DID YOU KNOW?

• FGCU has won a combined **82** conference regular season and tournament titles **IN ONLY 13 YEARS** in Division I as a member of the ASUN Conference & Coastal Collegiate Sports Association (women's swimming & diving)

• In just **9 YEARS** of DI postseason eligibility, FGCU has sent **26 TEAMS** to the NCAA Tournament, while men's golf (2012, 2013, 2015), swimming (2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2020) and men's tennis (2014) have had an individual(s) participate in their respective NCAA Championship, bringing **THE TOTAL NCAA APPEARANCES FOR FGCU TO 38.**

• FGCU has witnessed seven programs earn NCAA Tournament victories in their DI eras: Baseball (2017), Men's Basketball (2013/2016), Women's Basketball (2015/2018), Men's Soccer (2016), Women's Soccer (2015), Softball (2012), Volleyball (2018) and Swimming & Diving having at least one NCAA Championships qualifier. (2012-18, 2020).

• FGCU claimed its fourth **ASUN ALL-SPORTS TROPHY** in five years in 2016-17 and posted a record **6TH-PLACE FINISH** in the DI-AAA Learfield Director's Cup.

• In 2018-19, FGCU student-athletes hailed from **32 STATES & 32 COUNTRIES & ALL SIX HABITABLE CONTINENTS.**

• The Eagles had **SEVEN STUDENT-ATHLETES SIGN PROFESSIONAL CONTRACTS IN 2016**, including Whitney Knight (WNBA, Los Angeles Sparks), Rodrigo Saravia (MLS, Columbus Crew SC), Aaron Guillen (MLS, FC Dallas) and Jake Noll (MLB, Washington Nationals).

• FGCU has produced **FIVE MLB PLAYERS:** Chris Sale (Boston Red Sox, current/ Chicago White Sox), Richard Bleier (Baltimore Orioles, current/ New York Yankees), Jacob Barnes (Kansas City Royals, Milwaukee Brewers), Casey Coleman (Chicago Cubs/Kansas City Royals) and Jake Noll (Washington Nationals, current).

• FGCU's student-athlete population earned a **RECORD TERM GPA OF 3.46** for the Spring 2020 semester, while they have surpassed that of the overall FGCU student body for 22-consecutive semesters (3.34 to 3.01 in 2019-20).

• Seven programs have earned a top-25 national ranking in their respective sports (most recently No. 24 for the 2019-20 women's basketball program) and FGCU has also produced **11 ALL-AMERICANS** in the Division I era.

• In 2014-15, FGCU **WON NINE CHAMPIONSHIPS**, and behind an All-American relay team the swimming team **FINISHED 26TH IN THE NATION** at the NCAA Championships.

• In 2013-14, a pair of **ALL-AMERICAN SWIMMERS** (Emma Svensson and Kira Toussaint) helped FGCU finish 32nd in the nation at the NCAA Championship. Men's tennis junior Jordi Vives represented FGCU at the NCAA Championship for the **FIRST TIME IN PROGRAM HISTORY** and reached the Round of 32.

• The FGCU men's basketball team became the **ONLY NO. 15 SEED IN NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY** to advance to the **SWEET SIXTEEN.** Dunk City became the Cinderella of the 2013 dance, as the high-flying Eagles defeated No. 2 seed Georgetown and No. 7 seed San Diego State.

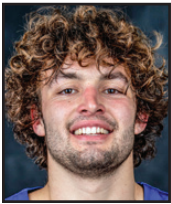

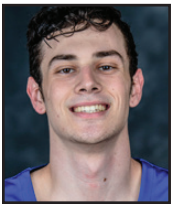

OUTLOOK & NOTES

THE QUICK SCOOP

- After a week off from last Saturday's 91-74 home win over Florida National, the FGCU men's basketball team hits the road for just the second time this year with a short ride across Alligator Alley to take on Miami. Saturday's game is slated for a Noon tip and will be televised by the ACC Network and available on ESPN+ as well.
- This will mark the first time the two teams have met since FGCU won in 2012-13.
- The meeting in Coral Gables will also be the final road game until the second weekend of ASUN play (Jan. 8 & 9) at Liberty. FGCU will close out 2020 with three home games against FIU, Webber International, and Georgia Southern.
- Early in the season, FGCU is led by Jalen Warren and Caleb Catto who are averaging 14 and 13 points per game, respectively. Both are also tied for the team lead in assists with 3.0 per game, while Catto adds 4.0 rebounds a night.
- After notching 12 points at USF and 13 points against Florida National, Cyrus Largie has upped his season scoring average to 10 points, while Ole Miss transfer Franco Miller, Jr., rounds out the top scorers with 9.0 a game.
- Depth has been key for the Eagles so far this year. A total of 12 players have seen action with 10 averaging 15-or-more minutes. Eight players are currently averaging over four points per game as well.
- Though it's just been three games, several Eagles are well represented among the ASUN leaders. Eli Abaev is second in the league with 8.0 rebounds per game, while Dakota Rivers' 60.0 field goal percentage is also second-best. Warren ranks seventh overall in scoring average, while Justus Rainwater and Rivers are both tied for fourth with 1.0 blocks per night.
- Miami is coming off a come-from-behind win over Purdue on Tuesday at the Watsco Center, 58-54. The Hurricanes stormed back from an 18-point halftime deficit to shock the Boilermakers in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- Isaiah Wong leads Miami with 16.0 points and 7.3 rebounds per game followed by Chris Lykes at 15.5 points - though Lykes missed the Purdue game on Tuesday. Kameron McGusty averages 13.0 points followed by Matt Cross at 9.3 per game.
- The Hurricanes stand at 3-0 to start the year including a pair of home wins over North Florida and Stetson.

SERIES HISTORY VS. MIAMI

- Saturday's match-up will be the fifth all-time meeting between FGCU and Miami and the first since the 2012-13 season that saw the Eagles magical run to the NCAA Sweet 16.
- As an iconic moment of foreshadowing back in 2012, the Eagles stunned Miami in a 63-51 win at Alico Arena for FGCU's second-ever win over a then-BCS program. Sherwood Brown and Eric McKnight each scored 14 points, while Bernard Thompson added 13 points to lead the Eagles.
- Miami won the previous three series as the teams also played in 2009, 2010 and 2011. The Hurricanes won all three including the most recent visit to Coral Gables in 2011, 60-50.

HOME SWEET HOME

- With a 2-0 record at home this year, FGCU sports an impressive advantage at Alico Arena, a.k.a., The Nest.
- The Eagles hold a 214-77 record in Alico Arena (75.4%) including a 107-34 record (81%) over the last nine years. FGCU was 10-4 at home in 2018-19 with a 7-1 conference mark (best in the ASUN).

FGCU HOSTS 11 NCAA GAMES IN FIRST FIVE DAYS OF 2020-21

- With the college basketball tip-off moved to Nov. 25, quite a few schedule changes were made. Included in that was the moving of the women's Beach Bubble tournament to Alico Arena. Between the opening day games for both the men's and women's teams on Nov. 25 and the nine Beach Bubble games, FGCU hosted 11 games in the first five days of the season.

MORE EXPERIENCED IN 2020-21

- FGCU entered the 2020-21 campaign with 70-percent of its scoring back in the line-up along with seven players who saw significant action in 25-or-more games during the 2019-20 season. That total alone puts FGCU ahead of this past year where the Eagles had just 22-percent of its scoring coming back and three players who saw key minutes.

LAST TIME OUT - WIN OVER FLORIDA NATIONAL

- Behind 23 points from Caleb Catto and 20 points from Jalen Warren, FGCU remained undefeated at Alico Arena to start the season with a 91-74 win over Florida National.
- "Being 2-1 early in the year and having multiple players with double-doubles tonight were both definitely positive takeaways from the game," said head coach Michael Fly. "I had hoped to get some of the younger guys more minutes, but credit FNU for their effort. We kept our older players out there for more minutes than we wanted, but that's part of the process with growing a new group. We'll learn from the film of tonight as we always do and start prepping for Miami."
- Catto and Warren became the first players to each score 20-plus points in a game since Brandon Goodwin (34) and Zach Johnson (37) did so against Lipscomb on March 4, 2018.
- Additionally, Cyrus Largie posted his first career double-double with 13 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, both personal bests, while Eli Abaev also recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. The duo became the first set of Eagles to have double-doubles in the same game since Goodwin (14 pts, 10 ast) and Christian Terrell (18 pts, 10 reb) did so on Nov. 29, 2017 against Webber International.

CATTO & WARREN NAMED TO ALL-ASUN PRESEASON SQUAD

- Prior to the start of the 2020-21 campaign, Caleb Catto and Jalen Warren were both honored to the 10-play All-ASUN Preseason Team.
- Catto led the Eagles in scoring last season at 12.7 points per contest as he started all 32 games. During the year, he was one of the most improved players in the league as his scoring average increased by 8.6 points compared to his freshman year in 2018-19. He led the team with a career-high 62 three pointers and ranked 10th overall in the league in scoring and among the top-10 of ASUN players in eight categories. Catto had a pivotal three-game stretch during league play where he scored 20-or-more points in three consecutive games becoming the first player since Brandon Goodwin (2017-18) to do so. Overall, he had five games with 20-or-more points including a career-high 26 points at Kennesaw State where he was 11-of-14 from the floor and 4-of-5 from deep.
- Warren was the second-leading scorer on the team at 10.9 points per outing while recording 120 assists which stand as the ninth-best for a single season in program history. In his first season with the Eagles, Warren made a name for himself with his overtime game-winning basket against FAU which was the No. 1 Play of the Day on ESPN's SportsCenter. He proved clutch during the year as he led the Eagles in overtime scoring with 20 total points in three extra session games. In addition to his game-winner against the Owls, he also scored the go-ahead bucket in the win at Jacksonville and scored eight of his 16 points in an overtime win at Stetson. Among the league leaders, both his 120 overall assists and his 68 in ASUN play last year ranked third for both.

EAGLES SIGN HUDSON DURING EARLY NLI PERIOD

- Ja'Heim Hudson (Hinesville, Ga./Wheeler HS) signed a National Letter of Intent with the FGCU men's basketball team as announced by head coach Michael Fly. Hudson is a 6-foot-7, 226 pound forward who most recently was honored as a 2020-21 Preseason All-Class 6A First Team selection with Wheeler High School which has also been picked as the top program in the classification as well.
- A top-25 prospect out of the state of Georgia, Hudson also held offers from East Tennessee State, UAB, Kennesaw State, Winthrop and SIUE. Hudson is versatile for his size with the ability to shoot on the perimeter while also scoring in the post and being highly active on the glass.
- As a junior at Wheeler, Hudson helped the Wildcats win the Georgia Class 6A Championship last March earning Atlanta Journal Constitution All-Cobb County Second Team honors. Heading into the 2020-21 season, Wheeler was ranked 19th nationally by MaxPreps.com with Hudson among the top returning trio.
- Before transferring to Wheeler High School starting with the 2019-20 season, Hudson played at South Gwinnett High School and he also played for the Game Elite and HYPE Hawks AAU programs.

OUTLOOK & NOTES

EAGLES EARN NABC ACADEMIC AWARD AGAIN

- For the second consecutive year, the FGCU men's basketball team earned the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Team Academic Excellence Award over the summer.
- To earn the honor, programs must achieve a cumulative grade-point-average of 3.0-or-better for the 2019-20 season. Last season marked the first year the Eagles had earned the team award. FGCU and Liberty were the only teams in the ASUN to be named among the honorees.
- Last year, as a team, FGCU had back-to-back tremendous semesters in the classroom with a program-record 3.35 team GPA in the spring. For the spring semester, a total of 15 Eagles had 3.0-or-better GPAs with Hector and Hoffman each posting perfect 4.0s.
- Individually, five Eagles were named to the NABC Honors Court: Sam Gagliardi, Tracy Hector, Jr., Kyle Hoffman, Justus Rainwater, and Ryan Rocuant. With five honorees, FGCU led the state of Florida with the most players and ranked second in the ASUN just behind Liberty (6).

COACH FLY RAISES FUNDS FOR CLIPS FOR CANCER

- In September, head coach Michael Fly took part in Clips For Cancer as he raised over \$5,000 to support Barbara's Friends at the Golisano Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida.
- Over the last 25 years, Barbara's Friends has helped over 8,000 local Southwest Florida children with cancer and blood disorders. The Clips For Cancer event raises funds to help support that cause.
- Fly blew past his initial goal of \$2,500 early in the campaign and had accumulated just over \$5,000 on the day his head was shaved by Lilly Bendell - seven year old who spent two years in intensive treatment at Golisano as an infant when she was diagnosed with leukemia at just four months old.
- To support Lilly and Barbara's Friends, Coach Fly has kept his head shaved since.

HOOPS ON A MISSION

- Giving back to the community and making an impact is a hallmark of FGCU. One group that has a close relationship with the basketball team is Hoops On A Mission based in Fort Myers and run by Dwayne Jackson.
- Historically, including most recently in April 2019, the nonprofit hosts a 3x3 Tournament at Alico Arena to raise money with members of the Eagles serving as referees. Many of the team's local products, like Caleb Catto, have ties to Jackson and his organization which works to help area youth by using basketball and mentorship to inspire, empower, and have a grand purpose for life.
- "There's people from all over the town that come out to this event," said Catt. "And it just goes to show who Dwayne is and the impact he's made."
- While COVID may have paused the work the two groups do together in 2020, the Eagles will partner again with Hoops On A Mission in the near future.

MILLER ONE OF 123 BAHAMIAN NCAA HOOPERS SINCE '99

- According to RealGM.com, FGCU redshirt sophomore Franco Miller, Jr., is one of 123 Bahamians to play NCAA basketball since 1999. Miller hails from Freeport where he learned the game from his father, Franco, Sr.
- Miller's basketball journey has taken him from the Bahamas to Canada to Mississippi and now to Fort Myers.
- Prior to the season, he was granted an immediate eligibility waiver after transferring from Ole Miss with three years remaining (in addition to a possible bonus COVID relief year).

Last season, the seven points allowed in the first half against Kennesaw State were a program record and the fewest allowed in the first half of an NCAA Division I game in 2019-20. The Owls were just 1-of-25 from the floor which nearly matched the NCAA record for lowest field goal percentage in the shot clock era which was set by Northern Illinois (1-of-31, 3.2%) on Jan. 26, 2013. The one made field goal tied the NCAA record for fewest made alongside NIU and Savannah State (at Kansas State, 2008). Overall the NCAA record for fewest points (since 1986 according to the NCAA record book) in a first half of a Division I game was 5 by California against Notre Dame on Nov. 26, 2010. In the NIU/EMU game, the Huskies were held to just four points, while Eastern Michigan also managed just four points in 2018 against Rutgers.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- FGCU is the only current ASUN team to have won multiple NCAA Tournament games with two wins: during their Sweet 16 run in 2013 and another in the opening round in 2016.
- FGCU still remains the only No. 15 seed in NCAA Tournament history to ever reach the Sweet Sixteen (2013).

THE GROWTH OF FGCU

- After starting their Division I transition with five-straight losing seasons, the Eagles posted six 20-win seasons in the last nine years.
- After not finishing higher than sixth place in the ASUN the first five years, FGCU has finished no worse than a tie for third in seven seasons of the past eight seasons.

YOUNG FGCU NOT SHORT ON HISTORY

- FGCU teams have combined to win an incredible 82 conference regular season and tournament titles in just 13 seasons at the Division I level. Additionally, in just nine seasons of D-I postseason eligibility, the Eagles have had a combined 38 teams or individuals compete in NCAA championships.
- Seven FGCU programs have earned a top-25 national ranking in their respective sport - including women's basketball (No. 24, 2019-20) and both men's soccer (2018, 2019) and women's soccer (2018) as three of the most recent.
- In 2016-17, the Green and Blue posted a department-best sixth-place finish in the DI-AAA Learfield Directors' Cup and top-100 showing nationally, ahead of several Power-5 and FBS institutions.
- In 2018-19, the Eagles had an ASUN and state of Florida best seven teams earn the NCAA's Public Recognition Award for their Academic Progress Rate (APR) in their sport and have had the highest percentage of teams so honored from these two groups over each of the past three years. FGCU also collectively earned a record 3.46 GPA in the classroom in the spring 2020 semester and has outperformed the general University undergraduate population for 22 consecutive semesters. The 2019 Fall and 2020 Spring semesters each saw another milestone reached as all 15 programs achieved a 3.0-or-higher team GPA.
- The Eagles also served an all-time high 7,200 volunteer hours in 2017 - being recognized as one of two runners-up for the inaugural NACDA Community Service Award presented by the Fiesta Bowl.

Michael Fly, who spent seven years as an assistant coach on the Eagles' staff, enters his third year as head coach of the FGCU men's basketball program after being promoted on Apr. 5, 2018.

Including the 2019-20 season, Fly has been a part of nearly 180 wins the past nine years, six ASUN Tournament Final appearances, three NCAA Tournament victories, three ASUN Tournament titles and three ASUN Regular Season Championships, two berths in the NIT, a CIT appearance, and a run to the Sweet Sixteen which captivated the nation and put the Southwest Florida campus on the national radar for good.

Academically, the Eagles have earned NABC Team Academic Excellence Awards in 2018-19 (first-ever for the program) and 2019-20. Following the 2019-20 season, five student-athletes were also named to the NABC Honors Court Program. In the Spring of 2020, FGCU had a program-record 3.35 team GPA with 15 Eagles posting a 3.0-or-better grade-point-averages. As head coach of the program, the team GPA has increased every semester and been above a 3.0 in four of those.

One of only two remaining members from that 2013 Sweet Sixteen squad (alongside assistant coach Joey Cantens), Fly has been an integral and loyal member of two staffs which have changed the men's basketball culture in every facet, resulting in team accomplishments and player developments to coincide with the Dunk City mantra.

A 2006 University of Kentucky alumnus, Fly is the program's fourth all-time head coach (since 2002; Division-I in 2007), joining Dave Balza (2002-11), Andy Enfield (2011-13) and Joe Dooley (2013-18).

Fly, 37, has coached 13 all-conference selections while with the Green and Blue, including two ASUN Player of the Year honors in Sherwood Brown and Brandon Goodwin, and two ASUN Defensive Player of the Year selections in Bernard Thompson and Demetris Morant. Graduate transfer Schadrac Casimir was named Second Team All-ASUN and was tabbed the conference's newcomer of the year in 2018-19.

As an assistant coach, Fly was responsible for recruiting multiple-time ASUN champions Zach Johnson, Brandon Goodwin and Christian Terrell in addition to 2020-21's leading returning scorer Caleb Catto. Johnson scored 1,344 career points in just three years to rank 4th in program history. Goodwin holds the top-two single-season scoring campaigns in program history in his only two years with the Eagles. Terrell is the only player in program history with at least 1,300 points, 500 rebounds and 250 assists. Catto was one of the most improved players in the ASUN in 2019-20 where he averaged 12.7 points per game and was named to the 2020-21 ASUN Preseason All-Conference Team.

Of the top-10 players in career points at FGCU, Fly has helped develop eight of them, including all-time leading scorer Thompson (1,835). Additionally, the Fulton, Ky., native has coached both the ASUN all-time assists leader Brett Comer (845; 24th in NCAA history) and FGCU all-time leading rebounder Chase Fieler (714).

A relentless and respected recruiter, Fly has worked tirelessly to build relationships nationally, regionally and particularly in the state of Florida. Since 2017-18, FGCU has averaged nearly nine players from the Sunshine State each year.

FGCU was one of only 18 teams in the nation to have posted six-straight 20+ win campaigns between 2013-2018 which culminated in postseason appearances: 2013, '16, '17 NCAA Tournament; 2014, '18 NIT; 2015 CIT. During Fly's time on the sidelines with the Eagles, FGCU has secured a 179-126 record (.587 winning percentage) entering the 2020-21 season.

Fly came to FGCU from Florida State where he was the video coordinator for three Seminoles' NCAA Tournament teams (2008-11) and worked with future NBA players Okaro White, Toney Douglas, Solomon Alabi, Ryan Reid, Chris Singleton and Bernard James. Fly also served as the assistant director of Leonard Hamilton Basketball Camps during his time in Tallahassee.

In 2007-08, Fly was a corporate and broadcast alliances intern with the NCAA after serving as a video coordinator intern with the NBA's Charlotte Bobcats in 2006-07 under head coach Bernie Bickerstaff. Fly got his start in 2004-05 as a student assistant at NAIA Georgetown College under head coach Happy Osborne, helping the team advance to the Elite Eight that year.

In 2018, the Eagles earned an automatic NIT berth with their second-straight outright ASUN Regular Season Championship and became the only school in the history of the ASUN (since 1978-79) to post six-straight 20-win seasons. From Dec. 29-Feb. 14, FGCU won 13-straight games – the longest in its D-I program history, besting a 10-game run in 2014-15.

FGCU set single-season all-time program records for points (2,847; previous: 2,703 in 2015-16), 3-pointers made (254; previous: 251 in 2011-12), free-throw percentage (.740; previous: .714 in 2003-04) and field goals made (1,045; previous: 1,008 in 2015-16), while establishing D-I single-season marks for assists (535; previous: 527 in 2016-17) and free throws made (503; previous: 501 in 2015-16).

In 2016-17, FGCU posted a 26-8 record, matching the program's D-I single-season wins record and securing the first single-digit loss campaign in the D-I era. The Eagles played their sixth NCAA Tournament game in five seasons after receiving a program-best No. 14 seed and fell just short to No. 3 seed Florida State – the second-tallest team in the nation in 2016-17 – 86-80.

Fly helped lead FGCU to an ASUN Tournament title in 2015-16, advancing to claim its third NCAA Tournament win in four years with a 96-65 victory over fellow No. 16 seed Fairleigh Dickinson in the First Four – with the 31-point margin of victory in that round of the tournament being the largest in NCAA history.

In 2014-15, FGCU (22-11, 11-3 ASUN) finished with the second-most wins of any D-I team in Florida (North Florida, 23), and a 10-game winning streak during conference action which at the time was the longest in D-I program history.

Fly was instrumental in guiding the Eagles to their initial ASUN Regular Season Championship and first trip to the NIT in 2013-14. FGCU finished the year with a 22-13 record, including a record 14 wins as part of a 14-4 ASUN mark.

In 2012-13, FGCU (26-11, 13-5 ASUN) again appeared in the ASUN Tournament Final; this time turning in the most impressive 40 minutes in program history up to that point by defeating No. 1 seed and host Mercer, 88-75, on its home floor to become the first team into the 2013 NCAA Tournament.

Deemed a No. 15 seed and sent to Philadelphia, the Eagles captured the hearts of the city and the nation by defeating No. 2 seed Georgetown, 78-68, before extending their win streak to seven games with another double-figure win over No. 7 seed San Diego State, 81-71. FGCU's high-flying attack – which culminated in a then-program-record 148 dunks – helped the Eagles become the only No. 15 seed in NCAA history to advance to the Sweet Sixteen and the first team since Florida in 1987 to win its first two NCAA Tournament contests.

In 2011-12 under then-head coach Enfield, the Eagles advanced to the ASUN Tournament Final in the program's first year of postseason eligibility, falling just 20 minutes short of the NCAA Tournament and finishing with 15 wins.

Fly is married to the former Heather Searcy and they are the proud parents of Jack Archer, who arrived in June 2019.

Fly was like a father figure for me all four years at FGCU – he helped get me through college both on and off the court. He's been a mentor for me as I've got into coaching and been there for me almost every step of the way. He'll keep FGCU moving in the right direction and maybe even higher heights. I couldn't be happier for him; he's earned this opportunity by staying loyal to the program and the community.

FGCU COACHING STAFF

DONNIE MARSH

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH • FRANKLIN & MARSHALL '79

Bringing nearly 40 years of collegiate experience, veteran Donnie Marsh is in his third season as the program's associate head coach in 2020-21.

Beyond his head-coaching stints at FIU and Alabama A&M, Marsh's 35-plus years of college coaching experience includes stops at Florida State, Virginia Tech, Indiana, UAB, Texas Southern and USF, in addition to more than a decade in Division III to begin his career.

Prior to his most recent tenure as the head coach at Alabama A&M, Marsh served as the associate head coach from 2014-17 at Texas Southern, helping the Tigers to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2015 and 2017, and an NIT berth in 2016 following a Southwestern Athletic Conference Regular Season Championship. TSU also won regular-season titles in 2015 and 2017, in addition to a 2013 crown when Marsh spent the 2012-13 season as an associate head coach with the program.

During his one year away from Texas Southern in 2013-14, Marsh was an assistant coach at USF. That year, FGCU and USF's matchup ended controversially in double overtime, when Chase Fielier's full-court tip-in with 0.3 of a second showing was waved off.

Marsh spent 2006-12 as the associate head coach at UAB, helping guide the Blazers to four-straight postseason appearances (3 NITs and 1 NCAA) from 2007-11. During that span, UAB compiled an impressive record of 95-41 (.698), including the program's first outright Conference USA Regular Season Championship in 2011.

Marsh, who is known as one of the top recruiters in the nation, made an immediate impact on UAB during his first season in 2006-07. He was responsible for bringing several newcomers who made up the nation's ninth-ranked class in 2007, according to CollegeHoopsUpdate.com. Additionally, the 2007 class was ranked among the nation's top 25 of incoming classes by almost every major recruiting service.

Prior to his time at UAB, Marsh was an assistant coach at Indiana from 2004-06. Before his arrival, Indiana ranked eighth in the Big 10 in points allowed (67.6) and fifth in field-goal percentage defense (.433). Under Marsh's tutelage, the Hoosier defense improved considerably, rising to fifth in scoring defense (63.6) and tied for third in field-goal percentage defense (.420). While with IU, Marsh helped guide the Hoosiers to the 2005 NIT and 2006 NCAA Tournament.

JUSTIN FURR

ASSISTANT COACH • WINGATE '99

A veteran coach and proven recruiter, Justin Furr joined the Eagles as assistant coach prior to the 2018-19 campaign.

Before joining the Eagles, Furr spent five seasons at Barry University including three years as the lead assistant.

In his last season with Barry, Furr helped guide the Buccaneers to a 23-9 record in 2017-18, advancing to the Elite Eight of the D-II NCAA Tournament for the second time in three years. In addition, Barry defeated Auburn – which won the SEC Regular Season Championship – in an exhibition contest to open the year. Barry made a school-record 391 three-pointers; in fact, Barry's top four three-point total seasons came between 2014-18 with Furr on the sidelines.

In Furr's five seasons at Barry, the Buccaneers made the NCAA Tournament each year, winning at least one game four times and advancing to the Elite Eight twice. Furr assisted Barry to an impressive 116-38 record (.753), including three-straight Sunshine State Conference championships. He also recruited the 2016, 2017 and 2018 SSC Players of the Year, in addition to three-time All-American Elvar Fridriksson. Furr was named one of the top-15 assistant coaches in the country by CoachStat.net.

In 2012-13, Furr served as an assistant coach at D-II Lynn University (Boca Raton, Fla.), where he served as a recruiting coordinator, worked with the team's guards, scouted opponents, handled fundraising, coordinated academic mentoring and served all other facets of the program.

Prior to landing at Lynn, Furr was an assistant at D-II Newberry College from 2010-12 where he coached a conference first-team member in 2011 and the league's freshman of the year in 2012.

Before Newberry, Furr served as an assistant coach at UNC Wilmington for four seasons from 2006-10. As the program's recruiting coordinator, Furr assembled the No. 2-ranked class in the Colonial Athletic Association in 2007-08, according to Street and Smith's College Basketball magazine. That class

Marsh arrived in Bloomington after spending the previous four seasons as the head coach at FIU. During his tenure in Miami from 2000-04, the Panthers ranked among the Sun Belt Conference leaders in total defense and offensive rebounding. Marsh also played a key role in the development of guard Carlos Arroyo.

After his stellar FIU career ended in 2001, Arroyo became – at the time – just the fifth Puerto Rico native in history to play in the NBA when he debuted for the Toronto Raptors. Arroyo has also played with the Denver Nuggets, Utah Jazz, Detroit Pistons, Orlando Magic, Miami Heat and Boston Celtics. Arroyo was a member of the Puerto Rico National Team that participated in the 2004 Athens Summer Olympic Games.

Prior to FIU, Marsh served as an assistant (1997-99) and associate head coach (1999-00) at Virginia Tech. Marsh had gone to Virginia Tech after serving as an assistant coach at Florida State from 1995-97, helping the Seminoles to the 1997 NIT Final.

As the head coach at Trenton State (N.J.) College, now named College of New Jersey, from 1989-93, Marsh compiled a four-year record of 64-41. That was highlighted by a 22-6 record and NCAA Tournament berth in 1990.

A 1979 graduate of Franklin & Marshall (Pa.) College with a bachelor's degree in history and education, Marsh earned All-America honors and helped the Diplomats to a 27-5 record and Division III Final Four. He averaged 15.4 points per game during his career, including 18.9 as a senior, which helped him become the third-round pick of the Atlanta Hawks in the 1979 NBA Draft.

After a brief professional playing stint, Marsh spent six years as assistant basketball coach, head baseball coach and associate director of admissions at Franklin & Marshall from 1980-86. Marsh was inducted into the Franklin & Marshall Hall of Fame in 1984. In 1987-88, Marsh served as the president of Players in Action, Inc., a firm that represented professional athletes.

Marsh, who earned a master's degree in health and human performance from Texas Southern in May 2017, made his head-coaching debut at Division III Elizabethtown (Pa.) College in 1988-89 before moving on to the College of New Jersey.

A graduate of Atlantic City (N.J.) High School, Marsh and his wife, LaRoyce, have a son, Tyler, and a daughter, Sydnee. Tyler is a member of the 2019 World Champion Toronto Raptors staff, while Sydnee is a noted fashion stylist in New York.

helped produce the largest turnaround among all D-I teams in 2007-08, going from 7-22 the previous year to 20-13.

He coached John Fields, who set the UNCW record for blocked shots in a season with 59. Furr also instructed Keith Rendleman, who finished his career among the top 10 in scoring, blocks and rebounds. Another one of his players, Chad Tomko, finished among UNCW's career scoring, assists, steals and 3-point leaders.

From 2004-06, Furr was an assistant at High Point University. He aided in the development of Arizona Reid, a two-time Big South Conference Player of the Year, who scored more than 2,000 points and grabbed over 1,000 rebounds in his career. Furr also coached 2004 Big South Player of the Year Danny Gathings.

Furr was the associate head coach at Saint Andrews Presbyterian College in 2003-04. There he coached Chad Eichelberger, who played professionally in Romania, in addition to logging stints in the American Basketball Association.

From 2001-03, Furr worked as an assistant at his alma mater, Wingate University. In 2001-02, his team advanced to the D-II NCAA Tournament, finishing 26-7. He coached Lorinza Harrington, who went on to play for the Denver Nuggets, New Orleans Hornets and Memphis Grizzlies. His two Wingate teams had a combined record of 44-18.

Furr's coaching start began at Pfeiffer University in 1999. He was there for two years and made the D-II Sweet Sixteen after becoming the first team in conference history to run the table with an 18-0 record in 1999-00. Pfeiffer led the country in scoring that year. Furr recruited 1,000-point scorer Rico Grier and a trio of All-American performers.

The native of Stanfield, N.C., played collegiately at North Carolina-based Wingate, receiving his Bachelor's of Science in Sports Management in 1999. He and his wife, Jennifer, have one son, Ezra (6).

FGCU COACHING STAFF

JOEY CANTENS

ASSISTANT COACH • ECKERD '09

Joey Cantens enters his third season as an assistant coach at FGCU after returning to Fort Myers in 2018-19; he previously spent 2011-14 with the Eagles as the program's Director of Operations.

With 14 total years of college and professional basketball coaching and playing experience, Cantens has served a valuable role in three Sweet Sixteen appearances, a No. 3 finish in the FIBA America's Championship and a No. 20 FIBA World Ranking with the Dominican Republic National Team.

He spent portions of June-July of 2018 as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs - one of the most respected and well-run organizations in the NBA - for their training camp in Texas and Summer League games in Utah and Las Vegas.

A native of Miami, Fla., and a three-year letterwinner at Eckerd College, Cantens and Fly are the only two members on staff who helped lead FGCU to its historic Sweet Sixteen in 2013 - still the only 15 seed to reach that round in NCAA Tournament history.

Cantens spent the two years before returning to FGCU in Germany as an assistant coach with a pair of professional clubs. He was on staff with Hebeisen White Wings in 2016-17 before moving to MHP Riesen Ludwigsburg in 2017-18, helping lead the team to the Champions League Final Four and a top-10 ranking in Europe.

Prior to that, Cantens was an assistant coach at Division-II Indiana University of Pennsylvania for 2015-16, aiding in the Crimson Hawks' 21-8 record and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference West Championship. Cantens went to IUP from USC where he was the Director of Scouting and Video Operations for the Trojans in 2014-15 under former FGCU head coach Andy Enfield.

Cantens worked with Enfield in his two seasons with the Green and Blue, culminating in 2012-13 with the program's first ASUN Tournament Champion-

ship and NCAA Tournament victories over second-seeded Georgetown and seventh-seeded San Diego State. He then remained on staff for former head coach Joe Dooley's first season in 2013-14, playing an integral role in FGCU's first ASUN Regular Season Championship.

In addition to his collegiate and professional experience, Cantens also possesses a national team coaching background with the Dominican Republic. He has had three different stints as a staff member with the Dominican Republic National Team (summers in 2011, 2013 and 2014). In 2011, he served under Kentucky head coach John Calipari and helped the team to a 3rd-place finish in the FIBA America's Championship - the highest in the country's history. That team afforded Cantens the opportunity to work alongside former NBA players Al Horford, Charlie Villanueva and Francisco Garcia.

Cantens got his start as a graduate manager from 2009-11 at Florida State where Fly was a video coordinator on Leonard Hamilton's staff. The Seminoles reached the Sweet Sixteen in 2011.

Cantens began his playing career at FIU for 2005-06 before transferring and graduating from Eckerd in 2009. While at the St. Petersburg-based school, he made two NCAA Tournament trips and reached the Sweet Sixteen. Cantens was named to the Sunshine State Conference Academic Honor Roll and received the Triton Award, which is presented annually to a student-athlete who reaches the highest levels of athletic achievement, scholarship and leadership. Cantens received his Master's of Science in Sport Management from FSU in 2011.

Cantens is engaged to former FGCU women's basketball director of operations and UConn women's basketball captain Mel Thomas.
