THE GAME

- Miami will play its final regular season game of 2021 at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham, N.C., on Nov. 27 against host Duke. Kick is set for 12:30 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast on **ACC RSN** with Tom Werme (pxp), James Bates (color) and Wiley Ballard (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 20th season together while Josh Darrow manages the sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game against the Blue Devils live on **Mundial 990AM** from Wallace Wade Stadium.

THE SERIES

- Saturday's game at Duke is the 19th matchup in the history of the series; UM leads the series by a commanding 14-4 margin, including 8-2 in Durham.
- The longtime foes have met every year since 2005 after Miami joined the Coastal Division of the ACC. Miami topped Duke 48-0 in the 2020 matchup.
- Miami is making its third straight trip to Durham in 2021; Miami's 2020 game against Duke was only added due to late COVID-19 scheduling issues.

THE HURRICANES

- The Miami Hurricanes returned 19 of 22 starters from a 2020 team that finished 8-3 overall and 7-2 in Atlantic Coast Conference play. The Canes, who ended the year in the 2020 Cheez-It Bowl, became the third Miami team to win seven games in ACC play since joining the conference in 2004.
- With their 38-26 win over Virginia Tech on Nov. 20, the Hurricanes earned the right to play in a bowl game for the ninth straight year dating to 2013.
- On Oct. 11, Diaz announced starting QB **D'Eriq King** would miss the rest of the season due to shoulder surgery resulting from an injury versus Michigan State. In his first season as starting quarterback at UM in 2020, King had with 2,686 passing yards, 538 rushing yards and 27 total TDs.
- Last time out vs. Virginia Tech (Nov. 20), Miami jumped out to a sizable early lead and topped the visiting Hokies, 38-26, at Hard Rock Stadium.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** has been sensational since taking over for King, throwing for 2,550 yards, 22 touchdowns and just six interceptions in eight starts. Van Dyke won three straight ACC Rookie of the Week honors this year, becoming the first player to do it since Jameis Winston of Florida State in 2013.
- WR **Charleston Rambo** became just the fourth wide receiver in Miami history to record 200 receiving yards in Miami's win over Georgia Tech on Nov. 6. Rambo currently ranks second in Miami history in single-season receptions (71) and fifth in single-season receiving yards (1,071) with one game left.
- For head coach **Manny Diaz**, 2021 marks a return to his roots as the program's defensive signal caller and defensive coordinator. Diaz was hired by Mark Richt in 2016 as the program's defensive coordinator, a role he served in for three seasons before being named head coach in January of 2019.
- In addition to re-assuming his role as defensive coordinator, Diaz hired **Travaris Robinson** - former defensive coordinator at South Carolina - to coach defensive backs, added **Ishmael Aristide** from Texas A&M to coach strikers and promoted **DeMarcus Van Dyke** from recruiting operations to coach corners. Diaz also brought back defensive line coach **Jess Simpson**, who spent the previous two years as d-line coach of the Atlanta Falcons.
- Several Miami Hurricanes were selected as preseason candidates for major college football awards; in addition to King, who was named a candidate for nearly every offensive award, Miami had **Bubba Bolden** named to the Thorpe Award watch list, **Will Mallory** to the Mackey Award, **Lou Hedley** to the Ray Guy Award, **Mike Harley** to the Biletnikoff Award, both **Zion Nelson** and **Jarrid Williams** to the Outland Trophy watch list, and others.
- Miami had more production returning than all but three Power 5 programs in America (Arizona State, UCLA, Rutgers) at 91%; the national average of returning production from 2020 into 2021 was 76.7% across FBS. UM was the only team in the ACC to rank in the top 25 of FBS returning production.

THREE AND OUT

UM CLOSES 2021 SEASON IN BULL CITY

- The Miami Hurricanes look to close out their season on a high note when they travel to Durham, N.C., to play host Duke on Nov. 27. Kickoff is set for 12:30 p.m.
- With its 38-26 win over Virginia Tech at Hard Rock Stadium last time out, the Hurricanes clinched bowl eligibility for the ninth straight year. Miami's bowl destination will be determined after the conference championship weekend (Dec. 3-5).
- Despite a commanding 14-4 lead in the all-time series, Miami had dropped two in a row to the Blue Devils before a dominant 48-0 win in last year's matchup. The Hurricanes are 8-2 all-time in Durham. UM's first trip to the Bull City came in 1983.

VAN DYKE MAKES HISTORY IN LAST FIVE

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** will be making his ninth straight start under center when the Hurricanes take on Duke on Saturday at Wallace Wade Stadium in Durham, N.C.
- Van Dyke, who has compiled a 5-3 record in his eight starts this season, threw for the ninth-most yards in a single game in Miami history and the second most ever by a Hurricanes freshman when he passed for 426 yards against #17/#19 Pitt on Oct. 30.
- With 357 passing yards and three touchdown passes last time out in a win over Virginia Tech, Van Dyke became the first ACC quarterback in the least 15 years to throw for at least 300 yards and at least three touchdowns in five straight games.

RAMBO NEARING TOP OF RECORD BOOKS

- After spending the first four seasons of his career at Oklahoma, WR **Charleston Rambo** joined the Hurricanes in January 2021 as one of the top-regarded wide receivers in the transfer portal.
- Rambo has delivered a dominant first season at The U, and now ranks second in Miami's history in single-season receptions (71) and fifth in single-season yards (1,071).
- With just 92 more receiving yards, Rambo would move into first place in single-season receiving yards in program history, surpass Allen Hurns' single-season record (1,162).
- Rambo (71) is two catches away from moving past Leonard Hankerson (72, 2010) into first in UM history for a single season.

WR Charleston Rambo became just the fifth Miami Hurricanes wide receiver to ever surpass 1,000 yards in a single season last time out against Virginia Tech (1,071).

In a win over Georgia Tech, RB Jaylan Knighton had the first 100-yard rushing game of his career, rushing for 162 yards on a career-high 32 carries.

Since the start of the 2015 season, the Hurricanes rank second in the Atlantic Coast Conference and trail only Clemson in conference wins with 36.

WR Michael Harley ranks second all time in career receptions at Miami with 169; he had three last time out vs. Virginia Tech.

The University of Miami has had at least one true freshman on the field for 1,861 snaps this season - a figure that ranks No. 3 in all of FBS and ranks first among any Power-5 program.

HURRICANES WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON IN BULL CITY VERSUS DUKE

- Coming off a 38-26 win last time out over Virginia Tech that clinched a bowl berth, the Hurricanes wrap up their regular season on Nov. 27 against host Duke at Wallace Wade Stadium. Kickoff is 12:30 p.m. ET.
- With its win over the Hokies last time out, Miami clinched bowl eligibility for the ninth straight year. The Hurricanes have played in three straight bowl games under the direction of head coach **Manny Diaz**
- Miami leads the all-time series, 14-4, but had dropped two in a row to the Blue Devils before stomping the hosts, 48-0, at Wallace Wade Stadium in 2020. The Hurricanes have an 8-2 all-time mark in Durham.
- The Hurricanes are making their third straight trip to the Bull City this season; the Hurricanes were not scheduled to play Duke in 2020 but a road game was added due to COVID-19-related scheduling issues.
- Head coach **Manny Diaz** is currently in his third season at the helm in Coral Gables; Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 record in 2020, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play. Miami won seven games in ACC play for just the second time in program history in 2020 - UM finished 7-1 in ACC play in 2017.
- Miami's game versus the the Seminoles is slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM and WMYM 990 AM.

LAST TIME OUT: HURRICANES TOP HOKIES, 38-26, CLINCH BOWL BERTH

- The Hurricanes jumped out to an early lead and captured a 38-26 win over Virginia Tech at Hard Rock Stadium on Nov. 20. Miami honored 24 players during Senior Day ceremonies before the matchup.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, making the eighth straight start for Miami, delivered another strong outing; Van Dyke threw for 357 yards and three touchdowns and was named ACC Co-Rookie of the Week on Nov. 22.
- WR **Charleston Rambo** finished with seven catches and 116 yards, becoming just the fifth Hurricane in Miami history to record a 1,000-yard season (1,071). He needs 92 yards to set UM's single season mark.
- TE **Will Mallory** caught a touchdown pass for the fourth time in the last five games dating to Oct. 23.
- CB **Marcus Clarke** wore the turnover chain for the first time in 2021 on a fumble recovery vs. the Hokies.

A LOOK BACK: FIRST ROAD SHUTOUT IN 20 YEARS WAS VS. DUKE IN '20

- In its 2020 game, Miami maintained its winning ways with its most dominant win of the season - a 48-0 romp of Duke at Wallace Wade Stadium on Dec. 5. The Hurricanes posted their first road shutout since 2000 (versus Syracuse) and their first shutout of a Power-5 opponent - also vs. Syracuse - since 2001.
- Miami's 48-point margin of victory was its largest ever in an ACC game, besting the previous high of 45, which had been done twice ever - against Wake Forest in 2004 (52-7) and Duke in 2005 (52-7).
- QB **D'Eriq King** had another strong outing for the Hurricanes, finishing with 248 yards with three passing touchdowns and one rushing score. He linked up with WR **Michael Harley** on a 89-yard touchdown in the win - the fourth-longest pass play in Miami history and the longest since 2007.
- Miami forced five turnovers and held the Blue Devils to a paltry 177 total yards of offense. Miami's elite tandem of DE Jaelan Phillips and DE Quincy Roche combined for four sacks and 6.5 tackles for loss.

'ROOSTER' NOW RB1, SHINING IN ROLE AS TOP BACK FOR HURRICANES

- After RB **Cam/Ron Harris** suffered a season-ending leg injury in a loss to North Carolina on Oct. 16, RB **Jaylan Knighton** assumed responsibility as UM's lead back. He will make his sixth start of 2021 Saturday.
- Knighton is the only ACC player with 500+ rushing yards, 250+ receiving yards and 10+ touchdowns.
- Knighton leads UM in touchdowns (10) and ranks second in all-purpose yards (761) in only seven games.
- In a win against Georgia Tech on Nov. 6, Knighton finished with a career-high 162 yards on a career-high 32 carries for the first 100-yard rushing game of his career. He also scored a touchdown in the win.
- Nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Mon., Oct. 18 after posting the best outing of his career vs. the Tar Heels. Knighton totaled 165 all-purpose yards and three touchdowns.
- Knighton upped the ante with his start against NC State on Oct. 23, finishing with 166 all-purpose yards, including 21 carries in the win. He was recognized as the ACC Running Back of the Week on Oct. 25.
- Knighton played in nine games and made two starts in his first year of college football in 2020 but was suspended for the first four games of 2021 due to a violation of team rules. He returned in Week 5.
- Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect and was listed as the No. 88 player in the ESPN300.

MALLORY MAKING BIG IMPACT OVER THE LAST FIVE GAMES FOR MIAMI

- After a slow start to the season, TE **Will Mallory** has been instrumental over the last five games. He had a career-long 57-yard score vs. Pitt and has 17 catches for 230 yards with four TDs in the last five games.
- In Miami's first six games of the season, Mallory totaled 10 catches and 73 yards with no touchdowns. Mallory has touchdowns in four of the last five games dating to Miami's win over NC State on Oct. 23.
- In his three seasons at The U entering 2021, Mallory had totaled 43 receptions, 659 yards and seven TDs. This season, the Jacksonville native ranks fourth on the team with 27 receptions and fifth in yards (313).



VAN DYKE SHINING, HAS THROWN FOR 17 TOUCHDOWNS IN LAST FIVE

- Ever since his insertion into the starting lineup against Central Connecticut State on Sept. 25, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** has impressed with some of the best outings by a freshman in Miami Hurricanes history.
- Van Dyke has 22 touchdowns and six interceptions and has a 61.1 completion rate for 2,550 yards.
- Over Miami's three-game winning streak (Oct. 30 - Nov. 6), Van Dyke averaged 380.0 passing yards per game, completed 72% of his passes and compiled totals of 10 touchdowns and just one interception
- Over the last 15 seasons in the ACC, Van Dyke is the only quarterback in ACC history to have ever thrown for 300-plus passing yards and had three passing TDs in five straight ACC games. He joined FSU's Jameis Winston (four in 2013), UNC's Sam Howell (three in 2019) and NC State's Russell Wilson (three in 2010) with at least three such games when he did it against Georgia Tech (for the third straight game).
- The 6-foot-4, 224-pound signal caller became the first Hurricane since the legendary Bernie Kosar in 1984 to record three consecutive games of at least 325 yards passing in Miami's win vs. Georgia Tech.
- Van Dyke, who took over as starter after QB **D'Eriq King** suffered a season-ending injury on Sept. 18, completed 10-of-11 passes for 270 yards and three touchdowns in the win vs. Central Connecticut State.
- In a victory over NC State (Oct. 23), Van Dyke had the best game of his career by nearly every margin - he set career marks for completions, passing yards and touchdowns in a 31-30 victory. He one-upped himself against #17/#19 Pitt (Oct. 30), throwing for career-high 426 yards on 32-for-42 passing.
- He won three straight ACC Rookie of the Week awards and won ACC Co-Rookie of the Week Nov. 22.
- Van Dyke's 270 yards were third-most by a UM quarterback making his first career start (since 1999).
- Van Dyke was rated a four-star prospect by ESPN and Rivals coming out of high school. He ranked No. 105 nationally in the ESPN300 and was rated as the No. 2 pro-style quarterback nationally by ESPN.
- The Glastonbury, Conn., native totaled over 4,600 yards and 39 passing touchdowns over his final two high school seasons. He was named 2019 New England Prep Player of the Year after his final season.

'O' STARTING TO CLICK WITH LONG SCORING DRIVES OVER SECOND HALF

- Despite a myriad of different season-ending injuries to four opening day starters, the Hurricanes offense has begun to click over the last seven games, all of which have been vs. Atlantic Coast Conference teams.
- Miami's offense had just five scoring drives of 70-plus yards over its first three games vs. Alabama, App State and Michigan State combined. It had five such drives vs. NC State (Oct. 23) and four vs. Pittsburgh (Oct. 30). In a win over Georgia Tech (Nov. 6), UM had its second-longest drive of 2021 by yards (93).
- After posting five scoring drives of 70-or-more yards over its first three games, the Hurricanes have managed 20 such drives over the last seven games, including two versus Virginia (Sept. 30) and three versus UNC (Oct. 16). UM tied its season-long 97-yard scoring drive in its loss against Florida State.
- Miami had its fastest scoring drive of the season (0:10) on a 75-yard TD pass last time out vs. Virginia Tech

HARLEY MOVING UP RECORD BROOKS IN CAREER RECEPTIONS, NOW 2ND

- WR **Michael Harley** delivered the best season of his career in Miami's new up-tempo offense a year ago, hauling in a career-high, team-best 57 receptions for a team-high 799 receiving yards with seven TDs.
- A third-team All-ACC selection, Harley set career marks in every category, nearly eclipsing his first three season totals combined. In his first three years at The U, Harley had 68 catches, 816 yards and three TDs.
- Harley has 169 career receptions, which ranks as the second-most in the history of Miami Football. In 2020, Harley moved past Phillip Dorsett (121) and Allen Hurns (121) into eighth in the record books.

ONE OF NATION'S TOP WRs, RAMBO CLIMBING UP UM'S RECORD BOOKS

- One of Miami's top playmakers this year has been WR **Charleston Rambo**, who arrived after spending the first four seasons of his career at Oklahoma, where had had 1,180 receiving yards and 76 career catches.
- Rambo currently ranks No. 2 in single-season catches (71) and No. 5 in single-season yards (1,071) at UM. With just two more catches and 92 more receiving yards, Rambo will have compiled the most prolific season by a Miami pass catcher in program history; he ranks No. 2 in both categories entering Week 13.
- Rambo delivered a scintillating performance in UM's win against Georgia Tech (Nov. 6), finishing with 210 receiving yards - only the fourth time a Miami player has ever eclipsed 200 receiving yards in one game.
- Rambo's 210 yards were the most by any ACC receiver in a game this season and only the 21st 200-yard game by any receiver in FBS in 2021 through Week 12. It was the 14th-best single game total so far in 2021.
- On Nov. 3, Rambo was one of six players added to the midseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award.
- When Rambo put together a dominant performance against Michigan State on Sept. 18, he managed a feat that had been done only twice in University of Miami history: 12 receptions in a single game.
- Rambo became the first Hurricane to haul in 12 catches since Phillip Dorsett did it versus USF in 2012, and only the third Hurricane ever. Rambo's 12 catches were the most he ever had in any college game, and his 156 receiving yards bested his previous high of 122, set in 2019 versus Texas Tech at Oklahoma.
- Rambo has started all 11 games at wide receiver and leads Miami with 71 catches, 1,071 yards and five TDs.
- The Cedar Hills, Texas native is one of just seven receivers in the ACC to have recorded 50 catches through Week 10. Rambo's average of 6.44 receptions per game ranks as the fourth-best mark in the conference.

FIVE STARTERS (FOUR ON OFFENSE) OUT FOR SEASON DUE TO INJURIES

- In addition to its two most productive offensive players in QB **D'Eriq King** and RB **Cam'Ron Harris**, the Hurricanes are missing team captain and center **Corey Gaynor** and left guard **Jalen Rivers** for the season.
- Miami will miss S **Bubba Bolden** for the rest of the year, as announced by HC Manny Diaz on Oct. 25, due to a shoulder injury. Bolden and King were two of three players selected to represent Miami at ACC Kickoff.

VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE RANKS AMONG NATION'S MOST EXPERIENCED

- The University of Miami entered the 2021 season with one of the nation's most experienced offensive lines in the nation. UM's 214 combined FBS OL starts are the second-most, trailing only Minnesota (235).
- The Hurricanes' offensive line features 10 players who have made at least one start at the FBS level.
- Among Miami's most battle-tested veterans include **Navaughn Donaldson** (43 starts), **DJ Scaife** (37), **Jarrid Williams** (36), **Corey Gaynor** (29), **Jakai Clark** (28), **Justice Oluwaseun** (24) and **Zion Nelson** (31).

RESTREPO SEEING INCREASED ROLE, SHARING REPS AS SLOT RECEIVER

- Second-year WR **Xavier Restrepo** set the tone for his 2021 season with three catches totaling 55 yards, including the first score of his career on a 29-yard contested catch vs. Alabama in Miami's opener.
- In a road win at Pittsburgh (Oct. 30), Restrepo had the best game of his career: seven catches for 89 yards, including a long reception of 22 yards. Restrepo has shared slot reps with WR **Mike Harley** in 2021.
- Through 11 games this season, Restrepo has totaled 22 catches for 343 yards with one touchdown.
- As a true freshman in 2020, Restrepo saw action in nine games and had just one 12-yard reception.
- In a win over CCSU, Restrepo had a then-career-high four catches totaling a then-career-best 75 yards - before his big game against Pitt on the road. Restrepo ranks sixth on Miami in receptions with 22.
- A former high school teammate of RB **Jaylan Knighton**, Restrepo was a four-star prospect by Rivals. A versatile player, he scored 48 touchdowns and totaled 3,000+ receiving yards in his high school career.

MIAMI EARNS SECOND RANKED ROAD WIN UNDER DIAZ'S DIRECTION

- The Hurricanes enjoyed a thrilling 38-34 win over #17/#19 Pittsburgh on the road on Oct. 30, picking up their first road win over a ranked opponent since a win over #18/#16 Louisville, 47-34, in 2020.
- Miami recorded back-to-back ranked wins for the first time since 2017, when the Hurricanes topped #13/#13 Virginia Tech, 28-10, and #3/#5 Notre Dame, 41-8, in back-to-back weeks (Nov. 4, Nov. 11).
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, making the fifth straight start for Miami, delivered one of the best performances of his career. Van Dyke set career marks for completions and passing yards in a 32-for-42, 426-yard, three-touchdown effort. Van Dyke was named ACC Rookie of the Week for the second straight week.
- WR **Charleston Rambo** posted his third 100-yard game of the season, finishing with 101 yards on seven receptions. RB **Jaylan Knighton** had 17 carries for 80 yards with two touchdowns in the win.
- S **James Williams** was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week after recording a career-high nine tackles and an interception. In addition, CB **Tyrique Stevenson** had his first collegiate interception.

FRESHMEN "EAT" AT MIAMI: UM LEADS POWER-5 IN TRUE FROSH SNAPS

- No Power-5 team has had at least one true freshman on the field for more snaps this year than UM (1,861).
- UM ranks No. 3 in all of FBS in the stat and trails only Eastern Michigan (1,911) and Northern Illinois (1,884).
- In a win over #17/#19 Pitt, TE **Elijah Arroyo** hauled in the first touchdown of his career and S **James Williams** was named ACC Defensive of the Week after having nine tackles and one interception.
- Miami's group of freshmen showed off their playmaking ability in its 45-42 loss to North Carolina on Oct .16; the Hurricanes group - comprised of true freshmen like RB **Cody Brown**, second-year freshmen like RB **Jaylan Knighton** and third-year redshirt freshmen like DE **Jahfari Harvey** - were responsible for every point scored vs. UNC. Knighton led Miami with three touchdowns while K **Andy Borregales** had two field goals.
- Miami true freshmen dominated in a 69-0 win over Central Connecticut State on Sept. 25; the Hurricanes group of first-year players finished with 411 total yards of offense and combined for six touchdowns.
- Brown two touchdowns while RB **Thad Franklin**, WR **Romello Brinson**, WR **Jacolby George** and WR **Brashard Smith** each finished with one score. Smith led the way with 126 all-purpose yards.
- QB **Jake Garcia** finished 11-for-14 for 147 yards with two touchdown passes and had a 45-yard rush. Garcia split reps with Van Dyke, who started and finished with 270 passing yards and three touchdowns.
- DL **Leonard Taylor** had a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss in Miami's win over Georgia Tech on Nov. 6.

STEVENS ON GETS FIRST PICK, UM DOUBLED PICKETT'S INT SEASON TOTAL

- CB **Tyrique Stevenson** recorded the first interception of his collegiate career in Miami's win over #17/#19 Pitt (Oct. 30). The third-year transfer cornerback - in his first year at Miami - returned the pick 39 yards.
- Stevenson and S **James Williams** both intercepted passes from Pitt QB and Heisman hopeful Kenny Pickett, who had thrown just one interception all season before the Hurricanes picked off two in the victory.

'THREE AMIGOS' SHOWING PROMISE AT WR IN FIRST SEASONS AT MIAMI

- Miami boasted three of the top-rated wide receivers in the Class of 2021: **Romello Brinson, Jacolby George** and **Brashard Smith**. All three freshmen scored touchdowns in Miami's win over Central Conn. State.
- The trio of wide receivers has been nicknamed the 'Three Amigos' - the three are close friends and live together with QB **Jake Garcia**. The trio combined for nine catches, 160 yards and three TDs vs. CCSU.
- All three are South Florida natives: Brinson and Smith are from Miami and George is from Fort Lauderdale.
- Both Brinson and George were ESPN300 prospects, while Smith was an Under Armour All-American.

"BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN!" NEWEST CHAIN COMES OUT VS. BAMA

- When DL **Jordan Miller** recovered a fumble in the third quarter of Miami's season opener vs. Alabama, fans across the country awaited the unveil of the newest turnover chain - version 5.0 for 2021.
- The chain has previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017), Sebastian the Ibis (2018), the notorious '305' Miami area code (2019) and the famous school logo inside the state of Florida (2020). The newest charm, in the shape of a Miami helmet, weighs one kilogram and is encrusted with 2,754 sapphires. The fifth iteration of the chain is 34 inches long and weighs 3.5 kilograms (with no charm).
- The chain took roughly three and a half months to complete, and was designed by famed jeweler Anthony "AJ the Jeweler" Machado. He is the architect behind all five chains and "Touchdown Rings."
- S James Williams has worn the turnover chain twice this season on interceptions against Pittsburgh and Central Conn. State, while S Avantae Williams wore it for the first time out last time out vs. Georgia Tech.
- From the start of 2017 - the year of unveiling of the first turnover chain - through 2020, UM was tied for third among all Power 5 programs in turnovers forced (92) and ranks No. 3 in turnovers forced per game (1.84).

SMITH HAS BEEN BALLING, HAS TOUCHDOWNS IN THREE OF LAST FOUR

- After seeing limited action in 2020 and finishing his true freshman season with just two catches, WR **Key'Shawn Smith** has played a big role for the Hurricanes' offense through the first 11 games - all of which he has started.
- Smith put together the best game of his collegiate career in a road win against Pittsburgh (Oct. 30), hauling in three catches - including a career-long 57-yard catch - and a 13-yard touchdown, the first of his career.
- He followed that with three catches, 35 yards and another touchdown in the win vs. Georgia Tech on Nov. 6. Smith earned a starting wide receiver spot after a strong offseason, and been up to the task with 32 catches totaling 399 yards through the first 10 games of the season. In UM's game against Michigan State, Smith finished with four catches totaling 50 yards. He had a career-best seven catches versus North Carolina.
- Originally a Washington State signee, Smith was able to join the Hurricanes after a coaching change in Pullman. A native of San Diego, the young speedster totaled 46 catches for 808 yards as a HS senior.

DEFENSE TIED FOR No. 10 IN FBS IN TFLs THROUGH FIRST TWELVE WEEKS

- Miami Football fans witness a familiar sight on Saturdays this fall as **Manny Diaz** assumed his responsibilities as playcaller and defensive coordinator; Diaz was defensive coordinator at Miami from 2016- 2019.
- Miami was one of just 11 teams in FBS and the only one from ACC to record 10 tackles for loss in Week 1.
- UM was tied for No. 10 in FBS tackles for loss after Week 12; Miami is averaging 7.3 tackles for loss per game.
- The Hurricanes defense has featured at least one player with 15 tackles for loss for three straight years; **Jaelan Phillips** (15.5) in 2020, **Gregory Rousseau** (19.5) in 2019 and **Jonathan Garvin** (18.0) in 2018.
- Including Diaz's time as head coach, Miami has had multiple defensive players record double-digit tackles for loss in four of his five seasons at The U, including Phillips (15.5) and Quincy Roche (14.5) a season ago.
- The Hurricanes are the only team since Diaz's arrival to Coral Gables in 2016 to rank among the top five in all of FBS in tackles for loss each year; Miami was No. 4 in 2020 (8.6 per game), No. 4 in 2019 (8.3), No. 1 in 2020 (10.5), No. 4 in 2017 (8.5) and No. 5 in 2016 (8.3). So far, Miami ranks No. 10 in FBS at 8.7 per game.

BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES NOW 4-5 FROM 40-50 YARDS THIS SEASON

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres "Andy" Borregales** entered his true freshman season at The U as Miami's starting placekicker for 2021.
- Earlier this year, Andy connected on a 55-yard field goal that was the longest by a freshman in UM history.
- After missing a kick off the uprights against Virginia as time expired in the fourth quarter, he rebounded with two field goals of 40+ yards in a close loss to North Carolina, hitting from both 44 yards and 42 yards.
- Andy connected on his lone two field goal attempts and one extra point attempt versus Alabama.
- The freshman went 3-for-4 vs. App State, including the game-winning 43-yard field goal with 2:04 left.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, finishing 20-for-22 on field goal attempts and a perfect 37-for-37 on extra point attempts. He passed on #30 to his brother.

UM SET NET PUNTING FBS RECORD IN 2021, HEDLEY A RAY GUY SEMIFINALIST

- A finalist for the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation's top punter a year ago, P **Lou Hedley** delivered one of the best seasons by a punter in FBS history in 2020. He was named a semifinalist for the 2021 Ray Guy Award.
- UM set the FBS record (minimum 40 punts) for net punting with an average of 44.96 yards per punt, besting the mark by San Diego State in 1996 (44.94). Hedley ranked second in FBS in punting (47.3).
- Hedley was named to the All-America Second Team by the Associated Press and the All-ACC Second Team. A former Australian Rules Football player, the 28-year-old Hedley hails from Mandurah Australia.
- The veteran averaged 47.4 yards on five punts versus Alabama with a long punt of 54 yards in Atlanta.

TRANSFER PORTAL ADDITIONS HAVE PLAYED BIG ROLES IN FIRST HALF

- Miami added several important players via transfer portal once again this offseason, including CB **Tyrique Stevenson** (from Georgia), WR **Charleston Rambo** (from Oklahoma), DE **Deandre Johnson** (from Tennessee) and OL **Justice Oluwaseun** (from UNLV). All have factored heavily into UM's 10 games half of 2021.
- Stevenson has 40 tackles and four PBUs, while Rambo leads Miami with 64 catches totaling 955 yards.

LASHLEE'S "POWER SPREAD" OFFENSE PAID DIVIDENDS IN YEAR ONE

- In his first year as Miami's offensive coordinator, **Rhett Lashlee's** installation of an up-tempo "power spread" offense made a clear impact for Miami. Lashlee joined the Hurricanes in January 2020 from SMU.
- In Lashlee's first season as coordinator in Coral Gables, the Hurricanes jumped to No. 32 in FBS in total offense (from No. 98), No. 29 in passing offense (from No. 52), No. 26 in scoring offense (from No. 90), No. 17 in red zone offense (from No. 122) and No. 20 in first downs gained offense (from No. 84).
- Joining Lashlee on the offensive coaching staff in 2020 were OL coach Garin Justice, who had served as an offensive coordinator at UNLV, and WR coach Rob Likens, who was an OC during his time at Arizona State.

MALLORY NEXT UP AT TIGHT END U, CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY

- Following the departure of TE **Brevin Jordan**, who declared for the NFL after a standout career at UM, veteran **Will Mallory** is next in line to carry the torch for the tight end factory that is Miami Football. Mallory has flashed the ability to be a dominant figure during his three seasons at The U; during a three-game injury absence for Jordan last year, Mallory totaled 10 catches, 187 yards and three touchdowns. He has started all 10 games.
- In his three seasons entering 2021, Mallory has totaled 43 receptions, 659 yards and seven TDs. He has 4 catches for 213 yards with three TDs in the last four games.
- A football legacy, Mallory's grandfather Bill Mallory is the winningest coach in Indiana University history. His father, Mike, spent last season as assistant special teams coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars.

HURRICANES SIGNED RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- The Hurricanes reeled in a top-10 recruiting class in 2021, nabbing signatures from 10 ESPN top 300 prospects and 10 players ranked in the 247Sports Composite Top 247. UM's class was rated #9 by ESPN. Miami signed 21 prospects during the early signing period, with 18 of them hailing from the state of Florida. 15 of those 21 players call either Miami-Dade, Broward or Palm Beach County home - otherwise known as "The State of Miami."
- The Hurricanes signed 10 players ranked in the Rivals' top 250 prospects for the Class of 2021.
- Four members were named to the Adidas All-American Bowl while another five players were named to the Under Armour All-America Game. Miami signed two five-star recruits for the first time since 2012.

VETERAN BACK HARRIS, NAMED ONE OF CFB'S "FREAKS" BUT WILL MISS REST OF SEASON

- RB **Cam'Ron Harris** cracked the annual "Freaks" list from college football writer Bruce Feldman of The Athletic, who named Harris No. 50 in his list of the top 100 freaky athletes in the sport entering 2021. Harris ran for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns in his first three seasons with the Hurricanes.
- Harris suffered a season-ending injury in Miami's loss at North Carolina and underwent surgery.
- Harris had posted back-to-back 100-yard games in two outings prior to the injury, marking the second time he has posted back-to-back performances and first time since doing it last year in the first two games.
- In a loss against Virginia (Sept. 30), Harris posted 111 yards on 14 carries with two touchdowns. Harris now has 22 career rushing touchdowns, which ranks 10th all-time at Miami. He surpassed Clinton Portis, who was previously 10th with 21 touchdowns, with his pair against the Cavaliers.

"In three seasons Harris has run for 1,385 yards and 17 touchdowns. At 5-10, 214 pounds, he hit 23.07 MPH, which is one of the fastest speeds registered by anyone, college or pro, in game action. His 75-yard touchdown run against Louisville is a good example of that burst. His 3-cone time of 6.88 would've topped any running back at the 2020 combine. Harris also squats 525 pounds and benches 365."

FOUR PROCANES, TWO FIRST ROUNDERS SELECTED IN 2021 NFL DRAFT

- Four Hurricanes were selected in the 2021 NFL Draft: **Jaelan Phillips** (first round, Miami), **Gregory Rousseau** (first round, Buffalo), **Brevin Jordan** (fifth round, Houston) and **Quincy Roche** (sixth round, Pittsburgh.). For 47 consecutive years, Miami has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft. With Phillips off the board at No. 18 and Rousseau at No. 30, UM had two first-round selections for the first time since 2015. UM had at least one DE drafted for the fifth straight year.
- The University of Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000 (123). No program in the ACC had more alumni on NFL 53-man rosters than the Hurricanes did entering Week 1 of the 2020 NFL season, when Miami boasted 31 former players and more who were on practice squads. Miami had 25 players on active 53-man rosters as of the roster cutting deadline entering 2021.

HURRICANES HAVE FEATURED NEW FACES, FIRST-TIME STARTERS IN 2021

- In addition to several key returners, the Miami Hurricanes have seen several newcomers and first-year starters feature through the first eight games of 2021. S **Kam Kinchens** made his first career start last time out.
- Miami's offense featured three new starters in the early going: WR **Key'Shawn Smith**, who saw limited action as a backup last year, WR **Charleston Rambo**, who transferred from Oklahoma and is in his first year at UM, and OL **Jalen Rivers**, who started at left guard but is out for the season to injury.
- In addition to those three players, OL **Justice Oluwaseun** - a UNLV transfer - has started, as has QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, who took over for QB **D'Eriq King** and has started the last seven games under center. On defense, LB **Corey Flagg** has started all 10 games while LB **Keontra Smith** started through the first two games before an injury versus App State. DE **Zach McCloud** and DE **Jahfari Harvey** are in their first full seasons as starters.
- S **James Williams** made the first start of his career in a win over Central Connecticut State (Sept. 25) and has started multiple straight games, as has S **Kam Kinchens**. CB **Tyrique Stevenson** is also in his first year with the Hurricanes in 2021.

D'ERIQ KING'S SEASON OVER DUE TO SURGERY FOR SHOULDER INJURY, WAS POISED FOR BIG SEASON

- QB **D'Eriq King** spent the first four seasons of his career at the University of Houston; 2021 marked the first time since high school he has had the same coordinator in back-to-back years (**Rhett Lashlee**). The veteran entered 2021 as one of just 11 quarterbacks in FBS with more than 30 career starts at QB.
- King was named a preseason watch list for several major awards, including the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Davey O'Brien Award (top quarterback) and the Maxwell Award (player of the year). The Manvel, Texas native is responsible for more than 11,000 yards during his illustrious career - 8,378 passing yards, 2,055 rushing yards, 520 receiving yards, 29 punt return yards and 260 kick return yards - a total of 11,242. He totaled 3,224 yards (2,686 passing, 538 rushing) in 2020.
- King set an FBS record with at least one rushing touchdown and one passing touchdown in 16 straight games, a streak that ended at Louisville in 2020; he bested Florida QB Tim Tebow's FBS record (15). King became the first Miami QB in history to rush for 100 yards in a game in a win at NC State in 2020.

MANNY DIAZ

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (THIRD OVERALL) | 20-15

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

In his most recent season as head coach of the Hurricanes in 2020, Diaz led Miami to an 8-3 overall record, including a 7-2 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play, and an appearance in the Cheez-It Bowl. Miami won seven games in ACC play for the second time with Diaz on staff (2017) and the third time overall.

During his 20-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 19 bowl games, amassing a 13-6 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories,

including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition. Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee.

Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
