## OPENING KICK

### VIRGINIA HEADS TO FLORIDA

- The Cavaliers continue their road trip on Saturday when they head to Miami Gardens, Fla., to face the Miami Hurricanes.
- The annual UVA meeting with Miami is a night game for the third year in a row. It is also the seventh all-time meeting between the Cavaliers and Hurricanes at night.
- UVA has won two of the last three games (2010 & 2018) against Miami when the Hurricanes were ranked and the Cavaliers were not, with its only loss in 2017 at Hard Rock Stadium against then-No. 2 Miami.

### VIRGINIA VS. MIAMI

- This is the 18th meeting between the normal Coastal Division rivals. Miami leads the series by three games, 10-7.
- Miami won the first three games in the series (1996, 2004, 2005), but it's been an even 7-7 record since.
- Since the Hurricanes' arrival in the Atlantic Coast Conference (2004), Miami leads the series narrowly, 9-7, in ACC play.

### FIVE TOP STORYLINES

- UVA is 3-1 against Miami in the 10th month of the year, winning in 2010 (Oct. 30) at Scott Stadium, 24-19, in 2011 (Oct. 27) on a Thursday night at Hard Rock Stadium, 28-21 and in 2018 (Oct. 13) at Scott Stadium, 16-13. Last year's 17-9 setback, the earliest-ever meeting between these teams, is UVA's lone loss to the Hurricanes in the month of October.
- Saturday will mark the third game for the Cavaliers at Hard Rock Stadium over a span of 379 days, which includes an Oct. 11, 2019 meeting with the Hurricanes and a Dec. 30, 2019 appearance in the Orange Bowl against Florida.
- WR **Billy Kemp IV** has 36 receptions this season. Kemp's 36 receptions are the most by a Cavalier in program history through the first four games of a season.
- **Kemp** is No. 1 in the ACC and No. 5 in the nation with 9.0 receptions per game. With 10 receptions in each of the last two games, he is just the fifth different Cavalier to notch multiple 10+ reception games in the same season. He joins **Hasise Dubois** (2019), **Billy McMullen** (2001 & 2002), **Alvin Pearman** (2003) and **Olamide Zaccheaus** (2018).
- WR **Lavel Davis Jr.** leads the nation's freshmen wide receivers in yards per reception with 23.33 per catch.

## #TheStandard: BY THE NUMBERS

- Counting Saturday, three of UVA's last four meetings with the Hurricanes will have been played at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Tony Poljan is tied for No. 5 in the nation among tight ends with 18 receptions. Of the tight ends ahead of him or tied with him, he is the only one who doesn't lead his team in receptions.
- Lavel Davis Jr. is No. 6 in the nation in yards (No. 1 in the ACC) per reception (23.33). Five of his nine receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards and three have gone for 30+ yards.

VIRGINIA ATHLETICS NEW BRAND IDENTITY

• The University of Virginia athletics department introduced this year its new brand identity. The refreshed designs provide updates on a brand rich in history and tradition. The work was developed by Nike's Global Identity Group (GIG) and includes updates to the iconic V-Sabre mark, two new secondary marks, a revised color scheme and the introduction of new typography, numerals and patterns.

• Nike's GIG team works with a select number of its side-line partners each year to update the athletics department's brand identity based on the goals provided by the institution. The launch of the new Virginia Athletics brand identity is the culmination of an 18-month collaborative process with Nike that began with discovery sessions with UVA coaches, student-athletes and administrators.

UNIQUELY UVA

The University of Virginia is an institution rich with history and tradition. Here is some of the terminology that contributes to UVA's culture.

Grounds: The term used by students, faculty and alumni to refer to the University dating as far back as Thomas Jefferson. "Campus" is never used.

First Year, Second Year, Third Year, Fourth Year: Instead of freshman, sophomore, junior, senior. Why you may ask? To be a "senior" implies that a person has reached the final phase of learning, a feat that Thomas Jefferson believed to be impossible, arguing instead that education is a life-long process.

Commonwealth: Virginia is one of four constituent states of the United States of America that officially uses the name "Commonwealth" instead of the word state in all references. The other three commonwealths are Kentucky, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania.

UNIVERSITY NICKNAMES

Virginia's athletics teams have been accompanied by a somewhat confusing array of nicknames. The most prominent and widely accepted of these monikers are "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos."

Although the terms "Cavaliers," "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are used almost interchangeably to refer to University teams and players, "Cavaliers" is more often used by the media, while "Wahoos" and "Hoos" are frequently used by Virginia students and fans.

Legend has it that Washington & Lee baseball fans dubbed the Virginia players "Wahoos" during the fiercely contested rivalry that existed between the two in-state schools in the 1890s. By 1940, "Wahoos" was in general use around Grounds to denote University students or events relating to them. The abbreviated "Hoos" sprang up later in student newspapers and has gained growing popularity in recent years.

THE CAVALIER MASCOT

The costumed Cavalier with a large character head debuted during Virginia's 1984 football season and has remained the official mascot of the University.

The first documented Cavalier on horseback was Francis Bell, a Virginia student from Dublin, Va., in 1947. Bell rode onto the field dressed as Cavaliers for Virginia's home football game with Harvard on the afternoon of October 11.

The Cavalier on horseback returned as the University's mascot in 1963. The UVA Polo Club provided both the horse and rider. However, the mounted Cavalier and his horse parted company in 1974 with the inception of AstroTurf at Scott Stadium.

The mounted Cavalier made its return in the Florida Citrus Bowl at the end of the 1989 football season. Due to its instant popularity, the Cavalier on horseback returned the following season on a regular basis and continues to lead the Virginia football team onto the field at the beginning of all home games.

UNIVERSITY COLORS

Orange and blue were adopted as the University of Virginia's official athletic colors at a mass student meeting in 1888. UVA athletic teams had previously worn silver gray and cardinal red, but those colors did not stand out on muddy football fields, prompting a student movement to change them.

One of the students attending the mass meeting was Allen Potts, a star athlete who played on Virginia's first football team in 1888. Potts showed up at the meeting wearing a navy blue-and-orange scarf that he had acquired during a summer boating expedition at Oxford University. Orange and blue were chosen as the official athletic colors after one of Potts' fellow students pulled the scarf off Potts' neck and, waving it to the crowd, yelled, "How will this do?" UVA later served as the inspiration for schools like Auburn and Florida when they selected school colors.

WAH-HOO-WAH

The origin of "Wah-hoo-wah" is uncertain. The cheer was used to root on Virginia teams as early as 1890 and may have been borrowed from Dartmouth College, whose athletics teams were once known as the Indians.

Legend attributes the yell to Natalie Floyd Otey, who sang the ballad "Where'er You Are, There Shall My Love Be" at Charlottesville's Levy Opera House in 1893. The predominantly student audience noticed that Otey warbled the first three words of the song between each of the stanzas and decided to join in the refrain. By evening's end, goes the legend, the crowd had corrupted "Where'er You Are" into "Wah-hoo-wah."

The Levy Opera House stands at the corner of High Street and Park Street and has since been renovated into an office building.

**VIRGINIA AT NFL STADIUMS**

- Virginia is 12-22 all-time in venues that at the time of the contest were active NFL stadiums.
- Seven of the 14 NFL stadiums UVA has played in are still active today.
- After losing seven games in a row in NFL stadiums, UVA snapped the streak with a 28-0 triumph over South Carolina in the 2018 Belk Bowl (Carolina Panthers' Bank of America Stadium).
- Saturday is the third game UVA has played at Hard Rock Stadium in just over a year. Not only did UVA play at Miami last season (Oct. 11), but it also faced Florida in the 2020 Orange Bowl on Dec. 30, 2019.

**MENDENHALL AND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP PROGRAMS**

- UVA head coach Bronco Mendenhall has at least one career victory over 12-different FBS programs that have won at least one football national championship.
- Mendenhall owns victories over the following FBS programs that boast at least one football national championship: Cal, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Miami (Fla.), Nebraska, Oklahoma, Ole Miss, Pittsburgh, TCU, Texas, UCLA and Washington.
- Mendenhall coached 11 seasons and won 99 games at BYU, another program that owns a college football national title (1984).

**MORE ON THE UVA-MIAMI SERIES**

- The first match-up occurred in the 1996 Carquest Bowl at then-Joe Robbie Stadium, a 31-21 victory by Miami.
- That game was the final collegiate action for several notable Cavaliers, including Tiki and Ronde Barber, James Farrior, Jon Harris and Jamie Sharper.
- In addition to this Cavalier quintet, the game featured a large number of future pros.
- Of the 44 starters in the game, 20 were drafted by NFL teams (11 UVA, 9 Miami). The group of NFL draftees included nine first-round picks. Twenty-one Cavaliers and 22 Hurricanes went on to play in the NFL.
- Saturday is the seventh time UVA and Miami have played a night game. UVA is 4-2 all-time against Miami when playing at night. UVA closed Miami's tenure at the Orange Bowl with a 48-0 win in 2007, followed by a Thursday Night win at Hard Rock Stadium in 2011, defeating the Hurricanes 28-21. UVA defeated Miami in a Saturday night game in 2014 at Scott Stadium, 30-13. Most recently, UVA topped then-No. 16 Miami at Scott Stadium in 2018, 16-13, in a night game. The first loss came in the 1996 Carquest Bowl (31-21), the first game in the all-time series. Last year's 17-9 loss at Hard Rock Stadium was the second to the Hurricanes in a night game.

**ALONSO HEADLINES 11 FLORIDA NATIVES ON UVA'S ROSTER**

- Virginia defensive lineman Mandy Alonso hails from Miami and starred at Gulliver Prep. Saturday will be Alonso's fourth career game for Virginia at Hard Rock Stadium. Alonso started the 2017 and 2019 meetings against Miami and appeared in the 2019 Orange Bowl against Florida. In three career games as a Cavalier at Hard Rock Stadium Alonso has seven tackles, 2.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks.
- Alonso is one of 11 Cavaliers from Florida. Other "South Beach" area Cavaliers are: Tavares Kelly Jr., Sean Moore, Brenton Nelson and D'Sean Perry. The other six Cavaliers from Florida are: Antonio Clary (Jacksonville), Dave Herard (Fort Lauderdale), Jordan Redmond (Kissimmee), Ryan Swoboda (Windermere), Zachary Teter (Lakeland) and Andrew Yavinsky (West Palm Beach).

**UVA ACCOMPLISHED THIS FLORIDA FEAT**

- UVA's trip to then-Sun Life Stadium in 2011 resulted in the Cavaliers' 28-21 victory. The win set the table for Virginia to become the first program in college football history to win road games at Miami and Florida State in the same season. UVA later won in 2011 at then-No. 23 FSU, 14-13.
- UVA was the only team in college football history to accomplish the feat until North Carolina did so in 2016.
- Florida State and Miami have brought eight combined national titles to the Sunshine State.
- The 2020 schedule for Virginia gives the Cavaliers their first opportunity to replicate their 2011 history as they make two trips to Florida. UVA is scheduled to play at FSU on Nov. 28.

**LAST-SECOND HEROICS IN 2012**

- The 2012 game at Scott Stadium saw last-second heroics by the Cavaliers.
- Michael Rocco tossed a 10-yard pass to Jake McGee in the back of the end zone with six seconds left to beat Miami, 41-40 at Scott Stadium. The touchdown capped a 10-point, fourth quarter comeback.
- Rocco was 29-of-37 for 300 yards and four touchdowns in the win.
- McGee had four catches for 26 yards including the game-winning score.
- WR Dominique Terrell had a career day in the 2012 meeting with nine catches for 127 yards.
- The victory serves as the most recent UVA "last-minute win," which means the winning score came with 60 seconds or less remaining in the game.

**VIRGINIA - MIAMI CONNECTIONS**

- UVA's defensive back Brenton Nelson was born in Miami and played three seasons at Winter Springs High School near Orlando before his family moved to Maryland and he enrolled at DeMatha.
- UVA's Tavares Kelly attended St. Thomas Aquinas High School (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), as did Miami's Mike Harley, Al Blades, Jr., and Avery Huff. The NFL announced that St. Thomas Aquinas High School had the most alums on NFL rosters entering the 2020 season with 14. St. Thomas Aquinas has earned this honor for the seventh season in a row and eighth in the past nine.

**Last Meeting**

No. 20 Virginia dropped its first ACC contest, 17-9, on the road at Miami the last time these two teams met.

Virginia led with 318 total yards on offense but was unable to score a touchdown as kicker Brian Delaney scored three field goals. Miami finished with 265 yards. The Cavaliers had the advantage in total plays (72-52) and time of possession (34:19-25:41).

The Cavaliers also lost All-American cornerback Bryce Hall for the season on a freak play on a UVA punt return. It was the last appearance by Hall in his UVA career. Hall is now with the New York Jets.

Quarterback Bryce Perkins passed for 252 yards and wide receiver Hasise Dubois led the team with seven receptions for 93 yards.

Miami opened the game with a touchdown on its first drive. Virginia hit its first field goal of the night at the end of the first half to trail 7-3 going into halftime. Neither team scored in the third quarter. UVA opened the fourth quarter with a field goal to cut it to 7-6. Miami responded with a field goal to lead 10-6 with 10:06 to play. The Cavaliers cut it to one again as Delaney hit a 44-yard field goal, but Miami took five minutes off the clock with a 10-play touchdown drive to put the game away.

KEMP BECOMING A WORKHORSE FOR THE UVA OFFENSE

- WR Billy Kemp IV has become a workhorse for the Virginia offense. He currently ranks No. 1 in the ACC and No. 5 in the nation with 9.0 receptions per game. He tallied a career-high 10 catches at No. 1 Clemson and again against NC State. His 96 receiving yards against the Tigers was also a career high.
- Kemp ranks No. 5 in the ACC and No. 32 nationally with 79.0 receiving yards per game.
- Over his last nine games, dating back to Nov. 9, 2019 vs. Georgia Tech, Kemp has caught 57 passes (6.3 rpg) for 509 yards (56.5 ypg) and two touchdowns (vs. VT & NC State).

KEMP CLIMBING UVA LIST FOR SINGLE-SEASON GAMES WITH 10+ CATCHES

- WR Billy Kemp IV has recorded two games this season with 10+ catches. He is just the fifth-different Cavalier to post multiple single-season games with 10+ receptions.

POLJAN BRINGING THE TIGHT END BACK TO UVA

- TE Tony Poljan, a grad transfer from Central Michigan, has 18 receptions for 146 yards and two touchdowns this season.
- Since 2000, only Virginia tight end Heath Miller (18) in 2003 had as many receptions as Poljan has had through the first four games. Poljan's two touchdowns is the same as what Miller had in 2003. Miller went on to notch 70 receptions for 835 yards and six touchdowns in 2003.
- Since 2001, UVA tight ends have accumulated 799 receptions, 8,303 receiving yards and 72 touchdowns, by far the best in the ACC over that span.
- From that list of tight ends, 10 have enjoyed careers in the NFL with seven lasting 3+ years.

POLJAN ONE OF THE NATION'S MORE PRODUCTIVE TIGHT ENDS

- TE Tony Poljan is No. 5 in the nation among tight ends with 18 receptions.
- The ACC boasts four of the nation's Top 5 tight ends in regards to receptions.
- Of all the tight ends in the Top 5, Poljan is the only one who doesn't lead his team in receptions as he is third on UVA behind WR Billy Kemp IV (36) and WR Terrell Jana (22).

VIRGINIA RUSHING GAME AT WAKE FOREST

- With 218 rushing yards against the Demon Deacons last time out, UVA rushed for 200+ yards in the game for the eighth time since the start of the 2018 season. It was the first time against an ACC opponent since the 2018 UNC game.

DELANEY CLIMBING VARIOUS UVA CAREER SCORING LISTS

- PK Brian Delaney needs two points to become the 11th Cavalier with 200+ career points and needs seven points to pass Kenny Stadlin for No. 10 on UVA's all-time career scoring ledger.
- Delaney is also No. 6 all-time at UVA in career points kicking with 198. Delaney set the UVA single-season record for points kicking with 110 in 2019. His 50 PATs in 2019 are also a UVA single-season record.
- Delaney is also tied for No. 6 all-time at UVA with 37 career field goals, sharing the spot with Kenny Stadlin (1983-85). Next on the list is Wayne Morrison (1979-82) who is No. 5 with 38 made field goals. No. 4 is Ian Frye (2012-15) with 45 made field goals.

**TAYLOR A UNIQUE TALENT FOR THE CAVALIERS**

- OLB Noah Taylor is the only player in the nation with at least 20 tackles (23), five TFLs (5.5), two sacks (2.5) and two passes defended (2).
- Taylor is used in a myriad of ways, coming off the edge, as well as dropping into coverage. Of his 23 tackles, 17 have come on rushing plays.
- Taylor is building on his breakthrough 2019 season when he finished 2019 with 57 tackles, 13.5 TFL, 7.0 sacks, 2 INT, 4 PBU, 1 FF and 1 punt block. His 7.0 sacks ranked No. 2 among ACC linebackers in 2019, second to former UVA teammate Jordan Mack (Carolina Panthers). Taylor was also just one of three FBS players with 2+ INTs and 7+ sacks in 2019 and the only one returning to college football in 2020.

**OPPONENTS RACKING UP THE PENALTIES**

- UVA has drawn back-to-back opponents to 10+ penalties and 100+ penalty yards games. UVA opponents have committed 23 penalties for 219 yards over the past two games.
- NC State committed 11 penalties for 100 yards, while Wake Forest committed 12 penalties for 119 yards. In contrast, UVA committed 12 penalties for 133 yards over the same two-game span.
- For the year, UVA has committed 18 penalties for 183 yards, while UVA opponents have committed 34 infractions for 309 yards.

**LAVEL DAVIS JR. STRETCHES THE FIELD**

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. is No. 6 in the nation in yards per reception (23.33), which ranks No. 1 in the nation among freshmen wide receivers. The only freshman in the nation with a better mark is running back Deuce Vaughn from Kansas State.
- Five of Davis Jr.'s nine receptions this season have gone for 20+ yards and three have gone for 30+ yards. All nine of his receptions have gone for a first down or a touchdown.
- Dating back to 2000, Davis Jr.'s 23.33 yards per reception mark through UVA's first four games is the second highest in program history of players with at least seven receptions. Only Andre Levrone as a senior in 2017 had a better yards per catch average (26.8).

**BLOUNT AND ZANDIER ARE A TACKLING DUO**

- Only 24 active FBS players have 200+ career tackles and UVA has two of them. Both FS Joey Blount (210) and ILB Zane Zandier (211) are part of the 24. Blount and Zandier are the only active Power-5 teammates with 200+ career tackles.
- Western Kentucky's Devon Key (294) and DeAngelo Malone (218) are the only other FBS teammates with 200+ career tackles.

**NELSON CLIMBING THE ACTIVE CAREER LIST FOR INTS**

- SS Brenton Nelson has eight career interceptions. He is tied for No. 6 among active FBS players for most career interceptions.
- FS Joey Blount (6) and CB De'Vante Cross (4), along with Nelson (8), make Virginia one of three schools with at least three players with 4+ career interceptions. Cincinnati has seven with 4+, while LSU, like UVA, has three.
- CB Nick Grant has three interceptions, also joining the Top 100 of career interceptions among active players.

**DELANEY BREAKS UVA'S CONSECUTIVE FIELD GOALS MADE RECORD**

- Senior Brian Delaney made 17-straight field goals, breaking the UVA record owned by Jake McInerney. In 1989, McInerney made 14 in a row. Delaney's streak came to an end at Wake Forest on Oct. 17 after he missed his third attempt of the game.
- Delaney's streak had started on Oct. 11, 2019 at Miami when he made three field goals in a row after his first attempt of the game was blocked.
- The ACC record is 34, set by Wake Forest's Nick Sciba last season, breaking the previous record of 27 held by NC State's Marc Primanti.

**STONE MAKES FIRST CAREER START**

- QB Lindell Stone made his first career start. With 193 passing yards, he became the 22nd Cavalier in program history to throw for 150+ yards in his first career start.
- Stone's 193 passing yards ranks No. 10 all-time among UVA quarterbacks making their first career starts.

**STONE'S CAREER DAY AGAINST NC STATE**

- Fourth-year QB Lindell Stone had a career day against NC State when he was called into the game in the second quarter after starting QB Brennan Armstrong left with an injury.
- It was just the fifth appearance of Stone's career and first that didn't come in the fourth quarter. Entering the game his only pass of 2020 had gone for -7 yards and his career QB efficiency rating was 5.03.
- Stone tossed his first career passing touchdown in the closing seconds of the second quarter when he found Billy Kemp IV for the two-yard score. On the scoring drive Stone was 6-of-9 for 75 yards and the touchdown pass.
- Stone finished with career highs in completions (30), attempts (53), yards (240) and touchdowns (3).
- Stone marked the 17th time since 2000 a Cavalier quarterback has completed 30+ passes in a game. Six of those occurrences have happened since 2017.

**LONG UVA SCORING DRIVES**

- Four games into the season, UVA already has scoring drives of 97 yards (vs. NC State) and 94 yards (vs. Duke). Both drives resulted in touchdowns and are longer than any drive the Cavaliers had in 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- The last time UVA had multiple drives of 90+ yards was in 2016 when UVA set a program record with a 99-yard drive vs. Central Michigan and also had a 90-yard drive against UConn.

The last Cavalier to reach 1,000-career rushing yards was former QB Bryce Perkins last season when he became the 44th player in program history to reach the milestone. He is only the third UVA quarterback to reach the milestone and the first since Shawn Moore in 1990.

**STARTING FIELD POSITION HAS GONE AGAINST UVA IN 2020**

- Through four games, UVA's averaging starting position per drive is its own 29-yard line, while the Cavaliers' opponents have an average starting position of their own 35-yard line for a -6 on field position for UVA.
- Compared to 2019, UVA through four games was posting an average starting field position of its 37-yard line, while opponents were starting on average on their own 26-yard line for a +11 field position for UVA.

**THE MENDENHALL ERA: HOLDING OPPONENTS TO CERTAIN THRESHOLDS**

- Virginia, under Bronco Mendenhall, has held opponents under 400 yards of total offense 36 times since the start of the 2016 season (55 games). UVA is 21-15 under Mendenhall in those games.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, UVA has held 23 opponents (30 games) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 16-7 under Mendenhall in those games.
- The 2019 team faced injuries in the secondary like no other position group during Mendenhall's tenure and still managed to do this 10 times. By the end of the season, or immediately after its conclusion, 11 members of the secondary in 2019 were out due to injury, or required a post-season surgery (played with ailment).
- Below are some year-by-year progressions during the Mendenhall era:

**JANA JOINS THE 100/1,000 CLUB AT VIRGINIA**

- WR Terrell Jana notched nine receptions against NC State on Oct. 10 to become the 23rd Cavalier in program history to reach 100 career receptions and 1,000 receiving yards. Jana became the 43rd player in program history to reach 1,000 career receiving yards in the 2019 Orange Bowl against Florida.
- Eight of the 23 Cavaliers to join the 100/1,000 club had current UVA wide receiver coach Marques Hagans as a coach.

**THE HAGANS FACTOR**

- With WR Terrell Jana moving into No. 24 all-time at UVA in receiving yards, he becomes the ninth Cavalier in the Top 25 to be coached by current UVA receivers coach and alum Marques Hagans.
- Hagans has coached: No. 2 Olamide Zaccheaus, No. 5 Kris Burd, No. 8 Hasise Dubois, No. 11 Darius Jennings, No. 12 Tim Smith, No. 17 Joe Reed, No. 18 Doni Dowling, No. 20 Canaan Severin and No. 25 Jana. Hagans worked with Burd while as an offensive GA in 2011.
- In all, 11 of the 42 Cavaliers that have reached the 1,000-yard receiving plateau in their career have been coached by Hagans.

**MITCHELL HONORS HAGANS WITH JERSEY PICK**

- WR Hayden Mitchell, who wore No. 83 the last two years, picked No. 18 when it was his time to choose this season. He did so to honor his position coach, Marques Hagans, who wore the number as a QB/WR at UVA (2002-05).
- Mitchell is a former walk-on. The Richmond, Va., native was awarded a scholarship this past August after practice.



**REINKENSMEYER ACCOMPLISHES RARE OFFENSIVE LINE FEAT**

- After starting the season opener against Duke at left guard, Virginia fifth-year offensive lineman Dillon Reinkensmeyer has started a game at all five offensive line positions. He is now the only FBS player to accomplish this feat in research dating back to the start of the 2010 season.
- Reinkensmeyer owns 21 starts at center, 12 starts at right tackle, four starts at left guard, two starts at left tackle and two starts at right guard.
- Reinkensmeyer's 41 career starts are top on the UVA offense.
- Research has found a number of players who started at center, and at guard and a tackle position over their careers prior to 2010, but no confirmations of all five.

**LAVEL DAVIS JR. SHINES IN DEBUT**

- WR Lavel Davis Jr. led UVA with 101 receiving yards and two touchdowns on four receptions in his collegiate debut against Duke. The 101 receiving yards by the Dorchester, S.C., native is the first time a Cavalier has recorded 100+ receiving yards in his collegiate debut.
- He scored touchdowns on scoring strikes of 18 and 26 yards in the fourth quarter. His first, an 18-yard pass from Brennan Armstrong, gave UVA the lead (24-20) for good with 12:43 left to play against Duke. He was named ACC receiver and rookie of the week for his efforts.
- To compare Davis to former Cavaliers, below is UVA's career Top 10 in receiving yards and what they did in their collegiate debut:

**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE DUKE WIN**

- With the help of the Havoc Hoos, Virginia forced seven Duke turnovers on Sept. 26. UVA has forced 25 Duke turnovers during its current six-game winning streak over the Blue Devils.
- UVA's seven forced turnovers and five interceptions are both single-game highs for a team in FBS this season.
- In 131 seasons of Virginia football, the Cavaliers have notched a program record five interceptions 10 times in a game. Two of those times have come in the Bronco Mendenhall era at UVA and both times against Duke (2016 and 2020).
- At +4 in the turnover margin, UVA is No. 1 in the nation in that category.
- UVA opened back-to-back seasons with ACC wins for the first time in program history after winning at Pitt to open 2019.
- Zane Zandier notched a career-high 15 tackles, which is a single-game best in the ACC this season. He was named ACC Linebacker of the Week for his efforts.
- TB Wayne Taulapapa rushed 16 times for a career-high 95 yards against Duke. His previous high was 77 against Duke last year.

**CAVALIERS THAT MADE COLLEGIATE DEBUTS IN 2020**

- Eleven Cavaliers have made their collegiate debuts so far in 2020.
- QB Iraken Armstead\*\*, LB Sam Brady\*\*, DL Jahmeer Carter\*\*, DB Chayce Chalmers, WR Lavel Davis Jr.\*\*, DB Jake Dewease, LS Tucker Finkelston, TE Mike Kosar, DE Nusi Malani\*\*, WR Demick Starling\*\* and LB Hunter Stewart made collegiate debuts so far in 2020.
- \*\* denotes true freshman

**THE THOMPSON TRIFECTA**

- QB Keytaon Thompson caught a three-yard pass at No. 1 Clemson for his first career receiving touchdown. It was just Thompson's second career reception with his first coming last season when he was at Mississippi State.
- In his career, Thompson has now passed for, rushed for and received for a touchdown. He previously had eight passing touchdowns and 10 rushing touchdowns at Mississippi State.

**UVA PASSING GAME UNDER BRONCO MENDENHALL**

- Five of the top eight single-game passing contests from a quarterback standpoint have happened during the head coach Bronco Mendenhall and offensive coordinator Robert Anae's tenure at UVA (2016-pres.).
- Kurt Benkert, the starting quarterback in 2016 and 2017 owns the No. 1 (455, vs. UConn, 2017), No. 2 (421, vs. Central Michigan, 2016) and No. 6 (384, at Miami, 2017) spots. Bryce Perkins, the starting quarterback in 2018 and 2019 has the No. 7 spot (379, vs. Ohio, 2018) and No. 8 spot (378, at UNC, 2019).
- Virginia also amassed 5,445 yards of total offense in 2019, marking the sixth time in program history a Cavalier team recorded over 5,000 yards in a single season. The 2019 season marked the second-best output in program history (1990, 5,516) and only the second time a Cavalier team tallied 5,000+ yards of total offense in back-to-back seasons after notching 5,033 total yards in 2018.
- Only ten times in program history has a UVA quarterback thrown for 20+ touchdowns in a season and five of those times have happened in the past five seasons: 2015 (Matt Johns, 20); 2016 (Kurt Benkert, 21); 2017 (Kurt Benkert, 25); 2018 (Bryce Perkins, 25); 2019 (Bryce Perkins, 22).

**"BREAKING THE ROCK"**

"Breaking the Rock," has also become a tradition in UVA football, started in 2018 by Shawn Griswold, the team's director of football development and performance. It represents how you move a mountain, one rock at a time. The hardest worker during summer workouts is awarded the honor of swinging the sledgehammer and breaking the designated rock to close the summer phase. After a Cavalier win, the "unofficial player of the game" breaks the rock for that week. Below is the collection of Cavaliers to Break the Rock since the tradition began. Griswold started the tradition while at Tulsa and also included it at Pitt and Arizona State.

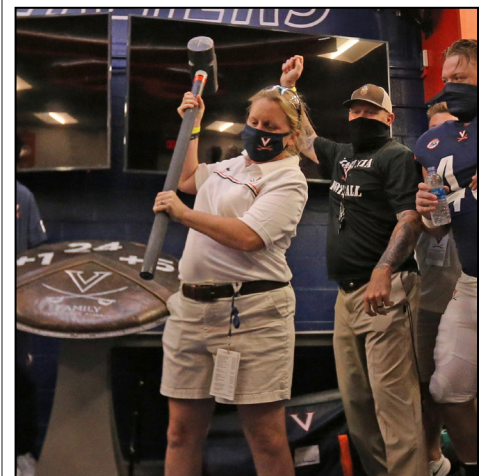

## GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The Virginia football program under Bronco Mendenhall has 14 guiding principles. They can be found on the walls of the McCue Center and outlining the fences of the practice facility. They are a constant reminder to the foundation of the program. Each one is a vehicle for the Virginia football program to develop people.
  - **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "I would love to win a national championship. I'd love to develop a great program here. But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."

## TASK UNIT LEADERS

- The Cavaliers have 10 task-unit leaders and each has an assistant. Working together, they determine the order in which players select their jersey numbers, choose the movie that's shown the night before a game (not taking place this season), pick the color combination of the uniform UVA will wear in a given game, recognize teammates for their effort in practice, and decide which players make up the four special-teams units: kickoff, kickoff return, punt and punt return.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It's their program. The idea simply is, I like the idea of delegating and providing leadership opportunities as much as possible. I try to get as much off it [head coach's plate] as possible, so the only thing that I have remaining to do is competitive work. Then that allows me to help our team at the highest level with the time that I have."
- OLB **Charles Snowden** *Said It:* "I know he's [Mendenhall] big on leadership development, so I think he just gives us opportunities to lead within football. We definitely see our peers in a different light than the coaches do. The coaches kind of see football only. We know who's coming back and getting in extra work, we know how guys carry themselves, we know how invested they are."

## THE 4TH SIDE

- Offense and defense are two sides. Special teams is the third side. **The 4th Side**, in Bronco Mendenhall's teaching, is the sidelines. Mendenhall has made it a point of emphasis with his team since arriving in Charlottesville that **The 4th Side** is as important as the other three. And just as he expects his teams to perform on offense, defense and special teams, Mendenhall wants his players on the sidelines to thrive. By extension, the UVA fan base is also part of the **The 4th Side**.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "It starts on our sideline and possibly the name of all of our fans as the entire stadium becomes The 4th Side."
- WR **Terrell Jana** *Said It:* "It is the 4th Side for a reason because of the four aspects of the team. Coach shows film in the meeting room of players on the 4th Side. The team sees that and takes pride in that."



## EARN YOUR JERSEY NUMBER

- Head coach Bronco Mendenhall introduced what he sees as the bedrock of his "earned not given" mantra when he arrived in Charlottesville in 2016. There are no double numbers and once a number is earned, that student-athlete has it for the season. The majority of numbers are picked over the course of the selection ceremonies during the final three weekends of fall camp. Once the season ends, all players return to the status of no number for winter conditioning, spring ball and summer workouts.
- To be considered for number selection, players have to meet certain physical benchmarks – weight room numbers, conditioning times, etc. – but it's also about dedication to the program, overall effort in practice and having the right disposition in the locker room.
- Bronco Mendenhall doesn't choose the order. The task unit leaders do.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* "The task unit leaders, they're the ones who are with their teammates every day in the locker room. They're with them in class. They're with them in their apartments. They see a lot more than I see. Our players have embraced it, and it matters to them to be endorsed by their peers to be on our team."
- Alum **Jordan Mack** *Said It:* "Part of our program is earned not given. They know what to expect coming in, and they know nothing is going to be given. To earn a number, gear, anything with a Virginia sabre on it, you're going to have to earn it through your hard work."

## STATE CHANGERS

- White ► Grey ► Orange ► Navy ► Black
- Workout gear color is immediate feedback where our student-athletes stand in their training in order to drive positive change.
- Everything in performance is tracked from the moment they step on Grounds to show their gains. All new players begin their UVA careers wearing white.
- Black workout gear is the pinnacle in the UVA strength & conditioning. Two current Cavaliers have reached that pinnacle: DE Richard Burney and CB Nick Grant.

## THURSDAY'S HEROES

- The Thursday's Heroes program is coordinated by the University of Virginia football team. Originally at BYU, Thursday's Heroes transitioned to UVA when Bronco Mendenhall became Head Coach in 2016. Since then, the program has continued to grow, warming the hearts of players, coaches, fans, and of course, the Heroes. Each Thursday during the Fall and Spring season (this is not happening this year), an individual who is undergoing a difficult circumstance (medical, physical, cognitive, etc.) and their family is invited to tour the football facilities, watch practice, meet the coaches/team, and receive special gifts unique to each Hero. Different players take turns showering the Hero with gifts, including UVA gear, an official game jersey, Beats by Dre, a bicycle, school supplies, Halloween costumes, and special video messages from favorite celebrities (Peyton Manning, Kenny Chesney, Damian Lillard, Chris Long and Hugh Jackman to name a few have taken part). The goal of the program is simple: to put a smile on the Hero's face and to welcome them to the Virginia Football family.
- TB **Wayne Taulapapa** *Said It:* "Everybody is Somebody ... Every day we look up to them and the fight they are in. We want them to know they are with us and we are with them."

UNIQUELY VIRGINIA FOOTBALL

MAD HATTERS (PUT ON THE HATS)

- The “Mad Hatters” is the name of the Virginia Football Scout Team. It drew inspiration from the character frozen in time in “Alice in Wonderland,” but the name has as much to do with the evolution of pennies scout team players once draped over their shoulder pads to brightly colored pieces of fabric, which stretch over their helmets. Hence, “Put on the hats.”
- Each Thursday after practice the “Mad Hatter of the Week” is announced by a task unit leader.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “The way I frame it to our team is without going through that process, I think there is a fundamental step missed in their development. Most recruits and most young people want to come in and play their first year. Most of us, right, it’s kind of about us. When you’re in that role, it’s really about serving and helping your team.”

UVA GROUNDSKEEPERS

- Virginia’s football program wants to be a catalyst for change in the community, helping to turn the pain of the Charlottesville riots of Aug. 12, 2017 into a celebration of life, love and unity. During the summer of 2020, a player-led initiative was born in the form of the Groundskeepers in order to “Take Back our Grounds” from the white nationalists that descended upon Charlottesville in 2017.
- To be part of the Groundskeepers, participants take part in their own march, which starts downtown at Heather Heyer Way — the street named in honor of the woman who lost her life during the Aug. 12 demonstrations — before heading to the Enslaved Workers Memorial and the Rotunda.
- **Bronco Mendenhall** *Said It:* “We chose to take this march in direct opposition and the exact opposite direction of the events that happened in the death of Heather Heyer. We’re standing against hate, inequality, anything that doesn’t reflect well on the state of mankind, especially at the University of Virginia.
- **OLB Charles Snowden** *Said It:* We are committed to making a change in our community. We are committed to fighting for what’s right. We are committed to a better future. We are the Groundskeepers. Just thinking about what transpired those two days and what those two days signify and stand for — There were protests led in the name of hatred, racism, oppression and that’s harmful. That’s hurtful to a lot of people and that’s not what the city of Charlottesville stands for. That’s not what the University of Virginia stands for. The Groundskeepers here at UVA, we just want to show that’s not who we are and not what we stand for. So we’re just trying to take back the power of those days and show that we stand for love, unity, respect, uplifting one another, and just doing what’s right.”
- One of UVA’s four flags they run onto the field with each game is a flag that represents the Groundskeeper, which serves as constant reminder to the community of the importance of being unified in love rather than hate.

THE SHIELD

- The shield is an important part of the Virginia football program. On the shield, which was modeled after shields used in the movie 300, has three numbers: +1, 24, +5. They represent a formula that Bronco Mendenhall and his staff developed after years of data study and analytics that will lead to probable wins. Each game UVA’s goal is to be at least +1 in turnover margin, score at least 24 points while holding opponents under 24 points and being at least +5 in field position. Accomplishing each of those goals in a game creates a winning scenario.
- Virginia’s shield (pictured) is always represented in the UVA locker room.
- The shield also has the UVA guiding principles painted around the shield.

ARMSTRONG IS NAMED QB1

- QB Brennan Armstrong was named the starting quarterback by Bronco Mendenhall on Aug. 27. He is the third opening-day starting quarterback under Bronco Mendenhall, joining Kurt Benkert (2016-17) and Bryce Perkins (2018-19).
- Armstrong is one of UVA's four team captains as voted upon by his peers. He is the only non-senior, joining DE Richard Burney, WR Terrell Jana and OLB Charles Snowden.
- Armstrong is the first left-handed starting QB at UVA since Jameel Sewell (2006, 2007, 2009).
- Armstrong enrolled at UVA in January 2018 and backed up Perkins the last two seasons, saving his redshirt season in 2018 under the NCAA participation rules.
- Armstrong is the 13th different UVA starting quarterback to start an opener in the last 16 seasons. The list includes: Bryce Perkins (2018-19), Kurt Benkert (2016-17), Matt Johns (2015), Greyson Lambert (2014), David Watford (2013), Michael Rocco (2011-12), Marc Verica (2010), Vic Hall (2009), Peter Lalich (2008), Jameel Sewell (2007), Christian Olsen (2006) and Marques Hagans (2005).

ARMSTRONG CONTINUES TO MATURE AS THE STARTING QB

- QB Brennan Armstrong threw for 200+ yards in each of his first two career starts, including 269 against Duke and 270 at No. 1 Clemson. He is only the second Cavalier to throw for 200+ passing yards in each of his first two career starts. Armstrong joins Matt Blundin, who did so in his first four career starts that spanned 1989, 1990 and 1991.
- With UVA trailing by three points (20-17) entering the fourth quarter in the season-opening win over Duke, Armstrong was 8-of-9 passing for 144 yards and two touchdowns. His lone incompletion was ruled a catch on the field by Davis Jr., but overturned on replay.
- Armstrong passed for 270 yards and three touchdowns at No. 1 Clemson, while also rushing for 89 more yards. Dating back to 2000, he is the only QB to pass for 225+ yards, pass for 3+ touchdowns and rush for 70+ yards in a game against the Tigers.
- With Armstrong under center, the UVA offense accumulated 417 yards of total offense at No. 1 Clemson. The Cavaliers became the first ACC team to earn 400+ yards of total offense against the Tigers since 2017 when NC State (Nov. 4) did so. Since the start of the 2019 season only LSU, Ohio State and Virginia (twice) have averaged 5.0+ yards per play against the Clemson defense.

UVA QUARTERBACKS IN THEIR FIRST-CAREER START

- QB Brennan Armstrong made his first collegiate start against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Armstrong threw for 269 yards and two touchdowns against Duke, which is the second-most by a Cavalier starting quarterback making his first career start.
- Since 1955, 22 Virginia quarterbacks have passed for at least 150 yards in their first-career start. Here is a breakdown of the most passing yards by a Virginia QB in their first-ever start:

SCOTT STADIUM, HOME OF THE CAVALIERS

The Carl Smith Center, home of David A. Harrison III Field at Scott Stadium, with its unique architectural design, scenic setting on the University's Grounds and exceptional sight lines, is one of the nation's finest college football settings.

Opened in 1931, Scott Stadium might be one of the oldest campus college football stadiums in the nation, but you could never tell from its appearance. Numerous upgrades and expansions make it a modern home for the Cavaliers and their fans.

Scott Stadium was the gift of Frederic William Scott and Elisabeth Strother Scott, and was dedicated to the memory of his parents, Frederic Robert Scott and Frances Branch Scott.

Virginia played its dedication game at Scott Stadium on Oct. 15, 1931 against the Virginia Military Institute before a then-capacity crowd of 22,000. Prior to that season, the Cavaliers staged their home games at the University's Lambeth Field.

Virginia has played 479 games in the historic venue. UVA's all-time record at Scott Stadium stands at 273-194-12.

# Bronco Mendenhall

## Head Coach • Fifth Season

Since arriving at Virginia for the 2016 season, head coach Bronco Mendenhall's impact on the Cavalier program has been immense. From a two-win season, to the ACC's Coastal Division Championship and a New Year's Six bowl invitation, Virginia football's ascent has both remarkable and historic.

Mendenhall came to Charlottesville after a highly successful 11-year career at BYU with a vision and a plan of execution for the daunting renovation project he faced. He has masterfully crafted principles and culture, and instilled pride and purpose, leading to a standard of unbroken growth in just four seasons.

Having a plan and being able to execute a strategic approach to achieving results have been mission critical to Mendenhall's formula for success.

"Teams and organizations are perfectly designed to get the results that they get,"

Mendenhall is fond of saying regarding both successes and failures. His pursuit of

"unbroken growth" centers around learning, applying and improving on tools, frameworks, networks, innovation and processes that deliver those results. His ultimate goal is more expansive than building a great football organization. He strives to build great people.

On-field success is just part of the story Mendenhall has scripted at Virginia. He is a powerful believer in balance, which he frequently sums up with one simple word ... AND. It has become the calling card for the UVA football program.

"I think decisions are made based on principle, and I think principles are governed by beliefs," Mendenhall said. "AND is one of our guiding principles, and that is based on my belief that football is a vehicle to develop people."

At his introductory press conference, Mendenhall stressed that he wanted students AND athletes and believed that combination was achievable, especially at an institution such as Virginia that ranks among the top three public universities in the nation. Since that time, he has not compromised his approach to achieving those means. More importantly, his teams have bought in on the concepts with great enthusiasm and demonstrated they can do so while also being successful on the field.

"I would love to win a national championship," Mendenhall said. "I'd love to develop a great program here.

But what I would really love is for every kid in my program to have an amazing life."

In the world of big-time football, Mendenhall's philosophy is unconventional, but that doesn't faze him.

"I'm looking for the complete development of everyone in our program - and winning," he said. "One is not at the expense of the other. I think they go hand-in-hand, and winning, without the other, would be hollow to me."

Under Mendenhall, the UVA program has progressed from two to six to eight to nine wins. Achievements and recognitions on the field, in the classroom and around the community have exponentially increased as well.

In 2019, UVA placed 10 players on the ACC All-Academic team, the most in the program's history. Linebacker

Jordan Mack was named the ACC's Jim Tatum Award winner as the league's top football scholar-athlete and was a finalist for the William B. Campbell Trophy, known in the sport as the "academic Heisman." Linebacker Micah Kiser, now a member of the Los Angeles Rams, won the award in 2017.

Giving back has become a cornerstone of Virginia football. Players frequently visit the University's Children's Medical Center and speak at local elementary schools. The team's Thursday's Heroes program has been recognized for its efforts to honor individuals across the state of Virginia who are dealing with personal adversity. In 2020, the ACC honored the Thursday's Heroes program with its "Game Changers" award, which recognizes and highlights specific conference teams' involvement with their local communities.

"I'm in pursuit, and we're in pursuit as a football program, of both of those things, and without compromising our expectations for one or the other," Mendenhall said. "I want good young people. I'm talking about morals, values, character, behavior and contribution to the world. And I want a great team. I know it sounds idealistic, but I would not coach football if I did not think it could be done, and I would not coach at Virginia if I did not think there was support for doing it that way."

Mendenhall's pursuit of individual growth is only magnified by the success his teams have also achieved on the field. His name appears often when the accolades of college football's leading active coaches are charted.

"To me, football is just a magical and powerful platform to have motivated learners, and I get to teach life lessons through the sport of football," Mendenhall said. "The trophies, the wins, they're necessary for job security and the world makes a big deal of that. But it is hollow without the substance. Relationships are everything. Other than that, it would just be a game, and that does not sound quite meaningful enough to me."

- UVA is 84-38-9 in season openers.
- The Cavaliers are 77-21-7 all-time in season openers at home.
- Virginia opened a season against Duke for the 20th time. The Cavaliers are 10-10 all-time against the Blue Devils in season openers.
- UVA is 39-33 all-time against Duke. UVA has won six-straight against the Blue Devils.
- UVA is 22-11 all-time against Duke at Scott Stadium.
- Bronco Mendenhall is 12-4 all-time in season openers, including 4-1 at UVA.

- Armstrong finished with 269 passing yards, becoming the 21st Cavalier quarterback to throw for 150+ yards in his first career UVA start. His 269 yards rank No. 2 for most passing yards in a first career UVA start.
- With four receptions, WR Terrell Jana extends his consecutive streak of games with a catch to 17.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr.'s 18-yard reception in the second quarter was the first of his career.
- Davis Jr. finished with four receptions for 101 yards in his debut, highlighted by his first two career touchdown receptions, both coming in the fourth quarter. His first went for 18 yards and his second went for 26 yards.
- S D'Angelo Amos notched his first Virginia interception in the second quarter. It was the third of his career. He notched two at JMU.
- ILB Zane Zandier notched a career-high 15 tackles. His previous high was 10 against Ohio in 2018.

### Game Notes

- Virginia played at Clemson for the first time since 2009.
- Saturday marks the fifth time the Cavaliers have played against the *Associated Press*' No. 1 team (0-5).
- UVA is 8-40-1 all-time against Clemson.
- With 417 yards of total offense, UVA became the first ACC team to record 400+ yards of total offense against Clemson since NC State in 2017 (Nov. 4).
- On UVA's first touchdown-scoring drive that came at the end of the second quarter, the Cavaliers had three pass plays of 20+ yards after having only two such plays in game one of the season vs. Duke.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr. made his first collegiate start.
- QB Brennan Armstrong finished with a career-high 270 yards passing. He joins Matt Blundin as the only UVA quarterbacks to throw for 200+ yards in each of their first two career starts. Blundin did so over the 1989 and 1990 seasons.
- Armstrong also rushed for a career-high 89 yards and threw a career-high three touchdowns.
- With five receptions, WR Terrell Jana extends his active streak with at least one reception to 18 games.
- With three receptions, TE Tony Poljan extends his active streak with at least one reception to 15 games, which includes 13 games at Central Michigan.
- Both Jana and Poljan collected their first touchdowns of the season.
- On UVA's first touchdown-scoring drive, which came at the end of the second quarter, QB Brennan Armstrong completed passes of 22, 27 and 23 yards after being sacked on first down. The 23-yard pass went for a touchdown to WR Terrell Jana. It was Jana's first touchdown of 2020 and fifth of his career.
- DE Richard Burney had a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss, including picking up his second sack of the season.
- QB Keytaon Thompson caught a touchdown pass on a three-yard pass from Brennan Armstrong. It was the first receiving touchdown on Thompson's college career. He now has caught a touchdown, rushed for a touchdown and thrown for a touchdown in his college career. He had previously rushed and thrown for multiple touchdowns at Mississippi State.
- WR Billy Kemp IV finished with 10 receptions for 96 yards, both career highs.
- In two career games against Clemson, Kemp IV has 19 career receptions for 162 yards against the Tigers.

**Game Notes**

- UVA's nine-game home winning streak was snapped. It was tied for the tenth-longest in the nation among active streaks and was tied for the third-longest of the UVA modern era. UVA has only lost two of its last 15 games at Scott Stadium (2018 vs. Pitt; 2020 vs. NC State).
- For the 36th time under Bronco Mendenhall, UVA held an opponent (363) under 400 yards of total offense. UVA is 21-15 in those games, including 16-7 since the start of 2018.
- UVA attempted 64 passes, which ranks No. 2 all-time in program history for a game.

- Jana extends his streak with at least one catch to 19 games.
- Finishing with 11.1 receiving yards, Jana surpassed 100 for the first time this season and third time in his career.
- P Nash Griffin connected on a 26-yard pass play to Nick Jackson on a fake punt attempt in the third quarter. The 26-yard pass play is the third-longest completed pass by a Cavalier on special teams in program history. The reception by Jackson was the first in his career.
- WR Lavel Davis Jr. finished with three receptions for 51 yards. One of his three receptions went for 20+ yards. For the season, five of his nine receptions have gone for 20+ yards.
- CB De'Vante Cross snatched his fourth career interception in the third quarter. It was the first interception yielded this season by NC State quarterback Devin Leary.
- WR Billy Kemp IV tied his career high with 10 receptions. He also had 10 last week at No. 1 Clemson.
