THE GAME

- The Miami Hurricanes kick off their second season under the direction of head coach Manny Diaz at Hard Rock Stadium against UAB on Sept. 10.
- After opening the past two seasons with neutral site matchups 2018 vs. LSU in Arlington, Texas at the AdvoCare Classic and 2019 vs. Florida in Orlando at the Camping World Kickoff, Miami will open its season at home for the first time since 2017 - a 41-13 win vs. Bethune-Cookman.
- The game will be broadcast on ACC Network with Dave O'Brien (pxp), Tim Hassebeck (color) and Katie George (sidelines) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 19th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game on Unanimo Deportes 990AM live from Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 10.

The Miami Hurricanes and the UAB Blazers will be meeting for the first time on the gridiron in the Sept. 10 showdown at Hard Rock Stadium.

THE SEASON

- Miami's adjusted 2020 schedule was released in July by the Atlantic Coast Conference; due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Hurricanes will play only 11 games this year - one non-conference game and 10 ACC games. Miami opens its season Sept. 10 against UAB in its Ione non-ACC game of 2020.
- In conjunction with the Miami Dolphins and Hard Rock Stadium, Miami Hurricanes football games will have a maximum of 13,000 fans this year.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami returns 11 starters and 39 letterwinners from a 2019 team that finished 6-7 in head coach Manny Diaz's first year at the helm in Coral Gables.
- On July 27, Diaz named redshirt senior D'Eriq King Miami's starting quarterback for the season. King, who announced his decision to transfer to Miami in January 2020, spent the first four seasons of his career at Houston, where he compiled 82 total touchdowns, 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards despite starting just 22 games. He was a 2018 Maxwell Award semifinalist honoring the sport's most outstanding offensive player.
- Miami had several players earn major preseason accolades, including QB **D'Eriq King** (Davey O'Brien Award, Maxwell Award), TE **Brevin Jordan** (Mackey Award), DE Quincy Roche (Bednarik Award, Nagurski Trophy) and LB Zach McCloud (Danny Wuerffel Trophy), among others,
- Diaz, who was the defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes from 2016-2018, retooled Miami's offensive staff this past offseason, hiring Rhett Lashlee as offensive coordinator from Southern Methodist. He also added wide receivers coach Rob Likens, who spent 2019 as offensive coordinator at Arizona State, and offensive line coach Garin Justice, who was offensive coordinator at UNLV. Diaz also added UM legend Ed Reed as Chief of Staff.

THE OPPONENT

- . UAB is under the direction of Bill Clark, who led the Blazers to a 45-35 win over Central Arkansas in their 2020 season opener on Sept. 3.
- . Clark, who has been head coach at UAB since 2014, has led the Blazers to at least eight wins in each of the past three seasons, including a 11-3 record and 7-1 C-USA record in 2018. He has compiled an impressive 23-9 record in C-USA play during his four seasons at the helm of the Blazers.

QUICH HITS

MIAMI OPENS 2020 SEASON VS. BLAZERS

- Miami plays the first game of any Power-5 team this fall when it hosts UAB at Hard Rock Stadium on Thursday, Sept. 10 at 8 p.m. on ACC Network.
- Miami has not lost a home opener since 2006, and have emerged victorious in its last 13 home openers - including a 63-0 victory vs. Bethune-Cookman in 2019.
- . The Hurricanes finished 4-2 at home in 2018 and are 20-5 in 25 regular season home games since Diaz joined the UM staff as defensive coordinator in January 2016.
- The Hurricanes have never lost a home opener at Hard Rock Stadium, racking up an impressive 12-0 record in openers at the facility since moving there in 2008.
- Miami has never played UAB prior to the upcoming matchup on Sept. 10.

CORAL GABLES HAS A NEW KING: D'ERIQ

- Redshirt senior **D'Eriq King** will make the first start of his Miami career on Thurs., Sept. 10 against UAB; he was named Miami's starting QB by head coach Manny Diaz in late July.
- King spent the first four seasons of his career at Houston before electing to transfer for his final year of eligibility; the Manyel Texas native was selected to the watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award and the Maxwell Award this preseason.
- King totaled a whopping 82 total touchdowns during his time with the Cougars and was one of the most prolific quarterbacks in FBS.
- King carries an FBS-record, 15-game streak of at least one rushing TD and one passing TD into Thursday night's game.

DIAZ HIRES ED REED AS CHIEF OF STAFF

- . Head coach Manny Diaz hired Ed Reed as the University of Miami's chief of staff this past spring, adding the former College and Football Pro Hall of Famer to the program. Reed will serve in an advisory role to Diaz and assist in several different areas.
- Diaz also retooled Miami's offensive staff, hiring OC Rhett Lashlee from Southern Methodist, where he led the Mustangs to unprecedented offensive success during his two years there
- . Joining Lashlee on Miami's offensive staff were Rob Likens, who spent last year as offensive coordinator at Arizona State and Garin Justice. who was OC at UNLV in 2019.
- Likens will serve as Miami's wide receivers coach while Justice will take over as offensive line coach at The U

The Hurricanes have won five national championships in program history (1983, 1987, 1989, 1991, 2001) – tied for the sixth-most in the history of Division I college football.

6.0

Redshirt senior defensive end Quincy Roche, who was last year's American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year, was one of just two FBS players with a game of 6.0 TFLs.

Miami ranked No. 4 in FBS and led the ACC with an average of 8.3 tackles for loss per game last year (108 total); the Hurricanes were one of only 14 teams in FBS to post more than 100 team tackles for loss in 2019.

The Hurricanes are opening their 13th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Thurs., Sept. 10 against UAB. Miami enters the game with a 12-0 record in home openers at the stadium.

MIAMI OPENS POWER-5 CFB THURSDAY NIGHT AT HARD ROCK STADIUM

- The Miami Hurricanes will be the first Power-5 team to play football this fall, and will host UAB in their lone nonconference game of the season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 10 (ACC Network).
- The Hurricanes will be playing the Blazers for the first time in the history of the two programs.
- With an adjusted 2020 slate due to COVID-19, Miami will play one nonconference game and 10 ACC games this fall; after its game with UAB, Miami travels to Louisville, Ky., on Sept. 19 to play Louisville.
- For the season, it was determined that the two teams with the best ACC record of the 15 members for 2020 will play in the ACC Championship Game; there is no Atlantic or Coastal Division for the fall.
- Thursday's game will represent the Hurricanes' fifth ever time playing on ACC Network, which
 debuted last fall; Miami is 2-2 in games all-time on ACC Network, including 2-1 in home games.
- The game will also be broadcast live by 560 WQAM "The Joe" and Unanimo Deportes 990 AM.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS

- The Miami Hurricanes open their 13th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 10 vs. UAB;
 Miami holds a 12-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 563-69 for an average margin of victory of 41.2 points in those 12 games including a 63-0 win in 2019.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 13 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a conference opponent in only three of its 17 home openers: Florida State twice (2004, 2006) and Georgia Tech once (2009).
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 17 times and is 15-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 29-11 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

A NEW KING IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ NAMED MIAMI'S STARTING QB

- QB D'Eriq King was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach Manny Diaz on July 27. King transferred to Miami in January for his final year of eligibility after four years at Houston.
- King had a prolific career with the Cougars, totaling 82 total touchdowns (50 passing, 28 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return), 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards in just 22 starts.
 King, who totaled 6,346 yads of offense at UH, enters 2020 with an FBS record of 15 straight games with at least one passing and one rushing TD; he broke Tim Tebow's record (14) in his final UH start.
- King, who split time at wide receiver and quarterback as a true freshman with the Cougars in 2016, became the first player in school history to throw a touchdown, catch a touchdown and return a kickoff for a touchdown in the same game when he managed the feat at Texas State.
- The Manvel, Texas native was named to the watch list for the Maxwell Award (nation's most outstanding player) and Davey O'Brien Award (nation's top quarterback) during the preseason.

THREE MORE GRAD TRANSFERS WILL BOLSTER HURRICANES IN 2020

- It wasn't just QB D'Eriq King who elected to spend 2020 at The U; DE Quincy Roche (Temple), K
 Jose Borregales (FIU) and OL Jarrid Williams (Houston) will also be suiting up for the Hurricanes.
- Roche delivered a dominant career at Temple, totaling 137 tackles, 39.5 tackles for loss and 26.0 sacks in three seasons. He was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2019, ranking No. 5 in FBS with 13 sacks and No. 11 in FBS with 19.0 tackles for loss with the Owls.
- Borregales, the all-time leading scorer at crosstown FIU, finished his Panthers career with 281 career points. He was a Lou Groza Award finalist as FBS' top kicker in 2018 and has 50 career field goals.
- Williams, expected to start at right tackle for Miami, started all 13 games at the position for the Cougars in 2018. He saw action in four games last season before suffering a season-ending injury.

DIAZ RETOOLS, HIRING LASHLEE AS O.C. AND REED AS CHIEF OF STAFF

- After a 2019 season that saw the Hurricanes finish 6-7, head coach Manny Diaz hired SMU offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee to the same post and added Miami legend Ed Reed as chief of staff.
- Diaz also added Rob Likens, who spent 2019 as offensive coordinator at Arizona State, as wide
 receivers coach and Garin Justice, who was offensive coordinator at UNLV, as offensive line coach.
- In Lashlee's up-tempo system, the Mustangs offense was ranked No. 7 in FBS in scoring (41.8 points per game), No. 9 in total offense (489.8 yards per game) and No. 3 in "plays per game" at 80.9.
- Reed, a College and Pro Football Hall of Famer, serves in an advisory role to head coach Manny Diaz, including strategic planning, quality control, operations, player evaluation and player development.
- Likens has served as offensive coordinator at four different schools during his 28-year career as a
 college coach, while Justice spent two seasons with UNLV and the two seasons before that at FAU.



TWO-HEADED MONSTER AT TIGHT END WILL PLAY BIG ROLE FOR CANES

- Miami boasts one of the nation's top tight end tandems in juniors Brevin Jordan and Will Mallory, who
 were listed as co-starters on Miami's first game week depth chart heading into Thursday's game.
- Jordan, who was the only Hurricane selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team, was one of three Mackey Award finalists last year as the nation's top tigh end and was selected to the 2019 All-ACC First Team.
- Jordan started all 10 games he played in and ranked third on the team with 35 receptions and second with 495 receiving yards. In two years, Jordan has made 21 starts and totaled 67 catches and 782 yards.
- Mallory saw action in all 13 games and made eight starts last year. He caught 16 passes fr 293 yards with two touchdowns. Over the final two games of last year, Mallory totaled eight catches and 135 yards.
- A Las Vegas native and high school teammate of QB Tate Martell and S Bubba Bolden, Jordan was named to the Mackey Award preseason watch list (nation's top tight end). Coming out of Bishop Gorman, he was ranked the No. 1 tight end by ESPN.com and 247Sports.com and was No. 2 by Rivals.
- Behind Jordan and Mallory are redshirt freshman Larry Hodges and true freshman Dom Mammarelli.

McCLOUD BACK FOR FIFTH YEAR, WILL ANCHOR HURRICANES DEFENSE

- One of Miami's most important returners for 2020 played in only four games last year: Zach McCloud.
- McCloud, who enrolled at Miami in January 2016, elected to redshirt last season to return for a final year in 2020. The veteran linebacker has totaled 139 tackles and 13.0 tackles for loss in his 44 career games.
- The heart and soul of Miami's defense, the Palm Beach County native has started 31 games in four
 previous seasons, including 11 as a true freshman in 2016, when Miami was the only team in the country
 to start three true freshman linebackers: McCloud, Shaquille Quarterman and Michael Pinckney.
- Outside of the football field, McCloud is one of Miami's team leaders in the community; the redshirt senior is an active member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) and the University of Miami Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. He was named UM's Community Service Man of the Year in 2019 and is on the watch list for the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy, honoring college football's man of the year.

STARTING OFFENSIVE LINE WILL INCLUDE INTRIGUING MIX OF VETERANS

- Miami's starting offensive line versus UAB could include a mix of veterans and newcomers, if the
 Hurricanes' first depth chart materializes. Redshirt sophomore John Campbell, Jr. is slated to make the
 third start of his career on the line and first at left tackle, while Houston transfer Jarrid Williams was
 listed as the starting right tackle. He started all 13 games at right tackle for the Cougars in 2018.
- Redshirt junior Corey Gaynor returns as the team's starting center after starting all 13 games in 2019.
- **DJ Scaife, Jr.**, who was last year's starting right tackle named the team's offensive MVP, slides inside to right guard it will be his second start at the position; he also started in the 2019 opener vs. Florida.
- Miami's starting left guard was listed as Ousman Traore, who saw action in just two games last year.

PHILLIPS, ROCHE EXPECTED TO BOOK END DEFENSIVE LINE THIS FALL

- Despite the decision of Gregory Rousseau to opt out of 2020, Miami has a pair of talented book ends on the defensive line in redshirt junior Jaelan Phillips and redshirt senior Quincy Roche.
- Though both have never suited up for the Hurricanes, Phillips was previously ranked the No. 1 recruit in the country out of high school and spent the first two years of his career at UCLA. He redshirted 2019.
- Roche was named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2019; he was one of just two players in FBS to record 6.0 solo tackles for loss in a game last season, when he managed the feat against Tulane. He was ranked among the nation's leaders in both sacks and tackles for loss in 2019.

MULTIPLE HURRICANES EARN MAJOR PRESEASON RECOGNITION

NO POWER-5 TEAM HAS MORE TURNOVERS SINCE'S CHAIN'S INCEPTION

- Since the unveiling of Miami's now infamous turnover chain in 2017, Miami leads all of Power-5 with an average of 1.95 turnovers forced per game in the 39 game since. The Hurricanes are tied with Wisconsin for No. 1 among all Power-5 teams with 76 turnovers forced over the span, including 20 last season.
- When Miami recovered a fumble in the first quarter of last year's season opener against Florida on Aug. 24, fans inside the stadium and across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017) and Sebastian the Ibis (2018), featured a 10-inch charm with the famous '305' Miami area code. The chain weighed 500 grams.
- 15 different Canes wore the '305' chain last year, none more than CB **DJ lvey** who wore it three times.

HURRICANE FOOTBALL OPENS ITS 95th SEASON AT HARD ROCK STADIUM

- The Miami Hurricanes will be kicking off their 95th season of football this coming fall. The Hurricanes had their first season of football in 1926 and their 100th year of football is currently set for 2025.
- The Hurricanes kicked off their 94th season of football in 2019, road tripping to Orlando their first trip there since the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. It was the earliest season opener in Miami history.
- Miami's first season of football came in 1926 and its 100th year of football is currently set for 2025.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), Miami has compiled a 30-11 record in season openers - UM's streak of three straight wins in openers came to an end in 2018 against LSU.

FOUR MORE PROCANES SELECTED, #NFLU TRADITION ROLLS ON

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: Shaq Quarterman (fourth round, Jacksonville),
 DeeJay Dallas (fourth round, Seattle), K.J. Osborn (fifth round, Minnesota) and Jonathan Garvin (seventh round, Green Bay). As of Sept. 7, 2020, all had secured spots on those teams' 53-man rosters.
- For 46 consecutive years, the Hurricanes have had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft.
- Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000; 119 Hurricanes have been selected.

- Early in August, ESPN announced it would host its famous College GameDay show at Disney's Magic Kingdom the morning of Miami's game against Florida at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- The game vs. Florida marked the 21st time a game involving the Hurricanes has been selected for College GameDay; prior, its most recent was the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and an additional 40yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility feat-ures interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (SECOND OVERALL) | 6-7 (.462)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

The Hurricanes accepted a bid to the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Diaz's first year at the helm in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes, who finished 4-4 in ACC play, saw three players selected to the All-ACC First Team in tight end Brevin Jordan, linebacker Shaquille Quarterman and defensive end Gregory Rousseau - who was also named ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year and a second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just





23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.






