#### THE GAME

- . Coming off an open date the weekend of Oct. 31, the #10/#11 Miami Hurricanes continue their second season under head coach Manny Diaz with a road matchup at NC State on Nov. 6. Kickoff for the Friday night contest is set for 7:30 p.m. on ESPN from Carter-Finley Stadium.
- The matchup will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Jason Benetti (pxp), Andre Ware (color) and Marty Smith (sidelines) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 19th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. In addition to the broadcast on 560 WQAM, Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game on Unanimo Deportes 990AM.

#### THE SERIES

- Friday's game vs. NC State is the 16th matchup in the history of the series; UM leads the series 9-5-1, including a 3-1 lead in games in Raleigh, N.C.
- The two teams have not met since 2016, when the Hurricanes emerged with a 27-13 road win over the Wolfpack at Carter-Finley Stadium.
- Since joining the ACC, the Hurricanes have won three of five meetings vs. NC State (2004, 2012, 2016), with its two losses coming in 2007 and 2008.

#### THE HURRICANES

- Miami returns 11 starters and 39 letterwinners from a team that finished in the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Manny Diaz's first year as coach.
- Miami was ranked #XX in the latest Amway Coaches Poll and #XX in the Associated Press top 25, released Nov. 1 a rise from its previous rankings of #12 by both the coaches and AP. Miami's #7/#7 rankings from Oct. 4 marked UM's highest position in the polls since November 26, 2017.
- Last time out on Oct. 24, the Hurricanes won their second straight game, 19-14, over Virginia. With the win, Miami improved to 5-1 and 4-1 in ACC play.
- WR Michael Harley was named ACC Receiver of the Week for his game against the Cavaliers; the senior wideout hauled in a career-high 10 passes for a career-best 170 yards, including a 43-yard score. He was two catches shy of the school record and had the most receiving yards by a Cane since 2014.
- Miami became the first school to participate in the game selected for the site of ESPN College GameDay three times in the first five weeks of the year in the show's history; UM, who is 15-9 in games selected for GameDay site, was picked for games versus Louisville, Florida State & Clemson this fall.
- QB D'Eriq King, who has picked up ACC Quarterback of the Week honors two times this year, has thrown for 1,401 yards and 11 touchdowns while adding 301 rushing yards and two rushing scores. One of the nation's most electrifying players, King is a Heisman Trophy candidate at The U.
- On July 27, Diaz named King Miami's starting quarterback for the season. King, who announced his decision to transfer to Miami in January 2020. compiled 82 total touchdowns, 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards during his 22 starts at Houston. He has 8,048 career yards of total offense.
- Diaz, who was the defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes from 2016-2018, retooled Miami's offensive staff this past offseason, hiring Rhett Lashlee as offensive coordinator from Southern Methodist. He also added wide receivers coach Rob Likens, who spent 2019 as offensive coordinator at Arizona State, and offensive line coach Garin Justice, who was offensive coordinator at UNLV. Diaz also added UM legend Ed Reed as Chief of Staff.

#### THE OPPONENT

On offense, NC State is led by RB Zonovan Knight (69 carries, 406 yards, 3 TDs) and WR Emeka Emezie (23 catches, 370 yards, 3 TDs). On defense, the Wolfpack are paced by LB Payton Wilson (53 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss) and LB Drake Thomas (46 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss, two sacks).

### **QUICH HITS**

#### MIAMI FACES OFF VS. PACK IN PRIMETIME

- Coming off its second open date of the fall, #10/#11 Miami travels to NC State for its first road game since Oct. 10. The matchup is slated for 7:30 p.m. on ESPN - Miami's sixth primetime game in seven games so far this season.
- The Hurricanes have a 9-5-1 lead in the all-time series, but have not traveled to Raleigh, N.C., for a game since a 27-13 win over the Wolfpack in 2016. Miami is 3-1 all-time in road games in the series.
- . Miami is looking to continue its strong start; with a win Friday, UM would have at least six wins in its first seven games for the second time in the last four years.

#### A NEW 'KING' IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ

- Redshirt senior D'Eriq King is slated for the sixth start of his Miami career on Saturday against Virginia; he was named Miami's starting guarterback by head coach Manny Diaz in late July.
- In his sixth start on Oct. 24 against Virginia, King threw for 322 yards in a 19-14 win; the 300-yard passing game was the eighth of his career and second at Miami.
- King spent the first four seasons of his career at Houston before electing to transfer for his final year of eligibility; the Manyel. Texas native was selected to the watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award and the Maxwell Award this preseason.

#### DIAZ RETOOLS, ADDS ED REED TO STAFF

- . Head coach Manny Diaz hired Ed Reed as the University of Miami's chief of staff this past spring, adding the former College and Football Pro Hall of Famer to the program. Reed will serve in an advisory role to Diaz and assist in several different areas.
- Diaz also retooled Miami's offensive staff, hiring offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee from SMU, where he led the Mustangs to unprecedented offensive success there.
- . Joining Lashlee on Miami's offensive staff were WR coach Rob Likens, who spent last year as offensive coordinator at Arizona State, and OL coach Garin Justice, who was offensive coordinator at UNLV in 2019.

## #10/#11 MIAMI TRAVELS TO TRIANGLE FOR MATCHUP WITH WOLFPACK

- #10/#11 Miami (5-1, 4-1 ACC) will make the trip to Raleigh, N.C., for the fifth time ever for a matchup with NC State (4-2, 4-2 ACC) in a Friday night game at Carter-Finley Stadium on ESPN (7:30 p.m.)
- The Hurricanes have a 9-5-1 lead in the all-time series, but have not traveled to Raleigh for a game since a 27-13 win over the Wolfpack in 2016. Miami is 3-1 all-time in road games in the series.
- Including Nov. 6, Miami has had one Friday night ACC game scheduled each of the last four years; Miami topped Duke on the road in 2017, fell to Boston College on the road in 2018 and beat Virginia at home in 2019. UM also fell to Pittsburgh on a Friday afternoon in 2017 on Thanksgiving weekend.
- With an adjusted 2020 slate due to COVID-19, Miami played just one nonconference game and had 10 ACC games scheduled; after its game versus NC State, UM has a road trip to Virginia Tech on Nov. 14.
- For the season, it was determined that the two teams with the best ACC record of the 15 members for 2020 will play in the ACC Championship Game; there is no Atlantic or Coastal Division for this fall.
- Friday's game will be broadcast live by 560 WQAM "The Joe" and Unanimo Deportes 990 AM.

## A LOOK BACK: HARLEY LEADS MIAMI TO 'W', MIAMI IMPROVES TO 5-1

- Last time out, Miami maintained its winning ways with a 19-14 home victory over Virginia on Oct. 24.
- The Hurricanes, who had an open date the weekend of Oct. 31, saw QB D'Eriq King throw for 322 yards in the victory. It was the eighth 300-yard passing game of his career and second at Miami.
- WR Michael Harley was named ACC Receiver of the Week after a standout performance against the Cavaliers: Harley hauled in a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 170 yards with one touchdown.
- Harley's 170 yards were the most versus an ACC opponent since Allen Hurns had 173 vs. Pitt in 2013.
- Miami's offense got off to a hot start, needing two offensive plays before scoring in 28 seconds King hit TE **Will Mallory** for a 32-yard gain on the first play before a touchdown connection with Harley.
- Freshman RB Donald Chaney, Jr. added 43 yards and a touchdown run on his 10 carries in the win.
- DL Jaelan Phillips led Miami with seven total tackles while LB Bradley Jennings, Jr. added a sack..

### NEW KING IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ A HEISMAN CANDIDATE AT THE U

- QB D'Eriq King was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach Manny Diaz on July 27. King transferred to Miami in January for his final year of eligibility after four years at Houston.
- King, who totaled 6,346 yards of offense at UH, entered 2020 with an FBS record of 15 straight games with at least one passing and one rushing TD; he broke Tim Tebow's record (14) at Houston.
- Though his FBS record streak came to an end at 16 games in Miami's win over Louisville, King has 1,401 passing yards and 301 rushing yards in six starts; he has 13 total touchdowns with 11 passing TDs.
- King was named ACC Quarterback of the Week, a Manning Award Star of the Week, Maxwell Award Offensive Player of the Week and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Player of the Week after Miami's win against Louisville. He was named ACC Quarterback of the Week after the win over Florida State.
- King had a prolific career with the Cougars, totaling 82 total touchdowns (50 passing, 28 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return), 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards in just 22 starts.
- King, who split time at wide receiver and guarterback as a true freshman with the Cougars in 2016, became the first player in school history to throw a touchdown, catch a touchdown and return a kickoff for a touchdown in the same game when he managed the feat for Houston at Texas State.
- The Manvel, Texas native was named to the watch list for the Maxwell Award (nation's most outstanding player) and Davey O'Brien Award (nation's top guarterback) during the 2020 preseason.

### "BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!" TURNOVER CHAIN IS BACK FOR 2020

- When CB **Al Blades, Jr.**, intercepted a pass in the second quarter of a road win over Louisville on Sept. 19, fans across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain version 4.0 for 2020.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017), Sebastian the lbis (2018), and the notorious '305' Miami area code (2019), showcases a charm with the famous school logo inside the state of Florida. The charm weights 300 grams while the chain is 30 inches in length.
- Since the unveiling of Miami's now infamous turnover chain in 2017, Miami led all of Power-5 with an average of 1.95 turnovers forced per game from 2017-2019. The Hurricanes were tied with Wisconsin for No. 1 among all Power-5 teams with 76 turnovers forced over the span, including 20 last season.

### **TURNOVER CHAIN 4.0: OFFICIAL SPECS, INFORMATION & INSPIRATION**

- The state of Florida "U" charm weighs 300 grams, while the chain itself weighs two kilograms and is about 30 inches long. There are 1,400 sapphire stones in the "U" and 1900 in the state of Florida.
   The chain took three months to complete, and was designed by famed jeweler Anthony "AJ the Jeweler" Machado - he designed the first three versions of the Turnover Chain and Touchdown Rings.
- Inspired by legendary coach Howard Schnellenberger's 'State of Miami' recruiting plan, the only three
  counties in the state featuring Miami colors are Dade County, Broward County & Palm Beach County.

# TOUCHDOWN RINGS ARE BACK, HAVE COME OUT OFTEN THIS SEASON

- When RB **Cam'Ron Harris** took a 4th-and-1 carry 66 yards in the first quarter of Miami's win over UAB, a familiar jewelry made its season debut on the Miami sidelines: the Touchdown Rings, version 2.0.
- Also designed by famous Miami-based jeweler Anthony Machado, the Touchdown Rings are made of orange and green sapphires and contain 829 stones. The rings weigh 100 grams combined.
- The rings, which took roughly three months to complete, spell out the words "THE CRIB" when held
  together an homage to a quote from Broward County-born DL Nesta Jade Silvera, who, on National
  Signing Day 2018, asked, "Why not make the crib great?" in announcing his decision to sign with the
  Hurricanes. Miami's coaching and recruiting staffs rallied behind Silvera's proclamation on NSD '18.

SOUTH FLORIDA SUN SENTINEL (Feb. 16, 2018) — On National Signing Day, Nesta Silvera walked onto the stage at American Heritage in Plantation with a handful of his teammates, three of whom — like him — were among the most highly recruited high school football prospects in the nation.

And on that stage, in the spotlight cast by ESPN, Silvera smiled and uttered a phrase that thrilled the Miami coaching staff and immediately endeared him to the Hurricanes fan base.

"Why not make the crib great?" Silvera responded when asked why he'd just signed with Miami while three of his Heritage teammates had chosen to attend Florida, Alabama and Georgia. "I could go to Tuscaloosa, I could go to Gainesville, I could go to Tallahassee and make those schools great. Why not make the crib great?"

In Coral Gables, Hurricanes coaches cheered his words — and shared that celebratory video on social media. Across South Florida, Miami fans latched on to a new rallying cry and Silvera, almost immediately, became the bright spot on a day when the Hurricanes weren't able to sway a few of their late recruiting targets.

### HARLEY RECOGNIZED BY ACC, HAVING IMPRESSIVE SENIOR CAMPAIGN

- WR Michael Harley was named ACC Receiver of the Week after a standout performance against Virginia on Oct. 24; Harley hauled in a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 170 yards with one touchdown.
- Harley leads the Hurricanes in receptions (27) and receiving yards (344), averaging 12.7 yards per catch.
- Harley's 170 yards were the most versus an ACC opponent since Allen Hurns had 173 vs. Pitt in 2013.
- Harley's 10 catches were tied for the second-most by a Miami player since the Hurricanes joined the ACC and came two short of tying the program record; it marked the most catches by a Hurricane since 2017.
- The 170 yards were the most by a Hurricane since **Phil Dorsett** had 201 versus Arkansas State in 2014.
- Harley's 10 catches tied TE Christopher Herndon (10 versus Syracuse in 2017) and were two shy of tying Dorsett (12 versus USF in 2012) for the most by a Hurricane player since Miami joined the ACC in 2004.

#### **BOLDEN BREAKING OUT IN SECONDARY AS A TOP DEFENSIVE PERFORMER**

- One of Miami's top defenders this season has been S **Bubba Bolden**, who has has started four of six games and who leads the Hurricanes with 38 tackles this season. He has also added four tackles for loss.
- Bolden, who had 11 total tackes in an injury-shortened 2019 season, was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week and Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week after a standout game against Louisville on Sept. 19.
- Bolden matched his 2019 season tackle total with a career-high 11 vs. UofL and added a forced fumble.
- In Miami's game at #1 Clemson (Oct. 10), Bolden totaled 10 tackles, two blocked field goals and a forced fumble. He won his second ACC Defensive Back of the Week Award for his performance against the Tigers.

#### WREAKING HAVOC: ROCHE ANCHORING DISRUPTIVE HURRICANE D-LINE

- Despite the decision of Gregory Rousseau to opt out of 2020, Miami has a pair of talented book ends on
  the defensive line in redshirt junior Jaelan Phillips and redshirt senior Quincy Roche. Those two ends
  start outside of interior linemen Nesta Jade Silvera, a first-year starter for Miami, and returner Jon Ford.
- Roche is tied for fifth in all of FBS in tackles for loss (9.5) and is first in active career sacks in FBS with 28.5.
- The four starting defensive linemen combined for a disruptive opener, totaling 13 total tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, three quarterback hurries and one sack. Silvera led the way with five total tackles against UAB.
- Though both ends had never suited up for Miami, Phillips was previously ranked the No. 1 recruit in the
  country out of high school and spent the first two years of his career at UCLA. He redshirted 2019 while
  recovering from multiple ankle injuries and a wrist injury suffered during a car accident on his scooter.
- Roche was named the American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2019. Roche was
  ranked among the FBS leaders in sacks and tackles for loss in 2019; he is tied for second in the ACC with
  5.5 TFLs. Last time out, Phillips had the first interception of his career in the win over Florida State.

   Thanks to the stellar work of Hedley, Miami ranks No. 8 in the nation in net punting, averaging a whopping
- 44.39 net yards per punt. Hedley was selected to the watch list for the Ray Guy Award for top punter.
  Borregales, who is fifth among ACC kickers with 52 points this season (10 field goals, 22 XPs), is 10-for-11
- on field goal attempts this year and was named ACC Specialist of the Week after a standout performance against Louisville where he tied the Hurricanes record with a 58-yard field goal and went 4-for-4 on FGs.
- Hedley ranked No. 26 in FBS in punting in his first year at The U (2019), averaging 43.9 yards per punt.
- Borregales ranks No. 2 in FBS in career field goals made with 60, trailing only Jake Verity of ECU (72).

### A LOOK BACK: MIAMI DOMINATES FLORIDA STATE IN HISTORIC 52-10 W

- Last time out, Miami continued its undefeated start to the 2020 season with a 52-10 thumping of rival Florida State on Sept. 26; the 52 points were the most ever scored by Miami against FSU.
- Miami scored 38 points in the first half of the game the most ever by either team in one half in the rivalry's history. The 35-point deficit was Florida State's second biggest ever halftime deficit in program history, while the 50-point performance was the first by either team in the rivalry's history
- QB D'Eriq King threw for 267 yards and two touchdown passes in the win, while Miami's rushing attack totaled 200 yards and four touchdowns - including a pair by freshman RB Donald Chaney, Jr.
- Miami's defense total 13 tackles for loss and six sacks and also forced three turnovers in the win; junior CB Al Blades, Jr., S Bubba Bolden and DE Jaelan Phillips all recorded interceptions vs. FSU.
- Among Miami's top statistical performers in the win over Florida State were Bolden (four tackles, 2
  TFLs, one forced fumble, one interception) and DE Quincy Roche (three tackles, 2 TFLs, one sack).
- King was named ACC Quarterback of the Week for the second straight week after the victory.

### **GAME 2: MIAMI WINS TOP-20 SHOOTOUT, 47-34, AT LOUISVILLE**

- Miami earned its first road win over a top-20 opponent since 2009 when it toppled the host #18/#16 Louisville Cardinals, 47-34, at Cardinal Stadium on Sept. 19. The win improved Miami to 2-0 overall.
- QB D'Eriq King threw for 325 yards and three touchdown passes in the win, while TE Brevin Jordan
  recorded seven receptions for 120 yards with one touchdown. RB Cam'Ron Harris (134 yards, 75-yard
  rushing touchdown) and RB Jaylan Knighton (two total touchdowns) helped lead the offense.
- Miami's defense total 10 tackles for loss and forced three turnovers, with CB **Al Blades, Jr.**, becoming the first Hurricane to rock the new Turnover Chain (v 4.0) after a second-quarter interception.
- One of Miami's most impactful performers was K **Jose Borregales**, who tied the Miami record with a 57-yard field goal. Borregales went 4-for-4 on field goals and totaled 17 points against Louisville.
- King (guarterback), Bolden (defensive back) & Borregales (specialist) were ACC Players of the Week.

# **GAME 1: MIAMI RUNS ROUGHSHOD IN SEASON OPENER, TOPS UAB 31-14**

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 13th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 10 vs. UAB, improving their mark to a perfect 13-0 in home openers at the facility with a 31-14 victory.
- In his first game as a Hurricane, QB D'Eriq King finished 16-for-24 for 144 passing yards and one
  touchdown. He rushed for 83 yards and another score, extending his own FBS record to 16 games with
  at least one rushing TD and one passing TD this time a four-yard strike to TE Brevin Jordan.
- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** rushed for 134 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns he was one carry shy of tying a career high (18) and two yards shy of tying a career mark (136). He scored on a 66-yard rush in the game's first quarter, and keyed a running attack that totaled 337 yards the second-most rush yards versus an FBS opponent since the Hurricanes joined the ACC in 2004 and most since 2014.
- The active FBS sacks leader, DE Quincy Roche recorded his 27th career sack and first as a Hurricane.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. Miami is now 30-11 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

- Since Manny Diaz's first arrival as defensive coordinator in 2016, Miami has posted 21 individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss in a game; DL Quincy Roche (4.0) did it in the win vs. Pitt (Oct. 24).
- The Canes have ranked in the top five in the country in tackles for loss in all five of Diaz's years at UM.
- Miami ranked No. 4 in FBS in 2019 averaging 8.3 tackles for loss per game; the Hurricanes currently are tied for No. 10 in FBS with an average of 8.5 tackles for loss in 2020, paced by Roche's team-high 9.5.

## **BORREGALES, ROCHE & WILLIAMS THREE IMPACT TRANSFER PORTAL ADDS**

- It wasn't just QB D'Eriq King who elected to spend 2020 at The U; DE Quincy Roche (Temple), K Jose Borregales (FIU) and OL Jarrid Williams (Houston) will be spending their final years at The U.
- Roche delivered a dominant career at Temple, totaling 137 tackles, 39.5 tackles for loss and 26.0 sacks in three seasons. He was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2019, ranking No. 5 in FBS with 13 sacks and No. 11 in FBS with 19.0 tackles for loss with the Owls.
- Roche had three tackles and his FBS-leading 28th career sack versus FSU. He had 4.0 TFLs vs. Pittsburgh.
- Borregales, the all-time leading scorer at crosstown FIU, finished his Panthers career with 281 career points. He was a Lou Groza Award finalist as FBS' top kicker in 2018 and has made 58 career field goals.
- The ACC Specialist of the Week for his game vs. Louisville, Borregales had a career-long 57-yard field goal and went 4-for-4 on field goals. He is the nation's second active leader in career field goals made.
- Williams, who has started first four games at right tackle for UM, started all 13 games at the spot for the Cougars in 2018. He saw action in four games last year before suffering a season-ending injury.

#### HARRIS HAS HELPED CARRY MIAMI OFFENSE IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTER

- Making the fifth start of his career and his second as full-time starting running back, RB **Cam'Ron Harris** delivered a 134-yard performance in the Hurricanes' 47-34 on the road at Louisville on Sept. 19.
- Harris had a career-long 75-yard touchdown run in the win Miami's longest rush since DeeJay Dallas had an 83-yard touchdown versus Duke in 2018. He ranks No. 11 in FBS with 311 rushing yards this year.
- Harris had a 134-yard, two-touchdown performance in Miami's 31-14 win over UAB in the season opener.
- Harris' 134 yards and 17 carries were just shy of tying his career high, set last year versus Georgia Tech.
- Not only did Harris record his first multi-rush TD game in the win over the Blazers, but he added a 66-yard touchdown run to open Miami's scoring. It was a career-long run until he bested it at Louisville.
- A consensus four-star prospect by every major scouting service, Harris who went by Cam'Ron Davis in 2018 but changed his last name to match his father's last name prior to the 2019 season - was ranked as the No. 9 running back in his high school class and No. 167 overall prospect in the 2018 class by ESPN.
- Harris played behind Travis Homer (2018) and DeeJay Dallas (2019), who are with the NFL's Seahawks.

- Jordan, who has missed the last tw ogames to injury, put on a show versus Louisville, finishing with seven catches for 120 yards and a 47-yard touchdown. He added five catches for 41 yards with a TD against FSU.
- Mallory opened Miami's scoring with a 17-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter of the win at Louisville. He had the first multi-touchdown game of his career in a win over Pittsburgh (Oct. 17).
- Jordan, who was the only Hurricane selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team, was a Mackey Award finaliss
  last year and was selected to the 2019 All-ACC First Team. He missed the last two games due to injury.

#### McCLOUD HAS BEEN AMONG TEAM LEADERS FOR MIAMI DEFENSE IN 2020

- One of Miami's most important returners for 2020 played in only four games last year: Zach McCloud.
- McCloud, who enrolled at Miami in January 2016, elected to redshirt 2019 to return for a final year. The veteran linebacker has totaled 158 career tackles in 49 career games including 20 so far this season.
- McCloud had one of the best games of his career in Miami's win over Louisville (Sept. 19), ranking second
  on the Hurricanes with nine tackles and adding one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one sack.
- The heart and soul of Miami's defense, McCloud started 31 games in four previous seasons, including 11 as
  a true frosh in 2016, when Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshman linebackers.
- McCloud is is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) and the University of Miami Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. He was named UM's Community Service Man of the Year in 2019 and is on the watch list for the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy, honoring college football's man of the year.

### 15 NEW HURRICANES, 11 FRESHMEN MAKE DEBUTS IN GAME VS. BLAZERS

- Among the 15 Hurricanes to make their debuts against the Blazers on Sept. 10, 11 were either true freshmen or redshirt freshmen. True freshmen with the most snaps in Week 1 included RB Jaylan Knighton and RB Donald Chaney, Jr. The redshirt freshman with the most was WR Jeremiah Payton.
- Seven players made the first starts of their UM careers vs. UAB: QB D'Eriq King, OL Jarrid Williams, OL Ousman Traore, DE Jaelan Phillips and DE Quincy Roche, DT Nesta Jade Silvera and LB Bradley Jennings, Jr. King (Houston), Phillips (UCLA) and Williams (Houston) had all started previously.

#### FOUR MORE PROCANES SELECTED in 2020 NFL DRAFT #NFLU

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: Shaq Quarterman (fourth round, Jacksonville), DeeJay
   Dallas (fourth round, Seattle), K.J. Osborn (fifth round, Minnesota) and Jonathan Garvin (seventh round, Green
   Bay). As of Sept. 7, 2020, all had secured spots on those teams' 53-man rosters.
- For 46 consecutive years, Miami has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft; UM leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000 (119)
- No program in the ACC had more alumni on NFL 53-man rosters than the Hurricanes did entering Week 1 of the NFL season, when Miami boasted 31 former players and several more who were on practice squads.
- Just this season, Frank Gore set the NFL record for most NFL games played by a running back, while #TightEndU veterans David Njoku, Greg Olsen and Jimmy Graham all scored touchdowns in Week 1 action.

#### CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon
  Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players
  teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.

# MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (SECOND OVERALL) | 11-8 (.578)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

The Hurricanes accepted a bid to the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Diaz's first year at the helm in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes, who finished 4-4 in ACC play, saw three players selected to the All-ACC First Team in tight end Brevin Jordan, linebacker Shaquille Quarterman and defensive end Gregory Rousseau - who was also named ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year and a second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just





23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
