### GAME PREVIEW

Rutgers men's basketball hits the road for the Big Ten / ACC Challenge. The Scarlet Knights (5-1) head south to face the 6-1 Miami Hurricanes, who are receiving votes in the AP Poll. The matchup begins a challenging five-game stretch, with consecutive games at Miami, vs. Indiana, at Ohio State, vs. Seton Hall and vs. Wake Forest over a span of three weeks.

### LAST TIME OUT

RU moved to 23-1 in the past three seasons in non-conference games with an 83-49 victory over Central Connecticut State on Saturday at Jersey Mike's Arena. Rutgers as a team shot a red-hot 61.5 percent in the first half. The team shot 44.4 percent from long range and racked up 19 team assists. The perimeter defense continued to be a strength as the Scarlet Knights limited CCSU to 3-of-27 from long range.

Senior wing Caleb McConnell returned to action after being sidelined for six weeks due to a knee injury and his presence was felt immediately. McConnell made his first shot attempt from the field in the first half. McConnell finished with four points, four rebounds, three assists, and a block.

### THE MIAMI MATCHUP

The contest signals the 17th meeting between the Scarlet Knights and Hurricanes on the collegiate hardwood dating back to 1989 with UM holding a 10-6 advantage. This will be the third time that RU travels down to Miami for a Big Ten/ACC Challenge matchup with UM since 2016. In the last meeting, RU earned a 57-54 win in the Challenge at the Watsco Center in 2018, led by 16 points from Geo Baker and holding the Hurricanes to 34 percent shooting. RU and Miami were also conference rivals in the BIG EAST. The squads met annually from 1996 to 2004.

Miami enters the contest at 6-1, with its loss coming to Big Ten foe Maryland, and a best win over Providence. The team is buoyed by Isaiah Wong at 14.3 points per game. Norchad Omier follows him at 14.0 points per game, and is fourth nationally at 4.33 offensive rebounds per game and 10th with three double-doubles. Nijel Pack, a preseason member of the Naismith Trophy and Wooden Award Watch Lists alongside Wong, has averaged 13.0 points per game.

### BIG TEN - ACC CHALLENGE

RU is 4-4 all-time in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge, having won two straight games in the Challenge, downing Clemson (2021) and Syracuse (2020) in home games. RU has claimed victories in the Challenge in road games at Miami (2018) and Clemson (2014).

The Big Ten has won three straight Big Ten / ACC Challenges. All-time, the ACC holds a 13-10-3 mark in the event.

### RU'S DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

Junior guard Cam Spencer has 22 steals through six contests. He currently is second in the nation with 3.67 steals per game and fourth overall in total steals, just two behind the NCAA's leader.

Rutgers is fifth in the country in steals-per-game (11.8) and leads Big Ten teams in total steals (71). RU is first in the country in three-point defense percentage (18.0 percent). The Scarlet Knights are seventh in the country in field goal percentage defense (34.1 percent). Rutgers is 8th in the country in scoring defense (52.8) and 12th in scoring margin (+24.0). Rutgers is tied for eighth in the country in turnover margin (+8) and 15th in turnovers forced (19.5).

Per Ken Pom, RU is also third in the nation in effective field goal percentage (37.7%), fifth in steal percentage (16.5%), is ninth in turnover percentage (27.4%) and is 11th in adjusted defensive efficiency (88.8).

### CLIFFORD OMORUYI, DUNK KING

Junior center Clifford Omoruyi has continued his success from last season being one of the nation's top dunkers. He led the country in dunks heading into the NCAA Tournament last season and is off to another hot start in 22-23. Omoruyi has 17 dunks in six games thus far (2.83 per-game). That is good for fifth-best in the country.

### STANDOUT STATS

Junior center Clifford Omoruyi is leading RU with 10.0 rebounds, one of just 17 players in the country to be averaging double-digit rebounds. He is one of just 12 players nationally to already post three double-doubles.

Omoruyi has scored 17.3 points-per-game and has been a force to be reckoned with in the paint thus far. Omoruyi is shooting 50.6 percent from the field.

"He's really grown and now he's understanding how teams are playing him," Pikiell said. "He can now beat you from outside the paint and teams have to step out and guard him there. His development is going to be huge for us."

Junior transfer Cam Spencer has been just as advertised on the offensive side of the floor. The Davidsonville, Md. Native is leading the team with 17.3 points-per-game and 3.83 assists. Spencer is shooting 95.5 percent from the free throw line, fifth best nationally and the best mark thus far of any Big Ten player. Spencer is shooting 53.1 percent from the field. He also leads the team thus far with 33.3 minutes-

per-game. He has 22 steals in the first six games of the season.

Senior forward Aundre Hyatt has been a huge contributor on the offensive side of the ball averaging 11.3 points. He's averaging 5.0 rebounds in 27.5 minutes thus far. After entering the year with just 4 career double-figure scoring games, he scored in double figures in the first four games of the season.

### OBSTACLES

Senior point guard Paul Mulcahy (shoulder) exited the game against UMass Lowell in the first half and didn't return and did not play in the next three games. Senior guard Caleb McConnell (knee) missed the first five games this season, returning versus CCSU.

### PIKIELL MILESTONES

Pikiell became the sixth coach in Rutgers history to notch 100 wins when the Scarlet Knights defeated Sacred Heart. Pikiell is just the sixth coach in Rutgers history to reach 100 wins as the helm of the Scarlet Knights (Tom Young: 239 wins, Frank Hill: 223 wins, Bob Wenzel: 128 wins, Bill Foster: 120 wins, Donald White: 105 wins). He is now 103-92 in his career at Rutgers. Another win milestone is approaching as he is five wins away from 300 in his career. Pikiell currently sits at 295-248 in his career.

### SEASON TICKET RECORD

The Rutgers men's basketball home slate is officially sold out of season tickets entering the 2022-23 season at Jersey Mike's Arena. For the second consecutive season, RU has broken the season ticket sales record with a total 5,925 season tickets sold for the 2022

### TEAM CAPTAINS

Head coach Steve Pikiell announced that the three returning starters, Paul Mulcahy, Cliff Omoruyi, and Caleb McConnell are the team's three captains for this season.

### SEASON TICKET RECORD

The Rutgers men's basketball home slate is officially sold out of season tickets entering the 2022-23 season at Jersey Mike's Arena. For the second consecutive season, RU has broken the season ticket sales record with a total 5,925 season tickets sold for the 2022-23 home schedule. The previous record of 5,297 season tickets sold was set last season, according to the Rutgers ticket office. The previous high before for the 2021-22 season was 3,239 season tickets sold in the 2011-12 seasons.

Since the hiring of head men's basketball coach Steve Pikiell, RU has seen a positive increase in season tickets sold in every one of the seven seasons he's been at the helm. In total, there has been a 135 percent increase in season ticket sales since 2016-17 season.

### MCCONNELL AND OMORUYI WATCH LISTS

Rutgers men's basketball's Caleb McConnell has been chosen as a member of the watch list for the Julius Erving Award, given to the best small forward in the country. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced the top 20 watch list members for the 2023 Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award last week. The six-foot-seven wing averaged 7.1 points-per-game, 5.3 rebounds, 2.2 steals, and 2.1 assists last season. His steals-per-game and 70 total steals led the Big Ten conference and was also good for 19th in the nation

Omoruyi has been chosen as a member of the watch list for the 2023 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award, given to the best center in the country. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced the top 20 watch list members for the 2023 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award Center Forward of the Year Award.

Omoruyi was one of the most improved players on the 2021-22 roster last season. The seven-foot center entered the NCAA Tournament last season leading the country in dunks. Omoruyi averaged career-highs in points (11.9) and rebounds (8.2) last season. Omoruyi was selected to the 2022-23 All-Big Ten Preseason Team earlier this month. Omoruyi's ascension to one of the best centers in the Big Ten was outstanding as a sophomore. In half the minutes played during his freshman year he averaged 3.8 points-per-game and four rebounds.

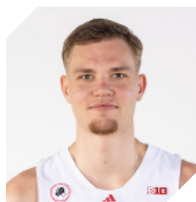

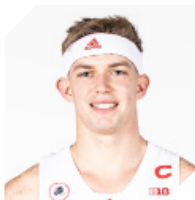

  - Led Big Ten in steals with career-high 70 last season.
  - In first four seasons at Rutgers, saw action in 114 games with 60 starts.

**TALKING RUTGERS BASKETBALL:  
PRESEASON NOTABLES**

- Rutgers basketball is returning the second-most minutes of any team in the Big Ten Conference at 63.5 percent.
- In 2021-22, the Scarlet Knights made the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back years for the first time since 1975-76.
- The Scarlet Knights achieved their third-consecutive winning season in 2021-22, a feat that had not been accomplished in over 30 years.
- Rutgers had four-straight wins over ranked opponents (Michigan St., Ohio State, Wisconsin, Illinois), the first time an unranked team had done so in all of college basketball history.
- Twelve wins for a fourth-place finish in the Big Ten Conference is the most wins and the highest place in the standings for Rutgers since joining the league.

with 93 dunks on the season and was leading the nation before the NCAA Tournament.

- Incoming junior transfer from Loyola Maryland Cam Spencer led the Patriot league with 18.9 points-per-game last season and brings a new flow to the RU offense as he shot 39 percent from three-point range last season.
- Dean Reiber, Aundre Hyatt, Mawot Mag and Oskar Palmquist all return to the roster this season with 34.3 minutes-per-game being left by Ron Harper Jr. at the small forward position.

## Rutgers Men's Basketball Welcomes 2nd-Highest Recruit in History Gavin Griffiths

Ten days after his official visit to Rutgers on May 7, Gavin Griffiths went back to campus for a surprise visit. He had decided he wanted to verbally commit to Rutgers, but he knew that it was something that he couldn't just do over the phone. "The coaching staff was just such a big part of my decision," Griffiths said, of his verbal commitment. "I think it says a lot about my decision to pick Rutgers that I really wanted to do that. Once I decided, I just knew I had to tell them in person."

The six-foot-eight, 195-pound player from Simsbury, Conn. native up to the RWJ Barnabas Health Athletic Performance Center with his family alongside him. Griffiths walked straight into the men's basketball floor and headed towards head coach Steve Pikiell's office. He told Pikiell, his fellow Connecticut native that he wanted to start his college career as a Scarlet Knight in 2023-24. "It was just one of those experiences that you remember forever," Griffiths said. "The pressure was lifted off, and I could say I finally did it. I'm here at Rutgers. It was just a great experience for me and my family."

Griffiths, from the Kingswood-Oxford High School in West Hartford, Conn., is ranked the No. 36 recruit in the country (247 Sports), marking the highest-ranked player landed in the Steve Pikiell-era and the second-highest recruit to attend RU in the modern era. Only former Rutgers guard Mike Rosario was ranked higher at the time of his recruitment (2008). Griffiths is also ranked No. 1 in the state of Connecticut. Griffiths officially signed his National Letter of Intent at Kingswood-Oxford High School during a press conference in front of a large crowd on Wednesday afternoon.

"We are so excited to welcome Gavin Griffiths into the Scarlet Knight family," Pikiell said. "Gavin is truly one of the most exciting players in the whole country out of Connecticut. He's a high-flyer with an ability to shoot the basketball at the highest level. His IQ on the floor is tremendous as well as his work ethic. From the first time I saw Gavin on the floor I loved his enthusiasm. Gavin is another great, hardworking basketball player from an unbelievable family. We are all looking forward to the bright future he will have at Rutgers."

"I'm super excited to join the Rutgers men's basketball family and it really means a lot to me," Griffiths said. "To be a part of a team that's as good as Rutgers means everything and I just can't wait to get started."

Gavin is one of four siblings. He has an older brother (Riley), older sister (Nora) and a younger brother (Declan). Gavin's three siblings all play competitive basketball as well. His father Larry was a two-time all-state high school center in Connecticut in the 1980s, played at the University of Hartford and played professionally overseas. His mom Karen joined him on many of his visits and trips to Rutgers games through the recruiting process.

Griffiths is ranked No. 30 in the country by Rivals, No. 36 by ESPN, and No. 39 by ON3 in the country. Griffiths has been competing with the AAU program Expressions Elite in the Nike EYBL league against some of the top talent in the country over the past few seasons. Griffiths proved himself to be one of the best perimeter shooters in all the Nike EYBL. Griffiths missed the first two sessions of the league with a facial injury but finished off strong against the nation's top talent.

"It's really cool to have that title, but at the end of the day it doesn't mean anything," Griffiths said. "Until I perform at Jersey Mike's Arena, it doesn't mean anything. It is very cool to have that title though and I do appreciate everyone that says that."

Following his celebration with Pikiell, athletic director Pat Hobbs and the men's basketball staff, Griffiths publicly announced his plans to join the Scarlet Knights with a post that said "Committed" on his social media platforms on June 2.

"It was actually a pretty easy decision for me once I took my tour and once, I went to Jersey Mike's Arena to watch a game," Griffiths said. "I have been to a lot of games and just to see the atmosphere at Jersey Mike's Arena, it was the best I've seen."

"I saw how nice the campus was, I toured that brand new practice facility," Griffiths said. "Just to see how much the coaches liked my game, that made it an easy decision."

Griffiths attended a few RU basketball games at Jersey Mike's Arena with his family during the 2021-22 season.

The last game at home for Rutgers last year was the one that stood out. On March 6, in a must-win game against Penn State, the Scarlet Knights put on a defensive masterpiece and defeated the Nittany Lions 59-58 in front of a sold-out crowd to lock in a consecutive appearance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1976.

Griffiths saw the support of the five RU seniors Geo Baker, Ron Harper Jr., Caleb McConnell, Luke Nathan, and Ralph Gonzales-Agee and was hooked. What stood out to him most was his first impressions of the arena on that day. All he had to do was look up to the very top.

"I remember walking into the arena when Rutgers played Penn State on Senior Night," Griffiths said. "Where you enter, right away you just see the top row of the arena. Just to see a row of people filling the top row, I have never been to an arena or stadium anywhere that gave me that feeling. I could just tell right away when I walked in, that's where I wanted to play."

Griffiths reiterated that the environment at Jersey Mike's Arena played one of the biggest roles in his decision to be a Scarlet Knight.

"When I visited you could definitely hear the floor and the whole arena shaking," Griffiths said. "I can't even imagine what it's going to be like to play there," Griffiths said. "I've never played in front of close to that many people before and I can't wait."

Griffiths got along with the Rutgers men's basketball staff right away throughout his recruitment. He shouted out all the coaches on the RU staff and said he knew he belonged at Rutgers before even meeting the staff in person.

"I didn't even need my visits for that," Griffiths laughed. "I knew from talking to Coach Pikiell over the phone and talking to coach T.J. (Thompson), coach (Brandin) Knight, and coach (Karl) Hobbs, I knew I was going to like them right away. Then when I got to campus it was the same way. It was all good and exactly how I pictured it would be."

Griffiths has received tremendous accolades for his performances for his high school as well. The New England Preparatory School Athletic Council (NEPSAC) named Griffiths the '23 Player of the Year in Class B Basketball on April 20. Griffiths averaged 24.0 points, eight rebounds, and four assists during his junior season.

So, what can Rutgers Nation expect from Gavin Griffiths the basketball player?

"I can do a lot of things on the court," Griffiths said. "I can shoot, dunk and pass, but I mostly pride myself on playing hard. I'm going to be one of the guys always in the practice facility. Winning games for Rutgers is what I really want to do."

Griffiths has an extraordinary frame for an elite shooter and has been watching the game of Kevin Durant closely since he was a child. He's looked up to Durant's game and his ability to create open shots at that size.

"Growing up my favorite player was definitely KD," Griffiths said. "Watching him when I was younger and him just being a taller guy that could really shoot. He could really shoot over people and make tough shots."

With one more season left as in high school, Griffiths is looking forward to the day he officially steps on RU's campus as a student in 2023. Griffiths knows the opportunity at hand in the years to come and spoke about what motivates him to achieving his dream of becoming a successful player in the Big Ten and working his way to one day becoming an NBA player.

"I feel like I have been blessed with all of these abilities and I feel like I have to make the most out of it," Griffiths said. "My more recent why is one of my best friends growing up got really hurt on the football field and it puts a lot into perspective that your opportunity could be taken from you whenever."





# STEVE PIKIELL

Head Coach • Seventh Season at Rutgers, 18th Season Overall

A father of four who has led the resurgence of Rutgers Basketball, both on and off the court, Steve Pikiell has spent six seasons as head coach of the Scarlet Knights. Under Pikiell's leadership, the team returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2021, making its first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1991. The Scarlet Knights returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2022 marking the first time RU has made the big dance in consecutive seasons since 1976. In 2022, Pikiell surpassed Tom

Young with the most ranked wins in school history (13).

With 30 years of coaching experience, the Bristol (Conn.) native is under contract to remain courtside at the RAC through 2029-30 under a recently signed contract extension. The 19th head coach in the history of Rutgers men's basketball, Pikiell has been instrumental in turnarounds throughout his playing and coaching career that have resulted in conference championships and NCAA berths.

### The 2021-22 Season

- NCAA Tournament appearance for second straight season
- 12 wins in the Big Ten Conference are the most in the conference in school-history.
- Led the Scarlet Knights to their first-ever win against a No. 1 ranked team in Purdue, the highest-ranked victory in RU's history.
- Led the program to RU's first-ever victory over Michigan, marking a defeat over every Big Ten team.
- Led the team to their first back-to-back-to-back wins over ranked opponents, the first time an unranked team has done so in college basketball history.
- Led RU to their first ever victory at Wisconsin.
- Became RU's leading head coach on the all-time ranked wins list (13).
- Rutgers was awarded National Team of the Week by ESPN and NCAA.com March Madness this past week.
- Coached Rutgers first-ever major award-winner in the Big Ten Post-season Awards in Caleb McConnell winning Defensive Player of the Year

### The 2020-21 Season

- Recipient of the Peter A. Carlesimo Award, presented by the Met Basketball Writers Association to the top coach in the Metropolitan Area. Pikiell earned the accolade for the second straight season and became the first coach to win the accolade from the MBWA four times in his career.
- Led the program to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1991.
- Guided the Scarlet Knights to an opening round victory over No. 7 seed Clemson that marked RU's first NCAA Tournament win since 1983.
- The Scarlet Knights' win over No. 7 seed Clemson in the opening round marked the highest seeded team defeated in the NCAA Tournament since 1979, before falling to an eventual Final Four team in No. 2 seed Houston.
- While facing a strength of schedule ranked as the second toughest in the nation by ESPN.com, Rutgers went 16-12 overall, ensuring back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in 29 years.
- Under Pikiell's leadership, Rutgers won 10 Big Ten Conference games, and has earned 21 Big Ten wins over the past two seasons. RU finished tied for sixth in the nation's top-rated conference.
- The team spent 11 weeks nationally ranked or receiving votes in the

AP Poll, peaking at No. 11 in the nation.

- In the regular season, RU earned wins over five teams that qualified for the NCAA Tournament - No. 1 seed Illinois, No. 4 seed Purdue, No. 10 seed Maryland, No. 11 seed Michigan State and No. 11 seed Syracuse.

### The 2019-20 Season

- Recipient of the 2019-20 Jim Phelan Award, presented annually to the nation's top Division I coach, and Peter A. Carlesimo Award, presented by the Met Basketball Writers Association to the top coach in the Metropolitan Area
- Was one of 15 coaches on the Naismith Coach of the Year Late 2020 Season Watch List.
- Rutgers joined the rankings for the first time in 41 years, since the final 1978-79 AP Poll (No. 18).
- The Scarlet Knights were No. 24/25 & No. 25/25 in the Jan. 20 & 27 polls, respectively. RU was ranked or receiving votes for eight weeks. -
- RU captured its first 20-win regular season in 37 years, since 1982-83, and first 20-win season overall since 2003-04 and had first winning season in 14 years, since 2005-06 (19-14).
- Led Scarlet Knights to most conference victories (11) in 29 years, since 1990-91 (14-4; A-10), while also posting its first winning league record in 29 years
- Secured the most home regular season wins in the nation (18) and set a program record for home wins in a season.
- Tied for fifth in the Big Ten Conference, the nation's top-rated league per Ken Pomeroy, after being selected 12th in the preseason media poll.
- Earned RU's first opening round bye in a conference tournament in 25 years, since the 1995 Atlantic 10 Championship.
- Opened the RWJBarnabas Health Athletic Performance Center to help further the mission of bringing winning back to Piscataway. The 307,000-square-foot, four-story sports facility and parking deck held its grand opening on Sept. 12, 2019, and provides state-of-the-art practice facilities, training areas, locker room and office space for men's basketball.
- Has welcomed four-star signees from New Jersey in three consecutive

classes, with Cliff Omoruyi (2020) joining Paul Mulcahy (2019) and Ron Harper, Jr. (2018) in electing to stay home.

#### The 2018-19 Season

- Rutgers was recognized as the nation's Most Improved Team by Sports Illustrated. The Scarlet Knights improved 70 positions in the KenPom.com rankings, best among all Power conference programs.
- Led Rutgers to seven league victories, its most in conference play in 13 years, while competing with a roster ranked 330th in experience. Projected to finish 14th in the preseason, Rutgers tied for 10th in the Big Ten standings.
- Rutgers' schedule ranked 31st nationally in difficulty per Ken Pom, toughest among all New York Metro programs. 61 percent (19/31) of games were against opponents that earned 2019 NCAA Championship (15) or National Invitation Tournament (4) berths.
- Rutgers concluded its season 75th in the KenPom ratings, the program's best rank since concluding its 2005-06 campaign at No. 71.
- With wins over No. 16 Ohio State and at No. 22 Iowa, the Scarlet Knights earned victories over two ranked league opponents for the first time since 2007-08.
- Rutgers had five sell-outs at the RAC, its most since 2004-05 (7) and average attendance improved 31.1%.
- Welcomed a four-recruit signing class that included multiple four-star players for the first time at Rutgers since 2008.

#### The 2017-18 Season

- Rutgers advanced to the Big Ten Conference quarterfinals at Madison Square Garden via wins over Minnesota and five-time national champion Indiana. It marked the first time RU won two conference tournament games since 1998.
- Despite playing the 2nd toughest conference schedule in the Big Ten according to Ken Pom analysis for the second straight year, Rutgers ranked 17th nationally in both scoring defense (64.8) and offensive rebounding (13.15), while placing 27th in 3-point FG% defense (27.0).
- The Scarlet Knights ranked among the top three in the Big Ten in eight statistical categories, including leading the league in offensive rebounding and 3-point FG% defense. RU accomplished these improvements while playing 10 games against programs that advanced to the round of 32 in the NCAA Tournament.
- Defeated No. 15 Seton Hall 71-65 before 8,318 fans at the RAC on Dec. 16, 2017 in the annual Garden State Hardwood Classic. Rutgers was honored as the NABC D-I National Team of the Week for its win over the Pirates.
- Rutgers enjoyed multiple home sell-outs at the RAC in the same season for the first time since 2011. The 8,325 attendance vs. Purdue (Feb. 3, 2108) was the largest at the RAC in 15 years.

#### The 2016-17 Season

- Began tenure with a 9-1 start, the best head-coaching debut in Rutgers men's basketball history.
- The Scarlet Knights more than doubled their overall win total, while tripling their conference victory total.
- Rutgers achieved a plus-117 rank improvement in RPI, as well as major NCAA ranking improvements in rebound margin (+299), scoring defense (+272), three point FG defense (+247), offensive rebounds (+244), rebounds (+232), field goal percentage defense (+226) and blocks (+114).
- The Scarlet Knights ranked among the top 100 in 10 NCAA statistical categories, including among the top 50 in seven, after ranking among the top 150 in just two statistical categories in 2015-16.
- Posted an undefeated home mark in non-conference play and jumped-out to a 6-0 record, the sixth-best undefeated start in the 110-year history of the program.
- Played 17 games, 52% of its schedule, against programs that earned NCAA (13) or NIT (4) bids.
- Rutgers out-rebounded opponents in 11 of 18 conference games, after winning the boards in just three league contests the prior year.
- Ten Big Ten games were decided in single digits after suffering 15 conference losses by double digits in 2015-16.

- In the Classroom and Community:
- The program earned a 3.537 GPA in the spring semester, highest ever
- The team GPA for the 2019-20 academic year was 3.237
- 100% of the roster earned a 3.0 in the 2020 spring semester, with nine posting a 3.5 or better, and 11 student-athletes holding a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better.
- In the NCAA Graduate Success Rate (GSR) report, the team achieved a score of 80. The score ranked seventh among Big Ten Conference programs and was 60 points ahead of the national average.
- The team's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score was 984, which ranked fifth among Big Ten programs.
- Program has maintained 100% team participation in Rutgers Leadership Development community service initiatives during his tenure.
- The team has sponsored charity exhibitions, hosted youth clinics, volunteered at Elijah's Promise Soup Kitchen in New Brunswick, participated in the SAAC Holiday Toy Giveaway, visited children at RWJBarnabas Health facilities around the state and participates annually in the Tunnel to Towers 5K Run.

#### Prior to Rutgers:

- Led Stony Brook to six postseason appearances over seven years and was the 2016 America East Conference Coach of the Year.
- During his tenure, the Seawolves won four America East regular season championships, achieved 22 or more victories on six occasions and captured five conference player of the year awards.
- A four-time America East Coach of the Year, compiled a 119-48 (.713) record over his final five seasons at Stony Brook.
- Served as an assistant at George Washington under Karl Hobbs from 2001-05. In 2004-05, the Colonials earned 22 wins, their most since 1997-98 and the second most in 50 years, en route to a top 20 ranking. The team won its first Atlantic 10 title, earning an automatic NCAA Tournament bid.
- Prior to GW, served as an assistant at Central Connecticut State (1997-01) which, before his arrival, had never posted a winning season at the Division I level. During his tenure at CCSU, the Blue Devils notched an 81-63 (.563) record, including a 25-6 mark in 1999-2000 and a bid to the 2000 NCAA tournament. It marked the school's first NCAA berth.
- After one season with the New Haven Skyhawks of the USBL (1992), spent three years as an assistant at Yale (1992-95). Moved on to take over as interim head coach at Wesleyan, a Division III school in Middletown, Conn. for one year.
- Began his coaching career at UConn in 1991-92 with a roster that featured future NBA players Donyell Marshall, Chris Smith, Scott Burrell, Donny Marshall and Kevin Ollie.

#### Personally

- Pikiell (53) and his wife Kate are the proud parents of four children: Brooke (22), John Patrick (20), Olivia (18) and Kevin (15). Brooke is in graduate school at Rutgers after playing on the Northwestern women's basketball team. John Patrick attends Rutgers as well. Olivia plays lacrosse at the University of North Carolina.
- A 1990 graduate of Connecticut with a bachelor's degree in finance.
- One of nine children who grew up with three brothers and five sisters. As a player, was a four-year letterwinner and two-time team captain at Connecticut from 1987-91 under head coach Jim Calhoun. After placing ninth in the Big East with a 4-12 record his freshman season, UConn won its first Big East title and advanced to the Elite Eight and Sweet 16 during the two years he captained the Huskies.
- As a senior, helped No. 11 seeded UConn to a 79-62 win over Shaquille O'Neal and No. 6 seed LSU in the round of 64. Played in 106 career games and averaged 8.2 points a game.
- Was the recipient of the UConn Club Senior Athlete Award for outstanding contributions to UConn Athletics.
- Enjoyed a storied career at St. Paul Catholic High School. A three-time all-state selection, he had his No. 21 jersey retired by the school and ranks among its all-time leaders in points, assists and steals.
- Was inducted into Bristol's Hall of Fame in 2006.
