SERIES NOTES

- •The Hatters and Hurricanes are meeting for the 83rd time on Friday, with Miami holding a 49-33 advantage.
- •The Hatters and Hurricanes were once members of the old Florida Intercollegiate Conference until it disbanded in the mid 1960s.

UNDER THE HAT

- •The Hatters get back to work on Friday when they pay a visit to in-state rival Miami. The game can be seen on ACC Network.
- •This will be Stetson's first game with the Hurricanes since Nov. 12, 2012, a game also played in Coral Gables. Miami escaped with an 87-79 win that night.
- •Stetson opened the COVID-impacted season in dubious fashion Monday, dropping a 64-61 decision to Emmanuel (Ga.) College. It was Stetson's first loss to a non-Division I foe in its last 20 games, and also marked the first time Stetson has ever lost a game when opening a new season at Edmunds Center (18-1).
- •The new season produced similar old results for sophomore guard Rob Perry, as he poured in a game-high 26 points. The effort was his 9th career game with 20 or more points.
- ·Head coach Donnie Jones begins his second season with the Hatters tonight. He led Stetson to a 16-17 record last season and an unexpected third place finish in the ASUN Conference. The 16 wins were the most for the Haters in 12 years.
- •Friday's game is the first of back-to-back nationally televised games for the Hatters. Sunday's game at Florida will be on SEC Network.
- •Six freshmen made their collegiate debuts on Monday, with three of them (Chase Johnston, Josh Smith, Stephan Swenson) in the starting lineup.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- •Stetson will be looking to avoid its first 0-2 start to the season since the 2015-16 squad opened the year with three straight losses
- •Stetson is facing an ACC team on Friday for just the second time in the last seven seasons. Stetson's last game against the ACC came against No. 3 Duke on Dec. 1, 2018.
- •Stetson's last game against a Power 5 team ended pretty well for the Hatters, as they defeated South Carolina last Dec. 30, winning by a 63-56 margin in Columbia, S.C. Columbia native Christiaan Jones led the Hatters with 18 points against the Gamecocks.
- •Stetson is 52-120 all-time against current ACC member schools. The Hatters have 33 of those 52 wins against Miami, with another 12 coming against Florida State. Stetson has never played Boston College or Syracuse. Stetson's last win against an ACC opponent was an 89-79 victory at Wake Forest on Nov. 12, 2010.

HATTERS MOURN THE LOSS OF GLENN WILKES

Dr. Glenn Wilkes, legendary Stetson men's basketball coach and internationally renowned steward of the game, passed away on Nov. 21. He was 91.

Wilkes spent 36 seasons as head coach at Stetson (1957-93), amassing a school-record 552 victories. A member of the Stetson Athletics, Florida Sports, and ASUN Conference Halls of Fame, Wilkes was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame in 2014. He enjoyed 27 winning seasons with the Hatters, authoring the only three 20-win campaigns in program history.

Upon his retirement in 1993, Wilkes ranked ninth among active coaches in wins, trailing only Dean Smith, Lefty Driesell, Lou Henson, Gene Bartow, Gary Colson, Don Haskins, Norm Stewart and Bob Knight.

But while his success on the court is well known, Wilkes' greatest contributions to the game came off the court. His Glenn Wilkes Basketball Schools, founded in the late 1950s, were the first of their kind in Florida and the South, and laid a blue-

print for all of today's successful mega camps. The camps were so well regarded that Wilkes eventually became camp director for the Nike All-America Camp and the Michael Jordan Flight School.

In addition to being inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame, Wilkes was also inducted into the Naismith Coaches Circle at the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass., in 2019. He entered along with Denny Crum, Cotton Fitzsimmons, John MacLeod and Frank Martin.

THE ONLY CONSTANT IS CHANGE

This has to be the motto for college basketball during the 2020-21 season, right? As COVID forces teams to make schedule changes across the country, the Hatters are not immune. Over the weekend, Stetson a adjusted its schedule, moving its game at Florida from Sunday, Dec. 6, to Tuesday, Dec. 1.

Stetson has already had to shuffle its original schedule multiple times due to a positive COVID test within in the program in mid-November, and Bethune-Cookman opting out of the 2020-21 season.

The Hatters were originally scheduled to open the year at Miami on Nov. 25, but that game was moved to Dec. 4. Two games with the cross-county Wildcats were scrapped, as was a game at FIU after Stetson and the Panthers couldn't find an agreeable date. That game will now be played next season. Games with Emmanuel and Florida were added in recent weeks.

THE WAITING IS THE HARDEST PART

A delayed start to the season nationally, and then two weeks in isolation in the days leading up to the start of the season have the Hatters in the unusual position of beginning a new season after Thanksgiving. The last time the Hatters started a campaign this late came during the 1992-93 season when Stetson visited Florida on Dec. 1. The Gators topped Stetson, 70-52.

CHASE JOHNSTON ELIGIBLE TO START THE YEAR

Speaking of waiting, redshirt freshman **Chase Johnston** will finally make his collegiate debut on Monday when the Hatters host Emmanuel. Johnston, a January transfer from Purdue Fort Wayne, was declared immediately eligible for the '20-21 season by the NCAA last spring, and the all-time high school leader in career 3-point field goals (546) is expected to be in the starting lineup against the Lions.

YOUNG GUNS II

One year after a band of freshmen led Stetson to its best season in 12 years, a new group of first-year players is expected to team with what are now a hardened group of veteran sophomores to help take the Hatters to the next step.

Sophomores Rob Perry, Mahamadou Diawara, Joel Kabimba and Wheza Panzo will join forces with freshmen Chase Johnston, Keith Lamar, Giancarlo Valdez, Josh Smith, Stephan Swenson and Gabriel Wuor to once again give Stetson one of the youngest rosters in the country.

Christiaan Jones is the only senior, and there are no juniors on the roster this year.

If this year's group of newcomers is impactful as last year's bunch, the Hatters and Donnie Jones may be onto something. Consider, in 2019-20:

-Stetson started at least three freshmen in all but two games, one of which was Senior Day. **Mahamadou Diawara** and **Rob Perry** made 32 starts each, and **Wheza Panzo** (10) and **Joel Kabimba** (25) and Terry Ivery (2) all made starts.

-Stetson's leading scorer in 25 of 33 games was a freshman, either Perry (15), Diawara (9) or Kabimba (1)

-15 times last season a Hatter scored at least 20 points, with Perry (8) and Diawara (4) making up 12 of those efforts

-23 different times a freshman either led or tied for the lead in rebounds in a game. Diawara (14), Perry (8), Kabimba (4), Panzo (4), and Ivery (1) led the way.

-Freshmen accounted for 62.8 percent of the scoring and 58.3 percent of the rebounding

-Stetson's season leaders in both scoring and rebounding were freshmen (Perry & Diawara).

NO FANS AT HOME GAMES TO START YEAR

With COVID-19 cases on the rise throughout Volusia County and the state of Florida, Stetson Athletics will begin the 2020-21 basketball season without fans in attendance at men's and women's home games at Edmunds Center. The 2020-21 season is slated to begin for both teams later this month.

Whether fan attendance will be permitted at a later date will be determined by the athletic department in conjunction with the Safer Stetson Task Force

Despite this news, fans will still have plenty of ways to follow the Hatters, both at home and on the road:

HATTERS PICKED THIRD IN ASUN POLL

Stetson's **Rob Perry** and **Mahamadou Diawara** were unanimously selected to the ASUN's Preseason All-Conference team, and the Hatters were picked to finish third in preseason voting by head coach, the league office announced on Thursday.

Stetson received two first place votes and 64 votes overall, finishing just 10 votes behind preseason favorite Lipscomb (74), and two votes behind second-place Liberty (66). North Florida (56), FGCU (45), North Alabama (40), Jacksonville (29), newcomer Bellarrmine (18) and Kennesaw State (13) round out the poll.

Perry and Diawara, both sophomores, were selected to the 10-man preseason team one year after each earned ASUN All-Freshman and national Freshman All-America honors.

For the Hatters, this is their highest preseason ranking since at least 2005, as conference records don't go back any farther. Stetson received two first-place votes in this year's poll.

Picked to finish last a season ago, the Donnie Jones-coached Hatters stunned the ASUN last year by finishing tied for third. Stetson's 16 wins were not only the program's most in 12 years, but the 9-win improvement was the best for a team with a first-year head coach.

INTERNATIONAL HATTERS

No fewer than seven different countries are represented on this year's Stetson Basketball roster. In addition to seven American players, the Hatters boast student-athletes from Canada (Wheza Panzo), Dominican Republic (Giancarlo Valdez), Mali (Mahamadou Diawara), Belgium (Stephan Swen-

son), South Sudan (**Gabriel Wuor**), and Democratic Republic of Congo (**Joel Kabimba**).

NEWS & NOTES

- •The Hatters return 78 percent of their offense from last season and 79 percent of their rebounding from last season
- •Stetson's 16 wins last season were its most since the 2008-9 season (16)
- •The Hatters showed a 9-win improvement last season, the most by a program with a first-year head coach
- •Stetson was picked to finish dead last in the ASUN preseason poll a year ago but instead finished tied for third
- •All home games and road ASUN Conference games will be streamed live on ESPN+, while Stetson's game at Florida will be carried live on the SEC Network. Games with Miami and USF are also expected to be televised or streamed on a national platform.

HATTERS ADD TWO FOR 2021-22

Luke Brown (Hartford City, Ind.) and Alexander Crawford (Chula Vista, Calif.) both signed with the Hatters during the recently concluded Early Signing Period.

Brown is a 6-1 guard from Blackford HS. He led the state of Indiana in scoring in each of the last two seasons (35.0, 32.3) and reached 1,000 points faster than any player in state history.

Crawford is a 6-7 forward. An exceptional leaper, Crawford averaged 17.1 points, 6.1 rebounds and 2.1 blocked shots as a junior at Eastlake High. He is playing this year for powerful Coronado High in San Diego.

ABOUT STETSON UNIVERSITY

Stetson is located in DeLand, Fla., with a second campus in Gulfport, Fla. and two satellite centers. Founded in 1883 by Henry A. DeLand as the DeLand Academy and later renamed Stetson University to honor its benefactor, Philadelphia hat maker John B. Stetson, the university has a storied history of leadership, values and significance. The university is home to many Florida firsts, including the first collegiate newspaper, the oldest schools of business administration and music, the first college of law and the first private university to integrate.

Notable athletic alums include 2014 & 2017 American League Cy Young Award winner Corey Kluber; 2014 National League Rookie of the Year & two-time (2018, 2019) NL Cy Young Award winner Jacob de-Grom; former NBA forward Lorenzo Williams; Ray Finkle, ex-Miami Dolphins kicker, later a police chief in Miami and one helluva model American; Atlanta Falcons President & CEO Rich McKay; college basketball Hall of Fame inductee Dr. Glenn Wilkes; Jacksonville Jaguars linebacker Donald Payne; Los Angeles Chargers tight end Donald Parham; and PGA Tour member Sam Ryder.

Some of the more notable non-athletic alums include actor Ted Cassidy (Lurch the Butler in TV's The Addams Family); former U.S. Senator Max Cleland (D-Ga.); composer Gerard Marino; country singer Wilma Burgess; Charles E. Merrill, founder of Merrill Lynch; and former Marine Corps General Roy Geiger.



DONNIE JONES

HEAD COACH • SECOND SEASON • PIKEVILLE '88

As first impressions go, Donnie Jones certainly made a strong one on Stetson basketball. Hired as the 22nd head coach in program history on April 1, 2019, Jones took a moribund Stetson basketball program and turned it into an instant contender in the ASUN Conference, despite starting at least three freshmen in every game and having to work six first-year players into the roster.

When the dust settled on the 2019-20 season, Jones and the Hatters had made history. The list of accomplishments was an impressive one:

- •Stetson' 16 victories were a 9-win improvement over the previous season, most in the country for a first-year head coach
- •The 16 victories were not only the most since the 2007-08 season, but also the most by a first-year head coach in Stetson history
- •After being picked to finish dead last in the ASUN preseason poll, the Hatters went 9-7 in ASUN play and finished tied for third
 - •Stetson hosted its first ASUN Tournament home game since 1996
- •Earned the program's first road win against an SEC team since 2004 when the Hatters defeated South Carolina, 63-56, on Dec. 30
- •Mahamadou Diawara and Rob Perry were named to the 30-man Kyle Macy Freshman All-America Team

Jones' reputation as an outstanding recruiter was put the test upon his hire, and he cobbled together an impressive recruiting class in a short time, one which yielded a pair of freshmen All-Americans, the conference Freshman of the Year (Perry), and several other key players who will be major factors as the Hatters march forward over the next several years.

The Hatters served notice almost immediately that things would be different under Jones. In their second game of the season, Stetson secured the program's first road win in two years when Perry exploded for 34 points to lead the Hatters to a 77-75 win at Western Illinois.

Growing pains took hold after that game, and the Hatters won just four more non-conference games through the end of December. But they closed out the non-conference schedule with their biggest win of the season, stunning the Gamecocks in Columbia. South Carolina, which had defeated reigning national champion Virginia in its previous outing, led just twice in the game's early going as the Hatters held on for their first win against a Power 5 program

in a decade. It was a marquee win for Jones and for Stetson.

ASUN play featured a 4-game conference winning streak, which included improbable back-to-back home wins, victories which helped propel the Hatters into the thick of the ASUN Conference race.

The first eye-popping win came against NJIT. The Highlanders jumped out to an 11-point halftime lead and eventually led by as many as 16 points early in the second half before the Hatters closed the game on a 38-21 run to secure the win.

Two nights later, conference leader Liberty stepped into the Edmunds Center. The Flames followed suit, holding an 11-point halftime lead. But once again, the Hatters showed they comeback-ability as they rallied for a 48-43 victory to show that they weren't going anywhere.

A successful conference season culminated on March 3 when the Hatters hosted, and defeated, North Alabama in the ASUN Conference quarterfinals. It was Stetson's first home tournament game since 1996.

Diawara and Perry both earned spots on the ASUN All-Freshman team, while Perry was named second-team all-conference. Perry also was voted to the NABC All-District first team, the first award of its kind for a Hatter since 2009.

Jones came to Stetson following a one-year stint as assistant coach at Dayton. The former head coach at UCF (2010-16) and Marshall (2007-10), Jones has also served as an assistant at Pikeville, Marshall, Wichita State, and Florida, helping lead the Gators to a pair of national championships.

In 10 seasons combined at UCF, Marshall and Stetson, Jones owns a 171-146 (.543) overall record and has led his teams to three post-season tournaments, including the NIT in 2012 with UCF. Nearly half of his teams – four – have produced 20-win seasons.

Long considered one of the top recruiters in the country, Jones has a history of securing top-shelf talent. During his time as an assistant at Florida, Jones helped the Gators recruit and sign 11 McDonald's All-American and 12 eventual National Basketball Association draft selections, including Matt Bonner, David Lee, Mike Miller and Jason Williams. At Marshall, Jones signed and coached current Miami Heat center Hassan Whiteside.

A native of Point Pleasant, W. Va., Jones has been coaching college basketball for 30 years and has experienced more than 700 wins in his coaching career. His career began as an assistant at his alma mater, Pikeville College in Pikeville, Ky., where he spent two seasons before moving on to Marshall as a graduate assistant (1990-92).

Jones was elevated to a full-time position in 1992 and stayed on staff after Billy Donovan joined the Herd in 1994. After four seasons at Marshall, Jones joined Donovan at Florida in 1996.

At Florida, Jones helped Donovan and the Gators to 261 victories, nine NCAA Tournament appearances, and NCAA National Championships in 2006 and 2007.

After 10 seasons in Gainesville, Jones returned to Marshall for his first head coaching job. In three seasons with the Thundering Herd, he was 55-41, winning 24 games and reaching quarterfinals of the CIT in 2010.

On the heels of his success with Marshall, Jones was named head coach at UCF in the spring of 2010 and spent six seasons with the Knights, amassing 100 wins and reaching the postseason twice (CBI Quarterfinals, 2011; NIT First Round, 2012). Jones won 20 games in each of his first three seasons in Orlando before the Knights left Conference USA for the American Athletic Conference.

In 2016 he worked as a scout for the Los Angeles Clippers before joining the staff at Wichita State for the 2017-18 season. Next, Jones teamed up with former fellow Florida assistant Anthony Grant at Dayton, joining the Flyers' staff for the recently completed season.

A 1988 graduate of Pikeville, Jones is a member of the Pikeville athletic Hall of Fame. He also earned a Master's degree in Sports Management from Marshall in 1992.

Jones and his wife, Michelle, have three children: Madisyn, Isaac, and Sophie.
