- Had 15 points and 10 rebounds in the UIC win
- At UGA, averaged 12.8 points and 7.7 rebounds in 28.4 minutes
- Had 28 of the team's 64 blocks, 30 steals and 205 deflections
- His eight double-doubles tied for the most in the SEC

2021-22: 6.3 ppg, 2.3 rpg, 2.5 apg

- Made his first start vs. Austin Peay (4 points, 5 assists, 1 turnover)

- First true freshman to start for UD in nine years
- Tied the Flyer single-game blocked shot record (6) vs. UMass Lowell

2021-22: 6.3 ppg, 3.3 rpg, .467 FG%

- Scored nine points and was +26 in plus/minus in the UIC win
- Had 12 points, nine rebounds and three assists vs. UMass Lowell
- Scored 63 of his season's 82 points in his last nine games in 2021-22
- Averaged 9.5 points and 5.0 rebounds, and shot .657 (14-21) FG, .556 (6-11) 3-pt., and 1.000 (4-4) FT in his last four games (three starts)
- Made his first career start in the win at A-10 champ St. Bonaventure

DAYTON TRAVELS TO THE ESPN EVENTS INVITATIONAL IN ORLANDO

The University of Dayton men's basketball team will travel for the first time this season, when UD goes to Orlando to play in the eight-team ESPN Events Invitational Nov. 25-28. The Flyers will play the Miami Hurricanes in the very first game of the tournament. The game tips on Thanksgiving at 12 Noon ET.

The ESPN Events Invitational will mark the 14th consecutive exempt tournament in a full season schedule for UD. Dayton won this tournament (when it was known as the Old Spice Classic) in 2011.

The game will be carried by WHIO Radio, televised on ESPN2 and streamed on ESPN+. Streaming audio, video and stats will be available at DaytonFlyers.com.

#TRENDING

- For the first time in UD Arena history, all season and single game tickets have been sold before the season even began. That announcement was made on Nov. 4. All 17 regular season home games are sold out, extending an ongoing sellout streak for the Flyers to 28.
- Two Flyers were named Preseason All-Atlantic 10. Forwards Toumani Camara and Mustapha Amzil were both named to the third team.
- Camara, a transfer from Georgia, is the first immediately-eligible transfer to earn preseason accolades in Atlantic 10 Conference history. He saw action in 57 games in two seasons at Georgia, and started his last 48 games as a Bulldog. Last year, Camara averaged 12.8 points and 7.7 rebounds per game in 28.4 minutes of action. Camara had 14 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals in Saturday's loss to Austin Peay.
- Amzil joined the team mid-year and exactly 50 days after he signed, he earned the first of his three Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week awards. In 19 games (15 starts), Amzil was third for UD in scoring (9.9 points a game), rebounds (5.6), FG% (.496, 68-137) and 3-pt. FG% (.382, 26-68).
- Three of the four Flyers in double figures against Austin Peay -- Koby Brea (career-high 13 points in 18 minutes), Moulaye Sissoko (career-high 12 in 13 minutes) and Kobe Elvis (10).
- True freshman DaRon Holmes II was the top Dayton scorer in the UMass Lowell game with 13 points (6-10 FG). He also tied the Flyer record for blocked shots in a game with six.
- Malachi Smith was one of three Flyers with 11 points against Lipscomb. He also had four assists, four rebounds and two steals in a career-best 31 minutes. He made his first career start against Austin Peay.
- The Covid year has complicated "the clock" for college student-athletes. With that in mind, the Flyers' 12 players who are listed as freshmen or redshirt freshmen are the second-most in NCAA Division I men's basketball. Only Arizona (13) has more. Next is Air Force (11) with Marquette and Vanderbilt (10 each) right behind.
- Dayton's incoming freshman class is ranked 21st-best in the nation. DaRon Holmes II, a consensus Top 50 recruit, is the highest-rated prospect to ever come to UD.

UP NEXT

- The Flyers will play either Kansas or North Texas on Friday. The ESPN Events Invitational will conclude on Sunday with a game with Alabama, Belmont, Drake or Iona.

PLAYER NOTES

TOO MANY BUCKETS

- A transfer from Georgia, Camara is the first immediately-eligible transfer to earn preseason accolades in Atlantic 10 Conference history.
- He was named Third Team Preseason All-Atlantic 10 in a vote of the coaches and media.
- Camara had a double-double in his Dayton debut, with 15 points and 10 rebounds vs. UIC.
- He had 11 points vs. Lipscomb.
- Led UD with 14 (6-9 FG) points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals vs. Austin Peay.
- Hailing from Brussels, Belgium, he saw action in 57 games in two seasons at Georgia, and started his last 48 games as a Bulldog.
- Last year, Camara averaged 12.8 points and 7.7 rebounds per game in 28.4 minutes of action.
- An outstanding defensive player, he had 28 of the team's 64 blocks, 30 steals and 205 deflections.
- He led Georgia in rebounds, blocked shots and deflections, and was third for the Bulldogs in the other categories.
- His eight double-doubles tied for the most in the SEC in 2020-21.
- In 2020-21, he nearly doubled his freshman averages of 6.6 points and 4.3 rebounds a game.

STAT STAPHA

- Named Third Team Preseason All-Atlantic 10 after being named to the All-Rookie Team last year.
- Came off the bench to get 13 points, seven rebounds and four assists in the exhibition game.
- Amzil signed with the Flyers in the fall of 2020 to be part of UD's nationally-ranked recruiting Class of 2021. Circumstances changed, he joined the program at semester, and exactly 50 days after he signed, he earned the first of his three Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week awards.
- In 19 games (15 starts), Amzil was third on the team in scoring (9.9 points a game), rebounds (5.6), FG% (.496, 68-137) and 3-pt. FG% (.382, 26-68). He also led UD in free throw percentage among players who made a minimum of 25 free throws. The Helsinki native shot .765 (26-34) from the line.
- Amzil was thrust into the lineup after just three practices when Chase Johnson left the program, and two other more experienced players were injured.
- He is the third Anthony Grant recruit to be named to the A-10 All-Rookie Team (Jalen Crutcher and Obi Toppin were the others.)

DREAM WEAVER

- Elijah Weaver transferred from USC last summer and was slated to sit out the 2020-21 season for developmental reasons.
- Weaver scored 12 against UMass Lowell.
- He scored 11 points vs. Lipscomb.
- He was a key player in the USC rotation as a freshman and sophomore, seeing action in 59 games with 19 starts and averaging 5.9 points, 2.1 assists, 2.1 rebounds, and 21.3 minutes a game.
- When the NCAA suspended transfer rules in December, he was playing in his first Dayton game two hours after he found out he was eligible.
- Weaver made his first Flyer start at Davidson. He had 11 points (4-5 FG, 3-3 FT) and seven assists (with one turnover). He had assists on three of UD's first four baskets in the game.
- He led UD with 16 points (4-4 3-pt.) in the NIT vs. Memphis.

YOU CAN CALL ME R.J.

- Blakney was a big key to the UD win over UIC. He was +26 in plus/minus, with nine points (3-4 FG), three rebounds, two assists and a steal.
- Against UMass Lowell, he had 12 points, nine rebounds and three assists.
- He was hampered by various injuries during the year in 2021-22, but was effective when he could play.
- He saw action in 17 games (three starts) and averaged 4.8 points and 2.4 rebounds a game, while shooting (.554 (31-56) FG and .833 (10-12) FT.
- He saw the court for 29 minutes against Mississippi State (9 of the 10 in OT), and sent the game into its second extra frame with a three-pointer with 16.1 seconds left.
- Injuries limited him to three games in January, but he scored 10 points at Duquesne on Feb. 2.
- His three starts were in his last three games of the year, starting with UD's upset win at A-10 regular season champion St. Bonaventure.
- Was unable to play in the NIT due to an injury.
- His mom Dafne was a star on four NCAA teams at Maryland.

BUILD A BREA

- Koby Brea came off the bench for a career high 13 points in 18 minutes against Austin Peay.
- After missing much of the preseason and all of the non-conference schedule due to an injury, Brea played in 16 games with three starts in 2020-21.
- Played catch-up with his development and comfort level all year, but had 21 of his season's 49 points and 11 of his 31 rebounds in the last three games.
- He was one of a trio of freshmen who played the final 3:48 of the overtime win at Davidson.
- A breakout candidate in 2021-22, Brea did not turn 18 until he had been on campus for four months in the fall of 2020.
- St. John's star and NBA standout Felipe Lopez is his godfather.

JUMPIN ZIMI

- Played in 22 games (3 starts) and averaged 5.9 points and 2.4 rebounds in 2020-21.
- Did not score a point nor grab a rebound in the month of December, but in the remaining 18 games he played double-digit minutes in every contest and averaged 7.3 points and 3.0 rebounds in 22.3 minutes a game.
- He exploded for 29 points at Rhode Island, nearly tripling his previous career-best with (9-10 FG, 9-11 FT). He also had nine rebounds.
- The 29 points were one short of the UD freshman single-game record.
- Freshman forward Zimi Nwokeji spent the fall of 2019 at SPIRE Academy, then enrolled at UD between semesters and joined the Flyer basketball program in January of 2020.
- He won a state championship at The Rock in Gainesville, Fla. as a senior in 2018-19, posting 10.2 ppg. and 7.0 rpg.
- He did not dress in the first two games (injury). He did dress but did not play against Lipscomb and APSU.

PLAYER NOTES & A-10 AWARDS

TALKIN' ABOUT MOO

- Moulaye Sissoko came off the bench to grab a career-high eight rebounds in the Lipscomb game.
- He scored a career-best 12 points in 13 minutes vs. APSU.
- He was hampered by a knee injury in 2020-21, but played in 14 games before undergoing surgery on Feb. 22 and missing the rest of the season.
- He was the only full-season freshman on the scholarship roster in 2019-20.
- With the other four Flyers who were 6-7 or taller in their third year of college ball (at least), it made sense for Sissoko to redshirt that year.
- He came to the States from Mali at the age of 16.

DA-DO, RON, RON, RON, DA-DOO, DaRON

- Freshman forward DaRon Holmes II is the highest-ranked freshman recruit to come to UD in men's basketball.
- He was the first true freshman to start a Dayton opener in nine years (on his mom Tomika's birthday, no less). He scored nine points and grabbed four rebounds, and was +11 in plus/minus.

- In 2019-20, he was the Arizona Gatorade High School Player of the Year after averaging 23.7 points, 10.6 rebounds, 3.8 blocks and 3.1 assists per game for the AIA 5A state finalists
- Was also conference Defensive Player of the Year.
- Had career averages of 18.9 points, 9.7 rebounds, 3.4 blocks, 2.6 assists and 1.6 steals for his three years at Millennium
- Millennium finished 24-6 while reaching the Arizona 5A championship game for the second consecutive year
- Began 2020-21 playing for one of the strongest teams in the country, Montverde Academy in Montverde, Fla.
- Transferred over the holidays back to Arizona to play for another top team, AZ Compass Prep and finished out the year where he averaged 15.2 points, 9.3 rebounds and 3.0 blocks
- Even with the mid-season change, MaxPreps named him an Honorable Mention All-American
- Holmes is the first true freshman to start a Flyer season opener in nine years.
- He tied the UD single-game record for blocked shots (6) in the UMass Lowell game. He also led UD with 13 points.

HE'S JUST GONE HOME

- Kobe Elvis is a transfer who played at DePaul last season.
- Elvis had 10 points and seven rebounds in the UIC win.
- He also had 10 points against Austin Peay.
- In the exhibition with Cedarville, he played 23 minutes, with 13 points (5-5 FG, 3-3 3-pt.) and six assists (vs. 1 turnover).
- Played in all 19 games at DePaul, starting four games.
- On a team that had 10 players score at least 4.9 points a game, Elvis averaged 5.2 points and 20.2 minutes per contest.
- Had 36 assists and 14 steals in his 19 games, and shot .423 (41-97) from the floor, and .419 (14-49) from beyond the arc.
- Was a standout in the Ontario Scholastic Basketball Association (OSBA), playing for Bill Crothers Prep in 2019-20 and was one of five players named to First Team All-Star for the OSBA.
- Averaged 26.5 points, 5.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.8 steals per game for Crothers Prep, leading the team to the championship game of the OSBA Final 8 Championships.

TRANSFORM UD ARENA

- The University of Dayton completed a three-year, \$76.2 million transformation project of UD Arena in time for the Arena's 50th anniversary in 2019-20
- The project transformed the 50-year-old facility into a state-of-the-art venue. The upgrade, the largest construction project in University history, modernized the Arena without losing the "soul of the bowl" - the atmosphere that has made UD Arena one of the best places to watch college basketball.
- The renovation of the Arena was accomplished in three phases, primarily during the off-seasons of 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- Phase I included new seats at the 100/200 levels, and a center-hung video board.
 - Phase II included new entrances on three of the four sides, a new ticket office, new seats in the 300 and 400 levels on the east side.
 - Phase III completed the walkway and 300/400 level seating work on the west side. It also provided renovated locker rooms at court level,
 - UD Arena has been the site of 125 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament games, 42 more than any other host.
 - Second place belongs to Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium, the original home of the NCAA tournament.

DON DONOHER RECEIVES 2017 USBWA'S DEAN SMITH AWARD

- National College Basketball Hall of Famer Don Donoher was named the winner of the 2017 Dean Smith Award given annually by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association.
- He was the third individual to receive the honor. Former Georgetown coach John Thompson was the first recipient, followed by Michigan State coach Tom Izzo.
- Former Temple coach Fran Dunphy was the winner in 2018, Davidson's Bob McKillop in 2019 and George Raveling this year.
- Donoher retired in 1989 after 25 years as Dayton's head coach with 437 career victories, the most in UD history.

MR. SMITH

- Malachi Smith came off the bench to score eight points (6-7 FT) in the UML game. He drew five fouls in 25 minutes.
- He had 11 points, four assists, four rebounds and two steals in the Lipscomb game.
- He made his first career start against Austin Peay and had five assists against one turnover, with four points.
- A three/four-star recruit, he led St. Raymond High School For Boys to the 2020 New York Catholic High School Athletic Association AA regular season championship
- Named AA First Team All-CHSAA and Third Team All-New York after averaging 19.2 points, 8.0 assists and 5.2 rebounds in his only varsity season.
- Was the third-ranked player in New York City (and the top point guard), and the sixth-ranked player in the state in 2019-20
- In the fall of 2020, he was named the regular season MVP of the Gauchos Roundball Classic, and first team all-tournament
- Missed his senior high school season due to the pandemic
- Smith's connection with the UD basketball program goes back much farther than his being recruited by Anthony Grant. His brother Scoochie was an All-A-10 guard in 2017, taking the Flyers to the NCAA tournament four seasons under Archie Miller
- Smith was an AAU teammate on the famed New York Gauchos with current Flyer guard Koby Brea.

THE GEORGIA WASHINGTON

- Georgia native Kaleb Washington is another four-star and Top 100 recruit in this recruiting class for the Flyers
- He played his first three varsity seasons for Pebblebrook HS.
- Broke out as a junior in 2019-20, averaging 15.8 points and 6.0 rebounds per contest.
- Played his senior season at Georgia powerhouse Wheeler High School in Marietta, and helped Wheeler win the Georgia 6A state championship, and was named Second Team All-Georgia.
- Repeated as an All-Cobb County and First Team All-Region selection.

LG3

- Lynn Greer III saw his first rotation action in the APSU game. He played 20 minutes, and had eight points, three assists and no turnovers.
- A four-year varsity starter at Roman Catholic High School in Philadelphia, he scored 1,392 career points and averaged 18.2 points per game as a 17-year old senior in '19-'20.
- Three-time First Team All-Philadelphia Catholic League
- Averaged 9.8 points a game as a freshman, 13.0 as a sophomore, 15.0 as a junior and 18.2 as a senior
- Averaged 5.0 assists a game for his career, and quarterbacked two league championship teams and one runner-up.
- Spent a post-graduate year at IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., one of the top 5-ranked prep teams in the nation in 2020-21
- Greer III is the son of one of Temple's all-time greats. His dad, Lynn Greer II scored 2,099 points between 1997-2002 and ranks second in Temple history in scoring. Both of his dad and grandad also played in the NBA.

DAYTON'S NBA LINEAGE CONTINUES

- Consensus national player of the year Obi Toppin was a lottery pick in the 2020 NBA draft, going to his hometown New York Knicks with eighth pick.
- He was the second Flyer drafted in three years.
- Kostas Antetokounmpo was taken in the second round in 2018, and earned a championship ring with the Lakers.
- In the last eight years, Antetokounmpo, Charles Cooke, Chris Johnson, Brian Roberts, Jordan Sibert, Toppin and Chris Wright have all represented Dayton in the NBA.

THE FLYER FAITHFUL

- For the first time in UD Arena history, all 17 regular season games have been sold out before the season even started.
- Dayton was 23rd nationally in average attendance in 2019-20 in the annual men's basketball attendance report.
- UD averaged a school-record 13,364 fans a game in 2019-20.
- UD Arena was the site of a record 14 sellouts in 2019-20. The previous record was eight.
- Dayton finished in the Top 30 in men's basketball attendance for the 23rd straight season.
- The 2019-20 season was the 23rd consecutive year with an average attendance of 12,000 or more fans.
- Dayton's game versus North Florida in 2017-18 was the 300th consecutive UD regular season home game with an attendance of at least 11,000 fans.
- In the last 30 years, 99% of UD's home games have had 10,000+ (563 of 576).
- UD Arena has 148 sellouts in its 50-year history.
- UD was the 11th school to have 10 million mark attend a men's basketball game in their current building. The others are Butler, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Minnesota, New Mexico, Purdue, Syracuse and Vanderbilt.

THE MADNESS STARTS IN DAYTON

- When the NCAA tournament resumes as a nation-wide sports event, "March Madness" will begin again in Dayton. The NCAA announced in October that UD Arena serves as the host site at least through the 2026 NCAA First Four.
- UD Arena is the all-time leader with 125 NCAA Tournament games hosted.
- That is 43 more than the original home of the NCAA Tournament, Kansas City's Municipal Auditorium.
- The Arena has been an NCAA site since 2001, and the host of the First Four since 2011.

- As a junior at Woodrow Wilson High in Dallas, Texas he was named the District 11 5A Newcomer of the Year in what ended up being his only high school season.
- He missed the summer of 2019 and his entire senior season with injuries.
- Prior to the injuries, Amaefule was ranked the 18th-best power forward in the country and eighth-best overall recruit in Texas in the class of 2020 via 247Sports.com.
- Signed in August of 2020 with ETSU, and traveled from his home in London to campus in the fall as Covid-19 restrictions were lifted.
- Played in 19 of the team's 25 games, and averaged 1.5 points and 2.4 rebounds in 8.3 minutes per contest at ETSU.

WALK ON BY

- Three walk-ons round out the Flyer roster.
- Christian Wilson has played in 23 games in three seasons scoring 11 points. He is 4-for 10 from the field (3-8 from three-point) with five rebounds and four assists.
- Drew Swerlein has been with the team the last two seasons. As a true freshman in 2018-19, he was a scrimmage player for the Flyer women's team.
- Brady Uhl joined the team this year after walk-on tryouts. He is part of only the second three-generation family in UD basketball history. His grandfather, Bill Uhl Sr, was an All-American at Dayton in the 1950's and is a member of the UD Hall of Fame. His father Bill Uhl Jr., was part of a Flyer Midwestern Collegiate Conference championship-winning team in 1990.
- The first three-generation family were the Zimmermans - George, Jack Sr. and Jack Jr.

AMAZING IN THE A-10

- Since the 2012-13 season, Dayton has the most conference regular season wins with 113. Next are St. Bonaventure (102) and VCU (101).
- Dayton has won three of the last six the A-10 regular season titles. Three different teams won the others.

DOIN' IT FOR THE ALMA MATER

- Anthony Grant is one of more than 30 coaches in Division I currently coaching at their alma mater.
- This list includes four coaches -- Jim Boeheim, Jamie Dixon, Grant, and Tubby Smith -- who have national coach of the year honors in the careers, but only Boeheim and Grant won their award while coaching the team they once played for.

GRANT HELPS USA BASKETBALL WIN GOLD

- Flyer coach Anthony Grant spent part of his summer in 2018 serving as an assistant coach for USA Basketball's gold medal-winning entry in the 2018 FIBA Americas U18 Championship for Men which was held June 11-17 in St. Catherines, Ontario.
- Kansas' Hall of Fame coach Bill Self was the team's head coach. Joining Grant on the staff was Danny Manning of who at the time was the coach of Wake Forest.
- This was Grant's second stint with USA Basketball. He was an assistant for the 2008 USA Men's U18 National Team, which played in the FIBA Americas Championship in Argentina.
- Grant is the fourth Flyer coach to serve with USA Basketball. Don Donoher had two stints, most notably as an assistant on the gold medal-winning team at the 1984 Olympics. Oliver Purnell served five times, including at the 2004 Olympics. Archie Miller was an assistant at the U-19 World Championships in 2015.

ANTHONY GRANT

Head Coach

University of Dayton Coach Anthony Grant is in his fifth season at the helm of his alma mater's men's basketball program, still riding the wave of the most heralded season in school history.

That success opened the doors to a Top 25 recruiting class, allowing Grant and his staff to present their vision of Dayton basketball to the kind of talented prospects who are the best fit to be a Flyer.

Dayton was 29-2 in 2019-20, setting the school record for most wins. Dayton ended the year ranked third in the nation and won its third Atlantic 10 regular season championship in the last five years, but went undefeated (18-0) in conference play for the first time.

Grant was the consensus national Coach of the Year, earning that honor from the Atlanta Tip-Off Club (Naismith Trophy), the NABC, the USBWA (Henry Iba Award), the Associated Press, The Sporting News, Fox Sports and CBSsports.com, among others.

When the Covid-19 pandemic abruptly ended the 2019-20 basketball season, many said there would be no team more wounded by the cancellation of the NCAA tournament than Dayton. Grant would have none of it, simply stating "This is bigger than basketball." Later, when those in the game began to take stock of what had happened in the spring, the Flyer leader emphasized that it was important for his team to recognize what they did accomplish, rather than have regrets over what they could have accomplished.

He was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Board of Directors in November, 2020.

The University announced Anthony Grant as the 20th head coach in UD Basketball history on March 30, 2017.

Grant had most recently been on the coaching staff of the NBA's Oklahoma City Thunder. He spent the last two seasons on then Thunder coach Billy Donovan's staff after nine seasons as head coach at Alabama and VCU and 13 seasons as a Division I assistant coach.

In his first 11 seasons as a head coach, Grant took his teams to three NCAA tournament appearances and seven postseason tournament berths. He won his 200th career game at Dayton on Jan. 3, 2018.

Grant is also a 1987 graduate of the University of Dayton, where he was a four-year basketball letterwinner and three-year starter. He played in 105 games at Dayton, and averaged 11.6 points and 6.7 rebounds per game as a starter. He was the Flyers' co-captain and the White-Allen Most Valuable Player as a senior. His teams played in two NCAAs and one NIT.

The 20th coach in Dayton's history, Grant is just the seventh Flyer coach in the last 70 years. In the modern era of UD basketball, Grant is just the second Dayton grad to coach the Flyers. The first was his coach, College BB Hall of Famer Don Donoher (1964-89).

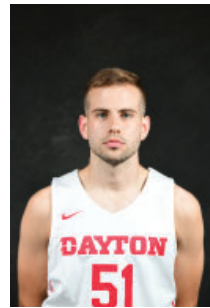
