THE GAME

- The Miami Hurricanes continue their third season under the direction of head coach Manny Diaz on Sat., Sept. 25 against Central Connecticut
 State at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. Kickoff for the matchup, slated for broadcast on RSN, is set for 12:30 p.m. ET.
- The game will be broadcast on RSN with Tom Werme (pxp), Charles Arbuckle (color) and Lauren Jbara (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 20th season together while Josh Darrow manages the sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on WMYM 990AM from Hard Rock Stadium. WVUM 90.5 FM will also broadcast.

THE SERIES

- Saturday's game between the Miami Hurricanes and Central Connecticut State Blue Devils is the first meeting in the history of the two programs.
- Miami did not compete against an FCS opponent in 2020; the Hurricanes topped Bethune-Cookman, 63-0, in 2019 for Manny Diaz's first win as coach.

THE HURRICANES

- The Miami Hurricanes return 19 of 22 starters from a 2020 team that finished 8-3 overall and 7-2 in Atlantic Coast Conference play. The Canes, who ended the year in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl, became the third Miami team to win seven games in ACC play since joining the conference in 2004.
- The Hurricanes feature several returners who opted for another season at The U over the NFL Draft, led by one of college football's most electric players, QB **D'Eriq King**. In his first season as starting quarterback, King finished with 2,686 passing yards, 538 rushing yards and 27 total TDs.
- Last time out against Michigan State (Sept. 18), Miami fell to the Spartans, 38-17. WR Charleston Rambo had 12 catches for a career-high 156 yards.
- In its home opener, the Miami Hurricanes won against Appalachian State on Sept. 11. Trailing 23-22 with less than five minutes remaining, freshman K Andy Borregales kicked a 43-yard field goal his third field goal of the game to seal the victory versus the upset-minded Mountaineers.
- Miami was ranked #14 in the Associated Press preseason top 25 and #16 in the USA TODAY Sports AFCA Coaches Poll released in August.
- Miami was ranked #18 in the final College Football Playoff rankings of 2020; it was UM's second time being included in the final CFP rankings.
- For head coach Manny Diaz, 2021 will mark a return to his roots as the program's defensive signal caller and defensive coordinator. Diaz was hired by
 Mark Richt in 2016 as the program's defensive coordinator, a role he served in for three seasons before being named head coach in January of 2019.
- In addition to re-assuming his role as defensive coordinator, Diaz hired Travaris Robinson former defensive coordinator at South Carolina to coach defensive backs, added Ishmael Aristide from Texas A&M to coach strikers and promoted DeMarcus Van Dyke from recruiting operations to coach corners. Diaz also brought back defensive line coach Jess Simpson, who spent the previous two years as d-line coach of the Atlanta Falcons.
- Several Miami Hurricanes were selected as preseason candidates for major college football awards; in addition to King, who was named a candidate
 for nearly every offensive award, Miami had Bubba Bolden named to the Thorpe Award watch list, Will Mallory to the Mackey Award, Lou Hedley to
 the Ray Guy Award, Mike Harley to the Biletnikoff Award, both Zion Nelson and Jarrid Williams to the Outland Trophy watch list, and others.
- Miami has more production returning than all but three Power 5 programs in America (Arizona State, UCLA, Rutgers) at 91%; the national average of
 returning production from 2020 into 2021 was 76.7% across FBS. UM was the only team in the ACC to rank in the top 25 of FBS returning production.

QUICH HITS

CANES HOST BLUE DEVILS AT HARD ROCK

- Miami continues its home slate with a nonconference matchup against Central Connecticut State on Sat., Sept. 25. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m. on RSN.
- Saturday's meeting at Hard Rock Stadium is the first ever between the two programs.
- The Hurricanes did not compete against an FCS team in the 2020 season; Miami's last game against an FCS team was Sept. 14, 2019 versus Bethune-Cookman, a 63-0 win - **Manny Diaz**'s first as head coach of the Hurricanes
- The Hurricanes finished 4-1 at home in 2020 and are 25-7 in 32 regular season home games since Manny Diaz joined the UM staff as defensive coordinator in 2016.

RETURN OF THE KING IN CORAL GABLES

- After recovery from reconstructive surgery on a torn ACL and meniscus in his right knee suffered in Miami's 2020 bowl game, **D'Eriq King** made the 14th start of his UM career against Michigan State on Sept. 18 at Hard Rock Stadium.
- King is responsible for more than 10,000 yards in his collegiate career: 8,378 passing yards, 2,055 rushing yards, 520 receiving yards, 29 punt return yards and 260 kick return yards - a total of 11,242 yards.
- King spent the first four seasons of his career at Houston; the Manvel, Texas native was selected to the watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Award and Maxwell Award this preseason.

'TURNOVER CHAIN' ICONIC ACROSS CFB

- Since the unveiling of the Turnover Chain during the 2017 season, Miami has ranked among the leaders in all of Power 5 in turnovers forced over the last four seasons.
- Entering the 2021 season, the Hurricanes were tied with lowa and Syracuse with 92 turnovers forced since the chain's inception
 the third-most in Power 5, behind only
 Clemson (97) and Alabama (95).
- The Hurricanes' average of 1.84 turnovers forced per game since the unveiling of the chain is also the third-most among all Power 5 teams
- Miami's newest chain featuring a sapphire-encrusted helmet charm made its debut in the season opener vs. Alabama.

CANES HOST CCSU BLUE DEVILS AT HARD ROCK STADIUM SATURDAY

- Miami continues its early-season home stretch on Sat., Sept. 25 against Central Connecticut State at Hard Rock Stadium. Kickoff for the matchup is set for 12:30 p.m. with broadcast slated for RSN.
- After opening its season against #1/#1 Alabama in Atlanta, Miami is in the midst of a four-game home stretch followed by a bye week - 41 days will have elapsed in between non-home games for the Hurricanes. Miami's next scheduled road game - its first of the year - is Oct. 16 at North Carolina.
- · The Hurricanes are matching up with the Blue Devils for the first time in program history on Saturday.
- Head coach Manny Diaz is entering his third season at the helm in Coral Gables; Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 record in 2020, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play. Miami won seven games in ACC play for just the second time in program history in 2020 - UM finished 7-1 in ACC play in 2017.
- UM's game versus the Spartans is slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM, WMYM 990 AM & WVUM 90.5.

LAST TIME OUT: UM FALLS SHORT DESPITE RAMBO'S RECORD-TYING DAY

- The Hurricanes dropped their home matchup with Michigan State, 38-17, on Sept. 18 at Hard Rock Stadium. UM took an early lead but the Spartans put together a 21-point fourth quarter for a road win.
- WR Charleston Rambo enjoyed a record-tying day for the Hurricanes, matching the program's singlegame record with 12 receptions. Rambo finished with a career-high 156 yards and two touchdowns.
- QB D'Eriq King threw for 388 yards and set Miami's single-game mark for both completions (38) and attempts (59). He threw for two touchdowns - both to Rambo - and two interceptions in the defeat.
- Making his first start of the season, LB Waynmon Steed posted eight tackles and his first career sack.
 Miami finished with three sacks, including one each from LB Corey Flagg and DE Chantz Williams.
- K **Andy Borregales** had the longest field goal by a freshman in UM history a 55-yarder in the loss.

RUN IT BACK: MIAMI AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED 2021 TEAMS

- By nearly every metric, the Hurricanes entered 2021 as one of the nation's most experienced groups.
 QB D'Eriq King's December 2020 announcement regarding his plans to return for another year spurred a flurry of similar announcements from veterans across offense, defense and special teams.
- The Hurricanes returned 19 of 22 starters on offense and defense; Miami only lost TE Brevin Jordan (Houston Texans, fifth round), DE Jaelan Phillips (Miami Dolphins, first round) and DE Quincy Roche (Pittsburgh Steelers, sixth round) to the 2021 NFL Draft, as well as K Jose Borregales on special teams.
- According to Bill Connelly of ESPN, Miami returns 91% of its production from 2020 into 2021 the
 highest of any program in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the fourth-most among any Power 5
 program and the 13th-most in FBS. The national average for all of FBS entering 2021 was 76.7%.

2021 HURRICANES ALSO FEATURE NEW FACES, FIRST-TIME STARTERS

- In addition to several key returners, the Miami Hurricanes have seen several newcomers and first-year starters feature through the first two games of the season on offense, defense and special teams.
- Miami's offense has featured three new starters so far this season: WR Key'Shawn Smith, who saw limited action as a backup last year, WR Charleston Rambo, who transferred from Oklahoma and is in his first year at The U, and OL Jalen Rivers, who has started left guard in the first three games of 2021.
- In addition to those three players, OL **Justice Oluwaseun** a UNLV transfer has made two starts.
- On defense, LB Corey Flagg and LB Keontra Smith both started through the first two games of the season - Smith was injured versus App State. DE Zach McCloud and DE Jahfari Harvey are in their first full seasons as starters; both started in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl for the first time at defensive end.
- On special teams, K Andy Borregales took over for older brother Jose, who won the Lou Groza in 2021
 as the nation's top kicker. Borregales had the game-winning 43-yard field goal versus App State.
- 13 Hurricanes have made their debuts through two games in 2021, including eight true freshmen.

SMITH OFF TO FAST START IN YEAR TWO, AMONG LEADERS AT WIDEOUT

- After seeing limited action in 2020 and finishing his true freshman season with just two catches,
 WR Key'Shawn Smith has played a big role for the Hurricanes' offense early on in 2021.
- Smith earned a starting wide receiver spot after a strong offseason, and been up to the task with 12 catches totaling 160 yards through the first three games of the season. Last time out against Michigan State, Smith finished with four catches totaling 50 yards. He has at least 40 yards in every game.
- Against App State, Smith had a game-high 70 yards on four receptions including one acrobatic grab.
- Originally a Washington State signee, Smith was able to join the Hurricanes after a coaching change in Pullman. A native of San Diego, the young speedster totaled 46 catches for 808 yards as a HS senior.
- Headlined by Smith, Miami's group of four second-year freshmen wide receivers have combined for 13
 catches and 186 yards in 2021; last year, the quartet totaled six catches for a combined 66 yards.



THE KING IS BACK IN CORAL GABLES: D'ERIQ HAS BEEN PROLIFIC AS QB

- After a dominant first season in Coral Gables, QB D'Eriq King announced his plans to return to the Hurricanes in 2021 on Dec. 26, 2020 - just before Miami's appearance in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl.
- King, who tore the ACL and meniscus in his right knee during the bowl, is fully recovered from the injury. He started the first three games of the season under center before a shoulder injury in Game 3.
- King, who set Miami's single-season mark for completion percentage a year ago at 64.1, broke Miami's single-game passing record for completions (38) and attempts (59) last time out vs. Michigan State.
- King spent the first four seasons of his career at the University of Houston; 2021 marks the first time since high school he has had the same coordinator in back-to-back years (**Rhett Lashlee**).
- The veteran entered 2021 as one of just 11 quarterbacks in FBS with more than 30 career starts at QB.
- King was named a preseason watch list for several major awards, including the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Davey O'Brien Award (top quarterback) and the Maxwell Award (player of the year).
- The Manvel, Texas native is responsible for more than 11,000 yards during his illustrious career 8,378 passing yards, 2,055 rushing yards, 520 receiving yards, 29 punt return yards and 260 kick return yards a total of 11,242 yards. He totaled 3,224 yards (2,686 passing, 538 rushing) at Miami in 2020.
- King set an FBS record with at least one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown in 16 straight games, a streak that ended at Louisville in 2020; he bested Florida QB Tim Tebow's FBS record (15).
- King became the first Miami QB in history to rush for 100 yards in a game in a win at NC State in 2020.
- King had a prolific career with the Cougars, totaling 82 total touchdowns (50 passing, 28 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return), 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards in just 22 starts.
- King became the first player in Houston history to throw a touchdown, catch a touchdown and return a kickoff for a touchdown in the same game when he managed the feat for Houston at Texas State.

DEFENSE RANKS IN TOP 10 IN TFLs THROUGH FIRST THREE GAMES

- Miami Football fans witness a familiar sight on Saturdays this fall as Manny Diaz assumed his
 responsibilities as playcaller and defensive coordinator; Diaz was coordinator at UM from 2016- 2019.
- Miami was one of just 11 teams in FBS and the only one from ACC to record 10 tackles for loss in Week 1.
- UM posted another eight tackles for loss in a win against App State, with DT **Nesta Jade Silvera** leading the way with 2.0. 11 players have at least one TFL this year, with Jared-Harrison Hunte (3.5) leading UM.
- The Hurricanes defense has featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss for three straight years; **Jaelan Phillips** (15.5) in 2020, **Gregory Rousseau** (19.5) in 2019 and **Jonathan Garvin** (18.0) in 2018.
- Including Diaz's time as head coach, Miami has had multiple defensive players record double-digit tackles for loss in four of his five seasons at The U, including Phillips (15.5) and Quincy Roche (14.5) a season ago.
- The Hurricanes are the only team since Diaz's arrival to Coral Gables in 2016 to rank among the top five in all of FBS in tackles for loss each year; Miami was No. 4 in 2020 (8.6 per game), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2020 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3). So far, Miami ranks No. 10 in FBS at 8.7 per game.

RESTREPO SEEING INCREASED ROLE IN SECOND YEAR IN OFFENSE

- Second-year WR Xavier Restrepo hauled in a career-high three passes totaling 55 yards, including the
 first score of his career on a 29-yard contested catch vs. Alabama on a connection with QB D'Eriq King.
- Restrepo added an 18-yard catch versus App State last time out; he had just one 12-yard catch in 2020.
- Through three games this season, Restrepo has totaled five catches for 80 yards with one touchdown.

"BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!" NEWEST CHAIN COMES OUT VS. BAMA

- When DL Jordan Miller recovered a fumble in the third quarter of Miami's season opener versus Alabama, fans across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain - version 5.0 for 2021.
- The chain has previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017), Sebastian the Ibis (2018), the notorious '305' Miami area code (2019) and the famous school logo inside the state of Florida (2020). The newest charm, in the shape of a Miami helmet, weighs one kilogram and is encrusted with 2,754 sapphires. The chain itself is 34 inches long and weighs roughly 3.5 kilograms.
- The chain took roughly three and a half months to complete, and was designed by famed jeweler
 Anthony "AJ the Jeweler" Machado. He is the architecht behind all five chains and "Touchdown Rings."
- From the start of 2017 the year of unveiling of the first turnover chain thorugh 2020, UM is tied for third among all Power 5 programs in turnovers forced (92) and ranks No. 3 in turnovers forced per game (1.84).

RAMBO'S 12-CATCH GAME TIED FOR BEST OUTPUT IN MIAMI HISTORY

- When WR **Charleston Rambo** put together a dominant performacne against Michigan State on Sept. 18, he managed a feat that had done only twice in Miami history: 12 receptions in a single game.
- Rambo became the first Hurricane to haul in 12 catches since Phillip Dorsett did it versus USF in 2012, and only the third Hurricane ever. Rambo's 12 catches were the most he ever had in any college game, and his 156 receiving yards bested his previous high of 122, set in 2019 versus Texas Tech at Oklahoma.
- Rambo has started all three games at wide receiver and leads Miami with 24 catches and 242 yards.

MIAMI'S STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE RANKS AMONG TOUGHEST IN NATION

• Through three games, TeamRankings.com scored Miami's strength of schedule as a 10.1 - the sixth-highest such mark in the nation. The Hurricanes' strength of schedule ranking only trails Georgia (14.2), Clemson (13.1), Alabama (12.6) and Penn State (11.8) and Ohio State (10.9) in all of FBS.

BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES HITS LONGEST KICKER EVER BY A FROSH

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres** "**Andy" Borregales** entered his true freshman season at The U as Miami's starting placekicker for 2021.
- Last time out, Andy connected on a 55-yard field goal that was the longest by a freshman in UM history.
- Andy connected on his lone two field goal attempts and one extra point attempt versus Alabama in the opener; he hit from 38 yards out at the end of the first half and also converted from 27 yards in the loss.
- The freshman went 3-for-4 vs. App State, including the game-winning 43-yard field goal with 2:04 left.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, finishing 20-for-22 on field goal attempts and a perfect 37-for-37 on extra point attempts. He passed on #30 to his brother.

MIAMI SET FBS RECORD FOR NET PUNTING, HEDLEY OFF TO GOOD START

- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation's top punter a year ago, P Lou Hedley delivered one of the best seasons by a punter in FBS history in 2020 - his second year with the Miami Hurricanes.
- UM set the FBS record (minimum 40 punts) for net punting with an average of 44.96 yards per punt, besting the mark by San Diego State in 1996 (44.94). Hedley ranked second in FBS in punting (47.3).
- Hedley was named to the All-America Second Team by the Associated Press and the All-ACC Second Team.
 A former Australian Rules Football player, the 28-year-old Hedley hails from Mandurah Australia.
- The veteran averaged 47.4 yards on five punts versus Alabama with a long punt of 54 yards in Atlanta.

VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE RANKS AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED

- The University of Miami entered the 2021 season with one of the nation's most experienced offensive lines in the nation. UM's 174 combined FBS OL starts are the second-most, trailing only Minnesota (190).
- The Hurricanes' offensive line features 10 players who have made at least one start at the FBS level.
- Among Miami's most battle-tested veterans include Navaughn Donaldson (37 starts), DJ Scaife (32), Jarrid Williams (30), Corey Gaynor (29), Jakai Clark (22), Justice Oluwaseun (23) and Zion Nelson (24).

BOLDEN ENJOYED BREAKOUT 2020 SEASON, NOW A THORPE CANDIDATE

- One of Miami's top defenders last season was S Bubba Bolden, who started eight of 11 games and led the Hurricanes with 74 tackles at the end of the year. Bolden was named to the 2020 All-ACC Second Team.
- Through three games, Bolden ranks first in total tackles (23) and has 2.5 tackles for loss and two PBUs.
- Last year, Bolden was announced as one of just 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award honoring the nation's top defensive back back. Bolden was the lone Thorpe Award semifinalist from the ACC.
- Bolden, who had just 11 tackes in an injury-shortened 2019 season, was one of three representatives from Miami to attend ACC Kickoff in Charlotte, the conference's annual media day features coaches and players.
- In Miami's game at #1 Clemson a year ago, Bolden totaled 10 tackles, two blocked field goals and a forced fumble. He won his second ACC Defensive Back of the Week Award for his performance against the Tigers.
- Bolden, who starred at national power Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas during his high school career, spent his freshman year of 2017 at Southern Cal before transferring to the Hurricanes prior to the 2019 season.

TRANSFER PORTAL ADDITIONS HAVE PLAYED BIG ROLES IN EARLY GOING

- Miami added several important players via transfer portal once again this offseason, including CB Tyrique Stevenson (from Georgia), WR Charleston Rambo (from Oklahoma), DE Deandre Johnson (from Tennesee) and OL Justice Oluwaseun (from UNLV). All have factored heavily into Mlami's first two games.
- Stevenson ranks third on the Hurricanes with 16 total tackles, while Rambo leads Miami with 24 catches totaling 242 yards. Oluwaseun has started the last two games on the offensive line for the Hurricanes.

LASHLEE'S "POWER SPREAD" OFFENSE PAID DIVIDENDS IN YEAR ONE

- In his first year as Miami's offensive coordinator, **Rhett Lashlee**'s installation of an up-tempo "power spread" offense made a clear impact for Miami. Lashlee joined the Hurricanes in January 2020 from SMU.
- Teaming up with QB **D'Eriq King**, the Hurricanes shot up the NCAA leaderboards in nearly every category.
 2021 will mark the first time since high school King will have the same coordinator two straight years.
- In Lashlee's first season as coordinator in Coral Gables, the Hurricanes jumped to No. 32 in FBS in total
 offense (from No. 98), No. 29 in passing offense (from No. 52), No. 26 in scoring offense (from No. 90), No.
 17 in red zone offense (from No. 122) and No. 20 in first downs gained offense (from No. 84).

- WR **Michael Harley** delivered the best season of his career in Miami's new up-tempo offense a year ago, hauling in a career-high, team-best 57 receptions for a team-high 799 receiving yards with seven TDs.
- A third-team All-ACC selection, Harley set career marks in every category, nearly eclipsing his first three season totals combined. In his first three years at The U, Harley had 68 catches, 816 yards and three TDs.
- Harley has 133 career receptions, which ranks as the seventh-most in the history of Miami Football. In 2020, Harley moved past Phillip Dorsett (121) and Allen Hurns (121) into eighth place in the record books.
- Harley had four receptions last time out to jump Leonard Hankerson into sixth place in Miami history.

The duo was part of a recruiting class ranked No. 9 in the nation by ESPN.

MALLORY NEXT UP AT TIGHT END U, CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY

- Following the departure of TE **Brevin Jordan**, who declared for the NFL after a standout career at UM, veteran **Will Mallory** is next in line to carry the torch for the tight end factory that is Miami Football.
- Mallory has flashed the ability to be a dominant figure during his three seasons at The U; during a three-game injury absence for Jordan last year, Mallory totaled 10 catches, 187 yards and three TDs.
- In his three seasons entering 2021, Mallory has totaled 43 receptions, 659 yards and seven TDs four in 2020 alone. This season, Mallory has eight catches totaling 64 yards in the first three starts of 2021.
- A football legacy, Mallory's grandfather Bill Mallory is the winningest coach in Indiana University history. His father, Mike, spent last season as assistant special teams coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

VETERAN BACK HARRIS NAMED ONE OF COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S "FREAKS"

- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** cracked the annual "Freaks" list from college football writer Bruce Feldman of The Athletic, who named Harris No. 50 in his list of the top 100 freaky athletes in the sport entering 2021.
- Harris ran for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns in his first three seasons with the Hurricanes.
- Harris leads the Hurricanes with 172 rushing yards in three games, averaging 4.2 yards per carry.

"In three seasons Harris has run for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns. At 5-10, 214 pounds, he hit 23.07 MPH, which is one of the fastest speeds registered by anyone, college or pro, in game action. His 75-yard touchdown run against Louisville is a good example of that burst. His 3-cone time of 6.88 would've topped any running back at the 2020 combine. Harris also squats 525 pounds and benches 365."

EVERYBODY EATS - TACKLES FOR LOSS NUMBERS RANK AMONG BEST

- Since **Manny Diaz**'s arrival as defensive coordinator in 2016, Miami has had 24 individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss in a game, including multiple such performances by UM's starting ends in 2020.
- Miami was one of just 12 teams in FBS to record 10 tackles for loss or more in Week 1 across the country.
- UM had two defensive ends selected in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft: **Jaelan Phillips**, selected by the Miami Dolphins, and **Gregory Rousseau**, selected by the Buffalo Bills after sitting out 2020.
- The Canes have ranked in the top five in the country in tackles for loss in all five of Diaz's years at UM.
- UM led FBS in tackles for loss in 2018, averaging 10.5 per game in Diaz's final year as coordinator.
- The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in tackles for loss in 2017 (8.5 per game) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3).

HURRICANES SIGN RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- The Hurricanes reeled in a top-10 recruiting class in 2021, nabbing signatures from 10 ESPN top 300 prospects and 10 players ranked in the 247Sports Composite Top 247. UM's class was rated #9 by ESPN.
- Miami signed 21 prospects during the early signing period, with 18 of them hailing from the state of Florida. 15 of those 21 players call either Miami-Dade, Broward or Palm Beach County home.
- The Hurricanes signed 10 players ranked in the Rivals' top 250 prospects for the Class of 2021.
- Four members were named to the Adidas All-American Bowl while another five players were named to the Under Armour All-America Game. Miami signed two five-star recruits for the first time since 2012.

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2021 NFL Draft: **Jaelan Phillips** (first round, Miami), **Gregory Rousseau** (first round, Buffalo), **Brevin Jordan** (fifth round, Houston) and **Quincy Roche** (sixth round, Pittsburgh.). For 47 consecutive years, Miami has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft. With Phillips off the board at No. 18 and Rousseau at No. 30, Miami had two first-round selections for the first time since 2015. The Hurricanes had at least one defensive end drafted for the fifth straight year.
- The University of Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000 (123). No program in the ACC had more alumni on NFL 53-man rosters than the Hurricanes did entering Week 1 of the 2020 NFL season, when Miami boasted 31 former players and more who were on practice squads. Miami had 25 players on active 53-man rosters as of the roster cutting deadline entering 2021.

MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (THIRD OVERALL) | 15-12

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

In his most recent season as head coach of the Hurricanes in 2020, Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 overall record, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play, and an appearance in the Cheez-It Bowl. Miami won seven games in ACC play for the second time with Diaz on staff (2017) and the third time overall.

During his 20-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 19 bowl games, amassing a 13-6 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories,

including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
