SEMINOLES RETURN TO THE TUCK FOR A TUESDAY NIGHT GAME AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED MIAMI

Florida State, which won ACC road games at Notre Dame and at Pittsburgh last week, returns home for a two-game home stand beginning with a Tuesday night (January 24, 7:00 p.m.) contest against a nationally-ranked Miami Hurricane team. The Seminoles have won two straight, and three of their last five games, and enter their game against Miami with a 5-4 record in conference play. Florida State is 3-1 in ACC games at home this season with victories over Louisville (73-55, December 10), Notre Dame (73-72, December 21) and Georgia Tech (75-64, January 7) and enters its game against Miami having won six consecutive home games -- and nine consecutive games -- against the Hurricanes. The Seminoles have won each of their games against Miami since a 101-90 win on January 27, 2018 at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center. Overall, the Seminoles are 33-8 at home against Miami in a series that began on December 19, 1950. Following Tuesday's game against Miami, the Seminoles will play host to a nationally ranked Clemson Tiger team on Saturday, January 28 at 5:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE'S RECENT ACC SUCCESS AT THE TUCKER CENTER

With its 3-1 record at home in ACC play this season, Florida State is 52-7 in ACC play at the Donald L. Tucker Center in the last seven seasons. The Seminoles' winning percentage of nearly 90 percent in conference play since the start of the 2016-17 season has made the Tucker Center one of the toughest places to play for ACC opponents. Florida State has lost only seven ACC home games since the start of the 2016-17 ACC schedule through the Seminoles' game against nationally ranked Virginia on January 14, 2023. To extrapolate Florida State's winning ways even further, the Seminoles won their final two ACC home games of the 2015-16 season against Notre Dame (77-56 on February 27, 2016) and Syracuse (78-73 on March 5, 2016) to raise their recent conference record at home to 54-7 for a winning percentage of .885 percent)

MILLS ENTERS TUESDAY'S GAME AGAINST MIAMI LOOKING TO EXTEND DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAK

Junior Caleb Mills enters Tuesday's game against Miami looking to extend to 11 his consecutive games streak of scoring in double figures. He has scored in double-figures in each of Florida State's games since December 10 against Louisville (16 points) and is averaging 12.4 points (124 total points scored) in that stretch of 10 games.

HAMILTON ON NAISMITH HALL OF FAME BALLOT

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, is on the ballot for enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The Seminoles' head coach won his 600th career game as he directed his Seminoles to their 75-64 win over Georgia Tech on January 7, 2023. In addition to the victory being his 600th overall coaching win, the win was his 400th at Florida State, making him only the fifth coach in ACC history to win 400 games as an ACC coach. Hamilton is one of just 16 active collegiate coaches with at least 600 career victories.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and gain its 10th consecutive win over the Hurricanes. A Seminole victory would continue the longest winning streak in the 89-game series;

...Defeat Miami and win its third consecutive ACC game. A streak of three consecutive ACC victories would be its longest streak since winning its final three games of the 2021-22 season (last year) when the Seminoles won at Virginia (64-63, February 26, 2022), and at home against both Notre Dame (74-70, March 2, 2022) and NC State (89-76, March 5) to close out their regular season.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018.

FLORIDA STATE WITH 14 VICTORIES OVER AP TOP 25 TEAMS IN LAST FOUR SEASONS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against nationally ranked Miami with 14 victories over nationally ranked opponents since the start of the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles won a school-record seven games against nationally ranked opponents during the 2016-17 season, and have defeated a school-record 58 nationally ranked opponents under head coach Leonard Hamilton. Included in the list of victories over nationally ranked teams since the beginning of the 2018-19 season is a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18, 2022.

SEMINOLES SHOOTING THE BALL WELL FROM THE FIELD

Florida State has shot better than 50 percent from the field in three of its last four games and enters Tuesday's game against Miami shooting .440 as a team from the field through its first 20 games of the season. The Seminoles are shooting nearly 49 percent from the field, are averaging 72.0 points scored per game, and totaled a season-high 84 points scored in their 84-71 win at Notre Dame on January 17 on the road in ACC play.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State shot .733 from the free throw line (11 of 15) in its 71-64 win at Pitt on Saturday in Pittsburgh. It marked the ninth time in their last 12 games the Seminoles shot better than 70 percent from the free throw line. The Seminoles made a season-high tying 23 free throws (16 in the second half) in their win over Notre Dame, and are shooting .810 percent from the free throw line in the second half of their last three games.

Florida State made a near-season-high tying 10 3-point shots as it scored 30 of its 74 points (.405 percent) from beyond the 3-point arc in its 71-64 win at Pittsburgh on Saturday. The Seminoles shot 50 percent or better from the bonusphere for the second time this season (10 of 20, .500) in winning their second consecutive at Pittsburgh's Peterson Events Center.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME

Caleb Mills scored a team-high 16 points while Anthony Polite scored 15 for Florida State and the Seminoles moved into a tie for first place in the ACC with a 61-60 win over Miami at the Watsco Center on January 22, 2022. The win gave Florida State a two-game regular season sweep of the Hurricanes for the fourth consecutive season. The Seminoles have won nine straight games against the Hurricanes, including both ends of the series in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022. The Seminoles' victory also marks Florida State's sixth straight win and fifth straight ACC win. The streak began with a 79-70 victory over Louisville on January 8. In a near mirror-image contest, Florida State led 43-19 at halftime before the Hurricanes turned it around and outscored the Seminoles 41-18 in the second half. In a game without any lead changes, the Seminoles gained their second consecutive one-point win over Miami. In the first meeting between the two teams, Florida State's RayQuan Evans made two free throws with 0.8 seconds left to play to give the Seminoles a 65-64 win. In Florida State's second win, Florida State scored the first basket of Saturday's game on a 3-point shot by Evans for a quick 3-0 advantage.

7 Freshman Cam Corhen has made seven consecutive free throws entering Tuesday's game against Miami.

37 All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland has more assists in the first 20 games of the 2022-23 season (37 / 1.9 apg) than he did as a freshman in 29 games (35 / 1.2 apg).

CLEVELAND'S SCORING AND REBOUNDING IMPROVEMENTS

All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland enters Tuesday's game against Miami in the conference's top 20 for overall scoring (14.3 ppg) and in the top 10 for overall rebounding (8.1 rpg). In ACC games only, Cleveland is ranked 14th in scoring (15.0 ppg) and third in rebounding (10.9 rpg). His statistics across the board in both overall games and in ACC games only are significantly improved this season as compared to his freshman season, when he became the fourth consecutive Seminole player to earn ACC Sixth Man of the Year honors.

Cleveland has eight blocked shots in the last four games (2.0 bpg), and has blocked three shots in two of the Seminoles' last three games (three each against Virginia and at Notre Dame).

CLEVELAND IS ONE OF FIVE AVERAGING IN DOUBLE FIGURES IN ACC PLAY

All-ACC candidate Matthew Cleveland has entered Tuesday's game against Miami as one of four ACC players currently averaging a double-double in points and rebounds in ACC play. Cleveland has recorded seven double-doubles in nine ACC games and is just four rebounds shy (two against Louisville and two against Pittsburgh) of earning a double-double in each of his first nine ACC games of the season. NOTING MATTHEW CLEVELAND'S REBOUNDING NUMBERS

All-ACC Candidate Matthew Cleveland enters Tuesday's game against Miami with 162 rebounds and a career-high 8.1 rebounds per game margin. He totaled 132 rebounds and 4.6 rebounds in 29 games as a freshman. Cam'Ron Fletcher -- My full name is Cam'Ron Nazir Fletcher. I'm named after the rapper, Cameron, who has released 12 albums worldwide. Cam'Ron may be best known for sparking a fashion phenomenon with his pink wardrobe and matching Range Rover.

Darin Green Jr. -- My full name is Darin Keven Green, Jr. I am named after my father.

De'Ante Green -- My full name is De'Ante Nathaniel Green. My dad's name is De'Armon and my parents wanted to give me a name that was similar to his. My middle name is a family name that has been passed down through five generations.

Tom House -- My full name is Thomas James House. I am named after my dad's brother, Tom House, who passed away when he was a teenager in a plane crash. It is because of him that I go by Tom, instead of Thomas. My mom and dad decided on James, my middle name.

Chandler Jackson -- My full name is Chandler Matthew Joseph Jackson. My mom and my grandmother named me after the character Chandler from the hit television show, Friends. My two middle names come from biblical figures because my grandfather is a pastor, and every member of my family has names from the Bible.

Darin Green Jr. made five 3-point field goals and scored 24 points in Florida State's victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday. It marked the third time this season and 12th time in his career that he has made five or more 3-point field goals in a game. Green Jr. averages 26.0 points in the three games he has made five or more 3-point field goals as a Seminole this season.

GREEN JR TRENDS TOWARDS 300 CAREER 3-POINT FIELD GOALS MADE

With his nine 3-point field goals made in Florida State's ACC victories on the road at Notre Dame (four) and Pittsburgh (five), Darin Green Jr enters Tuesday's game against Miami just 31 3-point field goals short of 300 for his career. He has made 61 3-point field goals and averages a single-season career-high tying 3.0 3-point field goals made this season. His career-high eight 3-point field goals made against St. John's on December 17 is tied for the third-highest single game total in school history, while his seven made 3-point shots against Troy on November 14 is tied for the sixth-highest single game total in school history.

How Steph Curry, An Unorthodox Shooting Method Prepared FSU Men's Basketball Star Darin Green Jr.

Darin Green Jr. remembers loving basketball since he was young.

His father played college basketball at George Washington University, while his mom was a high school star. So the basketball gene runs rampant through him.

But how early Green showed his love for basketball surprised even his father, Darin Green Sr.

Green Sr. finished playing in a YMCA basketball game when his son was just 3 years old. He was about to experience his son's ability and love for the game.

"After one of my games, my wife put Darin down on the ground and he ran over to the bench," Green Sr. told the Democrat.

"And at three years old, you are still kind of clumsy. I rolled the basketball out to try to slow him down because he was running so fast. And unbeknownst to me, he actually picked the basketball up and started dribbling with his left hand and ran over to me.

"And I was like, 'Whoa, I didn't even know he could do it.' And from that day, on, all the way to the point where we got in the car until we got home, he literally slept with that basketball. The ball was probably bigger than he was. It was certainly bigger than his head."

Green Jr., who is coming off a 24-point performance in an upset road victory over Pittsburgh on Saturday, will look to push the Seminoles' (7-13, 5-4 ACC) win streak to a season-high three games when they square off against rival Miami (15-4, 6-3) at 7 p.m. Tuesday at Donald L. Tucker Civic Center.

The younger Green is in his first year with the Seminoles after transferring from UCF. He is averaging 14.6 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.1 assists. He is shooting 42% from 3-point range and 90% from the free throw line, all while averaging 34.1 minutes per game.

Part of the reason Green Jr. chose FSU as his destination is the hope to take his game to the next level and reach the NBA.

"(Head) coach (Leonard) Hamilton and (associate head) coach (Stan) Jones trust me, and they don't hold me back," Green Jr. told the Democrat. "I'm not saying UCF held me back, but I'm in a situation where this offensive system allows more.

"And then of course on the defensive end, we play 94 feet and pressure, everything. So, that allows me to show

3-point shooting first

Green Sr. played at George Washington from 1994-98. He averaged 3.1 points per game in 89 career games. The elder Green saw his playing career impacted by leg injuries. He was an athletic player who made his name with dunks and later developed a jump shot.

So for Green Sr., he wanted his son to develop his jump shot before anything else.

"That's why he taught me how to shoot first so early," Green Jr. said. "Because the athleticism will come as I grow. And then that your athleticism can be taken away from you, but my shot I have that for much longer."

The first lesson for shooting form came early and with an out-of-the-box idea.

A few days following Jr.'s birthday, a few helium balloons that went to the ceiling started losing air and fell to the ground. Green Sr. found an innovative game for him and his son to play.

"What I did was, I actually took one of those balloons and I used it as a basketball. I would shoot it to him right and do the motion so that he could see the arc and the follow through and wait for the balloon to come down, and he had to catch it. And he had to shoot it to me the same way," Green Sr. said.

"So that's how he worked on his form, which is pretty interesting. What is so funny is I never knew that that was

Kicked out by father/coach

It wasn't always fun and games between father and son. Green Jr. will never argue with referees during a game, but that's due to a consequence of a mistake he made when he was 9 during an AAU game.

"My dad threw me out of the gym, in the middle of a game." Green Jr. said. "He literally kicked me out of the gym. I was talking back to a referee. He didn't like it. I remember I tried to say something back to one of the assistant coaches. He kicked me out and told me to go sit in the stands with my mom.

"He gave it to me young, so that way I know not to do it now. That's why I don't say much too much to the refs now."

Green Sr. said a couple of his players were complaining about calls from the refs during the first half, so he told them anyone who spoke back would be thrown out.

"And lo and behold, it's my son that comes out in the second half who had never done anything like this before," Green Sr. said. "I had to make the decision, right, like, I can't go back on that. So I said, 'No, not only do you go in the stands, you go up in the stands with mommy and then you go sit outside the car.'

"Needless to say my wife was pretty mad at me, but the good thing is he's never talked back to a referee ever. Ever since we can laugh at it now but he certainly wasn't laughing."

The call in question was a blocking foul call on Green Jr. He however felt he was in a good position to pick up a

Meeting Steph Curry

Following a move from North Carolina to Florida, Green Jr. fell behind in his grades in the sixth grade. Green Sr. came up with a motivational idea to get his son to perform better in the classroom.

Green Sr. worked with former NBA players Dell Curry and Muggsy Bogues at their summer basketball camps in Charlotte. He also coached a youth team, one which featured current NBA star, Stephen Curry.

That gave the father an incentive idea.

"I told him, 'Hey man if you do well, you start getting straight A's, I'll take you out to a game and we'll get you to go and actually meet Steph Curry since that's your favorite player,'" Green Sr. said. "And so he basically cashed in on it. So he went from making lower C's and B's to all A's."

The game turned out to be a Warriors game against the Miami Heat, featuring LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Following the game, Green Jr. got a chance to talk to his favorite player.

"Every shooter could say that they learned from (Curry's) mechanics and shot, how quick he releases his footwork, getting into his shot from different areas on the court," Green Jr. said. "He's known as the greatest

Tony's Ice Cream

Green Jr. took only one visit after he entered the transfer portal: Florida State.

"I tell this joke all the time, coach Ham, he didn't ask me to take a visit. He said, 'You are going to take a visit this weekend,'" Green Jr. said. "So I had no choice. So, I just came on my visit, and I liked what I saw."

On his visit, Hamilton and Green Jr. bonded over the fact both his mom and Hamilton came from the same city: Gastonia, N.C.

Tony's Ice Cream, a local favorite in Gastonia, was one of the common places both Hamilton and Green Jr. had frequented.

"My grandparents still live in Gastonia," Green Jr. said. "So, he and my grandfather actually met each other and they know some of the same people. It's just crazy."

Green Jr.'s maternal grandfather, Fred Smith, ran into Hamilton early in the season and the two had a chance to catch up.

"From the area we grew up in, it was kind of a tough area," Hamilton said. "Those experiences kind of make who you are. I enjoyed talking with his grandfather because we related so much to the same circumstances. I think a lot of that toughness and a lot of that grit that you had to exhibit to get through that era and that location it causes you to have a different mindset.

"That's the kind of mindset he has. He's a tough guy. He accepts challenges, he makes sacrifices. He's always

NBA aspirations

Following the 2020 season, Green Jr. entered his name in the NBA draft to hear feedback about his chances to take the leap. He was coming off a season averaging 10.1 points per game on 41% 3-point shooting as a freshman with the Knights.

It was an opportunity to earn feedback from the league to see what his next steps needed to be.

"They wanted to see more passing and want to see my defensive ability and more creating for myself. They know I can shoot the ball well," Green Jr. said.

Outside of the comfortability factor, Green Jr. said getting to the NBA played a factor in his decision to come to Tallahassee.

Both father and son said two players Green Jr. has molded his game after are current NBA stars: the Washington Wizards' Bradley Beal and New Orleans Pelicans' CJ McCollum.

Green Jr. said he's putting his faith in the coaching staff, which has helped many players get to the league.

"(Coach Hamilton) is always saying we're trying to get somewhere we've never been," Green Jr. said. "But he's been there, we have just put it in his hands, and I feel like he can get me where I need to be."

Game 19 -- Florida State 84, Notre Dame 71

NOTRE DAME, Ind. — Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 20 points on six made field goals, four 3-pointers, and four free throws to lead Florida State to an 84-71 victory over Notre Dame at the Joyce Center. Green Jr. led five Seminoles in double figure scoring, Green, Jalen Warley (17 points), Matthew Cleveland (14 points), Caleb Mills (11 points), and Cameron Corhen (10 points) to improve Florida State's ACC record to 4-4. Matthew Cleveland secured his eighth consecutive double against Notre Dame with 14 points and a career-high 16 rebounds. The last Seminole to reach the milestone was Reggie Royals who finished the 1970-71 season with nine consecutive double doubles. Cleveland will have the chance to join Royals in Saturday afternoon's game against Pittsburgh. Cleveland's 16 rebounds are tied for the second most in an ACC game by a Seminole — tied with Al Thornton against Virginia on February 7, 2007. The school record for rebounds by a Seminole in an ACC game is 17 by Michael Joiner against Wake Forest on January 9, 2001. Cleveland's 16 defensive rebounds established a school record by a Florida State player in an ACC game. Warley scored his career-high of 17 points on four made field goals and eight free throws. He surpassed his former career-high of 15 points against Duke in February of 2022 and made the most free throws of his career, shooting eight for 10 (.800) from the free throw line

Game 20 -- Florida State 71, Pitt 64

PITTSBURGH, Pa. — Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 24 points on seven made field goals, five three pointers and five free throws to lead Florida State to a 71-64 victory over Pittsburgh at the Peterson Events Center. Green Jr led three Seminoles in double figure scoring; Green, Matthew Cleveland (11 points), and Caleb Mills (11 points) to improve the Seminoles' ACC record to 5-4. Green Jr. scored 24 points on 7-12 shooting from the field and shot 5-8 from the bonusphere. He was perfect from the free-throw line, making all five of his free-throw attempts. Green's success at the charity stripe helped propel the Seminoles to shooting over 73% from the line in today's game. Cleveland scored 11 points on 4-7 shooting from the field, but fell two rebounds short of securing his ninth consecutive double-double and matching Reggie Royal's streak during the 1970-71 season. Cleveland finished the game with 11 points and collected eight rebounds — all on the defensive end of the court. Both Mills and Cleveland finished the game with 11 points and four made field goals apiece. Mills' 11 points marked his tenth consecutive game scoring in double figures. Greg Elliott's early seven points on two-of-two 3-point field goals, helped Pitt jump out to an early 15-5 lead before a 17-2 run by the Seminoles fueled by Mills scoring eight points, and Green Jr scoring five to put the Seminoles ahead 22-17.
