OPENING WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- The Hurricanes will open their fourth season under the direction of head coach **Gino DiMare** against Towson (Feb. 18-20).
- DiMare was a standout outfielder at Miami from 1989-92 under coach Ron Fraser and coached 19 years under Jim Morris.
- The Hurricanes are 27-5 on Opening Day since 1990 and have won 13 straight Opening Day contests at Mark Light Field.
- Miami and Towson will meet for the first time since 2020, when the Canes swept the Tigers in Coral Gables (Feb. 28-Mar. 1).
- The Hurricanes, which posted a 33-21 mark a year ago, added the No. 1 recruiting class in the ACC, according to *Baseball America*, to a group of 15 returning players from a 2021 team that earned the 47th postseason appearance in UM history.
- Sophomore right-handed pitcher **Alejandro Rosario** earned the Opening Day start opposite Towson RHP **Nick Janowicz**.
- Rosario, who was tabbed a Perfect Game Freshman All-America second team in 2021, made 11 starts in his debut season.
- A consensus preseason All-American, **Carson Palmquist** is one of two Hurricanes that were named Preseason All-America. Palmquist was joined by infielder **Yohandy Morales**, who was tabbed a third-team pick by *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Miami returns seven of 10 pitchers who tossed at least 18 innings over the Hurricanes' 54 games in the 2021 season.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

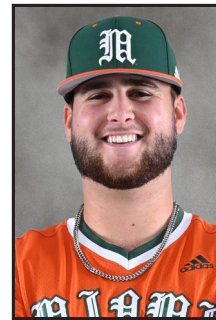

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2021 marked DiMare's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

In 2021, the Hurricanes returned to the postseason for the second time under DiMare's leadership. In a year that began with a series victory at preseason No. 1 Florida, Miami finished the regular season second in the ACC Coastal and traveled to the Gainesville Regional.

Lefty Carson Palmquist was a consensus All-American and earned first-team honors from the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Palmquist headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team pick, while catcher Adrian Del Castillo, outfielder Christian Del Castillo and infielder Anthony Vilar were picked for the second team. Palmquist and infielder Yohandy Morales were selected to the ACC All-Freshman team, while Palmquist, Morales and right-hander Alejandro Rosario earned Freshman All-America honors.

After the season, Adrian Del Castillo (2nd round, Arizona), Jake Smith (6th round, LA Angels) and Anthony Vilar (15th round, San Diego) were all selected in the MLB Draft and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

Miami proved to be one of the top teams in the country during a shortened 2020 season. The Canes went 12-4 and finished the season ranked as high as No. 5 by *Baseball America* and in the top 15 of all six major polls. A preseason pick to win the ACC Coastal, Miami went 3-0 in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, three Hurricanes were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken with the 33rd overall pick by the Arizona Diamondbacks, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft. McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round to the Colorado Rockies and junior shortstop Freddy Zamora was taken in the second round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

With three players drafted, Miami tied Mississippi State and Texas A&M with the most selections among the top 60 picks in the 2020 MLB Draft. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball*, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.



DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by *Baseball America*, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by *Collegiate Baseball*. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by *Collegiate Baseball* and fifth by *Baseball America* prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife, Denise, and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

OPENING WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**MIAMI OPENS FOURTH SEASON UNDER DIMARE**

- The University of Miami will begin its fourth season under the direction of head coach **Gino DiMare** on Feb. 18 with an Opening Day showdown against Towson.
- The Hurricanes and Tigers will meet for the first time since 2020, when Miami swept Towson (Feb. 28-Mar. 1).
- Miami will start its season at Mark Light Field for the 24th time in the last 25 years. The Hurricanes kicked off their 2021 campaign in Gainesville against the Florida Gators.
- The Hurricanes have not lost an opening weekend series in 15 seasons.
- Miami is **27-5** on **Opening Day** since 1990 and has won 13 straight Opening Day contests at Mark Light Field.
- UM has not lost on Opening Day since 2007 in Coral Gables, a 6-5 loss to Mercer.
- Sophomore right-hander **Alejandro Rosario** (6-4, 5.24 ERA in 2021) earns the Opening Day nod opposite Towson senior right-hander **Nick Janowicz** (3-3, 5.94 ERA in 2021).

HURRICANES OPEN SEASON IN TOP 25

- The Miami Hurricanes enter the 2022 season ranked by four outlets, and as high as No. 18 by Perfect Game.
- Miami opens the season ranked No. 23 by *Collegiate Baseball*, No. 18 by Perfect Game, No. 25 by *Baseball America*, and No. 25 by *D1 Baseball*.
- The Hurricanes will begin their season ranked for the eighth time in the last nine years.

VETERANS HEADLINE WEEKEND ROTATION

- A quartet of sophomores make up the Hurricanes' rotation on Opening Weekend. Third-years **Carson Palmquist**, **Jake Garland** and **Alex McFarlane** will follow **Alejandro Rosario** on the mound against the Towson Tigers.
- Rosario was a 2021 Perfect Game Freshman All-America second team after totaling 11 starts. In his debut season, the right-hander recorded a 6-4 mark with 55 strikeouts.
- Palmquist, who finished third in the nation with 14 saves a season ago, is slated to make his first career start. The left-handed pitcher was tabbed a consensus preseason All-American ahead of the 2022 season after posting a 2.22 ERA and 75 punchouts last year.
- Garland made a team-leading 13 starts in his second year in the orange and green. The Jupiter, Fla., native tossed a team-high 68 innings en route to a 6-4 record in 2021.
- McFarlane, who is considered one of the top-pitching prospects in the upcoming MLB First-Year Player Draft, appeared as both a starter and reliever in 2021. The flamethrowing right-hander notched a 2-1 record with a 4.50 ERA in 34 innings pitched last season.

PALMQUIST ON THE BUMP

- Third-year left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** enters the 2022 season as a unanimous preseason All-American and National Player of the Year candidate.
- Palmquist, who led the Hurricanes with 75 strikeouts, was one of only two freshmen among the 10 finalists for the 2021 NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after pacing the ACC and finishing thirddnationally with 14 saves.

- The southpaw collected first-team All-America recognition from NCBWA and Perfect Game, while he received second-team honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball* and *Collegiate Baseball*.
- The All-ACC First Team selection went 1-1 with a 2.22 ERA and held opponents to a .143 batting average.
- In the shortened 2020 season, Palmquist made eight appearances as a reliever, finishing with a 2.31 ERA. He tallied 15 strikeouts over 11.2 innings.

PALMQUIST ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** was among the 55 players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.
- Miami has had 14 different players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.

PAIR ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Infielder **Yohandy Morales** and catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** were among the 44 players named to the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List for the 2022 college baseball season.
- The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. The 44 players on the watch list represent 18 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.
- The BBCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBCSA expanded becoming a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. Last year, the BBCSA became a national award; however, no winner was announced due to the COVID-19 virus that cut the college baseball season short.
- Texas Tech's Hunter Hargrove won the initial BBCSA in 2017. Dallas Baptist's Devlin Granberg took home the honor in 2018, with Texas Tech's Josh Jung winning the award in 2019. Last year's winner was Connor Norby from East Carolina University.

TWO CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

- The Hurricanes had two different players selected to a Preseason All-America team in advance of the 2022 season: LHP **Carson Palmquist** and INF **Yohandy Morales**.

WAY TO GO, YOYO

- **Yohandy Morales** enters the 2022 season as one of the most prolific hitters in the ACC.
- Morales brings his big bat back to the heart of Miami's lineup after pacing the team with 13 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, .532 slugging percentage, 44 runs scored and 13-multi RBI games in his debut campaign.
- The All-ACC Freshman Team and *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America selection posted a .284 batting average and .874 OPS in 2021, making 53 starts primarily at third base.
- Morales was named to the All-Gainesville Regional team after leading the Hurricanes with a .444 average, a homer and two RBI.

DYNAMIC DUO BEHIND THE DISH

- **Carlos Perez** and **Maxwell Romero Jr.** provide the Hurricanes with a pair of elite backstops.
- Perez, who appeared in 19 games and made 12 starts a year ago, is one of the finest defensive catchers in the country.
- The Miami native had a .422 slugging percentage as a key freshman bat for the Hurricanes behind now Diamondbacks farmhand Adrian Del Castillo.
- Perez is ranked 14th among 2023 draft-eligible players in the ACC by both *D1 Baseball* and *Perfect Game*.
- Romero Jr. comes to his hometown Hurricanes after two years at Vanderbilt.
- The Miramar, Fla., native hit .300 with four home runs across 21 games as a Commodore. He registered 15 starts and helped Vanderbilt reach the College World Series finals in 2021.
- Romero Jr. is ranked as the fourth-most impactful transfer in the nation by *D1 Baseball*.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

- Miami has 19 newcomers on the 2022 roster, with 11 freshmen, five transfers, two JUCO transfers and one graduate transfer joining the 15 returning letterwinners from a year ago.
- Freshmen pitchers **Gage Ziehl**, **Karson Ligon** and **Rafe Schlesinger** and hitters **Lorenzo Carrier**, **Dorian Gonzalez Jr.** and **Renzo Gonzalez** figure to play key roles early.
- Graduate transfer **Matt Raudelunas**, as well as transfers **Maxwell Romero Jr.**, **Jacob Burke** and **Alejandro Torres** are expected to contribute from the start of the season.
- Miami's talented recruiting class was ranked first in the ACC, according to *Baseball America*, which marks the third straight year the Hurricanes have brought in the top class in the conference.

HURRICANES DOMINATE ALUMNI, 13-0

• The Miami Hurricanes welcomed back more than 60 alumni, who were introduced during pregame festivities at the annual Miami Alumni Game on Sat., Feb. 12.

• MLB All-Star **Yonder Alonso**, World Series champion **Jon Jay** and 95-year old **Larry Adams**, who played for Miami in the late 1940s, were among the Hurricanes who returned home to Mark Light Field.

• Facing a talented alumni roster that included Chicago White Sox infielder **Romy Gonzalez**, Arizona Diamondbacks prospect **Adrian Del Castillo** and fan favorites like **Kevin Brown** and **Willie Abreu**, among others, the Hurricanes beat the Alumni, 13-0.

• Miami scored nine runs in the first four frames, including a five run fourth inning. The Hurricanes tack on four insurance tallies in the eighth to bookend the offensive outburst.

• Sophomore left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** fired five shutout innings, surrendering only one hit and striking out eight.

• Right-handers **Andrew Walters**, **Alejandro Torres**, **Anthony Arguelles** and southpaw **Rafe Schlesinger** teamed up to toss four hitless frames to cap off the victory.

ON THE BIG SCREEN

• This past fall, the DiMare family pledged a \$1.6 million donation to fund a new scoreboard at Mark Light Field, which will debut this season.

• The new video display features Daktronics 10mm surface mount device (SMD LED) technology, elevating the fan experience with over 1,167,000 individual pixels. The new system replaces a 12-year old 23mm Daktronics system and increases resolution by 56 percent for stunning clarity

• In January, the University of Miami announced that the Ruiz family has committed a \$2 million gift to expand the current facility and fund a cutting-edge strength and conditioning complex at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

• The Ruiz Family Strength and Conditioning Complex will be an approximately 1,600-square-foot expansion to the current weight room. 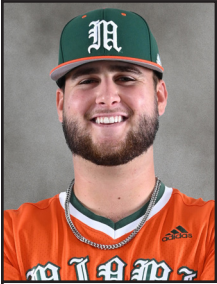
