SETTING THE SCENE BETWEEN THE TIGERS AND HURRICANES

- The Clemson Tigers opened the season with five straight wins, including four against Power 5 opponents for the first time since 1934-35. Clemson, 7-1, won its first league game of the season 77-67 over No. 18/19 Florida State.
- The contest will be televised on Fox Sports South with Evan Lepler and Mike Gminski calling the action, while Don Munson and Tim Bourret will call the action on the radio waves. The radio call will be available on the Clemson Tigers Network and Tunein com.
- Live stats will be provided on ClemsonTigers.com and Twitter updates will be available on Clemson's official account (@ClemsonMBB).

CLEMSON BASKETBALL HEADLINES

- Clemson (KenPom: No. 18 overall, No. 3 adjusted defensive efficiency (86.1)) is ranked third nationally in scoring defense (55.1 points per game), which is also tops in the ACC.
- Clemson knocked off a nationally ranked FSU squad (Dec. 29) for the second consecutive matchup in the series. Interestingly enough, they trailed at halftime of both contests.
- Al-Amir Dawes turned in his highest scoring output of the season with 18 points at Virginia Tech (Dec. 15).
- "We Too Deep": Clemson will look to use as many as 12 players in most games as it attempts to utilize its depth as one of its main strengths this season. The Tigers' bench has produced 25+ points in seven-of-eight games. Clemson has also had as many as 14 different scorers this season with six averaging over 5.0 points per game.
- A key word in the program under Brownell is "Sacrifice," and that has certainly been emphasized this season.
- Clemson stopped Alabama on 10-of-its-last-11 possessions and won the Holiday Hoopsgiving tilt with its defense. The Tigers finished on a 10-1 run in the 64-56 victory (Dec. 12).
- Aamir Simms earned Tournament MVP honors after scoring a game-high 24 points (8-13 FG) in the championship game against Purdue (11/26). Nick Honor also received All-Tournament Team recognition.
- Simms was named to the All-ACC Preseason First-Team, becoming Clemson's first since 2016 and second since 2018 to earn preseason league honors.
- Simms was named to the Karl Malone Watch List (Top 20 PF in the country) and became the first Tiger to earn recognition from the Basketball Hall of Fame's preseason award watch lists.
- Clemson boasted a Top-20 recruiting class in the country for 2020 with the additions of PJ Hall, Olivier-Maxence Prosper and Lynn Kidd. It marked the program's highest recruiting ranking since 2009, according to 247Sports.



TIGERS TAKE DOWN SEMINOLES

- Clemson took down No. 18/19 Florida State with an ultra-impressive offensive second half outburst, scoring 48 points en route to a 77-67 victory.
- The Tigers outrebounded the Seminoles 49-35, including a season-high 19 offensive rebounds.
- Nick Honor showed out in the second half of the second-straight game, scoring 13 points.
- Clyde Trapp led the way with 15 points, while Dawes chipped in 11.
- It marked the second-straight victory for Clemson over Florida State, dating back to Feb. 29, 2020. Al-Amir Dawes scored a game-winning layup with 1.0 second remaining to topple the No. 6 Seminoles 70-69 in Littlejohn.

CLEMSON HAS OVERCOME HALFTIME DEFICIT SIX TIMES SINCE 2019-20

- Clemson overcame a 34-29 halftime deficit to defeat Florida State on Dec. 29. It was Clemson's first victory after trailing at the half this season.
- Last season, the Tigers overcame six games with a halftime deficit and won, which ties the program record.
- The record for halftime deficits overcome for victory is six, and was also previously set in 1989-90 and 2013-14.

GETTING OFFENSIVE (REBOUNDS)

- Clemson won the rebounding battle with Florida State (Dec. 29) by 14 (49-35).
- The 49 total rebounds were the most since 50 against Auburn on March 18, 2018 in the second round of the 2018 NCAA Tournament.
- Garnering 19 offensive rebounds was the most for a Tiger team since Dec. 13, 2016 against SC State. Clemson grabbed 23 offensive rebounds.
- It was the most offensive rebounds in an ACC game since March 7, 2015 at Notre Dame. The Tigers produced 19 on the offensive glass.

UNDEFEATED IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY

- With a 66-51 victory over Morehead State on Dec. 21, Clemson secured a 6-0 mark in non-conference play.
- It marked the first time the Tigers finished undefeated in non-league play since they posted a 16-0 start to begin the 2008-09 season.
- Clemson won the Space Coast Challenge to begin the season with wins over Mississippi State and Purdue.
- The Tigers then beat SC State, Maryland and Alabama to get off to a 5-0 record.

STARTING A SEASON 5-0

- With the 64-56 win over Alabama (Dec. 12), it marked the 24th time in Clemson history that the Tigers have started a season 5-0.
- However, it is the first time ever that four-of-those-first-five have come against Power 5 opponents.
- The Tigers posted three Power 5 victories in their first five wins in 1934-35 and 1996-97.

"WE TOO DEEP"

- This has been a common theme with the football program at Clemson in recent years, but the basketball Tigers are attempting their own version in 2020-21.
- Clemson has one of the deepest teams during the Brownell Era this season and will look to play as many as 12 players in most games.
- In a season opening tournament to start, the Tigers played as many as 12 in games against Mississippi State and Purdue.
- Clemson played 14 players in a 37-point win over SC State (Dec. 2).
- By far the most impressive was playing all 15 rostered players in a 16-point win over Maryland in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge (Dec. 9).
- Of the 15 that played, the Tigers had nine different scorers
- With utilizing that depth, the Tigers have had 14 different scorers this season.
- Seven different players are averaging at least 5.0 points per game this season.
- The Tigers produced 25+ bench points in seven-of-itsfirst-eight games to start the season and 209 overall in those seven games.
- Clemson has produced: 26 vs. Mississippi State, 28 vs. Purdue and 36 vs. SC State, 25 vs. Maryland, 31 vs. Alabama, 34 vs. Morehead State and 29 against Florida State.
- Five consecutive games this season was the longest stretch of games during the Brownell Era that the bench

has put together 25+ scoring outputs.

- Three consecutive games has happened just once during the Brownell Era and you need to go back to his first season at Clemson.
- The Tigers put together a similar string of games with 25+ points off the bench in December 2010.
- Dec. 19, 2010 vs. UNCG (27), Dec. 22, 2010 vs. College of Charleston (26) and Dec. 27, 2010 vs. Delaware State (26).
- The most bench points scored by a Brownell team at Clemson was 47 on January 1, 2013 against the Citadel.
- The most in a three-game stretch of games scored off the bench is 97 points: 34 vs. SC State (12/23/12); 47 vs. The Citadel (1/1/13); 16 vs. Florida State (1/5/13).

DEFENSE LIVES HERE

- The Tigers defense is ranked third in the country in defensive efficiency, according to KenPom.
- The Tigers' rating of 86.1 is the third lowest in the country and best in the ACC.
- The rating is an estimate of the defensive efficiency (points allowed per 100 possessions) a team would have against the average D-I offense.
- The Tigers boast the seventh-highest defensive turnover percentage (27.6), which represents the percentage of offensive possessions that end with a turnover.
- Clemson ranks 17th in effective field goal percentage defense (43.1 percent).
- Clemson's 55.1 points per game scoring defense is ranked first in the ACC and third in the country.
- To go along with that, their field goal percentage defense (37.7 percent) is first in the ACC and 22nd in the nation.
- The Tigers have forced 149 turnovers in their first eight contests of the season. An average 18.62 turnovers forced per game.
- The Tigers rank third in the ACC in turnovers forced per game (18.62) and 16th in the country.
- The last time Clemson has forced at least 147 turnovers in eight-straight games to start a year was 166 to begin the 2009-10 campaign.
- Clemson forced 27 against Presbyterian, 28 at Liberty, 23 against UNCG, 26 against Winthrop, 19 against Texas A&M, 15 against Long Beach State, 13 against Butler and 15 vs. Illinois.
- Clemson limited Alabama to just 3-of-22 from 3-point range. The Crimson Tide had averaged better than 10 makes a game from beyond the arc.
- Clemson held Maryland to just 15 points in the first half of its 16-point victory on Dec. 2. Only seven times in the Brownell Era have the Tigers limited an opponent to 15 points or less in a single half.
- The 15 points scored by Maryland in the first half was the fewest they have scored in any half of its last, dating back to Jan. 13, 2013 at Miami (Fla.). The Terps managed just 14 points in a 54-47 loss.
- That was a 261-game span for the Terrapins dating back to the 2012-13 season.

CLEMSON IN THE AP POLL

- After a 5-0 start to the 2020-21 campaign and four of those victories coming against Power 5 opponents propelled the Tigers into the AP Top 25 for the first time since Nov, 19 2018. The Tigers found themselves ranked No. 24 in the AP Poll.
- Clemson was ranked No. 16 after a 5-0 start to the season, but surprisingly dropped out following a five-point loss to Creighton in the Cayman Islands Classic.
- From January 2018 until Nov. 2018, the Tigers had spent 14-straight weeks ranked in the Top 25, the third-longest streak in program history.

TIGERS ROLL TIDE IN ATLANTA

- Clemson's insufferable defense prevailed in a 64-56 win over Alabama in the Holiday Hoopsgiving event in Atlanta (Dec. 12).
- The Tigers made stops on 10-of-the-last-11 possessions for Alabama in the game for the eight point victory.
- Clemson limited Alabama to just 13.6 percent shooting from 3-point range (3-for-22).
- It marked just the fifth time since 2014-15 that Alabama had been held to that percentage or less from 3-point range in a game.

- Since 2010-11, Alabama has shot 13.6 percent or worse on just 18 occasions, which spans 340 total games.
- Of those 18 games, the 30.4 field goal percentage Clemson held Alabama to was the second-worst of that batch of games.
- The only game that Alabama shot worse from the field was 28.6 percent in a 49-37 loss at Auburn on Feb. 6, 2013.
- When you dissect it even more, on only 11 of those occasions did Alabama attempt more than 15 threes, and only once did they attempt more than 20.

TIGERS SHELL SHOCK MARYLAND

- Clemson dominated Maryland in the annual ACC/Big Ten Challenge en route to a 67-51 victory (Dec. 9).
- The Tigers held the Terrapins to just 15 first half points, the seventh time the Tigers have held an opponent to 15 points or less in any half of the Brownell Era.
- The 16-point win was the second-largest victory margin in the series history over the last 32 years for the Tigers.
- Clemson beat Maryland by 29 on Feb. 17, 2009 by a final score of 93-64.
- Clemson posted 25+ bench points for the fourthstraight game and played all 15 players on its roster for the first time this season.

PERIMETER PROWESS

- Clemson held South Carolina State to just 1-for-14 from long distance in a 37-point blowout win on Dec. 2.
- The Tigers have held an opponent to one or fewer 3-pointers (min. 10 attempts) on just seven prior occasions during the Brownell Era.
- The Dec. 2 win over the Bulldogs was the first time this has occurred since Feb. 1, 2017 when Clemson held Georgia Tech to just 1-for-11 from long range.
- During the Brownell Era, when the Tigers hold an opponent to one or fewer triples (min. 10 attempts); they are 7-1 overall.
- The last time the Tigers held an opponent to one or fewer triples on 14+ attempts was Wofford (1-20) on Feb. 6, 1996; a 77-28 home win.
- The last time the Tigers accomplished this, Terrell McIntyre was a freshman guard.

- Clemson came away with 13 steals in its 81-70 championship victory over Purdue on Nov. 25.
- The Tigers tied last season's performance of 13 steals against Colgate (Nov. 10, 2019).
- The 13 steals tied for the most in a game for Clemson since swiping 15 in an 84-67 win over Lipscomb (Dec. 30, 2018)
- The year prior in 2017-18, the Tigers stole 15 passes in a 74-69 overtime win over Louisville (Jan. 6, 2018).
- Besides those two instances, it is tied for the thirdmost steals in a game for Clemson under head coach Brad Brownell since they notched 16 (the most under coach Brownell) against The Citadel on Jan. 1, 2013.
- Nick Honor came away with a career-best four steals against Purdue (Nov. 25).

CONSECUTIVE WINS TO END ONE SEASON AND START ANOTHER

- The Tigers won its quarterfinal matchup against Miami in the 2020 ACC Tournament 69-64 before the tournament was cancelled due to COVID-19.
- With a season-opening win over Mississippi State, the Tigers won its last game of one season and its first game of the next for the first time since 1945-46 and 1946-47.
- Clemson beat The Citadel on Feb. 23, 1946 by a score of 76-24. They then opened the 1946-47 season on Dec. 11 and beat Erskine 58-30.

OPENING SEASON WITH TWO POWER FIVE VICTORIES

third time in the history of the program that Clemson opened its season with consecutive wins over teams from Power Five Conference schools.

- In 1951-52, under head coach Banks McFadden, the Tigers defeated Georgia at home on Dec. 1 by a 57-47 score, then four days later defeated the Bulldogs in Athens, 77-54.
- Clemson went on to a 17-7 record that year, its finest under McFadden, and won a then-record 11 Southern Conference games.
- The only other year Clemson accomplished the feat was 1934-35 when the Tigers opened by winning consecutive games in consecutive days at Auburn. That Clemson team went on to a 15-3 record, the best winning percentage in Clemson history (min 15 games).

CLEMSON TOUGH TO BEAT WHEN ALLOWING 50 OR LESS POINTS

- In Brad Brownell's tenure as head coach at Clemson, the Tigers are a combined 47-2 when they allow 50 or less points to its opponent.
- The Tigers have won their last 26 contests in which they have allowed 50 or less points (26-0).
- For the second time in 2020-21, the Tigers held their

opponent to less than 50 points. Clemson held SC State to just 38 points in the Tigers' home opener.

- In the 2020-21 season opener, the Tigers held Mississippi State to just 42 points in an 11-point victory.
- The Tigers held Jacksonville to just 39 total points (only 11 in the second half) en route to a 68-39 victory last season.
- In just the Tigers' second game of the 2019-20 season, they held Presbyterian to just 45 points, marking the first time this season they have held an opponent under the 50-point threshold.
- Clemson went 4-0 during 2018-19 in such games.
- The Tigers topped Pittsburgh with a 62-48 victory on the road on Feb. 27
- Clemson rolled Georgia Tech on the road on Feb. 6, 65-42, and clinching the fewest points allowed in consecutive ACC games in Clemson history.
- The Tigers dominated Wake Forest on Feb. 3, 64-37, holding the Demon Deacons to the lowest point total allowed in an ACC game under Brownell.
- The 37 points ties Georgia Tech from a Feb. 21, 2012, 56-37, Tiger victory.
- The 40th win came on Nov. 20 in the Cayman Islands Classic semifinals with a 64-49 win over Georgia.
- The only losses on the record are losses to Virginia (49-47, Feb. 2, 2011) and Miami (45-43, Feb. 17, 2013).

- Baehre, who returned from an ACL injury suffered in May 2019, was out for the rest of the season after retearing his ACL in late December 2020.
- For much of last season, the Tigers had as few as *eight* scholarship players active in games.
- Players missed a total of **75** games last season.

CLEMSON WINS OVER TOP-6 TEAMS LAST SEASON

- Clemson defeated Florida State, 70-69 for its third topsix win (time of the game) over teams in the AP poll on Feb. 29, and now leads the nation in top six wins. •The Tigers have defeated a third-ranked Duke, fifth-ranked Louisville and sixth-ranked Florida State this season.
- It is the first time since 1979-80 that Clemson has beaten three top-6 teams (top six by one of the two polls) in the same year.
- It is the first time in program history that Clemson has recorded three Top-6 AP ranked wins in the same season.
- Thirty-two different teams have recorded 36 top-6 wins this year. Louisville and Kentucky are the only other teams with two wins over top-6 teams. There have been 11 top-6 wins by ACC teams this year and Clemson has three of them.

BROWNELL'S 20-WIN SEASONS

- Head coach Brad Brownell clinched his fourth 20-win campaign at Clemson with a 75-69 victory over Wright State in the first round of the NIT on March 19, 2019.
- It marks Brownell's second consecutive 20-win season at Clemson.
- Brownell won 25 games in 2017-18 en route to leading the Tigers to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament.
- Brownell was a Naismath National Coach of the Year semifinalist in 2017-18 and won Sports Illustrated College Coach of the Year.
- The 25 wins tied the Clemson record for wins in a season and the 11 ACC victories was the most by a Clemson coach in history.
- Brownell also accomplished 20 wins in 2013-14 and in

his first season as a Tiger in 2010-11.

- The Tigers reached the semifinals of the NIT in 2014, while making an appearance in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- Brownell came to Clemson with six 20-win campaigns under his belt, including one at UNC Wilmington and one for each year he spent at Wright State.
- Of those six seasons, Brownell's teams made it to the NCAA Tournament on three occasions.

CLEMSON SEASON BREAKDOWN BY UNIFORM

- In 2017-18 the Tigers debuted three new jerseys to their arsenal, including a new version of its home white and road orange uniform. They also debuted purple, anthracite and throwback jerseys.
- Clemson wore its 2017-18 home whites the most last season, wearing them for 19-out-of-their-32 regular season games.
- With the exception of one home game in which Clemson wore 1990's throwback home white uniform against Pittsburgh, the Tigers wore its 17-18 home whites on the road in a 14-point win at Ohio State. The Buckeyes wore all red that night.
- They also wore white during their two-point triumphant comeback win over then No. 22-ranked Florida on Dec. 16 in the Orange Bowl Classic.
- 18 of the Tigers' 25 wins in 2017-18 came while wearing their home whites.
- Clemson tallied 13 victories in their home whites last season.

2020-21 SIGNING CLASS RANKED 20TH NATIONALLY

- Head Coach Brad Brownell and his staff added three players to the Clemson University men's basketball program for the 2020-21 campaign. P.J. Hall (Spartanburg, S.C./Dorman), Olivier-Maxence Prosper (Montreal, Quebec, Canada/NBA Academy Latin America) and Lynn Kidd (Gainesville, Fla./IMG Academy) all signed national letters of intent to play for the Tigers beginning in 2020-21.
- The recruiting class ranks 20th nationally according to 247Sports. Also, according to 247Sports, Hall and Prosper rank as the No. 3 and No 4 all-time prospects based on ranking in Clemson history.
- "I'm extremely excited about the addition of P.J. and O-Max to the Clemson Basketball family," said Brownell. "They are both highly regarded players who come from outstanding families and will add tremendous size, length and versatility to our team. These two hard-working young men have the ability and the opportunity to make a significant impact on our program. Our fans will certainly be excited to watch them play next season."

P.J. HALL (SPARTANBURG, S.C./DORMAN)

- Hall is a 6-10, 235-pound forward from Spartanburg, S.C. and is rated as a four-star prospect according to both ESPN and 247Sports. ESPN ranks Hall No. 42 in its Top 100 for the 2020 signing class. He is rated the No. 1 prospect in South Carolina and 10th at his position nationally. 247Sports lists Hall as their No. 61 overall prospect and the No. 9 player at his position in the country. Rivals ranks him at No. 62 in their Rivals150.
- "P.J. is a strong, physical post player with a shooting touch that allows him to play both inside and outside. He comes from an outstanding Dorman High School program coached by Thomas Ryan, where he has won back-to-back 5A State Championships. His passion for basketball and willingness to work gives us great excitement about his

future at Clemson."

- "Family's the most important thing, and that's the reason I fell in love with Clemson University," Hall said. "I went up there and my last visit in the fall was amazing. We were on a visit, but it didn't feel like a visit. It felt like I was a part of the basketball team and a student at the university."
- "That was the reason I couldn't say no. Coach Brownell recruited me two years very hard and I can't wait to play for him for the next four."
- As a member of Upward Stars (SC), Hall averaged 14.8 points and 4.8 rebounds per game on the adidas Gauntlet in 2019. Hall's best game came against the Atlanta Celtics, scoring 27 points and grabbing 14 rebounds.
- Over the course of 14 games, Hall finished 59.1 (81-for-137) percent from the floor and an ultra-impressive 55.8 percent (24-for-43) from three.
- P.J. chose Clemson over Virginia Tech, Florida, Tennessee, Georgia Tech and South Carolina among others.

DAWES PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Sophomore Al-Amir Dawes is off to a quick start for the Tigers this season, scoring in double-figures in six of the team's first seven contests.
- Dawes has hit multiple field goals in each game this season and is shooting 42.9 percent from the field.
- Dawes has scored in double figures in five consecutive games, including a season-high 18 points at Virginia Tech (Dec. 15).
- After starting the season 4-for-19 from 3-point range, Dawes has gone 12-for-26 over the last two contests (.462).

DAWES' HOT STREAK IN 19-20

- Dawes had 18 points, including the game-winner with one second left in Clemson's 70-69 win over Florida State.
- Clemson has won five-of-the-last-six games and Dawes led the Tigers in scoring in four of those contests.
- Over those five games, Dawes has averaged 15.0 points, shot 26-53 from the field (.491), 14-of-33 on his three-point attempts (.424) and made 75.0 percent from the line (9-12). He has added 16 assists and seven steals.
- Dawes scored 18 points at Pittsburgh (including 17 in the second half), a game he made 4-of-7 three-point shots and had a career high 22 at Boston College, where he made 6-10 three-point shots.

LEADING IN VICTORY


