THE SERIES vs. MIAMI

- The Wolfpack will be facing Miami for the first time since 2016.
- Only four members of the current squad have been on a team that played Miami: the four players who earned sixth years of eligibility: TE Dylan Autenrieth, TE Dylan Parham, WR C.J. Riley and OT Tyrone Riley. Only T. Riley played against Miami in 2016. He was in for eight snaps as a defensive end.
- Since Miami became a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2004, NC State has faced the Hurricanes just five times.
- Miami head coach Manny Diaz spent six years on the Wolfpack staff under head coach Chuck Amato (2000-05)

NOTING THE WOLFPACK

- After playing four of its first six games on the road, NC State will finish the second half of the season with four of five games at home.
- The Wolfpack is playing every team in the traditional ACC Coastal Division this season: Virginia Tech (L), Pitt (W), Virginia (W), Duke (W), UNC (W), Miami (11/6) and Georgia Tech (12/5).
- Wolfpack head coach Dave Doeren is in his 8th season with the Wolfpack, tying him for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51). He also ranks third in victories with 51 (Edwards 77, Sheridan 52).
- The Wolfpack not only has a shortened week due to the Friday night game, but will also not practice on Tuesday, as the team takes the day off for voting day.
- Wolfpack linebacker Payton Wilson ranks second in the ACC in tackles per game (10.6) and ranks 13th in the FBS.
- NC State's starting linebacker corps of Wilson, Drake Thomas and Isaiah Moore rank 2nd, 11th and 16th respectively in the ACC in tackles per game.
- Junior PK Christopher Dunn is just six field goals from tying the the school record for career kicks (he has 49, the record is 55).
- NC State has scored 20 times in its 23 trips inside the red zone - scoring at an 86.9% clip to rank 42nd nationally. Seventeen of those 20 scores have been touchdowns - the No. 22 mark nationally.
- The Pack's come-from-behind win at Pitt on Oct. 3 marked the first time since Doeren's first year at NC State that his squad won a game with a last minute score. That season, the Pack kicked a field goal to beat Richmond with 33 seconds remaining.
- Junior Levi Jones blocked a punt in two straight games (Virginia, Duke). He's the first Wolfpack player since 2010 to block two punts in a season.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

Friday night's contest against No. 11 Miami will mark NC State's second night game at Carter-Finley Stadium this season. The Pack opened the season with a home night game - a 45-42 shootout over Wake Forest - and then played a 3:30 pm game vs. Duke.

In his eight seasons at the helm of the Wolfpack, head coach Dave Doeren has posted a 12-6 record in home games played at night.

The Pack will also be playing its sixth non-Saturday home game under the Carter-Finley lights during Doeren's tenure.

BACK TO HIS ROOTS

Miami head coach Manny Diaz' first full-time coaching job was at NC State, as he served on Chuck Amato's Wolfpack staff from 2000-06. When Amato was named head coach at his alma mater in 2000, he brought Diaz with him from Florida State where the young coach had served as a video assistant.

Diaz spent two seasons as a defensive graduate assistant (2000, '01), then took over as linebackers coach for the 2002 and 2003 campaigns. In 2004 and 2005, he coaches the safeties and served as special teams coordinator. His son Gavin was born in Raleigh.

PERFECTING THE PASS

After starting three different QBs last season, the Wolfpack has had two starting quarterbacks in 2020 and another who looks like he will see increased playing time. Despite those changes at the signal caller spot, NC State has seen great improvement in its passing numbers from last year.

The Pack's passing offense ranked 67th in the NCAA in 2019, averaging 229.1 yards per game. That ranking is up to 31st this season, and 261.0 yards through the air per game.

Last time out at UNC, the Pack's 358 yards passing were the most for a Pack team since the 2018 regular season finale against East Carolina (421).

DOEREN FINE

The win over Virginia on Oct. 10 marked head coach Dave Doeren's 50th during his tenure at NC State. Doeren, whose first season with the Wolfpack was 2013, is only the third coach in school history to post that many victories at NC State and he now ranks third in school history in career wins with 51.

Doeren is just one victory shy of Dick Sheridan's second-place tally.

HELLO YELLOW

Under head coach Dave Doeren, NC State has been known as a disciplined team when it comes to penalties. In the seven previous seasons, NC State has averaged 5.5 penalties and 50.5 penalty yards per contest.

This season, the Wolfpack is drawing 8.2 yellow flags per game and 76.2 average yards penalized. That mark puts NC State 13th in the ACC, 90th nationally, in yards penalized per game.

Maybe that trend began to turn around in the win over Duke. NC State drew eight penalties for 106 yards in the first half, but in the second half, had none.

SPARE A NICKEL

In week 3 & 4, the Wolfpack couldn't spare a nickel.

Junior Tyler Baker-Williams started three games at nickel spot in 20019 and was the heir apparent to that spot in 2020. In one of the first practices of fall camp, his expected backup Cayman Czesak went down with a season-ending knee injury. Further into fall camp, Baker-Williams missed crucial time due to contact tracing - only returning the week of the first game. During his time out, corner-back Taiyon Palmer moved over to the nickel spot but true freshman Joshua Pierre-Louis became the main option behind experienced TBW.

After starting weeks 1 and 2, Baker-Williams was contact traced (for a second time) and had to miss the Pitt and Virginia games. Against Pitt, Pierre-Louis played in his spot, but was ejected for targeting, leaving Palmer as the only nickel left. Pierre-Louis started at Virginia, tallying five tackles and pulling down an interception that he returned for 21 yards.

SAVE A SAFETY

The Wolfpack spent most of the game vs. Duke without its two starting safeties, but running low on experienced safeties has been a theme of the young 2020 season.

Junior captain FS Tanner Ingle - known as the "Tasmanian Devil" for his fast play and hard hits - left the season opener after just two snaps with a hamstring injury and then missed Game 2 vs. Virginia Tech.

Enter sophomore Rakeim Ashford - a transfer who did not join the team until the first week of fall camp. He played 80 snaps in the opener after Ingle went down and then started the Virginia Tech game. 42 snaps into that contest, Ashford went down with a season-ending shoulder injury.

Ingle played hurt in the win at Pitt, but in the first quarter of the game at Virginia, was ejected for targeting and had to miss the rest of the game. Enter true freshman Devan Boykin, who ended up playing 70 snaps in the win. Ingle left the Duke win early with the injury as well and then was unable to go again UNC - giving Boykin the start.

The strong safety spot had been well-manned by sophomore Jakeen Harris until the Duke contest, when he was ejected for targeting. Enter redshirt sophomore Isaac Duffy - a former walkon who had never played a snap from scrimmage before last Saturday. Duffy came in for Harris and played 68 snaps - tallying four tackles and breaking up a pair of passes.

Harris was back against UNC and tallied a career-best 15 tackles.

LEADING LINEBACKERS

NC State's starting linebacker trio of Payton Wilson, Drake Thomas and Isaiah Moore currently rank 2nd, 11th and 16th respectively in the ACC in tackles per game in 2020.

Wilson, who missed the Virginia Tech game with an injury, ranks second in the league with 10.6 stops per game - the No. 13 mark in the FBS this week. He was the league leader before the UNC game, when he was slowed by injury. Thomas is averaging 7.7 stops per contest, while Moore stands at 6.8. Sophomore safety Jakeen Harris has jumped into 13th place in the ACC standings with 7.2 stops per contest.

In the win over Duke, the linebacking corps was spectacular. Although the starting three combined for 41 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss, and a pair of INTs (both by Wilson), the reserves did work as well. Reserve MLB Jaylon Scott also had a pick, while reserve Levi Jones blocked a punt that was returned for a score.

#HTT

Hard. Tough. Together.

When former Wolfpack quarterback Philip Rivers came back to visit his alma mater several years ago, he told the football team that at NC State, "We play hard. We play tough. And we play together."

Those words resonated with head coach Dave Doeren, now in his ninth year leading the NC State football program. Hard and tough is in his DNA and his programs have become known for being gutsy and gritty. But it's the together part that makes the Wolfpack unique.

There is strength in the Pack.

THE ICKEY (& OTHERS) SHUFFLE

After minimal changes to the offensive line the first four games of the season, the Pack made multiple adjustments to the starting lineup in the win over Duke that continued in the last outing vs. UNC.

In the first four games of 2020, the Pack starting lineup remained constant at four of the five positions on the offensive line: LT (Tyrone Riley), LG (Ickey Ekwonu), C (Grant Gibson) and RG (Joe Sculthorpe). Senior Justin Witt started at RT in the first two games of the season, but then missed the next three due to injury, so Bryson Speas has started in his spot.

Against Duke, Riley started on the opposite side at RT, Ekwonu moved back to left tackle (where he started seven games and earned freshman All-American honors last season) and Speas moved to LG. However Riley left the Duke game with an injury, causing another shift vs. UNC.

Center Grant Gibson and right guard Joe Sculthorpe have not only both started the first six games at their positions, but they combined have missed only one snap this year.

Last season, the Pack started the same five the first five games of the season, but had four different combinations in the final seven games.

WHAT'S UP, BRO?

To find the last time a pair of brothers played such significant roles on the Wolfpack football squad, you'd have to go back to the 1990s, when Torry Holt was a unanimous All-American at wide receiver (1995-98) and then his brother won All-America honors on defense (1999-02). However, those brothers did not play on the same team.

Almost a couple of decades later, Torry was coaching at local Wakefield High School when another pair of brothers were playing: Thayer and Drake Thomas. Holt coached Thayer, who ended up coming to NC State, where he has played in 30 games, starting 15 and posts one of the top punt return averages in school history. The RS-junior (who has already graduated) caught at touchdown pass in the win over Duke.

Younger brother Drake currently ranks second on the team and 11th in the ACC in tackles from his starting linebacker spot.

The pair have started in the same game six times in their careers.

ANOTHER NOTE ON BROTHERS

If it seemed a little familiar to see a player with "FINLEY" on the back of his jersey in the last outing at UNC, it's because it hasn't been that long since another player by that name was in that same position for the Wolfpack.

True freshman Ben Finley came off the bench to play 33 snaps at UNC, moving the offense down the field twice (once resulting in a TD and once resulting in a bobbled pass in the endzone that was picked off).

Ben's older brother Ryan - who now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals - holds the school record for career completion percentage (.645), and ranks second in passing yards (10,505), second in completions (881) and fourth in touchdowns (60). Finley was the Wolfpack starter from 2016-18.

Incidentally, senior wide receiver Emeka Emezie has caught a touchdown pass from *both* of the Finleys.

GIVE A DAWG A BONE

Defensive coordinator Tony Gibson says he wants 'dawgs' on his defense, aka tenacious, relentless, aggressive players. To commemorate those who play with those characteristics, the defensive staff introduced TAKEAWAY BONE in the win at Virginia.

Now, when a Wolfpack defender recovers a fumble or intercepts a pass, the BONE comes out on the sideline. The player who got the takeaway signs it and at the end of the season, whoever has signed it the most times gets to keep the bone. So far, Alim McNeill (fumble recovery and his spectacular "Thick Six" against UVa) and Payton Wilson (2 INTs vs. Duke) are in the lead.

The bone has made seven appearances since it's inception, as the Pack gained four takeaways at Virginia (for the first time since the 2017 Sun Bowl win over Arizona State) and three vs. Duke. The defense went boneless at UNC.

BLOCK PARTY

Redshirt junior Levi Jones, who sat out last season after transferring from USC, is making a name for himself on the Wolfpack Rangers unit. Jones blocked a punt in back to back games vs. Virginia and Duke - with the block vs. Duke resulting in a Max Fisher touchdown.

Jones is the first Wolfpack player since 2010 (Colby Jackson) to block two punts in the same season.

YOUTH IS SECONDARY

If the Wolfpack defense is a bunch of 'dawgs', then the secondary is a group of puppies.

There have been only two seniors (Val Martin and Daniel Joseph) in the playing rotation on defense this season and Joseph has been the only senior to start on the defensive side of the ball (two games).

The only two upperclassman to see any significant action in the secondary this season are juniors Tyler Baker-Williams and Tanner Ingle, and that duo has missed a combined 24 of 48 quarters played through the first six games.

Here's a look at the young pups who manned the secondary for the Wolfpack in the past three weeks: two true freshmen, a redshirt freshman, two sophomores and three RS-sophomores.

THICK SIX

When junior nose tackle Alim McNeill tipped a pass, caught it and then rumbled 18-yards for a touchdown in the win over Virginia, it drew national attention. Everybody loves a seeing the big guy score (when center Garrett Bradbury - a first-round draft pick of the Minnesota Vikings ran for a score vs. ECU in 2018 it became the stuff of legends) but McNeill's highlight was shown on every outlet following the game.

It marked the first time since 2015 that a Wolfpack defensive lineman scored a touchdown since Darian Roseboro returned an interception 20 yards for a score vs. Syracuse in 2015.

LEARY DOWN, HOCKMAN UP

The Wolfpack won the game versus Duke, but suffered a big loss when quarterback DevIn Leary suffered a broken fibula. The RS-sophomore underwent surgery on Sunday, Oct. 18, and will be out for a significant period. The Wolfpack won all three games Leary started this season.

After Leary went down vs. Duke, RS-junior Bailey Hockman, who started the first two games of 2020 for NC State, came in to seal the victory. The lefty also started two games last season - vs. Syracuse and at Boston College and led the Pack to its only ACC victory in 2019 over the Orange.

Hockman completed 70% (16-23) of his throws in the season opening win, throwing for 191 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing for a seven-yard score (his first career rushing TD). His one miscue was unfortunately a pick-six midway through the third quarter. He threw two picks the next week in the loss at Virginia Tech and another against UNC.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

One area where the Wolfpack has shown dramatic improvement from last year to this season: red zone success.

Through the first six games of 2020, NC State has scored 20 times in its 23 trips inside the red zone - scoring at an 86.9% clip to rank 42nd nationally. Seventeen of those 20 scores have been touchdowns - the No. 22 mark nationally.

NC State is 12-of-13 in scoring a touchdown when the Pack has a first-and-goal situation.

The 2020 success is a far cry from the Wolfpack 2019 struggles. The Pack ranked 67th nationally in red zone conversions last season and the 23 red zone TDs scored ranked 92nd nationally.

#BUILDTHEWALL

It's not a political statement. It's a defensive rallying cry.

In each of the past four games, the Wolfpack has had a goal line stand after the opponent started with 1st and goal and came away with zero points!

Junior nose Alim McNeill has been a stalwart force in the middle of the defensive front for the Wolfpack in 2020. At 6'2, 320 (ish), McNeill is not only huge and explosively strong, but freakishly athletic (he was named to The Athletic's "freak" list for 2020. (He power cleans 323 lbs. and boasts a 640-lb. squat.)

At Pitt on Oct. 3, with NC State holding a slim 17-13 lead in the third quarter, the Panthers drove down to the Pack 1 yard line and had first and goal. That's when McNeill was joined by 6'4, 344(ish)-lb. redshirt freshman Josh Harris to form a human wall.

That wall was impenetrable, as the Pack stopped a run on 1st down and 2nd down, then Harris knocked them back for two yards on the fourth down attempt to give the Wolfpack the ball back.

They rebuilt the wall at Virginia, as the Cavaliers had 1st and goal from the 5. The third and fourth down stops for no gain from the 1 were by McNeill, Harris and DE Savion Jackson.

Against Duke, McNeill made the stop on 3rd-and-goal followed by an incomplete pass on 4th down.

The wall was at it once again at UNC, when the Tar Heels had a 1st-and-goal from the eight yard line. After two rushes moved the ball to the five, an incompleton was followed up by a missed 22-yard field goal.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

Every Sunday during the football season, the Wolfpack offensive staff hands out bottles of syrup to his players in commemoration of their pancake blocks from the previous game. Against Pitt, the Pack earned 10 bottles.

Pitt entered the game with the Wolfpack (Oct 3) game leading the nation in sacks with 17 in three games - 5.7 per game. That highly vaunted defense was stymied by the Pack's offensive line, which allowed just one of Pitt's two sacks on the day.

At this point in his young career, sophomore Ikem "Ickey" Ekwonu would need a LOT of pancakes to use up all the syrup he's received. He has 66 pancakes in his 18 career contests, including 29 in the first six games of 2020.

Ickey was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for the opener and vs. Duke.

TOUCHDOWN, EMEZIE

The win at Pitt did not mark senior wide receiver Emeka Emezie's career high in terms of catches (he had seven) or receiving yards (he had 101) but he did set one crucial career best: he scored two touchdowns.

He scored the game-winning touchdown with 23 seconds remaining on a 13-yard throw from Devin Leary and had a 35-yard TD grab in the 2nd quarter to put Pack up 17-7.

Emezie now boasts 145 career receptions - the seventh-best mark in school history while his 1,725 career yards rank 17th. His 11 career touchdowns also ranks 17th in school history.

Four of the top 10 reception leaders in school history have played for head coach Dave Doeren. Jaylen Samuels (Pittsburgh Steelers) is the school career record holder with 202 career grabs, Kelvin Harmon (Washington Football Team) ranks fourth with 177 and Jakobi Meyers is fifth with 168.

Even more interesting - all four played together on the 2017 squad.

CARY GOOD

He's not fast. He's not flashy. But senior tight end Cary Angeline is pretty good.

After leading the Pack in touchdowns last season with five, he is once again leading the Pack with five in 2020. Over the last two seasons, 11 of his 46 catches have resulted in a Pack TD.

SIX DEGREES OF WOLFPACK NATION: The 2020 Wolfpack coaching staff boasts six new members and nine of the 10 assistant coaches are either in their first or second season at NC State.

On offense, new coordinator Tim Beck is in his first year, while OL coach John Garrison, TE coach Todd Goebbel and RB coach Kurt Roper are in their second campaigns with the Pack.

On defense, Tony Gibson, who joined the staff in 2019, is the only returning coach, while Joe DeForest (Saf), Brian Mitchell (CB), Charley Wiles (DL) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay are new.

Wide receivers coach George McDonald, now in his sixth season at NC State, is the only coach on the staff with a tenure of more than two seasons.

But just because these coaches are new to NC State doesn't mean they're new to each other. In fact, five of the six new members of the staff have coached with at least one other coach at a previous stop (and the sixth, Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay, is an NC State graduate). Also, the Pack's new Assistant to the Head Coach Ruffin McNeill has previous coaching ties with the current staff.

This season, his TD mark ranks third in the NCAA, and he has the third-most TDs among all D1 tight ends (7 by Florida's Kyle Pitts).

For his NC State career, Angeline has 46 receptions - the eighth-best total for a tight end in school history. He now ranks 17th in school history in receiving TDs.

Angeline in the end zone was a big reason the Pack pulled off the 30-29 upset at No. 24 Pitt on Oct. 3. Not only did he have a career-best two TD catches, but both came on third down.

In the first quarter after Pitt jumped out to a 7-0 lead, the Pack took its first offensive possession right down the field and QB Devin Leary found Angeline from six yards out on a third and goal.

The duo struck again in the fourth quarter with the Pack down 23-17. This time, it was a third-and-16 that was converted into another score with a wide-open 25 yard score down the middle of the field.

Angeline's only catch in the win at Virginia was a 32-yard TD strike and one of his two grabs vs. Duke was a four-yard score.

1,000-YARD CLUB

The Wolfpack currently boasts two players with 1,000+ career rushing yards: sophomore Zonovan "Bam" Knight and junior Ricky Person.

With 101 yards in the win over Virginia (Oct. 10), Knight crossed the 1,000-yard threshold and now has 1,151 for his career - which spans just 18 games. The sophomore rushed for two scores in that victory - a 35-yard scamper and a one-yard run.

Person has been hampered by injury for much of his career, but now boasts 1,035 for his career (22 games).

The tandem has alternated leading the team in rushing this season, with Person taking games 1, 3 and 5 and Knight leading the way in games 2, 4 and 6.

EXPERIENCED LEADERS

Dave Doeren has almost completely revamped his coaching staff over the past two seasons. In fact, only one assistant coach - WR coach George McDonald - was at NC State prior to 2019.

Prior to last season, Doeren brought in co-DC Tony Gibson, TE/FB coach Todd Goebbel, OL coach John Garrison and QB coach Kurt Roper. After

the 2019 campaign, Gibson took over as sole defensive coordinator, and heads an entirely new defensive staff: Charley Wiles (DL), Joe DeForest (SAF), Brian Mitchell (CB) and Freddie Aughtry-Lindsay (NIC). On offense, Roper moved over to running backs and OC Tim Beck joined the staff.

The Wolfpack's 10 assistant coaches boast 250 years of combined experience - *two and a half CENTURIES!*

WELL DUNN

Junior placekicker Christopher Dunn ranks third in career field goals (49) and is just six kicks from tying the school record set by Niklas Sade (2011-14). Dunn also ranks fourth in career percentage (.859), sixth in scoring (250 points), but has posted two of the top five longest consecutive field goal streaks in school history and holds the school record for PAT streaks.

Between 2018 and 2019, Dunn connected on 19 straight FGs - the second-longest streak in school history - before missing a 51-yarder at West Virginia last season. Over the last six games of last season and the first three of 2020, he posted another streak by hitting 14 straight. That's the third-longest streak in school history.

Dunn has also now set the school record for consecutive point after makes, as he is a perfect 103-for-103 for his Wolfpack career.

GOOD WORKS GILL

Back in April, when NC State students had been sent home and football had come to an abrupt halt, Pack punter Trenton Gill was thinking about ways he could help those in need. The junior record-setter wanted to help small businesses in his hometown of Hillsborough that were struggling through the shutdown, but he also wanted to help families who were struggling to pay bills and buy groceries. He came up with a way to do both!

Gill decided he would raise money to buy meals from restaurants in Hillsborough that were struggling, and then donate the meals to families in need.

He started a GoFundMe page to raise donations. Then he partnered with OCIM (Orange Congregations in Missions) to identify families who would benefit from the meals. Then he contacted *eight* different local restaurants. By the time he was finished, his efforts ended up purchasing more than 1,000 meals - giving much needed business to those eight establishments and feeding many families.

Because of his efforts, Gill was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Teams® for 2020 - marking the third time in the past four seasons that NC State has had a player recognized on that prestigious team (A.J. Cole, III in 2017, James Smith-Williams in 2019).

FAMILY TIES

Two freshman quarterbacks for NC State already have their names in the Wolfpack record book ... at least their last names.

Rookie Ben Finley, a 2020 early enrollee, is the younger brother of former signal caller Ryan Finley. Ryan holds the school record for career completion percentage (.645), and ranks second in passing yards (10,505), second in completions (881) and fourth in touchdowns (60). Finley was the Wolfpack starter from 2016-18 and now plays for the Cincinnati Bengals.

Walkon rookie QB Andrew Harvey is the son of Terry Harvey, a football and baseball star for NC State from 1991-95. Harvey stands sixth in the career records books in passing yards (5,925), seventh in completions (442), seventh in touchdowns (31) and 12th in percentage (.563). The younger Harvey's maternal grandfather, Vance Cockerham, played center for the Wolfpack in the early 60s for Coach Earle Edwards.

QBU

NC State IS #QBU - it's not even debatable. Five former Wolfpack signal callers are on 2020 NFL rosters. Those five have a combined 35 years of experience playing in the NFL, with 409 career starts among them entering 2020.

Russell Wilson (a three-year starter and graduate of NC State) has started every single game since his NFL career started in 2012, and has made two Super Bowl appearances with the Seattle Seahawks.

Philip Rivers is in his 17th NFL season, including his 15th as a starter, but 2020 is with a new team as he signed as a free agent with the Indianapolis Colts.

Jacoby Brissett is the backup to Rivers in Indianapolis this season, after he started 15 games last season for the Colts. As a rookie with Cincinnati last season, Ryan Finley started three games. Mike Glennon is in his seventh NFL season as the backup in Jacksonville.

During the 2019 NFL season, NC State led all other schools with four alums to start at QB during the season (Cal and Oklahoma each boasted two).

NO. 1

Since 2014, NC State head coach Dave Doeren has honored a member of the Wolfpack squad by giving them the No. 1 jersey. For 2019, redshirt junior linebacker Isaiah Moore, who has also been elected a team captain, will don that special number.

Moore is only the second underclassman to earn the privilege (Jaylen Samuels wore the No. 1 jersey as a junior and senior). He returns in 2020 for this third year as a starter and was the third-leading tackler on the team last season.

Moore has also been the de facto leader of the team's involvement in the #PackUnited movement, which stands out against racial violence and social justice.

RUFFIN IT:

One of the bright spots of a bizarre offseason in 2020 was that head coach Dave Doeren was able to bring his mentor and friend Ruffin McNeill to his staff. McNeill, one of the most well-liked and respected people in college football, is serving as the special assistant to the head coach and has been a great resource for Doeren as well as the entire program.

Doeren has known McNeill, who boasts four decades of coaching experience, for more than 20 years and their professional paths have crossed several times. When Doeren was a graduate assistant at USC in 1999, McNeill was the defensive line coach at nearby Fresno State. The two coached in the Big 12 together from 2002-05 - Doeren at Kansas and McNeill at Texas Tech - and for Doeren's first three years at NC State, McNeill was the head coach at East Carolina.

McNeill most recently served as the assistant head coach at Oklahoma, where he led the defensive tackles and outside linebackers during his three seasons with the program. He also served as defensive coordinator for much of the 2018 campaign. He left the program in January in order to return to North Carolina to help care for his elderly father.

He was the head coach at East Carolina, his alma mater for six seasons (2010-15). He posted a 42-34 record at ECU and his Pirates' teams played in four bowl games and beat Ohio 37-20 in the 2013 Beef O'Brady's Bowl.

CARTER-FINLEY STADIUM

One of the landmarks of North Carolina's capital city, Carter-Finley Stadium has gained a national reputation as being one of the toughest places to play. The home of the Wolfpack, which celebrated its 50th birthday in 2016, boasts 57,600 permanent seats and is surrounded by acres of convenient parking.

The playing surface at Carter-Finley Stadium was reconstructed in 2009. Named for Wolfpack alumnus Wayne T. Day in 2002, it is built to USGA specifications for a golf green.

The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is the football team's home for training and preparation.

NC State practices just a stone's throw away at the Wolfpack Practice Complex and the mammoth Close-King Indoor Practice Facility. The outdoor complex covers seven acres and boasts three full fields, a training room, restrooms and a video/coaching tower. The indoor facility boasts a full, 120-yard football field and roof height sufficient for kicking game, with suspended goal posts, additional training and conditioning space beyond both end zones

The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. There are also halftime locker room areas for the cheerleaders, the dance team, game referees and coaches.

HEAD COACH DAVE DOEREN

- In his eighth season at NC State, his 10th season as a head coach overall.
- Is tied for second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70) and Beattie Feathers (8, 1944-51).
- Ranks third in Wolfpack history in coaching victories.
- In the past three seasons, has had 13 players drafted by the NFL - including an ACC-best seven in 2017. That was the sixth-highest total nationally.
- 257 members of his Wolfpack teams have earned their degrees.
- NC State has boasted 26 Academic All-ACC performers under his guidance and in 2018, Ryan Finley was named to the prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Team.
- With nine victories, the 2018 Wolfpack was one of just six teams in the 126-year history of NC State football to post nine or more regular season wins. It marked the first time since 1991-92 that State posted back-to-back nine-win seasons (only the third time in school history).
- His teams qualified for five consecutive bowl games - the second-longest bowl streak in school history.
- Has coached bowl eligible teams in 14 of his 18 years in Division I.
- One of his players has won one of college football's national award in 2017 and 2018: Bradley Chubb (2017 Nagurski & Hendricks) and Garrett Bradbury (2018 Rimington).
- In 2014, the Wolfpack posted its best rushing average since 1992.
- Members of his teams have turned in over 8,000 collective hours of community service during his tenure at NC State.
- Led Northern Illinois to the most successful two years in program history.
- His first Husky squad won the school's first MAC Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins.
- His 2012 NIU team repeated as league champ and set a new school mark with 12 victories, earning a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school.
- Was a finalist for several national coach of the year awards in 2012.
- NIU boasted the nation's longest conference winning streak (17) and never lost a home game during his tenure.
- Spend five seasons in the Big Ten, serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Wisconsin.
- The Badgers posted a 49-15 mark while he was on staff.
- Spent four seasons at Kansas and was on staff when the Jayhawks ended a seven-year bowl drought.
- In 2000 and 2001, coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA powerhouse Montana. The Grizzlies advanced to the national title game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned in 2001 to win the championship.
- Montana posted a 28-3 record and won two Big Sky titles during his tenure.
- Planned to go to medical school following college and become an orthopedic surgeon. He took the MCAT but after helping coach high school between his junior and senior years, fell in love with coaching.
- Lettered at tight end at Drake and was an Academic All-American.
- Earned his undergraduate degree in pre-medical biology. Earned his master's from Drake in educational leadership and began work on a Ph.D. while serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Southern California.
