STORYLINES

- No. 8/8 Maryland (6-2) will host Miami (4-2) Thursday at 8 p.m. in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. The Terrapins are 11-2 all-time in the Challenge, winning four of their last five matchups in the event.
- The Terrapins fell to No. 7 Stanford, 86-68, Saturday in the Baha Mar Hoops Pink Flamingo Championship in the Bahamas. Ashley Owusu scored 30 points, 22 in the second half, and went 11-11 from the foul line to lead the Terps. Maryland won the second half, 44-40 but fell short after missing five players.
- Maryland is 11-5 all-time vs. Miami and 3-2 vs. the Hurricanes at the XFINITY Center. Most recently, the Terps won 79-71 in Coral Gables on Nov. 26, 2017. Maryland has won three straight in the series, dating back to Jan. 10, 2013.
- Maryland is ranked No. 8 in the AP Top 25 released Nov. 29.
- The Terps were picked to win the Big Ten by the league's head coaches and media panel. Ashley Owusu and Diamond Miller were both named to the 10-player Preseason All-Big Ten Team.
- The 2021-22 Terrapins return all five starters from last year's Big Ten championship squad. The Terps also return 10 of 11 letterwinners and 93 percent of their scoring from last year's team that led the nation in scoring (90.8)
- Four Terps were named to watch lists for national player of the year for their respective positions. Owusu was named to the Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List (point guard), Miller and Katie Benzan were named to the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List (shooting guard) and Chloe Bibby was named to the Cheryl Miller Award Watch List (small forward).
- Maryland led the nation in scoring with 90.8 points per game and in assist/turnover ratio (1.69). The Terrapins were No. 2 in the NCAA in three-point percentage (40.0%) and were third in the country in field goal percentage (49.5%). In 2020-21, the Terrapins set program records in free throw percentage (79.0%) and in assists (20.0).

• Head coach Brenda Frese was named National Coach of the Year by the AP, The Athletic and ESPN at the end of the 2020-21 season. Ashley Owusu won the 2021 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. Owusu and Katie Benzan earned AP All-America honors.

► 2021-22 SEASON OUTLOOK

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Returning 10 of 11 letterwinners and all five starters from a team that led the nation in scoring, expectations and excitement are high in College Park for the 2021-22 Terrapins. The Terps are ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press preseason poll and No. 5 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. They were picked to win the Big Ten by both the league's head coaches and media panel.

The Terrapins return 93 percent of their scoring from last year's team that led the country and set a program record with 90.8 points per game. They return players that averaged 84 of the 91 points per game. The Terps also led the nation in assist/turnover ratio (1.69).

"Obviously, there is a lot to look forward to this upcoming season," head coach Brenda Frese said at the team's media day. "You start with the polls of preseason, being the 4th-ranked team in the country. And you know I think it's extremely special when you talk about it starting with all three of our seniors choosing to come back and take that additional year with us.

"We return Katie Benzan, the No. 1 3-point shooter in the country last year at 50 percent. You talk about Chloe Bibby and her experience throughout the NCAA Tournament and post season, as well as her leadership. To me, that's something that has really stood out here in our first couple of weeks of practice. And lastly, the return of Channise Lewis through all the injuries and knee injuries that she has had to

be able to finally have her return to the court is something that we're really really looking forward to."

Last year's NCAA Tournament appearance was the first NCAA Tournament experience for all but just two of the 12 players on the roster. The experience, though disappointing with an early exit, is extremely valuable.

"I think for us being able to have the experience of our underclassmen, now having an NCAA Tournament under their belts, going through a season like no other last year, bodes well for this team in the upcoming year," Frese said. "When you talk about returning 93 percent of your scoring at 91 points per game, first in assist turnover ratio last season and returning all five of your starters, six who average in double figures. Our job as a coaching staff is you know to be able to put this team and these players in great positions to be successful."

Complete The MI22ION

Every off-season, the Terrapin coaching staff meets to discuss the upcoming season. One topic on the agenda is a team theme for each year's group. This year's theme is, "Complete the MI22ION."

"We wanted to set out big picture goal early," Frese said. "We truly believe this group has a chance to do some really special things, especially in the postseason, which will be in 2022, which is where the

2s come in. I think talking about our goals only helps prepare us for the road ahead. This is also about keeping our eyes on that mission. There are tons of steps along the way to a big goal like we have, but how do they help us get to that destination? That's what we are focused on."

Toughest Schedule in the Country

The Terrapins will play one of the toughest schedules in the country, playing six of the other nine teams in the AP Preseason top 10, including No. 1 South Carolina, No. 3 Stanford, No. 5 NC State, No. 7 Baylor, No. 8 Indiana, No. 9 Iowa, as well as No. 11 Michigan and No. 17 Ohio State in league play. The tough schedule was no accident - the scheduling was intentional to see where the Terps are throughout the season.

"One thing about this team that I can say separates a lot of teams is just their competitiveness," Frese said. "If you do take an early loss, just having that perspective, but as the ultimate competitors that they are, you know they're going to want to fix it. I think that's where we're at as a staff is we don't want to be surprised in March. We want to know in November, December and then as we're going to conference play to find all the strengths we have and then be able to make sure we fix the weaknesses to prepare us for postseason."

Back to a Sense of Normalcy

The experience of playing during a pandemic was quite an extraordinary one. The Terrapins were Covid-tested nearly every day from November thru March. They ate many meals alone in hotel rooms. They wore masks on the bench and played without friends, family and fans in the stands.

Because of the Covid restrictions, the Terrapins did not work out or have any team practices in the summer of 2020 as they normally would have. With four new key pieces, they had a lot to learn when they were finally able to come together in-person in October.

"We've had a lot more practices to build upon," Frese said. "Last year, it felt like we had a couple weeks in and then we were playing games. This year, they had all summer to be here with our strength and conditioning coach as well as our coaches for their player development. We have really been able to add a lot and have gotten a lot further in practice than we've ever been with that experience. I think in the last year, you saw the offensive side that we were very talented. We didn't get to spend as much time defensively, just not having the amount of days as we would in a normal year. I think that's the exciting part right now is that we've been able to put the defense in and implement it like you normally would, which is quite different from a year ago. Being able to put both sides together will be key."

Newcomers

The Terps welcome two freshmen in Shyanne Sellers and Emma Chardon. Sellers came to College Park in June and spent the summer working out and getting accustomed to life in College Park. Chardon played with the Swiss National Team in Euro qualifiers. She came to College Park in August.

"We're really excited about the future of our freshmen, Shyanne and Emma," Frese said. "Shyanne is extremely confident and is really getting comfortable within our system. She is tough and will make the efforts plays. Since Emma came later, she's still acclimating, but her ceiling is so high."

Staff

The Terrapins will see some staff consistency and welcome two familiar faces to the sidelines in 2021-22. Associate head coach Karen Blair enters her fourth season at Maryland. She was named the WBCA's Assistant Coach of the Year in 2020.

Kaitlynn Fratz enters her fourth season as an assistant and works a lot with the Terrapins' defense. Lindsey Spann was promoted to assistant coach last summer after serving as the Director of Recruiting Operations for a season.

Joe Glowacki is in his sixth year on staff and third as the Terrapins' Director of Video. Frese hired Jessica Imhof to work as the program's Director of Scouting and Player Development last season.

Frese hired back former manager and Terrapin alum Ryland Adkins as the Director of Operations this past summer. Adkins was a manager and operations intern under former Director of Operations Libby Ellis. Adkins graduated from Maryland in 2016, then went on to be the Director of Basketball Operations at Furman, Bucknell and Richmond over the past five seasons.

"We are thrilled to welcome Ryland back home," Frese said. "As a Terp alum and manager for us, Ryland was always someone we could count on. She has gained invaluable experience in her time away and I know she will be outstanding for us with the passion she has for Maryland and our program. Our student-athletes will be well-served by her. She will be a tremendous addition to our team and family."

Frese also welcomes former Terp Sarah Myers to the staff as the Director of Recruiting Operations. Myers helped the Terps to two Big Ten regular season titles, a Big Ten Tournament title and the 2017 Sweet Sixteen. Myers saw action in 82 games for Maryland. She earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, was named a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar and earned both the Big Ten Sportsmanship and Outstanding Sportsmanship Awards. Myers won the 2019 James F. Kehoe Award for outstanding sportsmanship among Maryland female student-athletes.

"We are thrilled to bring Sarah back home," Frese said. "As a former alum of our program Sarah has always had dreams of coaching that she shared with me as a student-athlete. It's awesome to turn that dream into a reality. She will be a tremendous addition to our players and staff. She will be very hands-on in her new role as the Director of Recruiting Operations. Sarah is someone who has always bled Maryland and I am so happy we have been able to bring her back to be a part of our program. It's a great day to be a Terp!"

Storylines

- Head coach Brenda Frese was named National Coach of the Year by the AP, The Athletic and ESPN at the end of the 2020-21 season. Ashley Owusu won the 2021 Ann Meyers Drysdale Award. Owusu and Benzan earned AP All-America honors.
 - Last year, the Terps won 15 straight games from Jan. 28 through the NCAA Tournament Second Round. They earned a record of 26-3 and went 17-1 in conference play.
 - Maryland led the nation in scoring with 90.8 points per game and in assist/turnover ratio (1.69). The Terrapins were No. 2 in the NCAA in three-point percentage (40.0%) and were third in the country in field goal percentage (49.5%).
 - The Terrapins set program records in free throw percentage (79.0%) and in assists (20.0).
 - The Terps won the Big Ten regular season title and won their fifth Big Ten championship in seven years last year. Owusu and Miller were Big Ten Tournament Co-MOPs.
 - Ashley Owusu and Diamond Miller earned All-Big Ten First Team honors and Katie Benzan was named to the Second Team. Chloe Bibby and Mimi Collins earned Honorable Mention honors, Angel Reese was named to the All-Freshman Team and Channise Lewis earned a Sportsmanship Award.
 - The Terps have earned a record of 128-15 (.895) in Big Ten play, including their 19-2 record in the Big Ten Tournament. They are 139-19 (.880) against Big Ten opponents in the 19 years under Brenda Frese. Since joining the league in 2014, Maryland is 56-4 (.933) against Big Ten teams in XFINITY Center.
 - Brenda Frese signed a multi-year extension in June 2021 which will keep her at Maryland through at least 2027. She's brought the program its first national championship, three Final Fours, six Elite Eights and 18 NCAA Tournament bids in her 20 postseasons. Frese has also brought in 15 top 15 recruiting classes and brought home 14 conference titles.
- ## Milestones, Streaks, Etc.
- Over the last four seasons, the Terps are 58-2 when they score 80 points or more, including 19 straight matchups.
 - The Terrapins hit a Big Ten-record 21 three-pointers on Dec. 3, 2020 vs. Towson. The previous record was 19, set by Iowa in 2015 and Minnesota in 2016.
 - The Terrapins' 115 points vs. No. 14 Arkansas on Nov. 29, 2020 are the most-ever for a Big Ten team over a ranked opponent.
 - The Terps' and Arkansas' combined 211 points in the Nov. 29 matchup set a program record.
 - Maryland tied the Big Ten record and set a program record for points in a quarter twice last year with 41 - (vs. Arkansas, 3Q and vs. Iowa, 1Q).
 - The Terps have won 28 straight home games since Nov. 17, 2019 when they beat Delaware, 99-55. The Terrapins are tied with Stephen F. Austin for the longest active streak in the country.
 - Frese earned her 500th career win with an 81-63 victory at Nebraska on Jan. 8, 2019. She owns a record of 575-163 (.779) over her 23-year coaching career.
 - Frese became the winningest coach in Maryland basketball history with a 95-73 win at Nebraska on Feb. 14, 2021. With the win, she picked up win No. 500 at Maryland, which put her ahead of former head coach Chris Weller on the all-time wins list.
 - Maryland's 68 points in the first half vs. Iowa (2/23/21) were the most-ever by a Big Ten team in

conference play.

- Benzan hit went 9-10 from outside the arc vs. Iowa (2/23/21), which set a program record for threes made in a game and for 3-point FG% in a game.
- With 11 points on Nov. 12 vs. Villanova, Chloe Bibby reached the 1,000-career points mark. She scored 609 career points in three seasons at Mississippi State. She's scored 475 points in her time at Maryland.
- Katie Benzan made 93 three-pointers last year. The program record for threes made in a season is 95 made by Taylor Mikesell in 2018-19.
- Ashley Owusu scored 24 points vs. No. 6 Baylor on Nov. 21 to reach the 1,000 career points mark. She is the 35th Terrapin to reach the mark.
- As a program, Maryland has earned a record of 1,061-435 (.709) and is the 12th NCAA Division I team to reach 1,000 wins.

All Gas, No Brakes!

- The Terrapins averaged 90.8 points per game last year, which led the country and set a program record. Maryland's team scoring record was 89.6 points per game by the 1977-78 team. No other team in program history averaged over 90 points per game.
- Maryland was the only school in the country with six players averaging in double figures.
- Ashley Owusu was the Terrapins' leading scorer with 17.9 points per game, which also set a program record for a sophomore.
- Owusu was also second in the Big Ten in assists (17.1), sixth in scoring (17.9), seventh in field goal percentage (.493) and 11th in free throw percentage (.762).
- Katie Benzan led the country in three-point percentage (.500) and was fourth in threes made (93).

Terps in the Polls

Maryland is one of the most consistent winning programs in the country. The Terrapins have been ranked in 215 straight Associated Press polls, dating back to the preseason poll of the 2010-11 season. That mark is behind just Baylor (340 weeks) and Connecticut (530 weeks).

- Overall, the Terps have been ranked in 531 AP polls.
- Maryland has been ranked for 266 weeks in the last 18 seasons, with 207 of those weeks in the AP top 10 and 92 in the AP top 5.
- Brenda Frese has had a team ranked in 317 weeks in her career.
- Maryland has started the season ranked in the last 12 seasons straight and 17 of head coach Brenda Frese's 20 seasons in College Park. The Terps have been in the AP Preseason Top 10 11 times under Frese and in the top five six times.

Terps vs. Ranked Teams Under Frese

Since Brenda Frese took over in 2002-03, Maryland has 81 wins over Associated Press top 25 teams, including 11 in the 2014-15 season, which set a new school record.

- Most recently, No. 3 Maryland beat No. 8 Baylor, 79-76, in College Park on Nov. 21.
- Maryland had seven wins over ranked teams in 2019-20.
- In 2014-15, the Terps won at No. 12 Nebraska, 75-47, on Jan. 3, at No. 23 Minnesota, 77-73, on Jan. 11, at No. 22 Rutgers, 71-59, on Jan. 15, vs. No. 20 Iowa, 93-88, on Feb. 1, vs. No. 19 Nebraska, 59-47, on Feb. 8, at No. 25 Northwestern, 69-48, on March 1, over Northwestern again, 74-63, on March 7, against No.

13 Princeton in the NCAA Second Round and over No. 16 Duke, 65-55, in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen. Most recently, Maryland beat No. 6 Tennessee, 58-48, in the Elite Eight on March 30.

- The Terps won 10 games over ranked teams in the 2005-06 season, including six over top 10 opponents and four over top five teams.

- The Terrapins are 81-64 against ranked teams over the last 18 years, all under Frese. Twenty-three of those wins were on the road and 21 were at neutral sites.

- Under Frese, Maryland has 24 wins over AP top 10 teams, most recently a 79-76 win over No. 6 Baylor on Nov. 21.

- Maryland has five wins over No. 1 teams in its history, including two in Frese's time. The Terrapins beat No. 1 North Carolina twice in the 2005-06 season.

Maryland in the B1G

- The Terps are 170-45 (.791) all-time against their Big Ten opponents.

- Since joining the Big Ten in 2014-15, the Terrapins are 128-15 (.895) vs. their conference opponents, including their 19-2 record in the Big Ten Tournament.

- In the 19 years under Frese, the Terps are 139-19 (.880) against their Big Ten opponents.

- Frese is 152-24 (.864) all-time vs. Big Ten opponents, which includes her time at Minnesota and at Ball State.

- Since joining the league in 2014, Maryland is 56-4 (.933) against Big Ten teams at home.

- With their 70-57 win at Ohio State's Value City Arena on Jan. 24, 2019, the Terrapins have won in every Big Ten arena since joining the league in the 2014-15 season.

- Since their first year in the Big Ten, the Terps are 101-0 when holding their league opponents to 70 points or less. The Terrapins are also 113-7 when they score 70 points or more.

- In her one season at Minnesota, Frese led the Gophers to a record of 22-8 overall, 11-5 in Big Ten play and an NCAA Tournament berth. She was named AP National Coach of the Year in April 2002.

Home Sweet Home

Maryland has been a dominant home team, especially over the last decade.

- The Terps are 571-136 (.808) all time in College Park, dating back to the inaugural 1971-72 season.

- Maryland is 277-41 (.871) at home under Brenda Frese, whose first season in College Park was the inaugural season of XFINITY Center. That is among the top 10 toughest places to play in the country.

- The Terrapins are 157-11 (.934) all-time in non-conference games in XFINITY Center.

- Prior to Jan. 2, 2016, Maryland had won 28 straight home games since a 94-46 win over Pittsburgh on Feb. 6, 2014.

- The Terps won 48 straight home games starting Nov. 9, 2007 with a 76-52 season-opening win over Princeton. The streak ended on Jan. 21, 2010 with an 80-77 loss to Miami.

Overtime is Our Time

The phrase, "Overtime is our time!" became one of the catch phrases from the Terps' 2006 NCAA title run. That 2005-06 team went 6-0 in overtime games and won the national title in extra time vs. Duke.

- The Terrapins currently have the longest active streak in the country without an overtime game at 282 straight games. Their last overtime game was a 92-81 win over Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament Quarterfinals on March 8, 2013.

- Maryland is 15-2 (.882) in overtime games in head coach Brenda Frese's 20 years.

- In the 2007-08 season, Frese was not on the sidelines for two of the Terps' overtime games. She missed a 97-86 double overtime loss at North Carolina on Jan. 26, 2008 and a 74-71 win at Virginia Tech on Feb. 4, 2008, due to her pregnancy with her sons.

- The Terps' only overtime loss with Frese on the sidelines was a 95-91 loss at Florida State on Jan. 16, 2005.

Terps In the Pros

- Eighteen Terrapins have been drafted since the start of the WNBA in 1997, including 14 under Brenda Frese.

- Eight of Frese's players have been drafted in the top 10, including: Crystal Langhorne (2008, 6th overall), Laura Harper (2008, 10th overall), Marissa Coleman (2009, 2nd overall), Kristi Toliver (2009, 3rd overall), Tianna Hawkins (2013, 6th overall), Alyssa Thomas

- Four former Terrapins have won WNBA Championships - Crystal Langhorne (Storm, 2018), Kristi Toliver (Sparks, 2016; Mystics, 2019), Shatori Walker-Kimbrough (Mystics, 2019) and Tianna Hawkins (Mystics, 2019).
- Maryland had five alums in the 2019 Finals as the Connecticut Sun played the Washington Mystics. Alyssa Thomas, Brionna Jones and the Sun took on Toliver, Walker-Kimbrough and Hawkins on the Mystics. Five alums was more than any other school.
- Four Terps played in the 2018 WNBA Finals - Walker-Kimbrough, Toliver, Hawkins and Langhorne. Four alums in the Finals was more than any other school.
- Five former Terps have been named WNBA All-Stars - Vicky Bullett (1999), Crystal Langhorne (2011, 2013), Kristi Toliver (2013), Marissa Coleman (2015) and Alyssa Thomas (2017, 2019), Brionna Jones (2021).
- Walker-Kimbrough made the WNBA All-Rookie Team in 2017. Thomas made the squad in 2014.
- Brionna Jones was named the WNBA's Most Improved Player in 2021.

Frese Welcomes Top Ten Class

Frese and her staff signed two top recruits that make up the No. 10 class in the country, as ranked by All Star Girls Report. Ava Sciolla (Fairless Hills, Pa.) and Mila Reynolds (South Bend, Ind.) are both rising talents. Reynolds, a 6-3 forward, is ranked No. 37 overall by ASGR and Sciolla, a 6-0 guard, is ranked No. 77.

- Reynolds averaged 19 points and nine rebounds a game as a junior in the 2020-21 season. She was named NIC (Northern Indiana Conference) MVP as a junior and to the First Team in all three seasons. She was named to the Jersey Mike's Naismith High School Underclassmen Girls Watch List in November.
- Sciolla averaged 17.0 points per game as a junior last season. She is the fastest female in Pennsbury history to reach the 1,000 career points mark. She helped her Pennsbury team win two Suburban One League (SOL) titles in 2020 and 2021. Her team also finished as runner-up in the district in 2020. Sciolla was named to the All-State 6A First Team in 2021.

USA Terps!

- Diamond Miller and Ashley Owusu competed in the AmeriCup in Puerto Rico this summer. They helped the US win gold with a 74-59 win over Puerto Rico in the final.
- Owusu averaged 5.8 points, 3.2 rebound and 3.0 assists in the six games. She scored eight points with three assists and three boards in the gold medal game.
- This marked Miller's third gold medal with USA Basketball, after she helped the USA to the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup and the 2017 FIBA U16 World Cup titles. This is Owusu's first gold medal with the USA.
- Katie Benzan, Mimi Collins, Faith Masonius and Angel Reese competed in the USA Basketball 3X Nationals in June in Springfield, Mass.
- They lost three heartbreakers in the preliminary rounds, then battled to beat a team called Legacy in the quarterfinals, 10-9, then beat Oregon, 19-14 in the semifinals. The Terps fell to a team called Force 10 in the finals, 16-10.
- The Terrapins finished second in the final standings - higher than any of the other college teams from Oregon, Louisville, NC State or Kansas State.

Next Level

Over the last few years, seven members of Frese's

team have made the jump to become head coaches or work in the NBA.

- Kristi Toliver was hired as an assistant coach for the Dallas Mavericks in 2021. She served on the Wizards' staff as an asst coach/player development staff member in 2019.
- Former practice player and intern Ryan Richman was hired as the Wizards' assistant coach in 2018.
- Former practice player and intern Winston Gandy spent three seasons as the Coordinator of Player Development for the Wizards before taking an assistant coaching job with the WBB program at Rice. He is now an assistant coach at Duke.
- In April 2015, associate head coach Tina Langley accepted the head coaching position at Rice. She is now the head coach at Washington.

Terps in the Classroom

The Terrapins have a 100 percent graduation rate in the 20 years under Brenda Frese.

- Former Terp Kristen Confroy graduated with her degree in Physiology and Neurobiology major in May. She enrolled in Wake Forest's medical school last fall.
- Former Terp Malina Howard is in her second year in medical school at the University of Maryland in Baltimore.

Frese For the Win

Head coach Brenda Frese's current career winning percentage is .779, which is the highest career percentage of all Big Ten head men's and women's basketball head coaches in their Division I careers.

Terps 1,000!

With their 73-72 win over Michigan on March 9, 2019, Maryland became the 12th Division I program to reach 1,000 wins.

- The Terps currently own a program record of 1,061-435 (.709). Their winning percentage is No. 11 in NCAA history.

Fear the Turtle!

- Maryland's bid to the 2021 NCAA Tournament marked its 17th straight postseason berth. Sixteen of those 17 were NCAA Tournament bids.
- The Terps have averaged 28.7 wins per season the last 15 years, and have 17 consecutive 20-win seasons from 2004-2021.
- Frese has led the Terps to seven 30-win seasons. 2005-06 marked the first 30-win season for the program, as the Terrapins went 34-4 and won the 2006 NCAA title. The Terps won 30 games in 2007-08 when they went 33-4 and in 2008-09 when they went 31-5. In 2012-13, the Terps notched the program's fourth 30-win season with their record of 31-5. Maryland posted three straight 30-win seasons in 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17.
- Maryland earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament in 2008, 2009 and 2015 and a No. 2 seed in 2006, 2007, 2012, 2021.

BrendaFRESE

575-163 (23rd year)/518-133 (20th year at Maryland)



Few coaches across any sport can claim the level of consistency and standard of excellence as Brenda Frese can in her 20 years at Maryland. Two-time National Coach of the Year, Frese's high work rate and positive attitude has resulted in 16 top-15 recruiting classes, three Final Fours, 14 conference titles and a National Championship in 2006. Frese has balanced that strong work ethic with a fun and family-friendly environment, also becoming a wife and a mother of twin boys, giving birth to them in the midst of one of the most successful seasons in the program's history. With the birth of her twins in February of 2008, she becomes one of only six coaches to win a national championship and be a parent.

Since her first season at the helm when the team won just 10 games, Frese has guided Maryland to a National Championship in 2006, 18 winning seasons, 17-straight 20-win seasons, seven 30-win campaigns and 17 bids to the NCAA Tournament. In 2021, she signed an extension through at least the 2026-27 season. With rollover years, she can be on the Maryland sidelines through 2028.

Former Athletics Director Deborah A. Yow courted the 2002 AP National Coach of the Year because of Frese's reputation for making amazing turnarounds and her relentless work ethic in recruiting. Described as dynamic, overachieving, determined and enthusiastic, the 51-year old coach is one of college basketball's stars. Standing atop the podium in Boston in 2006, Frese became the fifth-youngest coach (age 35) in NCAA history to win a national title and only the ninth to win in her first trip to the Final Four.

Despite claiming eight ACC Tournament titles prior to her arrival, Maryland advanced to new heights when Frese stepped on the scene. In her second season, she led the Terrapins to a tie for third place in the ACC standings - its highest finish since 1996-97. She's led Maryland to 16 top-four league finishes in her 19 years, including the last 11 straight. Her Maryland squads have posted a 512-130 (.798) mark in 19 years, advancing to at least the second round of the tournament in 16 of the last 18 years, including nine Sweet Sixteens, six Elite Eights and three Final Fours.

On Feb. 14, 2021, Frese won her 500th game at Maryland, making her the winningest coach in Maryland basketball history. She surpassed former women's basketball head coach and Hall of Famer Chris Weller, who retired with 499 wins for the Terrapins.

After joining the Big Ten in 2014, Frese's Terrapins have had historical success in the league. Her Terrapins teams have earned a record of 128-15 (.895) in conference play, including their 19-2 record in the Big Ten Tournament. Frese and the Terps have won six of seven Big Ten Championships, five Big Ten Tournament titles and a record seven straight appearances in the Big Ten Championship game.

Frese and her staff led the Terrapins to an unprecedented level of success in their first year in the Big Ten in 2015. After losing five seniors, including three starters and a three-time All-American, Maryland led the league in scoring with 80.2 points per game, en route to a perfect 18-0 conference record in a new league and a 24-game win streak over three months. The Terrapins were the first team to go undefeated in conference play since Purdue went 16-0 in 1998-99 and Ohio State went 18-0 in 1984-85. The Terps were the first Maryland team, men's or women's, to stay perfect in conference play. Frese was named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the second time in her career.

After losing five starters from the 2019-20 Big Ten Championship squad, Frese and her staff reloaded with five newcomers and the return of five sophomores. Frese's Terrapins did not miss a beat in 2020-21, earning a record of 26-3 overall, 17-1 in league play and winning the program's sixth Big Ten title in seven years. The Terrapins advanced to their ninth Sweet Sixteen under Frese. She was named Big Ten Coach of the Year and National Coach of the Year by the AP, The Athletic and ESPN.

Frese has built the team's success around recruiting, hard work and a positive atmosphere. The instant she arrived on campus, she determinedly worked the recruiting trails in an effort to reclaim the elite status Maryland once had in the 1980s. Success came quickly and early. Before she even coached a game in the newly-constructed XFINITY Center, she received commitments from a pair of high school All-

Americans, including Shay Doron, who went on to become a three-time All-ACC pick and a Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Draft selection. In all, 23 McDonald's All-Americans have donned a Maryland uniform under Frese's reign.

Sixteen of Frese's recruiting classes have been ranked in the top-15, including 13 rated in the top-10 and eight in the top five. In 2016, she and her staff signed the program's first-ever No. 1 recruiting class for the 2016-17 season. The landmark signings of Crystal Langhorne, Laura Harper, Jade Perry and Ashleigh Newman were rated No. 2 in the country, while the class of Marissa Coleman and Kristi Toliver was ranked No. 4 - the core of the Terps' national championship team. Her 2010 batch of Terrapins included four high school All-Americans and a No. 2 national ranking. Frese and her staff's 2019 class was ranked No. 1 on signing day.

Frese's recruiting classes have lived up to their billing and her pupils have earned numerous accolades. The first Terp in 17 years to garner All-American nods in 2006, Langhorne was a three-time AP and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) All-American, the program's first multiple All-American. She was selected a Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) All-American in 2007, the first in school history since 1989, and then again received the accolade in 2008. Most recently, Alyssa Thomas earned All-American nods from the WBCA, USBWA and First Team honors from the AP in 2012. Thomas was the first sophomore in school history to be named a WBCA All-American and First Team AP All-American and the first to be a three-time All-American.

Frese's players have also received numerous conference honors. Alyssa Thomas became just the second underclassman ever to be named ACC Player of the Year in March 2012. She is the first underclassman in league history to be named Player of the Year and Tournament MVP in the same season. Thomas was just the second player in league history to be named ACC Player of the Year in three straight years (2012, 2013, 2014). In her final season, Langhorne was selected the ACC's Player of the Year, the first Terp to win the award in nearly 20 years. Toliver followed suit at the end of her senior year, winning the ACC's top-player honor in 2009. In 2005, Langhorne became the program's first ACC Rookie of the Year since 1991. Coleman followed in her footsteps by nabbing the honor during the Terps' championship campaign in 2006. Center Lynetta Kizer and Thomas made it four Terps in six years to be named the league's top freshman when they won in 2009 and 2011.

In all, Terps have received 60 All-Conference citations in Frese's 19 years, including a school-record six in 2020 when Kaila Charles, Taylor Mikesell, Blair Watson, Stephanie Jones, Ashley Owusu and Shakira Austin were honored. Twelve Terps have been First Team conference selections 20 times in Frese's tenure.

Numerous Terps have also garnered national recognition under Frese. Most recently, Ashley Owusu won the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award for the nation's top shooting guard in 2021, while also earning All-America honors from the AP and the USBWA.

Maryland has rewritten several records over the last 18 seasons. In 2014-15, the Terrapins went 18-0 in conference play in their first season in the Big Ten. They were just the third team in history to go undefeated in Big Ten play. They won 28-straight games from Dec. 3, 2014 through March 30, 2015 to set a new school record. In 2007-08, the Terps became the first team in NCAA history to have four active players with at least 1,000 points on the same roster. That year, school records were broken for most home wins (21), which is also believed to be an NCAA record. The team opened the 2006-07 campaign winning 18-straight games, setting the program record for best start to a season. Maryland ended the 2008-09 campaign having won a school-record 36-straight home games, thanks to undefeated home

marks in two successive seasons, and 40-consecutive non-conference games at the XFINITY Center. In the 2009-10 season the Terrapins extended that streak to 48, a Maryland basketball record for either program.

In 2005-06, the team's 34 wins set a school record, shattering the previous mark of 29. The championship squad also set new standards for highest road winning percentage (.900), points (3,166), field goal attempts (2,363), 3-point field goals (216), 3-point attempts (540), free throws (690), free throw attempts (924), team free throw percentage (.747), rebounds (1,720) and blocked shots (195).

Numerous individual records have also fallen since her recruits began donning a Terrapin uniform. Among the most notable are the career scoring and rebounding records, which Thomas shattered in her four year career. She is the all-time leading scorer (2,356) and rebounder (1,235). She also broke the school record in double-doubles (66) set by Langhorne, who also previously held the scoring and rebounding records. Frese recruits own five of the top-six career scoring marks in Maryland history, including Nos. 1-3 in Langhorne, Coleman and Toliver - the only three players in Terp annals with 2,000-plus points apiece.

Under Frese, Maryland has been crowned an NCAA statistical champion 13 times. Most recently, Maryland led the nation in scoring (90.8 ppg) and assist/turnover ratio (1.69) and Katie Benzan led the country in three-point percentage (50.0). The Terrapins posted the nation's best rebounding margin in 2006 (+11.9), 2007 (+14.3) and 2016 (+15.1) and second-best in 2012 (+12.9) and 2013 (+13.7). In 2016, Jones led the country with her field goal percentage of 66.5 percent and Walker-Kimbrough led the NCAA, and set a Big Ten record, with her three-point field goal percentage of 54.5 percent. In 2017, Jones once again led the country with her field goal percentage of 69.0%. Also in 2006, the Terps shot 40.0 percent from 3-point range, tops in the country, while winning the most games of any team that year (34). In 2007, the team's 18.3 assists-per-game average was the best in the country, it owned the best shooting accuracy at 49.5 percent in 2008 and, in 2009, it once again claimed the top 3-point shooting mark in the nation (40.1 percent).

Maryland has been one of the most prolific scoring teams in the NCAA over the last decade, ranking No. 2 in scoring average in 2006, 2007 and 2008 and No. 3 in 2009. The Terrapins were third in the country in field goal percentage (.471) in 2013. In 2016, the Terrapins were No. 2 in the country in field goal percentage (49.6%) and No. 5 in scoring (83.2). In 2017, the Terrapins were No. 2 in the nation in rebounding margin (+13.9), scoring (89.3) and field goal percentage (51.0%), third in scoring margin (+24.9) and fourth in assists (19.8).

Maryland's rise into the upper-echelon of the country, has bolstered the excitement surrounding the team. Over the last 15 years, the program has ranked in the top-25 in the nation in attendance. In 2007, Maryland recorded the nation's largest one-season improvement in home attendance, averaging 9,533 fans in 16 games, almost double the average from the previous season (4,183) - with more than 150,000 people making their way through the Comcast Center turnstiles, a school-record. By the end of the '07 campaign, the Terps were sixth in the nation in average attendance and fourth in overall attendance, as 241,280 spectators filled the stands at home and on the road to watch the Terps play in 34 games. In 2008, Maryland hosted over 160,000 fans in 21 games and was ranked eighth in the nation in average attendance that year, followed by a No. 6 ranking in 2009 (133,336 in 15 games).

During Frese's tenure, the Terps have sold out the 17,950-seat XFINITY Center three times - Jan. 28, 2007 vs. North Carolina, Feb. 18, 2007 vs. Duke and Dec. 29, 2016 vs. Connecticut.

In the classroom, the Terps have also been all-star students. Thirty-one of Frese's Terps have been named to the Conference All-Academic Teams, while four, Kristen Confroy, Lori Bjork, Doron and Langhorne have received Academic All-American nods by ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA. In 2015, Malina Howard earned the Elite 89 Award, which is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's championships.

Maryland head women's basketball coach Brenda Frese announced the hiring of assistant coach and recruiting coordinator Karen Blair in May 2018. She brings over 20 years of coaching and recruiting experience to College Park. Blair was named the 2020 Division I Assistant Coach of the Year by the WBCA. In September of 2020, Frese promoted Blair to associate head coach.

Blair helped the Terrapins put the finishing touches on the No. 3 recruiting class of 2019, which included McDonald's All Americans Ashley Owusu and Diamond Miller. In 2019, she helped the Terps sign Angel Reese, the No. 2 overall recruit in the class of 2020 and the highest-ranked recruit in program history.

In her three seasons at Maryland, Blair has helped the Terps earn a record of 83-12 (.874) and win the 2019, 2020, 2021 Big Ten regular season titles and the 2020 and 2021 Big Ten Tournament title.

In Blair's first year in College Park, the Terrapins went 29-5, winning 12 games to start the year, including a dominant 85-61 win at No. 10 South Carolina in November. The Terps won 11 of 12 games to end the regular season and win their fourth Big Ten regular season title in five years. They earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

In 2019-20, the Terrapins earned a record of 28-4, winning 17 straight games to end the regular season and the Big Ten Tournament title. They clinched a share of their fifth Big Ten championship in six years with a record of 16-2 in conference play. Six Terrapins earned All-Big Ten honors - a program record. The Terps finished the season ranked No. 4 in the Associated Press and RPI rankings and were projected to be a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

In 2020-21, after losing all five starters, Blair helped lead the Terrapins to an amazing season in which they went 26-3 overall, 17-1 in Big Ten play and advanced to the Sweet Sixteen. The Terrapins led the nation in scoring with 90.8 points per game.

"From the moment she has stepped foot on our campus, Karen has made an impact on our program," Frese said. "She is someone who is always here for everyone and is selfless in her pursuit to help others achieve success. Karen's wealth of experience allows her to know exactly what needs to be done when needed and in the best interest of our program. Karen is someone I lean on and trust and I am grateful for what she means to our team and University."

"I love what I do, and working with Coach Frese and the Maryland family has been a blessing," Blair said. "The people around me, from the student-athletes to my colleagues and the best fans in the country, are what make coaching so special, and I am grateful to be surrounded by the best of the best at Maryland. It has been a privilege being a part of winning championships these past two seasons and look forward to many more to come."

Blair coached at Virginia Commonwealth for three seasons before coming to College Park. Prior to her time in Richmond, Blair served as an assistant and interim head coach at UT Arlington, and an assistant at Colgate, North Texas, and her alma mater, Southern Methodist.

Blair helped the Rams sign a top 30 recruiting class and the top class in the Atlantic 10. Over her time in Richmond, the Rams made a WNIT appearance and recorded the second-most wins in school history with 23.

Blair spent two seasons at North Texas, where she led the development of the Mean Green's guards and assisted with game strategy, scouting and served as the team's defensive coordinator.

A Michigan native, Blair spent two seasons as the top assistant and eventually, interim head coach, at UT Arlington from 2011-2013. Blair coordinated the Mavericks' national recruiting efforts and headed the signing of an ESPN Hoopgurlz.com recruit and a National Junior College Athletic Association All-American. She coached UT Arlington in its final eight games of the 2013 season and led the team to a win over eventual WAC Champion Idaho.

From 2009-2011, Blair served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Colgate.

After graduation, Blair spent 10 years coaching at her alma mater, SMU. She helped lead the Mustangs to a pair of Conference USA regular season titles, two NCAA Tournament appearances and two WNIT bids. SMU reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2000.

Blair was a three-year starting point guard for the Mustangs from 1995-1999 and led SMU to NCAA Tournament berths in 1996, 1998 and 1999. A two-year team captain, Blair was named Second Team All-WAC in 1998. She racked up academic accolades and graduated cum laude with a degree in business administration from SMU in 1999.

In the spring of 2020, Fratz was named one of the WBCA's Thirty under 30 honorees as an up-and-coming women's basketball coach.

Prior to her time in College Park, Fratz spent two years as a graduate assistant at Valdosta State. In her second season, she helped the Lady Blazers to a record of 22-10 and the 2017 Gulf South Conference title. They earned a bid to the NCAA South Region Tournament.

Fratz played her junior and senior seasons at California University of Pennsylvania, where she led the Vulcans to the 2015 Division II NCAA championship. Fratz was named the Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Tournament. She averaged 14.4 points, 2.9 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 2.0 steals in 34.2 minutes per game in her senior season.

Fratz played her high school career at Northern Garrett High School, where she was a four-year letter winner. She earned four straight First Team All-Conference honors, was named Conference Player of the Year twice. She was also twice named Cumberland Times-News All-Area Player of the Year and the Cumberland Times-News Athlete of the Year. Fratz holds career school records for points, assists and steals. She broke the Garrett County record for points (2,103) and helped lead North Garrett to a state title.

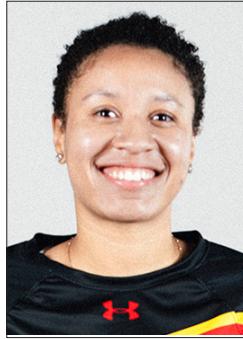


Lindsey SPANN

Head coach Brenda Frese welcomed Maryland native Lindsey Spann to the Maryland women's basketball staff in the summer of 2019. After a season as the Director of Recruiting Operations, Frese tabbed Spann as assistant coach in the spring of 2020.

"Lindsey is an up and coming star in our profession," Frese said. "She immediately had an impact on our team and program from the moment she started. Her communication, organizational skills and relationships with others elevate her. I love the fact that Lindsey grew up attending our camps and grew up just down the road. She is Maryland through and through and extremely loyal to our program. I am so excited to keep her in our Maryland family."



In her first season on staff at Maryland, Spann helped the Terrapins to a record of 28-4 and a 17-game win streak to end the season. Maryland won its fifth Big Ten championship and its fourth Big Ten Tournament title since joining the league six years ago.

In 2020-21, after losing all five starters, Spann helped lead the Terrapins to an amazing season in which they went 26-3 overall, 17-1 in Big Ten play and advanced to the Sweet Sixteen. The Terrapins led the nation in scoring with 90.8 points per game en route to winning the 2021 Big Ten regular season and tournament titles.

Spann was named one of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Thirty Under 30 honorees in 2021, an honor recognizing up and coming stars in the coaching world.

"I'm extremely humbled by this opportunity to start my coaching career at such a great university," Spann said. "I was fortunate to grow up watching Coach Frese establish such a high standard of excellence at the University of Maryland for her players and staff, on and off the court. I am very blessed to be a part of the Terp family and I'm appreciative of the opportunities Coach Frese has given me thus far. I cannot wait to get started."

Spann spent the 2018-19 season as a graduate assistant at South Carolina, where she finished her master's degree in sport and entertainment management. She played her senior season with the Gamecocks, where she averaged 10.3 points and shot over 45 percent from the field.

A graduate of Good Counsel, Spann played her first three seasons at Penn State where she earned Honorable Mention All-Big Ten honors in 2016. She scored 1,000 points in her time at Penn State. She earned Academic All-Big Ten honors three times and earned her bachelor's degree in public relations in 2017.

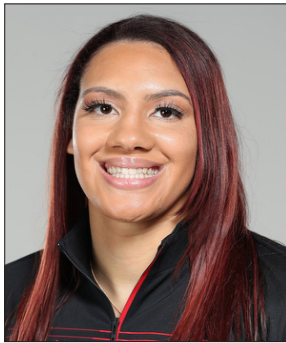

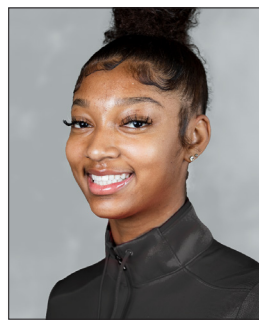
