THE OPENING TIP

• Pitt (10-11, 6-10 ACC) opens up ACC Tournament play Tuesday, March 9 at the Greensboro Coliseum against 13-seed Miami (8-16, 4-15 ACC). Tipoff is set for 2 p.m. on the ACC Network.

• The Panthers are 6-7 all-time in ACC Tournament play, including a 3-1 mark in first round action. Pitt is 2-2 in the conference tournament under head coach **Jeff Capel** with a 2-0 mark in opening round contests.

• Pitt ranks second in the ACC (22nd nationally) in offensive rebounds (12.7 orgp.) and rebound margin (+5.38). The Panthers have grabbed 15 or more offensive rebounds on eight occasions and own a +75 scoring margin in second chance points.

• **Justin Champagnie** leads the ACC with 13 double-doubles, including eight games with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds. He is the only major conference player in the NCAA averaging a double-double for the season.

• **Femi Odukale** has played 25 or more minutes in each of the past three games and five times on the season. He is averaging 11.6 points, 4.2 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.8 steals per game when playing at least 25 minutes in a game.

• **Nike Sibande** has been in the starting lineup seven times, including each of the past five games. He is averaging 8.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists per game with nine three-point field goals in his seven starts this season.

- **Justin Champagnie** scored 31 points, tied for sixth most by a freshman in ACC history, in an 81-72 win over Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2020 ACC Tournament.
- The 2020 New York Life ACC Tournament was cancelled following second round play due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

BY THE NUMBERS

- **Justin Champagnie** averaged 20.0 points per game on 17-of-30 (.567) shooting from the field in a pair of ACC Tournament contests last season. He scored a Pitt ACC Tournament-record 31 points on 13-of-17 shooting from the field in an opening round win over Wake Forest.
- **Ithiel Horton** went 4-of-6 from three-point range and finished with a team-high 18 points in a 70-55 win over Miami earlier this season. He ranks 14th in the ACC in three-point field goals (1.95 3pg.).
- **Justin Champagnie** has scored in double figures in all 19 games played this season. Clyde Vaughan (1983), Larry Harris (1976-78), Billy Knight (1974) and Don Hennon (1958) are the only players in program history to score 10 or more points in every game played in a season.
- **Justin Champagnie** has recorded a double-double in 10 of the past 13 games. He is averaging 18.6 points, 10.5 rebounds, 1.2 blocks and 1.4 steals per game, while shooting 49.7 percent (86-of-173) from the field, including 16-of-42 (.381) from three-point range, and 76.1 percent (54-of-71) from the foul line in that span.
- **Nike Sibande** has scored in double figures in two of the past four games and is averaging 12.8 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game over the past four contests.. He has scored in double figures 78 times in his career and now has 1,536 points, 526 rebounds and 198 three-point field goals in 110 career games.
- **Justin Champagnie** is attempting to become the first Panther to average a double-double for the season since DeJuan Blair (2008-09). Pitt has not had a player average better than 18 points and 10 rebounds per game since Billy Knight (1973-74). At 18.4 points and 11.1 rebounds per game, he is the only major conference player averaging a double-double on the season.
- **Femi Odukale** is averaging 12.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.5 steals per game over the past four contests.

- **Justin Champagnie** joins Sam Clancy (1978), Brian Shorter (1989) and DeJuan Blair (2009) as the only Panthers to earn first team all-conference honors as a sophomore.

LAST TIME OUT

- Pitt dropped its regular season finale, 77-62, at Clemson Saturday afternoon at Littlejohn Coliseum.
- The Panthers closed the opening half on a 15-6 run to trail 38-36 at intermission. Pitt shot 55.6 percent (10-of-18) from the field, including 6-of-10 from three-point range, in the opening half.
- Clemson made 12 three-point field goals and shot 55.8 percent (29-of-52) from the field in the contest.
- The Tigers got 45 points off the bench as Al-Amir Dawes made five three-point field goals and finished with a game-high 21 points.
- **Justin Champagnie** scored in double figures for the 19th consecutive game, finishing with 13 points. He was held to a season-low four rebounds and did not shoot a free throw for the first time this season and just the sixth time in 52 career games.
- **Ithiel Horton** went 3-of-5 from three-point range and finished with 11 points for his ninth double-figure scoring game.
- **Femi Odukale** added nine points, three rebounds, three assists and a season-high four steals, while **Nike Sibande** posted seven points on 3-of-4 shooting from the field.

• Pitt has outrebounded its opponent 14 times and ranks second in the ACC in rebounds per game (38.4 rpg.). The Panthers are also second in the ACC (22nd in the NCAA) in offensive rebounds (12.7 orpg.).

• Pitt has been outrebounded in each of the past three seasons and has not averaged 38.5 or more rebounds in a season since the 2010-11 campaign.

CHAMPAGNIE POPPIN' OFF

• Justin Champagnie has established himself as one of the top players in the NCAA in his second season at Pitt. He leads the ACC in rebounds (11.1 rpg.) and double-doubles (13) and ranks second in scoring (18.4 ppg.).

• Champagnie is the 20th ACC player (23 times) to average a double-double in the past 25 seasons. 16 of the 23 times that has been accomplished the player has earned First Team All-ACC accolades.

• Champagnie enters the ACC Tournament 0.3 points per game behind conference scoring leader Matthew Hurt (Duke). He is attempting to become the 12th player (14th time) to lead the ACC in scoring and rebounds.

• Champagnie is one of five players in the country and the only major conference player averaging 18+ points and 10+ rebounds per game. He is the only major conference player averaging a double-double.

• Champagnie also ranks in the top 10 among active ACC players in offensive rebounds (3.26 orpg. - 2nd), defensive rebounds (7.84 drpg. - 1st), double-doubles (13 - 1st), field goal percentage (.494 - 9th), free throw percentage (.726 - 10th), blocks (1.16 bpg. - 10th) and minutes played (34.56 - 9th).

• Champagnie has scored in double figures in all 19 games played this season and in 42 of 52 career contests.

• Champagnie set a school record for most rebounds in a two-game span with 41 boards in wins over Gardner-Webb (21) and Northwestern (20).

• Champagnie posted three consecutive 20+ point, 10+ rebound games (Dec. 5-12) matching the most by a Pitt player since the 1986-87 season. He has six 20/10 games, tied for sixth most in a season at Pitt.

• Champagnie tallied 20 points and 13 rebounds for his eighth 20/10 game and 13th double-double of the season against Wake Forest.

• Champagnie scored 21 points and grabbed 10 rebounds against No. 16 Florida State.

• Champagnie recorded a double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds against NC State. He set career highs in free throws made (11) and free throw attempts (16) in the contest.

• Champagnie collected his fourth consecutive double-double with 18 points and 10 rebounds at No. 14 Virginia.

• Champagnie registered a double-double with 10 points and 13 rebounds in a win over No. 16 Virginia Tech.

• Champagnie delivered 23 points and 10 rebounds against North Carolina. He went 7-of-9 from the field, including 4-of-5 from three-point range, in the contest.

• Champagnie recorded 31 points, 14 rebounds and five blocked shots in a home win over Duke to become the first player in program history to record 30+ points, 10+ rebounds and 5+ blocks in a game. Pitt began tracking blocks during the 1974-75 season. He was 12-of-15 from the field with four three-point field goals in the contest.

• Champagnie's 30/10 game against Duke was the 28th such game in program history and the first since Sam Young tallied 31 points and 10 rebounds against Connecticut March, 7, 2009.

• Champagnie scored 24 points and grabbed 16 rebounds in a home win over Syracuse after missing the previous two games with a knee injury suffered in practice on Dec. 20.

• Champagnie became the only ACC player since 1970 to record consecutive 20/20 games with a 24-point, 21-rebound effort against Gardner-Webb. His 21 rebounds is tied for the seventh most in program history.

• Champagnie recorded the first 20/20 game by a Pitt player since the 2008-09 season with 20 points and 20 rebounds in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge win over Northwestern. His 20 rebounds is an ACC-Big Ten Challenge record.

• Champagnie's 20-rebound effort at Northwestern was the first 20+ rebound game by a Panther since Talib Zanna had 21 boards in an ACC Tournament win over North Carolina March 14, 2014. His 15 defensive rebounds in the contest is tied for fourth best at Pitt.

• Champagnie registered the second 20-10 game of his career with 22 points and 10 rebounds against Northern Illinois. He was 8-of-13 from the field, including 4-of-6 from three-point range, in the win.

• Champagnie went 7-of-11 from the field and finished with 19 points, seven rebounds, two blocks and two steals in a win over Drexel.

• Champagnie recorded 20 points and 20 rebounds, while playing all 40 minutes in a 71-70 win at Northwestern to become just the fourth major conference player in the past 25 years to accomplish that feat.

• Champagnie's 20/20 game was the 13th such game in the ACC over the past 25 seasons. At 6-6, he also became the shortest player in that span to register a 20-20 game.

- Coulibaly scored a career-high 15 points on 4-of-6 shooting from the field and 6-of-7 from the foul line at Wake Forest.
- Coulibaly grabbed a career-high nine rebounds to go along with six points and two blocks in a win over Gardner-Webb.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

- **Terrell Brown** is averaging 1.45 blocks per game for his career, eighth best in program history. He leads all active players in the ACC and ranks tied for third in the Pitt record books with 170 career blocked shots.

- **Femi Odukale** has stepped up over the past 14 games to provide a lift in the backcourt for the Panthers. He has scored in double figures three times and is averaging 7.1 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.5 assists in 22.6 minutes per game in that span.
- Odukale has played 25+ minutes in a game five times (Louisville, at Syracuse, at NC State, Wake Forest). He is averaging 11.6 points and 4.2 rebounds per game, while going 20-of-47 (.426) from the field when playing 25+ minutes per game.
- Odukale went 6-of-11 from the field and 5-7 from the foul line en route to a season-high 18 points at NC State. He also added four rebounds and five assists with just one turnover in a season-high 38 minutes of action.
- Odukale had eight points, three rebounds and three assists against No. 16 Florida State.
- Odukale recorded seven points, four rebounds and an assist, while making his first career start in a win over No. 16 Virginia Tech.
- Odukale posted a season-high eight assists with no turnovers to go along with five points and two rebounds in a home win over Syracuse.

- Odukale tallied 10 points and a season-best seven rebounds in a win at Syracuse. He had six points, three rebounds and an assist in the final 3:37 of play as Pitt outscored the Orange, 15-3, to overcome a nine-point deficit.

- **Nike Sibande** missed Pitt's first five games of the season, while awaiting the NCAA decision on immediate eligibility for transfers. He also missed time following the holiday break due to COVID-19 contact tracing.
- Sibande has scored in double figures in two of the past four games and is averaging 12.8 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game over the past four contests.
- Sibande posted season highs in points (23), rebounds (9), assists (4), blocks (1), steals (2) and three-point field goals (3) in a home win over Wake Forest.
- Sibande had nine points, five rebounds and three assists in his fifth start of the season at NC State.
- Sibande recorded 12 points and seven rebounds in 36 minutes of action vs. No. 16 Florida State.
- Sibande scored eight points against Louisville in his first start as a Panther before missing Pitt's road win at Syracuse due to COVID-19 protocols.
- Sibande had three points and two rebounds in eight minutes of action in a win at Miami in his debut. He found out he would be able to play in the game 55 minutes before tip off.
- Sibande has made 197 three-point field goals and is an outstanding rebounder from the guard position, averaging 4.8 rebounds per game for his career.
- Sibande recorded 1,463 points in three seasons at Miami [Ohio] with 76 double-figure scoring games in 97 games, including 26 games with 20 or more points scored.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Freshman **Will Jeffress** is one of the youngest players in the NCAA after bypassing his final year of high school to sign with the Panthers for the 2020-21 season. He made his college debut at 17 years, five months and 22 days old, becoming the youngest ACC player to compete in a game since Brad Daugherty debuted for North Carolina at 17 years, one month and one day old Nov. 20, 1982.
- Jeffress scored a season-high eight points to go along with three rebounds, two assists and two blocks in a home win over Wake Forest. He played a season-high 37 minutes in the contest.
- Jeffress recorded two points, a season-high eight rebounds and an assist, while making his first career start at Syracuse.
- Jeffress finished with seven points, four rebounds and a steal in a season-high 33 minutes of action at Northwestern.
- Jeffress registered seven points, four rebounds, one assist and a steal in his Pitt debut.

JOHNSON ENTERS TRANSFER PORTAL

• Head coach **Jeff Capel** announced the departure of Xavier Johnson Feb. 24 after both parties mutually agreed that it was in everyone's best interest to part ways. Johnson entered the NCAA Transfer Portal on that same date.

• Johnson concludes his Pitt career with 1,152 points and 415 assists. He scored in double figures in 64 of 84 career games and averaged 13.7 points, 3.7 rebounds and 4.9 assists per game.

• Johnson had scored in double figures 13 times and was averaging 14.2 points, 3.4 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 1.3 steals per game this season. He ranked among the ACC leaders in scoring (16th), free throw percentage (.787 - 7th), assists (2nd) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.75:1 - 9th).

• Johnson was the 12th player in program history to collect 1,000+ points and 400+ assists in a career. He was in line to become the eighth Panther to lead the team in assists in three seasons before his departure.

TONY ENTERS TRANSFER PORTAL

• **Au'Diese Toney** entered the NCAA Transfer Portal Thursday, Feb. 25. He was averaging a career-best 14.4 points and 5.9 rebounds per game.

• Toney scored 15 or more points in nine games, including three 20+ point efforts. He is one of the top wing defenders in the conference.

• Toney ranked among the ACC leaders in scoring (14.4 ppg. - 13th), free throw attempts (87 FTA - 5th), offensive rebounds (2.31 - 11th) and minutes (34.96 mpg. - 8th).

SCORING SURGE VS. THE ORANGE

• Pitt scored a season-high 96 points, including 64 in the second half of play, in a home win over Syracuse. Capel-led teams are now 27-1 all-time, including a 4-0 mark at Pitt, when scoring 90 or more points in a game.

• The Panthers scored 64 points in the second half, the most by the program since joining the ACC and the fourth most in program history.

• The 96 points scored are the most in a conference game since a 101-96 double-overtime win against Wake Forest Feb. 16, 2016 and the most by the Panthers in a regulation (no overtimes) conference game since posting a 98-79 win over DePaul March 9, 2008.

• **Justin Champagnie** (24), Xavier Johnson (23), **Ithiel Horton** (20) and **Au'Diese Toney** (18) combined for 85 of the team's 96 points in the win.

• Pitt's 20-point margin of victory is the largest against an ACC opponent since an 84-61 win over Boston College Jan. 16, 2016 and tied for the fourth largest in ACC regular season play.

• **Justin Champagnie** earned ACC Player of the Week honors for the third time Jan. 25 after averaging 24.0 points, 11.0 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and 3.5 steals per game, while going 19-of-27 (.704) from the field, including 6-of-10 (.600) from three-point range, against Duke and Wake Forest. • Champagnie became the second Pitt player, joining Lamar Patterson (2013-14), to earn ACC Player of the Week accolades three times in a season.

• Champagnie claimed ACC Player of the Week recognition Jan. 18 and Jan. 25 to join Michael Young (2016-17) as the only Panthers to claim the honors in consecutive weeks since joining the ACC. He also became the first repeat ACC Player of the Week selection since Joel Berry (North Carolina) claimed honors Jan. 9 and Jan. 16, 2017. • Champagnie became the third Pitt player to earn multiple ACC Player of the Week honors in a season collecting recognition for the second time Jan. 18 following a 24-point, 16-rebound performance in a home win over Syracuse.

• Champagnie became the first Panther to earn ACC Player of the Week honors since Michael Young collected the honor twice (Nov. 14 and Nov. 21) during the 2016-17 season. Champagnie averaged 22.0 points, 20.5 rebounds per game in a pair of wins from Dec. 7-13.

• Champagnie recorded 20/20 games in wins over Northwestern (20/20) and Gardiner-Webb (24-21) to become the first ACC player since Tom Burlinson (NC State) during the 1971-72 season with back-to-back 20/20 games.
