DR. JULIO FRENK

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979

A fourth-generation physician whose paternal grandparents fled Germany in the early 1930s to build a new life in Mexico, Julio Frenk catalyzed his deep gratitude for the kindness of strangers into a lifelong mission to improve the health, education, and well-being of people around the world.

Dr. Frenk became the sixth president of the University of Miami in August of 2015. He also holds academic appointments as Professor of Public Health Sciences at the Leonard M. Miller School of Medicine and as Professor of Health Sector Management and Policy at the Business School.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, he was the dean for nearly seven years of the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and the T & G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Julio Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. There he pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal coverage, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for more than 55 million previously uninsured Mexicans.

He was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of its kind in the developing world. He also served as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy at the World Health Organization and as senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, among other leadership positions.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint Ph.D. in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan. He has received honorary degrees from ten universities. His scholarly production, which includes over 170 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, has been cited around 19,000 times.

He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the U.S. National Academy of Medicine, and the National Academy of Medicine of Mexico. He serves on the boards of the United Nations Foundation and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. He has received numerous recognitions, including the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health, the Bouchet Medal for Outstanding Leadership presented by Yale University for promoting diversity in graduate education, and the Welch-Rose Award for Distinguished Service from the Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health.In 2017, he was elected as a member of El Colegio Nacional, one of the most prestigious groups of intellectuals, artists, writers, and scientists of Mexico. Julio Frenk was born in Mexico City in December 1953. He is married to Dr. Felicia Knaul, a social sector economist, and has four children.

In summary, Dr. Julio Frenk has an extensive professional record spanning three decades and a career that has included leadership positions in all relevant aspects of public health and higher education: research, teaching, analysis of public policies, institution-building, international cooperation, and national public service. He has also been involved in various initiatives to reform higher education.



DR. MARVIN DAWKINS

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his ninth year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that role.

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and ACC.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports. He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in American Behavioral Scientist (2012).

He has published widely in these areas. Dr. Dawkins is coauthor (with Graham C. Kinloch) of the book, African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era (Praeger, 2000). His most recent publications include "African American Golf Clubs in the Early Development of Black Golf" in The Western Journal of Black Studies (2018) and "Challenges to Title IX: A Critical Race Perspective" in The Negro Educational Review (2019). Dr. Dawkins serves as the University of Miami's Faculty Athletics Representative to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). He served as ACC President for 2017-2018. Dr. Dawkins is also a member of the Museum Committee of the United States Golf Association (USGA).

BLAKE JAMES

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MINNESOTA STATE-MANKATO, 1992

Since taking over as the University of Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013, Blake James has transformed The U, spearheading significant advances in all aspects of the department, including in student-athlete support, facility upgrades, ticket sales, broadcast capabilities, academic achievement as well as in the number of postseason appearances.

Miami has captured five NCAA individual championships, six ACC team titles and 65 individual ACC titles since James became Director of Athletics. Miami's recent success continues to garner both James and UM national recognition. In 2019, James concluded a two-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division I Council, the group responsible for the day-to-day decision-making for all of Division I Athletics. In 2019, he was one of five nominees for the 2019 SportsBusiness Journal Athletic Director of the Year. In 2017, James was selected as one of four Division I recipients of the 2016-17 Under Armour Athletic Directors of the Year award from the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). This summer, he was selected as the ACC's Chair of the Athletic Directors for the 2020-21 academic year.

James has always placed a strong emphasis on academics and community outreach during his seven-plus years as Miami's Director of Athletics. A record 237 UM student-athletes made the 2019-20 ACC Honor Roll. Every team posted at least a 3.0 grade point average in the spring semester and the football team's spring semester and cumulative GPAs also set team records. Nine programs were recognized for perfect single-year scores of 1,000 in the latest NCAA Academic Progress Report, and five programs -- men's and women's cross country, golf, and men's and women's tennis teams -- earned Public Recognition Awards for teams finishing in the Top 10 percent of their respective sports based on the most recent multi-year APR.

Hurricane student-athletes placed fourth nationally in this past year's NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, their third consecutive Top 10 finish. Miami's rowing, soccer and men's track & field/cross country teams each finished second in their respective competitions, while football placed third.

On the fundraising front, despite a challenging climate, the Hurricane Club raised close to \$11 million in 2019-2020, including \$1.5 million in commitments to support the endowed scholarship fund, ten new Golden Canes Society Members and three new seven-figure gifts – one being the largest gift in UM baseball history from a former studentathlete. The Sixth Annual Celebration of Women's Athletics, held this past February, raised a record \$650,000 with a record attendance of more than 550.

On the facilities front, UM's new state-of-the art Jimmy and Kim Klotz Baseball Player Development Center opened this past summer, one of numerous facility projects Miami has completed during James' tenure. In 2018, the \$40 million Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility opened for use, encompassing not just indoor practice fields for football, but also new football coaches offices, new football reception and recruiting areas, weight room renovations and new coaches offices for golf, rowing, soccer and volleyball. Other recent facility enhancements include the opening of the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence; a new nutrition center; new artificial and natural playing surfaces and lights on the Greentree Practice Fields; a center-hung scoreboard inside the Watsco Center; renovations to the men's and women's basketball offices at Watsco Center; renovations to the Hecht Athletic Center; and a new videoboard for the Neil Schiff Tennis Center.

In 2018, UM set a record for football season tickets at Hard Rock Stadium (46,738) and also posted the school's highest average attendance at Hard Rock Stadium (61,469). From 2015-18, men's basketball tickets sold out for three consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

In addition, Miami has built its broadcast, communications and marketing departments into one of the nation's leaders in digital media and video production. Miami has continually ranked at the top of the conference in the number of live ACC Network Extra broadcasts each year and produced numerous ACC Network linear telecasts during the network's debut this past year. James was also instrumental in helping Miami strike one of the largest apparel deals in the country with adidas.

Prior to being named AD, James served Miami Athletics in the roles of Interim AD and Senior Associate AD for Development and Ticket Operations, where he oversaw the day-to-day operations of development, ticket sales and ticket operations. He also was a member of the Hurricanes' senior staff and provided sport supervision.

James returned to UM after spending seven years at the University of Maine, where he first served as Senior Associate Athletic Director before serving as Director of Athletics from 2005 to 2010. During his tenure at Maine, athletics experienced tremendous success, including three trips to the Frozen Four for the men's ice hockey program and NCAA playoff berths for football, baseball (two), women's basketball and softball. James implemented a comprehensive \$17 million facility improvement plan at Maine, which included an indoor practice facility and numerous other facility upgrades and renovations. Academically, the program flourished, earning the conference academic cup twice and student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 GPA or above.

Prior to his stint at Maine, James worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund.

James is no stranger to South Florida, beginning his athletic career with UM, working in ticket sales, corporate sales and athletic development. In 1995, he was hired as Miami's Director of Ticket Sales, serving in that capacity until 1997, when he was named an athletic development officer at the University of Nebraska. He returned to Miami in 1998 as the Director of Major Gifts and Corporate Sales and was promoted to the Director of Athletic Development at Miami in 2000 before moving on to Providence in 2002.

James graduated from Minnesota State University - Mankato with a Bachelor's degree in Marketing in 1992, and later received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in 1994. He and his wife, Kelly, have two children -- daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER / SWA PENNSYLVANIA, 1998

Jennifer Strawley joined the University of Miami on June 18, 2012 and currently serves as Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer. She also serves as the department's Senior Woman Administrator.

Serving as the second-in-command, Strawley provides strategic direction for the department and assists the Director of Athletics with the day-to-day operations. She is the sport administrator for football, soccer, women's basketball and women's tennis. Strawley leads the department's strategic planning initiatives, policy development and implementation, coordination of department and coaches meetings and gender equity and inclusion initiatives. She oversees the areas of human resources, sports medicine, academic services, equipment / Adidas, video services and student-athlete development, as well as serves as a liaison to various campus groups, the ACC and the NCAA.

Strawley played a key role in the hiring of head football coaches Mark Richt and Manny Diaz. In addition, she was instrumental in the development of Miami's annual Celebration of Women's Athletics recognizing the achievements of Miami's female student-athletes while raising money to support women's athletics.

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC. She currently serves on the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball foresight committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee, the ACC Football Schedulers Group, and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. She also serves on the board of directors for Women's Leaders in College Sports and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to UM, Strawley concluded her second tour with the NCAA as the Director of Academic and Membership Affairs. In this role, Strawley was instrumental in providing leadership in the areas of academic governance and development of academic policy. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 2007-10. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the student-athlete reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees and the NCAA Olympic Sports

Liaison Committee

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. Strawley was inducted into the William Tennent High School Hall of Fame in of 2014.



JASON LAYTON

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER ST. LEO, 1999

Jason Layton serves as the University of Miami Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Financial Officer, a position he took over in August 2017. He initially joined Miami in December 2014 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's business office, marketing, digital strategies, communications, ticket sales, client experience, ticket operations, analytics, video production, and broadcast departments.

Additionally, Layton has oversight of all departmental licensing matters, Hurricane Sports Properties, and serves as the department liaison for all ACC finance and ACC Network matters.

Since his arrival, Miami has seen exceptional growth in ticket sales, licensing revenue, and video production services in both content and broadcast with ESPN and the newly formed ACC Network.

Under Layton's guidance, Miami has seen unprecedented growth in football attendance, including the most season ticket holders in university history (46,738) during the 2018 season. 2018 overall attendance average, 61,469 fans, ranking first in the nation among stadiums with seating capacities under 70,000.

The 2017 season averaged 58,682 fans, ranking second in the nation among stadiums with seating capacities under 70,000. During the 2016 season, the Hurricanes totaled 42,000 season ticket holders, averaging 58,572 fans per game – the 27th-highest total in the nation and leader among all Power Five schools in percentage increase on a year-to-year basis (23 percent).

Miami also sold out its entire 2015-16, 2016-17, 2017-18 men's basketball season ticket allotments, marking the first time in Hurricane Athletics history that a team has sold out its season ticket allotment in back-to-back-to-back seasons.

Layton serves as the primary contact for ESPN, overseeing the recent launch of the ACC Network, first in digital format in August 2016, and building to the linear network in the fall of 2019.

Layton, a Florida native, arrived in Miami after spending the 2012-2014 seasons at Colorado State University, where he served as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing. During his time in Fort Collins, Colo., Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

Before he arrived at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled

a variety of responsibilities including sales, marketing, ticket operations, luxury suite operations, advertising, accounting, finance, and purchasing. Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011. Layton received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Saint Leo University in Saint Leo, Fla.

SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD ACADEMIC SERVICES FLORIDA A&M, 1994

"When you do the right things, the right things happen." David Wyman has empowered over 2,500 student-athletes with his signature creed. Now in his 26th year, Wyman has advised and mentored a diverse population of student-athletes to become skilled professionals in many different careers.

Wyman is the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Academic Services at the University of Miami, a position he was promoted to in August 2017. Wyman is also the sport administrator for Miami's volleyball and Men's Tennis program.

He began his own career as an intern, and was quickly promoted to the full-time staff after working just two months in the academic services division. Wyman became the assistant director two years later, supervising the tutorial program and advising both the football and men's basketball teams. He was then promoted to associate director, taking on the responsibility of coordinating the NCAA eligibility certification for all 400 student-athletes.

Since 2004, Wyman has managed the Division of Athletic Academic Services, currently leading a staff of ten full-time professionals. Under his leadership, the department and sport programs have gained national recognition and honors for continued growth in both academic progress rates (APR) and graduation success.

A 2016 inductee to the Iron Arrow Honor Society, Wyman has helped guide the football team to a pair AFCA Academic Achievement Awards for graduating 100 percent of student-athletes in the freshman classes of 2002 and 2009. Under his leadership, the University of Miami Graduation Success Rate has been 90% or higher seven out of the last eight years.

Wyman is a 1994 graduate of Florida A&M with a bachelor's degree in accounting. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University in 1995. Born in Staten Island, N.Y., he is married to Jewyll, and the couple has three daughters: Rebecca, Dominique and Sarah. Wyman has been a Big Brother in the Miami-Dade Big Brother/Big Sister Organization and is also a member of Omicron Delta Kappa, The National Leadership Honor Society and the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics.

Myles Payne completed the NCAA Leadership Institute for Ethnic Minority Males & Females and the Women Leaders in College Sports Mentoring Institute for Advancement in 2009 and Executive Institute in 2019, NACDA Mentoring Institute (2009, and 2014, 2019), Sport Management Institute (2011), the 1A Athletic Directors' Association Institute (2011, 2012, 2013), Executive PREP Advisory Program (2012), Collegiate Athletics Leadership Symposium (2012 and 2013) and Leadership Huntsville (2015). She is also a certified facilitator of True Colors Personal Success Assessments.

Myles Payne, a native of Clarksdale, Miss., graduated from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1997, where she also competed in track and field. She received her M.Ed. in Sports Administration in 2000 from Northwestern State and her Ed.D. in Higher Education Administration from Pittsburgh in 2005.

Jackson was a two-year letter winner for the women's track and field team at Bowling Green. PAIGE YAROSHUK-TEWS HEAD COACH

24TH SEASON (20th as HC) | UCLA, 1996

An outstanding recruiter with unrivaled knowledge of the game and passion for teaching, the 2020-21 season marks the 24th illustrious year for Paige Yaroshuk-Tews with the University of Miami women's tennis team, including her 20th as head coach.

The program's all-time winningest coach, Yaroshuk-Tews has turned the Hurricanes into a force nationally, leading Miami to the NCAA's Elite Eight in eight of the last 16 seasons, tied for the sixth-most quarterfinal appearances in the nation during that span. The Hurricanes have also made the Sweet 16 in 12 of the past 14 years, one of six programs to do so.

In her 19 years at Miami, Yaroshuk-Tews boasts an overall record of 362-123 (.746) and an ACC career record of 147-39 (.790). As a result of her unparalleled achievements, Yaroshuk-Tews was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 2012.

Yaroshuk-Tews' desire to make Miami a national title contender on a yearly basis has helped the program consistently flourish with all-conference and All-American talent. The Hurricanes have not only made the NCAA Team Championship in each of her years as head coach–excluding 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the postseason–but have also won at least one NCAA match every season. UM qualified for the ITA National Team Indoor Championships 12 straight years, from 2005-16, and was ranked in the top 10 at some point during the season in each of those campaigns. Yaroshuk-Tews annually brings in some of the top prep talent, reloading year in and year out for a program consistently ranked among the nation's best.

Since taking the head coaching position for the women's tennis program at Miami in 2001, Yaroshuk-Tews has led the Hurricanes on an unprecedented run in Coral Gables, Fla. In total, she has directed Miami to 13 Sweet 16 berths, eight Elite Eight trips and an appearance in the 2006 NCAA final, the program's first since 1985.

Miami hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Team Championship 13 times under Yaroshuk-Tews, including 12 straight years each from 2005-2016. The Hurricanes have turned in 17 straight ITA top-25 finishes, including 13 in the top 15. In eight of the last 14 seasons, Miami has ended the year in the top 10.

Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews has guided two players to NCAA Singles Championship crowns, as Audra Cohen won the hardware in 2007 and Estela Perez-Somarriba did so in 2019. Miami is one of just three schools with two NCAA singles titles in the past 13 tournaments, alongside Stanford and Virginia. Six Hurricanes have combined for eight semifinals berths during that stretch, with both totals the highest marks of any program since 2007.

Fifteen different Hurricanes have garnered a total of 33 ITA All-American honors under Yaroshuk-Tews, the former a program record for a coach. In 16 of her 19 seasons, at least one Hurricane has been named an All-American, with multiple players receiving the honor in nine of them. Under Yaroshuk-Tews' watch, 17 Hurricanes have combined for 36 All-ACC distinctions and 26 Miami players have totaled 47 Academic All-ACC recognitions. In addition, four Hurricanes have totaled six ACC Player of the Year plaudits and four have combined for five ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors.

Most recently, Miami notched a 6-4 (3-2 ACC) record during the 2020 campaign. The team did not play past February, as the season ended prematurely due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All four of the Hurricanes' setbacks were against top-20 teams, including two in the top five, and the team also notched a top-20 road win. Estela Perez-Somarriba broke the program's career singles wins record, becoming Yaroshuk-Tews' fourth pupil to top the charts. The Madrid native, who won ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year and ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award plaudits, also peaked at first nationally and held the second position when play ended. No ACC postseason accolades were awarded due to the pandemic, but Perez-Somarriba did win her fourth ITA All-America distinction.

The Hurricanes logged a 19-8 ledger in 2019, finishing 9-5 in ACC action and falling one point shy of the NCAA Sweet 16. Miami posted five top-25 wins, including defeating ninth-ranked NC State, 4-2, to reach the ACC Championship semifinals for the sixth time in seven years and fourth in a row. Yaroshuk-Tews guided her team to the No. 20 spot in the final ITA rankings, the 15th top-20 finish in a 16-year period. Estela Perez-Somarriba won the NCAA Singles Championship title and went 43-5, claiming ACC Player of the Year, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, ITA All-America and ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award honors, while ending the season ranked second nationally. Freshman Daevenia Achong earned Second Team All-ACC accolades, as well as joined Perez-Somarriba and three other Hurricanes on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Miami posted an 18-8 mark in 2018, including an 11-3 record in ACC play. After a one-year hiatus, the Hurricanes again hosted the opening two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and advanced to the Sweet 16. Yaroshuk-Tews' team ended the season ranked No. 17 nationally, good for a 14th top-20 finish in a 15-year span. Estela Perez-Somarriba was named the ACC Player of the Year and the ITA National Player to Watch, finishing with ITA All-America accolades, First Team All-ACC distinction, a 39-8 record and the fifth spot in the final ITA rankings. Sinead Lohan, who finished her career with the fourth-most singles wins in school history (130), became Miami's third four-time All-ACC honoree and won the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award.

Despite dealing with significant injuries throughout the 2017 campaign, Yaroshuk-Tews oversaw the team's 22nd consecutive NCAA Team Championship berth and 21st winning season in a row. The Hurricanes finished 13-12, concluded the campaign ranked No. 25 nationally and reached the second round of NCAA play. Miami had two First Team All-ACC honorees for the second straight year, as Sinead Lohan and Estela Perez-Somarriba both garnered the recognition. Perez-Somarriba, an ITA All-American, became the first Hurricane freshman to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, giving Miami a semifinalist for the third season in a row.

Yaroshuk-Tews, en route to ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year distinction, guided Miami to a 21-6 record in 2016, the team's 11th 20-win season in a 13-year span. The Hurricanes went 12-2 in the ACC for the third year in a row, finishing in second place, and reached the ACC Championship final for the sixth time in 12 seasons in the ACC. Miami advanced to the Sweet 16 for the 11th year in a row and ended the campaign ranked No. 10 in the nation, its 13th straight top-15 finish and eighth top-10 finish in the last 11 years. Sinead Lohan, Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang combined for a total of four ITA All-American distinctions. Wagner, the ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year, broke the program's career wins record, finishing with 134. The All-American trio combined for six ACC Player of the Week honors, with Wagner winning four, the most by anyone since 2012, to conclude her career with eight. Lohan went 40-6 in singles, tied for the third-most wins in a season by a Miami player, and became the seventh different Hurricane to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, including the sixth under Yaroshuk-Tews.

The Hurricanes went 18-7 in 2015 and finished second in the ACC at 12-2. Miami reached the Sweet 16 for the 10th year in a row and earned a 12th consecutive top-15 finish. The team also finished in the top four of the ACC for the 11th straight year, each one since it joined the conference. On an individual level, Yaroshuk-Tews guided both Sinead Lohan and Stephanie Wagner to ITA All-American honors. Both of them reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the third time ever–all under the direction of Yarosuk-Tews–two Hurricanes did so the same year. Wagner was also named the ITA National Player to Watch. UM set a program record with five nationally-ranked singles players in the year-end rankings and tied the top mark set the previous season with six different players ranked in either singles or doubles.

In 2014, Miami posted its sixth consecutive 20-win season and 10th in the last 11 years, finishing at 21-6, with a 12-2 mark in the ACC to tie for first place. The Hurricanes hosted the NCAA Team Championship first and second rounds for the 10th consecutive year and reached the NCAA round of 16 for the ninth straight time. Additionally, UM made the ITA National Team Indoor Championships for the 10th season in a row. Miami ended the year at No. 12 in the nation and two Hurricanes, Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno, earned ITA All-American recognition. Six different Hurricanes ended the season ranked in either singles or doubles, a new program record.

The 2013 season saw Miami win its first ACC Championship title, as the Hurricanes knocked off a trio of top-30 teams in Cary, N.C., including second-ranked North Carolina in the semifinals. Miami went on to finish 23-6, marking the most wins for the program since 2009 and the third-most during Yaroshuk-Tews' tenure. The season also marked the fifth consecutive trip to the Elite Eight for the Hurricanes, then the longest streak in the country. UM concluded the year ranked eighth, its fifth straight top-10 finish, and Yaroshuk-Tews was named the ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, while her assistant coach, Alex Santos, was chosen as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

During the 2012 season, the Hurricanes advanced to their fourth consecutive NCAA Team Championship Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion Florida. Miami played host to North Florida and Utah in the first two rounds of the tournament, winning both matches, 4-0. In the Sweet 16, the Hurricanes exacted revenge on ACC foe North Carolina, winning 4-2 to erase the memory of a 4-3 loss to the Tar Heels in the regular season. Miami wound up ninth in the final national rankings, and Anna Bartenstein was named an ITA All-American, making it nine straight seasons Yaroshuk-Tews coached a player who received the honor.

In 2011, Yaroshuk-Tews led Miami on another deep run in the NCAA Team Championship, winning at home in the first two rounds before taking down Michigan in the round of 16 in Stanford, Calif. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked seventh nationally. Also in 2011, senior Bianca Eichkorn became the program's all-time winningest singles player (133 victories) en route to numerous All-America and all-conference honors. Among them, Eichkorn became the fourth UM player in the last seven seasons to be named ACC Player of the Year under Yaroshuk-Tews, who surpassed 200 career wins with Miami's NCAA-opening 4-0 victory May 13 against FIU. Anna Bartenstein was also named an ITA All-American in 2011, making it four straight years the Hurricanes had at least two players garner the accolade.

In 2010, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to the NCAA quarterfinals, a No. 10 final ranking and a 20-6 record, UM's sixth 20-win season in the last seven years. Miami also posted a 10-1 mark in ACC play to finish in second place. For the second straight year-the first time that happened since 1985-86-three Hurricanes earned ITA All-America honors, this time Bianca Eichkorn, Gabriela Mejia and Laura Vallverdu, who also won the Honda Sports Award. Vallverdu was an All-American in singles and doubles, giving Miami four All-America honors for the first time since 1988. Additionally, Vallverdu set the program record for singles wins (131) and became the fourth four-year All-American in program history and the first under Yaroshuk-Tews. Eichkorn and Vallverdu both reached the NCAA Singles Championship quarterfinals, the second straight year two Hurricanes did so after it had not previously happened in program history. Vallverdu made the semifinals, to become the program's first two-time semifinalist.

During the 2009 season, Yaroshuk-Tews claimed the ACC Coach of the Year award after leading UM to a 26-5 mark, its second-best record ever during the NCAA era (1982-present). The Hurricanes went 16-0 at home, captured the ACC regular season title at 10-1 and registered 12 consecutive victories leading into the ACC Championship final. Yaroshuk-Tews saw her team advance to the NCAA quarterfinals and concluded the season seventh in the country, its second best finish of the last 32 years. For the first time since 1988, three UM players were named ITA All-Americans, in Bianca Eichkorn, Julia Cohen and Laura Vallverdu. All three reached the NCAA Singles Championship round of 16, a first in school history. Cohen and Eichkorn became the first Hurricane duo to make the semifinals the same year, and Vallverdu finished as the second finalist in program history. In total, four Hurricanes played in the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the first time that happened, and four Miami duos were listed in the final ITA doubles rankings for the first time ever.

In 2008, Miami finished with a 17-6 overall mark, snapping a string of four consecutive 20-win seasons. The Hurricanes faced 18 ranked opponents and went 12-6 against them. UM hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship for the fourth straight year and reached a third consecutive Sweet 16. The Hurricanes' 6-1 win over No. 45 NC State April 12 gave Yaroshuk-Tews her 132nd victory to pass legendary Miami coach Ivan Duvenhage (1982-88) for the program record. Miami ended the season at No. 14 in the nation and Laura Vallverdu was named an ITA All-American.

During the 2007 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to a 22-7 mark, the team's fourth straight 20-win season and to the NCAA quarterfinals for the second straight season. Miami went 17-1 at home, with the lone loss against eventual NCAA champion Georgia Tech. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked ninth in the nation, their second straight top-10 finish. Audra Cohen and Laura Vallverdu were both named ITA All-Americans, making it three straight years UM had multiple honorees for the first time since 1986-88. Cohen went 42-2 in singles, became the first player in program history win the national title in the NCAA Singles Championship and was also the first to win the Honda Sports Award. She also won her second consecutive ITA National Player of the Year Award and ACC Player of the Year award, making it three straight years a Hurricane earned both accolades. It marked just the second time ever a school had three straight ITA National Player of the Year winners on the women's side, and Cohen was fifth women to win the award in back-to-back years. Cohen ended the season at No. 1 in the nation for the second year in a row, marking the third straight time a UM player finished first, and she was selected to the ITA All-Star Team as well. Three Hurricanes made the NCAA Singles Championship for the third time ever, and first since 1985. Yaroshuk-Tews reached 100 wins with a 6-1 win over excent reaches.

Baylor Feb. 3, becoming the third coach in program history to get to triple digits. Her assistant coach, David Anderton, garnered the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year award for his work with the team.

The 2006 campaign was a special one for the Miami program, as the Hurricanes advanced to the final of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time since 1985 and the second time ever. UM upset second-ranked Notre Dame in the quarterfinals and third-ranked USC in the semifinals. The impressive run came to an end in the championship match against two-time defending champion and top-seeded Stanford. The Hurricanes finished the season at 24-7 and shared the ACC regular season title for the second straight year. Yaroshuk-Tews' squad came up with big wins against some of the nation's best teams, going 5-3 against top-10 teams, including a 4-2 mark against opponents ranked in the top three. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked fourth in the country, their first top-five finish since 1987 and the fourth-best record in program history during the NCAA era (1982-present).

The same year, Melissa Applebaum and Audra Cohen were both named ITA All-Americans, making it back-to-back years the Hurricanes had a pair of honorees for the first time since the 1987-88 season. Cohen went 34-2 in singles and finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation, the second straight year a Hurricane took the top spot. She was named the ITA National Player of the Year and ACC Player of the Year, making it back-to-back years a Hurricane won both awards, and she was nominated for the Honda Sports Award. Cohen and Applebaum ended the year ranked second nationally in doubles and made the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Both of them were named to the ITA All-Star Team. Additionally, four Hurricanes made the year-end ITA rankings for the first time in 30 years.

The team flourished in 2005 under Yaroshuk-Tews, earning a 21-5 overall record, marking its second consecutive 20-win season. Miami went 9-1 in Atlantic Coast Conference play in its inaugural season in the league to tie for first place and also reached the ACC Championship final. The Hurricanes made the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships and upset fourth-ranked UCLA, 4-3. UM earned an automatic bid to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and fell to California in the second round to snap a 27-match home winning streak. The Hurricanes finished at No. 13 in the nation and both Audrey Bañada and Megan Bradley were named ITA All-Americans, the first time Miami had multiple players earn the honor since 1992. The pair also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship, the first Miami duo to do so since 1992. Bradley set a program record for singles wins with 44, finishing at 44-2 and winning 39 straight matches along the way. She won the ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships title, finished the season ranked first in the nation, made the ITA All-Star Team, and won ACC/UM Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year and ITA National Senior Player of the Year. Additionally, Bradley was the first Hurricane to win ITA National Player of the Year and the first to receive the ACC Player of the Year award. Her ITA national awards were the first by a Hurricane since 1991.

In 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to yet another successful season and earned her second BIG EAST Coach of the Year award. The Hurricanes finished with a 20-4 overall record and were ranked 15th in the final poll, the team's highest ranking since 1991. Miami made the BIG EAST Championship final for the 13th straight year–every one it participated in as a conference member–and won its eighth title. Half the titles and seven of the finals appearances came with Yaroshuk-Tews on the coaching staff. The Hurricanes were part of one of the biggest upsets in collegiate tennis history in 2004. They beat previously undefeated and top-ranked ranked Florida, 4-3, in the second round of the NCAA Team Championship in Gainesville, Fla. Miami had not defeated the Gators since the 1986 season. The Hurricanes advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1999 and defeated No. 11 Tulane, 4-1, to reach the Elite Eight for the first time since the 1986. Megan Bradley was named an ITA All-American, the first Hurricane to garner the honor since 1999, which was also the last time Miami won 20-plus matches. After the season, Yaroshuk-Tews was tabbed to coach the prestigious USA Tennis Collegiate Team.

During the 2003 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to a 17-7 record and an eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Team Championship. Her squad advanced to the second round of the tournament and finished the season ranked 23rd in the country, marking the program's first top-25 finish since 1999. The Hurricanes had two players–Melissa Applebaum and Megan Bradley–in the NCAA Singles Championship for the first time since 1992, and placed a pair–Applebaum and Bradley–in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the first time since 1997, both ending the longest droughts in program history.

In 2002, her first season as head coach, Yaroshuk-Tews guided the Hurricanes to their seventh BIG EAST Championship title and she was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year. The team finished with a 14-7 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time in three years. Half of Miami's wins came against ranked opponents that season and the Hurricanes had a player, Mari Toro, finish the season nationally ranked for the first time since 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews spent the 1998 and 1999 seasons as the assistant coach at Miami before being promoted to associate head coach for the 2000 and 2001 seasons. During that stretch, the Hurricanes won the BIG EAST Championship in both 1998 and 2000. In Yaroshuk-Tews' opening year on staff, UM had its first All-American–Lioudmila Skavronskaia–in three years, quickly ending the program's first two-year drought without one since its first two years of existence (1973-74).

Prior to joining the Miami staff, Yaroshuk-Tews worked at the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Player Development Headquarters in Key Biscayne, Fla., as a traveling coach with the top U.S. junior players. Before her USTA appointment, Yaroshuk-Tews played professionally in satellite and challenger events. A Miami native and Killian High School graduate, Yaroshuk-Tews stood out among Florida juniors. In the Girl's 18 Division, she held the No. 1 ranking in Florida and the No. 8 spot nationally.

Yaroshuk-Tews went on to star at UCLA, where she was a four-year letter winner and two-time ITA All-American. The Bruins made the NCAA Team Championship and finished in the top 15 all four of her seasons on the team, including a trio of top-10 finishes. She made an immediate impact as a freshman in 1993, playing No. 5 singles and No. 2 doubles for UCLA, who finished No. 13 in the nation. Her junior year, in 1995, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 3 singles and No. 3 doubles for the Bruins, who concluded the year sixth in the country after reaching the Elite Eight. Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews made the NCAA Singles Championship and finished No. 78 nationally.

As a senior in 1996, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Bruins, who made the Final Four and ended the season ranked fourth. Yaroshuk-Tews won the PAC-10 Indoor and Outdoor Doubles Championships with partner Keri Phebus and achieved ITA All-America and All-PAC-10 honors in both singles and doubles. The Bruins' top tandem was ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation during the 1996 season and finished No. 3, while Yaroshuk-Tews achieved a singles ranking as high as No. 13 and closed at No. 21. She made the round of 16 of the NCAA Singles Championship and the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. In addition, Yaroshuk-Tews was honored with UCLA's "Champs Award," given to the school's most inspirational female athlete, and was named the team's Most Valuable Player. She was also appointed to the Rolex/ITA Collegiate All-Star Team.

Yaroshuk-Tews graduated from UCLA in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, while earning PAC-10 academic honors. She began UM's graduate studies program in elementary education during the spring of 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews is the daughter of Ernie and Carol Yaroshuk. Her father was a member of the University of Miami baseball team from 1961-63, and was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 1992. He holds the third-highest batting average (.448) in the program's single-season history. Yaroshuk-Tews and her father form the only father-daughter duo in the UMSHoF.

On Jan. 10, 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews was married to Scott Tews. The couple lives in Palmetto Bay, Fla., with their daughter, Emma, and son, Landon.

FIRST SEASON (SECOND STINT) | UNIVERSIDADE TECNICA DE LISBOA, 2005

University of Miami head women's tennis head coach Paige Yaroshuk-Tews announced Dec. 1, 2020, the hiring of Alex Santos.

For Santos, who will serve as associate head coach, this will be his second stint at Miami; he previously worked for Yaroshuk-Tews from 2009-13. Santos earned ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in his final season, before departing to become the head coach at Pittsburgh.

"I couldn't be happier to welcome Alex Santos back to the University of Miami women's tennis program," Yaroshuk-Tews said upon his re-hiring. "His attention to detail and work ethic are undoubtedly among the best in the country. He is a proven recruiter and our collective goals are to get this program back to national championship contention. Alex will be committed to this program and its success from day one and won't stop until our job is complete."

Santos served as Miami's volunteer assistant in 2009-10 and as a graduate manager in the fall of 2010 before being elevated to a full-time assistant coaching position in the spring of 2011.

During his four years at Miami, Santos helped the Hurricanes to an 85-24 record that included a 36-8 ledger in ACC play and a 50-5 mark at home. The 85 victories are tied for the sixth-most in any four-year span in program history, with two of the five higher marks featuring three of Santos' seasons.

The Hurricanes not only won 20-plus matches in all four of Santos' seasons with the team, but reached the NCAA Elite Eight and finished in the ITA top 10 all four times. Their peak year-end ranking came in 2011 with a seventh-place finish. In 2013, Santos also aided Miami to the program's first ACC Championship title.

Santos left Miami after the 2013 campaign to become the head coach at Pittsburgh. He served in that capacity for six years, leading the Panthers to their first win over a ranked foe and guiding the program's first players to earn ITA singles and doubles rankings.

Off the court, Pittsburgh posted four consecutive perfect 1,000 Academic Progress Report (APR) scores during his tenure.

In August 2019, Santos accepted a position as the associate head coach at Baylor. In his lone spring with the Bears, he helped lead the team to a 10-2 mark during the abbreviated 2020 campaign.

A native of Oeiras, Portugal, Santos was one of the top-ranked junior players in his homeland. He graduated from Universidade Tecnica de Lisboa in 2005. He has experience working at tennis academies in both Portugal and Spain.

Maci Epstein is currently the volunteer assistant coach for the University of Miami women's tennis team.

Epstein previously served as the interim assistant coach during the 2020 spring season and as a student assistant coach in 2017-18. The Winter Park, Fla., native played her final collegiate season for the Hurricanes in 2016-17.

During her stint as the team's interim assistant coach in the abbreviated 2020 campaign, Epstein helped guide Miami to a 6-4 (3-2 ACC) record and an ITA ranking as high as No. 18 nationally.

While finishing her graduate studies at Miami in 2017-18, Epstein served on Yaroshuk-Tews' staff and aided the Hurricanes to a spot in the NCAA Championship Sweet 16, the program's 12th such berth in a span of 13 years. Miami posted an 18-8 (11-3 ACC) ledger and finished the season ranked No. 17 in the country.

A four-year letter winner at the University of Virginia, Epstein helped the Cavaliers claim the ACC Championship title in 2014 and 2015. She ascended as high at fifth in the ITA doubles rankings as a freshman in 2013, then the best mark in program history.

After redshirting in the spring of 2016 to retain her final year of eligibility, Epstein came to Miami as a graduate transfer for her last season. During her lone campaign with the Hurricanes, she peaked at a career-high No. 69 in the singles rankings, spent much of the year at the top spot in doubles and helped Miami to a top-25 finish.

A 2016-17 ITA Scholar-Athlete and a 2014-15 VaSID All-State Second Team pick in singles, Epstein concluded her college career with an 89-55 record in singles and a 93-54 tally in doubles.

2020 Honors

Despite the abbreviated campaign due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Estela Perez-Somarriba still earned several prestigious honors. Most prominently, she earned ITA All-America status for the fourth consecutive year, making her the fifth four-time ITA All-American in program history, including the third with three such distinctions in singles. The Madrid native also claimed ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year accolades and, for the second year in a row, won the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Award for Sportsmanship & Leadership. Both awards were the fourth, regardless of region, by a Hurricane during head coach Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' tenure, with the latter marking the third year in a row a Miami player claimed the plaudit.

Although no conference postseason honors were handed out, Perez-Somarriba did still receive two recognitions from the ACC. First, on Feb. 18, 2020, she earned the sixth ACC Player of the Week award of her career. After the season, she became one of four Miami student-athletes to receive an ACC postgraduate scholarship.

In addition, Perez-Somarriba was one of five Hurricanes to pick up ITA Scholar-Athlete distinction. She joined Daevenia Achong, Diana Khodan, Maya Tahan and Florencia Urrutia in that group. Miami also earned ITA Academic Team status for the sixth consecutive year, following a spring semester in which the squad posted a combined 3.78 GPA, good for the best mark ever by a Miami athletic team.

Perez-Somarriba vs. Gauff

On Feb. 15, 2020, Estela Perez-Somarriba competed against Coco Gauff in an exhibition match at the Delray Beach Open in front of over 5,500 fans at the Delray Beach Tennis Center. Gauff, who reached the fourth round of both Wimbledon in 2019 and the Australian Open in 2020, held a No. 51 WTA ranking at the time. Playing in her hometown, Gauff earned a 6-3, 6-3 victory.

- At least one Hurricane has played in the NCAA Singles Championship for 17 years in a row, going back to Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' second year as head coach
 - * In nine of those seasons, Miami had multiple participants, including four in 2009 and three in 2007
 - * Additionally, during those same 17 years, a pair of Hurricanes have been in the NCAA Doubles Championship all but six times (2004, 2012, 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018)

 * Overall, the Hurricanes are 25-1 on their home court in NCAA Team Championship play, splitting their two matches in 2005 when they hosted for the first time
 - * Miami has outscored its opponents by a 97-6 margin during the 24-match winning streak, posting 22 shutouts, and has a 104-10 margin overall with 23 shutouts in home NCAA Team Championship action

Since the NCAA Singles Championship began in 1982, 27 Hurricanes have combined for 60 total berths in the field, posting an overall record of 92-58 (.613). At least one Hurricane has participated 34 of 38 years (all but 1996 and 2000-02), with multiple players doing so 18 times, including three competing on five occasions (1984-87 and 2007) and four once (2009). Five times (four players), a Hurricane has been seeded first and two of the nine No. 1 seeds to claim the title were Hurricanes. Of the four ACC players (30 total in NCAA history) to make multiple semifinal appearances through 2020, two were Hurricanes. No tournament was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Miami has made the NCAA finals twice, falling to USC, 6-3, in Oklahoma City in 1985 and dropping a 4-1 decision against Stanford on the Cardinal's home court in Stanford, Calif., in 2006. Additionally, the Hurricanes made the Final Four in 1986 and defeated Trinty (Texas), 5-4, in Austin, Texas, in the third-place match. No tournament was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
