MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NEWS

- No. 6 Miami plays its penultimate midweek contest, welcoming the UCF Knights to Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series over the Knights, 23-10, but UCF took the mid-March meeting, 10-5, in Orlando.
- Under head coach **Gino DiMare**, Miami has posted a 28-7 (.800) record in midweek games, including an 8-2 mark in 2022.
- For the second time this year, UM right-hander **Jake Garland** (6-2, 2.95 ERA) opposes UCF lefty **Will Saxton** (4-3, 3.27 ERA).
- Against UCF on March 16, Garland tossed just 49 pitches across four innings, allowing only one unearned run on two hits.
- The Hurricanes are a consensus top-10 team for the fifth straight week, checking in as high as No. 5 by three outlets.
- As of May 10, UM boasts the seventh best RPI in the country, which is fifth among Power 5 programs, per WarrenNolan.com.
- The Canes are off to their best 47-game start and top ACC start since 2016. In 2016, Miami reached the College World Series.
- Miami is one of only two programs in the nation with 10 top-25 victories, matching the first-ranked Tennessee Volunteers.
- The Hurricanes, who posted a 33-21 mark a year ago, added the No. 1 recruiting class in the ACC, according to *Baseball America*, to a group of 15 returning players from a 2021 team that earned the 47th postseason appearance in UM history.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series **25 times** - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

THE HURRICANES' SKIPPER

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2021 marked DiMare's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

In 2021, the Hurricanes returned to the postseason for the second time under DiMare's leadership. In a year that began with a series victory at preseason No. 1 Florida, Miami finished the regular season second in the ACC Coastal and traveled to the Gainesville Regional.

Lefty Carson Palmquist was a consensus All-American and earned first-team honors from the NCBWA and Perfect Game. Palmquist headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team pick, while catcher Adrian Del Castillo, outfielder Christian Del Castillo and infielder Anthony Vilar were picked for the second team. Palmquist and infielder Yohandy Morales were selected to the ACC All-Freshman team, while Palmquist, Morales and right-hander Alejandro Rosario earned Freshman All-America honors.

After the season, Adrian Del Castillo (2nd round, Arizona), Jake Smith (6th round, LA Angels) and Anthony Vilar (15th round, San Diego) were all selected in the MLB Draft and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

Miami proved to be one of the top teams in the country during a shortened 2020 season. The Canes went 12-4 and finished the season ranked as high as No. 5 by *Baseball America* and in the top 15 of all six major polls. A preseason pick to win the ACC Coastal, Miami went 3-0 in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic ended the season prematurely.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, three Hurricanes were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. Sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken with the 33rd overall pick by the Arizona Diamondbacks, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft. McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round to the Colorado Rockies and junior shortstop Freddy Zamora was taken in the second round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

With three players drafted, Miami tied Mississippi State and Texas A&M with the most selections among the top 60 picks in the 2020 MLB Draft. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball*, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.



DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by *Baseball America*, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by *Collegiate Baseball*. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by *Collegiate Baseball* and fifth by *Baseball America* prior to the 2007 season. That includes DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife, Denise, and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

HURRICANES HOST IN-STATE FOE UCF

- For the second and final time in the regular season, No. 6 Miami faces off against the UCF Knights.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series over the Knights, 23-10, but UCF took the most recent meeting, 10-5, on March 16.
- The Knights are led by Miami alum Greg Lovelady, who won two national championships as Hurricane in 1999 and 2001.
- Miami right-handed pitcher **Jake Garland** (6-2, 2.95 ERA) and UCF southpaw **Will Saxton** (4-3, 3.27 ERA) will square off on the hill as they did in mid-March in Orlando.

MIAMI RUNS PAST BISON

- The Hurricanes secured their seventh sweep of the season, outscoring North Dakota, 44-5, across the three-game set.
- In the series opener, Miami mashed a season-best five home runs, crushing the Bison, 22-0, the Hurricanes' largest shutout in seven years.
- Outfielder **Jacob Burke** became the first Hurricane since **David Thompson** in 2015 to drive eight runs in a game, highlighted by a pair of three-run homers.
- Meanwhile, third baseman **Yohandy Morales** recorded his third career four-hit performance, including his second straight, becoming the first Cane since **George Iskenderian** seven years prior with a quartet of hits in back-to-back contests.
- Miami's 21 hits marked the most in a single game since the Hurricanes totaled 22 knocks at Georgia Tech on May 9, 2016.
- On the mound, third-year sophomores **Carson Palmquist** and **Jake Garland** teamed up for the shutout, yielding just four hits, while striking out 10 Bison along the way.
- Freshman **Renzo Gonzalez** stole the spotlight Saturday, finishing a double shy of the cycle with a career-high four RBI in a 16-1 victory.
- Gonzalez helped the Hurricanes score 10 runs across the first three innings, putting up a six spot in the opening frame and tallying four more in the third.
- Miami completed the sweep Sunday with a 6-4 victory, sparked by Morales.
- In his 100th career game, Morales slammed a 407-foot solo shot in the first before launching a game-winning 430-foot rocket in the seventh.
- Closer **Andrew Walters** entered in the eighth and retired the final six batters to slam the door, registering his 13th save.
- Morales finished the weekend 10-for-15 with three big flies and nine RBI as the Hurricanes pounded 11 long balls in the series.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE NATION

- For the fifth week in a row, the Hurricanes are a consensus top-10 team.
- Miami checks in as high as No. 5 by *Collegiate Baseball*, the USA Today Coaches Poll and Perfect Game, while the Hurricanes are No. 6 by *Baseball America*, *D1 Baseball* and the NCBWA and ninth.
- As of May 10, the Hurricanes are seventh in RPI, the fifth-highest ranking among Power-5 programs.

WAY TO GO, YOYO

• Following a sensational weekend, infielder **Yohandy Morales** earned Player of the Week recognition from the Atlantic Coast Conference and *Collegiate Baseball* on May 9.

• The Miami native batted .667, going 10-for-15 with three home runs and nine RBI across the Hurricanes' sweep of North Dakota State.

• In Friday's 22-0 victory over the Bison, Morales recorded his third career four-hit game, including his second straight, becoming the first Hurricane since **George Iskenderian** in 2015 with a quartet of hits in back-to-back contests.

• Morales built on his stellar series-opening effort Saturday, tallying three knocks and three RBI, highlighted by a game-winning solo shot.

• The 6-foot-4, 208-pound slugger punctuated his impressive showing at the plate Sunday, posting his first mult-homer performance of the season, capped off by a three-run jack in the seventh inning.

• With his 10th and 11th round-trippers on Mother's Day, Morales is the first Cane since **Zack Collins** in 2015 and 2016 to smack double-digit dingers in consecutive campaigns.

• The sophomore is also the first Miami player to collect *Collegiate Baseball* recognition this season and joins fellow classmate **Dominic Pitelli** as the only Hurricanes to garner an ACC weekly honor in 2022.

FIRE ME UP, WALT

• Closer **Andrew Walters** was among the 62 players named to the midseason watch list for the 17th Annual National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year Award, given to the top relief pitcher in NCAA Division I Baseball.

• The 6-foot-4, 220-pound right-hander is tied for second in the country and paces the ACC with 13 saves.

• The third-year sophomore holds the best ERA amongst hurlers with double-digit saves with a 0.34 mark through 26 2/3 innings.

• Walters has a jaw-dropping 12.50 strikeout-to-walk-ratio, punching out 50 hitters and yielding four free passes.

• The Palm Bay, Fla., native has surrendered just eight hits, holding opponents to a .091 batting average.

• As a freshman in 2021, Walters posted a 1.46 ERA that was lowest among Miami pitchers with at least 10 appearances.

• In his career, Walters has totaled a 0.88 ERA with 86 strikeouts over 51 1/3 innings.

KAYFUS IN THE LEADOFF SPOT

- Sophomore **CJ Kayfus** has provided a spark at the top of the Hurricanes' lineup.
- The Wellington, Fla., native has reached safely in all but one game this season and in 52 of the last 53 contests, dating back to last season.
- Kayfus paces Miami in average (.375), hits (69), on-base percentage (.471), stolen bases (13) and multi-hit games (20).
- Within the ACC, the leadoff man is tied for fourth in hits and tied for seventh in average.
- As a freshman, Kayfus hit .298 with three homers and six RBI, playing in 40 games, including 10 starts.
- The 6-foot, 188-pound first baseman was named to the 2021 All Gainesville Regional team after hitting .308 in three games.

YOYO MAKES US GOGO

- Sophomore third baseman **Yohandy Morales** is one of the most prolific power hitters in the ACC.
- Morales has totaled a team-best 185 at-bats, 16 doubles, 11 home runs, 117 total bases and a .571 slugging percentage.
- The Miami native is tied for fifth in the ACC in doubles, while checking in ninth in total bases.
- In his debut campaign in 2021, he led the Hurricanes with 13 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 45 RBI, a .532 slugging percentage, 44 runs scored and 13-multi RBI games.
- The All-ACC Freshman Team and *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America selection posted a .284 batting average and an .874 OPS in 2021, making 53 starts primarily at the hot corner.

STAY GOLDEN, ROOKIE

- Freshman right-hander **Karson Ligon** was among the 44 players named to the Golden Spikes Award midseason watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.
- Miami has had seven different players named to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.
- **Peter O'Brien** (2012), **Bryan Radziewski** (2013) and **David Thompson** (2015), **Zack Collins** (2016), **Bryan Garcia** (2016) and **Adrian Del Castillo** (2021), preceded Ligon as midseason picks.
- Ligon has recorded a 3.48 ERA over 62 innings pitched. The 6-foot-1, 208-pound hurler has held opponents to a .245 batting average, which ranks first among ACC freshmen.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

DIMARE WINS 100TH CAREER GAME

- With a 7-1 victory at FAU on March 23, **Gino DiMare** became the second-fastest head coach to reach 100 wins in Miami Hurricanes baseball history.
- The former standout outfielder and longtime assistant coach reached the triple-digit mark in 151 contests, trailing only **Jim Morris'** impressive 132-game pace.
- DiMare is 121-57 in four seasons, including 58-34 in ACC play.

PITCHERS POISED FOR PRODUCTIVE 2022

- A quintet of sophomores anchor the Hurricanes' pitching staff: **Jake Garland, Alex McFarlane, Carson Palmquist, Alejandro Rosario** and **Andrew Walters**.
- Garland made a team-leading 13 starts in his second year in the orange and green. The Jupiter, Fla., native tossed a team-high 68 innings en route to a 6-4 record in 2021.
- McFarlane, who is considered one of the top-pitching prospects in the upcoming MLB First-Year Player Draft, appeared as both a starter and reliever in 2021. The flamethrowing right-hander notched a 2-1 record with a 4.50 ERA in 34 innings pitched last season.
- Palmquist, who finished third in the nation with 14 saves a season ago, made the move into the starting rotation in his third year. The southpaw was tabbed a consensus preseason All-American ahead of the 2022 season after posting a 2.22 ERA and 75 punchouts last year.

• Rosario was a 2021 Perfect Game Freshman All-America second team after totaling 11 starts. In his debut season, the right-hander recorded a 6-4 mark with 55 strikeouts.

• Walters, who is in his first year as the Hurricanes' closer, led Miami with a 1.46 ERA in 2021. The Palm Bay, Fla., native struck out 36 hitters over 24.2 innings and held opponents to a .221 average.

PAIR ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Infielder **Yohandy Morales** and catcher **Maxwell Romero Jr.** were among the 44 players named to the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List for the 2022 college baseball season.
- The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. The 44 players on the watch list represent 18 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.
- The BBCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBCSA expanded becoming a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. Last year's winner was Connor Norby from East Carolina University.

TWO CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

- The Hurricanes had two different players selected to a Preseason All-America team in advance of the 2022 season: LHP **Carson Palmquist** and INF **Yohandy Morales**.
- Palmquist is the third Hurricane to be named a unanimous preseason All-American in the last 13 years, joining **Zack Collins** and **Adrian Del Castillo**. Morales looks to build off his stellar Freshman campaign, where he was named a Freshman All-American by *Collegiate Baseball*.

- Freshmen pitchers **Gage Ziehl**, **Karson Ligon** and **Rafe Schlesinger** and hitters **Lorenzo Carrier**, **Dorian Gonzalez Jr.** and **Renzo Gonzalez** figure to play key roles early.
- Graduate transfer **Matt Raudelunas**, as well as transfers **Maxwell Romero Jr.**, **Jacob Burke** and **Alejandro Torres** are expected to contribute from the start of the season.

- Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.
- Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

- **Forty-one** Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.
