MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NEWS

- No. 3 Miami, which has won 18 of its last 21 games, wraps up a five-game homestand against the Stetson Hatters.
- The Hurricanes leads the all-time series over the Hatters, 114-43, including a 73-16 advantage at Mark Light Field.
- Under head coach **Gino DiMare**, UM has posted a 28-6 (.824) record in midweek contests, including an 8-1 ledger in 2022.
- Miami right-hander **Jake Garland** (6-1, 2.19 ERA) opposes Stetson southpaw **Jonathan Gonzalez** (3-5, 5.29 ERA) Tuesday.
- Garland, who ranks third in the ACC in ERA, pitched seven scoreless innings in his last outing against Bethune-Cookman.
- The Canes are a consensus top-four team for the second time this year, checking in as high as No. 2 by *Collegiate Baseball*.
- As of April 25, the Hurricanes boast the seventh-best RPI in the country, which is fifth among Power 5 programs.
- UM is off to its best 40-game start since 2016 and top-ACC start since 2008. Both years, UM made the College World Series.
- Miami leads the nation with 10 top-25 wins, highlighted by a sweep of No. 3 Virginia at Mark Light Field (April 8-10).
- The Hurricanes, who posted a 33-21 mark a year ago, added the No. 1 recruiting class in the ACC, according to *Baseball America*, to a group of 15 returning players from a 2021 team that earned the 47th postseason appearance in UM history.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2021 marked DiMare's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

In 2021, the Hurricanes returned to the postseason for the second time under DiMare's leadership. In a year that began with a series victory at preseason No. 1 Florida, Miami finished the regular season second in the ACC Coastal and traveled to the Gainesville Regional.

Lefty Carson Palmquist was a consensus All-American and earned first-team honors from the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Palmquist headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team pick, while catcher Adrian Del Castillo, outfielder Christian Del Castillo and infielder Anthony Vilar were picked for the second team. Palmquist and infielder Yohandy Morales were selected to the ACC All-Freshman team, while Palmquist, Morales and right-hander Alejandro Rosario earned Freshman All-America honors.

After the season, Adrian Del Castillo (2nd round, Arizona), Jake Smith (6th round, LA Angels) and Anthony Vilar (15th round, San Diego) were all selected in the MLB Draft and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

Miami proved to be one of the top teams in the country during a shortened 2020 season. The Canes went 12-4 and finished the season ranked as high as No. 5 by *Baseball America* and in the top 15 of all six major polls. A preseason pick to win the ACC Coastal, Miami went 3-0 in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, three Hurricanes were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken with the 33rd overall pick by the Arizona Diamondbacks, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft. McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round to the Colorado Rockies and junior shortstop Freddy Zamora was taken in the second round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

With three players drafted, Miami tied Mississippi State and Texas A&M with the most selections among the top 60 picks in the 2020 MLB Draft. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball*, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.



DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by *Baseball America*, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by *Collegiate Baseball*. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by *Collegiate Baseball* and fifth by *Baseball America* prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife, Denise, and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

MIAMI CONCLUDES HOMESTAND

- No. 3 Miami, which has won 18 of its last 21 games, welcomes the Stetson Hatters to Mark Light Field.
- The Hurricanes are 114-43 all-time against the Hatters, including a 73-16 advantage in Coral Gables.
- Miami is 28-6 (.824) in midweek matchups under fourth-year head coach **Gino DiMare**, including an 8-1 mark this season.
- UM right-handed pitcher **Jake Garland** (6-1, 2.19 ERA) gets the ball against Stetson lefty **Jonathan Gonzalez** (3-5, 5.29 ERA) Tuesday.

HURRICANES STAY HOT IN ACC ACTION

- Miami won its sixth ACC series in seven tries, taking two-of-three against the Pitt Panthers.
- First baseman **CJ Kayfus** delivered a walk-off single in the 10th, pushing the Hurricanes past the Panthers, 2-1, in the series opener.
- Left-handed hurler **Carson Palmquist** struck out 11 across 5 1/3 scoreless innings.
- As a pitching staff, Miami punched out 19 batters, which matches the third-most in a game in program history.
- On Saturday, the Hurricanes scored in seven of the eight innings they came to the plate, pounding Pitt, 17-2.
- Miami tied a season-high 17 runs on 15 hits, led by outfielder

Zach Levenson.

- Third-year freshman **Henry Wallen**, junior catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** and sophomore outfielder **Jacob Burke** all joined Levenson with three RBI.
- Freshman right-hander **Karson Ligon** tossed a career-high eight innings, allowing only one run and matching a career-best eight strikeouts.
- Prior to Game 2, the Hurricanes celebrated the 40th anniversary of the 1982 national championship team, which was the first Miami team to win a national championship in a major sport and the first baseball national title for any school in the southeastern United States.
- Despite **Ronaldo Gallo's** career-outing out of the bullpen, Miami dropped the series finale, 9-4, Sunday.
- Gallo pitched a career-high three innings, retiring eight of the nine batters he faced.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE NATION

- For the second time this season, Miami is a consensus top-four team.
- The Hurricanes check in as high as No. 2 by *Collegiate Baseball*, while Miami is No. 3 by *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball*, *NCBWA* and the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 4 by Perfect Game.

DON'T STOP THE ROCK

- The Miami Hurricanes are off to their best 40-game start since 2016 and ACC start since 2008. Both seasons, Miami qualified for the College World Series.
- Prior to dropping the series opener to the Virginia Tech Hokies (April 14), the Hurricanes' 14-game winning streak was the program's longest in eight seasons.
- Miami leads the country with 10 top-25 wins, highlighted by a sweep of then-No. 3 Virginia (April 8-10).

- Freshman right-hander **Karson Ligon** was among the 44 players named to the Golden Spikes Award midseason watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.
- Miami has had seven different players named to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.
- **Peter O'Brien** (2012), **Bryan Radziewski** (2013) and **David Thompson** (2015), **Zack Collins** (2016), **Bryan Garcia** (2016) and **Adrian Del Castillo** (2021), preceded Ligon as midseason picks.
- Ligon has recorded a 3.21 ERA over 53 1/3 innings pitched. The 6-foot-1, 208-pound hurler has held opponents to a .220 batting average, which ranks first among ACC freshmen.

FIRE ME UP WALT

- Closer **Andrew Walters** has been one of the best relievers in college baseball this season.
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pound right-hander is tied for second in the country with 12 saves.
- In his second season in the orange and green, Walters has made 17 appearances, pitching 23 2/3 innings allowing only one run.

- In his career, Walters has totaled a 0.93 ERA with 83 strikeouts over 48 1/3 innings.

PITELLI NAMED ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- After a historic weekend, **Dominic Pitelli** earned ACC Co-Player of the Week honors on April 4.
- Pitelli, in the Hurricanes' series sweep at Duke, became the first player in the program's rich 78-year history to smack two grand slams in the same series.
- The 5-foot-11, 175-pound sophomore clubbed a game-winning grand slam in the eighth inning, propelling Miami to a 4-1 victory over the Blue Devils in the series opener.
- After a two-hit performance in the 4-3 win Saturday, Pitelli jumpstarted the Hurricanes in the series finale, rocketing a first-inning grand slam.
- The shortstop finished Sunday's sweep with a career-high five RBI, sparking an 11-3 rout of the Blue Devils.
- Pitelli went 9-for-18 with two home runs and 10 RBI, posting a .500 on-base percentage and a .944 slugging percentage, leading Miami to a perfect 4-0 week.
- The left-handed hitter is the first Hurricane to garner an ACC weekly honor in 2022.

DIMARE WINS 100TH CAREER GAME

- With a 7-1 victory at FAU on March 23, **Gino DiMare** became the second-fastest head coach to reach 100 wins in Miami Hurricanes baseball history.
- The former standout outfielder and longtime assistant coach reached the triple-digit mark in 151 contests, trailing only **Jim Morris'** impressive 132-game pace.

PITCHERS POISED FOR PRODUCTIVE 2022

• A quintet of sophomores anchor the Hurricanes' pitching staff: **Jake Garland, Alex McFarlane, Carson Palmquist, Alejandro Rosario** and **Andrew Walters**.

• Garland made a team-leading 13 starts in his second year in the orange and green. The Jupiter, Fla., native tossed a team-high 68 innings en route to a 6-4 record in 2021.

• McFarlane, who is considered one of the top-pitching prospects in the upcoming MLB First-Year Player Draft, appeared as both a starter and reliever in 2021. The flamethrowing right-hander notched a 2-1 record with a 4.50 ERA in 34 innings pitched last season.

• Palmquist, who finished third in the nation with 14 saves a season ago, made the move into the starting rotation in his third year. The southpaw was tabbed a consensus preseason All-American ahead of the 2022 season after posting a 2.22 ERA and 75 punchouts last year.

• Rosario was a 2021 Perfect Game Freshman All-America second team after totaling 11 starts. In his debut season, the right-hander recorded a 6-4 mark with 55 strikeouts.

• Walters, who is in his first year as the Hurricanes' closer, led Miami with a 1.46 ERA in 2021. The Palm Bay, Fla., native struck out 36 hitters over 24.2 innings and held opponents to a .221 average.

PALMQUIST ON THE BUMP

• Third-year left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** enters the 2022 season as a unanimous preseason All-American and National Player of the Year candidate.

• Palmquist, who led the Hurricanes with 75 strikeouts, was one of only two freshmen among the 10 finalists for the 2021 NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after pacing the ACC and finishing third nationally with 14 saves.

• The southpaw collected first-team All-America recognition from NCBWA and Perfect Game, while he received second-team honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball* and *Collegiate Baseball*.

• The All-ACC First Team selection went 1-1 with a 2.22 ERA and held opponents to a .143 batting average.

• In the shortened 2020 season, Palmquist made eight appearances as a reliever, finishing with a 2.31 ERA. He tallied 15 strikeouts over 11.2 innings.

WALTERS ON STOPPER OF THE YEAR LIST

• Right-handed pitcher **Andrew Walters** was among the 66 players named to the initial watch list for the 17th Annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I Baseball.

• Walters notched a 1.46 ERA in his debut season in the orange and green. The Palm Bay, Fla., native racked up 36 strikeouts and held opposing hitters to a .221 batting average over 24.2 innings.

• **Bryan Garcia**, Miami's all-time saves leader, is the lone Hurricane to win the award, garnering the honor in 2016.

PAIR ON BRAGAN AWARD LIST

- Infielder **Yohandy Morales** and catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** were among the 44 players named to the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List for the 2022 college baseball season.
- The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. The 44 players on the watch list represent 18 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.
- The BBCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBCSA expanded becoming a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. Last year's winner was Connor Norby from East Carolina University.

TWO CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

- The Hurricanes had two different players selected to a Preseason All-America team in advance of the 2022 season: LHP **Carson Palmquist** and INF **Yohandy Morales**.
- Palmquist is the third Hurricane to be named a unanimous preseason All-American in the last 13 years, joining **Zack Collins** and **Adrian Del Castillo**. Morales looks to build off his stellar Freshman campaign, where he was named a Freshman All-American by *Collegiate Baseball*.

WAY TO GO, YOYO

- **Yohandy Morales** enters the 2022 season as one of the most prolific hitters in the ACC.
- Morales brings his big bat back to the heart of Miami's lineup after pacing the team with 13 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, .532 slugging percentage, 44 runs scored and 13-multi RBI games in his debut campaign.
- The All-ACC Freshman Team and *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America selection posted a .284 batting average and .874 OPS in 2021, making 53 starts primarily at third base.
- Morales was named to the All-Gainesville Regional team after leading the Hurricanes with a .444 average, a homer and two RBI.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

- Miami has 18 newcomers on the 2022 roster, with 11 freshmen, four transfers, two JUCO transfers and one graduate transfer joining the 15 returning letterwinners from a year ago.
- Freshmen pitchers **Gage Ziehl**, **Karson Ligon** and **Rafe Schlesinger** and hitters **Lorenzo Carrier**, **Dorian Gonzalez Jr.** and **Renzo Gonzalez** figure to play key roles early.
- Graduate transfer **Matt Raudelunas**, as well as transfers **Maxwell Romero Jr.**, **Jacob Burke** and **Alejandro Torres** are expected to contribute from the start of the season.
- Miami's talented recruiting class was ranked first in the ACC, according to *Baseball America*, which marks the third straight year the Hurricanes have brought in the top class in the conference.

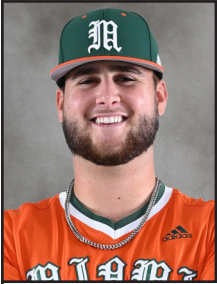
