## GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- South Carolina's calling card all season has been its defense, leading the country in field goal percentage defense (.324) and third in scoring defense (50.8). The Gamecocks stamped that authority on the NCAA Tournament early, setting first/second-round records for points allowed in a game (21) and in a half (4) and field goals allowed in a game (8, tied).
- The Gamecocks' paint dominance spans both ends of the court. South Carolina is out-scoring opponents in the paint by 15.2 points per game (38.1-22.9). The Gamecocks are allowing opponents to shoot just 38.7 percent shooting within six feet of the basket, thanks in large part to the NCAA-best 7.7 blocks per game.
- Another area of paint dominance is South Carolina's offensive rebounding and second-chance points. The Gamecocks are third in the NCAA with 17.1 offensive rebounds per game, led by Aliyah Boston's 3.8 average, which ranks 22 nd in the country. South Carolina has turned those 17.1 offensive boards into 16.4 second-chance points per game.
- The Gamecock offense has found better ball movement of late, averaging 16.8 assists per game over the last five outings. That's an assists on 67.2 percent of made field goals over that stretch.
- With her 25th-consecutive double-double coming against Howard (Mar. 18), Aliyah Boston became just the third woman in NCAA history with a singleseason streak at least that long. She joins Cal's Kristine Anigwe (32 in 2018-19) and Oklahoma's Courtney Paris ( 33 in 2006-07, 31 in 2007-08, 28 in 2005-06).
- Junior Brea Beal continues to be a key to the Gamecock defense, as she has throughout her career. Over the last five games, the 6 -foot-1, powerful guard has held her primary guard 4.6 points below her average. Beal has also been lifting her offensive output in that stretch, netting 6.8 points per game.

## Five-Second Count

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 11 seasons, including five 30 -win seasons in the last eight campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four three times in the last seven NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 187 consecutive weeks, including 56 in the top 10. Staley has led the Gamecocks to their only No. 1 rankings in program history, owning that spot 44 times ( 12 weeks in 2014-15, 10 weeks in 2019-20, 3 weeks in 2020-21, 19 weeks in 2021-22), making them just the sixth program all-time with that at least 40 top entries in that poll. In the SEC, the Gamecocks have won six SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

Under Staley's leadership, eight Gamecocks have earned All-America status, three have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 17 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last six years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020).

## The Miami Series

The Gamecocks lead the all-time series 2-0, although the two teams have not met since Nov. 28, 1993. This marks the first meeting between the two in Columbia and the first postseason meeting.

## Gamecocks' Tournament Summary

South Carolina opened the 2022 NCAA Tournament in historic fashion with a 79-21 win over Howard in the opening round. The Gamecock defense set NCAA Tournament first/second-round records for points allowed in a first half (4), points allowed in a game (21) and tied the record for field goals allowed in a game (8). South Carolina also tied the record for rebounds in a game (69) and was second in rebounding margin (+41).

The defense and rebounding effort also hit the Gamecock record books:

- 4 first-half points allowed - program record
- 21 points allowed - tied program record
- 58-point victory - program NCAA Tourn. record
- 79 FG attempts - program NCAA Tourn. record
- 30 offensive rebs. - program NCAA Tourn. record
- 38 defensive rebs. - program NCAA Tourn. record


## TEAM THEME: NETWORTH

South Carolina's 2021-22 season theme "Net Worth" taps into the universal symbol of success in basketball - cutting down the nets. Each member of the team, the program and the fan base plays a role in the march toward achieving that level of success.

Every role is not the same, but every person has a "Net Worth" - an added value necessary for the team to achieve its goals.

Head coach Dawn Staley's program develops a different theme each season to amplify the team's goals and mindset for the season ahead.

Staley sent 14 Gamecocks to the court in the game with the bench out-scoring the starters 43-26. Three reserves set new season highs in at least one category.

## Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are 495-165 (.750) all-time in home games, including a 183-34 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. That .843 winning percentage is second among the program's all-time head coaches (Pam Parsons (41-7) .854).

Playing in its 19th season at Colonial Life Arena, South Carolina boasts a 246-67 (.786) record in the building, including three undefeated seasons since 2013-14. Staley's share of that record is 180-34 (.841).

This marks the 11th season that the Gamecocks have hosted NCAA Tournament games in Columbia, most recently in the 2018 event. (South Carolina earned the right to host games in 2019 but had to play in Charlotte, N.C., due to Colonial Life Arena hosting the men's tournament that season.)

The Gamecocks are 14-2 in home NCAA Tournament games, including a 9-0 mark in Colonial Life Arena.

## NCAA Tournament Take

South Carolina is in its 18th NCAA Tournament and its 10th straight under head coach Dawn Staley. The Gamecocks are 35-16 overall in the event with 11 Sweet 16 appearances, five Elite Eight seasons, three Final Four showings and the 2017 National Championship.

In her 22nd season as a head coach, Staley has taken a team to the NCAA Tournament 16 times. She is 29-14 at the event, including a 27-8 mark at South Carolina.

## Gamecocks Against the Field

South Carolina faced 15 of the 68 teams in the NCAA Tournament field, just one of which is in the Greensboro Region with them. The Gamecocks went 19-1 against those 15 teams, including an 11-1 mark against the seven other SEC teams in the field.

In addition to their seven league rivals in the field Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Ole Miss and Tennessee - South Carolina played non-conference games against Buffalo, Connecticut, Kansas State, Maryland, NC State, Oregon, South Dakota and Stanford.

## Ranked Readings

Against ranked opponents, South Carolina is 96-66 (.593) in the Dawn Staley era (beginning 2008-09), and even that mark is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure.

Since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Gamecocks are 81-27 (.750) against ranked teams, including a 33-6 mark since the start of the 2019-20 season.

This season, South Carolina's 11 wins over ranked opponents are more than any other team in the country and have come by an average of 13.5 points.

Junior Aliyah Boston leads the team against ranked opponents, averaging a double-double (17.5 pts/12.6 rebs) to go with 3.2 blocks per game. Zia Cooke has 13.4 points per game, and Destanni Henderson is also in double figures at 12.4.

## Schedule Strength

South Carolina's 11 games against nationally ranked teams, eight of which were in the AP top 15 at the time of the game, are the second most in the country (Indiana, Texas and Virginia Tech, 12). Wins in all 11 of those games have the Gamecocks atop the NET rankings and are the most during the regular-season schedule in program history. The overall program record for ranked wins is 13 , originally set in 2015-16 and tied in 2019-20.

The Gamecocks' non-conference schedule is rated second-toughest in the country, helping the team to 18 wins against NET top-50 opponents, the most of any team this season.

## Ranking Review

The Gamecocks are atop both the AP and the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Polls for the 19th-straight week after opening the season in that position for the second time in as many seasons.

In the AP Poll, the Gamecocks' 44 total weeks at No. 1 make them just the sixth program all-time to sit atop that poll at least 40 times. South Carolina has appeared in each of the last 187 AP Polls, giving it the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, which dates back to Dec. 10, 2021. It has spent the last 56 of those weeks ranked in the top 10.

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll. It has been No. 1 in this poll 28 times in the last eight seasons.

## Staley's Stand

In October, the University of South Carolina awarded head coach Dawn Staley a seven-year contract totaling $\$ 22.4$ million. With a guaranteed $\$ 2.9$ million this season, the move made Staley the highest paid women's basketball coach at a public institution (matching Geno Auriemma at UConn) and the highest paid Black coach in her sport.

Ever the trailblazer, Staley emphasized that her negotiations were about more than her contract. They were founded in her desire to make a point about the inequality in salaries for women, and Black women in particular, throughout her sport and across all professions.

## The Staley File

In her 22nd season as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .742 (533-185) winning percentage, which ranks 12th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience (sixth among Power 5 conference coaches). The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

In her 14th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (361) with a program-record 11 postseason appearances (10 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for all three of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances $(2015,2017,2021)$ and the first NCAA National Championship in program history (2017).

After claiming six SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 167 SEC games, the most among active league coaches and third all-time - trailing just Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductees Andy Landers (Georgia, 273) and Pat Summitt (Tennessee, 306). Her 11.9 SEC wins average is the best in league history among coaches with more than one year in the league, and her . 752 SEC winning percentage (167-55) is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt (.874) in league history.

## SEC Stories

South Carolina has been a regular contender for SEC regular-season championships since claiming its first one in 2013-14. In the last nine seasons, the Gamecocks have won the league six times - 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2020, 2022 - and finished second in the other three seasons. It is the league's most successful stretch for one team since Tennessee claimed seven titles in nine seasons 1999-2007.

The Gamecocks are the only program with two 16-0 SEC seasons - 2016, 2020.

After struggling through its first 17 seasons in the powerful league, South Carolina turned a corner with the arrival of Dawn Staley. Under her tutelage, the Gamecocks are 167-55 (.752) in league play with the 167 wins accounting for 72.3 percent of the program's 231 all-time SEC victories.

## National Acknowledgment

Three Gamecocks have picked up national recognition for their efforts this season. Aliyah Boston leads the trio with National Player of the Year honors from The Athletic and First-Team All-America status from the AP and the USBWA.

Destanni Henderson picked up her first All-America recognition, earning a spot on the USBWA third team and honorable mention status from the AP.

Zia Cooke joined Henderson with AP honorable mention selection.

## SEC Awards

SEC Regular-Season Champion South Carolina saw three "of the Year" awards and three All-SEC positions come their way in voting by the league's coaches.

Head coach Dawn Staley collected her fifth SEC Coach of the Year award after leading her team to its sixth regular-season title in the last nine years and within one point of the program's third perfect $16-0$ record.

Junior forward Aliyah Boston grabbed the first SEC Player of the Year award of her career and is a perfect three-for-three in SEC Defensive Player of the Year voting, having earned at least a share of the award in each of her first two seasons as well.

Senior guard Destanni Henderson made her first appearance on an All-SEC team, joining Boston on the first team. Junior guard Zia Cooke grabbed a spot on the second team, her second season earning All-SEC status.

## Dominating Defense

South Carolina's defense has been deceptively smothering throughout the season, leading the nation in field goal percentage defense (.324) and third in scoring defense (50.7). Yes, the Gamecocks lead the nation in blocked shots, but they are barely in the top 300 in steals per game and, for the season, have a-1.2 turnover margin. Neither stat tells the story of the relentless defensive effort, though.

As with most things, the Gamecocks are more fundamental than flashy as the defense is committed to the disruption of offensive flow, however, slight it may be. And, the method works. No team has reached its scoring average against the Gamecocks this season, including some of the SEC's most prolific offenses, and only two came within single digits of it - Missouri (Dec. 30) and Mississippi State (Jan. 2).

The SEC's highest-scoring team, Arkansas at 74.9 points per game, scored just 52 at home against South Carolina

and 54 in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals. LSU is second in the league, pouring in 74.1 points per game, but managed just 60 against the Gamecocks in Baton Rouge.

On a national stage, Maryland currently ranks 10th in NCAA with 78.1 points per game but scored just 59 on its trip to Columbia. Similarly, NC State is 15 th at 76.4 points per game but netted just 57 at home against the Gamecocks.

## Paint Production

South Carolina has long dominated the paint on both ends of the court. This season, the Gamecocks average 38.1 points in the paint, accounting for 53.3 percent of their total offense. Unlike many previous seasons, post players have been the dominant scorers in the paint, accounting for 63.4 percent of the paint points with 24.2 such points per game.

Defensively, the Gamecocks have protected the paint, yielding just 22.9 points per game in that space. For the season, the Gamecocks are holding opponents to just 38.7 percent shooting within six feet of the basket, compared to the league average of allowing 48.3 percent in that space.

## Glass Ceiling

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, the Gamecocks have dominated on the glass, ranking among the NCAA's top five in rebounds per game and rebounding margin every season and sixth in offensive rebounds per game each of the last three seasons. South Carolina has been out-rebounded just twice (Stanford, 12/21/21; at Georgia, 2/13/22) in its last 65 games, dating back to the 2019-20 regular-season finale against Texas A\&M.

This season, South Carolina leads the nation with a +17.9 rebounding margin. The Gamecocks lead the SEC in offensive (.460) and defensive (.752) rebounding percentage.

Individually, Aliyah Boston leads the way with 12.0 rebounds per game, which ranks seventh in the nation. Three other Gamecocks pull in more than five boards per game - forward Victaria Saxton (5.5), center Kamilla Cardoso (5.4) and guard Brea Beal (5.4)

## Block Party

South Carolina annually ranks among the best shot blocking teams in the country and leads the way this season at 7.7 blocks per game after finishing the 2020-21 season second at 7.0.

Aliyah Boston's 2.66 blocks per game lead the way at 10th in the nation and second in the SEC. Sophomore Kamilla Cardoso - the leading shot blocker in the ACC last season - is eighth in the SEC at 1.2.

## Quarter Breakdown

South Carolina's defense has held an opponent to single digits in a quarter 34 times this season, including 12 second quarters and six fourth quarters as the constant defensive pressure wears opponents down. The scoring differential is largest in the first quarter with South Carolina out-scoring opponents by 6.4 points in that period.

## Oh Captain, My Captain

For the second time in as many seasons, senior Victaria Saxton and junior Aliyah Boston are serving as team captains. It is Saxton's third season in that position.

## All-Everything Aliyah Boston

From her career debut triple-double to becoming the only 2021 finalist for both the Naismith Trophy and Naismith Defensive Player of the Year, junior Aliyah Boston has spent her entire career on the national stage.

In her third campaign, the 2022 SEC Player of the Year and first-team All-American is poised to rise to the top step.

The three-time All-American and two-time Lisa Leslie Center Award winner averages a double-double for her career ( $14.3 \mathrm{ppg} / 10.9 \mathrm{rpg}$ ) while her 56 career doubledoubles leads active SEC players, ranks fifth among Div. I active players and is third in program history. In 39 career games against ranked opponents, her averages rise to 14.8 ppg and 11.8 rpg .

Dropping over 20 pounds since the start of her sophomore season, Boston was all about basketball this

[^0]summer, helping the U.S. to gold at the FIBA AmeriCup and spending time training with NBA legend Tim Duncan.

## Henny-thing Goes

Senior point guard Destanni Henderson is coming into her own in her final collegiate season, proving that trusting the process works. Entering the program as the No. 1 point guard in the Class of 2018, she waited her turn to step in to the starting role - even accepting a star bench position as a sophomore instead of clamoring for a starting role at another guard spot.

In two seasons as the starting point guard, Henderson is handing out 4.7 assists per game, including 30 games with five or more, and has a 1.9 assist-to-turnover ratio. Her 11.7 points per game in that time includes 40.6 percent shooting from 3-point range.

The increased scoring as a starter helped Henderson join the 1,000-point club at Arkansas on Jan. 14.

## Ready to Cooke

A prolific scorer from the minute she got to campus, junior Zia Cooke averages 13.0 points for her career. In 95 career games, she has hit double-digit points 71 times - 74.7 percent of her games - including 1420 -point outings.

The preseason All-American hit 1,000 career points on

Dec. 12 and scored in double figures in 14 of her 15 SEC games to post 11.5 points per league game this season.

## Brea-Fense, Brea-Fense

Junior guard Brea Beal personifies the Gamecock defense - gritty, physical and unrelenting. A mainstay in Dawn Staley's starting lineup, the 6-foot-1 Beal regularly takes on an opponent's toughest scorer and delivers on shutting her down.

Beal has allowed her primary defensive assignment to reach her scoring average just eight times this season, and has held her guard at least 40 percent below her average 12 times, including UConn's Christyn Williams (10 pts vs. SC), Maryland's Chloe Bibby (2 pts vs. SC), Kentucky's Rhyne Howard (9 pts at SC) and Arkansas' Amber Ramirez (8 pts in SEC Tournament).

For the season, Beal's primary defensive assignment has scored 3.2 points below her season average. Against ranked opponents, that number rises to 3.4.

## V is for Vital

Often the most overlooked player in the Gamecocks' star-studded starting lineup, senior forward Victaria Saxton is the one whose consistently sound execution and tireless effort allow her teammates to shine - and she doesn't mind either part of that statement.

Staley refers to Saxton as high performance, low maintenance; and recently commented that she is the player the coaching staff wonders how they will replace next season.

Saxton's 5.7 points, 5.5 rebounds ( 2.8 on the offensive end, 5th in the SEC), 1.3 blocks and 1.3 assists per game (four games of three or more) don't appear to be flashy numbers, but to see them is to appreciate their impact.

## Three Grand

For the first time in program history, three Gamecocks reached the 1,000-point plateau in the same season.

Already inextricably linked in Gamecock history as part of the program's first No. 1 ranked signing class in 2019, Aliyah Boston and Zia Cooke became the first Gamecock duo to record their 1,000th career points in the same game. Against Maryland on Dec. 12, Cooke reached the mark first by hitting a 3 in the second quarter, and Boston followed in the third quarter. A little over a month later, senior Destanni Henderson joined them, hitting the mark at Arkansas on Jan. 14.

## Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last seven seasons. With over 10,100 season tickets sold this season - the most since 10,221 were out in 2016-17 - that streak looks to

The Gamecocks have drawn nine of the 16 games with 12,000 or higher attendance this season, including the most attended game of the season - an 18,000 fan sell out on Feb. 20 against Tennessee. It marked the sixth-straight season (excluding COVID-limited 2020-21 season) of at least one sellout at Colonial Life Arena.

Excluding the COVID limited-attendance season of 2019-20, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans in 62 consecutive games dating back to the Nov. 10, 2017, season opener. In regular-season action (excluding NCAA Tournament games), the streak stretches to 96 games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.

## U-S-A, U-S-A

Since the arrival of Staley in the 2008-09 season, South Carolina has solidified its relationship with USA Basketball. at least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue in each of the last six years of international competition (no events in 2020), and the group of 11 Gamecocks, including three currently in the program, has helped 18 U.S. teams to gold medals, three more to silvers and another to bronze.

Staley along with three current and two former Gamecocks added four golds to that count this summer.

In Tokyo, Staley and alumna A'ja Wilson led the U.S. to its record-tying seventh-straight gold medal in $5 \times 5$ basketball, while Allisha Gray was part of the first ever Olympic $3 \times 3$ gold medal team.

In June, Staley led the U.S. team, which included senior Destanni Henderson and junior Aliyah Boston, to gold at the FIBA AmeriCup in June. Two months later, freshman Sania Feagin was part of the U.S. team to take gold int he FIBA U19 World Cup.

While this summer marked the first gold medals for Feagin and Henderson, Boston's was the fifth of her career. Junior Zia Cooke also has two gold medals with USA Basketball.

In December, USA Basketball named Staley a corecipient of its National Coach of the Year award, and Gray became the organization's first $3 \times 3$ Athlete of the Year.

## Everybody's All-American

On the Gamecocks' 16-woman roster, 11 were McDonald's All-Americans in high school - Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Kamilla Cardoso, Zia Cooke, Sania Feagin, Bree Hall, Destanni Henderson, Raven Johnson, Destiny Littleton, Saniya Rivers and Eniya Russell.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 18 McDonald's All-Americans, including 14 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen. That total number will go up by two next season as the Gamecocks' two Class of 2022 signees, Talaysia Cooper and Ashlyn Watkins, earned the title on Jan. 25.

The Gamecock have serious speed in the open court. Laeticia Amihere registered the fastest 3/4-court sprint time at 2.83 seconds. Destanni Henderson is right behind at 2.86 second, then Brea Beal at 2.96 seconds. Aliyah Boston and Saniya Rivers round out the top five at 3.03 seconds.

Boston showed the biggest improvement in the offseason, going from 3.44 at the start of 2020-21 to 3.03 to start this season.

## Jumping

10 of 16 Gamecocks have a standing, two-foot vertical jump over 25 inches with Victaria Saxton leading the way at 30.3 inches. She can touch 10 -foot-5.

Saniya Rivers is second on the team at a 29.8-inch vertical jump and can
also touch 10 -foot-5. Laeticia Amihere has a 27 -inch vertical and can touch 10-foot-9. Aliyah Boston improved her vertical jump by four inches in the offseason.

8 of 16 Gamecocks have broad jumps greater than eight feet with Saxton leading at 9-foot-4.5.
