STARTING FIVE

■ In the win over Duke, Jazmine Jones scored a career-high 26 points on 9-14 shooting and added 10 rebounds for her first double-double of the season and the third of her career. Her previous career-high was 25 points against Central Michigan on Nov. 14, 2019. It marked her first double-double since she had 13 points and 12 rebounds in the win over UConn on Jan. 31, 2019. She ranks third in the ACC with a 57.7 shooting percentage. She leads the team with 1.5 steals per game, ranks second with 14.4 points per game and 3.5 assists per game, and third with 5.1 rebounds. Jones has six 20-point scoring games this season which is tied for the lead in the ACC. She is averaging 20.3 points per game in ACC play, which ranks fourth in the league.

■ Jones became UofL's 30th 1,000 point scorer with her 26 points in the win over Duke. She is the 11th player to eclipse 1,000 points under head coach Jeff Walz. The previous player to record 1,000 points was Sam Fuehring, who finished her career with 1,017 points, and eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau against Oregon State in the NCAA Regional semifinal win over Oregon State.






■ Dana Evans was named to Wooden Award Midseason Top 25. She ranks second in the ACC with 18.5 points per game. She leads the league and ranks 11th in the country with 44 made 3-pointers. She is shooting 43.1 percent from beyond the arc, which leads the league and ranks 39th in the country. Her 3.9 assists per game rank eighth in the ACC. She has scored in double figures in 14 of 15 games and her five 20-plus point games rank fourth in the ACC. She was 10-10 from the line at UT Martin and leads the league and ranks 11th in the country with a 90.7 free throw percentage. She had just six assists in the first four games, but is averaging 4.8 assists per game in the 11 games since. She had 18 assists combined against Kentucky and UT Martin.

■ UofL is giving up 58.1 points per game, which ranks third in the ACC, and have held opponents to 67 points or less in all but one game. In three ACC games, they are holding opponents to 54.3 points per game, which leads the league.

■ The win against Duke marked the fourth time this season that UofL has overcome a double-digit deficit to record a win. They trailed by a season-high 13 points (20-7) in the win over Duke. They also trailed by double digits in the wins over No. 1 Oregon, Kentucky and UT Martin.

ABOUT THE HURRICANES

Miami enters Thursday's contest with a 9-5 record, 1-2 in ACC play. The Hurricanes opened conference play with a 59-56 win over Wake Forest, but have lost their last two games - at Georgia Tech (L, 61-54) and vs. No. 8 Florida State (L, 73-62). Four of their five losses have come to AP Top 25 Teams as they fell 89-83 at DePaul, 75-53 to Oregon State and 58-45 to Indiana. They have the fourth toughest schedule in the country. They are averaging 69.1 points per game, which ranks ninth in the ACC, while giving up 64.2 points per game, which also ranks ninth. Senior Beatrice Mompremier was an Associated Press and WBCA All-America Honorable Mention a season ago and was chosen as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year by the head coaches and Blue Ribbon Panel. She ranks third in the ACC with 10.4 rebounds per game, fifth with a 51.2 field goal percentage and 1.7 blocks per game, and seventh with 16.3 points per game. She has seven double-doubles on the year. Junior Mykea Gray ranks second on the team with 12.1 points per game and ranks seventh in the league with 1.7 steals, while junior Kelsey Marshall is averaging 10.6 points per game, shooting 34.1 percent from deep and knocking down 30 3-pointers, which both rank eighth in the ACC.

■ **Series History** - UofL is 4-2 all-time against Miami, 4-1 since joining the ACC. The Cards are 2-2 at home and 2-0 on the road. Last season, Louisville fell 79-73 at the KFC Yum! Center, which marked their lone home loss of the season. UofL won 84-74 in their last matchup at Miami.

■ **The Last Meeting (Feb. 17, 2019)** - No. 2 Louisville dropped its first home game of the season to No. 20 Miami, 79-73. The Hurricanes shot 67 percent from the field in the second half. The loss ended an 18-game winning streak at the KFC Yum! Center for the Cardinals. Senior Asia Durr led UofL in scoring with 16 points while sophomore Dana Evans pitched in 14 points. Junior Kylee Shook added 12 points on 4-of-5 shooting from 3-point range, while grabbing six boards. Junior Bionca Dunham had 12 points on 6-7 shooting, while adding eight rebounds. The Cardinals shot 31 percent in the second half.

QUICK HITTERS

■ In the last two-plus years, UofL is a combined 82-8. Prior to the loss at Ohio State, the previous seven losses had all come to AP Top 25 teams, five to Top 5 teams.

■ UofL overcame a 13-point deficit (20-7) to win 60-55 against Duke, which marked their largest deficit to overcome this season.

■ After not trailing at halftime in the first 10 games, UofL trailed at half in three of the last five games; Kentucky (40-31), UT Martin (31-26), Duke (31-25).

■ UofL had 25 points in the first half against Duke, which marked a season low.

■ Louisville took a 28-point lead (50-22) into halftime at Clemson, which marked their largest lead at the half this season.

■ UofL's 5.2 blocks per game rank second in the ACC and 22nd in the country.

JAMMIN' WITH JAZ

Jazmine Jones scored a career-high 26 points on 9-14 shooting and became UofL's 30th 1,000-point scorer in the win over Duke. She added 10 rebounds for her first double-double of the season. She ranks third in the ACC with a 57.7 shooting percentage. She leads the team with 1.5 steals per game, ranks second with 14.4 points per game and 3.5 assists per game, and third with 5.1 rebounds. Jones has six 20-point scoring games this season which is tied for the lead in the ACC. She was named College Sports Madness ACC Player of the Week after scoring 24 points on 8-12 shooting, 7-8 from the stripe, in the win over Syracuse. She was 14-of-19 against NKU and UK. She shot 9-of-10 en route to a game-high 21 points in the win over Northern Kentucky. She did not make the start at NKU on 12/8, which ended a streak of 84 consecutive starts. She scored 24 points against UT Arlington on 11/28 and her scoring average reached a season-high 16.5 points per game.

AT THE STRIPE

The Cardinals are shooting 76.4 percent from the free throw line which leads the ACC and ranks 22nd in the country. They shot 18-20 in the double overtime win at UT Martin.

APPROACHING MILESTONES

- **Seeking all-time win No. 900** - With 892 wins, UofL is eight wins shy of 900 all-time.
- **Walz seeks 350th win** - At 345-101, Jeff Walz is five victories shy of win No. 350.
- **Jones seeks to play more games than any Cardinal in history** - Jazmine Jones has played in 127 games and is 15 games played away from tying Myisha Hines-Allen (2014-2018) and Shoni Schimmel (2010-14) for most games played with 142.
- **Jones adds name to 1,000-point club** - With 26 points against Duke, Jazmine Jones became UofL's 30th 1,000 point scorer and the 11th under head coach Jeff Walz.

DON'T GET SHOOK

Kylee Shook is nearly averaging a double-double on the season with 8.6 points per game and 8.2 rebounds. Her 8.6 rebounds per game rank 12th in the ACC, while her 2.4 blocks lead the league. She has scored in double figures in seven of 15 games this season. She has six double doubles on the year and 12 for her career. Her six double-double rank sixth in ACC and 33rd in the NCAA. She had 15 points, 11 rebounds and six blocks at UT Martin and 11 points, 13 rebounds and five blocks in the win over UK with 11 points, nine rebounds and four blocks coming in the second half. In the win over Oregon, she had a season-high 18 points and tied a career-high with 15 rebounds.

YAYA BRINGS THE ENERGY

Yacine Diop had season-highs in the win at UT Martin with 15 points, seven rebounds and 28 minutes. She averaged 2.8 points and 2.7 rebounds through the first nine games, but in the last six games, she ranks third on the team with 8.5 points and 5.0 rebounds per game, while shooting 19-36 (.528) from the field, 2-4 from 3-point range and 11-14 from the stripe.

BALOGUN IS BALLIN'

Elizabeth Balogun tied her season-high with 15 points at Clemson, shooting 6-10 and 3-6 from 3-point range. She also added five blocks, five rebounds and three assists, while committing just one turnover. She has scored in double figures eight times this season, including two of the last three games. She was 5-6 from 3-point range and scored 15 points in the season opener against WKU and played all 40 minutes, contributing 11 points, in the win over No. 1 Oregon.

IN ACC PLAY

Louisville is 32-3 in ACC games the last three seasons. They are 16-2 in home games and 16-1 in road games during the stretch. Its lone road loss an 82-68 defeat at No. 1 Notre Dame on 1/10/19. It two home losses (L, 79-73 vs. No. 20 Miami on 2/17/19; L, 50-49 vs. No. 12 FSU on 1/21/18).

OPENING LEAGUE PLAY

Louisville is 3-0 to open league play for the first time since 2018-19. That season, they opened the ACC at 6-0 before falling to 50-49 to No. 12 Florida State on Jan. 21. They finished 15-1 in league play. Last season, the Cardinals opened 2-0 in league play before falling 82-68 at No. 1 ND.

- With the win over Syracuse, UofL has won their last seven conference openers, including going 6-0 in ACC openers. Their last loss in a conference opener was an 86-80 defeat at DePaul in 2012-13. Overall, Walz is 11-2 in conference openers, 7-0 on home, and his teams have won 11 of their last 12. The other blemish came in 2008 at Syracuse (L, 79-56).
- UofL has won its last three conference road openers after winning 75-50 at Clemson. Last year, they won 73-51 at Duke on Jan. 6, 2019 and they won 74-71 at Georgia Tech on Dec. 28, 2017. Their last loss in an ACC road opener was a 58-55 loss at No. 13 Duke on Jan. 2, 2017. UofL is 5-1 in ACC road openers. All-time, Walz in 10-3 in conference road openers.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

UofL is 28-3 in true road games over the last three seasons. Prior to the loss at Ohio State, their only losses came to No. 1 teams (1/10/19 at No. 1 ND, L, 82-68; 2/12/18 at No. 1 UConn, L, 69-58). Their previous road loss to a non-No. 1 team was an 85-66 setback at No. 7 Notre Dame on 2/16/17. Their previous road loss to an unranked team was a 71-69 loss at Western Kentucky on 11/21/15. The Cards went 11-1 in true road games last season and 7-1 in ACC road games.

- Last Year: UofL went 16-3 away from the KFC Yum! Center (includes 5-2 neutral record).
- UofL has won 168 games away from home since Walz's arrival in 2007-08. UofL boasts a 168-75 (.691) record in those contests (includes 51-25 record for neutral site games).

DE-FENSE, DE-FENSE

UofL is giving up 58.1 points per game, which ranks third in the ACC, and have held opponents to 67 points or less in all but one game. In three ACC games, they are holding opponents to 54.3 points per game, which leads the league.

- Louisville held Oregon to just 62 points in the 72-62 win. The Ducks' previous smallest point total was 81 in an 81-64 win over No. 17 Syracuse. Oregon entered the game averaging 93.0 points. Last season, they scored 62 points or less twice and went 0-2 in those games.

70-PLUS POINTS

UofL is 239-23 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz. They have scored 70-plus in 10 of 14 games this season and are 10-0 in those games. Last year, they scored 70-plus in 29 of 36 games and went 26-3 in those games. Their 79-73 loss to Miami ended a 49-game winning streak when scoring 70-plus points.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 12th season as a head coach, has compiled a 345-101 (.774) record as the Cardinals' leader. He has led Louisville to nine NCAA Sweet 16 appearances, five Elite 8's, three trips to Final 4 (2009, 2013, 2018), two of which culminated with NCAA runner-up finishes (2009, 2013). Walz, who is averaging 27.6 wins per season, became the winningest coach in program history in 2013-14. He also has the most 20-win seasons in school history (11) and the top-six entries for most victories in a season (36 in 2017-18, 34 in 2008-09; 33 in 2013-14; 32 in 2018-19; and 29 in 2012-13 and 2016-17).



Hired on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native took the program to its first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent time on four other coaching staffs: Western Kentucky (1996-97), Nebraska (1997-01), Minnesota (2001-02), and Maryland (2002-07). He helped Maryland win the program's first national title in 2006.

UofL has shot above 50 percent three times this season and are 3-0 in those games. Overall, they boast a 113-1 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz. Their lone loss came on Nov. 29, 2008 at Nevada when they shot 50.8 percent (L, 85-82). Last year, UofL shot over 50 percent in 12 of 36 games and went 12-0 in those games.

BOARDED UP

UofL is averaging 15.0 offensive rebounds, which ranks third in the ACC, and their +8.4 rebounding margin ranks sixth. They outrebounded opponents in all 12 non-conference games, but have yet to outrebound their opponent in ACC play. Their 41.9 rebounds per game rank seventh in the ACC.

KYLEE BECOMES UOFL'S ALL-TIME BLOCKS LEADER

Shook now has 173 career blocks after recording six blocks at UTM to become UofL's all-time leader, surpassing Angel McCoughtry (2006-09) who had 162. She recorded five blocks against CMU to pass Audrey Baines (144, 1976-80) for second place all-time in program history.

EVANS EARNS PLAYER OF WEEK HONORS

Evans was named College Sports Madness ACC Player of the Week after scoring 18 points and tying a career-high with 10 assists in the win at UK. It marked her second career double-double and both have come in Lexington. She had 11 points and 10 assists at UK on Dec. 17, 2017. She was named espnW, USBWA and ACC Player of the Week following her MVP performance at the Paradise Jam. She finished the week averaging a tournament-best 21.3 points, while shooting 47 percent from the floor, 11-21 (.524) from 3-point range and 17-18 (.944) from the free throw line.

OVERCOMING DOUBLE DIGIT DEFICITS

The win against Duke marked the fourth time this season that UofL has overcome a double-digit deficit to record a win. Against Duke, UofL trailed by a season-high 13 points at 20-7 towards the end of the first quarter. They trailed 31-25 at halftime. They took the lead at 49-47 with 7:15 to go and never trailed again in a 60-55 win. At UT Martin, they trailed 10-0 to start the game and trailed by five (47-42) with 3:34 to go. They took their first lead at 49-47 with 2:03 remaining before going to double overtime. The Cardinals scored the final 10 points in double OT to secure the 71-63 win. Against UK, they trailed by 10 (55-45) with three minutes to go in the third quarter prior to going on 13-0 run and winning 67-66. They trailed by 11 (24-13) at the end of the first quarter against No. 1 Oregon prior to winning 72-62.

QUARTERLY REPORT

Other than scoring 25 points in the first and second quarter at Clemson, UofL has failed to score 20 points in 15 of the last 17 quarters. They scored 12 points in the first and third quarter at UT Martin, which is its smallest point total in both quarters. They then scored 12 points in the second and fourth quarter against Syracuse. UofL's smallest point total in a quarter this season is nine in the fourth quarter at UK. Their 31 points in the third quarter at NKU tied the most points in a quarter this season. They led 37-35 at half and then outscored the Norse 31-9 in the third quarter to open up a 68-44 lead. They also had 31 points in the first quarter against Boise State.

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

UofL is 12-1 against unranked teams. Prior to the 67-60 loss at Ohio State, they had won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25. Their previous loss to an unranked team was a 79-66 setback vs. Dayton in the Gulf Coast Showcase in Estero, Fla. on 11/29/15.

TWO DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Dana Evans (18 points, 10 assists) and Kylee Shook (11 points, 13 rebounds) both had double-doubles in the 67-66 win over Kentucky. It marked the first time UofL has had two double-doubles in the same game since Sam Fuehring (10 points, 12 rebounds) and Jazmine Jones (13 points, 12 rebounds) in the 78-69 win over UConn on Jan. 31, 2019.

DANA FROM DEEP

Dana Evans scored 27 points at Clemson, just one point shy of her career-high. She knocked down a career-high seven 3-pointers (7-13). In the first half, she had 24 points on 9-12 shooting, 6-8 from deep. Her seven 3-pointers were the most by a UofL player since Asia Durr knocked down an ACC record 11 3-pointers (11-17) en route to tying her own school record with 47 points in the 92-62 win over NC State on Senior Night on 2/28/19.

A THREE BARRAGE

Louisville made a season-high 12 3-pointers (12-31) in the win at Clemson. It marks the most threes in a game since they knocked down 15 (15-34) against NC State on 2/28/19. Last year's season high for 3-pointers in a game was 16 (16-34) in the 102-80 season opening win at WKU.

A ONE-POINT WIN

The 67-66 win at UK marked Louisville's first one-point win since they won 59-58 against No. 17 NC State on March 3, 2017 in the ACC Tournament quarters. The Cardinals scoring margin on the season is +16.6 points, which ranks fifth in ACC.

OVERTIME WIN

UofL's 71-63 double overtime win at UT Martin marked the first overtime win since the Cards won 95-90 in overtime against No. 5 Ohio State in Columbus on Nov. 12, 2017. It marked their first double overtime game since they won 87-82 against Rutgers in double overtime on March 8, 2009 in the first round of the Big East Tournament in Hartford, Conn.

WIN OVER NO. 1

UofL's 72-62 win over No. 1 Oregon marked its second ever win over a No. 1 team, first since their 82-81 victory over No. 1 Baylor in the 2013 NCAA Tournament. The Cards are 2-11 all-time against AP No. 1 teams (1-0 vs. Baylor, 1-0 vs. Oregon, 0-10 vs. UConn, 0-1 vs. Notre Dame).

MOVING UP TO NO. 2 IN BOTH POLLS

UofL moved up six spots in the AP poll to No. 2 and seven spots in the USA Today poll to No. 2 following their win over No. 1 Oregon. It matched their highest ever ranking in both polls. Four other times Louisville has been ranked second in the AP poll, three times last season and once in 2017-18. Five other times, they have been second in the USA Today, three times last season, once in 2017-18 and at the end of the 2008-09 season.

TOP FIVE WINS

Louisville's win over No. 1 Oregon marked Walz's 11th against a top five team in his tenure.

VS. AP TOP 25

UofL is 2-0 against AP Top 25 teams this year. Overall, Walz has 62 wins over AP Top 25 teams and 51 in the last 10 years.

STAYING IN THE TOP 10

UofL has remained in the AP Top 10 for 47 straight polls and the USA Today Top 10 for 47 straight polls, both program records. Louisville had remained in the AP Top 5 for 37 consecutive weeks (Nov. 13, 2017-March 18, 2019) prior to being picked ninth in this year's preseason poll. They were in the USA Today Top 5 for 36 consecutive weeks (Nov. 27, 2017-March 18, 2019) before being picked sixth in last year's final poll.

PRESEASON AP/USA TODAY POLLS

UofL was picked ninth in the preseason AP and USA Today polls. They were also picked ninth in the preseason AP poll in 2017-18. That season they finished with a program-best 36-3 record and advanced to the final four.

SUCCESS AGAINST AP TOP 25 IN 2018-19

Louisville was 8-4 against AP Top 25 teams last season. The win over No. 2 UConn marked their second straight win over a top 5 team at the KFC Yum! Center, following the win over No. 2 Notre

MOST WINS IN SCHOOL HISTORY

UofL's 32 wins (32-4) last season, marked the fourth most victories in a single season. The top six and nine of the 10 top win totals in program history have come under Walz.

BACK-TO-BACK 30 WIN SEASONS

Louisville is coming off of back-to-back 30-win seasons for the first time in program history, going a combined 68-7 over the last two seasons, the best two-year stretch in program history. They have finished the last two seasons with 30-plus wins, an ACC regular season championship and as a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

After going 32-4 in 2018-19, head coach Jeff Walz now has 11 20-win seasons in 12 years, adding to what was already the most in school history.

■ **Longest stretches in school history** - UofL has won at least 20 games for nine consecutive seasons, the longest stretch in program history. The longest run previously was three, achieved just twice in school history. They have reached the NCAA Tournament nine straight times, which is also the longest stretch in program history.

SENIOR CLASS HAS CHANCE TO SET NEW STANDARD

Bionca Dunham, Jazmine Jones, Jessica Laemmle and Kylee Shook have an opportunity to be the third straight senior class to conclude their career as the most accomplished class in program history. They are 111-16 (.874), just 12 wins shy of tying the program-record 123 wins. They are on pace to set program-record for winning percentage and with less than six losses the rest of the way, will set the program-record for fewest losses. This year's class is 9-3 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and are just two tournament wins shy of setting the program-record for wins in a four-year period. The record is 11 by the 2015-16, 2014-15 and 2013-14 classes. They also have the opportunity to be the first class in program history to advance to the Sweet 16 all four years.

■ **Last year's historic senior class** - Arica Carter, Asia Durr and Sam Fuehring finished their career as the most accomplished senior class in program history, going 123-23 (.842) overall in the last four years, which marks the most wins by a class ever, surpassing Myisha Hines-Allen, who wrapped her career with a 118-26 (.819) record. They also finished their careers with the fewest losses and the best winning percentage in program history. Last year's senior class went 10-4 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

RETURNING POINT PRODUCTION

After losing three players to the WNBA Draft (Durr, Carter, Fuehring), UofL returns 39.4 points, 50.6 percent of their production. In 2018-19, they returned 60.6 points per game, which was 79.0 percent of their production.

RETURNING STARTERS

The Cardinals return two starters from last year (Bionca Dunham, Jazmine Jones). Jones started all 36 games last year and has started all 75 games the last two seasons. She entered the season with 76 career starts to lead Louisville. Dunham started 31 of 36 games a season ago. Dana Evans made five starts last season en route to being named ACC Sixth Player of the Year, while Kylee Shook made three starts, and Yacine Diop and Mykasa Robinson had two starts each. Shook entered the year with 17 career starts after making 13 starts as a freshman. Elizabeth Balogun and Elizabeth Dixon started all 30 games for the Yellow Jackets last season.

Elizabeth Balogun was named to the Citizen Naismith Top 50 Watch List, along with being picked #23 on espnW's list of the Top 25 players in the country.

EVANS NAMED TO WOODEN AWARD WATCH LIST

Dana Evans was named to the Wooden Award Top 30 Watch List. The list is comprised of 30 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious honors.

LOUISVILLE PICKED FIRST IN ACC PRESEASON POLLS

UofL was picked first in the league in both polls after claiming back-to-back regular season titles. COACHING STAFF CHANGE

After six straight seasons of having the same assistants, Walz was forced to make a new addition after Samantha Williams was named head coach at Eastern Kentucky following eight seasons at UofL. Jonneshia Pineda arrives from Georgia Tech and is in her first season on Walz's staff. Sam Purcell enters his seventh season, while Stephanie Norman has been with Walz all 13 seasons.

MELTING POT

Louisville's 2019-20 roster continues last year's pattern of being diverse. Of the 16 student-athletes on its roster, eight are from different states (California, Colorado, Florida, Indiana, Kentucky, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas). Yacine Diop is from Dakar, Senegal and Norika Konno is from Sendai, Japan, while Elizabeth Balogun was born in Lagos, Nigeria.

MY OLD KENTUCKY HOME

UofL has five Kentucky natives in Lindsey Duvall (Bullitt East), Jessica Laemmle (Mercy Academy), Molly Lockhart (Butler), Seygan Robins (Mercer County) and Mykasa Robinson (Ashland).

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 30-11 record in NCAA Tournament games. He is eighth all-time in winning percentage and 5th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), three Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018), five Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019), nine trips to the Sweet 16 and 11 NCAA Tournaments.

WALZ NAMED USA BASKETBALL NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

After leading the USA Basketball team to a perfect 7-0 record and a gold medal at the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand, Jeff Walz was announced as a recipient of the 2019 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award. With Walz at the helm, the USA U19 women topped its competition by an average of 25.2 points per game, including beating Australia 74-70 in overtime in the gold medal contest. Kentucky's Rhyné Howard was named to all-tournament team.

CARDS EARNED NO. 1 SEED FOR SECOND CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Last year, UofL was a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year and for the second time in program history. They advanced to the Elite Eight for the fifth time in program history and for the second straight year. In 2017-18, as a No. 1 seed they advanced to the Final Four after winning their four regional games by an average margin of 27.5 points. UofL is 7-2 all-time in the NCAA Tournament as a No. 1 seed.

WINNING A SECOND STRAIGHT ACC REGULAR SEASON TITLE

Last season, with the 67-40 win at Pitt, the Cards concluded ACC play with a 14-2 record and clinched their second straight ACC regular season title. It marked the program's seventh regular season conference crown and the first time in program history that they have won back-to-back.

HISTORY IN BIG DANCE

Last season, UofL made its 22nd NCAA Tournament appearance and 11th in 12 seasons under Walz. The Cardinals made their ninth straight NCAA Tournament and 14th in the last 15 years. Louisville is 34-22 all-time. They were 4-11 in their first 11 appearances and are 30-11 in their 11 appearances with Walz. They have moved on to the Sweet 16 nine times, Elite 8 five times and advanced to the NCAA Final Four three times (2009, 2013, 2018). With three Final Fours in the last 11 years, UofL ranks fourth in the country behind UConn (11), Stanford (6) and Notre Dame (6).

CARDINALS WELCOME IN COCHRAN, RUSSELL, SMITH AND VAN LITH

Louisville signed four top players to their 2020 class for the No. 5 class per espnW HoopGurlz - Olivia Cochran, a 6-foot-3 forward from Columbus, Ga., Merissah Russell, a 5-foot-11 guard from Ottawa, Ontario, Ahlana Smith, a 5-foot-9 guard from Charlotte, N.C., and Hailey Van Lith, a 5-foot-7 guard from Wenatchee, Wash.

■ **Cochran** comes to Louisville as the No. 18-ranked player in the class of 2020, according to espnW HoopGurlz. The five-star prospect is tabbed as the fourth-best player at the forward position. Prospects Nation ranks her No. 10 overall and as the third-best forward, while she is ranked No. 26 by PASS Scouting Service. She was named a first team Class 4-A All-State selection by the Atlanta Journal Constitution in 2018 and 2019, while being named honorable mention as a freshman in 2017. She was also named Georgia Class 4A All-State in 2018 and 2019.

■ **Russell** is ranked as the 29th best guard by espnW. She is listed as a four-star prospect by Prospects Nation and is rated No. 54 overall by PASS Scouting Service. She played for Canada's U19 team at the 2019 FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand. She was also a member of Canada's Senior National team and participated as the youngest player on the roster in a five-game European exhibition tour in Belgium and Great Britain.

■ **Smith** is a 5-foot-9 shooting guard playing for Gulf Coast State junior college during the 2019-20 season. She spent the 2018-19 season at UCLA, where she played in 32 games, the most of among freshmen on the team. She averaged 12.6 minutes, 3.0 points and 1.9 rebounds on the year. At Mallard Creek High School, she was named First Team All-MeCKa 4A and State Tournament MVP as the Mavericks went 29-1 overall in her junior year.

■ **Van Lith** is a consensus top-10 player in the 2020 class and was a member of the U19 USA squad that won a gold medal in the FIBA World Cup in July. She has been a part of four USA gold medal teams (2019 FIBA U19 World Cup, 2019 FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cup, 2018 Youth Olympic Games, 2018 FIBA U17 World Cup). She is ranked as the No. 2 prospect in the nation by Prospect Nation and No. 8 overall and the top guard by espnW HoopGurlz. She was the Gatorade Player of the Year in Washington last season.
