ACC SERIES STORYLINES & NEWS

- The Canes welcome **Wake Forest** to The Light for a three-game conference series. Miami has a 36-11 all-time series lead.
- The Hurricanes will face the Demon Deacons for the first time since taking two-of-three at Wake Forest in 2019.
- RHP **Alejandro Rosario** (1-0, 2.81 ERA) will make his first Friday night start, opposing RHP **William Fleming** (1-0, 3.00 ERA).
- True freshman **Yohandy Morales** leads the Canes in hitting (.357), home runs (3) and is tied for the team lead with 11 RBI.
- Infielder **Anthony Vilar** is 12-for-30 (.360 AVG) with a homer and seven RBI during active seven-game hitting streak.
- Outfielder **Christian Del Castillo** was named ACC Co-Player of the Week following a stellar series at then-No. 1 Florida.
- A consensus preseason All-American, **Adrian Del Castillo** is one of four Hurricanes that were named Preseason All-America in 2021. The catcher was joined by 1B **Alex Toral**, RHP/UT **Ben Wanger** and LHP/UT **JP Gates** garnering recognition.
- Miami returns eight of nine hitters who made at least 11 starts over Hurricanes' 16 games in shortened 2020 season.
- The Canes, who finished 12-4 a season ago, added the No. 1 recruiting class in the country according to Baseball America, DI Baseball and Collegiate Baseball. Miami has 15 returners and 20 newcomers making up its 2021 Opening Day roster.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (36). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2019 marked DiMare's 20th year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

Miami proved to be one of the top teams in the country during a shortened 2020 season. The Canes went 12-4 and finished the season ranked as high as No. 5 by Baseball America and in the top 15 of all six major polls. A preseason pick to win the ACC Coastal, Miami went 3-0 in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, three Hurricanes were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken with the 33rd overall pick by the Arizona Diamondbacks, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft. McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round to the Colorado Rockies and junior shortstop Freddy Zamora was taken in the second round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

With three players drafted, Miami tied with Mississippi State and Texas A&M with the most selections among the top 60 picks in the 2020 MLB Draft. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America, D1 Baseball, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.

DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by Baseball America, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.



Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by Collegiate Baseball and fifth by Baseball America prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMich's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife Denise and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

CANES WELCOME WAKE FOREST TO THE LIGHT

- Miami will play its third ACC series of the 2021 season, welcoming Wake Forest to Mark Light Field for a three-game set.
- The Hurricanes hold an all-time series lead of 36-11, and a 16-4 advantage in games played in Coral Gables, but have won just six of the last 10 against the Demon Deacons.
- Miami, who took two-of-three at NC State last week, enters the weekend off a 11-2 victory over No. 25 FAU.
- Wake Forest is 3-4 on the season and is coming off a 1-2 series against Notre Dame on Feb. 27-28. The Demon Deacons have not played since then due to COVID-19.
- Miami RHP **Alejandro Rosario** (1-0, 2.81 ERA) will make his first career Friday night start, opposing Wake Forest RHP **William Fleming** (1-0, 3.00 ERA).

WEEKEND REWIND: BATS COME ALIVE AT NC STATE

- Miami took two-of-three in its first ACC road series of 2021, winning the final two games at NC State to clinch the series.
- After hitting just two homers over the first six games, the Hurricanes clubbed six homers over the weekend -- including four in Sunday's 6-4 win.
- The Canes hit back-to-back-to-back homers in the top of the sixth inning on March 7, as Anthony Vilar, Yohandy Morales and Adrian Del Castillo became the first Canes to hit three consecutive homers since Randy Batista, Michael Burns and Romy Gonzalez all went deep in the ninth inning at Boston College on April, 29, 2017.
- Newcomer **CJ Kayfus** recorded his first hit as Cane, a solo homer in the top of the ninth to help Miami take Saturday's game, 6-4.

HURRICANES BACK IN THE TOP 5

- Miami moved up in five polls and cracked the top 5 of *Baseball America's* top 25 after taking two-of-three at NC State over the weekend.
- The Hurricanes (5-4, 3-3 ACC) are also ranked in the top 10 by the Perfect Game (No. 6), D1 Baseball (No. 8) and the NCBWA (No. 8).
- The Canes moved up a spot to No. 13 in the USA TODAY coaches poll and surprisingly were dropped seven spots to No. 16 by Collegiate Baseball.
- The Canes opened the season ranked No. 6 by Collegiate Baseball, No. 7 by Perfect Game, No. 10 by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers' Association, No. 11 by Baseball America, No. 15 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 21 by D1 Baseball.
- Miami entered the 2021 season with multiple top-10 preseason rankings for the fourth time in the last 10 seasons: 2015 (2), 2016 (4), 2020 (6), 2021 (3).

DEL CASTILLO BROTHERS REUNITE AT THE U

- Brothers **Adrian Del Castillo** and **Christian Del Castillo** reunited at Miami, becoming teammates for the first time since little league.
- Adrian, who is the younger brother, is in his third year as a catcher at The U and enters the 2021 season as a consensus first team All-American and one of the top hitters in the country.
- Christian, who is two years older than Adrian, comes to Coral Gables after four years as an outfielder at Seton Hall, where he was named Male Breakthrough Athlete of the Year in 2019.
- The Del Castillos are the first set of brothers to be teammates at Miami since **Carlos** and **David Gutierrez** (06-08).

DEL CASTILLO BEHIND THE DISH

• Third-year catcher **Adrian Del Castillo** enters the 2021 season as a consensus preseason All-American, National Player of the Year candidate and is on the Buster Posey Award Watch List.

• Del Castillo led the Canes with a .358 batting average and added five extra-base hits and 15 RBI in the shortened 2020 season.

• A second team All-ACC pick as a freshman in 2019, Del Castillo led the Canes in hits (78), doubles (22) and runs batted in (72).

• Del Castillo finished 2019 batting .331 and also scored 58 runs and clubbed 12 homers, while striking out just 24 times.

• The Miami native's 72 RBI were the second-most by a UM freshman in program history, finishing just four shy of Ryan Braun's record 76, set in 2003. The 72 runs batted in were also the most by a Miami freshman since Yonder Alonso drove in 69 runs as a freshman in 2006.

• Del Castillo finished tied for 13th in the nation and second in the ACC in RBI (72) and also ranked second in the ACC in doubles (22).

• A Freshman All-American, Del Castillo earned a host of awards after his collegiate debut season, including Second Team All-ACC, ACC All-Freshman Team, ABCA All-Region and All-Starkville Regional Team honors.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW, YOYO!

• Infielder **Yohandy Morales** continued his torrid start to his UM career, going 4-for-12 with a double, two homers and three RBI at NC State (Mar. 5-7).

• On March 6, Morales led off the top of the eighth with a ground-rule double to right and later evaded a tag at the plate to score the go-ahead run in Miami's 6-4 victory.

• A day later, Morales crushed a solo shot to center that tied the game at 3 as part of a five-run Miami sixth. Then Morales led off the top of the seventh with another solo bomb to center, closing out his second career three-hit game and recording his first multi-homer performance.

• Morales, who has started every game this season, hit his first career homer on Feb. 28 against Virginia Tech and went 5-for-14 (.312) with a double, a triple, an RBI and four runs scored in the season-opening series at then-consensus No. 1 Florida.

• The Miami native leads the Hurricanes in hitting (.359), home runs (3) multi-hit games (5) and is tied for the team lead with nine RBI.

FOUR CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

• The Hurricanes had four different players selected to a Preseason All-America team in advance of the 2021 season: C **Adrian Del Castillo**, 1B **Alex Toral**, RHP/UT **Ben Wanger** and LHP/UT **JP Gates**.

• A consensus preseason All-American, Del Castillo leads all Hurricanes with five preseason All-America honors. The complete list of UM 2020 Preseason All-Americans is on page 5.

CANES PICKED TO WIN THE COASTAL

• For the second straight year, Miami was picked as the preseason favorite to win the ACC Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 14 head coaches.

• Miami, which was picked by 7 of 14 coaches as the likely division winner, is looking for its first Coastal title since 2016. The Hurricanes have won the division four times since joining the ACC in 2005. Miami won its first division crown in 2008 and won three consecutive Coastal titles from 2014-16.

LALA IN THE LEADOFF SPOT

- Third-year outfielder **Jordan Lala** has been a spark at the top of Miami's order since arriving at The U in 2019.
- Lala has reached base safely in 17 of his last 18 games dating back to the 2020 season. At NC State over the weekend, Lala went 3-for-10 with a double, a homer, five runs scored five RBI, two walks and two hit-by-pitches.
- A year ago, Lala posted a .419 OBP and led UM with 15 walks and four stolen bases while ranking second with 12 runs scored.
- In 2019, Lala had a team-high 68 runs while leading the team with 61 walks, a .446 OBP and 28 stolen bases.
- Lala's 28 stolen bases in 2019 are the most by a Hurricane since Zeke DeVoss stole 32 bags in 2011.
- The Tampa, Fla. native finished the 2019 season ranked second in the ACC in SB (28), fourth in the ACC in runs (68) and tied for sixth in the NCAA in walks (61)

VILAR ON A TEAR IN THE TWO HOLE

- Third-year infielder **Anthony Vilar** has been one of Miami's hottest hitters over the last two weeks.
- After opening the season 1-for-16 with 1 RBI, 2 BB and 4 K, Vilar is on a six-game hitting streak where he is 12-for-30 (.360 AVG) with a home run, seven RBI, two walks and five strikeouts.
- Vilar, who is third on the team with three multi-hit games, had a three-hit day in Miami's comeback win on March 6 at NC State.
- The left-handed hitter's two-run homer in the top of the sixth on March 7 at NC State sparked a five-run rally and led off Miami's first back-to-back-to-back homers since 2017..

ROOKIES EARN SPOTS IN STARTING ROTATION

- True freshmen right-handers **Alejandro Rosario** and **Victor Mederos** follow veteran **Daniel Federman** on the mound Miami's starting rotation and they impressed in their debuts against the then-consensus No. 1 Florida Gators.
- Rosario had some tough luck in his debut, as only two of the five runs he allowed were earned. Rosario, who flashed velocity in the upper 90s, allowed six hits and struck out four in his first outing as a Hurricane.
- Mederos showed why he is one of the top true freshmen pitchers in the country. The right-hander settled in after giving up a leadoff double to Florida's Jacob Young, striking out the side in first collegiate inning.
- The true freshman held Florida to two runs (one earned) on seven hits while striking out five Gators over 4.2 innings pitched.
- Rosario was a 2019 Under Armour and Perfect Game All-American and a member of the 2019 18U USA National Team and the 2017 15U USA National Team. He is ranked the No. 5 Freshman in ACC by D1 Baseball and the No. 60 overall prospect by Baseball America.
- Mederos was named the No. 6 Freshman in ACC by D1 Baseball and was a three-time HS All-American, earning 2019 Under Armour All-America Game MVP honors.
- Left-handed pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** was the last freshman to start a game on the mound during opening weekend, allowing just one run on three hits over six innings to help Miami beat Rutgers, 2-1, in 11 innings on Feb. 18, 2011.

- After a stellar debut as a Miami Hurricane, **Christian Del Castillo** was named ACC Co-Player of the Week on Feb. 22.
- "Delly," who had a .917 OPS over the weekend, went 4-for-12 with a double and six RBI in his first series as a Cane.
- He was 2-for-3 with three RBI on opening night, drove in a run in Miami's improbable comeback win over the top-ranked Gators on Saturday and had two hits and two RBI in Sunday's series finale.
- Del Castillo, who is the older brother of Miami star Adrian Del Castillo, came to The U as a graduate transfer after a standout career at Seton Hall. He earned the starting position in right field and led the Hurricanes in hitting on opening weekend.

TRIO OF CAPTAINS LEADING THE WAY

- The University of Miami players and coaches combined to select C **Adrian Del Castillo**, RHP **Daniel Federman** and 1B **Alex Toral** as 2021 team captains.
- Del Castillo is a returning captain from the 2020 season, while Federman and Toral are both first-time captains in their career.

- Miami has 20 newcomers on the 2021 roster, with 13 freshmen, six JUCO transfers and two graduate transfers joining the 15 returning letterwinners from a year ago.

ACC SERIES NEWS & NOTES

TORAL A TERROR AT THE PLATE

- **Alex Toral** entered the 2021 season as one of the most feared power hitters in Division I.
- Toral was 2-for-7 with six walks and two runs scored in the season-opening series at then consensus No. 1 Florida.
- Toral brings his big bat back to the heart of Miami's lineup after leading the team with five home runs and 16 RBI in 16 games in a shortened 2020 season.
- The fourth-year junior posted a .296 batting average in 2020, while leading the team with a .593 slugging percentage and was second on the Canes with .435 on-base percentage.
- Toral flexed his muscle at the plate in 2019, hitting an ACC leading 24 home runs that ranked third in Division I and helped propel Miami to a conference-high 85 homers on the year.
- The herculean first baseman's 24 homers moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.
- In addition to his prolific power numbers, Toral hit .293 with six doubles, 47 runs scored and 67 RBI. The Davie, Fla., native's 19 multi-RBI games led the Canes and he also posted 15 multi-hit performances in 2019.
- Toral was one of the most dangerous hitters in the ACC in 2019 finishing tied for fifth in the ACC in RBI (67) and sixth in the ACC in slugging percentage (.656)

FEDERMAN BRINGS EXPERIENCE TO ROTATION

- Fourth-year right-hander **Daniel Federman** leads a new-look Miami starting rotation after the departure of standouts **Brian Van Belle**, **Chris McMahon** and **Slade Cecconi**.
- Federman posted a 2.08 ERA with 11 strikeouts and three saves over 8.2 innings as Miami's closer in shortened 2020 season.
- In 2019, Federman led all Miami pitchers with 35 appearances and tallied seven saves with a 3.51 ERA and 60 strikeouts over 48.2 innings pitched.
- As a true freshman in 2018, earned Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball after compiling a 2.25 ERA in 60.0 innings with 54 strikeouts over 23 appearances including starts.
- In his debut season, held opponents to .203 batting average and his 2.25 ERA was lowest among all pitchers on staff while his 54 strikeouts and 60.0 innings were fourth-most.
- Over four starts in 2018, went 1-2 with a 2.74 ERA and 21 strikeouts over 23 innings pitched. Allowed just one unearned run and struck out a career-high seven batters over a career-long eight innings at FGCU on 3/28/18.

PALMQUIST ON STOPPER WATCH LIST

- Left-hander **Carson Palmquist** is among the 45 players named to the initial Watch List for the 16th Annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I Baseball.
- Palmquist got off to a strong start this season, striking out four batters while allowing just one hit over four shutout innings against then-consensus No. 1 Florida
- Former Miami closer **Bryan Garcia** is the only Hurricanes to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award, earning the honor in 2016.

- Catcher **Adrian Del Castillo** and first baseman **Alex Toral** were among the 55 players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.
- Del Castillo is on the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list for the second straight year.
- Miami is one of 11 schools with multiple student-athletes represented.

UM DUO ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Adrian Del Castillo** and **Alex Toral** were among the 48 players named to the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List for the 2021 college baseball season.
- The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. The 48 players on the watch list represent 17 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.
- Texas Tech's Hunter Hargrove won the initial BBCSA in 2017. Dallas Baptist's Devlin Granberg took home the honor in 2018, with Texas Tech's Josh Jung winning the award in 2019.

VETERAN BATS BACK AT THE U

- Miami returns eight of nine hitters who played in at least 11 of the Hurricanes' 16 games during the shortened 2020 season.
- Three of the returners have earned Preseason All-America recognition: C **Adrian Del Castillo**, 1B **Alex Toral** and LHP/UT **JP Gates**.
- Infielders **Anthony Vilar** and **Raymond Gil** and outfielders **Jordan Lala**, **Tony Jenkins** and **Gabe Rivera** round out the group of experienced returners.

ACC SERIES NEWS & NOTES

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

- Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series** in 2016, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.
- Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.
- Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

BASEBALL AMERICA TOP NEWCOMERS

- Baseball America ranked the top 25 new additions in college baseball for 2020-21 and three Hurricanes made the list.
- Freshmen right-handers **Alejandro Rosario** and **Victor Mederos** combined at No. 6, as the freshmen headlined Miami's top-ranked recruiting class and emerged as weekend starters to open the 2021 season.
- Third-year right-hander **Jake Smith** is ranked No. 9, as the JUCO transfer features a potent fastball and tons of potential.

DEL CASTILLO'S TOOLS AMONG BEST IN DRAFT

MIAMI IS #MLBU

- No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **298** players picked into the professional ranks - including three in 2020. Since 1991, UM has produced **193 draft picks** - 23 more than the next-highest ACC total (170, Clemson).
- RHP **Slade Cecconi** became the 29th Hurricane selected in the first round of an MLB Draft when he was picked 33rd overall by the Arizona Diamondbacks.
- RHP **Chris McMahon** (No. 46, Rockies) and SS **Freddy Zamora** (No. 53, Brewers) were both second round selections, while RHPs **Brian Van Belle** (Red Sox) and **Tyler Keysor** (Reds) signed as free agents following the shortened five-round MLB Draft.
- With three players selected, Miami tied with Mississippi State and Texas A&M for the most players drafted over the first 60 picks of the 2020 MLB Draft.
- With 15 players taken in 1996, Miami has the most players selected in a single draft by any ACC school.
