- After capturing a thrilling 14-12 win over Virginia in four overtime periods on Oct. 29, the Hurricanes continue their first season under the direction of head coach Mario Cristobal on Sat., Nov. 5 vs. Florida State. Kickoff for the rivalry game, slated for broadcast on ABC, is set for 7:30 p.m. ET.
- The game will be broadcast on ABC with Joe Tessitore (pxp), Greg McElroy (color) and Katie George (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 21st season together. Josh Darrow manages sideline duties. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game live on Radio Actualidad from Hard Rock Stadium. WVUM 90.5 FM will also broadcast the game.

THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series with the Seminoles by a 35-31 margin, and have won four of the last five head-to-head games dating to 2017.
- In the Seminoles' last trip to Hard Rock Stadium in 2020, the Hurricanes, then ranked No. 12, emerged victorious, topping their in-state rival, 52-10.
- Florida State leads the all-time series in games played in Miami, 20-18, while Miami leads, 16-11, in games played in Tallahassee in the rivalry series.

THE HURRICANES

- . After capturing a 14-12 in 40T win last time out at Virginia, Miami looks to build second-half momentum in a rivalry game vs. Florida State on Nov. 5.
- . The Miami Hurricanes officially kicked off the Mario Cristobal era Sept. 3, when the Hurricanes topped Bethune-Cookman, 70-13, in their 2022 opener.
- WR Colbie Young became the sixth Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Week honors this year when he was recognized as ACC Receiver of the Week on Oct. 24. Young, who arrived from Lackawanna Junior College just before the season, has 23 catches, 317 yards and four TDs in his last four games.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon. During his time in Eugene, the Ducks were the only team to play in a Power-5 conference championship game each of his final three years. He led the Ducks to a Rose Bowl win and two Pac-12 titles.
- Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to have produced a top-10 pick in each of the last three drafts, joining only Alabama's Nick Saban.
- The first-year Miami head coach drew widespread acclaim for the staff he assembled, which includes reigning Broyles Award winner Josh Gattis as offensive coordinator, longtime coordinator and SEC veteran Kevin Steele as defensive coordinator and Charlie Strong as co-DC/linebackers coach
- QB Tyler Van Dyke entered his first full year as a starter with high expectations after earning ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors as a second-year freshman in 2021. Named to nearly every major offensive award preseason watch list, Van Dyke became the first quarterback since Joe Burrow (2019) to record a streak of six straight 300-yard passing games with three-or-more TDs in each of those games.
- TE Will Mallory (Mackey Award), James Williams (Bednarik Award), P Lou Hedley (Ray Guy Award), K Andy Borregales (Lou Groza Award), OL Zion Nelson (Outland) and DL Leonard Taylor (Bronko Nagurski Trophy) were also among those recognized with preseason watch list selections.
- In addition to a talented group of returners, the Hurricanes feature a 2022 recruiting class that finished ranked among the top 15 nationally by every scouting service and a group of newcomers through the transfer portal that includes DL Mitchell Agude (UCLA), DL Jacob Lichtenstein (USC). DL Akheem Mesidor (West Virginia), DL Darrell Jackson (Maryland), DL Antonio Moultrie (UAB), LB Caleb Johnson (UCLA), DB Daryl Porter, Jr. (West Virginia), OL Logan Sagapolu (Oregon), OL Jonathan Denis (Oregon) WR Frank Ladson, Jr. (Clemson) and RB Henry Parrish (Ole Miss).

QUICH HITS

MIAMI LOOKING FOR RIVALRY GAME WIN

- Following a 14-12 win over Virginia in a four-overtime game last time out in Charlottesville, Miami returns to Hard Rock Stadium for its penultimate home contest of the season on Nov. 5 vs. Florida State.
- The Hurricanes hold a 35-31 all-time series lead over Florida State, and have won four of the last five matchups in the series dating back to 2017.
- The rivalry is Miami's longest running consecutive series, with Saturday's matchup making it 54 straight seasons with at least one game between the two programs (dating to 1969).

GARCIA MAKES FIRST CAREER START IN WIN

- Last time out, Miami topped Virginia, 14-12, in a game that took four overtime periods to complete in Charlottesville, Va., on Oct. 29.
- Making the first start of his career, QB Jake Garcia scored on a rushing play during the fourth overtime, diving for the pylon to give Miami its first overtime win since a 36-33 decision over Nebraska on Sept. 19, 2015.
- . Miami's defense totaled 11 tackles for loss and five sacks in the win. DL Leonard Taylor III paced the Hurricanes defense with four tackles for loss and 15 sacks
- K Andy Borregales finished 4-for-4 on field goal attempts, with a long boot of 42 yards.

RADAKOVICH NAMED ATHLETICS DIRECTOR

- Not only were the Hurricanes bolstered by the return of Mario Cristobal, but Miami named longtime Clemson AD Dan Radakovich to the same post in December 2021.
- Radakovich, whose career spans more than 30 years, earned his MBA from the University of Miami in 1982 and worked in the school's business office from 1983 - 1985.
- . Prior to Clemson, Radakovich served as Georgia Tech's AD from 2006 to 2012, and before that, he was a Senior Associate AD at LSIT Radakovich earned his bachelor's degree from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in

HURRICANES MATCH UP WITH SEMINOLES IN ANNUAL RIVALRY SERIES

- Miami continues its first season under the direction of head coach Mario Cristobal on Nov. 5 with its second-to-last home game of the season - a rivalry showdown with Florida State at 7:30 PM on ABC.
- Last time out on Oct. 29, Miami emerged victorious with a 14-12 decision over homestanding Virginia Charlottesville, Va. It was UM's first win in overtime since a September 2015 decision over Nebraska.
- UM has an 35-31 all-time lead in its series with the Seminoles. The rivalry represents Miami's longest running series; the Hurricanes have played FSU every year since 1969, a stretch of 54 straight seasons.
- Cristobal was named the 26th head coach in the history of the program on December 6, 2021 after spending the previous four years at the helm of the Oregon Ducks. Cristobal is a two-time UM alum.
- When he departed Eugene, Cristobal was the only Power-5 head coach to lead his team to three straight conference championship games from 2019-2021. He won two Pac-12 titles, delivered a Rose Bowl to the Ducks and is one of just two active coaches to produce a top-10 pick three straight years.
- Miami has won four of the last five vs. FSU, including a 52-10 win in the Seminoles' last visit in 2020.
- UM's game against FSU is also slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM, Radio Actualidad & WVUM 90.5.

A LOOK BACK: MIAMI TOPS UVA IN CHARLOTTESVILLE, 14-12, IN 4 OT

- Points were at a premium in Miami's last road game, but the Hurricanes emerged victorious in the first-ever four-overtime game in UM history, a 14-12 decision over Virginia at Scott Stadium on Oct. 29.
- The Canes' previous longest game in history came on Sept. 17, 2003 a 3 OT, 36-30 win at Clemson.
- QB **Jake Garcia**, making the first start of his career in place of an injured QB **Tyler Van Dyke**, led the Hurricanes to victory with a diving score at the pylon in the fourth extra period to seal the victory.
- DL **Leonard Taylor III** delivered a dominant performance on defense, finishing with four tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. The Hurricanes totaled 11 tackles for loss and five sacks in the victory over Virginia.
- RB Henry Parrish, Jr., had his third 100-yard game of the year in the win, with 113 yards on 24 carries.
- One of Miami's biggest contributors was K Andy Borregales, who connected on all four field goal attempts - including two in overtime - to clinch the win. He connected from 38, 20, 42 and 37 yards.
- The Hurricanes had not played in an overtime game since 2019 a 28-21 loss to Georgia Tech at home.
 The team's last win in overtime came in 2015, a 36-33 win over Nebraska at Hard Rock Stadium.

DEFENSE PLAYING AT HIGH LEVEL UNDER STEELE'S DIRECTION IN 2022

- The Hurricanes are ranked No. 24 in FBS in rushing defense (113.5) and rank No. 3 in the ACC in the same category. Only 26 FBS teams average under 115 rush yards allowed per game, including Miami.
- In addition to its strong rushing defense numbers, Miami is ranked No. 13 in all of FBS in first downs allowed on defense (124), No. 5 in team sacks (3.62) and No. 14 in tackles for loss (7.20) so far in 2022.
- **Kevin Steele**, a previous finalist for the Broyles Award honoring the nation's top assistant coach, owns 38 years of coaching experience, including 13 in the SEC and 10 overall as a defensive coordinator.
- Among Miami's top performers on defense have been DL Akheem Mesidor and LB Corey Flagg, Jr.

MIAMI RANKED NO. 22 IN PASSING OFFENSE UNDER BROYLES WINNER

- The Hurricanes are ranked No. 22 in passing offense in FBS, averaging 290.4 yards per game under the direction of offensive coordinator **Josh Gattis**, who won the 2021 Broyles Award while at Michigan.
- The Hurricanes rank No. 31 in FBS in offense first downs gained (195), No. 45 in total offense (422.6 yards per game), No. 28 in time of possession (31:54) and No. 45 in third down percentage (.424).
- Miami's average of 290.4 passing yards per game is ranked third in the conference through nine weeks. The only two ACC schools above Miami are North Carolina (334.4) and Wake Forest (297.50).

CRISTOBAL ASSEMBLED SUPERSTAR STAFF HEADING INTO FIRST YEAR

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was Mario Cristobal's staff assembly in Coral Gables, where the Hurricanes added some familiar faces from South Florida to a staff with national ties.
- Cristobal pulled the reigning Broyles Award winner (top assistant coach) Josh Gattis from Michigan, where the OC helped lead the Wolverines to their first College Football Playoff appearance in 2021.
- Boasting over 40 years of experience including stints as defensive coordinator at Clemson, Auburn
 and LSU, Kevin Steele joined Cristobal's staff as DC. Longtime head coach Charlie Strong is Co-DC.
- Frank Ponce and Alex Mirabal, two Miami natives, moved back home to join Cristobal's staff as well.
- The impressive nature of Cristobal's staff build-out was not restricted to just full-time assistants; NFL
 Hall of Fame defensive end Jason Taylor is a quality control analyst, longtime NFL personnel director
 and UM alum Alonzo Highsmith was named General Manager of Football Operations.
- Between Taylor and senior football advisor Ed Reed, Miami has two Pro Football Hall of Fame members who combined for 15 Pro Bowl nods, 12 All-Pro picks and eight First Team All-Pro.

YOUNG BALLING OVER LAST FOUR GAMES, EMERGING FOR OFFENSE

- WR Colbie Young has emerged as one of Miami's qo-to playmakers on offense after seeing limited action; over just the last four games, Young has totaled 23 catches, 317 yards and four touchdowns.
- The talented Young had six catches for 127 yards and two touchdowns vs. Duke. He became the first UM receiver with a multi-TD game in 2022 and was recognized as ACC Receiver of the Week.
- In addition, Young's 71-yard scoring TD vs. Duke the longest play from scrimmage by a Cane in 2022.
- Before the Duke game, Young had nine grabs for 110 yards and a touchdown in the win at Virginia Tech. He became the first Miami player to post back-to-back games with 100-plus yards and at least one TD in back-to-back games since Mike Harley on 10/24/20 against Virginia and 11/6/20 at NC State.
- Prior to Young, the last Hurricane with consecutive 100-yard receiving outings was Charleston Rambo, who did so on 11/20/21 against Virginia Tech and 11/27/21 at Duke, the same two foes for Young.
- Young's 71-yard play was the longest by a Hurricane since an 83-yard catch by Cam'Ron Harris on 9/25/21 against Central Connecticut State. In addition, it was the longest by a Miami player versus an FBS foe since a 76-yard reception by Brevin Jordan on 12/12/20 against North Carolina.
- Young transferred in from Lackawanna College in Pennsylvania, the same school that produced All-American offensive lineman Bryant McKinnie. Young played high school football in Binghamton, N.Y.

TAYLOR NAMED ACC DL OF THE WEEK, HEADLINED DISRUPTIVE GAME

- Miami's defense posted 11 tackles for loss and five sacks in a dominant showing last time at Virginia.
- With 3.62 sacks per game, the Hurricanes rank fifth in the country and second in the ACC. The lone ACC team with a better mark is Louisville (3.62). Just 20 teams are putting up even 3.0 sacks per contest and seven at 3.5. Miami is racking up 7.2 tackles for loss per game, ranking No. 14 in all of FBS.
- DL Akheem Mesidor and DL Leonard Talyor III are tied for the team lead in tackles for loss (8.0).
- Taylor III had a dominant performance of his own last time out, totaling 4.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks in a 14-12 win at Virginia. It was only the sixth performance of at least 4.0 tackles for loss in a single game by a Miami Hurricane defender in the last seven seasons dating back to 2016.
- Taylor III, who goes by 'L.T.', is one of only four Power Five players—including the only one in the ACC—to post a game this season with at least 6 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 4.0 TFLs. He is among just three ACC players in the last two seasons with 6 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 4.0 TFLs in a single game, joining Florida State's Jermaine Johnson II (11/13/21) and Georgia Tech's Charlie Thomas (9/25/21)

PARRISH RECORDS CAREER-HIGH 113 YARDS LAST TIME OUT VS. CAVS

- Henry Parrish, Jr., recorded the third 100-yard game of his Miami career last time out at Virginia, rushing for a career-high 113 yards on a career-high 24 carries in the team's 14-12 in 4 OTs.
- Parrish previous career high for yards was 111, set in 2021 vs. Arkansas when he was at Ole Miss.
- His performance a Virginia was just the 13th occurrence this season of an ACC player running for 110-plus yards in a game against a Power Five foe, including just the seventh such game on a road. He became the second player to rush for 100-plus yards against UVA, alongside Illinois' Chase Brown.
- This was just the sixth time since the turn of the century (2000-present) a Miami Hurricane has hit 85 yards in each of the first three games of a season, as Parrish joined DeeJay Dallas (2019), Mark Walton (2016), Duke Johnson (2014), Lamar Miller (2011) and Frank Gore (2003) to accomplish the feat.
- Parrish who returned home to Miami after spending the first two years of his career at Ole Miss, rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns on just 14 carries in the opener vs. Bethune-Cookman. The 108 yards marked the second-highest total of his career, while the three scores set a new mark.
- Parrish bested himself against Southern Miss, rushing for 109 yards with one touchdown in a 30-7 win on Sept. 10. Outside of Parrish, no other Miami player this century (2000-pres.) has opened his career as a Hurricane by rushing for 100-plus yards in the team's opening two games of a season
- In his two years with the Rebels, the Miami native totaled more than 1,000 all-purpose yards. He was a four-star prospect who rushed for more than 4,600 yards in an illustrious high school career.
- When he decided to transfer to Miami, Parrish reunited with running backs coach **Kevin Smith**.

VAN DYKE INJURED VERSUS DUKE, MISSED FIRST START AT VIRGINIA

- Named to nearly every offensive award major preseason watch list, QB Tyler Van Dyke entered 2022 poised for another big season after putting together an ACC Rookie of the Year campaign in 2021.
- Van Dyke became the third Miami Hurricane to win both ACC Rookie of the Year and ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors, joining Hurricanes QB Brad Kaaya (2014) and RB Duke Johnson (2012).
- The Glastonbury, Conn., native was injured in a home game versus Duke, exiting with an upper body
 injury. He did not start Miami's last game at Virginia, ending a streak of 16 straight starts for Miami.
- Van Dyke took over starting duties three games into the season and ended the year by throwing for 2,931 yards, 25 passing touchdowns and just six interceptions. He completed 62.3 percent of passes.

BROTHERLY LOVE: BORREGALES CARRYING ON LEGACY, IS ACC POW

- A year after his older brother Jose became the first Lou Groza Award winner in program history,
 Andres "Andy" Borregales earned starting placekicker responsibilities as a true freshman in 2021.
- Andy went on to earn All-ACC Honorable Mention honors in a 2021 season where he connected on 17-of-21 field goal attempts and 45-of-45 extra point attempts. He was 5-6 of kicks longer than 40.
- Borregales has been impressive again in 2022. He is 14-17 on field goal attempts and 25-25 on PATs.
- Borregales became the eighth ACC kicker in the last two years to make four-plus field goals in a game without a miss last time out at Virignia; all four of his kicks came with 0:00 on the clock in the victory.
- A Miami native, Borregales places No. 28 overall and fourth in the ACC with 1.43 field goals per game.
- The younger Borregales nailed a 55-yard kick in 2021 that was the longest ever by a UM freshman.
- Jose was Miami's first consensus All-America since 2004 in his lone season at The U, passing #30 on.

A RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE, HEDLEY HONORED BY ACC AFTER VT

- A 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and 2022 Preseason First Team All-ACC, Lou Hedley had an excellent first half of 2022 and was recognized with ACC Specialist of the Week honors on October 17.
- Through eight games, Hedley has Miami No. 11 in the nation in net punting at 42.00 yards per attempt
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder is averaging 43.3 yards per punt. He has three punts of 50 yards or more and has landed 15 punts inside the opponents' 20-yard line this season with only two touchbacks.
- A sixth-year redshirt senior, Hedley was a 2020 Ray Guy Award finalist and a 2021 semifinalist. In the
 former year, he was also an Associated Press Second Team All-American. He was named a semifinalist
 for the 2022 William V. Campbell Trophy honoring the sport's top scholar athlete in late September.
- The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder from Mandurah, Australia, Hedley is a two-time Second Team All-ACC.

MESIDOR AMONG FBS LEADERS IN TACKLES FOR LOSS IN YEAR 1 AT UM

- After a dominant performance versus Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium on Oct. 15 that saw him total a teamhigh eight tackles and a career-best 3.5 sacks, DL **Akheem Mesidor** was named Walter Camp National Defensive Player of the Week and ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week on Oct. 17.
- Mesidor ranks No. 34 in the nation and No. 3 in ACC with an average of 0.71 sacks per game in 2022 (5.0).
- Mesidor became just the third ACC player over the last three seasons to record at least 3.5 sacks in a single game, including the first since Virginia's Charles Snowden on 10/31/20 against North Carolina.
- Before Mesidor, the last ACC player to notch at least 3.5 sacks in a road game was also a Hurricane, as eventual first-round pick **Gregory Rousseau** tallied 4.0 on 11/2/19 in a victory at Florida State.
- Mesidor registered six tackles and two TFLs last time out vs. Duke. The prior week, he had eight tackles and 3.5 TFLs in the win at Virginia Tech. He is the 10th Hurricane in the last decade (2013-present) to log multiple games with six-plus tackles and multiple TFLs in the same season. He joined:

- Mesidor and Georgia Tech's Aydine Eley (9/10/22 versus Western Carolina and 9/17/22 versus Ole Miss) are the only players in the ACC with back-to-back six-tackle, two-TFL performances this season.
- Mesidor transferred to UM after totaling 70 tackles, 14.5 TFLs & 9.5 sacks in two years at West Virginia.

MALLORY CLOSING IN ON TIGHT END U RECORDS IN FINAL SEASON AT UM

- After the announcement of Mario Cristobal's appointment as head coach at The U, a number of studentathletes elected to return for their final year of eligibility rather than train for the NFL Draft.
- One of Miami's most important returnees was TE **Will Mallory**, who was among Miami's top offensive performers a season ago. Mallory set career marks in catches (30), yards (347), starts (12) and longest reception (57) last year, while also matching his career mark for touchdowns in a season (four).
- The Mackey Award candidate had his best game yet in UM's game vs. North Carolina: a career-high eight catches for a career-high 115 yards. The performance marked his first 100-yard game for UM.
- The veteran tight end, named to the Mackey Award honoring the nation's top performer at the position, leads the Hurricanes in both receptions (28) and yards (371) and has started all eight games in 2022.
- Mallory needs 22 receptions, 398 yards and two touchdowns to set the Miami records for a tight end.
- The Jacksonville native's accomplishments are even more impressive given the history of tight ends at Miami, an alumni group that includes Jeremy Shockey, Greg Olsen, Bubba Franks and Jimmy Graham.

RESTREPO ENJOYED FAST START, RETURNED LAST TIME OUT AT UVA

- WR **Xavier Restrepo** returned to action last time out at Virginia after missing five straight games due to a leg injury. Restrepo turned in the finest game of his Miami career in the opener, catching all five balls thrown his way to finish with 100 yards and a touchdown. It was the first 100-yard game of his career.
- Before suffering an injury prior to Miami's game against Texas A&M, Xavier Restrepo was off to a fast start to begin 2022. The third-year sophomore wide receiver was averaging 86.0 yards per game, which was good for the fourth-best mark in the ACC. Only eight players in the league had 60-plus yards per contest. At the time of his injury, Restrepo was also tied for fourth in ACC with 11 catches.
- Restrepo totaled 24 catches for 373 yards and two touchdowns as a second-year freshman in 2021.

TVD MAKING IMPACT ON MIAMI, ACC RECORD BOOKS AS STARTING QB

After throwing for 496 yards against North Carolina, Tyler Van Dyke amassed 351 at Virginia Tech. This is
the ninth time in program history a Miami quarterback has compiled 350 yards in back-to-back games
and Van Dyke is the first Hurricane to achieve the feat three times.

- Van Dyke's eight 300-yard games against ACC foes are already good for a program record, eclipsing
 the mark of seven previously co-held by Stephen Morris (24 ACC appearances) and Bad Kaaya (23 ACC
 appearances). The previous longest streak of consecutive 300-yard passing games in ACC play was
 three by Morris (11/24/12 at Duke, 10/5/13 vs. Georgia Tech and 10/17/13 at North Carolina).
- Since the turn of the century (2000-present), Van Dyke is the only ACC quarterback with eight
 consecutive 300-yard passing games in league play. In fact, only 14 quarterbacks have even eight total
 300-yard passing gams in ACC action during that stretch. Of those 14, the longest streak of consecutive
 300-yard games is five by Kenny Pickett.

- WR **Key'Shawn Smith** is second in the nation in kickoff return average with a 30.5-yard mark. The lone player ahead of him is Indiana's Jaylin Lucas (30.9); he ranks first in the ACC in the category.
- Smith and Lucas are the only two players in the nation averaging at least 30 yards per attempt.
- Miami is first in the country in kickoff return average, with 29.73 yards per attempt.

IVEY HAD STANDOUT GAME VS. DUKE, IS UM'S LEADER IN STARTS ON D

- DB **DJ Ivey** posted a team-high seven tackles versus Duke, as well as added a forced fumble and a
 fumble recovery. He is just the fifth Hurricane in the last 14 years (2009-present) to force and recover
 a fumble, while posting seven-plus tackles.

 - Zach McCloud on 9/19/20 at Louisville

FLAGG IMPRESSING IN 2ND YEAR STARTING AT MIDDLE LINEBACKER

- Corey Flagg, Jr., had seven tackles, three TFLs and 0.5 sacks against UNC. He was the first Hurricane to reach each of those figures since 11/14/20 when Jaelan Phillips did so at Virginia Tech.
 The only other Cane to do so over the last three years was Quincy Roche on 10/17/20 vs. Pitt.
- The third-year player had a breakout 2021, starting all 12 games and leading UM with 60 total tackles.

MIAMI BACK AT WORLD-CLASS HARD ROCK STADIUM FOR YEAR 15

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 15th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 3 vs.
 Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a 15-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 689-119 for an average margin of victory of 38.0 points in those 15 home openers.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 15 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 18 times and is 16-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 32-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

MIAMI BOASTS TALENTED RUNNING GAME, RUSHED FOR 305 IN GAME 1

- RB Henry Parrish, Jr., and RB Jaylan Knighton were listed as co-starters for Miami's season opener.
- Though Knighton missed the game with a soft tissue injury, the Hurricanes managed to total 305 yards on the ground and scored seven rushing touchdowns in a dominant 70-13 win on Sept. 3.
- After a season-ending leg injury to Miami's starting running back in 2021, Knighton assumed the starting responsibility and delivered a strong first season as a primary running back.
- He was nicknamed 'Rooster' by former Pop Warner football coach named Dave Williams for his reddish hair in a mohawk style as a kid, Knighton was a consensus four-star prospect in high school.
- Miami ranks first in the ACC in scoring defense (10.0) and second in the league in scoring offense (50.0). Miami is also second in total offensive average (515.5) and third in off. yards per play (7.21).

IT STARTS IN THE TRENCHES - WHERE UM HAS LOADS OF EXPERIENCE

- One of Mario Cristobal's focal points has been in building Miami's depth and ability in the trenches, and the Hurricanes return and add a number of key players at the line of scrimmage for 2022.
- Miami has three players who each have more than 30 starts on the offensive line: Zion Nelson (32 career starts), Jakai Clark (37) and DJ Scaife (48). In addition, the Hurricanes return several other played who have started, including Justice Oluwaseun, Jalen Rivers and John Campbell.
- Campbell has started all eight games this season at left tackle, as has Rivers at left guard. Scaife, who leads all active Hurricanes in career starts, has started all eight games at right tackle in his final year.
- On the defensive line, some of Miami's most experienced players arrive via the transfer portal, including All-Big 12 defensive lineman Akheem Mesidor (West Virginia), defensive end Mitchell Agude (UCLA), second-year defensive tackle Darrell Jackson (Maryland), south Florida native and longtime USC defensive lineman Jacob Lichtenstein and defensive lineman Antonio Moultrie (UAB).
- Jackson has started all eight games this season on the interior defensive line for the Hurricanes.

JAMES WILLIAMS CONTINUING ASCENT, MISSED VIRGINIA GAME DUE TO INJURY

- A former five-star recruit who made his presence felt in 2021, second-year safety James Williams was named to the
 watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award honoring the nation's top defensive player prior to his sophomore year.
- The second-year standout ranks second on Miami with 32 total tackles and has started seven of eight games.
- Williams continued his ascent into one of the nation's premier defensive backs against Texas A&M in College Station.

 He totaled a team-high seven tackles, including six solo, and defended two passes. He missed his first game vs. UVA.
- Williams became the fourth Hurricane—fifth occurrence—in the last 10 seasons, including the second on the road, to notch seven takedowns and two breakups in the same game, joining Kamren Kinchens (11/6/21 vs. Georgia Tech), Te'Cory Couch (9/20/21 vs. Virginia and 12/20/20 vs. Oklahoma State) and Shaquille Quarterman (10/26/19 at Pittsburgh); no Miami player had managed to do so from 2013-18. Williams appeared in all 10 games for which he was healthy in 2022, making seven starts and finishing with 31 tackles and a team-high two interceptions.
- Williams enjoyed a breakout year as an All-ACC Honorable Mention selection, headlining a secondary that included fellow first-year players Kam Kinchens and Avantae Williams in the safety rotation.
- Williams and **Leonard Taylor III** both signed with Miami in 2021 as five-star recruits, marking the first five-star pair to join the Hurricane in the same year since Duke Johnson and Tracy Howard in 2012.

FORD'S SELECTION CONTINUES MIAMI'S NFL DRAFT STREAK - FOURTH-LONGEST

- DL Jonathan Ford's selection by the Green Bay Packers on the final day of the 2022 NFL Draft continued Miami's streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975 – the fourth-longest streak in the country.
- 2022 marked the sixth straight year the NFL Draft featured at least one UM defensive ineman selected.
- A three-year starter for the Hurricanes, Ford saw action in 10 games and made eight starts in his final year 2021.
- Ford made 30 starts over his career. He ended up making the Packers 53-man roster despite being a 7th-round pick.

ACC ANNOUNCES NEW MODEL; HURRICANES TO PLAY BC, FSU, UofL

- The new ACC football scheduling model is based on a 3-5-5 structure whereby each team will play three primary opponents annually and face the other 10 league teams twice during the cycle. The schedule allows for each team to face all 13 conference opponents home and away at least once during the four-year cycle.
- The structure was adopted by the league's ADs and faculty reps and was announced prior to the 2022 season.
- The new schedule will eliminate the Atlantic and Coastal divisions with all 14 schools competing in one division beginning in 2023. The top two teams based on conference winning percentage will compete for the title.
- Miami's three permanent ACC crossover opponents will be Florida State, Boston College and Louisville.

SEASON BREAKDOWN: A LOOK BACK AT FIRST SEVEN GAMES OF 2022

GAME 7: YOUNG IMPRESSES AGAIN, MIAMI FALLS SHORT TO BLUE DEVILS

- Miami took the lead early in the second half but could not hold on versus Duke last time out, dropping a game to the Blue Devils, 45-21. WR **Colbie Young** led Miami with 127 receiving yards his second 100-yard game.
- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** was injured in the first half on a strip-sack. The reigning ACC Rookie of the Year, Van Dyke finished the game 11-for-16 for 81 yards with one touchdown before exiting due to injury.
- QB **Jake Garcia** saw the most significant time of his career in the defeat. He finished 13-for-21 for 198 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions. He threw a 71-yard touchdown pass in the loss.
- DB **DJ Ivey** led the Hurricanes with seven tackles, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

GAME 6: HURRICANES TOP HOKIES, 20-14, ON ROAD FOR FIRST ACC WIN

- QB Tyler Van Dyke threw for 351 yards and two touchdowns, Miami outgained Virginia Tech, 458-257, and the
 Hurricanes left Lane Stadium victorious, 20-14, on Oct. 15 in Blacksburg, Va. WR Colbie Young enjoyed a career
 game for the Hurricanes in his first career start. He totaled a career-high nine catches and 110 yards with a TD.
- DL Akheem Mesidor led the Miami defense, finishing with a team-high eight tackles and 3.5 sacks.
- The Hurricanes totaled seven tackles for loss and six sacks; LB Corey Flagg, Jr. had two tackles for loss.
- P Lou Hedley was dominant on special teams, averaging 44.6 yards per punt with a long punt of 58.
- · Hedley was named ACC Specialist of the Week, while Mesidor won weekly honors for defensive line.
- WR Brashard Smith had a career-high six catches totaling 76 yards; WR Frank Ladson, Jr., had his first TD.

GAME 5: CANES FALL TO TAR HEELS DESPITE VAN DYKE'S RECORD DAY

- QB **Tyler Van Dyke** threw for the second-most yards in Hurricanes history, but it wasn't enough in a 27-24 loss.
- Van Dyke, who was named ACC Quarterback of the Week for his performance against UNC, threw for 496 yards and three touchdowns. He set the Miami record for completions in a game (42) in the loss at home.
- Van Dyke's 496 yards were the most by any player against an FBS opponent in 2022 and 125 more than any ACC quarterback has amassed. It was tied for the 14th-most yards ever by an ACC quarterback.
- TE **Will Mallory** had the first 100-yard game of his career, hauling in a career-high eight receptions for a career-best 115 yards. WR **Frank Ladson** (8) and RB **Henry Parrish** (7) also caught multiple passes.
- DB Kam Kinchens also picked off a pass, which doubled UNC QB Drake Maye's season interception total (1).

GAME 4: MIAMI DROPS NONCONFERENCE FINALE TO MTSU ON SEPT. 24

- The Hurricanes fell in their final nonconference game of 2022, dropping a matchup with the visiting Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders, 45-31, at Hard Rock Stadium. UM had a bye week following the game.
- RB **Henry Parrish**, **Jr.** led the Canes on the ground with 57 rushing yards on 14 carries (4.1 average).
- WR Frank Ladson had a team-high six grabs for 65 yards his most at UM including a 16-yard catch.
- QB Jake Garcia had 169 yards. QB Tyler Van Dyke started and threw for 138 with one touchdown.
- Miami's defense was led by LB Corey Flagg, Jr., who had a team-high eight tackles, and S Kam Kinchens, who
 had his second interception of the season. DE Jahfari Harvey had a pair of TFLs.

GAME 3: MIAMI FALLS TO A&M IN CLOSE TOP-25 SHOWDOWN, 17-9

- The Hurricanes fell in their first road test of 2022, dropping a game with top-25 Texas A&M, 17-9, on the road.
- The Hurricanes held Texas A&M to just 16 first downs and 124 rushing yards and outgained the Aggies 392-264.
- Miami had 27 first downs (compared to 16 for Texas A&M) and 217 yards passing (140 for Texas A&M).
- Miami's defense totaled six tackles for loss and three sacks on defense, including one each from DL Darrell
 Jackson and DL Jahfari Harvey. DB James Williams led the defense with seven tackles.

GAME 2: MIAMI TOPPLES SOUTHERN MISS, 30-7, TO MOVE TO 2-0

- A week after rolling to a 70-13 win in its season opener against Bethune-Cookman, Miami improved to 2-0.
- Making the 11th start of his career, QB Tyler Van Dyke completed 20 of 29 passes for 261 yards with one
 touchdown and one interception. Miami improved to 8-3 in games started by TVD all-time with the 30-7 win..
- Miami held Southern Miss to just seven points in the victory. It marked the first time Miami has conceded single-digit points in a game since 9/25/21 versus Central Connecticut State (zero).

GAME 1: MIAMI DOMINATES WILDCATS, 70-13, IN SEASON OPENER

- The Hurricanes improved to 6-0 all-time against Bethune-Cookman in its season opener on Sept. 3.
- Miami amassed all but 15 possible offensive yards against the Wildcats in its 70-13 win at Hard Rock Stadium. It scored a touchdown on nine of its 11 drives, while another one ended at the opposing six-yard-line.
- The Hurricanes logged three interceptions in the win, with one each by Gilbert Frierson, Kamren Kinchens and James Williams. It marked the second time in the last four years Miami had three interceptions.

HIGHSMITH NAMED GENERAL MANAGER OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

- The University of Miami hired longtime National Football League executive and Hurricanes great **Alonzo Highsmith** as general manager of football operations, it was announced on May 26, 2022.
- As general manager of football operations, Highsmith will work directly with Cristobal to support all
 administrative functions of the football program, including budget related items, culture building,
 program imaging, and working directly with staff members both on and off the field.
- Highsmith, a former first-round selection in the NFL Draft, also serves as a liaison between the
 administration and program, serve as a liaison between former players and assists with scouting.
- Highsmith, who played running back for the Hurricanes from 1983-1986, boasts 29 years' experience
 and 18 playoff appearances as an NFL player, scout and executive. He has spent the past 23 years
 in scouting and personnel, most recently serving as senior executive advisor to the GM for Seattle.
- Highsmith joined the Packers as a college scout in 1999 and spent 13 years on their college scouting staff. He was promoted to senior personnel executive in 2012 and remained in that role through the 2017 season. During his time there, the Packers made 13 trips to the playoffs and won Super Bowl XLV.

RADAKOVICH SIGNS ON AS DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS AT MIAMI

- One of the nation's most well-respected athletics administrators returned to the institution where nearly
 three decades ago he launched his career—the University of Miami. Dan Radakovich, who served as
 director of athletics at Clemson University for nine years, was named vice president and director of
 athletics on Dec. 9, 2021 shortly after the hiring of head coach Mario Cristobal.
- Radakovich took the helm at Clemson in late 2012 and during his tenure, Clemson won 15 Atlantic Coast
 Conference team titles. The Tigers football program won two national championships, made six College
 Football Playoff appearances, and captured six ACC titles. In the classroom, Clemson student-athletes
 recorded nine semesters with a 3.0 GPA or higher. The athletic department attained the school's
 highest-ever NCAA Graduation Success Rate at 93 percent in 2020.

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (11TH OVERALL) | 4-4 | 66-64

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future.

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992.
