QUICK HITS

LAST TIME OUT

- Miami won a five-set barn burner at Florida State on Nov. 19.
- Savannah Vach posted a double-double with a match-high 58 assists and 21 digs.
- Angela Grieve led all hitters with 23 kills.
- Priscilla Hernandez notched a match-best 25 digs.

HISTORICALLY AGAINST NORTH CAROLINA

- Miami has won the last two meetings, including a five-set thriller earlier this season on Oct. 1 in Coral Gables.
- In this year's meeting, the Canes recorded a season-high 174 attacks.
- The Hurricanes finished the match with 14 blocks.
- Savannah Vach recorded a double-double on Oct. 1 with a match-best 49 assists and 15 digs. She added four kills and four blocks in the win.
- Priscilla Hernandez led Miami in the victory with 20 digs, while Angela Grieve led the team with 18 kills.

SCOUTING THE TAR HEELS

- North Carolina has won its last two matches, including a sweep over Virginia in its last contest on Nov. 14.
- UNC is fifth in the ACC with a .255 hitting percentage this year, while having the fourth-lowest opponent hitting percentage of .194.
- Kaya Merkler's .360 hitting percentage ranks fifth in the conference and Amanda Phegley is ninth with a mark of .333.
- Meghan Neelon is 10th in the ACC with 8.31 assists per set.
- Nia Robinson and Mabrey Shaffmaster are both ranked in the top-10 in the conference in kills per set. Robinson is fifth (3.79) and Shaffmaster is 10th (3.38).
- Karenna Wurl is currently third in the ACC with 4.08 digs per set.

VOTE MIAMI

- For the sixth straight week, Miami is receiving votes in the AVCA Poll.
- UM has been ranked in the AVCA Poll 15 times, the highest ranking, in a non-COVID year, being 20th on Sept. 12, 2011.
- The Canes are currently 15th in the RPI, on track to be the highest final RPI in a season for the program.

SNAPPING STREAKS

- Miami earned the season sweep over Florida State after its 3-2 win on Nov. 19.
- The season sweep marks the first for the program since the 2008 season.
- UM's win at Florida State is the first in Tallahassee since Nov. 26, 2010.
- The road win at FSU is the first under head coach Jose "Keno" Gandara.

FULL TEAM EFFORT

- The Hurricanes had five players record double-digit kills and four notch double-digit digs in their win over FSU on Nov. 19.
- Angela Grieve led the match with 16 kills, while Peyman Yardimci added 16. The trio of Aristea Tontai, Janice Leao and Janet Kalaniuvalu each registered 10 kills.
- Priscilla Hernandez led the game with 25 digs and Savannah Vach tallied 21 in the win. Peyman Yardimci totaled 11, while Emily Damon had 12 digs.
- Miami has had seven matches this season with four or more players posting double-digit kills.

DOUBLE THE FUN

- Vach posted her team leading ninth double-double of the year on Nov. 19 against Florida State with a match-best 58 assists and career-high 21 digs. She has 25 in her career.
- Peyman Yardimci notched her third career double-double against FSU with 16 kills and 11 digs.

SEASON HIGH OUTING

- Miami tabbed season-best marks of 71 kills and 67 assists in its win over FSU on Nov. 19.
- The Canes have posted 60 or more kills and 60 or more assists in a match four times this season.

MILESTONE MARKER

- Head coach Jose "Keno" Gandara earned his 100th career ACC win on Nov. 13, following Miami's 3-1 victory over Clemson.

BLOCK PARTY

- Miami's 15 blocks at Clemson on Nov. 7 tie a season-best mark that was set Oct. 3 against NC State.
- The Canes have 10 games this year with double-digit blocks.

PEN TO PAPER

- Miami welcomed Cianna Tejada to the family on National Signing Day.
- Tejada is a 6' 1" middle blocker and outside hitter from Pompano Beach, Fla.

BREAK OUT THE BROOMS

- Miami has earned sweeps in 15 of its 22 wins this year. The four non-sweeps include four set wins over USF on Sept. 3 and FSU on Oct. 6, and a pair of five set wins over North Carolina on Oct. 1 and Wake Forest on Oct. 22.
- The Canes 15 sweeps is the most in a season since 2011 when they finished the year with 15 sweeps.
- The 15 sweeps ties the most in a year since Miami joined the ACC in 2004.

WEEKLY HONORS

- Peyman Yardimci was tabbed ACC Freshman of the Week on Nov. 2 for her play against Syracuse and Boston College.
- The freshman outside hitter helped Miami to a 2-0 weekend over the Orange and BC.
- The Istanbul, Turkey native, posted a combined 22 kills with a .391 attacking percentage in the two matches.

GOING FOR THE KILL

- Angela Grieve has appeared in all 26 matches this season, recording

50 PIECE

• Savannah Vach has four matches this season with 50 or more assists. She posted 51 against Florida State (Oct. 6), 57 at Wake Forest (Oct. 22), 56 against Syracuse (Oct. 29) and a season-high 58 at Florida State (Nov. 19).

FIRST TIME IN A LONG TIME

• Miami's reverse sweep against Wake Forest, Oct. 22, is the first since Aug. 25, 2017, against Southern Miss.

NATIONALLY RANKED

- Janice Leao's 1.37 blocks per set is 11th in the entire NCAA. She is 23rd with 126 total blocks.
- Savannah Vach is one of 24 players in the country with at least one triple-double this season.
- Vach's 11.06 assists per set is 16th best in all of Division I.
- Vach is ranked 10th among active players with 10.59 assists per set in her career.
- Miami is 24th in the nation with a blocks per set mark of 2.58.

TOP OF THE CONFERENCE

- Miami has been strong on the receiving end of attacks this season, posting the second-highest digs per set mark in the ACC at 15.18.
- At the net, the Canes have been a force with the third-lowest marks for opponent hitting percentage (.184).
- The Hurricanes mark of 2.58 blocks per set is the third-most in the ACC. Their 237 blocks rank sixth.
- Miami is averaging 12.68 assists per set, which is the fourth best in the conference.
- The Canes are fourth in the ACC with 13.70 kills per set.
- Miami's .253 hitting percentage is sixth in the conference.

CANES IN THE ACC

- Janice Leao is third in the conference with 1.37 blocks per game and second with 126 total blocks this year. She is eighth with a .336 hitting percentage.
- Savannah Vach is second in assists (984) and assists per set (11.06).
- Priscilla Hernandez sits fourth with a season mark of 377 digs. She is second with 4.10 digs per set.
- Aristea Tontai's 1.11 blocks per set is ninth in the conference.
- Angela Grieve is sixth in the ACC in kills (335) and kills per set (3.72).

SET UP FOR SUCCESS

- Miami has won 70 of its 89 sets played this season, posting a set win percentage of .787.

EXTRA VOLLEYBALL

- The Canes have played extra volleyball five times this season with four coming in the first set and one in a third set.
- Miami took its first set against North Carolina (29-27), NC State (32-30), and Duke (26-24). It fell, 27-25, to Florida State.
- The Canes took a 32-30 third set win over No. 14 Georgia Tech (Nov. 5).

YET TO LOSE

- UM holds a 18-0 record when it wins the first two sets this season.
- The Hurricanes are 8-0 in matches played on a Sunday this year, along with a perfect 24-0 in Sunday sets played.
- UM is 16-0 in matches where it has recorded more blocks than the opponent.
- When Miami posts more kills, it is 18-0 this season.

TRIPLE THE EXCITEMENT

- Savannah Vach notched her first career triple-double at the Sunshine State Classic against UCF (Sept. 16) with 16 kills, 28 assists, and 11 digs.
- The triple-double is the first to be recorded since head coach Jose "Keno" Gandara took the helm in 2013.

NEXT UP

- Miami returns home on Nov. 23 for its regular season finale and senior day at 3 p.m. against Wake Forest in the Knight Sports Complex.

Jose "Keno" Gandara accepted the position of head volleyball coach at the University of Miami on March 20, 2013, becoming the second head coach since the program returned in 2001.

The Hurricanes returned the NCAA Championship in 2017 for the fourth time in five seasons under Gandara's leadership. Miami won its first postseason match since 2014, defeating the College of Charleston in the opening round of the tournament in a Gainesville, Fla. The Canes fell to No. 2 Florida in four sets in an exciting second round matchup to close the season 22-6 and finish with their best winning percentage since 2012.

Senior outside hitter Olga Strantzali was named ACC Player of the Year and AVCA East Coast Region Player of the Year. Strantzali was joined by redshirt junior setter Haley Templeton on the All-ACC First Team and AVCA All-East Coast Region team. Strantzali and Templeton topped off a memorable season with AVCA All-America Honorable Mention recognition. The Canes both started and finished the campaign strong, winning the first nine matches and the seven contests prior to falling to second-seeded Florida. Miami topped the ACC in service aces with 1.71 per set and finished the season in the top three of two additional categories – hitting percentage (second with .246) and kills (tied for third with 13.64 per set).

In 2016, Gandara led a resilient Miami squad that proved to rise to the occasion when it stepped into an opponent's gym. The 2016 Hurricanes won 11 matches away from Coral Gables, picking up big road wins at Notre Dame and Louisville. Junior outside hitter Olga Strantzali developed into one of the best players in the country, receiving AVCA All-America honorable mention and earned AVCA All-East Coast Region and First Team All-ACC honors. Strantzali and freshman setter Hannah Sorensen were named to the All-ACC Academic Team in recognition of their success on the court and in the classroom.

Gandara led the Hurricanes to three straight NCAA Tournaments in his first three seasons at the helm of the Miami volleyball program. The Canes were selected to the 2015 NCAA Tournament, where they faced Iowa State in a first round match in Madison, Wis. The Canes finished the season 21-10 and 14-6 in the ACC, while Miami's 21 wins marked the second consecutive 20-win season under Gandara's leadership. The Hurricanes saw seniors Alexis Mourning and Taylor Scott, as well as sophomores Olga Strantzali and Haley Templeton, named to the 2015 All-ACC Second Team with Strantzali and Templeton also earning AVCA All-East Coast Region Honorable Mention.

Miami reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth consecutive season in 2014 and seventh time in program history. The Hurricanes, who finished the season 22-9, defeated UCF in five sets in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The victory was Gandara's first NCAA Tournament win as a head coach. Miami's 22 wins also gave Gandara his first 20-win season at the helm of the program.

The Canes reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament before falling to No. 8 Florida in four sets. But Gandara helped develop several players to reach unprecedented levels of success.

Senior outside hitter Savanah Leaf was named 2014 ACC Player of the Year and a second team AVCA All-American, while freshman Haley Templeton earned ACC Freshman of the Year honors. Leaf was joined by senior middle blocker Emani Sims on the All-ACC First Team, while Templeton was picked for the All-ACC Second Team and the All-ACC Freshman Team. The accolades continued for the trio as Leaf and Sims were named AVCA East Coast All-Region selections and Templeton was tabbed as the AVCA East Coast Region Freshman of the Year.

The 2013 season was filled with firsts for Gandara. He secured his first win as a NCAA head coach on Aug. 30, when Miami defeated Austin Peay, 3-1. Gandara collected his first home win when Miami beat LSU in five sets on Sept. 14. The first-year head coach tallied his first ACC win when the Canes defeated Boston College in five sets on Sept. 28. Gandara also guided the Canes to their fifth straight NCAA Tournament appearance and first under his tutelage.

The Hurricanes dropped their first-round match against Oregon in three sets, but 2013 was still a successful first season under Gandara. Miami had four players earn All-ACC distinction, including Savanah Leaf and Emani Sims (first team), Alexis Mourning (second team) and Ryan Shaffer (third team). The Canes defeated No. 12 North Carolina at home and earned one of the coveted 64 spots in the NCAA Tournament.

Gandara came to Miami after spending eight years as an assistant at the University of Washington. He previously served as an assistant at UNLV and his alma mater, UC Santa Barbara.

Gandara is a highly respected teacher who has played and coached at the top levels of college and professional volleyball. Keno assisted former Washington head coach Jim McLaughlin with all aspects of coaching, including opponent scouting and contributing to the Huskies' defensive package. The Huskies won a National Championship in Keno's first year on staff, 2005, and reached the 2006 Final Four.

Gandara began his coaching career at UCSB in 1992 as an assistant with the men's team and was an assistant with the women's team in 1994. He also spent one season as a head coach/player with the San Juan Volleyball club in the Puerto Rico Professional League.

A San Juan, Puerto Rico, native, Gandara graduated from UC Santa Barbara in 1990 after a successful volleyball career with the Gauchos as a middle blocker. Gandara was a first team All-America selection in 1989 and second team selection in 1988 after leading UCSB to the national title match. He was also a two-time all-conference honoree. Gandara has also been inducted into the UCSB Hall of Fame. He also represented both the United States and Puerto Rico in international competition as a member of their respective national volleyball teams.

Gandara is married to Stephanie Cox who was a standout setter at UCSB and played on the AVP Tour. The couple welcomed their first child, a son named Lucas, in April 2011.






