#### THE GAME

- After falling in their annual rivalry matchup last time out versus Florida State on Nov. 5, the Hurricanes continue their first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Sat., Nov. 12 at Georgia Tech. Kickoff for the game, slated for broadcast on ACC RSN, is set for 3:30 p.m. ET.
- The game will be broadcast on **Bally Sports Sun** locally with Tom Werme (pyp), James Bates (color) and Wiley Ballard (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pyp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 21st season together. Josh Darrow manages sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (pyp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on **Radio Actualidad** from Bobby Dodd Stadium on the Georgia Tech campus.

#### THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes and Yellow Jackets are tied in the all-time series, 13-13. Georgia Tech leads, 10-5, in games played in Atlanta in the series history.
- Miami has had the upper hand of late, having won nine of the last 12 matchups overall dating to 2009, including four of the last six dating to 2015.
- In last year's matchup, the Hurricanes emerged victorious at Hard Rock Stadium, winning 33-30. Saturday marks UM's first trip to GT since 2018.

#### THE HURRICANES

- After falling in its annual rivalry game with Florida State, Miami looks to return to winning ways when it travels to Georgia Tech for a game on Nov. 12.
- The Miami Hurricanes officially kicked off the **Mario Cristobal** era Sept. 3, when the Hurricanes topped Bethune-Cookman, 70-13, in their 2022 opener.
- DL **Leonard Taylor III** and K **Andy Borregales** became the seventh and eighth Hurricanes to win ACC Player of the Week honors this year when they were recognized as ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and ACC Specialist of the Week, respectively, on Oct. 31 following Miami's win over Virginia.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks were the only team to play in a Power-5 conference championship game each of his final three years. He led the Ducks to a Rose Bowl win and two Pac-12 titles.
- Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to have produced a top-10 pick in each of the last three drafts, joining only Alabama's Nick Saban.
- The first-year Miami head coach drew widespread acclaim for the staff he assembled, which includes reigning Broyles Award winner **Josh Gattis** as offensive coordinator, longtime coordinator and SEC veteran **Kevin Steele** as defensive coordinator and **Charlie Strong** as co-DC/linebackers coach.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** entered his first full year as a starter with high expectations after earning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors as a second-year freshman in 2021. Named to nearly every major offensive award preseason watch list, Van Dyke became the first quarterback since Joe Burrow (2019) to record a streak of six straight 300-yard passing games with three-or-more TDs in each of those games.
- TE **Will Mallory** (Mackey Award), **James Williams** (Bednarik Award), P **Lou Hedley** (Ray Guy Award), K **Andy Borregales** (Lou Groza Award), OL **Zion Nelson** (Outland) and DL **Leonard Taylor** (Bronko Nagurski Trophy) were also among those recognized with preseason watch list selections.
- In addition to a talented group of returners, the Hurricanes feature a 2022 recruiting class that finished ranked among the top 15 nationally by every scouting service and a group of newcomers through the transfer portal that includes DL **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), DL **Jacob Lichtenstein** (USC), DL **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), DL **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), DL **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB), LB **Caleb Johnson** (UCLA), DB **Daryl Porter, Jr.** (West Virginia), OL **Logan Sagapolu** (Oregon), OL **Jonathan Denis** (Oregon) WR **Frank Ladson, Jr.** (Clemson) and RB **Henry Parrish** (Ole Miss).

## QUICK HITS

#### MIAMI HITS ROAD FOR MATCHUP WITH GT

- Following a loss to Florida State in its annual rivalry showdown, Miami hits the road for a matchup with Georgia Tech at Bobby Dodd Stadium on Nov. 12 at 3:30 p.m.
- The all-time series is tied, 13-13, but Miami has had the advantage in the series of late; the Hurricanes have won four of the last six games overall, but have not made the trip to Bobby Dodd since 2018 due to scheduling issues caused from COVID-19.
- The Hurricanes emerged victorious in last year's matchup, winning 33-30 over Georgia Tech at Hard Rock Stadium on Nov. 6, 2021.

#### CANES' DEFENSE CAUSING CHAOS IN 2022

- The Miami Hurricanes defense ranks among the nation's leaders in several stat categories, including both tackles for loss and sacks, under the direction of first-year coordinator **Kevin Steele**.
- Miami is averaging 3.56 sacks per game through nine games, which ranks as the fifth-best mark in the nation and second-best mark in the ACC. Only five FBS teams are averaging more than 3.5 sacks per game in 2022.
- Miami's defense totaled 11 tackles for loss and five sacks in the win over Virginia on Oct. 29. DL **Leonard Taylor III** paced the Hurricanes defense with four tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

#### RADAKOVICH NAMED ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

- Not only were the Hurricanes bolstered by the return of **Mario Cristobal**, but Miami named longtime Clemson AD **Dan Radakovich** to the same post in December 2021.
- Radakovich, whose career spans more than 30 years, earned his MBA from the University of Miami in 1982 and worked in the school's business office from 1983 - 1985.
- Prior to Clemson, Radakovich served as Georgia Tech's AD from 2006 to 2012, and before that, he was a Senior Associate AD at LSU. Radakovich earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1980.

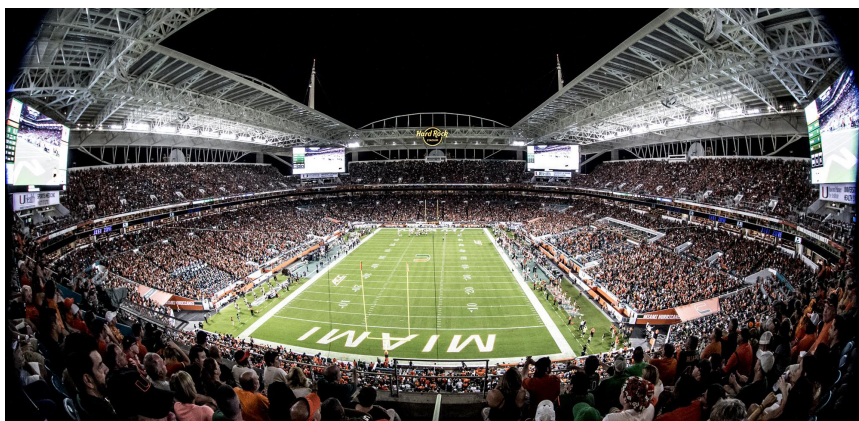

## HURRICANES TRAVEL TO GEORGIA TECH FOR ROAD MATCHUP NOV. 12

- Miami continues its first season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Nov. 12 with its second-to-last road game of the season - an ACC Coastal matchup with Georgia Tech at 3:30 p.m. ET.
- Last time out on Nov. 5, Miami fell to Florida State in its annual rivalry showdown with the Seminoles at Hard Rock Stadium. Miami hits the road for back-to-back games before its home finale on Nov. 26.
- Miami and Georgia Tech are tied in the all-time series, 13-13. The Hurricanes have had the upper hand of late, winning four of the last six matchups. Saturday's game is Miami's first trip to GT since 2018.
- Cristobal was named the 26th head coach in the history of the program on December 6, 2021 after spending the previous four years at the helm of the Oregon Ducks. Cristobal is a two-time UM alum.
- When he departed Eugene, Cristobal was the only Power-5 head coach to lead his team to three straight conference championship games from 2019-2021. He won two Pac-12 titles, delivered a Rose Bowl to the Ducks and is one of just two active coaches to produce a top-10 pick three straight years.
- Miami has won nine of the last 12 vs. GT, including a 33-30 win over the Jackets at home in 2020.
- UM's game against GT in Atlanta is also slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM and Radio Actualidad.

## A LOOK BACK: MIAMI FALLS TO FLORIDA ST. IN ANNUAL RIVALRY GAME

- Miami fell to Florida State, 45-3, in its annual rivalry showdown against the Seminoles on Nov. 5.
- After missing his first start since September 2021 in Miami's trip to Virginia, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** returned for FSU before departing early on due to a similar upper body injury suffered vs. the Noles.
- QB **Jake Garcia** and QB **Jacurri Brown** split time at quarterback in Van Dyke's place versus Florida St.
- DL **Mitchell Agude** led the defense with two tackles for loss (10 yards), while DL **Jordan Miller** and DL **Nyjalik Kelly** each had a sack. Kelly, a true freshman, has four sacks this season in his first year for UM.
- The Hurricanes defense totaled 11 tackles for loss (for 46 yards), three sacks (28) and one interception.
- Four players had a pair of catches for Miami, including WR Xavier Restrepo and WR Colbie Young.
- Brown led Miami with 64 rushing yards, while RB Jaylan Knighton had a career-long 45-yard rush.

## MIAMI 'D' AMONG NATION'S BEST AT WREAKING HAVOC IN BACKFIELD

- Miami's defense has been among the nation's most disruptive in terms of tackles for loss and sacks.
- The Hurricanes rank No. 5 nationally in team sacks, averaging 3.56 per contest. The figure puts them second in the ACC, behind only Louisville; only five teams in college football average at least 3.5 sacks.
- In addition to their gaudy sack numbers, the Hurricanes rank No. 9 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC in tackles for loss, averaging 7.7 per game. Miami trails only Clemson (7.8) in the ACC in the category.
- Among Miami's top performers on the defensive line have been **Akheem Mesidor** (8.5 tackles for loss, 5.0 sacks), **Leonard Taylor III** (8.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks) and DL **Nyjalik Kelly**, who has 4.0 sacks.
- **Kevin Steele**, a previous finalist for the Broyles Award honoring the nation's top assistant coach, owns 38 years of coaching experience, including 13 in the SEC and 10 overall as a defensive coordinator.
- Miami has had 11 tackles for loss in back-to-back games at Virginia (Oct. 29) and against FSU (Nov. 5).
- Taylor III had a dominant individual performance versus Virginia, totaling 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks to win ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors. It was only the sixth performance of at least 4.0 tackles for loss in a single game by a UM defender in the last seven seasons dating back to 2016.
- Taylor III, who goes by 'L.T.', is one of only four Power Five players—including the only one in the ACC — to post a game this season with at least 6 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 4.0 TFLs. He is among just three ACC players in the last two seasons with 6 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 4.0 TFLs in a single game, joining Florida State's Jermaine Johnson II (11/13/21) and Georgia Tech's Charlie Thomas (9/25/21)

## KINCHEMS AMONG TOP BALLHAWKS IN THE NATION IN SECOND YEAR

- DB **Kamren Kinchens** is tied for No. 18 in the country and second in the ACC with three interceptions on the year. The only ACC player with more picks than Kinchens is NC State's Aydan White (4).

## VAN DYKE INJURED VERSUS DUKE, RETURNED BRIEFLY VS. SEMINOLES

- Named to nearly every offensive award major preseason watch list, QB **Tyler Van Dyke** entered 2022 poised for another big season after putting together an ACC Rookie of the Year campaign in 2021.
- Van Dyke, who had started 16 straight games since his first career start against Central Connecticut State on Sept. 25, 2021, saw his streak end when he missed Miami's game at Virginia on Oct. 29 due to an upper body injury suffered versus Duke at home on Oct. 22. Though he returned to start Miami's game against Florida State on Nov. 5, Van Dyke missed most of the contest due to injury.
- Van Dyke became the third Miami Hurricane to win both ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, joining Hurricanes QB Brad Kaaya (2014) and RB Duke Johnson (2012).
- Van Dyke took over starting duties three games into the season and ended the year by throwing for 2,931 yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just six interceptions. He completed 62.3 percent of passes.

## YOUNG BALLING OVER LAST FIVE GAMES, EMERGING FOR OFFENSE

- WR **Colbie Young** has emerged as one of Miami's go-to playmakers on offense after seeing limited action; over just the last five games, Young has totaled 25 catches, 323 yards and four touchdowns.
- The talented Young had six catches for 127 yards and two touchdowns vs. Duke. He became the first UM receiver with a multi-TD game in 2022 and was recognized as ACC Receiver of the Week.
- In addition, Young's 71-yard scoring TD vs. Duke the longest play from scrimmage by a Cane in 2022.
- Before the Duke game, Young had nine grabs for 110 yards and a touchdown in the win at Virginia Tech. He became the first Miami player to post back-to-back games with 100-plus yards and at least one TD in back-to-back games since Mike Harley on 10/24/20 vs. Virginia and 11/6/20 at NC State.
- Prior to Young, the last Hurricane with consecutive 100-yard receiving outings was Charleston Rambo, who did so on 11/20/21 against Virginia Tech and 11/27/21 at Duke, the same two foes for Young.
- Young's 71-yard play was the longest by a Hurricane since an 83-yard catch by Cam'Ron Harris on 9/25/21 against Central Connecticut State. In addition, it was the longest by a Miami player versus an FBS foe since a 76-yard reception by Brevin Jordan on 12/12/20 against North Carolina.
- Young transferred in from Lackawanna College in Pennsylvania, the same school that produced All-American offensive lineman Bryant McKinnie. Young played high school football in Binghamton, N.Y.

## DEFENSE RANKS No. 15 IN FBS IN FIRST DOWNS ALLOWED IN 2022

- Miami ranks No. 15 in FBS in first downs - defense, having allowed 146 through nine games. Only 18 teams in FBS have allowed fewer than 150 first downs, including just two in ACC (NC State the other).

## PARRISH HAS THREE 100-YARD GAMES IN FIRST SEASON WITH CANES

- **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, recorded the third 100-yard game of his Miami career in the Hurricanes' win at Virginia, rushing for a career-high 113 yards on a career-high 24 carries in the team's 14-12 in 4 OTs.
- Parrish previous career high for yards was 111, set in 2021 vs. Arkansas when he was at Ole Miss.
- His performance at Virginia was just the 13th occurrence this season of an ACC player running for 110-plus yards in a game against a Power Five foe up to that point, including just the seventh such road game. He became the second player to rush for 100-plus against UVA, alongside Illinois' Chase Brown.
- Parrish made it just the sixth time since the turn of the century (2000-present) a Miami Hurricane has hit 85 yards in each of the first three games of a season, joining DeeJay Dallas (2019), Mark Walton (2016), Duke Johnson (2014), Lamar Miller (2011) and Frank Gore (2003) to accomplish the feat.
- Parrish who returned home to Miami after spending the first two years of his career at Ole Miss, rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns on just 14 carries in the opener vs. Bethune-Cookman. The 108 yards marked the second-highest total of his career, while the three scores set a new mark.
- Parrish bested himself against Southern Miss, rushing for 109 yards with one touchdown in a 30-7 win on Sept. 10. Outside of Parrish, no other Miami player this century (2000-pres.) has opened his career as a Hurricane by rushing for 100-plus yards in the team's opening two games of a season
- In his two years with the Rebels, the Miami native totaled more than 1,000 all-purpose yards. He was a four-star prospect who rushed for more than 4,600 yards in an illustrious high school career.
- When he decided to transfer to Miami, Parrish reunited with running backs coach **Kevin Smith**.

## PORTAL ADDITIONS, NEWCOMERS MAKING IMPACT IN FIRST YEARS

- Widely regarded as one of the nation's top recruiters, **Mario Cristobal** added several impact players through the transfer portal and signed a recruiting class ranked in the top-15 nationally for 2022.
- Among UM's top transfers were defensive linemen **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), **Darrell Jackson, Jr.**, (Maryland), **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB) and **Jacob Lichtenstein** (USC).
- The quintet has combined for 21.5 tackles for loss and 12.5 sacks to help aid Miami's defensive efforts.
- Defensive line is not the only position where Miami saw an injection of talent after Cristobal's arrival; UM's top running back (**Henry Parrish, Jr.** [Ole Miss]) arrived via transfer, as did three of the top five-pass catchers based catch total (**Colbie Young** [Lackawanna], **Frank Ladson** [Clemson] and Parrish).
- True freshmen have also made an impact; TE **Jaleel Skinner** started his first game last time out, DL **Nyjalik Kelly** ranks among Miami's sack leaders and LB **Wesley Bissainthe** has seen an increased role.

## CRISTOBAL ASSEMBLED SUPERSTAR STAFF HEADING INTO FIRST YEAR

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was **Mario Cristobal's** staff assembly in Coral Gables, where the Hurricanes added some familiar faces from South Florida to a staff with national ties.
- Cristobal pulled the reigning Broyles Award winner (top assistant coach) **Josh Gattis** from Michigan, where the OC helped lead the Wolverines to their first College Football Playoff appearance in 2021.
- Boasting over 40 years of experience including stints as defensive coordinator at Clemson, Auburn and LSU, **Kevin Steele** joined Cristobal's staff as DC. Longtime head coach **Charlie Strong** is Co-DC.
- **Frank Ponce** and **Alex Mirabal**, two Miami natives, moved back home to join Cristobal's staff as well.
- The impressive nature of Cristobal's staff build-out was not restricted to just full-time assistants; NFL Hall of Fame defensive end **Jason Taylor** is a quality control analyst, longtime NFL personnel director and University of Miami alum **Alonzo Highsmith** was named General Manager of Football Operations.
- Between Taylor and senior football advisor **Ed Reed**, Miami has two Pro Football Hall of Fame members who combined for 15 Pro Bowl nods, 12 All-Pro picks and eight First Team All-Pro plaudits.

## BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES CARRYING ON FAMILY LEGACY AT UM

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history, **Andres "Andy" Borregales** earned starting placekicker responsibilities as a true freshman in 2021.
- Andy went on to earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors in a 2021 season where he connected on 17-of-21 field goal attempts and 45-of-45 extra point attempts. He was 5-6 of kicks longer than 40.
- Borregales has been impressive again in 2022. He is 15-18 on field goal attempts and 25-25 on PATs.
- Borregales became the eighth ACC kicker in the last two years to make four-plus field goals in a game without a miss in Miami's win at Virginia; all four of his kicks came with 0:00 on the clock in the win.
- The sophomore was named ACC Specialist of the Week after Miami's 40T win over the Cavaliers.
- A Miami native, Borregales places No. 11 in FBS and No. 3 in the ACC with 1.67 field goals per game.
- The younger Borregales nailed a 55-yard kick in 2021 that was the longest ever by a UM freshman.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, passing #30 on.

## A RAY GUY CANDIDATE, HEDLEY HAS UM SIXTH IN NATION IN NET PUNTING

- A 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2022 Preseason First Team All-ACC, **Lou Hedley** had an excellent first half of 2022 and was recognized with ACC Specialist of the Week honors on October 17.
- Through nine games, Hedley has Miami No. 6 in the nation in net punting at 42.69 yards per attempt
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder is averaging 44.0 yards per punt. He has five punts of 50 yards or more and has landed 16 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line this season with only two touchbacks.
- A sixth-year redshirt senior, Hedley was a 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and a 2021 semifinalist. In the former year, he was also an Associated Press Second Team All-American. He was named a semifinalist for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy honoring the sport's top scholar athlete in late September.
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder from Mandurah, Australia, Hedley is a two-time Second Team All-ACC selection.

## MESIDOR LEADS HURRICANES IN SACKS IN IMPRESSIVE FIRST YEAR AT UM

- After a dominant performance versus Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium on Oct. 15 that saw him total a team-high eight tackles and a career-best 3.5 sacks, DL **Akheem Mesidor** was named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 17.
- Mesidor ranks No. 54 in the nation and No. 8 in ACC with an average of 0.62 sacks per game in 2022 (5.0).
- Mesidor became just the third ACC player over the last three seasons to record at least 3.5 sacks in a single game, including the first since Virginia's Charles Snowden on 10/31/20 against North Carolina.
- Before Mesidor, the last ACC player to notch at least 3.5 sacks in a road game was also a Hurricane, as eventual first-round pick **Gregory Rousseau** tallied 4.0 on 11/2/19 in a victory at Florida State.
- Mesidor registered six tackles and two TFLs last time out vs. Duke. The prior week, he had eight tackles and 3.5 TFLs in the win at Virginia Tech. He is the 10th Hurricane in the last decade (2013-present) to log multiple games with six-plus tackles and multiple TFLs in the same season. He joined:
  - Gilbert Frierson in 2020
  - Quincy Roche in 2020
  - Shaquille Quarterman in 2019 (five)
  - Gregory Rousseau in 2019 (four)
  - Michael Pinckney in 2019 (three)
  - Jonathan Garvin in 2018

- Of the above 10, the only ones to amass back-to-back games with six-plus tackles and multiple TFLs:

- Shaquille Quarterman in 2019 (11/2/19 at Florida State & 11/9/19 versus Louisville)
- Gregory Rousseau in 2019 (10/26/19 at Pittsburgh & 11/2/19 at Florida State)
- Jonathan Garvin in 2018 (9/2/18 vs. LSU & 9/8/18 versus Savannah State)

- Mesidor and Georgia Tech's Aydine Eley (9/10/22 versus Western Carolina and 9/17/22 versus Ole Miss) are the only players in the ACC with back-to-back six-tackle, two-TFL performances this season.
- Mesidor transferred to UM after totaling 70 tackles, 14.5 TFLs & 9.5 sacks in two years at West Virginia.

## MALLORY CLOSING IN ON TIGHT END U RECORDS IN FINAL SEASON AT UM

- After the announcement of Mario Cristobal's appointment as head coach at The U, a number of student-athletes elected to return for their final year of eligibility rather than train for the NFL Draft.
- One of Miami's most important returnees was TE **Will Mallory**, who was among Miami's top offensive performers a season ago. Mallory set career marks in catches (30), yards (347), starts (12) and longest reception (57) last year, while also matching his career mark for touchdowns in a season (four).
- The Mackey Award candidate had his best game yet in UM's game vs. North Carolina: a career-high eight catches for a career-high 115 yards. The performance marked his first 100-yard game for UM.
- The veteran tight end, named to the Mackey Award honoring the nation's top performer at the position, leads the Hurricanes in both receptions (28) and yards (371) and has started all nine games in 2022.
- Mallory needs 19 receptions, 376 yards and two touchdowns to set the Miami records for a tight end.
- The Jacksonville native's accomplishments are even more impressive given the history of tight ends at Miami, an alumni group that includes Jeremy Shockey, Greg Olsen, Bubba Franks and Jimmy Graham.

**RESTREPO ENJOYED FAST START, RETURNS AFTER MISSING FIVE GAMES**

- WR **Xavier Restrepo** returned to action in UM's win at Virginia after missing five straight games due to a leg injury. Restrepo turned in the finest game of his Miami career in the opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was the first 100-yard game of his career.
- Before suffering an injury prior to Miami's game against Texas A&M, Xavier Restrepo was off to a fast start to begin 2022. The third-year sophomore wide receiver was averaging 86.0 yards per game, which was good for the fourth-best mark in the ACC. Only eight players in the league had 60-plus yards per contest. At the time of his injury, Restrepo was also tied for fourth in ACC with 11 catches.
- Restrepo totaled 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a second-year freshman in 2021.

**MIAMI BATTLING SEVERAL KEY INJURIES ACROSS OFFENSE IN 2022**

- In addition to WR **Xavier Restrepo**, Miami has also missed several key offensive figures and would-be contributors for multiple games this year, including TE **Elijah Arroyo**, OL **Justice Oluwaseun**, OL **Zion Nelson**, RB **Don Chaney, Jr.**, OL **Jakai Clark** and OL **Jonathan Denis**, among others on the depth chart.

**TVD MAKING IMPACT ON MIAMI, ACC RECORD BOOKS AS STARTING QB**

- After throwing for 496 yards against North Carolina, **Tyler Van Dyke** amassed 351 at Virginia Tech. It was the ninth time in program history a Miami quarterback has compiled 350 yards in back-to-back games and Van Dyke is the first Hurricane to achieve the feat three times.

The previous longest streak of consecutive 300-yard passing games in ACC play was three by Morris (11/24/12 at Duke, 10/5/13 vs. Georgia Tech and 10/17/13 at North Carolina).
- Since the turn of the century (2000-present), Van Dyke is the only ACC quarterback with eight consecutive 300-yard passing games in league play. In fact, only 14 quarterbacks have even eight total 300-yard passing games in ACC action during that stretch. Of those 14, the longest streak of consecutive 300-yard games is five by Kenny Pickett.

## IVEY HAD STANDOUT GAME VS. DUKE, IS UM'S LEADER IN STARTS ON D

• DB **DJ Ivey** posted a team-high seven tackles versus Duke, as well as added a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. He is just the fifth Hurricane in the last 14 years (2009-present) to force and recover a fumble, while posting seven-plus tackles.

## FLAGG IMPRESSING IN 2ND YEAR STARTING AT MIDDLE LINEBACKER

• **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, had seven tackles, three TFLs and 0.5 sacks against UNC. He was the first Hurricane to reach each of those figures since 11/14/20 when Jaelan Phillips did so at Virginia Tech.

The only other Cane to do so over the last three years was Quincy Roche on 10/17/20 vs. Pitt.

• The third-year player had a breakout 2021, starting all 12 games and leading UM with 60 total tackles.

## MIAMI BACK AT WORLD-CLASS HARD ROCK STADIUM FOR YEAR 15

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 15th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 3 vs. Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a 15-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 689-119 for an average margin of victory of 38.0 points in those 15 home openers.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 15 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 32-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

## MIAMI BOASTS TALENTED RUNNING GAME, RUSHED FOR 305 IN GAME 1

- RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, and RB **Jaylan Knighton** were listed as co-starters for Miami's season opener.
- Though Knighton missed the game with a soft tissue injury, the Hurricanes managed to total 305 yards on the ground and scored seven rushing touchdowns in a dominant 70-13 win on Sept. 3.
- After a season-ending leg injury to Miami's starting running back in 2021, Knighton assumed the starting responsibility and delivered a strong first season as a primary running back.
- He was nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect in high school.

## IT STARTS IN THE TRENCHES - WHERE UM HAS LOADS OF EXPERIENCE

- One of Mario Cristobal's focal points has been in building Miami's depth and ability in the trenches, and the Hurricanes return and add a number of key players at the line of scrimmage for 2022.
- Miami has three players who each have more than 30 starts on the offensive line: **Zion Nelson** (32 career starts), **Jakai Clark** (38) and **DJ Scaife** (49). In addition, the Hurricanes return several other players who have started, including **Justice Oluwaseun**, **Jalen Rivers** and **John Campbell**.
- Campbell has started all nine games this season at left tackle, as has Rivers at left guard. Scaife, who leads all active Hurricanes in career starts, has started all nine games at right tackle in his final year.
- On the defensive line, some of Miami's most experienced players arrive via the transfer portal, including All-Big 12 defensive lineman **Akheem Mesidor** (West Virginia), defensive end **Mitchell Agude** (UCLA), second-year defensive tackle **Darrell Jackson** (Maryland), south Florida native and longtime USC defensive lineman **Jacob Lichtenstein** and defensive lineman **Antonio Moultrie** (UAB).
- Jackson has started all eight games this season on the interior defensive line for the Hurricanes.

## MIAMI PLACES THREE ON 2022 PRESEASON ALL-ACC FOOTBALL TEAM

- Among Miami's preseason honorees were OL **Zion Nelson** and TE **Will Mallory**, along with P **Lou Hedley**, who were all selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team in a poll of conference media.

**JAMES WILLIAMS CONTINUING ASCENT, MISSED VIRGINIA GAME DUE TO INJURY**

- A former five-star recruit who made his presence felt in 2021, second-year safety **James Williams** was named to the watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award honoring the nation's top defensive player prior to his sophomore year.
- The second-year standout ranks second on Miami with 32 total tackles and has started seven of eight games.
- Williams continued his ascent into one of the nation's premier defensive backs against Texas A&M in College Station. He totaled a team-high seven tackles, including six solo, and defended two passes. He missed his first game vs. UVA.
- Williams became the fourth Hurricane—fifth occurrence—in the last 10 seasons, including the second on the road, to notch seven takedowns and two breakups in the same game, joining Kamren Kinchens (11/6/21 vs. Georgia Tech), Te'Cory Couch (9/20/21 vs. Virginia and 12/20/20 vs. Oklahoma State) and Shaquille Quarterman (10/26/19 at Pittsburgh); no Miami player had managed to do so from 2013-18. Williams appeared in all 10 games for which he was healthy in 2022, making seven starts and finishing with 31 tackles and a team-high two interceptions.
- Williams enjoyed a breakout year as an All-ACC Honorable Mention selection, headlining a secondary that included fellow first-year players **Kam Kinchens** and **Avantae Williams** in the safety rotation.
- Williams and **Leonard Taylor III** both signed with Miami in 2021 as five-star recruits, marking the first five-star pair to join the Hurricane in the same year since Duke Johnson and Tracy Howard in 2012.

**FORD'S SELECTION CONTINUES MIAMI'S NFL DRAFT STREAK - FOURTH-LONGEST**

- DL Jonathan Ford's selection by the Green Bay Packers on the final day of the 2022 NFL Draft continued Miami's streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975 – the fourth-longest streak in the country.
- 2022 marked the sixth straight year the NFL Draft featured at least one UM defensive ineman selected.
- A three-year starter for the Hurricanes, Ford saw action in 10 games and made eight starts in his final year 2021.
- Ford made 30 starts over his career. He ended up making the Packers 53-man roster despite being a 7th-round pick.

**ACC ANNOUNCES NEW MODEL; HURRICANES TO PLAY BC, FSU, UofL**

- The new ACC football scheduling model is based on a 3-5-5 structure whereby each team will play three primary opponents annually and face the other 10 league teams twice during the cycle. The schedule allows for each team to face all 13 conference opponents home and away at least once during the four-year cycle.
- The structure was adopted by the league's ADs and faculty reps and was announced prior to the 2022 season.
- The new schedule will eliminate the Atlantic and Coastal divisions with all 14 schools competing in one division beginning in 2023. The top two teams based on conference winning percentage will compete for the title.
- Miami's three permanent ACC crossover opponents will be Florida State, Boston College and Louisville.

- Miami took the lead early in the second half but could not hold on versus Duke last time out, dropping a game to the Blue Devils, 45-21. WR **Colbie Young** led Miami with 127 receiving yards - his second 100-yard game.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** was injured in the first half on a strip-sack. The reigning ACC Rookie of the Year, Van Dyke finished the game 11-for-16 for 81 yards with one touchdown before exiting due to injury.
- QB **Jake Garcia** saw the most significant time of his career in the defeat. He finished 13-for-21 for 198 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions. He threw a 71-yard touchdown pass in the loss.
- DB **DJ Ivey** led the Hurricanes with seven tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

**GAME 6: HURRICANES TOP HOKIES, 20-14, ON ROAD FOR FIRST ACC WIN**

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for 351 yards and two touchdowns, Miami outgained Virginia Tech, 458-257, and the Hurricanes left Lane Stadium victorious, 20-14, on Oct. 15 in Blacksburg, Va. WR **Colbie Young** enjoyed a career game for the Hurricanes in his first career start. He totaled a career-high nine catches and 110 yards with a TD.
- DL **Akheem Mesidor** led the Miami defense, finishing with a team-high eight tackles and 3.5 sacks.
- The Hurricanes totaled seven tackles for loss and six sacks; LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.** had two tackles for loss.
- P **Lou Hedley** was dominant on special teams, averaging 44.6 yards per punt with a long punt of 58.
- Hedley was named ACC Specialist of the Week, while Mesidor won weekly honors for defensive line.
- WR **Brashard Smith** had a career-high six catches totaling 76 yards; WR **Frank Ladson, Jr.**, had his first TD.

- TE **Will Mallory** had the first 100-yard game of his career, hauling in a career-high eight receptions for a career-best 115 yards. WR **Frank Ladson** (8) and RB **Henry Parrish** (7) also caught multiple passes.
- DB **Kam Kinchens** also picked off a pass, which doubled UNC QB Drake Maye's season interception total (1).

- Miami's defense was led by LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, who had a team-high eight tackles, and S **Kam Kinchens**, who had his second interception of the season. DE **Jahfari Harvey** had a pair of TFLs.

## HIGHSMITH NAMED GENERAL MANAGER OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

- The University of Miami hired longtime National Football League executive and Hurricanes great **Alonzo Highsmith** as general manager of football operations, it was announced on May 26, 2022.
- As general manager of football operations, Highsmith will work directly with Cristobal to support all administrative functions of the football program, including budget related items, culture building, program imaging, and working directly with staff members both on and off the field.
- Highsmith, a former first-round selection in the NFL Draft, also serves as a liaison between the administration and program, serve as a liaison between former players and assists with scouting.
- Highsmith, who played running back for the Hurricanes from 1983-1986, boasts 29 years' experience and 18 playoff appearances as an NFL player, scout and executive. He has spent the past 23 years in scouting and personnel, most recently serving as senior executive advisor to the GM for Seattle.
- Highsmith joined the Packers as a college scout in 1999 and spent 13 years on their college scouting staff. He was promoted to senior personnel executive in 2012 and remained in that role through the 2017 season. During his time there, the Packers made 13 trips to the playoffs and won Super Bowl XLV.

## RADAKOVICH SIGNS ON AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AT MIAMI

- One of the nation's most well-respected athletics administrators returned to the institution where nearly three decades ago he launched his career—the University of Miami. **Dan Radakovich**, who served as director of athletics at Clemson University for nine years, was named vice president and director of athletics on Dec. 9, 2021 - shortly after the hiring of head coach Mario Cristobal.
- Radakovich took the helm at Clemson in late 2012 and during his tenure, Clemson won 15 Atlantic Coast Conference team titles. The Tigers football program won two national championships, made six College Football Playoff appearances, and captured six ACC titles. In the classroom, Clemson student-athletes recorded nine semesters with a 3.0 GPA or higher. The athletic department attained the school's highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate at 93 percent in 2020.



# MARIO CRISTOBAL

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (11TH OVERALL) | 4-5 | 66-65

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future."

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
