FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT MIAMI IN SECOND GAME OF SEASON AGAINST HURRICANES

Florida State, which holds the longest current winning streak in the ACC at five consecutive victories, travels to play at Miami on Saturday, January 11, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla. The Seminoles won the first meeting between the two teams just 11 days ago, 65-64, as redshirt senior guard RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 0.8 seconds remaining in the Seminoles' win at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles arrive in Coral Gables with an eight-game winning streak against the Hurricanes. Florida State has won each of the meetings between the two teams since a 101-90 win on January 27, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles current five-game winning streak began in January 8 with a win over Louisville and includes victories over the Cardinals (January 8, 79-70), the Hurricanes (January 11, 65-64), at Syracuse (January 15, 76-71), No. 5 Duke (January 18, 79-78 in overtime) and against UNF (January 20, 86-73). Following Saturday's game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play at Georgia Tech on January 26 at 9:00 p.m. in the first meeting of the season between the two teams.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on Tuesday with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he and his staff develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked following the Seminoles' win over No. 5 Duke on Tuesday in Tallahassee.

ACC SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR CANDIDATE MATTHEW CLEVELAND WITH FIRST CAREER 20-10 DOUBLE DOUBLE

ACC Sixth Man of the Year candidate Matthew Cleveland earned his second career double with a 21-point and 10-rebound performance in Florida State's 86-73 win over North Florida on Thursday in Tallahassee. His first career double double of 13 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State 83-81 win at NC State on January 1, 2022 earned Cleveland ACC Freshman of the Week honors for the first time in his career on January 3 from the ACC Office. Cleveland's double double against UNF is the first 20-10 double double since Mfiondu Kabengele earned a double double of 21 points and 10 rebounds against Vermont in the NCAA Tournament on March 21, 2019. Cleveland's performance against the Ospreys is the first double double by a true freshman Seminole since Jonathan Isaac totaled 23 points and 10 rebounds in Florida State's 83-80 win over Notre Dame in Tallahassee on January 18, 2017.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 389 career wins at Florida State.

...Defeat Miami and gain a sweep of the regular season series between the two teams for the fourth consecutive season. With eight straight wins against the Hurricanes, the Seminoles' have won both ends of the season series in 2019, 2020 and 2021.

...Defeat Miami and win the two-game season series against Miami for the ninth time (2007, 2008, 2010, 2011, 2017, 2019, 2020, 2021) since the Hurricanes joined the ACC for the beginning of the 2004-05 season;

....Defeat Miami and win its fifth consecutive ACC game. The Seminoles most recently won five straight ACC games during the 2020-21 season when they defeated NC State (January 13, 2021, 105-73), North Carolina (January 16, 2021, 82-75), Louisville (January 18, 2021, 78-65), Clemson (January 23, 2021, 80-61) and Miami (January 27, 2021, 81-59) all in a row in a 14-day span.

FLORIDA STATE PLAYING FOR A SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK

A sixth consecutive win would mark Florida State's longest winning streak since the Seminoles won 10 consecutive games from December 8, 2018 through January 25, 2020. The Seminoles won six consecutive ACC games during that stretch.

FLORIDA STATE'S CURRENT WINNING STREAK

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami having won five straight and seven of its last eight games since a 97-60 win over Lipscomb on December 15, 2021. Following their game against Wake Forest on January 4 in Winston-Salem, the Seminoles were 7-5 overall, 1-2 in ACC play and in a tie for ninth in the ACC standings. Entering Saturday's game against Miami, the Seminoles are 12-5 overall, 5-2 in ACC play and alone in second place in the ACC standings.

FLORIDA STATE IN THE MONTH OF JANUARY

The Seminoles are 6-1 in the month of January with five ACC victories (over NC State, Louisville, Miami, at Syracuse and at Duke) and one non-conference win (over UNF).

FLORIDA STATE ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

With victories at NC State (January 1, 83-81) and at Syracuse (January 15, 76-71), the Seminoles enter Saturday's game at Miami with a 2-1 record on the road in ACC play. Only Florida State (2-1), North Carolina (2-1) and Virginia (2-1) are above .500 in league play on the road entering this weekend's slate of ACC games. Florida State is 17-13 in ACC road games during the last three seasons.

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY SINCE THE START OF THE 2018-19 SEASON

Florida State is 45-15 in ACC regular season play (.750 winning percentage) since the start of the conference schedule in 2018-19.

FLORIDA STATE WITH A SEASON-HIGH FIELD GOAL SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN WIN OVER UNF

Florida State shot a season-high .559 from the field (33 of 59) in its 86-73 win over UNF on Thursday in Tallahassee. The Seminoles shot .625 from 2-point range (30 of 48) in reaching the 80-point mark for the sixth time this season. Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami as one of 10 ACC teams shooting 44 percent or better from the field for the season.

SEMINOLES IN THE GIVING MOOD

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami ranked fifth in the ACC in assists with a 14.6 assists per game average. The Seminoles earned 20 assists (against only 13 turnovers) in Thursday's win over UNF in Tallahassee. The Seminoles' assists total marked the fourth time this season Florida State had earned at least 20 assists in a game and are 4-0 when they earn at least 20 assists in a game. The Seminoles have earned 20 or more assists in two of their last three games (against Syracuse and North Florida), are averaging 15.8 assists per game (79 total assists) and have an assist:turnover ratio of 1.6:1 (79 assists and 49 turnovers) in their current five-game winning streak.

FLORIDA STATE GOING TO THE OFFENSIVE BOARDS

Led by Matthew Cleveland's four offensive rebounds in the Seminoles' 86-73 win over North Florida on Thursday, the Seminoles earned 13 offensive rebounds against the Ospreys. It marked the fourth time during their current five-game winning streak that the Seminoles earned 10 or more offensive rebounds. The Seminoles have won the overall rebounding battle three times (with one tie) and are outscoring their last five opponents by a 70-43 margin on second chance point opportunities. The Seminoles outscored North Florida by a 24-0 margin on second chance points in their 86-73 win in Tallahassee on Thursday.

SEMINOLES LIMITING THEIR OPPONENTS' OFFENSIVE REBOUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Florida State has held each of their last four opponents to eight or fewer offensive rebounds and are surrendering an average of 6.8 offensive rebounds (34 total offensive rebounds) during its current five-game winning streak. The Seminoles are allowing 6.2 second chance points per game during their winning streak. Florida State limited Miami to eight offensive rebounds and eight second chance points in its 65-64 victory over the Hurricanes just 11 days ago. After allowing nine double figure rebounding efforts by their opponents (132 offensive rebounds / 12.5 second chance points) in their first 12 games (for a 7-5 record), the Seminoles have since held the opponents to single digit offensive rebounds (34 offensive rebounds / 6.2 second chance points) four times during their current five-game winning streak (for a 5-0 record).

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST MEETING

Freshman Matthew Cleveland scored 11 of his 15 points in the second half, RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 0.8 seconds left and Florida State beat in-state rival Miami 65-64 to extend its win streak against the Hurricanes to eight games at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on January 11, 2022. Malik Osborne hit a 3-pointer late in the shot clock to give FSU a 63-61 lead with 27 seconds left. Moore missed a driving layup on the other end, but Jordan Miller grabbed the offensive rebound off his own missed put-back attempt and kicked it out to Moore in the corner for a 3 to give Miami a one-point lead with 7 seconds to go. Evans was fouled by Moore on a driving lay-up attempt and made the winning free throws. The 6-foot-7 Cleveland — one of the top recruits in his class — scored seven consecutive Seminoles points before Alexander hit a 3-pointer — his first made 3 in ACC play this season — to give FSU a 52-50 lead with 8 minutes remaining. There were six lead changes and two ties from there.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak including Miami twice (on January 27, 2018 in Tallahassee and on January 18, 2020 in Coral Gables).

A KEY TO THE SEMINOLES' OVERTIME SUCCESS

Florida State won its 13th consecutive overtime game with its 79-78 win Duke on Tuesday in Tallahassee – the Seminoles' second overtime win of the season. One of the common denominators in Florida State's overtime wins over Boston University and Duke was the absence of turnovers by the Seminoles in the overtime periods. The Seminoles outscored BU by a 10-9 margin with zero overtime turnovers and outscored Duke with a 12-11 margin with zero turnovers in the overtime period.

FLORIDA STATE'S BENCH BUNCH AVERAGING

Led by freshman Matthew Cleveland's 11.2 points per game scoring average, Florida State's bench averages 29.1 (495 points in 17 games) points scored per game. Cleveland is the league's leading candidate to win the Seminoles' fourth consecutive ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award. Florida State's bench has outscored its opponents bench in 12 of its first 17 games of the season including by an incredible 25-1 margin against Syracuse on December 4 in Tallahassee and a 25-0 margin on January 11 in its 65-64 win over Miami. Cleveland has scored in double figures nine times with each of his appearances coming off of the bench. Florida State's bench has earned 16 double figure scoring efforts with Cleveland (nine), Cam/Ron Fletcher (four) and Wyatt Wilkes (two) leading the way. Florida State's bench has outscored its opponents' benches by a more than 2:1 margin during their current five-game winning streak.

FLORIDA STATE WITH DOUBLE DIGIT STEALS IN WIN OVER UNF; CONTINUE TO LEAD ACC IN STEALS

A total of seven Seminoles recorded at least one steal in Florida State's win over North Florida giving the Seminoles a total of 10 steals in the victory. Florida State's seventh game of double figure steals allowed the Seminoles to maintain the ACC team lead in the steals category. The Seminoles have earned a total of 164 steals for an average of 9.6 steals per game. Florida State's 16 steals against Wake Forest is the second highest single game total in the ACC this season. Florida State has led the ACC in steals two times – 2012 (ACC Tournament Champions) and 2020 (ACC Champions) and have won the conference championship in both of those years.

SEMINOLES STINGY WITH THE BASKETBALL

Florida State allowed only five steals in its victory over North Florida and has allowed only nine steals in its last three games. The Seminoles are surrendering only 5.5 steals per game and only one team has earned double figure steals against Florida State this season. For the second consecutive meeting, the Seminoles (first, 9.6 spg) and the Hurricanes (second, 8.5 spg) ranked as the ACC leaders in steals leaders entering Saturday's game in Coral Gables. Florida State has allowed five steals or less in 10 of their first 17 games of the season.

RAYQUAN EVANS FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans enter Saturdays game against Miami having made 14 consecutive free throws dating back to the second half of Florida State's game against Syracuse of December 4. Since the 3:58 mark of that game against the Orange, he has missed only one free throw attempt.

16 Freshman Jalen Warley has 16 steals in the first 17 games of his Florida State career including four (two each in victories over Duke and North Florida) in the last two games (2.0 spg).

25 Redshirt senior RayQuan Evans is tied for seventh in the ACC with a career-high 25 steals and a career-high 1.7 steals per game average. His 25 steals in his first 15 games of the season are already six more than he totaled (19) in the first two seasons and 53 games of his Florida State career.

Oh ... and he's two of two from the line in overtime (against No. 5 Duke).

DEFENSIVE WIZARD POLITE APPROACHING 30 STEALS FOR THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Redshirt senior Anthony Polite earned two steals in Florida State's 86-73 win over North Florida on Thursday to bring his season total to 27. He's just three steals shy of reaching the 30 steals plateau for the third consecutive season. He earned a career-high 37 steals during the 2019-0 season.

Native American RayQuan Evans Feeling Right At Home Playing For Florida State Seminoles

On that night, wearing that jersey, no one other than RayQuan Evans was destined to be standing at the free throw line for Florida State with the game on the line.

The 6-foot-4 senior point guard and the first member of a Native American tribe to play for the Seminoles men's team calmly dropped both free throws with less than a second remaining to secure the one point win over Miami.

And this wasn't just another moment to be celebrated and forgotten.

Evans, the son of Lavern OldElk and Israel Evans and a member of the Crow Tribe in Montana, stood at that foul line wearing the Seminoles' N7 turquoise jersey, which honors Native American culture.

"To have the moment as a team and me understanding what those jerseys represent, what a huge moment," Evans said. "I'm very thankful I was able to be put in that moment because there's a bunch of little kids at home who look up to me. I feel like it was a real surreal moment."

The man given the Indian name 'Young Man With Blessed Days' naturally secured the 65-64 victory, handing Miami its first ACC loss. That game played just more than a week ago sets up Saturday's 2 p.m. rematch between the top two teams in the ACC when the Seminoles (12-5, 5-2 ACC) travel to Miami (14-4, 6-1).

And Evans was not done making clutch shots. Four nights later at Syracuse, his two free throws with three seconds remaining sealed the win. Tuesday was a double-dose of Ice Water Evans against Duke. He sent the game into overtime with a layup high off the glass over two defenders just before the buzzer, and then made the winning free throws with 12.3 seconds left in OT for the 79-78 win.

"We feel safe when he's going to the line," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. "There's no doubt that he's very mature, he's given us tremendous leadership. Whenever the game's on the line, he seems to always make the right decisions."

Evans' 7.1 points and 2.6 assists per game do not come close to depicting his value to the Seminoles. He had five assists and one turnover in the Syracuse and Duke wins.

"He has to be on the floor in a lot of ways," ESPN basketball analyst Seth Greenberg said. "He's almost their compass."

And Evans will tell you he's had a lot of help when it comes to this season.

Evans has been playing with a heavy heart ever since his brother, Tye Lafranier, died Nov. 21. Tye, 27, suffered a seizure about six months prior to his death and was diagnosed with a rare and aggressive form of leukemia.

"Every game now and just the way I walk in my life is for my brother," Evans said. "Every game I've been playing harder because he fought to the end with his cancer. Not a day went by where he didn't fight. If he can fight at a time like that, I can fight on the court, I can fight in life ... I'm representing my brother through that."

Evans proud to be a Seminole

RayQuan Ethan Evans is in the perfect place. Working on his third college degree, Evans as much as anyone understands the respect and reverence given to Native Americans by a school whose nickname has drawn criticism and calls to be changed.

Instead, Evans could not be prouder of the university he represents.

"There's been times where organizations have used Native American names and other cultures, names and mascots and didn't pay any attention to or give credit to those tribes," Evans said. "But here, it's awesome. Especially because it's not going unnoticed and (brings attention to the Seminole Tribe) and I'm using it to bring recognition to my tribe back home and tribes all over Montana.

"People need to take more time in understanding that there is no disrespect going on here at all."

Evans spent part of his childhood on the Crow Indian Reservation, located about an hour east of Billings. He learned basketball from his dad, who played for the University of Montana. He said basketball is an important part of his large family.

Evans spent two years at North Idaho College before being signed by Hamilton in 2019. He was aware of Florida State and its history with the Seminole Tribe, but never envisioned playing in Tallahassee.

Until that surprise phone call.

"When coach Hamilton called, I was shocked and amazed because the culture behind Florida State, what this culture represents, this program, the building blocks this program has set," he said. "I thought this is my opportunity. I get to play at the highest level of college basketball but also I get to share my culture and give kids a reason back home to look up to me, and give kids a reason to chase their dreams.

"I feel like I was brought here for something bigger and something more (than just basketball)."

Playing game after brother's death

Which is why Evans felt he was in a good enough place to play in a game the day after being told his brother's battle with leukemia had ended. RayQuan scored eight points and had a game-high six assists in 16 minutes of FSU's 81-58 win over Missouri in the championship game of the Jacksonville Classic on Nov. 22.

While Evan broke down in tears following the game, Hamilton was emotional when describing what he had seen. "There are true Seminoles," Hamilton said. "But then there's whatever kind of Seminole Ray Evans is. For him to step up and want to do that ... not very many people can do that and play as well as he played tonight."

Hamilton, who is in his 52nd year of coaching, called it "one of the best performances I've ever seen in my coaching career."

What happened eight days later topped any clutch moment on the court. Evans was home in Montana that night to attend Tye's funeral. FSU was playing at Purdue in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Before the game, a Purdue student sent an envelope to Hamilton and said it was for RayQuan.

When he finally got to open it, RayQuan found a black card with the Purdue logo and a note inside from the student body saying how sorry they were for his loss and that the entire college basketball community "including your new fans in West Lafayette" were behind him. The Boilermakers' basketball program also tweeted out a link to a GoFundMe page that was set up to cover funeral expenses.

Evans got emotional reading the card.

"I couldn't believe it," he said. "It's competition, teams may not like each other, the crowd may not like you and for them to take the time before a big game and acknowledge what I went through even though I was not there, really meant a lot to me.

"That shows the character of people. That shows no matter how competitive the basketball world is I feel like we're all a family."

Underdog Unleashed: Freshman Matthew Cleveland Makes Mark For FSU Hoops

Ralph Cleveland was living the life of millions of other youth sports dads.

His son Matthew loved basketball and showed legitimate potential. He was dedicated to improving. And with any luck, he was going to have the same growth spurt his father experienced around the time he hit high school.

So Ralph did what parents do.

He worked with Matthew on his game. He and his wife, Sandra, drove all around metro Atlanta, taking him to rec-league practices and AAU tournaments. He enlisted the help of skills trainers.

All with the hope that Matthew one day might have the opportunity -- if he continued working really hard -- to play college basketball somewhere. Anywhere.

It wasn't until a scout approached him at an AAU event before Matthew's freshman year of high school that his father realized what the future might really hold.

"He's probably going to be an inch or two taller than you, and with the way he's playing, he's high-major material," the scout told Ralph, who stands 6-foot-4.

At the time, Matthew was still a middle-schooler. Having fun. Playing a game.

He was nowhere close to 6-5 or 6-6. And the idea of making it to high-major college basketball -- in a conference like the ACC, SEC or Big Ten -- seemed like something out of a dream.

"That was the first time someone said it to me," Ralph Cleveland remembered. "Honestly, my jaw dropped. That was probably the earliest indication that this was going to be a little bit different ride."

'It just took off'

Matthew Cleveland was not a basketball phenom from an early age.

He wasn't bigger or stronger than all the other kids. And because he split time between basketball and baseball, he wasn't quite as polished as the boys who hooped all year-round.

When Cleveland did finally decide to focus full-time on basketball and tried out for a summer AAU program around the age of 12, he wasn't quite good enough to make the outfit's top team. He was relegated to one of the lesser squads.

It was what he considered a common theme.

"Pretty much my whole career playing basketball, I've always been the underdog," the FSU freshman told Warchant this past summer. "So I've always had that chip on my shoulder."

Underdog is a relative term these days.

By the time he enrolled at Florida State, Cleveland was a five-star prospect and the No. 17 recruit in the country. He chose the Seminoles over national powers like Michigan, Kansas and Stanford. Countless other elite programs didn't make the cut.

But beneath all the recent success, Cleveland and his family distinctly remember his humble beginnings.

When he was still learning how to transition from rec ball to the competitive AAU circuit. When he wasn't as adept at ball-handling and passing, but his father encouraged him to play in the backcourt anyway. When he made his high school team as a freshman but couldn't grab a starting role.

To be certain, Matthew Cleveland tasted plenty of failure in his youth. But even in those toughest times, his family says he never doubted that he could one day play at the college level, and possibly in the NBA.

Even if others were not quite so sure.

"We were a long ways from there when we started," Ralph Cleveland said with a laugh. "We'll just put it that way." The progress started to come quickly, though, once the younger Cleveland hung up his baseball bat and glove. One year after getting left off that AAU program's top roster, Cleveland worked on his deficiencies and earned an invitation the next time around.

"Slowly but surely, he worked his way up," his father said. "To being a starter and to being a big contributor on that team."

Then came the growth spurt.

As a freshman in high school, Cleveland was listed at 6-foot-2. One year later, he shot up to 6-6. Then 6-7 the year after that.

Ralph Cleveland always expected his son would grow into a small forward's body. Not only was he himself tall, but his wife's family had some height as well.

But instead of banking on that size and having Matthew focus on playing around the basket, Ralph wanted him to work on being a guard. He even placed him on multiple AAU teams at a time so that Matthew could play on the wing with some squads and actually handle point guard duties on others.

"I knew that was going to be important for his growth and development, that he could take on the ball-handling responsibilities for a team and gain some comfort level with that," the father said. "Let's make sure that you can really handle the ball and that you can play on the perimeter."

By the time Matthew was a sophomore in high school, everything came together.

Not only had he grown four or five inches, but his body started filling out thanks to steady work in the weight room. His skills were also continuing to improve.

Soon, he would leave the Hype Hawks, an independent AAU team that had been his offseason basketball home, for the prestigious Adidas-sponsored Atlanta Celtics.

"You could just see the progression really take off," Ralph Cleveland said. "He didn't play on a shoe circuit team all the way up until 17U. And because the coaches were so supportive and just instilled a tremendous amount of confidence in him to go out and perform ... man, it just took off.

"Once he started playing above the rim, it was kind of done," Ralph continued with a laugh. "His confidence went through the roof at that point."

A perfect match

Choosing a college destination ultimately would be Matthew Cleveland's decision, but he certainly had guidance from the family.

Both of his parents graduated from Georgia Tech -- Ralph majored in engineering while Sandra majored in management with a concentration in accounting -- so academics were definitely going to be a major consideration. With that in mind, they encouraged their talented son to choose a school that not only would prepare him for life after basketball, but that could help him achieve his "highest potential."

They urged him to seek the same from a basketball perspective. To find a program that would develop him to become the best player he could be.

And the third criteria was character within the coaching staff.

"Are these people that you can trust?" Ralph asked his son. "Are these people that when they say they're going to do something, are they going to do what they promised? And are these mentors of men? What's their track record on that?"

It didn't take long for Leonard Hamilton's Florida State Seminoles program to emerge as the frontrunner.

"They are A-plus on all three of those scales," Ralph said.

Cleveland didn't announce his commitment to FSU until the summer before his senior season -- after schools like North Carolina and Kentucky had tried to make a late push -- but looking back, he says he knew he would be a Seminole following his first visit as a high school sophomore.

"No other visit was like that. No other coaching staff was like that," said Cleveland, who was recruited primarily by FSU assistant coach Charlton Young. "And I knew no other school was going to be able to top that. So it was really just a waiting game after that."

Cleveland would end up taking three trips to FSU during the recruiting process, and each only served to solidify his decision.

In January of 2020, a few months before he made his commitment, he attended an FSU home game against Notre Dame. It was a Saturday night. Prime time with a sold-out crowd. And the game was a thriller that the Seminoles won 85-84.

Cleveland loved watching the way FSU loaded its lineup with tall, versatile wings like himself. He appreciated how hard they played defense and how quickly they got out in transition on offense.

"Florida State was a great fit from that standpoint," Ralph said. "You look at the fit from a basketball standpoint, and it's really undeniable, right? Coach Ham, Coach Young and all of the coaches do a terrific job of developing players with his size and skill set and versatility."

The academic piece pushed the Seminoles over the top.

Florida State's status as a Top 20 public university would be impressive enough. But because Cleveland has long dreamed of pursuing a career in the FBI, he was thrilled to learn that FSU's criminology department is routinely ranked in the top 10 nationally.

And Hamilton's incredible record of graduating players speaks for itself.

"It's top-notch," Ralph said. "And then a really good law school as well? With a clear articulation plan from undergraduate into a law degree? That was just hard to beat. It was really hard to beat."

'You don't have to rush it'

It hasn't taken Matthew Cleveland long to make an impact on the college level.

At just past the midway point of his freshman season, he ranks third on the team in scoring at 10.5 points per game and third in rebounding at 4.3, despite coming off the bench in every contest.

He was named ACC Freshman of the Week in early January after recording a double-double -- 13 points and 10 rebounds -- in a win at N.C. State. He hit a game-winning shot with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift FSU past Boston University. And just last week, he led the team with 15 points in a one-point win over Miami.

While the scoring is noteworthy, Hamilton said recently that Cleveland's "defense, his rebounding, his aggressiveness and his tenacity" have been perhaps his greatest contributions to the Seminoles, who are now 11-5 overall and 5-2 in the ACC after knocking off No. 6 Duke late Tuesday.

Those descriptions wouldn't come as much of a surprise to Ralph Cleveland.

He knows better than anyone how much time and effort his son has poured into becoming the best all-around player he can be.

"He's really a Swiss Army Knife on the floor," Ralph said. "There's so many different things he can do. And he makes it look so easy sometimes. But by the time you've seen Matthew do it in a game, he has really worked at it."

In Cleveland's early years, that work might have been devoted to basics like ball-handling, passing and shooting. In the months before he enrolled at Florida State, it was finishing at the rim with both hands -- with finesse and with power. Skills we have seen on display already this season.

"He's worked hard on that. Really hard," Ralph said. "When he decides, 'This is a skill that I want to develop,' he works on it."

It's a mindset Cleveland has possessed for as long as anyone can remember.

It served him well when he was young and not even the strongest player in some of his youth leagues. And also last season, when he was widely regarded as one of the premier high school players in the country.

The self-described "underdog," who vividly remembers being doubted as a youth, maintained that same dogged determination when opposing prep teams focused on taking down the hot-shot Florida State signee.

"It didn't really matter if they were coming at me, because I was coming right back at them," he said.

And more often than not, he came out on top.

Cleveland led Pace Academy to Georgia state championships as a junior and senior. He averaged 22.8 points, 10.6 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 2.0 steals during his final season, and he followed that up by participating in the prestigious Allen Iverson Roundball Classic, a postseason All-America game in Philadelphia.

Then once he got back home to Atlanta, it was back in the weight room three days a week with a strength trainer, and in the gym two or three days a week with his skills trainer.

The work never stopped.

When asked in the early summer what he was spending time on specifically, Cleveland offered a lengthy list: "Shooting. Shooting off the dribble. Change of direction in the half-court game. Finishing. And defense."

As a player who patterns his game after NBA stars like Kevin Durant, Jayson Tatum and Bradley Beal, there's a chance Cleveland could be the next Florida State standout to make a splash as a professional.

He doesn't have quite the same size of Scottie Barnes and Patrick Williams -- both of whom were one-and-done players at FSU and No. 4 picks in the 2021 and 2020 drafts, respectively -- but he isn't far off. And his statistics are actually slightly more impressive.

Whether the time comes for Cleveland to test the NBA waters sooner or later, Ralph insisted his son is in no hurry. He said Matthew didn't come to Tallahassee with preconceived notions of how long that process would take, and he's not going to leave until he's certain that he's ready.

"I think he views himself as clearly having the ability to play at the next level," Ralph said. "He just recognizes that he's got to put in the work. Just keep developing. Keep getting better. When the time is right, you're gonna know it. You don't have to rush it. It will be there for you.

"But the main focus for us has always been -- and will always be -- continued growth and development. That is one thing that I think has really served Matthew well. He is really bought in to that. He is really bought in to, 'What do I have to do to get better?' And then he goes and does it."

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 12 seconds remaining and John Butler blocked a jump shot by Wendell More, Jr., with two seconds remaining, and Florida State won its NCAA record 13th consecutive overtime decision with a 79-78 win over No. 5 Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Caleb Mills led the Seminoles with 18 points, while Butler added a career-high 14. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. The Seminoles' overtime winning streak dates back to a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State has defeated 11 different teams during the overtime streak with its win over Duke marking its first over the Blue Devils during the streak. The win was Florida State head coach Leonard Hamilton's eighth all-time win over Duke. The win was also the Seminoles' first over a top-5 ranked team since a 69-69 win over Virginia on March 15, 2019 in the semifinals of the ACC Tournament. Florida State gained its first win over a nationally ranked opponent this season and snapped a five-game losing streak to the Blue Devils. The Seminoles started the second half in a 38-33 hole at half but turned it around at the under 16-minute media timeout to lead by a 44-34 margin. Sophomore Naheem McLeod started for the second time in his season and finished with a near a double-double with a career-high nine points and 10 rebounds.
