FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO MIAMI IN ACC BATTLE FOR THE STATE OF FLORIDA

Florida State, which has won a series-record seven consecutive games against Miami, plays host to the Hurricanes on Tuesday, January 11, 2022 at 8:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles' game against Miami marks the first of two games in 11 days between the two teams as the Seminoles make the trip to Coral Gables on January 22. Florida State comes into Tuesday's game against Miami having won three of its last four games including ACC wins at NC State (January 1, 83-81) and at home against Louisville (January 8, 79-70). Florida State's game against Miami is a battle between two of the top three winningest coaches in Miami basketball history — Leonard Hamilton (144 wins from 1991-2000) and Jim Larranaga (211 wins, 2012-pesent). Following Tuesday's game against Miami, Florida State travels to play at Syracuse (January 15, 4:00 p.m.) and then plays host to Duke (January 18, 9:00 p.m.)

MILLS TIES CAREER-HIGH FOR POINTS IN WIN OVER LOUISVILLE

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Mills tied his career-high with 27 points in the Seminoles 79-70 win over Louisville at the Donald L. Tucker Center on Saturday night. His 27 points tied his career best which he also scored against Tulsa on February 19, 2020 while playing for the Cougars of the University of Houston. Mills' 27 points marked the most points scored by a Seminole since Terance Mann scored 30 against Georgia Tech on January 20, 2018.

FLORIDA STATE AT HOME SINCE 2015

Florida State is 82-5 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.943 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 82 of their last 87 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 79 of 84 home games (.941 winning percentage) in the last five seasons. The Seminoles have lost just one ACC home game since a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Florida State has won 26 of its last 27 ACC home games since defeating the Tigers and won 25 consecutive ACC home games from January 22, 2019 through March 3, 2021 – the second longest conference winning streak in ACC history. Only Duke, who won 26 straight ACC home games from 1997-2002, has a longer streak than then Seminoles in the history of the greatest conference in college basketball history.

SEMINOLES TO HONOR NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE AGAINST MIAMI

The Florida State men's basketball team will continue its tradition and wear its special turquoise Nike N7 uniforms in Tuesday's game against Miami to raise awareness for bringing sport to Native American and Aboriginal youth. It marks the 19th time (and second time this season) the Seminoles will wear the special uniforms. The Seminoles last wore the special uniforms in their 59-54 win over Tulane in Tallahassee on November 17, 2021. This season (2021-22) marks the ninth consecutive season the Seminoles will wear the turquoise uniforms. Florida State makes a distinct departure from its traditional school colors to don turquoise Nike N7 uniforms to stand for the importance of bringing sport and physical activity to Native American and Aboriginal youth. "The Seminole Tribe of Florida approached us about this program, and we are honored and excited to wear these unique uniforms," said head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles first wore the turquoise uniforms in their 89-61 win over UT-Martin in Tallahassee on November 17, 2013. The Seminoles are 15-3 when wearing the special N7 turquoise uniforms.

LOOKING INTO THE SERIES BETWEEN THE SEMINOLES AND THE HURRICANES

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Miami having won nine of the last 10 games in the series against the Hurricanes since a 75-57 win in Coral Gables on February 1, 2017. The Seminoles' current seven-game winning streak against the Hurricanes is the longest by either team in the series which began on December 19, 1950. The Seminoles' seven-game winning streak is its longest any of the current ACC teams.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

- ...Defeat Miami and win its eighth consecutive game against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles have won each of the games played between the two teams since a 101-90 win over the Hurricanes on January 27, 2018;
- ...Defeat Miami and win its sixth consecutive home game against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles have won each of the games played between the two teams since a 66-57 win on March 4, 2017;
- ...Defeat Miami and win its 27th ACC home game in its last 28 games dating to a win over Clemson on January 27, 2019. The Seminoles won 25 straight ACC home games from January 27, 2019 through March 3, 2021 against Boston College the second longest ACC home winning streak in conference history.

SEMINOLES AT HOME IN THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 26 of its last 27 ACC home games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019. Since the beginning of the 2016-17 season, the Seminoles have won 43 of their last 47 ACC home games (.915 winning percentage) including 19 of their last 20 (.950 winning percentage) since the start of their 2019-20 conference schedule.

SEMINOLES CUTTING TURNOVERS DOWN

Florida State committed a season-low six turnovers in its victory over Louisville on Saturday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles have committed a total of 16 turnovers in their last two games (8.0 turnovers per game) and have surrendered a total of 17 points from their own miscues against Louisville (five) ad Wake Forest (12). Florida State's six turnovers against Louisville included only two in the first half (three points surrendered) as they took a 50-40 lead at the intermission. Tuesday's game in the Donald L. Tucker matches the top two teams in the ACC in terms of turnover margin – Florida State (+4.1) and Miami (+4.3). Florida State's six turnovers against Louisville is tied for the fifth lowest single game total in the ACC this season.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Miami as the ACC leaders in steals with a 10.0 steals per game average in its first 13 games of the season. The Seminoles have earned at least 10 steals in six of their first 13 games of the season and are the only team in the conference who averages in double figures in steals (10.0 spg).

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S 16 STEALS AGAINST WAKE FOREST

Florida State's 16 steals against Wake Forest on January 4 in Winston-Salem is the second highest team steals total of the 2021-22 season any ACC team. Pittsburgh totaled an ACC-high 17 steals against West Virginia on November 12, 2021.

FLORIDA STATE IS TOUGH TO BLOCK

Florida State has had only 33 of its 739 shots blocked in its first 13 games of the season (.04 percent). The Seminoles did not have any of their shots blocked in Saturday's victory over Louisville and have gone block-less in three games this season — wins over Loyola Marymount (November 21), Missouri (November 22) and Louisville. Florida State has blocked nearly twice as many shots (63 / 4.8 bpg) as its first 13 opponents (33 2.5 bpg).

FLORIDA STATE FAMOUS FOR ITS BOOM SQUAD

Florida State's bench (appropriately nicknamed the Boom Squad) has outscored its opponents bench in 10 of its first 13 games of the season including by an incredible 25-1 margin against Syracuse on December 4 in Tallahassee. Freshman Matthew Cleveland – a prime candidate for the ACC Sixth Man of the Year Award – has scored in double figures seven times with each of his appearances coming off of the bench. Florida State's bench has earned 12 double figure scoring efforts with Cleveland (seven), Cam'Ron Fletcher (four) and Wyatt Wilkes (one) leading the way for the Boom Squad.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI - THE LAST MEETING

Junior Sardaar Calhoun scored a career-high 16 points to lead four Seminoles in double figure scoring and No. 9 ranked Florida State earned an 88-71 win over Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on February 24, 2021. Balsa Koprivica scored 13 points while RaiQuan Gray and Anthony Polite scored 12 each as the Seminoles rolled to their 10th ACC victory of the season. The Seminoles reached the 10-win mark in ACC play for the third consecutive season. Gray earned his third career double double with 12 points and a career-high 13 rebounds. His 12 points marks the ninth straight game he has scored in double figures. Koprivica also achieved double-figure scoring with 13 points and was five of 10 (.500 percent) from the field. With 12 points and three rebounds, Polite was another of four double-figure scoring Seminoles this evening. Polite was four of nine (.444 percent) from the field and two of six (.333 percent) from beyond the arc. Freshman Scottie Barnes had a game-high and a career-high of eight assists in contributing eight points.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Florida State scored first and often in the championship game of the Inaugural Jacksonville Classic as it overwhelmed Missouri, 81-58, to win its sixth in-season tournament championship under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles never trailed, led 44-23 at halftime, and increased their lead to 28 in the second half in claiming the win over the Tigers. Florida State was led by Malik Osborne, who was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player, and he scored 10 points and pulled down seven rebounds in the championship-clinching win. Anthony Polite led the Seminoles with 14 points on six of nine shooting from the field to go along with three rebounds, two assists and two steals. Also in double figures for the Seminoles were Cam'Ron Fletcher with 12 and freshman Matthew Cleveland with 10. Hamilton played his full complement of 17 players as the Seminoles were playing their second game in as many nights after defeating Loyola Marymount, 73-45, on Sunday. For the Seminoles, 13 players found the scoring column as they shot the ball incredibly well throughout the game.

Game 11 -- Florida State 83, NC State 81

RALEIGH, N.C. - Malik Osborne scored 12 of his 19 points in the second half and Cam'Ron Fletcher and Matthew Cleveland made big plays in the final seconds to help Florida State edge NC State. Fletcher scored 14 points and Cleveland and Caleb Mills 13 each as the Seminoles survived a 32-point performance by Dereon Seabron. After Terquavion Smith hit a 3-pointer off a Seabron assist to cut FSU's lead to 79-78, Cleveland was fouled after an offensive rebound and made 1 of 2 free throws. NC State called timeout with 8.4 seconds remaining but Fletcher stole the inbounds pass meant for Seabron and was fouled. He made the first free throw and missed the second but NC State's Jericole Hellems was called for a foul going for the rebound and Cleveland sank two more free throws. Smith hit his seventh 3-pointer as the game ended. Seabron was 12-of-14 shooting. His only 2-point miss came with NC State up by a point with a minute to go and led to a held-ball and an FSU possession that began the Seminoles' 9-6 game-ending run. Neither team led by more than seven points and there were 14 lead changes.
