight year. Yaroshuk-Tews' squad came up with big wins against some of the nation's best teams, going 5-3 against top-10 teams, including a 4-2 mark against opponents ranked in the top three. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked fourth in the country, their first top-five finish since 1987 and the fourth-best record in program history during the NCAA era (1982-present).

The same year, Melissa Applebaum and Audra Cohen were both named ITA All-Americans, making it back-to-back years the Hurricanes had a pair of honorees for the first time

since the 1987-88 season. Cohen went 34-2 in singles and finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation, the second straight year a Hurricane took the top spot. She was named the ITA National Player of the Year and ACC Player of the Year, making it back-to-back years a Hurricane won both awards, and she was nominated for the Honda Sports Award. Cohen

Cohen and Applebaum ended the year ranked second nationally in doubles and made the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Both of them were named to the ITA All-Star Team. Additionally, four Hurricanes made the year-end ITA rankings for the first time in 30 years.

The team flourished in 2005 under Yaroshuk-Tews, earning a 21-5 overall record, marking its second consecutive 20-win season. Miami went 9-1 in Atlantic Coast Conference play in its inaugural season in the league to tie for first place and also reached the ACC Championship final. The Hurricanes made the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships and upset fourth-ranked UCLA, 4-3. UM earned an automatic bid to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and fell to California in the second round to snap a 27-match home winning streak. The Hurricanes finished at No. 13 in the nation and both Audrey Bañada and Megan Bradley were named ITA All-Americans, the first time Miami had multiple players earn the honor since 1992. The pair also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship, the first Miami duo to do so since 1992. Bradley set a program record for singles wins with 44, finishing at 44-2 and winning 39 straight matches along the way. She won the ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships title, finished the season ranked first in the nation, made the ITA All-Star Team, and won ACC/UM Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year award. Her ITA national awards were the first by a Hurricane since 1991. since 1991

In 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to yet another successful season and earned her second BIG EAST Coach of the Year award. The Hurricanes finished with a 20-4 overall record and were ranked 15th in the final poll, the team's highest ranking since 1991. Miami made the BIG EAST Championship final for the 13th straight year–every one it overall record and were ranked 15th in the final poll, the team's highest ranking since 1991. Miami made the BIG EAST Championship final for the 13th straight year—every one it participated in as a conference member—and won its eighth title. Half the titles and seven of the finals appearances came with Yaroshuk—Tews on the coaching staff. The Hurricanes were part of one of the biggest upsets in collegiate tennis history in 2004. They beat previously undefeated and top-ranked ranked Florida, 4-3, in the second round of the NCAA Team Championship in Gainesville, Fla. Miami had not defeated the Gators since the 1986 season. The Hurricanes advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1999 and defeated No. 11 Tulane, 4-1, to reach the Elite Eight for the first time since the 1986. Megan Bradley was named an ITA All-American, the first Hurricane to garner the honor since 1999, which was also the last time Miami won 20-plus matches. After the season, Yaroshuk-Tews was tabbed to coach the prestigious USA Tennis Collegiate Team.

During the 2003 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to a 17-7 record and an eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Team Championship. Her squad advanced to the second round of the tournament and finished the season ranked 23rd in the country, marking the program's first top-25 finish since 1999. The Hurricanes had two players—Melissa Applebaum and Megan Bradley—in the NCAA Singles Championship for the first time since 1992, and placed a pair—Applebaum and Bradley—in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the first time since 1997, both ending the longest droughts in program bistory.

since 1997, both ending the longest droughts in program history.

In 2002, her first season as head coach, Yaroshuk-Tews guided the Hurricanes to their seventh BIG EAST Championship title and she was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year. The team finished with a 14-7 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time in three years. Half of Miami's wins came against ranked opponents that season and the Hurricanes had a player, Mari Toro, finish the season nationally ranked for the first time since 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews spent the 1998 and 1999 seasons as the assistant coach at Miami before being promoted to associate head coach for the 2000 and 2001 seasons. During that

During that stretch, the Hurricanes won the BIG EAST Championship in both 1998 and 2000. In Yaroshuk-Tews' opening year on staff, UM had its first All-American–Lioudmila Skavronskaia–in three years, quickly ending the program's first two-year drought without one since its first two years of existence (1973-74).

Prior to joining the Miami staff, Yaroshuk-Tews worked at the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Player Development Headquarters in Key Biscayne, Fla., as a traveling coach with the top U.S. junior players. Before her USTA appointment, Yaroshuk-Tews played professionally in satellite and challenger events. A Miami native and Killian High School graduate, Yaroshuk-Tews stood out among Florida juniors. In the Girl's 18 Division, she held the No. 1 ranking in Florida and the No. 8 spot nationally.

Yaroshuk-Tews went on to star at UCLA, where she was a four-year letter winner and two-time ITA All-American. The Bruins made the NCAA Team Championship and finished in the top 15 all four of her seasons on the team, including a trio of top-10 finishes. She made an immediate impact as a freshman in 1993, playing No. 5 singles and No. 2 doubles for UCLA, who finished No. 13 in the nation. Her junior year, in 1995, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 3 singles and No. 3 doubles for the Bruins, who concluded the year sixth in the country after reaching the Elite Eight. Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews made the NCAA Singles Championship and finished ranked No. 78 nationally.

As a senior in 1996, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Bruins, who made the Final Four and ended the season ranked fourth. Yaroshuk-Tews won the PAC-10 Indoor and Outdoor Doubles Championship swith partner Keri Phebus and achieved ITA All-America and All-PAC-10 honors in both singles and doubles. The Bruins' top tandem was ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation during the 1996 "Champs Award," given to the school's most inspirational female athlete, and was named the team's Most Valuable Player. She was also appointed to the Rolex/ITA Collegiate All-Star Team.

Yaroshuk-Tews graduated from UCLA in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, while earning PAC-10 academic honors. She began UM's graduate studies program in elementary education during the spring of 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews is the daughter of Ernie and Carol Yaroshuk. Her father was a member of the University of Miami baseball team from 1961-63, and was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 1992. He holds the third-highest batting average (.448) in the program's single-season history. Yaroshuk-Tews and her father form the only father-daughter duo

On Jan. 10, 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews was married to Scott Tews. The couple lives in Palmetto Bay, Fla., with their daughter, Emma, and son, Landon.

Maci Epstein was named the University of Miami women's tennis team's interim assistant coach Jan. 17, 2020. She will work with the Hurricanes for the entirety of the spring campaign.

Hailing from nearby Winter Park, Fla., Epstein played for the Hurricanes in 2016-17 and served as the team's student assistant coach in 2017-18.

A four-year letter winner at the University of Virginia, Epstein helped the Cavaliers claim the ACC Championship title in 2014 and 2015. She ascended as high at fifth in the ITA doubles rankings as a freshman in 2013, then the best mark in program history.

After redshirting in the spring of 2016 to retain her final year of eligibility, Epstein came to Miami as a graduate transfer for her last season. During her lone campaign with the Hurricanes, she peaked at a career-high No. 69 in the singles rankings and spent much of the year at the top spot in doubles.

A 2016-17 ITA Scholar-Athlete and a 2014-15 VaSID All-State Second Team pick in singles, Epstein concluded her college career with an 89-55 record in singles and a 93-54 tally in doubles.

While finishing her graduate studies in 2017-18, Epstein served on Yaroshuk-Tews' staff and aided the Hurricanes to a spot in the NCAA Championship Sweet 16. The Hurricanes went 18-8 (11-3 ACC) and finished the season ranked No. 17 nationally.

HONORS, RANKINGS & NOTES

2019 Honors

Estela Perez-Somarriba garnered numerous recognitions during one of the best single seasons in both Miami and, as demonstrated by her awards, ACC history. The Madrid native won her second straight ACC Player of the Year distinction, the sixth such accolade for a Miami player, making her the ninth individual in league history to claim the honor twice and the eighth to do so back-to-back. Perez-Somarriba also became the fourth Hurricane to win ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, winning the program's fifth such honor. The fourth person-fifth time-to win both ACC Player of the Year and ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season, Perez-Somarriba also garnered First Team All-ACC plaudits for the third year in a row, becoming the seventh Hurricane with three All-ACC nods at any level. In addition, she earned All-ACC Academic Team accolades, becoming the eighth Hurricane to achieve that status at least three times, and picked up one ACC Player of the Week selection.

Nationally, Perez-Somarriba won the Honda Sport Award for Tennis, given to the best student-athlete in the nation. She is just the third Hurricane to garner the prestigious honor, which saw her rewarded with a trip to Los Angeles for a live ceremony on CBS Sports Network. Perez-Somarriba also earned ITA All-America status in singles for the third straight year, becoming the 10th three-time ITA All-American in Miami history and just the fifth with at least three singles recognitions. Additionally, she received the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Award for Sportsmanship & Leadership, becoming the third player in Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' 18 years at the helm to claim the regional plaudit, including the second in a row.

Daevenia Achong received Second Team All-ACC recognition, becoming just the sixth Miami freshman to pick up All-ACC honors. The Geleen, Netherlands, native also joined Perez-Somarriba on the All-ACC Academic Team. In addition, she picked up two ACC Player of the Week honors and four ACC Freshman of the Week awards, both team highs.

Ana Madcur, Lucia Marzal Daniella Roldan gave Miami its third and fourth All-ACC Academic Team selections. It was the second such distinction for Madcur and the first for both Marzal, who won one ACC Freshman of the Week honor, and Roldan. Miami's five selections were the second-most of any school.

Finally, Achong, Madcur, Perez-Somarriba and Roldan earned ITA Scholar-Athlete status and, for the fifth consecutive year, the Hurricanes were named an ITA Academic Team. Needing just a 3.2 cumulative GPA for the recognition, Miami's roster turned in a 3.478 mark for the school year.

2019 Final Rankings Notes

- The Hurricanes ended the season ranked No. 20 in the country, their 17th consecutive top-25 finish and 15th in the top 20 during that stretch.
- Miami concluded the campaign as the fifth of seven ACC teams in the rankings, alongside third-ranked North Carolina, fourth-ranked Duke, No. 11 NC State, No. 14 Florida State, No. 21 Virginia and No. 23 Wake Forest.
- For the ninth time in 16 years, a Hurricane concluded the season top-five in singles, with Estela Perez-Somarriba placing second, despite entering the postseason ranked first, going undefeated and winning the national title.
- Perez-Somarriba notched the fifth top-two finish in program history, joining Ronni Reis (second in 1988), Megan Bradley (first in 2005) and Audra Cohen (first in 2006 and 2007) and became the third Hurricane with multiple top-five finishes alongside Reis (also fifth in 1986) and Cohen.
- Daevenia Achong finished the season ranked No. 123, her first national ranking of the year after enrolling for the spring semester, giving Miami multiple players on the final list for the 15th straight year.
- Miami had at least one player in the top 30 of the final singles list for the 15th time in 16 years and had a top-10 finisher for the fourth time in five
- In doubles, Achong and Daniella Roldan placed No. 25 to end the year, good for the highest final mark by a Miami duo since 2016.

2019 NCAA Team Championship

The Hurricanes competed in the NCAA Team Championship for the 24th consecutive year, a stretch that dates back to 1996 and is among the 10 longest active streaks in the country. In addition, Miami advanced to the Round of 32 for the 18th straight season, a mark that goes back to Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' first at the helm in 2002.

The Hurricanes went to Stillwater, Okla., where they met Washington State in the opening round. Despite its 14-year first-round shutout streak coming to an end, Miami reached the second round with a 4-3 victory over the Cougars, rallying from a 2-0 deficit.

Once there, Miami squared off with homestanding Oklahoma State, the No. 15 seed in the field. The Hurricanes once again fell into a 2-0 hole before tying the match at three, but could not fight all the way back, dropping a 4-3 decision. It marked just the third time in 16 years and second time in 14 years Miami did not reach the Sweet 16.



HONORS, RANKINGS & NOTES

2019 NCAA Doubles Championship

For the first time since 2015, Miami had a pair compete in the NCAA Doubles Championship. Freshman Daevenia Achong and senior Daniella Roldan earned a spot in the tournament at the USTA National Campus in Orlando, Fla. The 36th and 37th different Hurricanes to make the field, they formed the 28th unique duo to do so.

Achong and Roldan drew Tulsa's Martina Okalova and Vera Ploner in the opening round and came up short. They lost the first set in a tiebreaker and could not rally back in the second, dropping a 6-7 (6-8), 2-6 result.

Perez-Somarriba Claims 2019 NCAA Singles Championship Title

Junior Estela Perez-Somarriba claimed the 2019 NCAA Singles Championship crown at the aforementioned USTA National Campus in Orlando. She became the ninth No. 1 seed to win the title, including the second such Hurricane, as Miami's other champion, Audra Cohen, did so as the top seed in 2007. The 10th three-time NCAA Singles Championship partcipant in program history, Perez-Somarriba gave Miami a player in the field for the 34th time in the 38-year history of the event, including the 17th year in a row.

The Madrid native opened play with a 6-0, 6-1 win over Alabama's Andie Daniell and then topped Texas A&M's Katya Townsend, 6-2, 6-0, to become the third Hurricane with three Sweet 16 berths and the second to do so in back-to-back years. It marked the 15th time in 16 years a Hurricane reached the Sweet 16 and set a program record by making it five years in a row the feat occurred.

Next, Perez-Somarriba notched a 4-6, 6-0, 7-6 (7-3) comeback win over VCU's Paola Diaz-Delgao and followed it with a 6-4, 6-4 triumph over Illinois' Asuka Kawai to put a Hurricane in the Final Four for the fourth time in five years. Also a 2017 semifininalist, she is one of 30 players in NCAA history with at least two Final Four berths. Just three other ACC players have achieved the feat, including one fellow Hurricane, Laura Vallverdu, who did so in 2009 and 2010.

Perez-Somarriba beat North Carolina's Cameron Morra, 6-3, 6-1, to claim the third finals appearance by a Miami player. Once there, she met second-seeded Katarina Jokic of Georgia and dropped the first set before rallying for a 6-7 (1-7), 6-2, 6-3 win that she clinched on her seventh championship point.

 - * Miami has outscored its opponents by a 97-6 margin during the 24-match winning streak, posting 22 shutouts, and has a 104-10 margin overall with 23 shutouts in home NCAA Team Championship action

Consecutive Season Opener Wins: 25

- The Hurricanes have won their first match of the season in each of the last 25 years, dating back to 1995
 - * Overall, Miami is 45-2 in season openers, with the lone defeats coming in 1994 and 1986

Consecutive Home Opener Wins: 48

- In all 48 years of the program's history, the Hurricanes have won their first match on their home court

Since the NCAA Singles Championship began in 1982, 27 Hurricanes have combined for 60 total berths in the field, posting an overall record of 92-58 (.613). At least one Hurricane has participated 34 of 38 years (all but 1996 and 2000-02), with multiple players doing so 18 times, including three competing on five occasions (1984-87 and 2007) and four once (2009). Five times (four players), a Hurricane has been seeded first and two of the nine No. 1 seeds to claim the title were Hurricanes. Of the four ACC players (30 total in NCAA history) to make multiple semifinal appearances through 2019, two were Hurricanes.

Since the NCAA Team Championship began in 1982, Miami has made the field 34 of 38 years (all but 1990 and 1993-95) and posted an overall record of 54-34 (.614). Miami has made the NCAA finals twice, falling to USC, 6-3, in Oklahoma City in 1985 and dropping a 4-1 decision against Stanford on the Cardinal's home court in Stanford, Calif., in 2006. Additionally, the Hurricanes made the Final Four in 1986 and defeated Trinty (Texas), 5-4, in Austin, Texas, in the third-place match.
