THE GAME

- The Miami Hurricanes return home for a matchup with ACC foe North Carolina State at Hard Rock Stadium on Oct. 23. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN 2** with Anish Shroff (ppp), Mike Golic, Jr. (color) and Taylor McGregor (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (ppp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 20th season together while Josh Darrow manages the sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (ppp) and Jose Martinez (color) will carry the game live on **Mundial 990AM** from Hard Rock Stadium. **WVUM 90.5 FM** will also broadcast.

THE SERIES

- Saturday's game vs. NC State is the 17th matchup in the history of the series; UM leads the series 10-5-1, including a 6-4-1 lead in games in Miami.
- The Hurricanes are looking for their fourth straight win over the Wolfpack; Miami topped NC State, 44-41, in Raleigh, N.C., last season on Nov. 6, 2020.
- UM has not lost to NC State since 2008, though the teams have matched up just three times since. The Pack have not traveled to Miami since 2012.
- Since joining the ACC, Miami has won four of six meetings vs. NC State (2004, 2012, 2016, 2020), with its two losses coming in 2007 and 2008.

THE HURRICANES

- The Miami Hurricanes returned 19 of 22 starters from a 2020 team that finished 8-3 overall and 7-2 in Atlantic Coast Conference play. The Canes, who ended the year in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl, became the third Miami team to win seven games in ACC play since joining the conference in 2004.
- On Oct. 11, head coach **Manny Diaz** announced starting QB **D'Eriq King** would miss the rest of the season due to shoulder surgery resulting from an injury versus Michigan State. In his first season as starting quarterback, King finished with 2,686 passing yards, 538 rushing yards and 27 total TDs.
- Last time out against UNC (Oct. 16), Miami mounted an impressive comeback but fell, 45-42, to the host Tar Heels. Making the third start of his collegiate career in place of King, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 264 yards and one touchdown, while RB **Jaylan Knighton** had three touchdowns.
- Knighton was named ACC Rookie of the Week for his performance against the Heels, where he finished with 165 all-purpose yards and three scores.
- In its home opener on Sept. 11, the Hurricanes won against Appalachian State. Trailing 23-22 with less than five minutes remaining, freshman K **Andy Borregales** kicked a 43-yard field goal - his third made field goal of the game - to seal the victory versus the upset-minded Mountaineers.
- For head coach **Manny Diaz**, 2021 marks a return to his roots as the program's defensive signal caller and defensive coordinator. Diaz was hired by Mark Richt in 2016 as the program's defensive coordinator, a role he served in for three seasons before being named head coach in January of 2019.
- In addition to re-assuming his role as defensive coordinator, Diaz hired **Travaris Robinson** - former defensive coordinator at South Carolina - to coach defensive backs, added **Ishmael Aristide** from Texas A&M to coach strikers and promoted **DeMarcus Van Dyke** from recruiting operations to coach corners. Diaz also brought back defensive line coach **Jess Simpson**, who spent the previous two years as d-line coach of the Atlanta Falcons.
- Several Miami Hurricanes were selected as preseason candidates for major college football awards; in addition to King, who was named a candidate for nearly every offensive award, Miami had **Bubba Bolden** named to the Thorpe Award watch list, **Will Mallory** to the Mackey Award, **Lou Hedley** to the Ray Guy Award, **Mike Harley** to the Biletnikoff Award, both **Zion Nelson** and **Jarrid Williams** to the Outland Trophy watch list, and others.
- Miami had more production returning than all but three Power 5 programs in America (Arizona State, UCLA, Rutgers) at 91%; the national average of returning production from 2020 into 2021 was 76.7% across FBS. UM was the only team in the ACC to rank in the top 25 of FBS returning production.

THREE AND OUT

MIAMI HOSTS WOLFPACK AT HARD ROCK

- The Miami Hurricanes host ACC Atlantic foe NC State at Hard Rock Stadium on Sat., Oct. 23. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. on ESPN 2.
- Miami is matching up with NC State for the second straight year, but is welcoming the Wolfpack to South Florida for the first time since 2012, when Miami emerged with a 44-37 win late on a record-setting day from QB Stephen Morris. UM has won three in a row over NC State dating to that game.
- Saturday's game will mark Miami's fifth home game through the first eight weeks of the season; UM has played just one game on the road and has played one neutral site game in 2021.

KING, HARRIS TO MISS REST OF SEASON

- After recovery from reconstructive surgery on a torn ACL and meniscus in his right knee suffered in Miami's 2020 bowl game, **D'Eriq King** made the 14th start of his UM career against Michigan State.
- King hurt his shoulder in Miami's game against the Spartans and missed the first two starts of his career. Head coach **Manny Diaz** announced on Oct. 11 that King would miss the remainder of the season due to shoulder surgery.
- On Monday, Oct. 18, Diaz announced starting RB **Cam/Ron Harris** would miss the remainder of the 2021 season due to a lower extremity injury suffered in Miami's game against North Carolina.

2001 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS HONORED

- The University of Miami will host a 20-year reunion for the 2001 national champion Miami Hurricanes during their game against NC State on Oct. 23.
- Widely regarded as one of the greatest teams in college football history, more than 50 representatives from that team - including head coach Larry Coker, former players, assistant coaches and support staff, are expected to attend Saturday's game against the Wolfpack.
- Saturday's game marks the second reunion of the year for a Miami title team; UM celebrated the 30-year reunion of the 1991 national championship team during its contest with Michigan State on Sept. 18.

MIAMI HOSTS PACK AT HARD ROCK STADIUM FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2012

- Coming off a heartbreaking 45-42 loss at North Carolina last time out, the Miami Hurricanes return home for a matchup with NC State on Saturday, Oct. 23. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. on ESPN 2.
- The Hurricanes are matching up with the Wolfpack for the second straight year but only the fourth time since 2012. UM is riding a three-game winning streak over NC State heading into Saturday.
- After opening its season against Alabama in Atlanta on Sept. 4, Miami ended a four-game homestand on Sept. 30 vs. Virginia followed by an open date before playing North Carolina in Chapel Hill, N.C. on Oct. 16. 41 days elapsed between the Hurricanes' two games away from home through six games.
- Head coach **Manny Diaz** is currently in his third season at the helm in Coral Gables; Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 record in 2020, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play. Miami won seven games in ACC play for just the second time in program history in 2020 - UM finished 7-1 in ACC play in 2017.
- UM's game versus the Wolfpack is slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM, WMYM 990 AM & WVUM 90.5.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI DROPS 45-42 HEARTBREAKER IN CHAPEL HILL

- The Hurricanes fell in crushing fashion for the second straight game last time out, nearly erasing an 18-point deficit but ultimately falling to North Carolina, 45-42, at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, making the third start of his Miami career in place of an injured QB **D'Eriq King**, finished 20-for-45 for 264 yards with one touchdown and three interceptions in the loss to UNC.
- Van Dyke marched UM into the red zone with a chance to win the game on Miami's final drive of the game in the fourth quarter, but UNC recorded an interception with fewer than 15 seconds remaining.
- RB **Jaylan Knighton** had the best outing of his career against the Tar Heels, finishing with 165 all-purpose yards and three total touchdowns. He was named ACC Rookie of the Week for his efforts.
- DE **Jahfari Harvey** had the first pick-six by a Miami Hurricane since Romeo Finley in 2018, tying the game 7-7 in the first quarter on an interception. LB **Keontra Smith** added two sacks on defense after missing the previous three games with a leg injury. STRK **Amari Carter** led Miami with eight tackles.

A LOOK BACK: HURRICANES TOPPED PACK, 44-41, IN 2020 THRILLER

- On Nov. 6, 2020, Miami won its third straight game with a come-from-behind 44-41 victory at NC State. The Hurricanes were trailing by 10 points in the fourth quarter but emerged with a road victory.
- QB **D'Eriq King** had one of the best performances ever by a Miami quarterback in last year's win; King became just the third ACC quarterback in history to throw for more than 400 yards (430) and rush for 100 yards (105). He added five touchdown passes - one short of the Miami single-game standard (6).
- King's 430 passing yards were the seventh most by a Miami QB in a single game in program history.
- The two ACC QBs to record 400/100 games were Louisville's Lamar Jackson and Clemson's Tajh Boyd.
- WR **Michael Harley** finished with eight catches and 153 yards, as well as two touchdowns in the win.

2021 HURRICANES HAVE FEATURED NEW FACES, FIRST-TIME STARTERS

- In addition to several key returners, the Miami Hurricanes have seen several newcomers and first-year starters feature through the first six games of the season on offense, defense and special teams.
- Miami's offense featured three new starters in the early going: WR **Key'Shawn Smith**, who saw limited action as a backup last year, WR **Charleston Rambo**, who transferred from Oklahoma and is in his first year at UM, and OL **Jalen Rivers**, who started at left guard but is out for the season to injury.
- In addition to those three players, OL **Justice Oluwaseun** - a UNLV transfer - has started, as has QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, who took over for QB **D'Eriq King** and has started the last three games under center.
- On defense, LB **Corey Flagg** has started all five games while LB **Keontra Smith** started through the first two games before an injury versus App State. DE **Zach McCloud** and DE **Jahfari Harvey** are in their first full seasons as starters; both started in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl for the first time at end.
- S **James Williams** made the first start of his career in a win over Central Connecticut State (Sept. 25) and has started three straight games. CB **Tyrique Stevenson** is also in his first year with the Canes.
- On special teams, K **Andy Borregales** took over for older brother Jose, who won the Lou Groza in 2021 as the nation's top kicker. Borregales had the game-winning 43-yard field goal versus App State.

D'ERIQ KING'S SEASON OVER DUE TO SURGERY FOR SHOULDER INJURY

- After a dominant first season in Coral Gables, QB **D'Eriq King** announced his plans to return to the Hurricanes in 2021 on Dec. 26, 2020 - just before Miami's appearance in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl.
- King, who tore the ACL and meniscus in his right knee during the bowl, fully recovered from the injury - but a shoulder injury vs. Michigan State on Sept. 18 forced him to undergo season-ending surgery.
- King, who set Miami's single-season mark for completion percentage a year ago at 64.1, broke Miami's single-game passing record for completions (38) and attempts (59) in the game versus the Spartans.



VAN DYKE PREPARING FOR FOURTH START OF CAREER VERSUS NC STATE

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** put together an impressive first start at quarterback, completing 10-of-11 passes for 270 yards and three touchdowns in Miami's 69-0 win over Central Connecticut State on Sept. 25.
- Van Dyke took over as starter after QB **D'Eriq King** suffered a season-ending injury on Sept. 18.
- Van Dyke followed up his performance with 203 passing yards on 15-for-29 passing with one touchdown and no interceptions in Miami's ACC opener against Virginia on Sept. 30. He has five touchdowns and three interceptions and is completing 52 percent of passes (45-for-86) for 737 yards.
- Despite splitting reps for the majority of the CCSU game with fellow QB **Jake Garcia**, Van Dyke's 270 passing yards were the third-most by a UM quarterback making the first start of his career since 1999.
- Van Dyke was rated a four-star prospect by ESPN and Rivals coming out of high school. He ranked No. 105 nationally in the ESPN300 and was rated as the No. 2 pro-style quarterback nationally by ESPN.
- The Glastonbury, Conn., native totaled over 4,600 yards and 39 passing touchdowns over his final two high school seasons. He was named 2019 New England Prep Player of the Year after his final season.

KING WAS POISED FOR BIG FINAL SEASON BEFORE SHOULDER INJURY

- QB **D'Eriq King** spent the first four seasons of his career at the University of Houston; 2021 marked the first time since high school he has had the same coordinator in back-to-back years (**Rhett Lashlee**).
- The veteran entered 2021 as one of just 11 quarterbacks in FBS with more than 30 career starts at QB.
- King was named a preseason watch list for several major awards, including the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Davey O'Brien Award (top quarterback) and the Maxwell Award (player of the year).
- The Manvel, Texas native is responsible for more than 11,000 yards during his illustrious career - 8,378 passing yards, 2,055 rushing yards, 520 receiving yards, 29 punt return yards and 260 kick return yards - a total of 11,242 yards. He totaled 3,224 yards (2,686 passing, 538 rushing) at Miami in 2020.
- King set an FBS record with at least one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown in 16 straight games, a streak that ended at Louisville in 2020; he bested Florida QB Tim Tebow's FBS record (15).
- King became the first Miami QB in history to rush for 100 yards in a game in a win at NC State in 2020.
- King had a prolific career with the Cougars, totaling 82 total touchdowns (50 passing, 28 rushing, three receiving, one kickoff return), 4,925 passing yards and 1,421 rushing yards in just 22 starts.
- King became the first player in Houston history to throw a touchdown, catch a touchdown and return a kickoff for a touchdown in the same game when he managed the feat for Houston at Texas State.

UM'S STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE RANKED NINTH-TOUGHEST IN NATION

- Through Week 7, ESPN's Football Power Index (FPI) ranked Miami's strength of schedule as the ninth-toughest in the nation and second-highest in the ACC, trailing only Clemson, who ranked sixth.

'ROOSTER' PREPARING FOR ROLE AS LEAD BACK AFTER HARRIS INJURY

- After RB **Cam'Ron Harris** suffered a season-ending leg injury in a loss to North Carolina on Oct. 16, RB **Jaylon Knighton** is preparing for his role as the lead running back in the Miami offense for the first time.
- Nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Mon., Oct. 18 after posting the best outing of his career at North Carolina. Knighton totaled 165 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns.
- Knighton played in nine games and made two starts in his first year of college football in 2020 but was suspended for the first four games of 2021 due to a violation of team rules. He returned versus Virginia.
- Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect by all major scouting services. He was listed as the No. 88 player in the ESPN300 and rated the No. 11 running back nationally and No. 15 player in Florida by ESPN.

RUN IT BACK: MIAMI AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED 2021 TEAMS

- By nearly every metric, the Hurricanes entered 2021 as one of the nation's most experienced groups. QB **D'Eriq King**'s December 2020 announcement regarding his plans to return for another year spurred a flurry of similar announcements from veterans across offense, defense and special teams.
- The Hurricanes returned 19 of 22 starters on offense and defense; Miami only lost TE Brevin Jordan (Houston Texans, fifth round), DE Jaelan Phillips (Miami Dolphins, first round) and DE Quincy Roche (Pittsburgh Steelers, sixth round) to the 2021 NFL Draft, as well as K Jose Borregales on special teams.
- According to Bill Connelly of ESPN, Miami returned 91% of its production from 2020 into 2021 - the highest of any program in the Atlantic Coast Conference, the fourth-most among any Power 5 program and the 13th-most in FBS. The national average for all of FBS entering 2021 was 76.7%.

FRESHMEN "EAT" AT MIAMI: FROSH SCORED EVERY POINT AGAINST UNC

- Miami's group of freshmen showed off their playmaking ability in its 45-42 loss to North Carolina; the Hurricanes group - comprised of true freshmen like RB **Cody Brown**, second-year freshmen like RB **Jaylan Knighton** and third-year redshirt freshmen like DE **Jahfari Harvey** - were responsible for every point scored vs. UNC. Knighton led Miami with three touchdowns while K **Andy Borregales** had two field goals.
- Second-year freshman QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for one touchdown and 264 yards in his first road start.
- Miami true freshmen showed off in a 69-0 win over Central Connecticut State on Sept. 25; the Hurricanes group of first-year players finished with 411 total yards of offense and combined for six touchdowns.
- Brown two touchdowns while RB **Thad Franklin**, WR **Romello Brinson**, WR **Jacolby George** and WR **Brashard Smith** each finished with one score. Smith led the way with 126 all-purpose yards.
- QB **Jake Garcia** finished 11-for-14 for 147 yards with two touchdown passes and had a 45-yard rush. Garcia split reps with Van Dyke, who started and finished with 270 passing yards and three touchdowns.



"BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!" NEWEST CHAIN COMES OUT VS. BAMA

- When DL **Jordan Miller** recovered a fumble in the third quarter of Miami's season opener vs. Alabama, fans across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain - version 5.0 for 2021.
- The chain has previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017), Sebastian the Ibis (2018), the notorious '305' Miami area code (2019) and the famous school logo inside the state of Florida (2020). The newest charm, in the shape of a Miami helmet, weighs one kilogram and is encrusted with 2,754 sapphires. The fifth iteration of the chain is 34 inches long and weighs 3.5 kilograms (with no charm).
- The chain took roughly three and a half months to complete, and was designed by famed jeweler Anthony "AJ the Jeweler" Machado. He is the architect behind all five chains and "Touchdown Rings."
- From the start of 2017 - the year of unveiling of the first turnover chain - through 2020, UM was tied for third among all Power 5 programs in turnovers forced (92) and ranks No. 3 in turnovers forced per game (1.84).

'THREE AMIGOS' SHOWING PROMISE AT WR IN FIRST SEASONS AT MIAMI

- Miami boasted three of the top-rated wide receivers in the Class of 2021: **Romello Brinson**, **Jacolby George** and **Brashard Smith**. All three freshmen scored TDs in Miami's win over Central Conn. State.
- The trio of wide receivers has been nicknamed the 'Three Amigos' - the three are close friends and live together with QB **Jake Garcia**. The trio combined for nine catches, 160 yards and three TDs vs. CCSU.
- All three are South Florida natives: Brinson and Smith are from Miami and George is from Fort Lauderdale.
- Both Brinson and George were ESPN300 prospects, while Smith was an Under Armour All-American.
- In a win over CCSU, Brinson had a one-handed catch in the end zone that made several national highlight reels as one of the top plays of Week 4. Smith showed off his speed with a 75-yard touchdown, while George - making his collegiate debut - was on the receiving end of a 44-yard scoring pass from Garcia.

FOUR STARTERS OUT FOR YEAR ON OFFENSE, INCLUDING TOP O-LINEMEN

- In addition to its two most productive offensive players in QB **D'Eriq King** and RB **Cam'Ron Harris**, the Hurricanes will miss team captain and center **Corey Gaynor** and left guard **Jalen Rivers** for the season.

RAMBO THE LATEST GREAT ADDITION FROM TRANSFER PORTAL FOR UM

- When WR **Charleston Rambo** put together a dominant performance against Michigan State on Sept. 18, he managed a feat that had been done only twice in Miami history: 12 receptions in a single game.
- Rambo became the first Hurricane to haul in 12 catches since Phillip Dorsett did it versus USF in 2012, and only the third Hurricane ever. Rambo's 12 catches were the most he ever had in any college game, and his 156 receiving yards bested his previous high of 122, set in 2019 versus Texas Tech at Oklahoma.
- Rambo has started all six games at wide receiver and leads Miami with 35 catches and 422 yards.
- The Cedar Hills, Texas native is one of just four receivers in the ACC to have recorded 35 catches through Week 7. Rambo's average of 6.2 receptions per game ranks as the fifth-best mark in the conference.

HARLEY MOVING UP RECORD BROOKS IN CAREER RECEPTIONS, NOW 3RD

- WR **Michael Harley** delivered the best season of his career in Miami's new up-tempo offense a year ago, hauling in a career-high, team-best 57 receptions for a team-high 799 receiving yards with seven TDs.
- A third-team All-ACC selection, Harley set career marks in every category, nearly eclipsing his first three season totals combined. In his first three years at The U, Harley had 68 catches, 816 yards and three TDs.
- Harley has 150 career receptions, which ranks as the third-most in the history of Miami Football. In 2020, Harley moved past Phillip Dorsett (121) and Allen Hurns (121) into eighth place in the record books.
- Harley had four receptions against Michigan State to jump Leonard Hankerson into sixth place in UM history. With six receptions in Miami's game against Virginia, Harley moved all the way up to third place.

SMITH OFF TO FAST START IN YEAR TWO, HAD CAREER-GAME VERSUS UNC

- After seeing limited action in 2020 and finishing his true freshman season with just two catches, WR **Key'Shawn Smith** has played a big role for the Hurricanes' offense at the midpoint of 2021.
- Smith earned a starting wide receiver spot after a strong offseason, and been up to the task with 20 catches totaling 239 yards through the first six games of the season. In UM's game against Michigan State, Smith finished with four catches totaling 50 yards. He had a career-best seven catches last time out vs. UNC.
- Against App State, Smith had a game-high 70 yards on four receptions including one acrobatic grab.
- Originally a Washington State signee, Smith was able to join the Hurricanes after a coaching change in Pullman. A native of San Diego, the young speedster totaled 46 catches for 808 yards as a HS senior.

DEFENSE RANKS No. 15 IN FBS IN TFLs THROUGH FIRST SIX WEEKS OF 2021

- Miami Football fans witness a familiar sight on Saturdays this fall as **Manny Diaz** assumed his responsibilities as playcaller and defensive coordinator; Diaz was defensive coordinator at UM from 2016- 2019.
- Miami was one of just 11 teams in FBS and the only one from ACC to record 10 tackles for loss in Week 1.
- UM was tied for No. 15 in FBS tackles for loss after Week 7; Miami is averaging 7.2 tackles for loss per game.
- The Hurricanes defense has featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss for three straight years; **Jaelan Phillips** (15.5) in 2020, **Gregory Rousseau** (19.5) in 2019 and **Jonathan Garvin** (18.0) in 2018.
- Including Diaz's time as head coach, Miami has had multiple defensive players record double-digit tackles for loss in four of his five seasons at The U, including Phillips (15.5) and Quincy Roche (14.5) a season ago.
- The Hurricanes are the only team since Diaz's arrival to Coral Gables in 2016 to rank among the top five in all of FBS in tackles for loss each year; Miami was No. 4 in 2020 (8.6 per game), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2020 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3). So far, Miami ranks No. 10 in FBS at 8.7 per game.

RESTREPO SEEING INCREASED ROLE, HAD CAREER GAME VERSUS CCSU

- Second-year WR **Xavier Restrepo** hauled in three passes totaling 55 yards, including the first score of his career on a 29-yard contested catch vs. Alabama on a connection with QB **D'Eriq King** in Atlanta.
- In a win over CCSU, Restrepo had a career-high four catches totaling a career-best 75 yards, including a 42-yard catch. Restrepo added an 18-yard catch vs. App State; he had just one 12-yard catch in 2020.
- Through six games this season, Restrepo has totaled 12 catches for 236 yards with one touchdown.

BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES HITS LONGEST KICKER EVER BY A FROSH

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres "Andy" Borregales** entered his true freshman season at The U as Miami's starting placekicker for 2021.
- Earlier this year, Andy connected on a 55-yard field goal that was the longest by a freshman in UM history.
- After missing a kick off the uprights against Virginia as time expired in the fourth quarter, he rebounded with two field goals of 40+ yards last time out against UNC, hitting from both 44 yards and 42 yards.
- Andy connected on his lone two field goal attempts and one extra point attempt versus Alabama in the opener; he hit from 38 yards out at the end of the first half and also converted from 27 yards in the loss.
- The freshman went 3-for-4 vs. App State, including the game-winning 43-yard field goal with 2:04 left.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, finishing 20-for-22 on field goal attempts and a perfect 37-for-37 on extra point attempts. He passed on #30 to his brother.

MIAMI SET FBS RECORD FOR NET PUNTING, HEDLEY OFF TO GOOD START

- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation's top punter a year ago, P **Lou Hedley** delivered one of the best seasons by a punter in FBS history in 2020 - his second year with the Miami Hurricanes.
- UM set the FBS record (minimum 40 punts) for net punting with an average of 44.96 yards per punt, besting the mark by San Diego State in 1996 (44.94). Hedley ranked second in FBS in punting (47.3).
- Hedley was named to the All-America Second Team by the Associated Press and the All-ACC Second Team. A former Australian Rules Football player, the 28-year-old Hedley hails from Mandurah Australia.
- The veteran averaged 47.4 yards on five punts versus Alabama with a long punt of 54 yards in Atlanta.

VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE RANKS AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED

- The University of Miami entered the 2021 season with one of the nation's most experienced offensive lines in the nation. UM's 184 combined FBS OL starts are the second-most, trailing only Minnesota (205).
- The Hurricanes' offensive line features 10 players who have made at least one start at the FBS level.
- Among Miami's most battle-tested veterans include **Navaughn Donaldson** (38 starts), **DJ Scaife** (32), **Jarrid Williams** (31), **Corey Gaynor** (29), **Jakai Clark** (23), **Justice Oluwaseun** (24) and **Zion Nelson** (25).

BOLDEN ENJOYED BREAKOUT 2020 SEASON, HAS STARTED ALL SIX GAMES

- One of Miami's top defenders last season was S **Bubba Bolden**, who started eight of 11 games and led the Hurricanes with 74 tackles at the end of the year. Bolden was named to the 2020 All-ACC Second Team.
- Through six games, Bolden ranks first in total tackles (41) and has 2.5 tackles for loss and two PBU's.
- Last year, Bolden was announced as one of just 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award honoring the nation's top defensive back back. Bolden was the lone Thorpe Award semifinalist from the ACC a season ago.
- Bolden, who had just 11 tackles in an injury-shortened 2019 season, was one of three representatives from Miami to attend ACC Kickoff in Charlotte, the conference's annual media day features coaches and players.
- In Miami's game at #1 Clemson a year ago, Bolden totaled 10 tackles, two blocked field goals and a forced fumble. He won his second ACC Defensive Back of the Week Award for his performance against the Tigers.
- Bolden, who starred at national power Bishop Gorman in Las Vegas during his high school career, spent his freshman year of 2017 at Southern Cal before transferring to the Hurricanes prior to the 2019 season.

TRANSFER PORTAL ADDITIONS HAVE PLAYED BIG ROLES IN FIRST HALF

- Miami added several important players via transfer portal once again this offseason, including CB **Tyrique Stevenson** (from Georgia), WR **Charleston Rambo** (from Oklahoma), DE **Deandre Johnson** (from Tennessee) and OL **Justice Oluwaseun** (from UNLV). All have factored heavily into Miami's first half of the season.
- Stevenson has 23 tackles and three PBU's, while Rambo leads Miami with 35 catches totaling 422 yards.

LASHLEE'S "POWER SPREAD" OFFENSE PAID DIVIDENDS IN YEAR ONE

- In his first year as Miami's offensive coordinator, **Rhett Lashlee's** installation of an up-tempo "power spread" offense made a clear impact for Miami. Lashlee joined the Hurricanes in January 2020 from SMU.
- In Lashlee's first season as coordinator in Coral Gables, the Hurricanes jumped to No. 32 in FBS in total offense (from No. 98), No. 29 in passing offense (from No. 52), No. 26 in scoring offense (from No. 90), No. 17 in red zone offense (from No. 122) and No. 20 in first downs gained offense (from No. 84).

MALLORY NEXT UP AT TIGHT END U, CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY

- Following the departure of TE **Brevin Jordan**, who declared for the NFL after a standout career at UM, veteran **Will Mallory** is next in line to carry the torch for the tight end factory that is Miami Football. Mallory has flashed the ability to be a dominant figure during his three seasons at The U; during a three-game injury absence for Jordan last year, Mallory totaled 10 catches, 187 yards and three TDs.
- In his three seasons entering 2021, Mallory has totaled 43 receptions, 659 yards and seven TDs - four in 2020 alone.
- A football legacy, Mallory's grandfather Bill Mallory is the winningest coach in Indiana University history. His father, Mike, spent last season as assistant special teams coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

HURRICANES SIGN RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- The Hurricanes reeled in a top-10 recruiting class in 2021, nabbing signatures from 10 ESPN top 300 prospects and 10 players ranked in the 247Sports Composite Top 247. UM's class was rated #9 by ESPN. Miami signed 21 prospects during the early signing period, with 18 of them hailing from the state of Florida. 15 of those 21 players call either Miami-Dade, Broward or Palm Beach County home.
- The Hurricanes signed 10 players ranked in the Rivals' top 250 prospects for the Class of 2021.
- Four members were named to the Adidas All-American Bowl while another five players were named to the Under Armour All-America Game. Miami signed two five-star recruits for the first time since 2012.

VETERAN BACK HARRIS, NAMED ONE OF CFB'S "FREAKS", TO MISS REST OF SEASON WITH INJURY

- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** cracked the annual "Freaks" list from college football writer Bruce Feldman of The Athletic, who named Harris No. 50 in his list of the top 100 freaky athletes in the sport entering 2021. Harris ran for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns in his first three seasons with the Hurricanes.
- Harris suffered a season-ending injury last time out against North Carolina after delivering a strong first half of the year for the Hurricanes.
- Harris had posted back-to-back 100-yard games in two outings prior to the injury, marking the second time he has posted back-to-back performances and first time since doing it last year in the first two games of the 2020 season (vs. UAB, at Louisville). He has five career 100-yard games to his name.
- In a loss against Virginia (Sept. 30), Harris posted 111 yards on 14 carries with two touchdowns. Harris now has 22 career rushing touchdowns, which ranks 10th all-time at Miami. He surpassed Clinton Portis, who was previously 10th with 21 touchdowns, with his pair against the Cavaliers.

"In three seasons Harris has run for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns. At 5-10, 214 pounds, he hit 23.07 MPH, which is one of the fastest speeds registered by anyone, college or pro, in game action. His 75-yard touchdown run against Louisville is a good example of that burst. His 3-cone time of 6.88 would've topped any running back at the 2020 combine. Harris also squats 525 pounds and benches 365."

FOUR PROCANES, TWO FIRST ROUNDERS SELECTED IN 2021 NFL DRAFT

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2021 NFL Draft: **Jaelan Phillips** (first round, Miami), **Gregory Rousseau** (first round, Buffalo), **Brevin Jordan** (fifth round, Houston) and **Quincy Roche** (sixth round, Pittsburgh.). For 47 consecutive years, Miami has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft. With Phillips off the board at No. 18 and Rousseau at No. 30, Miami had two first-round selections for the first time since 2015. The Hurricanes had at least one defensive end drafted for the fifth straight year.
- The University of Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000 (123). No program in the ACC had more alumni on NFL 53-man rosters than the Hurricanes did entering Week 1 of the 2020 NFL season, when Miami boasted 31 former players and more who were on practice squads. Miami had 25 players on active 53-man rosters as of the roster cutting deadline entering 2021.

MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (THIRD OVERALL) | 16-14

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

In his most recent season as head coach of the Hurricanes in 2020, Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 overall record, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play, and an appearance in the Cheez-It Bowl. Miami won seven games in ACC play for the second time with Diaz on staff (2017) and the third time overall.

During his 20-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 19 bowl games, amassing a 13-6 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories,

including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
