#### AT THE RIM

- Wrapping up its six-game home stand on Tuesday, the No. 24/RV Virginia Tech men's basketball team will face Miami (Fla.) at 6 p.m. ET on ACC Network inside Cassell Coliseum.
- The Hokies and Hurricanes played each other twice last season, with the 'Canes coming on top both times, including the last time out in Cassell, a triple overtime thriller. (More on page 5)
- Tech, which is 17-24 in the all-time series with Miami, is 9-8 at home against the Hurricanes and is a perfect 4-0 when ranked.
- Tech coach Mike Young is 1-3 all-time versus Miami's Jim Larrañaga. When Young was at Wofford and Larrañaga at George Mason, Young's Terriers defeated the Patriots 82-79 in overtime in 2010 in Charleston.

#### WHO TO WATCH



- Scoring 18 points for the second straight game, Jalen Cone did so thanks to tying his career high in 3-pointers with six and also had a board vs. Longwood.
- The sophomore guard has now hit 11 triples his last two games.

- Tyrece Radford turned in a near double-double his last outing, recording nine points and eight rebounds, including four offensive, and had three assists.
- The last time he played the 'Canes, he had a double-double (26 PTS, 10 REB).



#### LAST TIME OUT

- Shooting a 49.2 percent clip from the field, the Hokies, who got off to a slow start, kicked it into gear in the second half for a 26-point victory over Longwood last Monday, 84-58.
- Tech tallied a season-high nine steals and forced the Lancers to commit 15 turnovers.

**A WIN WOULD**

- Make the Hokies 2-0 in league play and atop the ACC standings for being tied for first place. It would be just the fourth time in school history Tech began its first two ACC games with wins.
- Be revenge for getting swept last year by Miami (Fla.) and make coach Mike Young 1-2 versus the Hurricanes since his arrival to Blacksburg.
- Give the Hokies a nice four-game winning streak heading into its first road contest of the season (UVA on Saturday).

**WAS A FUN RIDE**

- Tech played all of its December games in the friendly confines of Cassell Coliseum, taking on six foes in total with Tuesday's game vs. the 'Canes.
- December has treated the Hokies well so far, winning four of those contests, with its lone loss coming to Penn State in the ACC/B1G Challenge.
- To kick off the new year, Tech will travel to in-state rival Virginia on Saturday and then do a midweek matchup in Louisville on Jan. 6.

**DUNK CITY**

- The rim was rocking quite a bit in Tech's last game, with the Hokies tallying seven dunks against Longwood on Dec. 21.
- The seven dunks marked the most in the Mike Young era, topping the previous high of five set against Maryland Eastern Shore last year (Dec. 29).
- Keve Aluma had multiple dunks (2x) and then Nahiem Alleyne, David N'Guessan, Hunter Cattoor, Tyrece Radford and Justyn Mutts all had one and joined in on the 'dunk party' as well.
- To put it in perspective of how rare that instance was, Tech has three games this season (Coppin State, Villanova, USF) that it didn't get a single dunk.
- Last year, Tech had five games of three dunks, six games of two dunks and 11 games of just one.

**DON'T MAKE 'EM LIKE ME ANYMORE**

- Keve Aluma has been arguably Tech's best player so far this season, with being the team's leading scorer (14.8) and rebounder (6.8), and put it all together in Tech's most recent outing.
- Against Longwood last week, the redshirt junior put together quite the stat line, registering 14 points, four rebounds, three blocks, two steals and an assist in just 24 minutes of action.
- Because of that outing, he is just one of five ACC players and only 13 high-major guys, including Iowa's Luka Garza, to do that stat line or better this season.

**SOMETHING 'BOUT THOSE TWO**

- When you look at the shortest players on the rosters for Virginia Tech and Miami (Fla.), it's not your typical 6-foot walk-on, as Tech's Jalen Cone (5'10") and Miami's Chris Lykes (5'7") are pretty short considering DI averages.
- But, despite their challenges of that, the two have formed a bond with one another and consider each other friends off the court.
- The two text regularly and Lykes has given Cone tips on best practices of overcoming his lack of height in the ACC, with Lykes being a couple of years older than Cone and sharing words of wisdom of what has worked for him over the years.

**SMALL BUT MIGHTY**

- Among high-major conference teams, there are only 35 players that are less than six feet tall, including Tech's Jalen Cone, standing at 5-foot-10.
- Of those 35, 19 of them are walk-ons, while the other 16 are on scholarship.
- In the ACC, Cone is one of eight players shorter than six feet, and is just one of five scholarship players in the league.
- This week, Cone will go against two of the more famous shorter guys in the league, including Miami (Fla.)'s Chris Lykes and UVA's Kihei Clark.

**UPTICK IN SHARING THE ROCK**

- Sophomore guard Hunter Cattoor has improved his ball handling and decision making from last year, and it really has showed here the last couple of games for the Hokies.
- With Cartier Diarra opting out of the season (since Dec. 15), Cattoor has filled in as the secondary point guard, spelling Wabissa Bede, and has done a nice job, turning in eight assists his last two games.
- That two-game stretch of eight dimes is his best two-game stretch yet as a Hokie, topping his previous high of seven assists last season versus Delaware State on Nov. 20 and then-No. 3 Michigan State on Nov. 25.
- Versus Coppin State on Dec. 19, he dished out a career-high five assists – not bad for a guy who is known as a catch-and-shoot specialist.

**OUT IN TRANSITION**

- For just the third time in the Mike Young era, the Hokies have had three straight games of scoring in double digits in the fastbreak points category.
- With their totals of 12 against Clemson, 15 versus Coppin State and 13 against Longwood, it marked the first time since Jan. 7-14 ('Cuse, NCSU, Wake) of them doing so.
- Tech, which averaged 9.45 fastbreak points per game last year against nonconference foes and just 8.05 versus ACC opponents, is averaging 10.63 so far this season.
- According to KenPom, the Hokies' tempo is on a little more of an uptick compared to last year, with them averaging 66.6 (adjusted tempo rating) this year to 65.5 last season.

**UNDER A HANDFUL CAN SAY SO**

- Tech is one of just four high-major schools this season to have two players drill five or more 3s together in the same game.
- The Hokies are one of two ACC schools ('Cuse) to do so this year, while the other two teams are two top-10 teams in No. 4 Iowa (vs. UNC), which actually had three players accomplish the feat, and No. 5 Villanova (vs. Georgetown).

**20-ASSIST PLATEAU**

- Tech has had six games of 20 or more assists in the Young era and is 5-1 in those games, with the lone loss coming to Syracuse at home last year in a close one, 80-78.
- The Hokies had 20 assists against Coppin State for a season high, with three players owning at least four, including Wabissa Bede (5 ast.), Hunter Cattoor (5) and Jalen Cone (4).

**What's a Hokie?**



The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which is still used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

The official university school colors - Chicago Maroon and Burnt Orange - also were introduced in 1896. The colors were chosen by a committee because they made a 'unique combination' not worn elsewhere at the time. The official definition of "hokie" is "a loyal Virginia Tech Fan".

**WHERE THEY AT**

- Tech has 15 players on the squad who represent 10 states and two international countries (Netherlands, Nigeria), making it tied for eighth in the country for most states and countries represented on a roster this season.
- Virginia leads the way with three players – Joseph "Joe" Bamisile, Gill Williamson, Grant Yates – while Maryland has two players – Keve Aluma and Darius Maddox.
- New Mexico, Penn and UT Martin are No. 1 nationally with 15 players from different states and countries, while in the ACC, Boston College (13) is first and Florida State is tied with the Hokies for the second most in the league with 12.
- Of the 23 schools that have 12 or more players from different spots, nine are from high-major conferences, including BC, Kentucky, Butler, FSU, Iowa State, Nebraska, Tennessee, Tulane and the Hokies.

**'19 CLASS OF HIGH-MAJOR COACHES**

- Out of the seven high-major conferences (ACC, American, BIG EAST, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12 and SEC), there were 14 head coaches hired for the 2019-20 season.
- Virginia Tech coach Mike Young was just one of six coaches that were a mid-major coach to jump up to the big leagues, joining Alabama's Nate Oats (Buffalo), Arkansas' Eric Musselman (Nevada), Tulane's Ron Hunter (Georgia State) and Washington State's Kyle Smith (San Francisco).
- Of the 14 new coaches, Young was the longest-tenured coach to leave, following his 17-year stint as the head guy at Wofford.
- The NBA saw three of its coaches jump into the college ranks, with Michigan's Juwon Howard (Miami Heat), Nebraska's Fred Hoiberg (Chicago Bulls) and Vanderbilt's Jerry Stackhouse (Memphis Grizzlies).
- In this cycle, only one assistant coach was promoted from within and that was Temple's Aaron McKie, who served as an assistant under Fran Dunphy for five seasons in Philadelphia.
- Former Hokie coach Buzz Williams, who is at Texas A&M, was one of just two coaches to jump ship and go high-major for high-major, with UCLA's Mick Cronin (Cincinnati) being the other.
- A full breakdown of the 14 coaches in the cycle is below, with the SEC welcoming the most among the seven leagues with four. The Big 12 was the lone conference not make coaching change heading into the 2019-20 season.

**LAST TIME vs. MIAMI (FLA.)**

- One of the more memorable games in Mike Young's first season, the contest that went three overtimes in Blacksburg marked the longest ACC game since Dec. 20, 2003, when a Chris Paul-led Wake Forest team won 119-114 in triple overtime over North Carolina in Chapel Hill, North Carolina.
- The triple overtime game tied for the longest in the history of Cassell Coliseum.
- The Hokies got down by as many as 12 points, but mustered a comeback and almost won the game in regulation. Jalen Cone made 1 of 2 free throws with 13 seconds left to put Tech up three points at 77-74, but an and-1 play by Kam McGusty at the end tied the game to send it to overtime.
- Tyrece Radford came to play, logging 50 minutes to tie the most-ever by a Hokie in an ACC game (Malcolm Delaney vs. Maryland in 2010), and had a double-double (career-high 26 points, 10 rebounds).
- The Canes shot lights out from the charity stripe, making 29 of their 32 free-throw attempts (90.6%).

**SCOUTING MIAMI (FLA.)**

- Miami is coming off nine-point win over Jacksonville (6-4) on Dec. 19 at home, with getting a big scoring outing (25 points) from sophomore Isaiah Wong and a double-double performance from Anthony Walker (18 points, 10 rebounds) in the 73-64 final.
- Jim Larrañaga enters his 10th season as the head coach in Coral Gables, following a 14-year stint at George Mason where he took the Patriots to the Final Four in 2006. With the Canes, he has led them to four NCAA Tournament appearances and an ACC title in 2013.
- The Hurricanes are paced by Wong, who is averaging 19 points and 6.2 rebounds per game, and preseason All-ACC pick Chris Lykes, who is averaging 15.5 points and 5.5 assists per game, but has missed four games.
- Blocking shots and playing fundamental defense are two key strengths for Miami. It is 19th nationally and first in the ACC in blocked shots per game (5.3) and is 16th and fourth in the league in fouls per game (14.3).



### TOP ITEMS IN YOUNG ERA

- To give perspective on how well the Hokies were clicking on all cylinders Saturday against Coppin State on Dec. 19, here are how some key items that stand out in the Mike Young era.
- Tech's bench exploded for 51 points, which is the most in the Young era, topping the previous high of 49, which was set twice - Delaware State (Nov. 20) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Tech's 20 3s were the second most in school history, as well as the Young era (21 vs. Delaware State).
- The 97 points were the second most in the Young era, topping the triple OT game against Miami (Fla.) last year of 95 points, but being a triple short of the Delaware State game's 100-point outing.
- Also, Tech had eight players make a 3 versus Coppin State, which hasn't happened at Tech since Nov. 21, 2017 against Houston Baptist (8 as well).

### NOT GREAT, BOB - OH WAIT

- Tech had not been shooting the ball well from downtown as of late, making just five 3s versus then-No. 24/RV Clemson, six 3s against Penn State, four triples versus VMI and only five the one before that (USF) for a combined 20-of-81 clip (24.7%).
- In the Mike Young era, that was the fewest 3s made in a four-game stretch.
- So, after hitting just 20 3s its last four games heading into Coppin State, Tech ripped off the exact amount in just one game.

### FALLING BUT WINNING THE GLASS

- Tech coach Mike Young is 12-2 at Tech when his Hokie team out-rebounds the opponent, with another instance of it happening in Tech's last game versus Penn State (39-33).
- It marked just the second loss when his group has outrebounded its opponent, with the only other loss coming last season against Boston College on Feb. 8, 2019, with a +1 differential.
- In fact, out of Tech's 20 ACC games last year, it only out-rebounded its league opponent three times, with two of those being versus Clemson.

### BOOTS EXPANDING HIS VERSATILITY

- Guard Tyrece Radford, otherwise known as "Boots", tied his career high in assists against Radford, racking up five assists.
- Radford has done so three times now, with the other two coming last year against Syracuse (Jan. 18) and Maryland Eastern Shore (Dec. 29).
- Last year, the Louisiana native had seven games of four or more assists. So, after working on his passing ability this offseason, expect Boots to share the rock on an uptick this season instead of having his head down traditionally on his way to the rim.
- Since the season opener versus the Highlanders, Radford has found his groove with sharing the rock, leading the team in assists in three games so far, including Tech's game vs. Penn State (3 ast.).

### RARE, LIKE MR. CLEAN WITH HAIR

- Justyn Mutts, who doesn't have a bad hairdo himself, became just the fifth Hokie in the last decade to have a 10-point, nine-rebound, six-assist or better stat line and the first since 2019 (Nickeil Alexander-Walker) when he did so vs. VMI.
- Mutts is just one of two in the ACC players in the ACC to do so this year (Louisville's Carlik Jones).

### ROUND THE BLOCK

- With more of an intentionality of scoring inside this season with the added presence down low compared to last year, Tech showcased that vs. USF with 42 points in the paint, which was most in the Mike Young era, spanning over 35 games.
- The previous high was 40 points against then-No. 10/8 Duke on Dec. 6 in Cassell, a 77-63 lost.

### GETTIN' TO THE CHARITY STRIPE

- Coach Young was not happy with how little the Hokies got to the free-throw line last year, with an average of 13.4 per game, which ranked second-to-last in the ACC and was in the bottom 25 nationally.
- So now, with not being as dependent on the 3-ball and having more players that can get to the rim, Tech has increased that average to 22.1 this season, including a three-game stretch of 20-plus three-throw attempts versus Villanova, USF and VMI.
- Last year, the Hokies only had eight games (out of 32) of having 20 or more free throw attempts. When doing so, they were 7-1, with the lone loss being against Miami (Fla.) in triple overtime.
- Tech accomplished consecutive contests with 20-plus free throws only twice (Jan. 7-14) last year.

### STARTIN' OUT HOT

- The Hokies have started the season out on a strong note, with defeating their opponent by 10 or more points twice through five games.
- In Young's final season at Wofford (2018-19), that was a norm, with his Terriers having 22 games of winning by double digits.
- Last season, though, Tech only won by 10 or more 10 times, including just four times against a high-major conference opponent.
- The Hokies already have one double-digit win against a high-major team (USF) this year.

### MORE ON THE DECK

- Sophomore Hunter Cattoor was a more balanced player in high school he shared recently, with doing a little bit of everything (3s, mid-range, floaters) at all three levels.
- Since his arrival to Blacksburg, he's been more of a catch-and-shoot player and is looking to buck that trend.
- So, against USF, the guard set a career-high eight free throw attempts and cashed in six of those. Cattoor last year, out of 31 games, only got to the line in eight games for a total of 22 free throw attempts. So expect more times than not he will put it on the deck and attack the rim.

### LEVELIN' UP

- The grad transfer from Iowa, Cordell PemsI, stepped up in a big way against USF, subbing in for Keve Aluma when he picked up his second foul early in the first half.
- PemsI came in and made some big plays, playing 12 minutes and recording eight points and four rebounds alone in the first half.
- He would go on to finish with 10 points and six rebounds - not bad for a role player who had 13 minutes, one point and two rebounds combined the first two games.

### BENCH MOB HEATIN' UP

- In the USF win, the Hokies had five players score in double figures, which was a first this year and only the third time in the Mike Young era (UMES, Michigan St.; both with five players).
- Of those five players Sunday, two did so coming off the bench, respectively, in Cartier Diarra and Cordell PemsI. Last season, that happened just eight times, with half of those in ACC play.

### THAT'S A FIRST

- Tech basketball under the direction of Coach Young is known for being a quality 3-point shooting team, with the Hokies finishing with the most 3s made last year in the ACC with 315.
- So when they are having an off shooting night from downtown, it's tough to overcome it and get a win.
- Last year, Tech had three instances when it made five or less 3s and went 0-3 in those games.
- This year, with not being as reliant on the deep ball, Tech made only five triples versus USF, but still earned a blowout win, a first in the Mike Young era.

### DOWNTOWN, A STAPLE

- As you know, 3-point shooting is a staple of the Coach Young offense.
- And to back up his prowess, Young is one of only two coaches whose teams have ranked in the top 80 nationally in 3P% each of the last six years (since 2014-15).
- The only others are Saint Mary's Randy Bennet, Duke's Coach K, Michigan State's Tom Izzo and Gonzaga's Mark Few each with five a piece.

### TOP-THREE WINS

- There are only two teams since '10 that have won a game against a top-3 team in their first six games of the season in consecutive years, with it being Tech and Duke ('17, '18).

### THE FEW, THE PROUD

- Only eight players this season have racked up 13 rebounds and dished out five assists in a game, with Tyrece Radford accomplishing the feat against then-No. 3 Villanova.
- Three of those players reside in the ACC, with Radford, Duke's Jalen Johnson and Pitt's Justin Champagnie.

### WITH THE BEST OF THEM

- Over the last five seasons, only Tech, Duke, UNC and Kansas have the most wins against AP top-five teams, with all four squads owning six games apiece since 2016.

### UPSET TIDBITS

- Coach Young earned his second ranked win at Tech, following his upset of then-No. 3 Michigan State late November in Maui, and makes him 2-0 at Tech versus the AP's third-ranked team.
- For the third time in Coach Young's last four seasons he's earned a top-five win (No. 5 North Carolina, 2017, when he was at Wofford).
- Tech now has three straight seasons of winning a nonconference tournament game against a ranked opponent (No. 23/22 Purdue, 2018, Charleston Classic).

### THE GLASS

- Tech didn't control the glass too much last year in games against ACC teams, with only out-rebounding its ACC opponent three times out of 21 games.
- But what was a weakness, with a good amount of that coming down to size, last year is arguably now a strength, as the Hokies out-rebounding third-ranked Villanova by nine.
- Tyrece Radford tied his career high with 13 boards to lead the charge on the glass for Tech.
- Keve Aluma (8) and Justyn Mutts (6) combined for 14 boards, including three of those being offensive.

### BEEN A MINUTE

- Tech scored 81 against then-No. 3/3 Villanova, marking the first time the Hokies have scored 80 or more points since Feb. 19, 2020 against Miami (Fla.) in a triple overtime thriller.
- A total of seven games came in between the Miami and 'Nova games.
- The Hokies are 5-1 when they score 80-plus points under Coach Young. The lone loss was the Miami (Fla.) triple OT contest, a 102-95 setback.

### EFFICIENT AS THEY COME

- Forward Keve Aluma had quite the debut vs. Radford, netting seven of his 10 shots for a career-high 19 points.
- The redshirt junior likely won't keep a 70 percent field-goal percentage going all season, but it is something to keep an eye on the rest of the way.
- In his final season at Wofford (2018-19), Aluma shot 67 percent from the floor, which ranked 17th among all Division I players (minimum 140 FGA).
- So, expect a high clip from the Maryland native this season.

### THE LONE SWEEP

- Last season, Tech swept Clemson with defeating the Tigers once on the road (Nov. 5) and once at home (March 4) for its lone sweep of a team on the year.
- It marked just the second-ever over the Tigers (2017).
- The Hokies had six players hit a 3-pointer, including four players hitting at least two.

### COMEBACK KIDS

- Tech put together a 12-point comeback against the third-ranked 'Cats in the win.
- The last time the Hokies were down double digits and came back to win was vs. UNC on Jan. 22, 2020, which was also a game that went into overtime.

### SOMETHING ABOUT 4

- Tech, which didn't necessarily have a handful of high-end scorers in Mike Young's first season, looks like it does now, as six players made at least four shots against Radford.
- So there must be something about the No. 4, as Tech also had four steals, with four players getting one swipe apiece.
- Last year, Tech didn't have a single game of six players making four or more field goals (closest was five players twice), marking the Radford game a first in the Mike Young era – a promising sign for the Hokies of a more well-balanced attack offensively.

### SHARING IS CARING

- Tech dished out 18 assists versus the Highlanders, which was the third-most by an ACC team in season openers.
- The Hokies had 18 or more assists in seven games last year and went 6-1 on those contests, losing to Syracuse 71-69 at home in the lone setback.

### MY TURN

- Coach Young this fall created a non-profit called MY TURN, which is an anti-bullying organization.
- Through this organization, Coach Young hopes to bring attention and awareness to bullying in schools, as well as prevention tactics to the community at Tech and the surrounding areas.
- Growing up in Southwest Virginia, Coach Young spent a lot of time in Cassell Coliseum with his late father, Bob Young, whose service and dedication as an educator and coach impacted many young lives in the new river valley community.
- Following in his father's footsteps, Coach Young's passion for coaching and teaching makes him a great advocate for promoting change and equality.

### NOT TOO SHABBY

- Tech ranked highly in a few categories nationally last season and hopes to do the same this season, with those including being fifth in turnovers per game (9.9), fifth in assist-turnover ratio (1.48), 13th in 3-point field goals per game (9.8) and 17th in personal fouls per game (14.8).

### WHAT'S NOT TO LIKE?

- KenPom had the Hokies at No. 35 out of 351 teams in its preseason rankings, which are based off of adjusted efficiency margin.
- Out of the ACC, it has Tech tabbed as the eighth best team in the league.

### FIRST-YEAR WINS

- Tech coach Mike Young tallied 16 wins his first year in Blacksburg, making him tied for the fifth-most wins by a first-year Tech coach in school history.
- The 16 wins were the most by a first-year Tech coach since 1999-00 when Ricky Stokes had 16 as well.

### THAT NEW, NEW

- Tech is tied for the 12th-most newcomers in the nation, bringing in nine players this past offseason.
- Two of those guys were already on campus in Keve Aluma and Grant Yates, but had to sit out last year due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Speaking of transfers, Tech welcomed three this past summer in Cartier Diarra (Kansas State), Justyn Mutts (Delaware) and Cordell Pems (Iowa). Mutts has two years of eligibility, while Diarra and Pems each have one season left. However, the NCAA waived the players' eligibility that compete in winter sports, therefore all three could return an additional year.
- Then the other four players are freshmen, with three being on scholarship and one is a walk-on.
- The Hokies have the most newcomers of any team in the ACC.
- Here is how Tech ranks among high-major conferences with bringing in new players:

### OLDER AND WISER

- Last season, Tech was one of the youngest teams in the country (second among high-majors, trailing Utah), playing seven underclassmen in its nine-player rotation.
- This season, it got a little older and wiser with the addition of three grad transfers, as well as its core of now-sophomores having a year of experience, which should equate to a more poised Hokie bunch.
- The three grad transfers combined for 252 games under their belts coming into this season, giving the Hokies some much-needed experience.

### HOME SWEET HOME

- The Hokies home nonconference winning streak got up to 35 games, which at the time was the third-longest in the nation before Penn State snapped the streak in the ACC/B1G Challenge.
- Tech hadn't lost a home nonconference game since Dec. 30, 2015 against West Virginia (88-63).
- The previous best was 23, which was set twice from 1980-84 and 2005-09. The 35-game streak began on Nov. 11, 2016, against Maine.

### BOOTS ON THE BOARDS

- For just the third time in school history since joining the ACC in 2004, Tech had a freshman lead the team in rebounding last season when Tyrece Radford brought down 199 boards.
- The other two instances were done by household names as well, with Dorian Finney-Smith (232) in 2011-12 and Jeff Allen (251) in 2007-08 doing so.

## NBA & G-LEAGUE

### NAW IN YEAR 2

- Nickeil Alexander-Walker has left his mark on Virginia Tech and is working on making a name for himself at the next level with the New Orleans Pelicans.
- A first-round draft pick in 2019, the Toronto native played in 47 games for the Pels in the 2019-20 NBA season. On Feb. 26, he was moved down to the Erie Bayhawks, then came back up when the bubble in Orlando started.
- He scored a career-high 27 points against the Miami Heat on Saturday, Nov. 16. He followed it up the next game on Sunday, Nov. 17 with 19 points, five rebounds and four assists versus the Warriors, for his best two-game stretch of the season.
- This season, NAW has played in one game for the Pelicans, which was their season opener on Dec. 23 vs. the Toronto Raptors, and played four minutes.

- It was a little bit of a whirlwind for Tech alums Nickeil Alexander-Walker, Justin Robinson and Ahmed Hill last year, with all three going up and down and all around on their quest to solidifying a roster spot in the NBA.
- Robinson, who signed as an undrafted free agent after the NBA Draft concluded with the Washington Wizards, was waived on Jan. 4.
- Hill signed with the Hornets this summer on a two-way deal, but was released in early November. However, he landed nicely on his feet, with now playing on the NAZ Suns, the G-League affiliate of the Phoenix Suns.
- Justin Bibbs, who plays for the Boston Celtics' affiliate (Maine Red Claws), hit a game-winner on Jan. 19, 2019, finishing with 15 points and six assists.

- The guard, who was averaging 1.4 3-point makes per game before Feb. 15, finished another level since that game versus Pitt Feb. 15 with a 2.9 mark on a 47.4 percent clip over his last eight outings.
- So, though his attempts were about the same with one more a pop, he made more at a higher rate, making him a reliable threat off the bench, and is someone to watch heading into this year for another jump in shooting percentages coming most likely.
- In his last game, with maybe a glimpse of what's to come, he hit four 3s against North Carolina.

**MAKE IT RAIN**

- Tech let it rip with six guys hitting a 3-pointer against Clemson in its final home game of the 2019-20 season, which is a trend it accomplished a few times that season.
- In their 32 games last season, the Hokies had nine games with six or more guys hitting a triple and went 6-3 in those games.
- Tech had six guys hit a 3 against Coppin State (11/8) and USC Upstate (11/13), marking the first time that has happened in consecutive games since December 2018 vs. Central Connecticut State (1st) and VMI (5th).
- Since 2010, the Hokies have had 31 games in which they have had at least six players make a 3. In those games, they are 26-5 (.839).
- The most they've had hit a 3 is eight players in a game, which has happened just once since 2010 (Houston Baptist on Nov. 21, 2017).

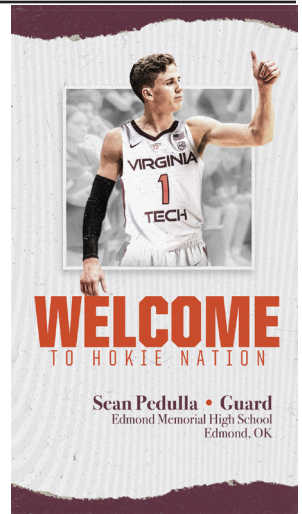

Having just three players returning who saw minutes the previous year in 2018-19 on the team, Young had to act quickly when hired on April 7, 2019 and build a roster to compete in the best conference in the nation. Adding a staff and six scholarship players in a hurry, Young's first season in Blacksburg started off with a bang, as the Hokies went down to South Carolina and defeated Clemson in style to give Young his first Hokie and ACC win, as well as his 300th career victory.

Another big-time W came at the prestigious Maui Jim Maui Invitational against then-No. 3 Michigan State. On ESPN2 with Dan Shulman and Jay Bilas on the call, the young Hokies (7 of the 9 rotation players were underclassmen) pulled off one of the bigger upsets of the season with a 71-66 win. With the upset of Sparty, it marked the first time since 1964 that Tech beat a top-five team in nonconference play.

Despite being the shortest and second-youngest squad among high-major conference teams, Young and Co. tallied 16 wins to make it the most victories by a first-year head coach at Tech since 1999-00 and tied for the fifth-most wins ever by a first-year Hokie coach. He also became the first coach to win two of his first three road ACC games in school history.

Leaning on a mix of young and old in his first season, Young developed junior Wabissa Bede into one of the finer point guards in the country, as Bede would go on to finish with the sixth-best assist-to-turnover ratio nationally (3.34) and first in the ACC. And under Young's tutelage, redshirt freshman Tyrece Radford blossomed into one of the better all-around players in the league, with being one of only two players in the ACC to average 10 points, six rebounds and shoot over 60 percent from the field.

Under the direction of Young, the Hokies put together some new records during the 2019-20 season. On Nov. 20 versus Delaware State, Tech racked up 21 3-pointers, marking the most in school history and the most ever by an ACC team. Speaking of 3s, the 315 hit last season were the second-most in school history.

Four freshmen hit 49 or more 3-pointers, which was the most by any program in over the last 25 years. Behind the young bucks, Tech finished 13th nationally in 3-pointers made per game with 9.9 triples a contest, which was the most in school history.

Utilizing its freshmen on the offensive end last year, Tech finished with its freshmen averaging 50.7 points per game, which is the fourth-most in ACC history behind Duke's 2018-19, 2017-18, 1982-83 teams.

Making sure his team played the game the right way by limiting miscues, Young's prowess showed on Dec. 29 when Tech committed only two turnovers against Maryland Eastern Shore to tie a school record. The Hokies would go on to finish fourth in the nation in fewest turnovers committed per game (9.9).

The Radford, Virginia native joined the Hokies after a record-setting 17-year tenure as the head coach at Wofford. The Terriers posted a 30-5 overall record in 2018-19, including a perfect 18-0 mark in Southern Conference play, and registered a convincing 84-68 win over Seton Hall in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

The 2019 Sporting News Coach of the Year, Young built the Terriers into one of the Southern Conference's preeminent programs and a perennial NCAA Tournament participant. He guided Wofford to five NCAA Tournament berths over the past 10 seasons and five Southern Conference championships.
