THE GAME

- The Hurricanes continue their first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Sept. 17 vs. Texas A&M in College Station, Texas. Kickoff for the Hurricanes' first road game of 2022, slated for broadcast on ESPN, is set for 9 p.m. ET from Kyle Field.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Chris Fowler (pxp), Kirk Herbstreit (color) and Holly Rowe (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 21st season together while Josh Darrow manages the sideline duties.

THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series with the Aggies, 2-1. Saturday's matchup will mark the first game between the two teams since 2008.
- In UM's only other trip to Kyle Field in history, the Hurricanes topped the host Aggies, 41-23, in 2008. Previously the teams played in 1944 and 2007.
- Saturday's game in College Station will mark UM's first trip to the Lone Star State since 2018, when Miami played LSU at AT&T Stadium in Arlington.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami improved to 2-0 last time out, toppling visiting Southern Miss, 30-7, in the first-ever matchup between the two teams at Hard Rock Stadium.
- The Miami Hurricanes officially kicked off the **Mario Cristobal** era Sept. 3, when the Hurricanes topped Bethune-Cookman, 70-13, in their 2022 opener.
- The Hurricanes will hit the road for the first time under Cristobal's direction on Sept. 17 when they travel to College Station for a game with Texas A&M.
- Through the first two weeks of the season, the Hurricanes have seen two players earn ACC weekly honors. OL **Jalen Rivers** was named ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week following Miami's win over Bethune-Cookman, while K **Andy Borregales** was named ACC Specialist of the Week on Sept. 12.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks were the only team to play in a Power-5 conference championship game each of his final three years. He led the Ducks to a Rose Bowl win and two Pac-12 titles.
- Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to have produced a top-10 pick in each of the last three drafts, joining only Alabama's Nick Saban.
- The first-year Miami head coach drew widespread acclaim for the staff he assembled, which includes reigning Broyles Award winner **Josh Gattis** as offensive coordinator, longtime coordinator and SEC veteran **Kevin Steele** as defensive coordinator and **Charlie Strong** as co-DC/linebackers coach.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** enters his first full year as a starter with high expectations after earning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors as a second-year freshman in 2021. Named to nearly every major offensive award preseason watch list, Van Dyke became the first quarterback since Joe Burrow (2019) to record a streak of six straight 300-yard passing games with three-or-more TDs in each of those games.
- TE **Will Mallory** (Mackey Award), **James Williams** (Bednarik Award), P **Lou Hedley** (Ray Guy Award), K **Andy Borregales** (Lou Groza Award), OL **Zion Nelson** (Outland) and DL **Leonard Taylor** (Bronko Nagurski Trophy) were also among those recognized with preseason watch list selections.
- In addition to a talented group of returners, the Hurricanes feature a 2022 recruiting class that finished ranked among the top 15 nationally by every scouting service and a group of newcomers through the transfer portal that includes DL **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), DL **Jacob Lichtenstein** (USC), DL **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), DL **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), DL **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB), LB **Caleb Johnson** (UCLA), DB **Daryl Porter, Jr.** (West Virginia), OL **Logan Sagapolu** (Oregon), OL **Jonathan Denis** (Oregon) WR **Frank Ladson, Jr.** (Clemson) and RB **Henry Parrish** (Ole Miss).

QUICK HITS

CANES TRAVEL TO COLLEGE STATION, TX

- #13/#13 Miami continues its highly anticipated first season under the direction of **Mario Cristobal** on Saturday, Sept. 17 against #22/#24 Texas A&M in College Station, Texas.
- Cristobal is no stranger to success against top-25 teams on the road; just last season, the former Oregon head coach led the Ducks to a 35-28 win over #3/#3 Ohio State on the road in Columbus on Sat., Sept. 11.
- Miami moved up to No. 13 in both major college football polls following its Week 2 win, while Texas A&M dropped from #6/#6 following a loss to Appalachian State.

EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS

- Miami has enjoyed success in the state of Texas, compiling an 8-4 record in games played in the Lone Star State in the modern era of Miami Football (since 1979).
- The Hurricanes are 7-2 in regular season games played in the state of Texas in the modern era, and have lost just one regular season game in the state since 1982 (to LSU in 2018 in Arlington, Texas).
- Miami has won six of its last seven regular season games played in the state of Texas, including its most recent 41-23 win over Texas A&M in College Station on Sept. 20, 2008.

RADAKOVICH NAMED ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

- Not only were the Hurricanes bolstered by the return of **Mario Cristobal**, but Miami named longtime Clemson AD **Dan Radakovich** to the same post in December 2021.
- Radakovich, whose career spans more than 30 years, earned his MBA from the University of Miami in 1982 and worked in the school's business office from 1983 - 1985.
- Prior to Clemson, Radakovich served as Georgia Tech's AD from 2006 to 2012, and before that, he was a Senior Associate AD at LSU. Radakovich earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1980.

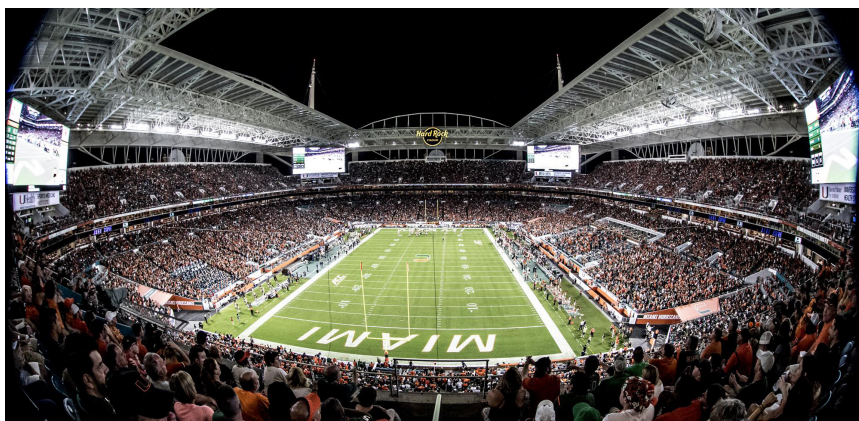

#13/#13 MIAMI HITS ROAD FOR FIRST TIME UNDER CRISTOBAL'S LEAD

- #13/#13 Miami continues its first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sept. 17 with its first road game of 2022 at #23/#25 Texas A&M. Kickoff is set for 9 p.m. ET from Kyle Field.
- Cristobal was named the 26th head coach in the history of the program on December 6, 2021 after spending the previous four years at the helm of the Oregon Ducks. Cristobal is a two-time UM alum.
- When he departed Eugene, Cristobal was the only Power-5 head coach to lead his team to three straight conference championship games from 2019-2021. He won two Pac-12 titles, delivered a Rose Bowl to the Ducks and is one of just two active coaches to produce a top-10 pick three straight years.
- The Hurricanes are matching up with Texas A&M for the fourth time in history; UM is 2-1 in the series.
- No stranger to success on the road against top-25 teams, Cristobal led Oregon to a win over #3/#3 Ohio State in September 2021. The road win was Oregon's first over a top-5 team in a decade (2011).
- UM's game versus the Aggies is additionally slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM on Sept. 17.

A LOOK BACK: MIAMI TOPPLES SOUTHERN MISS, 30-7, TO MOVE TO 2-0

- A week after rolling to a 70-13 win in its season opener against Bethune-Cookman, the Hurricanes improved to 2-0 in **Mario Cristobal**'s first season with a 30-7 win over Southern Miss on Sept. 10.
- Making the 11th start of his career, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** completed 20 of 29 passes for 261 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Miami improved to 8-3 in games started by Van Dyke all-time.
- Miami held Southern Miss to just seven points in the victory. It marked the first time Miami has conceded single-digit points in a game since 9/25/21 versus Central Connecticut State (zero). The last time the Hurricanes held an FBS team below 10 points was 12/5/20 at Duke (zero) and the last time they did so against a non-conference FBS foe was 11/11/17 versus third-ranked Notre Dame (eight).
- Five different Southern Miss players logged at least one carry Saturday. All of them averaged fewer than 1.5 yards per attempt, with three at 0.0 or below. Miami racked up 32 yards in TFLs on the day.

HURRICANES TRAVELING TO LONE STAR STATE FOR FIRST ROAD GAME.

- Miami opens its road slate with its first trip to the state of Texas since 2018 for its game at Texas A&M.
- The Hurricanes were slated to play in El Paso, Texas for its 2021 bowl game (Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl), but the game was cancelled. UM has played in Texas 12 times in its modern era (since 1979) and is 8-4.
- The Canes have won six of their last seven games in the Lone Star State during the regular season.

CRISTOBAL ASSEMBLED SUPERSTAR STAFF HEADING INTO FIRST YEAR

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was **Mario Cristobal**'s staff assembly in Coral Gables, where the Hurricanes added some familiar faces from South Florida to a staff with national ties.
- Cristobal pulled the reigning Broyles Award winner (top assistant coach) **Josh Gattis** from Michigan, where the OC helped lead the Wolverines to their first College Football Playoff appearance in 2021.
- Boasting over 40 years of experience including stints as defensive coordinator at Clemson, Auburn and LSU, **Kevin Steele** joined Cristobal's staff as DC. Longtime head coach **Charlie Strong** is Co-DC.
- **Frank Ponce** and **Alex Mirabal**, two Miami natives, moved back home to join Cristobal's staff as well.
- The impressive nature of Cristobal's staff build-out was not restricted to just full-time assistants; NFL Hall of Fame defensive end **Jason Taylor** is a quality control analyst, longtime NFL personnel director and UM alum **Alonzo Highsmith** was named General Manager of Football Operations.
- Between Taylor and senior football advisor **Ed Reed**, Miami has two Pro Football Hall of Fame members on its staff who combined for 15 Pro Bowl nods, 12 All-Pro selections and eight First Team All-Pro plaudits. Both won NFL Defensive Player of the Year during their pro careers.

VAN DYKE HAS THROWN MULTIPLE TDs IN SEVEN OF LAST EIGHT

- Named to nearly every offensive award major preseason watch list, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** is poised for another big season after putting together an ACC Rookie of the Year campaign at Miami in 2021.
- Van Dyke became the third Miami Hurricane to win both ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, joining Hurricanes QB Brad Kaaya (2014) and RB Duke Johnson (2012).
- Van Dyke took over starting duties three games into the season and ended the year by throwing for 2,931 yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just six interceptions. He completed 62.3 percent of passes.
- In the season opener vs. Bethune-Cookman, Van Dyke extended his streak of throwing multiple TDs to seven consecutive games. For the fifth time during that stretch, Van Dyke threw zero interceptions.
- Van Dyke's streak of seven straight games with multiple touchdown passes ended vs. Southern Miss.

PARRISH HAS BACK-TO-BACK 100-YARD GAMES IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- In the win over Bethune-Cookman, for the first time this century (2000-pres.), the Hurricanes logged seven rushing touchdowns. Four different Hurricanes combined to run the ball into the end zone, including three alone from **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, who started the game and was making his UM debut.
- Parrish, Jr., who returned home to Miami after spending the first two years of his career at Ole Miss, rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns on just 14 carries. The 108 yards marked the second-highest total of his career, while the three touchdowns set a new mark - his previous high was two.
- Parrish, Jr. bested himself against Southern Miss, rushing for 109 yards with one touchdown in a 30-7 win on Sept. 10. Outside of Parrish, no other Miami player this century (2000-pres.) has opened his career as a Hurricane by rushing for 100-plus yards in the team's opening two games of a season.
- In his two years with the Rebels, the Miami native totaled more than 1,000 all-purpose yards. He was a four-star prospect who rushed for more than 4,600 yards in an illustrious high school career.
- Saturday made it three consecutive years where Miami has had a game with two players scoring at least two rushing TDs in the same game. Before that, Miami hadn't had such a game since 2013.

RESTREPO HITS TRIPLE DIGITS IN SEASON OPENER VERSUS WILDCATS

- WR **Xavier Restrepo** turned in the finest game of his Miami career in the opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was the first 100-yard game of his career.
- Xavier Restrepo is off to a fast start to begin 2022. The third-year sophomore wide receiver is averaging 86.0 yards per game, good for the fourth-best mark in the ACC. Only eight players in the league are even at 60-plus yards per contest. Restrepo is also tied for fourth in ACC with 11 catches.
- Restrepo, who started and was a team captain vs. B-CU, caught a career-long 52-yard pass.
- Restrepo totaled 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a second-year freshman in 2021.

MALLORY RETURNS, COULD SET CAREER RECORDS AT #TIGHTENDU

- After the announcement of Mario Cristobal's appointment as head coach at The U, a number of student-athletes elected to return for their final year of eligibility rather than train for the NFL Draft.
- One of Miami's most important returnees is TE **Will Mallory**, who was among Miami's top offensive performers a season ago. Mallory set career marks in catches (30), yards (347), starts (12) and longest reception (57) last year, while also matching his career mark for touchdowns in a season (four).
- Mallory started the season opener and had two catches totaling 21 yards in the 70-13 win on Sept. 3.
- Mallory needs 46 receptions, 726 yards and three touchdowns to set the Miami records for a tight end.
- The Jacksonville native's accomplishments are even more impressive given the history of tight ends at Miami, an alumni group that includes Jeremy Shockey, Greg Olsen, Bubba Franks, David Njoku and Jimmy Graham. Mallory was named a candidate to watch for the Mackey Award as the top tight end.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS: MIAMI BACK AT HARD ROCK STADIUM

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 15th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 3 vs. Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a 15-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 689-119 for an average margin of victory of 38.0 points in those 15 home openers.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 15 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a conference opponent in only three of its 19 home openers: Florida State twice (in 2004 and 2006) and Georgia Tech once (2009).
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 32-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

WILLIAMS RECORDED PICK IN OPENER VERSUS BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- A former five-star recruit who made his presence felt in 2021, second-year safety **James Williams** was named to the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award honoring the nation's top defensive player.
- Williams appeared in all 10 games for which he was healthy in 2022, making seven starts and finishing with 31 tackles and a team-best two interceptions. Williams was one of only 15 ACC players on the list.
- The south Florida native recorded an interception and finished and had three tackles in the opener.
- Williams enjoyed a breakout year as an All-ACC Honorable Mention selection, headlining a secondary that included fellow first-year players **Kam Kinchens** and **Avantae Williams** in the safety rotation.
- The Hurricanes will be coached by secondary coach **Jahmile Addae**, whose Georgia Bulldogs unit ranked No. 13 in the nation in pass defense in 2021 and checked in as the No. 1 scoring defense.
- Addae's 2020 unit at West Virginia ranked No. 1 nationally in fewest passing yards allowed per game.
- Williams and **Leonard Taylor III** both signed with Miami in 2021 as five-star recruits, marking the first five-star pair to join the Hurricane in the same year since Duke Johnson and Tracy Howard in 2012.

MIAMI BOASTS TALENTED RUNNING GAME, RUSHED FOR 305 IN GAME 1

- RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, and RB **Jaylan Knighton** were listed as co-starters for Miami's season opener.
- Though Knighton missed the game with a soft tissue injury, the Hurricanes managed to total 305 yards on the ground and scored seven rushing touchdowns in a dominant 70-13 win on Sept. 3.
- After a season-ending leg injury to Miami's starting running back in 2021, Knighton assumed the starting responsibility and delivered a strong first season as a primary running back.
- In just 17 games, Knighton has totaled 770 rushing yards, nine rushing touchdowns, 415 receiving yards and four receiving scores. He has totaled 1,303 all-purpose yards in his 17 games (76.6/game).
- He was nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect in high school.
- Miami ranks first in the ACC in scoring defense (10.0) and second in the league in scoring offense (50.0). Miami is also second in total offensive average (515.5) and third in off. yards per play (7.21).

BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY AT UM

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres “Andy” Borregales** earned starting placekicker responsibilities as a true freshman in 2021.
- Andy went on to earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors in a 2021 season where he connected on 17-of-21 field goal attempts and a perfect 45-of-45 extra point attempts. He was 5-6 of kicks longer than 40.
- Borregales has been dominant to begin 2022. He is 16-of-16 on kicks, including 13-of-13 on extra points and 3-of-3 on field goals. He also has recorded a touchback on 15 of 18 kicks, averaging 64.4 yards
- The younger Borregales nailed a 55-yard kick in 2021 that was the longest ever by a UM freshman.
- Jose was Miami’s first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, finishing 20-for-22 on field goal attempts and a perfect 37-for-37 on extra point attempts. He passed on #30 to Andy.

IT STARTS IN THE TRENCHES - WHERE MIAMI HAS LOADS OF EXPERIENCE

- One of Mario Cristobal’s focal points has been in building Miami’s depth and ability in the trenches, and the Hurricanes return and add a number of key players at the line of scrimmage for 2022.
- The Miami offensive line opened the season in dazzling fashion in pass protection. The Hurricanes did not allow a sack until 6:56 remained on the second-quarter clock of Game 2, marking a stretch of 83:04 to begin the year without conceding a quarterback takedown.
- Miami has three players who each have more than 30 starts on the offensive line: **Zion Nelson** (32 career starts), **Jakai Clark** (32) and **DJ Scaife** (32). In addition, the Hurricanes return several other players who have started, including **Justice Oluwaseun**, **Jalen Rivers** and **John Campbell**.
- On the defensive line, some of Miami’s most experienced players arrive via the transfer portal, including All-Big 12 defensive lineman **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), defensive end **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), second-year defensive tackle **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), south Florida native and longtime USC defensive lineman **Jacob Lichtenstein** and defensive lineman **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB).

MIAMI PLACES THREE ON 2022 PRESEASON ALL-ACC FOOTBALL TEAM

- Among Miami’s preseason honorees were OL **Zion Nelson** and TE **Will Mallory**, along with P **Lou Hedley**, who were all selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team in a poll of conference media.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** finished third in Preseason Player of the Year voting with 21 votes, trailing only QB Sam Hartman of Wake Forest (30) and QB Devin Leary of NC State (40), who ranked as the top two. Van Dyke is the reigning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year entering 2022.
- Mallory has 73 career receptions for 1,006 yards with 11 touchdowns in his four seasons at The U.
- Nelson, an All-ACC Honorable Mention pick last year, has played in all 36 games since arriving to Miami in 2019. He has made 32 starts of his career, including all 12 in 2021 and all 13 in 2019.
- Hedley was a 2020 finalist for the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation’s top punter and is a two-time Second Team All-ACC designee. He has averaged 45.2 yards per punt in his three seasons at Miami.

WEEK 1: MIAMI DOMINATES WILDCATS, 70-13, IN SEASON OPENER

- The Hurricanes improved to 6-0 all-time against Bethune-Cookman in its season opener on Sept. 3.
- Miami amassed all but 15 possible offensive yards against the Wildcats in its 70-13 win at Hard Rock Stadium. It scored a touchdown on nine of its 11 drives, while another one ended at the opposing six-yard-line. The Hurricanes' final drive ended at the nine-yard-line when the game clock expired.
- The Hurricanes logged three interceptions in the win against Bethune-Cookman, with one each by **Gilbert Frierson**, **Kamren Kinchens** and **James Williams**. It marked the second time in the last four years Miami had three interceptions in a game, joining the 9/26/20 matchup with Florida State.
- WR **Xavier Restrepo** turned in the finest game of his career in Miami's season opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was Restrepo's first 100-yard game.
- QB **Jake Garcia** went 8-for-8 in Miami's win over B-CU. He became the first Hurricane quarterback this century (2000-pres.) to complete seven-plus passes in a game without an incompleteness.
- The opener marked the third time this century (2000-pres.) Miami logged 300-plus yards both rushing and passing in the same game. It is the second season in a row the Hurricanes have achieved that feat, as they last did so on 9/25/21 versus Central Connecticut State (322 rushing & 417 passing). Previously, Miami hit those numbers on 9/21/13 against Savannah State (324 rushing & 313 passing).

HIGHSMITH NAMED GENERAL MANAGER OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

- The University of Miami hired longtime National Football League executive and Hurricanes great **Alonzo Highsmith** as general manager of football operations, it was announced on May 26, 2022.
- As general manager of football operations, Highsmith will work directly with Cristobal to support all administrative functions of the football program, including budget related items, culture building, program imaging, and working directly with staff members both on and off the field.
- Highsmith, a former first-round selection in the NFL Draft, also serves as a liaison between the administration and program, serve as a liaison between former players and assists with scouting.
- Highsmith, who played running back for the Hurricanes from 1983-1986, boasts 29 years' experience and 18 playoff appearances as an NFL player, scout and executive. He has spent the past 23 years in scouting and personnel, most recently serving as senior executive advisor to the GM for Seattle.
- Highsmith joined the Packers as a college scout in 1999 and spent 13 years on their college scouting staff. He was promoted to senior personnel executive in 2012 and remained in that role through the 2017 season. During his time in GB, the Packers made 13 trips to the playoffs, captured nine division titles and won Super Bowl XLV.

RADAKOVICH SIGNS ON AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AT MIAMI

- One of the nation's most well-respected athletics administrators returned to the institution where nearly three decades ago he launched his career—the University of Miami. **Dan Radakovich**, who served as director of athletics at Clemson University for nine years, was named vice president and director of athletics on Dec. 9, 2021 - shortly after the hiring of head coach Mario Cristobal.
- Radakovich took the helm at Clemson in late 2012 and during his tenure, Clemson won 15 Atlantic Coast Conference team titles. The Tigers football program won two national championships, made six College Football Playoff appearances, and captured six ACC titles. In the classroom, Clemson student-athletes recorded nine semesters with a 3.0 GPA or higher. The athletic department attained the school's highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate at 93 percent in 2020.

ACC ANNOUNCES NEW MODEL; HURRICANES TO PLAY BC, FSU, UofL

- The new ACC football scheduling model is based on a 3-5-5 structure whereby each team will play three primary opponents annually and face the other 10 league teams twice during the cycle. The schedule allows for each team to face all 13 conference opponents home and away at least once during the four-year cycle. The structure was adopted by the league's ADs and faculty reps.
- The new schedule will eliminate the Atlantic and Coastal divisions with all 14 schools competing in one division beginning in 2023. The top two teams based on conference winning percentage will compete in the Subway ACC Football Championship Game on the first Saturday in December.
- Miami's three opponents primary annual opponents are Boston College, Florida State and Louisville.

FORD SELECTED BY PACKERS, UM's DRAFT STREAK CONTINUES IN '22

- University of Miami defensive lineman **Jonathan Ford** was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers on the final day of the draft. Ford's selection continued Miami's streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975 – the fourth-longest streak.
- 2022 marked the sixth straight year the NFL Draft featured at least one UM lineman selected.
- A three-year starter for the Hurricanes, Ford saw action in 10 games and made eight starts in 2021.
- Ford made 30 starts over his career. He finished his career with 60 tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss.

UM LEADING THE WAY WITH A DIVERSE STAFF REPRESENTING SOFLA

- Miami is tied with Hawai'i for the highest percentage of minority representation on its full-time staff. Nine of UM's 11 full-time coaches are either African-American, Hispanic or Polynesian, exactly (81.8%)

CANES PULL IN RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Thanks to the late work of Mario Cristobal and his staff on the recruiting trail, the Hurricanes 2022 high school recruiting class soared to a top-15 class by nearly every recognized outlet by end of year.
- The Hurricanes picked up several impactful pieces on Early Signing Day, signing LB **Wesley Bissainthe**, DL **Nyjalik Kelly**, DL **Cyrus Moss** and TE **Jaleel Skinner**, who enrolled before spring ball.
- Miami added RB **TreVonte' Citizen**, one of the nation's best running backs, and inked offensive linemen like **Matthew McCoy** and **Anez Cooper** to move into a class ranked in the top 15.
- The Hurricanes signed five top-125 prospects for the first time since 2018. The four highest-rated members of that group committed after Mario Cristobal took over at the helm of the Hurricanes.

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (11TH OVERALL) | 2-0 | 64-60

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future."

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
