#### THE GAME

- After capturing their first conference win last time out at Virginia Tech, the Hurricanes continue their first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Oct. 22 vs. Duke. Kickoff for the game, slated for broadcast on ACC RSN, is set for 12:30 p.m. ET from Hard Rock Stadium.
- The game will be broadcast on **Bally Sports Florida** with Tom Werme (pxp), James Bates (color) and Wiley Ballard (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 21st season together while Josh Darrow manages the sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on **Radio Actualidad**. The game will also be broadcast on **WVUM 90.5 FM**.

#### THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series with the Blue Devils by a commanding 15-4 margin, with head-to-head wins in six of the last eight contests.
- Miami has picked up back-to-back wins against the Blue Devils, including a 48-0 win over Duke in 2020 and a 47-10 win in 2021 - both on the road.
- Due to COVID-19 scheduling issues, the Hurricanes had played three straight vs. Duke in Durham; UM has outscored Duke 95-10 the last two years.

#### THE HURRICANES

- After capturing a 20-14 win last time out at Virginia Tech, Miami returns home for a matchup with Duke looking to win their second straight ACC game.
- The Miami Hurricanes officially kicked off the **Mario Cristobal** era Sept. 3, when the Hurricanes topped Bethune-Cookman, 70-13, in their 2022 opener.
- **P Lou Hedley** and **DL Akheem Mesidor** became the fourth and fifth Hurricanes to win ACC Player of the Week honors this year when they were recognized as ACC Specialist of the Week and ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week, respectively, after dominant games at Virginia Tech on Oct. 15.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks were the only team to play in a Power-5 conference championship game each of his final three years. He led the Ducks to a Rose Bowl win and two Pac-12 titles.
- Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to have produced a top-10 pick in each of the last three drafts, joining only Alabama's Nick Saban.
- The first-year Miami head coach drew widespread acclaim for the staff he assembled, which includes reigning Broyles Award winner **Josh Gattis** as offensive coordinator, longtime coordinator and SEC veteran **Kevin Steele** as defensive coordinator and **Charlie Strong** as co-DC/linebackers coach
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** entered his first full year as a starter with high expectations after earning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors as a second-year freshman in 2021. Named to nearly every major offensive award preseason watch list, Van Dyke became the first quarterback since Joe Burrow (2019) to record a streak of six straight 300-yard passing games with three-or-more TDs in each of those games.
- TE **Will Mallory** (Mackey Award), **James Williams** (Bednarik Award), P **Lou Hedley** (Ray Guy Award), K **Andy Borregales** (Lou Groza Award), OL **Zion Nelson** (Outland) and DL **Leonard Taylor** (Bronko Nagurski Trophy) were also among those recognized with preseason watch list selections.
- In addition to a talented group of returners, the Hurricanes feature a 2022 recruiting class that finished ranked among the top 15 nationally by every scouting service and a group of newcomers through the transfer portal that includes DL **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), DL **Jacob Lichtenstein** (USC), DL **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), DL **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), DL **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB), LB **Caleb Johnson** (UCLA), DB **Daryl Porter, Jr.** (West Virginia), OL **Logan Sagapolu** (Oregon), OL **Jonathan Denis** (Oregon) WR **Frank Ladson, Jr.** (Clemson) and RB **Henry Parrish** (Ole Miss).

## QUICK HITS

#### MIAMI LOOKING FOR HOME WIN VS. DUKE

- Following a 20-14 win last time out at Virginia Tech, the Miami Hurricanes will return home to Hard Rock Stadium for an ACC matchup with Duke on Oct. 22.
- Despite being Coastal Division foes, Duke's trip to Miami is its first since 2018; the Hurricanes have made three straight trips to Durham in the yearly series due to COVID-19 scheduling issues that affected the 2020 season.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series, 15-4, and are looking for their third straight win in the series; UM has outscored Duke, 95-10, in its last two trips to the Bull City.

#### VAN DYKE PUT TOGETHER BIG GAME AT VT

- After a challenging start against MTSU on Sept. 24, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** has rebounded with two big games - including an impressive start vs. UNC, finishing with 496 yards versus the Tar Heels at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Van Dyke was recognized with ACC Quarterback of the Week honors on Oct. 10; the third-year signal caller's 42 completions (42-for-57) set a new school record.
- The Connecticut native had another big start at Virginia Tech - he threw for 351 yards in a 20-14 win. 'TVD' became the first Miami quarterback to ever throw for 350 yards in back-to-back games three different times.

#### RADAKOVICH NAMED ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

- Not only were the Hurricanes bolstered by the return of **Mario Cristobal**, but Miami named longtime Clemson AD **Dan Radakovich** to the same post in December 2021.
- Radakovich, whose career spans more than 30 years, earned his MBA from the University of Miami in 1982 and worked in the school's business office from 1983 - 1985.
- Prior to Clemson, Radakovich served as Georgia Tech's AD from 2006 to 2012, and before that, he was a Senior Associate AD at LSU. Radakovich earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1980.

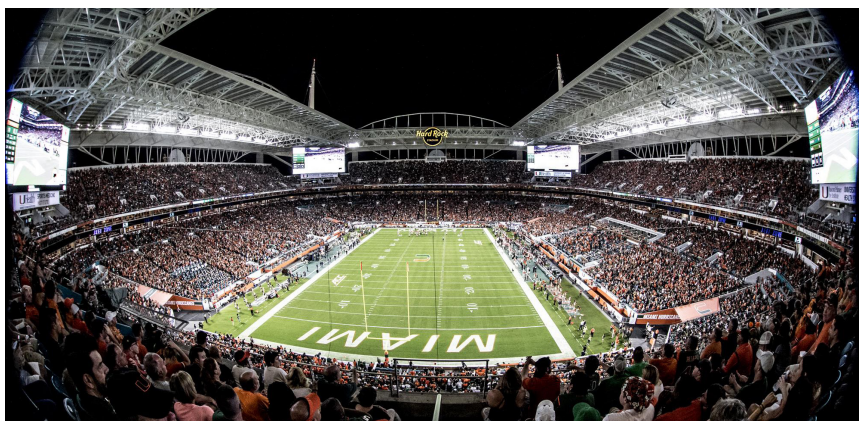

## HURRICANES RETURN HOME, LOOKING FOR THIRD STRAIGHT VS. DUKE

- Miami continues its first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Oct. 22 with its second home conference game of 2022 - a matchup with the Duke Blue Devils (12:30 p.m., ACC RSN).
- Last time out on Oct. 15, Miami captured its first ACC win of the season - a 20-14 decision over Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium. The Hurricanes outgained the Hokies, 458-257, in the win in Blacksburg, Va.
- UM has a 15-4 record all-time in its series with the Blue Devils. Saturday will mark Duke's first trip to Miami since 2018; the Hurricanes have played three straight in the series on the road in Durham, N.C.
- Cristobal was named the 26th head coach in the history of the program on December 6, 2021 after spending the previous four years at the helm of the Oregon Ducks. Cristobal is a two-time UM alum.
- When he departed Eugene, Cristobal was the only Power-5 head coach to lead his team to three straight conference championship games from 2019-2021. He won two Pac-12 titles, delivered a Rose Bowl to the Ducks and is one of just two active coaches to produce a top-10 pick three straight years.
- The Hurricanes have won six of the last eight versus Duke, including wins in back-to-back contests.
- Miami's game against Duke is also slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM, Radio Actualidad and WVUM.

## A LOOK BACK: HURRICANES TOP HOKIES, 20-14, AT LANE STADIUM

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 351 yards and two touchdowns, Miami outgained Virginia Tech, 458-257, and the Hurricanes left Lane Stadium victorious, 20-14, last time out on Oct. 15 in Blacksburg, Va.
- WR **Colbie Young** enjoyed a career game for the Hurricanes in his first career start. He totaled a career-high nine catches, 110 yards and one touchdown. He led the Hurricanes in catches and yards.
- DL **Akheem Mesidor** led the Miami defense, finishing with a team-high eight tackles and 3.5 sacks.
- The Hurricanes totaled seven tackles for loss and six sacks; LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.** (two tackles for loss, one sack) had five tackles. DB **DJ Ivey** forced a fumble that was recovered by DB **Avantae Williams**.
- P **Lou Hedley** was dominant on special teams, averaging 44.6 yards per punt with a long punt of 58.
- Hedley was named ACC Specialist of the Week, while Mesidor won weekly honors for defensive line.
- WR **Brashard Smith** had a career-high six catches totaling 76 yards; WR **Frank Ladson, Jr.**, had his first touchdown as a Hurricane on a 5-yard catch in the back of the end zone for Miami's first score.

## DEFENSE PLAYING AT HIGH LEVEL UNDER STEELE'S DIRECTION IN 2022

- The Hurricanes are ranked No. 14 in FBS in rushing defense (98.2) and rank third in the ACC in the same category. Only 16 FBS teams average under 100 rush yards allowed per game, including Miami.
- In addition to its strong rushing defense numbers, Miami is ranked No. 11 in all of FBS in first downs allowed on defense (96), No. 7 in team sacks (3.50) and No. 16 in tackles for loss (7.00) in six games.
- **Kevin Steele**, a previous finalist for the Broyles Award honoring the nation's top assistant coach, owns 38 years of coaching experience, including 13 in the SEC and 10 overall as a defensive coordinator.
- With seven interceptions this season, Miami places No. 30 at the FBS level and third in the conference.

## MIAMI RANKED NO. 27 IN TOTAL OFFENSE UNDER '21 BROYLES WINNER

- The Hurricanes are ranked No. 27 in total offense in FBS, averaging 463.7 yards per game under the direction of offensive coordinator **Josh Gattis**, who won the 2021 Broyles Award while at Michigan.
- The Hurricanes rank No. 32 in FBS in offense first downs gained (160), No. 14 in passing offense (319.8 yards per game), No. 22 in time of possession (32:29) and No. 31 in third down percentage (.461).
- Miami's average of 319.8 passing yards per game is good for No. 14 in the country and second in the ACC. The only ACC school above Miami is North Carolina (326.7). It ranks third in ACC in total offense.

## CRISTOBAL ASSEMBLED SUPERSTAR STAFF HEADING INTO FIRST YEAR

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was **Mario Cristobal's** staff assembly in Coral Gables, where the Hurricanes added some familiar faces from South Florida to a staff with national ties.
- Cristobal pulled the reigning Broyles Award winner (top assistant coach) **Josh Gattis** from Michigan, where the OC helped lead the Wolverines to their first College Football Playoff appearance in 2021.
- Boasting over 40 years of experience including stints as defensive coordinator at Clemson, Auburn and LSU, **Kevin Steele** joined Cristobal's staff as DC. Longtime head coach **Charlie Strong** is Co-DC.
- **Frank Ponce** and **Alex Mirabal**, two Miami natives, moved back home to join Cristobal's staff as well.
- The impressive nature of Cristobal's staff build-out was not restricted to just full-time assistants; NFL Hall of Fame defensive end **Jason Taylor** is a quality control analyst, longtime NFL personnel director and UM alum **Alonzo Highsmith** was named General Manager of Football Operations.
- Between Taylor and senior football advisor **Ed Reed**, Miami has two Pro Football Hall of Fame members who combined for 15 Pro Bowl nods, 12 All-Pro picks and eight First Team All-Pro plaudits.

## VAN DYKE TO MAKE 16TH START OF CAREER SATURDAY VERSUS DUKE

- Named to nearly every offensive award major preseason watch list, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** entered 2022 poised for another big season after putting together an ACC Rookie of the Year campaign in 2021.
- Van Dyke became the third Miami Hurricane to win both ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, joining Hurricanes QB Brad Kaaya (2014) and RB Duke Johnson (2012).
- Van Dyke took over starting duties three games into the season and ended the year by throwing for 2,931 yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just six interceptions. He completed 62.3 percent of passes.
- In the season opener vs. Bethune-Cookman, Van Dyke extended his streak of throwing multiple TDs to seven consecutive games. For the fifth time during that stretch, Van Dyke threw zero interceptions.
- Van Dyke's streak of seven straight games with multiple touchdown passes ended vs. Southern Miss.

## MESIDOR NAMED WALTER CAMP/ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK AFTER VT

- After a dominant performance versus Virginia Tech that saw him total a team-high eight tackles and a career-best 3.5 sacks, DL **Akheem Mesidor** was named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week. Mesidor started the game at Lane Stadium.
- Mesidor is just the third ACC player over the last three seasons to record at least 3.5 sacks in a single game, including the first since Virginia's Charles Snowden on 10/31/20 against North Carolina. The only other ACC player to do so during that stretch is Duke's Victor Dimukeje on 9/19/20.
- Before Mesidor, the last ACC player to notch at least 3.5 sacks in a road game was also a Hurricane, as eventual first-round pick **Gregory Rousseau** tallied 4.0 on 11/2/19 in a victory at Florida State.
- Mesidor is just the ninth ACC player in the last decade (2013-present) to register at least eight total tackles and 3.5 sacks in a single game. Miami is the only team with two players on that list, as Rousseau also had eight tackles in his four-sack performance at Florida State.
- Mesidor is one of only five FBS players with at least 3.5 sacks in a single game this season, including the only one to do so in a Power Five vs. Power Five contest. He is joined on the list by Fresno State's David Perales (4.0 vs. San Jose State on 10/15/22), Eastern Michigan's Jose Ramirez (4.0 on 10/8/22 at Western Michigan), Houston's Derek Parish (4.5 at Texas Tech on 9/10/22) and Michigan State's Jacoby Windmon (4.0 vs. Western Michigan on 9/2/22). Mesidor and Parish (11 tackles) are the only FBS player to register at least eight tackles and 3.5 sacks in a single game this year.
- Over the last 15 seasons, just four Hurricanes have posted 3.5 sacks in a single game, including only three against an FBS foe. Mesidor and Rousseau are joined on that list by **Allen Bailey** (3.5 vs. North Carolina on 10/23/10) and **Olivier Vernon** (3.5 on 9/2/10 vs. Florida A&M).
- Mesidor transferred to UM after totaling 70 tackles, 14.5 TFLs & 9.5 sacks in two years at West Virginia.

## OTHER DEFENSIVE PERFORMERS STOOD OUT IN WIN OVER HOKIES

- In addition to DL **Akheem Mesidor**'s day, other Hurricanes stood out for standout performances: DB **James Williams** totaled six tackles and two pass breakups. He is the first Hurricane with two such games in a single year since Darryl Sharpton (2009) and first DB since Brandon Meriweather (2005).
- LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, and Mesidor both logged at least five tackles, two TFLs and one sack in the victory over the Hokies. It is the first time two Miami players had the stat line in the same game since the last time the team played in Blacksburg, Va., as both Gilbert Frierson and Jaelan Phillips did so on 11/14/20 against Virginia Tech. That is the only other such occurrence over the last three seasons.
- Miami held Virginia Tech to 257 yards and two touchdowns Saturday. It is the first time the Hurricanes conceded fewer than 260 yards and fewer than three touchdowns in ACC play since 11/2/19 at FSU.

## TVD MAKING IMPACT ON MIAMI, ACC RECORD BOOKS AS STARTING QB

- After throwing for 496 yards against North Carolina, **Tyler Van Dyke** amassed 351 at Virginia Tech. This is the ninth time in program history a Miami quarterback has compiled 350 yards in back-to-back games and Van Dyke is the first Hurricane to achieve the feat three times.

- Van Dyke has now started eight games against ACC competition and thrown for over 315 yards each time. Across his eight conference starts, Van Dyke is averaging 380.1 passing yards per game. In each of his last four league outings, Van Dyke has eclipsed 350 passing yards he is averaging 396.3 yards.
  - Van Dyke's eight 300-yard games against ACC foes are already good for a program record, eclipsing the mark of seven previously co-held by Stephen Morris (24 ACC appearances) and Bad Kaaya (23 ACC appearances). The previous longest streak of consecutive 300-yard passing games in ACC play was three by Morris (11/24/12 at Duke, 10/5/13 vs. Georgia Tech and 10/17/13 at North Carolina).
  - Since the turn of the century (2000-present), Van Dyke is the only ACC quarterback with eight consecutive 300-yard passing games in league play. In fact, only 14 quarterbacks have even eight total 300-yard passing games in ACC action during that stretch. Of those 14, the longest streak of consecutive 300-yard games is five by Kenny Pickett.

## DISRUPTIVE IN THE BACKFIELD: MIAMI DEFENSE AMONG FBS LEADERS

- With 3.50 sacks per game, the Hurricanes rank seventh in the country and second in the ACC. The lone ACC team with a better mark is Louisville (3.83). Just 16 teams are putting up even 3.0 sacks per contest. Miami is racking up 7.0 tackles for loss per game, a figure that puts it No. 16 in FBS.

## A RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE, HEDLEY HONORED BY ACC ON OCT. 17

- A 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2022 Preseason First Team All-ACC, **Lou Hedley** had an excellent first half and was recognized with ACC Specialist of the Week honors after a dominant game versus Virginia Tech.
- Through six games, Hedley has Miami top-five in the nation in net punting at 43.94 yards per attempt
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder is averaging 45.2 yards per punt. Four of Hedley's seven punts pinned the Hokies inside their own 10-yard-line. He put them at the 8-yard-line once and at the 2-yard-line on another deep boot. He averaged 44.8 yards per boot and logged a long of 58 yards and had just one touchback on the day.
- A sixth-year redshirt senior, Hedley was a 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and a 2021 semifinalist. In the former year, he was also an Associated Press Second Team All-American. He was named a semifinalist for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy honoring the sport's top scholar athlete in late September.
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder from Mandurah, Australia, Hedley is a two-time Second Team All-ACC designee.

## TVD'S OUTING VERSUS TAR HEELS PUT HIM IN RARE COMPANY AT ACC, UM

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke's** 496 yards against North Carolina were the second-most in school history, trailing only the 566 by Stephen Morris on 9/29/12 against NC State. The record before that was 485 by Gino Torretta on 11/30/91 against San Diego State. Van Dyke's 496 yards are tied with FSU's Chris Weinke (10/7/00 at Miami) for No. 14 in ACC history. It was the second 400-yard game of Van Dyke's career in just 15 career starts.
- It is also the second-highest total by any Power-5 player this season, trailing only the 516 by Washington's Michael Penix (9/24/22 versus Arizona). Van Dyke was the first player to throw for over 490 yards versus an FBS team since Notre Dame's Jack Coan and Ohio State's CJ Stroud did so on 1/1/22.
- Van Dyke also set the school record for completions (42) against the Tar Heels, as he completed 73.7 percent of his passes. The prior records was 37 (Brock Berlin on 10/2/03 vs. West Virginia). Van Dyke's 42 completions placed him ninth in ACC single-game history. The total is eight more than any other ACC quarterback has totaled this year, as NC State's Devin Leary held the previous top total of 34 (9/25/22 vs. UConn). In addition, the figure is the most by any ACC quarterback since NC State's Ryan Finley in 2017.
- Van Dyke is just the fifth Miami quarterback ever to throw for 400-plus yards in a loss, joining N'Kosi Perry (422) on 10/5/19 against Virginia Tech, Brad Kaaya (405) on 10/10/15 at Florida State, Steve Walsh (424) on 10/15/88 at Notre Dame and Bernie Kosar (447) on 11/23/84 vs. Boston College.

## MALLORY TALLIED FIRST 100-YARD GAME vs. UNC, CLOSING IN ON RECORDS

- After the announcement of Mario Cristobal's appointment as head coach at The U, a number of student-athletes elected to return for their final year of eligibility rather than train for the NFL Draft.
- One of Miami's most important returnees was TE **Will Mallory**, who was among Miami's top offensive performers a season ago. Mallory set career marks in catches (30), yards (347), starts (12) and longest reception (57) last year, while also matching his career mark for touchdowns in a season (four).
- The Mackey Award candidate had his best game yet in UM's game vs. North Carolina: a career-high eight catches for a career-high 115 yards. The performance marked his first 100-yard game for UM.
- The veteran tight end, named to the Mackey Award honoring the nation's top performer at the position, leads the Hurricanes in both receptions (23) and yards (304) and has started all six games so far this year.
- Mallory needs 25 receptions, 443 yards and three touchdowns to set the Miami records for a tight end.
- The Jacksonville native's accomplishments are even more impressive given the history of tight ends at Miami, an alumni group that includes Jeremy Shockey, Greg Olsen, Bubba Franks and Jimmy Graham.

## FLAGG IMPRESSING IN 2ND YEAR STARTING AT MIDDLE LINEBACKER

- **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, had seven tackles, three TFLs and 0.5 sacks against UNC. He was the first Hurricane to reach each of those figures since 11/14/20 when Jaelan Phillips did so at Virginia Tech. He leads UM with 35 tackles. The only other Cane to do so over the last three years (2020-present) was Quincy Roche on 10/17/20 vs. Pitt.
- Flagg, Jr., sits fifth in the country and first in ACC with 1.6 TFLs per game. He is also No. 11 in FBS at 9.5 TFLs
- The third-year player had a breakout 2021, starting all 12 games and leading Miami with 60 total tackles.

## BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY AT UM

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres "Andy" Borregales** earned starting placekicker responsibilities as a true freshman in 2021.
- Andy went on to earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors in a 2021 season where he connected on 17-of-21 field goal attempts and a perfect 45-of-45 extra point attempts. He was 5-6 of kicks longer than 40.
- Borregales has been impressive to begin 2022. He is 10-13 on field goal attempts and 22-22 on extra points.
- A Miami native, Borregales sits No. 14 in the country and fourth in the ACC with 1.67 field goals per game.
- The younger Borregales nailed a 55-yard kick in 2021 that was the longest ever by a UM freshman.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, passing #30 to Andy.

**PARRISH JOINED ELITE GROUP WITH THIRD STRAIGHT GAME OF 85+**

- **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, amassed 85-plus rushing yards in each of his first three games as a Hurricane. This was just the sixth time since the turn of the century (2000-present) a Miami Hurricane has hit 85 yards in each of the first three games of a season, as Parrish joined DeeJay Dallas (2019), Mark Walton (2016), Duke Johnson (2014), Lamar Miller (2011) and Frank Gore (2003) to accomplish the feat.
- Parrish, Jr., who returned home to Miami after spending the first two years of his career at Ole Miss, rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns on just 14 carries in the opener. The 108 yards marked the second-highest total of his career, while the three scores set a new mark - his previous high was two.
- Parrish, Jr. bested himself against Southern Miss, rushing for 109 yards with one touchdown in a 30-7 win on Sept. 10. Outside of Parrish, no other Miami player this century (2000-pres.) has opened his career as a Hurricane by rushing for 100-plus yards in the team's opening two games of a season
- Parrish, Jr., rushed 16 times for 85 yards at Texas A&M, averaging 5.3 yards per carry on the road.
- In his two years with the Rebels, the Miami native totaled more than 1,000 all-purpose yards. He was a four-star prospect who rushed for more than 4,600 yards in an illustrious high school career.
- Miami's game vs. Bethune-Cookman made it three consecutive years where Miami has had a game with two players scoring at least two rushing TDs. That hadn't happened since 2013 before 2020.

**MIAMI ALREADY IMPROVED IN RED ZONE DEFENSE SIX GAMES IN**

- Miami's defense has done an excellent job backed up against its own end zone. The team is allowing scores on just 76.5 percent of red-zone drives, a mark that ranks third in the ACC and No. 32 nationally.
- Last year, UM finished No. 129 of 130 teams in the statistic with a 94.9 percent mark in red zone defense.

**KEY'SHAWN SMITH SHINING ON KOR, UM LEADS NATION IN RETURNS**

- WR **Key'Shawn Smith** retook the NCAA lead in kickoff return average, as his 34.4 mark puts him 0.4 yards above Eastern Michigan's Jaylon Jackson for first place in FBS. No other players are above 32.0.
- The Hurricanes continue to lead the nation in kickoff return average, posting 34.69 yards per attempt, a figure that ranks far ahead of the second-place mark of 30.27 by both Kentucky and Mississippi State. The gap from first to second place is larger than the gap from second to 10th in the category.

**RESTREPO ENJOYED FAST START BEFORE SUFFERING FOOT INJURY**

- WR **Xavier Restrepo** turned in the finest game of his Miami career in the opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was the first 100-yard game of his career.
- Before suffering an injury before Miami's game against Texas A&M, Xavier Restrepo was off to a fast start to begin 2022. The third-year sophomore wide receiver was averaging 86.0 yards per game, which was good for the fourth-best mark in the ACC. Only eight players in the league had 60-plus yards per contest. At the time of his injury, Restrepo was also tied for fourth in ACC with 11 catches.
- Restrepo totaled 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a second-year freshman in 2021. Among Miami's team leaders on offense, Restrepo had emerged as a primary offensive target for UM

**MIAMI BACK AT WORLD-CLASS HARD ROCK STADIUM FOR YEAR 15**

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 15th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 3 vs. Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a 15-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 689-119 for an average margin of victory of 38.0 points in those 15 home openers.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 15 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 32-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

**MIAMI BOASTS TALENTED RUNNING GAME, RUSHED FOR 305 IN GAME 1**

- RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, and RB **Jaylan Knighton** were listed as co-starters for Miami's season opener.
- Though Knighton missed the game with a soft tissue injury, the Hurricanes managed to total 305 yards on the ground and scored seven rushing touchdowns in a dominant 70-13 win on Sept. 3.
- After a season-ending leg injury to Miami's starting running back in 2021, Knighton assumed the starting responsibility and delivered a strong first season as a primary running back.
- In just 17 games, Knighton has totaled 770 rushing yards, nine rushing touchdowns, 415 receiving yards and four receiving scores. He has totaled 1,303 all-purpose yards in his 17 games (76.6/game).
- He was nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect in high school.
- Miami ranks first in the ACC in scoring defense (10.0) and second in the league in scoring offense (50.0). Miami is also second in total offensive average (515.5) and third in off. yards per play (7.21)

## IT STARTS IN THE TRENCHES - WHERE UM HAS LOADS OF EXPERIENCE

- One of Mario Cristobal's focal points has been in building Miami's depth and ability in the trenches, and the Hurricanes return and add a number of key players at the line of scrimmage for 2022.
- Miami has three players who each have more than 30 starts on the offensive line: **Zion Nelson** (32 career starts), **Jakai Clark** (36) and **DJ Scaife** (46). In addition, the Hurricanes return several other played who have started, including **Justice Oluwaseun**, **Jalen Rivers** and **John Campbell**.
- On the defensive line, some of Miami's most experienced players arrive via the transfer portal, including All-Big 12 defensive lineman **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), defensive end **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), second-year defensive tackle **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), south Florida native and longtime USC defensive lineman **Jacob Lichtenstein** and defensive lineman **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB).

## MIAMI PLACES THREE ON 2022 PRESEASON ALL-ACC FOOTBALL TEAM

- Among Miami's preseason honorees were OL **Zion Nelson** and TE **Will Mallory**, along with P **Lou Hedley**, who were all selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team in a poll of conference media.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** finished third in Preseason Player of the Year voting with 21 votes, trailing only QB Sam Hartman of Wake Forest (30) and QB Devin Leary of NC State (40), who ranked as the top two. Van Dyke is the reigning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year entering 2022.
- Mallory has 73 career receptions for 1,006 yards with 11 touchdowns in his four seasons at The U.
- Nelson, an All-ACC Honorable Mention pick last year, has played in all 36 games since arriving to Miami in 2019. He has made 32 starts of his career, including all 12 in 2021 and all 13 in 2019.
- Hedley was a 2020 finalist for the Ray Guy Award honoring the nation's top punter and is a two-time Second Team All-ACC designee. He has averaged 45.2 yards per punt in his three seasons at Miami.

## WILLIAMS CONTINUING ASCENT IN YEAR 2 AS ONE OF LEADERS

- A former five-star recruit who made his presence felt in 2021, second-year safety **James Williams** was named to the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award honoring the nation's top defensive player.
- The second-year standout ranks second on Miami with 27 total tackles and has started all six games.
- Williams continued his ascent into one of the nation's premier defensive backs against Texas A&M in College Station. He totaled a team-high seven tackles, including six solos, and defended two passes.
- Williams became the fourth Hurricane—fifth occurrence—in the last 10 seasons, including the second on the road, to notch seven takedowns and two breakups in the same game, joining Kamren Kinchens (11/6/21 vs. Georgia Tech), Te'Cory Couch (9/20/21 vs. Virginia and 12/20/20 vs. Oklahoma State) and Shaquille Quarterman (10/26/19 at Pittsburgh); no Miami player had managed to do so from 2013-18.
- Williams appeared in all 10 games for which he was healthy in 2022, making seven starts and finishing with 31 tackles and a team-high two interceptions in his highly anticipated rookie season.
- Williams enjoyed a breakout year as an All-ACC Honorable Mention selection, headlining a secondary that included fellow first-year players **Kam Kinchens** and **Avantae Williams** in the safety rotation.
- Williams and **Leonard Taylor III** both signed with Miami in 2021 as five-star recruits, marking the first five-star pair to join the Hurricane in the same year since Duke Johnson and Tracy Howard in 2012.

## RESULTS

### GAME 5: CANES FALL TO TAR HEELS DESPITE VAN DYKE'S RECORD DAY

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for the second-most yards in Miami Hurricanes history, but it wasn't enough in a 27-24 defeat to the North Carolina Tar Heels at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami's 2022 ACC opener.
- Van Dyke, who was named ACC Quarterback of the Week for his performance against UNC, threw for 496 yards and three touchdowns. He set the Miami record for completions in a game (42) in the loss.
- Van Dyke's 496 yards were the most by any player against an FBS opponent in 2022 and 125 more than any ACC quarterback has amassed. It was tied for the 14th-most yards ever by an ACC QB.
- In addition, Van Dyke's 42 completions were the second-most by any FBS player this season, trailing only the 43 by Akron's DJ Irons. The number is eight more than any other ACC QB has posted in 2022.
- TE **Will Mallory** had the first 100-yard game of his career, hauling in a career-high eight receptions for a career-best 115 yards. WR **Frank Ladson** (8) and RB **Henry Parrish** (7) also caught multiple passes.
- LB **Keontra Smith** had his first interception while LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, totaled three tackles for loss.
- DB **Kam Kinchens** also picked off a pass, which doubled UNC QB Drake Maye's season interception total (1) entering the contest. Miami finished with nine tackles for loss and five sacks in the game.

### GAME 4: MIAMI DROPS NONCONFERENCE FINALE TO MTSU ON SEPT. 24

- The Hurricanes fell in their final nonconference game of 2022, dropping a matchup with the visiting Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders, 45-31, at Hard Rock Stadium. UM had a bye week following the game.
- RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.** led the Canes on the ground with 57 rushing yards on 14 carries (4.1 average).
- WR **Frank Ladson** had a team-high six grabs for 65 yards - his most at UM - including a 16-yard catch.
- WR **Key'Shawn Smith** had four catches (81 yards), as did TE **Will Mallory** (50 yards) for the Canes.
- QB **Jake Garcia** had 169 yards. QB **Tyler Van Dyke** started and threw for 138 with one touchdown.
- Miami's defense was led by LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, who had a team-high eight tackles, and S **Kam Kinchens**, who had his second interception of the season. DE **Jahfari Harvey** had a pair of TFLs.

### GAME 3: MIAMI FALLS TO A&M IN CLOSE TOP-25 SHOWDOWN, 17-9

- The Hurricanes fell in their first road test of 2022, dropping a matchup with top-25 Texas A&M, 17-9, in College Station, Texas on Sept. 17. Miami outgained the Aggies, 392-264, in the defeat.
- The Hurricanes held Texas A&M to just 16 first downs and 124 rushing yards, but came up just short.
- Miami had 27 first downs (compared to 16 for Texas A&M) and 217 yards passing (140 for Texas A&M).
- Miami's defense totaled six tackles for loss and three sacks on defense, including one each from DL **Darrell Jackson** and DL **Jahfari Harvey**. DB **James Williams** led the defense with seven tackles.
- Miami's offense was led by RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.** (16 carries, 85 yards) and RB **Jaylan Knighton** (14 carries, 77 yards). TE **Will Mallory** had six catches for 56 yards while eight players caught a pass.
- Miami did not allow a single sack against the talented Texas A&M defense.

### GAME 2: MIAMI TOPPLES SOUTHERN MISS, 30-7, TO MOVE TO 2-0

- A week after rolling to a 70-13 win in its season opener against Bethune-Cookman, the Hurricanes improved to 2-0 in **Mario Cristobal's** first season with a 30-7 win over Southern Miss on Sept. 10.
- Making the 11th start of his career, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** completed 20 of 29 passes for 261 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Miami improved to 8-3 in games started by Van Dyke all-time.
- Miami held Southern Miss to just seven points in the victory. It marked the first time Miami has conceded single-digit points in a game since 9/25/21 versus Central Connecticut State (zero). The last time the Hurricanes held an FBS team below 10 points was 12/5/20 at Duke (zero) and the last time they did so against a non-conference FBS foe was 11/11/17 versus third-ranked Notre Dame (eight).

### GAME 1: MIAMI DOMINATES WILDCATS, 70-13, IN SEASON OPENER

- The Hurricanes improved to 6-0 all-time against Bethune-Cookman in its season opener on Sept. 3.
- Miami amassed all but 15 possible offensive yards against the Wildcats in its 70-13 win at Hard Rock Stadium. It scored a touchdown on nine of its 11 drives, while another one ended at the opposing six-yard-line. The Hurricanes' final drive ended at the nine-yard-line when the game clock expired.
- The Hurricanes logged three interceptions in the win against Bethune-Cookman, with one each by **Gilbert Frierson**, **Kamren Kinchens** and **James Williams**. It marked the second time in the last four years Miami had three interceptions in a game, joining the 9/26/20 matchup with Florida State.
- WR **Xavier Restrepo** turned in the finest game of his career in Miami's season opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was Restrepo's first 100-yard game.

## HIGHSMITH NAMED GENERAL MANAGER OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

- The University of Miami hired longtime National Football League executive and Hurricanes great **Alonzo Highsmith** as general manager of football operations, it was announced on May 26, 2022.
- As general manager of football operations, Highsmith will work directly with Cristobal to support all administrative functions of the football program, including budget related items, culture building, program imaging, and working directly with staff members both on and off the field.
- Highsmith, a former first-round selection in the NFL Draft, also serves as a liaison between the administration and program, serve as a liaison between former players and assists with scouting.
- Highsmith, who played running back for the Hurricanes from 1983-1986, boasts 29 years' experience and 18 playoff appearances as an NFL player, scout and executive. He has spent the past 23 years in scouting and personnel, most recently serving as senior executive advisor to the GM for Seattle.
- Highsmith joined the Packers as a college scout in 1999 and spent 13 years on their college scouting staff. He was promoted to senior personnel executive in 2012 and remained in that role through the 2017 season. During his time there, the Packers made 13 trips to the playoffs and won Super Bowl XLV.

## RADAKOVICH SIGNS ON AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AT MIAMI

- One of the nation's most well-respected athletics administrators returned to the institution where nearly three decades ago he launched his career—the University of Miami. **Dan Radakovich**, who served as director of athletics at Clemson University for nine years, was named vice president and director of athletics on Dec. 9, 2021 - shortly after the hiring of head coach Mario Cristobal.
- Radakovich took the helm at Clemson in late 2012 and during his tenure, Clemson won 15 Atlantic Coast Conference team titles. The Tigers football program won two national championships, made six College Football Playoff appearances, and captured six ACC titles. In the classroom, Clemson student-athletes recorded nine semesters with a 3.0 GPA or higher. The athletic department attained the school's highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate at 93 percent in 2020.

## ACC ANNOUNCES NEW MODEL; HURRICANES TO PLAY BC, FSU, UofL

- The new ACC football scheduling model is based on a 3-5-5 structure whereby each team will play three primary opponents annually and face the other 10 league teams twice during the cycle. The schedule allows for each team to face all 13 conference opponents home and away at least once during the four-year cycle. The structure was adopted by the league's ADs and faculty reps.
- The new schedule will eliminate the Atlantic and Coastal divisions with all 14 schools competing in one division beginning in 2023. The top two teams based on conference winning percentage will compete in the Subway ACC Football Championship Game on the first Saturday in December.

## FORD SELECTED BY PACKERS, UM'S DRAFT STREAK CONTINUES IN '22

- University of Miami defensive lineman **Jonathan Ford** was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the Green Bay Packers on the final day of the draft. Ford's selection continued Miami's streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975 – the fourth-longest streak,
- 2022 marked the sixth straight year the NFL Draft featured at least one UM lineman selected.
- A three-year starter for the Hurricanes, Ford saw action in 10 games and made eight starts in 2021.
- Ford made 30 starts over his career. He finished his career with 60 tackles and 7.5 tackles for loss.

## UM LEADING THE WAY WITH A DIVERSE STAFF REPRESENTING SOFLA

- Miami is tied with Hawai'i for the highest percentage of minority representation on its full-time staff. Nine of UM's 11 full-time coaches are either African-American, Hispanic or Polynesian, exactly (81.8%)

## CANES PULL IN RECRUITING CLASS RANKED AMONG NATION'S BEST

- Thanks to the late work of Mario Cristobal and his staff on the recruiting trail, the Hurricanes 2022 high school recruiting class soared to a top-15 class by nearly every recognized outlet by end of year.
- The Hurricanes picked up several impactful pieces on Early Signing Day, signing LB **Wesley Bissainthe**, DL **Nyjalik Kelly**, DL **Cyrus Moss** and TE **Jaleel Skinner**, who enrolled before spring ball.
- Miami added RB **TreVonte' Citizen**, one of the nation's best running backs, and inked offensive linemen like **Matthew McCoy** and **Anez Cooper** to move into a class ranked in the top 15.
- The Hurricanes signed five top-125 prospects for the first time since 2018. The four highest-rated members of that group committed after Mario Cristobal took over at the helm of the Hurricanes.



# MARIO CRISTOBAL

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (11TH OVERALL) | 3-3 | 65-63

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future."

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
