ACC CHAMPIONSHIP STORYLINES & NEWS

- No. 3 seed Miami opens up its postseason against NC State at the 2022 ACC Baseball Championship at 7 p.m. May 25.
- The Hurricanes headline Pool C, alongside the sixth-seeded Wake Forest Demon Deacons and the 10th-seeded Wolfpack.
- Miami hasn't faced NC State or Wake Forest this season, but went a combined 4-1 against the two league foes in 2021.
- The Hurricanes are 23-24 all-time in the ACC Baseball Championship. Miami has won one ACC Championship (2008).
- Despite being the lone team in the ACC to win 20 conference games, the Canes finished the regular season second in the Coastal for the second consecutive campaign, finishing half a game behind division winner and No. 2-ranked Virginia Tech.
- Half a dozen Hurricanes earned All-ACC recognition: LHP **Carson Palmquist** (1st team), RHP **Andrew Walters** (1st team), OF **Jacob Burke** (2nd), 1B **CJ Kayfus** (2nd), 3B **Yohandy Morales** (2nd) and RHP **Karson Ligon** (All-Freshman).
- The Hurricanes are a consensus top-10 team for the seventh straight week, checking in as high as No. 5 in three polls.
- Miami completed its best regular season in six years, the last time the Hurricanes reached the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes lead the country with 13 top-25 victories, highlighted by a sweep over then-No. 3 Virginia (April 8-10).
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2021 marked DiMare's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

In 2021, the Hurricanes returned to the postseason for the second time under DiMare's leadership. In a year that began with a series victory at preseason No. 1 Florida, Miami finished the regular season second in the ACC Coastal and traveled to the Gainesville Regional.

Lefty Carson Palmquist was a consensus All-American and earned first-team honors from the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Palmquist headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team pick, while catcher Adrian Del Castillo, outfielder Christian Del Castillo and infielder Anthony Vilar were picked for the second team. Palmquist and infielder Yohandy Morales were selected to the ACC All-Freshman team, while Palmquist, Morales and right-hander Alejandro Rosario earned Freshman All-America honors.

After the season, Adrian Del Castillo (2nd round, Arizona), Jake Smith (6th round, LA Angels) and Anthony Vilar (15th round, San Diego) were all selected in the MLB Draft and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

Miami proved to be one of the top teams in the country during a shortened 2020 season. The Canes went 12-4 and finished the season ranked as high as No. 5 by *Baseball America* and in the top 15 of all six major polls. A preseason pick to win the ACC Coastal, Miami went 3-0 in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, three Hurricanes were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken with the 33rd overall pick by the Arizona Diamondbacks, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft. McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round to the Colorado Rockies and junior shortstop Freddy Zamora was taken in the second round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

With three players drafted, Miami tied Mississippi State and Texas A&M with the most selections among the top 60 picks in the 2020 MLB Draft. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball*, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.



DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by *Baseball America*, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by *Collegiate Baseball*. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by *Collegiate Baseball* and fifth by *Baseball America* prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife, Denise, and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

MIAMI OPENS ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

- Following their best regular season in six years, the Hurricanes are the No. 3 seed in the 2022 ACC Baseball Championship.
- Miami (39-16, 20-10 ACC) headlines Pool C, which also features No. 6 seed Wake Forest (39-16-1, 15-14-1 ACC) and No. 10 seed NC State (33-20, 14-15 ACC).
- The Hurricanes will begin their postseason at 7 p.m. Wednesday against the Wolfpack before wrapping up pool play at 3 p.m. Friday versus Wake Forest.

SIX HURRICANES EARN ALL-ACC ACCOLADES

- Half a dozen Miami players received recognition from the Atlantic Coast Conference Monday morning, following the 2022 regular season.
- Left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** and right-handed reliever **Andrew Walters** were named to the All-ACC First Team, while outfielder **Jacob Burke**, first baseman **CJ Kayfus** and third baseman **Yohandy Morales** garnered All-ACC Second Team honors. Meanwhile, right-hander **Karson Ligon** was among the 12 rookies tabbed to the All-ACC Freshman Team.
- The Hurricanes' six selections marked the most Miami student athletes to collect conference distinction since 2016.

CANES CAP OFF REGULAR SEASON WITH A BANG

- The Hurricanes punctuated their best regular season in six years, taking two-of-three from No. 14 Notre Dame.
- Miami threw the first punch in the three-game set, winning the opener over the Fighting Irish, 6-4.
- Freshman outfielder **Gaby Gutierrez** launched two homers and drove in five runs in a career night against Notre Dame.
- After the Irish blanked the Hurricanes for the first time all season Friday, Miami mashed six home runs in the series finale.
- Junior catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** smacked a pair of round-trippers, while sophomores **Jacob Burke** and **Zach Levenson**, and freshmen **Ariel Garcia** and **Gutierrez** joined the home run derby with a blast each, guiding the Hurricanes to a 16-7 victory.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE NATION

- For the seventh week in a row, the Hurricanes are a consensus top-10 team.
- Miami checks in as high as No. 5 by *Baseball America*, Perfect Game and the USA Today Coaches Poll, while the Hurricanes are No. 6 in the *D1 Baseball* and NCBWA rankings, and 10th, according to *Collegiate Baseball*.
- As of May 23, the Hurricanes are eighth in RPI, the second-highest mark among ACC programs.

DON'T STOP THE ROCK

- Miami completed its best regular season since 2016, the last year the Hurricanes reached the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes lead the country with 13 top-25 victories, including a pair of wins over then-No. 14 Notre Dame in their final series of the regular season.
- Prior to dropping the series opener to the Virginia Tech Hokies (April 14), Miami's 14-game winning streak was the program's longest in eight seasons.
- The Hurricanes' sweep over Virginia marks Miami's first sweep over a top-three team since 2012.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

CARSON ECLIPSES THE CENTURY MARK

- Sophomore left-handed pitcher **Carson Palmquist** is one of the most highly-touted arms in the nation.
- Palmquist is second in the ACC with 105 strikeouts and checks in third with nine wins. His 2.64 ERA ranks fourth in the conference, while his .220 batting average against sits in seventh.
- With his third punchout against Notre Dame on May 19, the Fort Myers, Fla., native become the first Hurricane since **Evan McKendry** in 2018 to reach 100 strikeouts in a season.
- In 11 of his 14 starts, the 6-foot-3, 185-pound southpaw has yielded one earned run or fewer, recording three double-digit strikeout performances along the way.
- Palmquist, who led the Hurricanes with 75 punchouts last season, was one of two freshmen among the 10 finalists for the 2021 NCBWA Stopper of the Year award, after pacing the ACC and finishing third nationally with 14 saves.
- The southpaw collected first-team All-America recognition from NCBWA and Perfect Game, while he received second-team honors from *Baseball America*, *D1Baseball* and *Collegiate Baseball*.
- The 2021 All-ACC First Team selection went 1-1 with a 2.22 ERA and held opponents to a .143 batting average.
- In the shortened 2020 season, Palmquist made eight appearances as a reliever, finishing with a 2.31 ERA. He tallied 15 strikeouts over 11 2/3 innings.

FIRE ME UP, WALT

- Closer **Andrew Walters** was among the 62 players named to the midseason watch list for the 17th Annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I Baseball.
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pound right-hander is tied for fourth in the country and paces the ACC with 13 saves.
- The third-year sophomore finished the regular season with a 1.24 ERA, allowing just four earned runs over 29 innings.
- Walters has a jaw-dropping 11.0 strikeout-to-walk-ratio, punching out 55 hitters and issuing four free passes.
- The Palm Bay, Fla., native has surrendered only 10 hits, holding opponents to a .103 batting average.
- As a freshman in 2021, Walters posted a 1.46 ERA that was lowest among Miami pitchers with at least 10 appearances.
- In his career, Walters has totaled a 1.34 ERA with 91 strikeouts over 53 2/3 innings.

KAYFUS IN THE LEADOFF SPOT

- Sophomore **CJ Kayfus** has provided a spark at the top of the Hurricanes' lineup.
- The Wellington, Fla., native has reached safely in all but two games this season and in 58 of the last 60 contests, dating back to last year.
- Kayfus paces Miami in average (.362), hits (79), walks (35), on-base percentage (.458), stolen bases (16) and multi-hit games (25).
- Within the ACC, the leadoff man is tied for fourth in hits and tied for eighth in stolen bases.
- As a freshman, Kayfus hit .298 with three homers and six RBI, playing in 40 games, including 10 starts.
- The 6-foot, 188-pound first baseman was named to the 2021 All Gainesville Regional team after hitting .308 in three games.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

YOYO MAKES US GOGO

- Sophomore third baseman **Yohandy Morales** is one of the most prolific power hitters in the ACC.
- Morales has totaled a team-best 58 runs, 16 doubles, three triples, 13 homers and 132 total bases.
- The Miami native is the first Hurricane since **Zack Collins** in 2015 and 2016 to blast double-digit dingers in back-to-back seasons.
- In his debut campaign in 2021, he led the Hurricanes with 13 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, a .532 slugging percentage, 44 runs scored and 13-multi RBI games.
- The All-ACC Freshman Team and *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America selection posted a .284 batting average and an .874 OPS in 2021, making 53 starts primarily at the hot corner.
- Morales was named to the All-Gainesville Regional team after leading the Hurricanes with a .444 average, a homer and two RBI.

BAYOU BURKE

- In his first year in the orange and green, outfielder **Jacob Burke** has been a key cog in the middle of the order.
- The sophomore leads the club with a .611 slugging percentage and 55 RBI, the most by a Hurricane in three years.
- On May 6 against North Dakota State, Burke became the first Cane since David Thompson in 2015 to record eight RBI in a game.
- The 6-foot-1, 208-pounder is also second in average (.355), runs (57) and homers (12), and tied for second in stolen bases (9).
- The St. Francisville, La., native was tabbed a 2021 *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America at Southeastern Louisiana, after pacing the Southland conference with 23 stolen bases and leading the Lions with nine home runs.

WAY TO GO, YOYO

- Following a sensational weekend, infielder **Yohandy Morales** earned Player of the Week recognition from the Atlantic Coast Conference and *Collegiate Baseball* on May 9.
- The Miami native batted .667, going 10-for-15 with three home runs and nine RBI across the Hurricanes' sweep of North Dakota State.
- In Friday's 22-0 victory over the Bison, Morales recorded his third career four-hit game, including his second straight, becoming the first Hurricane since **George Iskenderian** in 2015 with a quartet of hits in back-to-back contests.
- Morales built on his stellar series-opening effort Saturday, tallying three knocks and three RBI, highlighted by a game-winning solo shot.
- The 6-foot-4, 208-pound slugger punctuated his impressive showing at the plate Sunday, posting his first mult-homer performance of the season, capped off by a three-run jack in the seventh inning.
- With his 10th and 11th round-trippers on Mother's Day, Morales is the first Cane since **Zack Collins** in 2015 and 2016 to smack double-digit dingers in consecutive campaigns.
- The sophomore is also the first Miami player to collect *Collegiate Baseball* recognition this season and joins fellow classmate **Dominic Pitelli** as the only Hurricanes to garner an ACC weekly honor in 2022.

STAY GOLDEN, ROOKIE

• Freshman right-hander **Karson Ligon** was among the 44 players named to the Golden Spikes Award midseason watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.

• Miami has had seven different players named to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.

• **Peter O'Brien** (2012), **Bryan Radziewski** (2013) and **David Thompson** (2015), **Zack Collins** (2016), **Bryan Garcia** (2016) and **Adrian Del Castillo** (2021), preceded Ligon as midseason picks.

• Ligon has recorded a 4.12 ERA over 72 innings pitched. The 6-foot-1, 208-pound hurler has held opponents to a .253 batting against, which ranks second among ACC freshmen.

DIMARE WINS 100TH CAREER GAME

• With a 7-1 victory at FAU on March 23, **Gino DiMare** became the second-fastest head coach to reach 100 wins in Miami Hurricanes baseball history.

• The former standout outfielder and longtime assistant coach reached the triple-digit mark in 151 contests, trailing only **Jim Morris'** impressive 132-game pace.

• DiMare is 125-61 in four seasons, including 61-37 in ACC play.

PAIR ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

• Infielder **Yohandy Morales** and catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** were among the 44 players named to the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List for the 2022 college baseball season.

• The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. The 44 players on the watch list represent 18 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.

• The BBCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBCSA expanded becoming a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. Last year's winner was Connor Norby from East Carolina University.

TWO CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

• The Hurricanes had two different players selected to a Preseason All-America team in advance of the 2022 season: LHP **Carson Palmquist** and INF **Yohandy Morales**.

• Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

• Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.

• Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

MIAMI IS #MLBU

• **Forty-one** Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.

• No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **301** players picked into the professional ranks - including three in 2021.

• Since 1991, UM has produced **196 draft picks** - 20 more than the next-highest ACC total (176, Clemson).

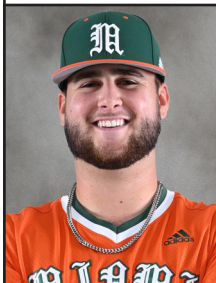
