THE GAME

- The #18/#18 Miami Hurricanes are going bowling for the 44th time in school history, and will hit the field on Dec. 29 for the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl at Camping World Stadium in Orlando. The matchup between the Hurricanes and #21/RV Oklahoma State kicks off at 5:30 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Dave O'Brien (pxp), Tim Hasselbeck (color) and Katie George (sidelines) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 19th season together and will carry the game live. In addition to the broadcast on 560 WQAM, Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on **Unanimo Deportes 990AM** from Hard Rock Stadium.

THE SERIES

- Miami topped Oklahoma State, 40-3, in the only other matchup between the two in Miami in 1991 - a year the Canes won the national championship.

THE HURRICANES

- The 2020 Hurricanes became just the second Miami team since joining the ACC in 2004 to win seven conference games; head coach **Manny Diaz** was defensive coordinator on staff the last time the Hurricanes won seven ACC games in a single season (2017). Miami finished that year with a 10-3 mark.
- The University of Miami had six football student-athletes named semifinalists for major college football awards on Dec. 7; **S Bubba Bolden** was select for the Paycom Jim Thorpe Award, **K Jose Borregales** for the Lou Groza Award, **P Lou Hedley** for the Ray Guy Award, **TE Brevin Jordan** for the John Mackey Award, **QB D'Eriq King** for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award and Earl Campbell Award and **DE Jaelan Phillips** for the Chuck Bednarik Award. Borregales (Groza), Hedley (Ray Guy) and King (Campbell) went on to be named finalists for those respective awards in late December.
- Nine Hurricanes earned All-ACC recognition, headlined by Borregales' All-ACC first-team honors. Bolden, Hedley, Jordan and Phillips were named to the second team, **DE Quincy Roche** and **WR Michael Harley** to the third team while King and **DT Nesta Jade Silvera** were honorable mention.
- UM was ranked #18 in both the latest Amway Coaches' Poll and Associated Press top 25, released Dec. 13 - a drop from its previous rankings of #8 by the coaches and #9 by the Associated Press. Miami's #7/#7 rankings from Oct. 4 marked the Hurricanes' highest poll position since Nov. 26, 2017.
- Miami was ranked #18 in the final College Football Playoff rankings on Dec. 13; it was UM's second time ever being included in the final CFP rankings.
- **QB D'Eriq King** picked up ACC Quarterback of the Week three times this year, including on Nov. 9; he has thrown for 2,573 yards and 22 TDs while adding 520 rushing yards and four rushing TDs. One of the nation's most electrifying players, King earned All-ACC Honorable Mention recognition.
- Miami became the first school to participate in the game selected for the site of ESPN College GameDay three times in the first five weeks of the year in the show's history; UM, who is 15-9 in games selected for GameDay site, was picked for games versus Louisville, Florida State & Clemson this fall.
- On July 27, Diaz named King Miami's starting quarterback for the season. King, who announced his decision to transfer to Miami in January 2020, compiled 82 total touchdowns, 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards during his 22 starts at Houston. He has 9,148 career yards of total offense.
- 11 starters and 39 letterwinners return from a team that finished in the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Diaz's year at the helm in Coral Gables.
- Diaz, who was the defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes from 2016-2018, retooled Miami's offensive staff this past offseason, hiring **Rhett Lashlee** as offensive coordinator from Southern Methodist. He also added wide receivers coach **Rob Likens**, who spent 2019 as offensive coordinator at Arizona State, and offensive line coach **Garin Justice**, who was offensive coordinator at UNLV. Diaz also added UM legend **Ed Reed** as Chief of Staff.

QUICK HITS

MIAMI ON THE HUNT FOR A BOWL WIN

- #18/#18 Miami is going bowling for the eighth straight season and will be making a record sixth appearance in what is now the Cheez-It Bowl on Dec. 29 in Orlando.
- The Hurricanes are matched up with the Cowboys for just the second time in history; Miami topped Oklahoma State, 40-3, in the last head-to-head meeting in 1991.
- Miami has a 20-23 all-time record in 43 bowl games in program history, and is playing in its second bowl game under the direction of head coach **Manny Diaz**.
- Miami is 3-2 in this bowl game, and the Hurricanes are looking for their first bowl win since their last appearance in it in 2016.

A NEW 'KING' IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ

- Redshirt senior **D'Eriq King** is slated for the 11th start of his Miami career in the Cheez-It Bowl against Oklahoma State; he was named Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Manny Diaz** in late July.
- In the 10th start at UM on Dec. 12 vs. UNC, King threw for 239 yards with two passing touchdowns. King has accounted for 26 total touchdowns in 10 games at Miami, including 22 passing touchdowns.
- King spent the first four seasons of his career at Houston; the Manvel, Texas native was selected to the watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award and the Maxwell Award this preseason.

UM #18 IN FINAL CFP RANKINGS OF 2020

- The Miami Hurricanes football team checked in at No. 18 in the final College Football Playoff rankings released on Dec. 13 - a fall from its previous ranking of #10.
- Miami's appearance at No. 10 on Dec. 1 marked the eighth time inside the top 10 of the CFP rankings; when it cracked the top-10 of the first CFP rankings released on Nov. 24, it was the first such occasion since the final rankings of 2017 (Dec. 3, 2017).
- Miami's game against Oklahoma State marks the only ranked bowl matchup outside of the New Year's Six games; the Cowboys were ranked #21 in the final CFP rankings of the fall.

D'Eriq King became the first quarterback in Miami history to rush for more than 100 yards in a game when he totaled 105 in a come-from-behind win at NC State.

The Hurricanes became just the second FBS team (South Alabama) in history to block three field goals in a single game on Oct. 10, managing the feat at No. 1 Clemson.

Miami was one of five teams to have a player named semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award (top place kicker - Jose Borregales) and Ray Guy Award (top punter - Lou Hedley).

The Hurricanes, who ranked No. 4 in FBS and led the ACC with an average of 8.3 tackles for loss per game last year (108 total), are one of only five teams in FBS averaging more than 8.5 tackles for loss (8.6) this year.

Nine Miami Hurricanes were among those players recognized with All-ACC honors this season.

Miami led all ACC programs with 31 former players on active NFL 53-man rosters entering Week 1 of the 2020 NFL season.

D'Eriq King's 89-yard touchdown pass to Mike Harley at Duke was the fourth-longest pass play in Miami history and longest since 2007, when Kyle Wright connected with Darnell Jenkins on a 97-yard pass at North Carolina.

#18 HURRICANES BATTLE #21 COWBOYS IN ORLANDO AT CHEEZ-IT BOWL

- #18/#18 Miami looks to put the finishing touches on its 2020 season when it battles #21/RV Oklahoma State in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl at Camping World Stadium in Orlando on Dec. 29 (5:30 p.m., ESPN).
- The Hurricanes are playing in the game for a record sixth time; Miami's last bowl win came in this game in 2016 (Russell Athletic Bowl). Oklahoma State last played in the game in 2017. Miami's other wins in the game came in 1996 (Carquest Bowl vs. Virginia) and in 1998 (MicronPC Bowl vs. NC State)
- The Hurricanes, who have an all-time mark of 20-23 in 43 previous bowl games, are bowling for the eighth straight year and second time under head coach **Manny Diaz**. In his first bowl game at the helm last year, the Hurricanes fell to Louisiana Tech, 14-0, at the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl.
- With an adjusted 2020 slate due to COVID-19, Miami played just one nonconference game and had 10 ACC games scheduled; Miami won seven ACC games (7-2 record) for just the second time in history.
- Tuesday's bowl game will be broadcast live by 560 WQAM "The Joe" and Unanimous Deportes 990 AM.

A LOOK BACK: MIAMI FALLS TO NORTH CAROLINA IN FINAL HOME GAME

- Last time out on Dec. 12, Miami fell to North Carolina, 62-26, at Hard Rock Stadium in the regular season finale for both teams. The Hurricanes' following game against Georgia Tech, which was scheduled for Dec. 19, was eventually canceled. The loss to UNC was Miami's only home loss in 2020.
- QB **D'Eriq King** threw for 239 yards and two scores in the loss to the Tar Heels, while RB **Cam/Ron Harris** added a rushing TD. TE **Brevin Jordan** had six catches for 140 yards and a 76-yard TD.
- TE **Brevin Jordan** had four receptions for 75 yards and a touchdown, RB **Donald Chaney, Jr.**, added four receptions for 81 yards and WR **Dee Wiggins** had a touchdown. Harley had 105 yards in the win.
- In his last game as a Hurricane, DE **Jaelan Phillips** had four tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a half-sack.

NEW KING IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ DOMINATES IN FIRST YEAR AT UM

- QB **D'Eriq King** was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach **Manny Diaz** on July 27.
- King, who totaled 6,346 yards of offense at UH, entered 2020 with an FBS record of 15 straight games with at least one passing and one rushing TD; he broke Tim Tebow's record (14) at Houston.
- Though his FBS record streak came to an end at 16 games in UM's win over Louisville, King has 2,573 passing yards and 520 rushing yards in 10 starts; he has 26 total touchdowns with 20 passing TDs.
- King became the first Miami QB in history to rush for 100 yards in a game in Miami's win at NC State.
- In a win at Duke on Dec. 5, King connected on an 89-yard touchdown pass to WR Michael Harley - the fourth-longest passing play in UM history. King has just one interception in his last five games.
- King was named ACC Quarterback of the Week, a Manning Award Star of the Week, Maxwell Award Offensive Player of the Week and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Player of the Week after Miami's win against Louisville. He is one of five finalists for the Earl Campbell Award, as announced Dec. 23.
- King had a prolific career with the Cougars, totaling 82 total touchdowns (50 passing, 28 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return), 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards in just 22 starts.
- King became the first player in Houston history to throw a touchdown, catch a touchdown and return a kickoff for a touchdown in the same game when he managed the feat for Houston at Texas State.

PHILLIPS, ROCHE ANNOUNCE PLANS TO ENTER NFL DRAFT, MISS BOWL

- Starting defensive end tandem **Jaelan Phillips** and **Quincy Roche** announced they would forego their remaining eligibility, including the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl, to begin preparations for the NFL Draft.
- The duo combined for 90 total tackles, 30 tackles for loss and 12.5 sacks in a dominant 2020 season.



"BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!" TURNOVER CHAIN IS BACK FOR 2020

- When CB **Al Blades, Jr.**, intercepted a pass in the second quarter of a road win over Louisville on Sept. 19, fans across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain - version 4.0 for 2020.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017), Sebastian the Ibis (2018), and the notorious '305' Miami area code (2019), showcases a charm with the famous school logo inside the state of Florida. The charm weights 300 grams while the chain is 30 inches in length. The chain took three months to complete, and was designed by famed jeweler Anthony "AJ the Jeweler" Machado - he designed the first three versions of the Turnover Chain and Touchdown Rings.
- Inspired by legendary coach Howard Schnellenberger's 'State of Miami' recruiting plan, the only three counties in the state featuring Miami colors are Dade County, Broward County & Palm Beach County.
- After the unveiling of Miami's now infamous turnover chain in 2017, Miami led all of Power-5 with an average of 1.95 turnovers forced per game from 2017-2019. The Hurricanes were tied with Wisconsin for No. 1 among all Power-5 teams with 76 turnovers forced over the span, including 20 last season.

HARLEY EMERGED AS FORCE AT WIDE RECEIVER IN SENIOR SEASON

- WR **Michael Harley** earned his first ACC Receiver of the Week honor after a standout game vs. Virginia on Oct. 24; Harley hauled in a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 170 yards with one touchdown.
- The senior doubled down with another dominant game versus NC State; Harley had eight catches totaling 153 yards including two touchdowns to capture his second straight ACC Receiver of the Week honor.
- In Miami's game at Duke (Dec. 5), he posted another 100-yard outing (105) - including an 89-yard touchdown reception that now stands as the fourth-longest passing play in Miami football history.
- Harley leads the Hurricanes in receptions (49) and receiving yards (730) and has added six touchdowns.
- The Fort Lauderdale native has 117 catches totaling 1,546 yards and nine touchdowns for his career.
- In just 10 games, Harley shattered his entire 2019 junior season output (38 catches, 487 yards, 3 TDs).
- Harley became the third Hurricane with back-to-back 150-yard receiving games, joining **Phillip Dorsett** and **Andre Johnson**. He became just the sixth Hurricane to record multiple 150-yard receiving games ever.
- Harley's 170 yards vs. UVA were the most versus an ACC team since **Allen Hurns** had 173 vs. Pitt in 2013.
- Harley's 10 vs. UVA catches were tied for the second-most by a Miami player since Miami joined the ACC and came two short of tying the program record; it marked the most catches by a Hurricane since 2017.
- The 170 yards were the most by a Hurricane since **Phil Dorsett** had 201 versus Arkansas State in 2014.
- Harley's 10 catches tied TE **Christopher Herndon** (10 versus Syracuse in 2017) and were two shy of tying Dorsett (12 versus USF in 2012) for the most by a Hurricane player since Miami joined the ACC in 2004.

BOLDEN BREAKING OUT IN SECONDARY, THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- One of Miami's top defenders this season was S **Bubba Bolden**, who has started seven of 10 games and who leads the Hurricanes with 65 tackles this season. He was named to the 2020 All-ACC Second Team.
- On Dec. 7, Bolden was announced as one of just 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award honoring the nation's top defensive back back. Bolden was the lone Thorpe Award semifinalist from the conference.
- Bolden, who had just 11 tackles in an injury-shortened 2019 season, was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week and Jim Thorpe Award Player of the Week after a standout game against Louisville on Sept. 19.
- Bolden matched his entire 2019 year tackle total with a career-high 11 vs. UofL and added a forced fumble.
- In Miami's game at #1 Clemson (Oct. 10), Bolden totaled 10 tackles, two blocked field goals and a forced fumble. He won his second ACC Defensive Back of the Week Award for his performance against the Tigers.
- The standout safety had another double-digit tackle game with a career-high 13 against UNC on Dec. 12.
- Bolden, a high school teammate of Miami TE **Brevin Jordan** at national power Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas, spent his freshman year of 2017 at Southern Cal before transferring to UM prior to the 2019 season.

HEDLEY, BORREGALES MAKE UP TOP SPECIAL TEAMS DUO IN ALL OF FBS

- Miami has been bolstered this season by the best punter / kicker combination in the country: P **Lou Hedley**, in his second season with the Hurricanes, and K **Jose Borregales**, in his first year at Miami.
- The Hurricanes were one of just five teams with a player who was named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award (top punter) and a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award (top place kicker), as announced Dec. 7.
- Both Hedley and Borregales were named finalists for those respective special teams awards on Dec. 22.
- Thanks to the work of Hedley, Miami ranks No. 1 in FBS in net punting, averaging a whopping 44.98 net yards per punt. Hedley has won ACC Specialist of the Week twice this year and ranks No. 2 in FBS punting.
- Borregales, who is ranked among the ACC leaders with 89 points (18 field goals, 35 XPs), is 18-for-20 on field goal attempts this year and was named ACC Specialist of the Week after a standout performance against Louisville where he tied the Hurricanes record with a 58-yard field goal and went 4-for-4 on FGs.
- Hedley ranked No. 26 in FBS in punting in his first year at The U (2019), averaging 43.9 yards per punt.
- Borregales ranks No. 3 in FBS in career field goals made with 68; ranked No. 1 is Jake Verity of ECU (74).

D'ERIQ KING A TRUE DUAL THREAT QUARTERBACK FOR HURRICANES

- QB **D'Eriq King** set the record for single-season rushing yards by a Miami quarterback with 520.
- King has posted three of the top five rushing games by a quarterback since Miami joined the ACC:

- Miami's pass-catching contingent, thanks largely to a surge by WR **Mike Harley**, have enjoyed a streak of five consecutive games with at least one player posting a 100-yard receiving game dating back to Oct. 24.
- Harley, enjoying a career year, is responsible for three of those games; WR **Dee Wiggins** has one as does TE **Brevin Jordan**, who had a career-best outing in Miami's loss to North Carolina last time out on Dec. 12.
- The Hurricanes' current five-game streak of 100-yard receiving games is the fourth time since 1992 - when UM had Heisman Trophy winner **Gino Torretta** at quarterback - that Miami has managed the feat.

- Since Manny Diaz's arrival as defensive coordinator in 2016, Miami has had 24 individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss in a game; DL **Quincy Roche** and DL **Jaelan Phillips** both did it at Duke (Dec. 5).
- Phillips also posted a career-high 4.5 tackles for loss in Miami's win versus Virginia Tech (Nov. 14).
- The Canes have ranked in the top five in the country in tackles for loss in all five of Diaz's years at UM.

HURRICANES SIGN RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- The Hurricanes reeled in a consensus top-10 recruiting class during the early signing period, nabbing signatures from nine ESPN top 300 prospects and 10 players ranked in the 247Sports Composite Top 247.
- Miami signed 21 prospects during the early signing period, with 18 of them hailing from the state of Florida. 15 of those 21 players call either Miami-Dade, Broward or Palm Beach County home.
- The Hurricanes signed 10 players ranked in the Rivals' top 250 prospects for the Class of 2021.
- Four members were named to the Adidas All-American Bowl while another five players were named to the Under Armour All-America Game. Miami signed two five-star recruits for the first time since 2012.

TOUCHDOWN RINGS ARE BACK, HAVE COME OUT OFTEN THIS SEASON

- When RB **Cam'Ron Harris** took a 4th-and-1 carry 66 yards in the first quarter of Miami's win over UAB, a familiar jewelry made its season debut on the Miami sidelines: the Touchdown Rings, version 2.0.
- Also designed by famous Miami-based jeweler Anthony Machado, the Touchdown Rings are made of orange and green sapphires and contain 829 stones. The rings weigh 100 grams combined.
- The rings, which took roughly three months to complete, spell out the words "THE CRIB" when held together - an homage to a quote from Broward County-born DL **Nesta Jade Silvera**, who, on National Signing Day 2018, asked, "Why not make the crib great?" in announcing his decision to sign with the Hurricanes. Miami's coaching and recruiting staffs rallied behind Silvera's proclamation on NSD '18.

SOUTH FLORIDA SUN SENTINEL (Feb. 16, 2018) — *On National Signing Day, Nesta Silvera walked onto the stage at American Heritage in Plantation with a handful of his teammates, three of whom — like him — were among the most highly recruited high school football prospects in the nation.*

And on that stage, in the spotlight cast by ESPN, Silvera smiled and uttered a phrase that thrilled the Miami coaching staff and immediately endeared him to the Hurricanes fan base.

"Why not make the crib great?" Silvera responded when asked why he'd just signed with Miami while three of his Heritage teammates had chosen to attend Florida, Alabama and Georgia. "I could go to Tuscaloosa, I could go to Gainesville, I could go to Tallahassee and make those schools great. Why not make the crib great?"

In Coral Gables, Hurricanes coaches cheered his words — and shared that celebratory video on social media. Across South Florida, Miami fans latched on to a new rallying cry and Silvera, almost immediately, became the bright spot on a day when the Hurricanes weren't able to sway a few of their late recruiting targets.

HARRIS HAS HELPED CARRY MIAMI OFFENSE IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTER

- Making the fifth start of his career and his second as full-time starting running back, RB **Cam'Ron Harris** delivered a 134-yard performance in the Hurricanes' 47-34 on the road at Louisville on Sept. 19.
- Harris had a career-long 75-yard touchdown run in the win - Miami's longest rush since DeeJay Dallas had an 83-yard touchdown versus Duke in 2018. Harris has started eight of nine games at running back for UM.
- Harris had a 134-yard, two-touchdown performance in Miami's 31-14 win over UAB in UM's season opener.
- A consensus four-star prospect by every major scouting service, Harris - who went by Cam'Ron Davis in 2018 but changed his last name to match his father's last name prior to the 2019 season - was ranked as the No. 9 running back in his high school class and No. 167 overall prospect in the 2018 class by ESPN.
- Harris played behind Travis Homer (2018) & DeeJay Dallas (2019), who are both with the Seattle Seahawks.

TWO-HEADED TIGHT END MONSTER HAS DELIVERED FOR HURRICANES 'O'

- Miami boasts one of the nation's top tight end tandems in juniors **Brevin Jordan** and **Will Mallory**, who have been listed as co-starters on the offensive depth chart and who both started last time out at Duke (Dec. 5).
- Jordan, who missed three games in the middle of the year but returned in a win at Virginia Tech (Nov. 14), put on a show versus Louisville (Sept. 19), finishing with seven catches for 120 yards and a 47-yard touchdown.
- Mallory opened Miami's scoring with a 17-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter of the win at Louisville. He had the first multi-touchdown game of his career in a win over Pittsburgh (Oct. 17). Both have four TDs.
- Jordan, who was the only Hurricane selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team, was a Mackey Award finalist last year and was selected to the 2019 All-ACC First Team. The duo has combined for 590 yards and 8 TDs in 2020.

BORREGALES, ROCHE & WILLIAMS MADE TRANSFER PORTAL IMPACT IN 2020

- It wasn't just QB **D'Eriq King** who elected to spend 2020 at The U; DE **Quincy Roche** (Temple), K **Jose Borregales** (FIU) and OL **Jarrid Williams** (Houston) decided to enjoy their final years at The U.
- Roche delivered a dominant career at Temple, totaling 137 tackles, 39.5 tackles for loss and 26.0 sacks in three seasons. He was named American Athletic Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2019, ranking No. 5 in FBS with 13 sacks and No. 11 in FBS with 19.0 tackles for loss with the Owls.
- Roche, who will skip the bowl game to prepare for the NFL Draft, was a third-team All-ACC selection.
- Borregales, the all-time leading scorer at crosstown FIU, finished his Panthers career with 281 career points. A Lou Groza Award finalist as a top kicker in 2018, he was named a Groza finalist on Dec. 22.
- The ACC Specialist of the Week for his game vs. Louisville, Borregales had a career-long 57-yard field goal and went 4-for-4 on field goals. He is the nation's third active leader in career field goals made.
- Williams, who has started nine games at right tackle for UM, started all 13 games at the spot for the Cougars in 2018. He saw action in four games last year before suffering a season-ending injury.

15 NEW HURRICANES, 11 FRESHMEN MAKE DEBUTS IN 2020 SEASON OPENER

- Among the 15 Hurricanes to make their debuts against the Blazers on Sept. 10, 11 were either true freshmen or redshirt freshmen. True freshmen with the most snaps in Week 1 included RB **Jaylan Knighton** and RB **Donald Chaney, Jr.** The redshirt freshman with the most snaps against UAB was WR **Jeremiah Payton**.
- Seven players made the first starts of their UM careers vs. UAB: QB **D'Eriq King**, OL **Jarrid Williams**, OL **Ousman Traore**, DE **Jaelan Phillips** and DE **Quincy Roche**, DT **Nesta Jade Silvera** and LB **Bradley Jennings, Jr.** King (Houston), Phillips (UCLA) and Williams (Houston) had all started at previous schools before Miami.

FOUR MORE PROCANES SELECTED IN 2020 NFL DRAFT #NFLU

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: **Shaq Quarterman** (fourth round, Jacksonville), **DeeJay Dallas** (fourth round, Seattle), **K.J. Osborn** (fifth round, Minnesota) and **Jonathan Garvin** (seventh round, Green Bay). As of Sept. 7, 2020, all had secured spots on those teams' 53-man rosters entering the year.
- For 46 consecutive years, Miami has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft; the University of Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000 (119). No program in the ACC had more alumni on NFL 53-man rosters than the Hurricanes did entering Week 1 of the NFL season, when Miami boasted 31 former players and more who were on practice squads.
- Just this season, Frank Gore set the NFL record for most NFL games played by a running back, while #TightEndU veterans David Njoku, Greg Olsen and Jimmy Graham all scored TDs in Week 1 action.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility. The \$34 million project changed the complexion of Miami Football.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields – one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.

GAME 9: MIAMI ROUTS DUKE, POSTS FIRST ROAD SHUTOUT SINCE 2000

- Miami continued its last season surge with its most dominant win of the season on Dec. 5 - a 48-0 romp of Duke at Wallace Wade Stadium on Dec. 5. The Hurricanes posted their first road shutout since 2000 (versus Syracuse) and their first shutout of a Power-5 opponent - also vs. Syracuse - since 2001.
- Miami's 48-point margin of victory was its largest ever in an ACC game, besting the previous high of 45, which had been done twice ever - against Wake Forest in 2004 (52-7) and Duke in 2005 (52-7).
- QB **D'Eriq King** had another strong outing for the Hurricanes, finishing with 248 yards with three passing touchdowns and one rushing score. He linked up with WR **Michael Harley** on a 89-yard touchdown in the win - the fourth-longest pass play in Miami history and the longest since 2007.
- TE **Brevin Jordan** had four receptions for 75 yards and a touchdown, RB **Donald Chaney, Jr.**, added four receptions for 81 yards and WR **Dee Wiggins** had a touchdown. Harley had 105 yards in the win.
- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** rushed for 96 yards and two touchdowns while King added an 11-yard TD rush.
- Miami forced five turnovers and held the Blue Devils to a paltry 177 total yards of offense. Miami's elite tandem of DE **Jaelan Phillips** and DE **Quincy Roche** combined for four sacks and 6.5 tackles for loss.
- Roche, CB **Marcus Clarke**, LB **Corey Flagg**, TE **Dom Mammarelli** and S **Amari Carter** each wore the turnover chain. Clarke recorded his first interception while the others recorded fumble recoveries.

GAME 8: UM COMES BACK AGAIN TO TOP HOKIES, 25-24 IN BLACKSBURG

- The Hurricanes maintained their winning ways with a come-from-behind 25-24 victory at Virginia Tech on Nov. 14. Trailing for most of the game, Miami held on after going ahead with 5:59 remaining.
- QB **D'Eriq King** had another strong outing for the Hurricanes, finishing with 255 yards on 24-for-38 passing and one touchdown. He added a 10-yard rushing touchdown - his third rushing score of 2020.
- WR **Dee Wiggins** was King's favorite target in the win against the Hokies; Wiggins finished with a career-high eight catches for a career-best 106 yards. It was his first career 100-yard game at Miami.
- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** rushed for a score, while WR **Mark Pope** had the go-ahead touchdown catch.
- A week after being named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week, **Jaelan Phillips** put together another dominant game; Phillips had eight tackles and career-high totals of 4.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.
- STRK **Gilbert Frierson** (eight tackles, two sacks) and CB **Te'Cory Couch** (first interception of career) also shined for the Hurricanes defense, which totaled 11 tackles for loss and six sacks in the victory.
- Phillips (Defensive Lineman of the Week) and P **Lou Hedley** (Specialist) were honored by the ACC.

GAME 7: MIAMI FIGHTS BACK TO TOP NC STATE, 44-41, IN ROAD THRILLER

- Miami won an absolute thriller in a Friday night matchup with a come-from-behind 44-41 victory at NC State on Nov. 6. The Canes were trailing by 10 points in the fourth quarter but emerged with a road win.
- QB **D'Eriq King** had one of the best performances ever by a Miami quarterback in the win; King became just the third ACC quarterback in history to throw for more than 400 yards (430) and rush for 100 yards (105). He added five touchdown passes - one short of the Miami single-game standard (6).
- King's 430 passing yards were the seventh most by a Miami QB in a single game in program history.
- The two ACC QBs to record 400/100 games were Louisville's Lamar Jackson and Clemson's Tajh Boyd.
- King was named ACC Quarterback of the Week and Walter Camp National Off. Player of the Week.
- WR **Michael Harley** finished with eight catches and 153 yards, as well as two touchdowns in the win.
- DL **Jaelan Phillips** led Miami with a career-high 10 total tackles while CB **DJ Ivey** had an interception.
- Harley was named ACC Receiver of the Week while Phillips was ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.

GAME 6: HARLEY LEADS MIAMI TO 'W' VS. UVA, MIAMI IMPROVES TO 5-1

- The Hurricanes, who had an open date the weekend of Oct. 31, saw QB **D'Eriq King** throw for 322 yards in the victory over UVA. It was the eighth 300-yard passing game of his career and second at Miami.
- WR **Michael Harley** was named ACC Receiver of the Week after a standout performance against the Cavaliers; Harley hauled in a career-high 10 passes for a career-high 170 yards with one touchdown.
- Harley's 170 yards were the most versus an ACC opponent since **Allen Hurns** had 173 vs. Pitt in 2013.
- Miami's offense got off to a hot start, needing two offensive plays before scoring in 28 seconds - King hit TE **Will Mallory** for a 32-yard gain on the first play before a touchdown connection with Harley.
- DL **Jaelan Phillips** led Miami with seven total tackles while LB **Bradley Jennings, Jr.** added a sack..

GAME 5: MIAMI TOPS PITTSBURGH FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR, 31-19

- Miami got back to its winning ways with a 31-19 home victory over Pittsburgh on Oct. 17.
- QB **D'Eriq King** threw four touchdown passes in the victory, including two to TE **Will Mallory**. He threw for 222 yards and completed 16 of 31 passes on the day with two interceptions.
- UM's defense held Pittsburgh to just 22 total rushing yards and 300 yards of total offense in the win.
- DE **Quincy Roche** was among Miami's top defensive performers in the win, finishing with a season-best seven tackles including a game-high four tackles for loss. He also forced and recovered a fumble.
- P **Lou Hedley** had one of his most outstanding performances, averaging 51.7 yards on six punts
- Roche (Defensive Lineman of the Week) & Hedley (Specialist of the Week) were honored by the ACC.

GAME 4: HURRICANES FALL SHORT VS. #1 TIGERS IN DEATH VALLEY

- The Miami Hurricanes lost to top-ranked Clemson in a top-10 showdown in Death Valley, falling 42-17.
- The loss was Miami's first in Death Valley; the Hurricanes had entered the game a perfect 2-0 all time at the stadium. The matchup versus Clemson was UM's first since the 2017 ACC Championship Game.
- The Hurricanes became only the second team in FBS history to block three field goals in a game in the loss to Clemson; S **Bubba Bolden** blocked two kicks while DL **Jared Harrison-Hunte** blocked one field goal that was returned by CB **DJ Ivey** for a touchdown with no time remaining in the first half.

GAME 3: MIAMI DOMINATES FLORIDA STATE IN HISTORIC 52-10 W

- Miami continued its undefeated start to the 2020 season with a 52-10 thumping of rival Florida State on Sept. 26; the 52 points were the most ever scored by Miami against the Seminoles in the series history.
- Miami scored 38 points in the first half of the game - the most ever by either team in one half in the rivalry's history. The 35-point deficit was Florida State's second biggest ever halftime deficit in program history, while the 50-point performance was the first by either team in the rivalry's history
- QB **D'Eriq King** threw for 267 yards and two touchdown passes in the win, while Miami's rushing attack totaled 200 yards and four touchdowns - including a pair by freshman RB **Donald Chaney, Jr.**
- Miami's defense total 13 tackles for loss and six sacks and also forced three turnovers in the win; junior CB **Al Blades, Jr.**, S **Bubba Bolden** and DE **Jaelan Phillips** all recorded interceptions vs. FSU.

GAME 2: MIAMI WINS TOP-20 SHOOTOUT, 47-34, AT LOUISVILLE

- Miami earned its first road win over a top-20 opponent since 2009 when it toppled the host #18/#16 Louisville Cardinals, 47-34, at Cardinal Stadium on Sept. 19. The win improved Miami to 2-0 overall.
- QB **D'Eriq King** threw for 325 yards and three touchdown passes in the win, while TE **Brevin Jordan** recorded seven receptions for 120 yards with one touchdown. RB **Cam'Ron Harris** (134 yards, 75-yard rushing touchdown) and RB **Jaylan Knighton** (two total touchdowns) helped lead the offense.
- Miami's defense total 10 tackles for loss and forced three turnovers, with CB **Al Blades, Jr.**, becoming the first Hurricane to rock the new Turnover Chain (v 4.0) after a second-quarter interception.
- One of Miami's most impactful performers was K **Jose Borregales**, who tied the Miami record with a 57-yard field goal. Borregales went 4-for-4 on field goals and totaled 17 points against Louisville.

GAME 1: MIAMI RUNS ROUGHSHOD IN SEASON OPENER, TOPS UAB 31-14

- In his first game as a Hurricane, QB **D'Eriq King** finished 16-for-24 for 144 passing yards and one touchdown. He rushed for 83 yards and another score, extending his own FBS record to 16 games with at least one rushing TD and one passing TD - this time a four-yard strike to TE **Brevin Jordan**.
- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** rushed for 134 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns - he was one carry shy of tying a career high (18) and two yards shy of tying a career mark (136). He scored on a 66-yard rush in the game's first quarter, and keyed a running attack that totaled 337 yards - the second-most rush yards versus an FBS opponent since the Hurricanes joined the ACC in 2004 and most since 2014.
- The active FBS sacks leader, DE **Quincy Roche** recorded his 27th career sack and first as a Hurricane.

MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (SECOND OVERALL) | 14-9 (.608)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

The Hurricanes accepted a bid to the 2019 Walk-On's Independence Bowl in Diaz's first year at the helm in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes, who finished 4-4 in ACC play, saw three players selected to the All-ACC First Team in tight end Brevin Jordan, linebacker Shaquille Quarterman and defensive end Gregory Rousseau - who was also named ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year and a second-team All-American by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA).

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
