MIAMI HURRICANES (14-18, 5-13 ACC)

Head Coach: Jim Larrañaga (Providence, '71)

Record at UM: 175-97 (8th season), Career Record: 645-431 (35th season)

THINGS TO KNOW

- Miami is 15-13 all-time in the ACC Tournament. The Canes have won at least one game in the tournament in seven of Jim Larrañaga's eight seasons at the helm.
- Miami is the only power conference team with five players each averaging at least 11 points per game.
- Over the last 10 games, Anthony Lawrence II is averaging 15.2 ppg, 9.1 rpg and 3.7 apg. He owns five double-doubles in the last six games.
- Lawrence averaged a double-double (15 pts, 10 reb) in two games against Virginia Tech this season, while Chris Lykes averaged 17.5 ppg and 6.5 apg against the Hokies.
- Lykes is 10th in the ACC in overall scoring (16.1 ppg) and eighth in conference play (15.9 ppg).
- Zach Johnson is one of 14 players nationally with 1,700 career points and 350 assists.
- As a team Miami ranks ninth nationally in fewest fouls per game (14.6).

MIAMI IN ACC TOURNAMENT

Competing in its 15th ACC Tournament, Miami is 15-13 all-time in the event.

The Canes are the No. 12 seed for the third time (2007, 2010). As the 12-seed in 2010, UM upset the No. 5 seed (Wake Forest) and No. 4 seed (Virginia Tech) en route to a semifinal appearance.

UM is 2-1 in tournament games in Charlotte (2008).

In head coach Jim Larrañaga's eight seasons, Miami is 9-6 in the ACC Tournament, winning at least one game in seven of the appearances.

UM has won at least one game in the tournament in 12 of 15 seasons.

LAWRENCE STEPS UP IN STRETCH RUN

Over the last 10 games, Anthony Lawrence II is averaging 15.2 ppg, 9.1 rpg and 3.7 apg.

Lawrence recorded six double-doubles, including five in the last six games, in that span. He scored a career-high 27 points on March 5 against Pitt.

He nearly became the third UM player to record a triple-double but fell an assist shy on Feb. 23 against Georgia Tech (16 pts, 10 reb, nine assists).

THE MAGNIFICENT SEVEN

Miami has primarily played with a rotation of seven players this season.

UM currently has seven scholarship student-athletes available, plus Willie Herenton, a former walk-on who in January was awarded a scholarship for the remainder of the school year.

Chris Lykes (33.9, 12th), Anthony Lawrence (33.3, 14th) and DJ Vasiljevic (31.7, 23rd) rank in the ACC's top 25 in minutes played, while Zach Johnson (31.5) is just outside the top 25.

THE LYKES SHOW

Chris Lykes is averaging 16.1 ppg and ranks 10th in the ACC in scoring. He averaged 15.9 ppg in ACC games, which is eighth among all ACC players.

Lykes owns 10 20-point games this season and upped his scoring average by 6.5 ppg from his freshman season, marking the third-largest increase among active ACC players.

Lykes has scored in double figures in 26 of 31 outings, including 19 games of 16 or more points.

BALANCE ON OFFENSE

Miami is the only power conference team with five players averaging at least 11 points per game.

The Miami five: Chris Lykes (16.1), Anthony Lawrence (12.8), Zach Johnson (12.1), DJ Vasiljevic (11.6) and Ebuka Izundu (11.0).

The five also averaged in double figures in conference play, led by Lykes at 15.9 ppg and followed by Lawrence (12.2), Johnson (11.2), Izundu (10.5) and Vasiljevic (10.4).

LAWRENCE ETCHING NAME IN MIAMI RECORDS BOOK

Anthony Lawrence II joined Miami's 1,000-point club last Tuesday against Pitt, becoming the 39th Hurricane to reach the milestone. After a 20-point





game Tuesday, he currently has 1,039 points.

With three points Wednesday, Lawrence can move into a tie for 34th place with Julie Cohen (1959-62) and Dick Miani (1952-56).

Lawrence has played in 129 career games, tied for sixth most in program history. With his next appearance he will tie Brian Asbury (2005-09) for fifth in school history at 130 games.

With 144 career steals, Lawrence is ninth most in program history.

THE ACC GRIND CONTINUES

To put it mildly, Miami's ACC slate has been tough.

A league-high eight of Miami's 18 conference games pitted the Canes against teams currently ranked in the AP or USA Today Coaches Top 25 polls.

The Canes' conference schedule included home-and-homes with Florida State, UNC and Virginia Tech, all of which are currently ranked in the top 15.

Seven of Miami's first 11 league games were against teams that are currently ranked or were ranked at the time – most of any ACC team.

CHRIS LYKES: HEART OVER HEIGHT

At 5-foot-7, Chris Lykes is the shortest player on any team in basketball's six power conferences (ACC, BIG EAST, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC).

Within these conferences, he is the second-leading scorer among players under 6-feet tall at 16.2 ppg (Markus Howard, 5-11, Marquette, 25.0 ppg).

He is one of six players under 6-feet tall to regularly be a starter this year, joining Howard, Aaron Calixte (Oklahoma), Justin Coleman (Arizona), Jared Harper (Auburn) and Tremont Waters (LSU).

The other five in this group all are at least 5-10.

JOHNSON IN ELITE 1,700/350 CLUB

Zach Johnson is one of 14 active players nationally to score 1,700 career points and rack up 350 career assists.

Johnson has scored 1,706 career points (1,344 at Florida Gulf Coast, 362 at UM) and owns 395 career assists (321 at FGCU, 74 at UM).

Johnson ranks 49th nationally in career scoring and 58th in assists among active Division I players. He also is 19th in steals (197).

He is averaging 12.1 ppg this season.

IZUNDU CONTINUES BREAKOUT YEAR

Ebuka Izundu has stepped into a starting role this season, averaging 11.2 ppg and a team-high 8.6 rebounds per game (5.0 ppg, 3.8 rpg last season).

Izundu has produced eight double-doubles.

He leads the ACC in offensive rebounds (3.63/game) and ranks fourth overall in rebounds and double-doubles.

Izundu ranks sixth nationally in offensive rebounds and owns the most offensive boards (109) by a Miami player since Tonye Jekiri in 2014-15 (118).

In the last three games, he has racked up 18 offensive rebounds (9 at Duke, 7 vs. Pitt, 2 at VT).

VASILJEVIC AMONG ACC 3-PT LEADERS

DJ Vasiljevic is 73-for-204 (35.8%) from 3-point range and averaging 11.3 ppg.

He is seventh in the ACC in 3-pointers per game (2.4).

Vasiljevic has 15 games with three or more 3-pointers this season.

He had a 33-game streak with at least one made 3-pointer snapped on Feb. 2 at Virginia. It was the third-longest streak in Miami history and tied for the 20th longest in ACC history.

Vasiljevic led the ACC in 3-point field goal percentage last season (41.1%), becoming the fifth Hurricane to top the conference in 3-point shooting (first since Malcolm Grant in 2011).

WAARDENBURG ON UPWARD SWING

Sam Waardenburg has stepped up in the last 12 games, averaging 6.3 points per game in 26.3 minutes per contest.

During that stretch, he is shooting 22-48 (.458) from the field, 12-24 from 3-point range and 19-23 (.826) from the free-throw line.

In the nine games prior to this stretch, he averaged 3.2 ppg.

MACK PROVIDING VALUABLE MINUTES

Anthony Mack has given Miami valuable minutes off the bench in the 21 games since returning from the fall finals break, averaging 16.6 minutes per game in that span.

He played in all 18 ACC contests, averaging 16.4 minutes per game and making seven starts.

He scored a career-high nine points in the first matchup with Wake Forest, including a pair of 3-pointers.

He scored five total points in 33 minutes while playing in five of UM's first nine games.

ACC ANNOUNCES 20-GAME SCHEDULE FUTURE OPPONENTS

The ACC announced Feb. 13 the future matchups of the league's 20-game schedule, which begins with the 2019-20 season. The 20-game matrix is in effect for three years through the 2021-22 season.

Miami will play its two primary rivals, Florida State and Virginia Tech, every season both home and away (four games) as well as four repeat opponents both home and away (eight games). The remaining eight opponents will be single games (four home, four road). The full cycle of repeat opponents will be complete following the third year.

CANES SIGN TWO TO 2019-20 NLI

Miami announced Nov. 14 the signing of Anthony Walker and Isaiah Wong to National Letters of Intent for the 2019-20 school year.

Herenton served as a team manager last season before joining the team as a student-athlete last summer.

He had surgery Dec. 18 to repair the injured knee.

Miami lost three players from its 2017-18 squad, each of whom started at least 18 games: Lonnie Walker IV, Bruce Brown Jr. and Ja'Quan Newton.

Walker was an Honorable Mention All-ACC pick and ACC All-Freshman Team honoree last year. He was selected 18th overall in the NBA Draft by the San Antonio Spurs.

Brown started 19 games before missing the remainder of the season with a foot injury. He was picked 42nd overall in the NBA Draft by Detroit.

Newton played in 127 career games (seventh in program history) and finished with 1,134 career points.

PROGRAM EARNED PERFECT GSR

The Miami men's basketball program earned its first perfect GSR rating, coming in 19 percent above the NCAA average of 81 percent.

The GSR measures graduation rates at Division I institutions and includes students transferring into the institutions. The most recent Division I Graduation Success Rates are based on the four entering classes from 2008-09 to 2011-12

AMONG ACTIVE D-I NCAA COACHES

Entering the ACC Tournament, Jim Larrañaga ranks 11th in career wins among active Division I coaches with 644. Of those 11, four are in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, including three from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Now in his 35th season as a head coach, Larrañaga ranks 40th in all-time NCAA victories among Division I head coaches.

In his career, Larrañaga won 27 games at American International, 170 at Bowling Green and 273 at George Mason, and he now has 174 at Miami. He is one of 15 coaches all-time with 100 or more wins at three D-I schools, four of whom are actively coaching.



MIAMI IN ACC TOURNAMENT

Competing in its 15th ACC Tournament, Miami is 14-13 all-time in the event.

The Canes are the No. 12 seed for the third time (2007, 2010). In 2010 as the 12-seed, UM upset the No. 4 and 5 seeds en route to a semifinal appearance.

UM is 1-1 in games played in Charlotte.

In head coach Jim Larrañaga's first seven seasons, Miami went 8-6 in the ACC Tournament, winning at least one game in each of the first six seasons.

UM has won at least one game in the tournament in 11 of 14 seasons.

2013 ACC TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS

Miami won the ACC Tournament in 2013, defeating North Carolina, 87-77, in the championship game, for the Canes' first ACC title. UM also finished the 2013 regular-season atop the standings.

Since Miami joined the ACC in 2004-05, four teams have won both the regular season and tournament titles in the same year – Miami (2013), Duke (2006, '09), Virginia (2014, '18) and North Carolina (2007, '08 and '16).

IF MIAMI ADVANCES ...

MIAMI-VIRGINIA TECH SERIES

Miami leads the series with Virginia Tech, 22-16.

The Canes have won nine of the last 13 matchups, although the Hokies captured both regular-season games this year.

Virginia Tech downed Miami, 82-70, on Jan. 30 in Coral Gables and 84-70 last Friday in Blacksburg.

Jim Larrañaga is 12-6 against Virginia Tech in his career.

MARCH 8: VA. TECH 84, MIAMI 70

Miami lost at No. 15 Virginia Tech, 84-70, Friday evening in the regular-season finale. Chris Lykes led Miami with 16 points and a career-high nine assists.

Anthony Lawrence recorded 15 points and 11 rebounds.

Miami shot 45.8 percent (27-of-59) from the field, including 6-of-29 from 3-point range. Virginia Tech was hot from behind the arc, nailing 14-of-26 attempts. The Hokies shot 49 percent from the field.

Miami hit seven of its first eight shots in bolting to an early 16-8 advantage. From there, the Hokies tightened the clamps on defense, holding the Hurricanes to two field goals over the next 13 minutes while out-scoring UM 35-8 for a 43-24 lead.

JAN. 30: VA. TECH 82, MIAMI 70

Miami fell to No. 12 Virginia Tech, 82-70, on Jan. 30 at the Watsco Center. Chris Lykes led Miami with 19 points and four assists.

Anthony Lawrence II added 15 points and nine rebounds. Miami shot 23-of-56 (41.1 percent) from the field, while the Hokies were 30-of-51 (58.5 percent). The Canes were 12-of-33 (36.4 percent) from long range, while Virginia Tech finished 9-of-19 (47.4 percent) from beyond the arc.

The Hokies were led by Nickeil Alexander-Walker with 25 points, six steals and five assists.

In a back and forth opening half, the Canes grabbed an 18-15 lead with 8:35 to play on a Lawrence 3-pointer. The Hokies countered with a 10-0 run over the next 3:17 and took a 34-27 lead into the locker room, a lead they would not relinquish.
