STARTING FIVE

- The Cardinals changed up their lineup ahead of the Jan. 29 matchup against Syracuse and they are 5-1 with the new starting five with the lone blemish being a 78-76 loss in overtime on a buzzer beater against #10 Notre Dame. Hailey Van Lith has led the team with 15.8 points per game and has averaged 4.3 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 2.2 steals in the last six games. Coming off the bench, Chrislyn Carr is second on the team with 13.0 points per game over the previous six games. She has led the Cards in plus/minus in four of the six games. Mykasa Robinson has led the team in a several categories since she has been in the starting lineup. She is first on the squad with 7.3 assists per game, 6.7 rebound and 2.5 steals per game while she has scored 7.0 points per game. Robinson leads the ACC with a 2.7 assist/turnover ratio in conference games this season. Nyla Harris has also done well in the starting five as she has set career-highs in points against Syracuse (18) and rebounds against North Carolina (12). Norika Konno scored a career-high 12 points against Clemson.
- Chrislyn Carr has been one of best three-point shooters in the country this season. She leads the team with 75 threes made this season and is shooting a .467 clip from behind the arc. Her shooting percentage leads the ACC and ranks fifth nationally. If the season ended today, her shooting percentage would finish second all-time in program history for best shooting percentage in a single season behind Jill Morton, who holds the program record of .535 percent during the 1999-00 season. Morton's .535 shooting percentage was the best in the nation that season. Carr's 75 threes is second in the ACC and ranks 18th nationally. In ACC play, Carr leads the league with a .473 shooting percentage (43-91) from behind the arc.
- The Cardinals have been the class of the ACC since they joined the league in 2014-15. Louisville is 125-23 (.845) in ACC play over the past eight seasons. They are the only school with a winning percentage above .800 in conference games and they have eight more wins than the school with the second-highest win total over that span.
- With the 62-52 win on Feb. 19 against Boston College, the Cardinals reached the 20-win mark for the 13th-straight season, extending the program record. The previous record was three-straight seasons and it was only achieved twice. Louisville has won 20 games or more in 15 of the 16 seasons under head coach Jeff Walz.
- The Cardinals have had several individual recognitions during the 2022-23 season. They are just one of three schools to have a player on all five positional watch lists (Chrislyn Carr, Lieberman Award; Van Lith, Drysdale Award; Morgan Jones, Miller Award; Olivia Cochran, McClain Award; Josie Williams, Leslie Award). Van Lith and Jones were both named to the Preseason All-ACC team as the Cardinals were selected as league favorites. Jones and Van Lith were both selected to the Naismith Award Women's Watch List and the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List. Van Lith was named a second team Preseason All-American by The Athletic. Van Lith was also selected to the Wade Watch List, the third national player of the year watch list she has been named to this season. Van Lith was just named to the Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Watch List on Jan. 5. Carr was named ACC Player of the Week on Dec. 27 and Hailey Van Lith was named Player of the Week on Jan. 16. Van Lith was named to the Wooden Award Late Season Top 20 List, Drysdale Award Top 10 List and Naismith Player of the Year Midseason List in the recent weeks.

ABOUT THE HURRICANES

Miami is 17-10 on the season and is 10-6 in ACC play heading into Thursday's matchup. The Hurricanes are coming off a 1-1 week with a home win over Clemson (59-54) and a road defeat to Syracuse (68-77). Miami is ranked fifth in the ACC this season with a .435 field goal percentage, three spots behind the Cardinals who are second in the league with a .456 field goal percentage. The Hurricanes are also a strong passing team, similar to the Cardinals. Louisville ranks third in the league with 15.5 assists per game and Miami is fifth with 14.9 per game. Miami is just one game behind the Cardinals in the ACC standings as we enter the final week of the regular season. None of the 15 seeds are set in stone as every team is still able to improve their positioning before the regular season ends on Sunday. The Hurricanes can finish as high as the No. 3 seed and as low as the No. 8 seed for the upcoming ACC Women's Basketball Tournament. The Cardinals can get as high as the No. 2 seed in the tournament but can't fall lower than the No. 7 seed.

■ **Series History** - This will be the 11th meeting all-time between the two schools and the Cardinals hold a 7-3 all-time series advantage. The Cardinals are 7-2 against Miami since Jeff Walz took over in the 2007-8 season. In games played in Louisville, the Cardinals are 3-2 in those games. They won the last game played in Louisville, 79-76, on January 26, 2021. Each of the last three games played between the two teams have been decided by three points or less.

■ **Last Meeting (March 4, 2022)** - Destiny Harden hit a turnaround midrange jumper at the horn to cap a one-woman comeback as Miami scored the game's final 17 points to down No. 4 Louisville 61-59 in Friday night's quarterfinals of the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament. The second-seeded Cardinals led 59-44 with 5:44 left, only to see the seventh-seeded Hurricanes stage a frantic rally that abruptly turned what looked set to be a Louisville win into a stunning reversal. Harden did it almost single-handedly, scoring the game's last 15 points for Miami (19-11) on the way to 27 points on 11-for-15 shooting. That included the game-tying 3-pointer from the left wing with 31 seconds left. Then, after the Cardinals committed a shot-clock violation, Miami got the ball back with 1.7 seconds left. Kelsey Marshall sent a one-bounce pass to Harden on the right side, with Harden catching and turning over Hailey Van Lith to launch a shot that caught all net. Chelsie Hall scored 13 points to lead the Cardinals (25-4). Kianna Smith finished with 10 points, while Emily Engstler added eight points and nine rebounds

Quick Hitters

■ **Making the Extra Pass** - The Cardinals have been distributing the ball at a high rate over the last six games. In the last six games, the Cardinals have 109 assists on 154 made baskets (.708). The Cardinals are averaging 18.2 assists per game in the last six games.

■ **Strong Cardinal Shooting** - Louisville has been one of the best shooting teams in the ACC this season. In conference games, the Cardinals lead the league with a .452 shooting percentage and are second in the league with a .368 three-point percentage. For the season, Louisville is second in the league with a .351 shooting mark from three-point range and are second in the conference with a .456 shooting percentage.

ROBINSON KNOWS DEFENSE

A familiar face is back to take advantage of her fifth year of eligibility as graduate student Mykasa Robinson returns for the Cardinals this season. She has 153 games played in her career, which sets the program record for most games played in a Louisville career.

■ In the last six games since she has been moved into the starting lineup, she is averaging 7.0 points, 7.3 assists, 6.7 rebounds and 2.5 steals per game. She has led the Cardinals in assists in each of the six games.

■ In ACC games this season, Robinson leads the ACC with a 2.7 assist/turnover ratio. She ranks

third in the conference with 4.9 assists per game and fifth with 2.0 steals per game.

- Robinson is ranked 21st nationally in assist/turnover ratio with 2.4 on the year.
- In the road win over Boston College, Robinson led the Cardinals with eight assists, tied a career high with nine rebounds and had five points and steal. It was her fourth-straight game and fifth time in the last six games she has had five assists or more.
- On the road in overtime against #10 Notre Dame, she set a career high after playing all 45 minutes and had nine points, a team-high five assists, five rebounds and two steals.
- Robinson continues to thrive in her role in the new starting lineup as she led the Cards with a team-high nine assists, tied a career high with 10 points and had five rebounds, two steals and a block in the home win over Clemson.
- In the road win over Virginia, Robinson led the Cards with six assists to go with six points, six rebounds, two steals, tied a career-high with two blocks and just one turnover. It was the first time in her career she has had multiple steals and multiple blocks in the same game.
- In the home win over #11/14 North Carolina, Robinson tied a season high with eight rebounds and added five points, four assists and three steals.
- Robinson set a career high with 12 assists and tied a career high with five steals against Syracuse. She also had seven points, a team-high seven rebounds and zero turnovers in the road win over the Orange. She is the only player in the country with 12 or more assists and zero turnovers in a game this season. The 12 assists were the most by a Louisville player since 2015 when Mariya Moore had 12 against Charleston.
- She set the program record for career games played in the home win over Boston College. She scored eight points, four rebounds, four assists and two steals.
- On the road against #13/13 Virginia Tech, Robinson led the team with a season-high six assists with a season-high eight rebounds and six points and three steals. It is the fourth-straight game she has had two or more steals.
- Recorded two steals, her third-straight game with multiple steals, with three points and four rebounds against Pitt. She converted an and-one layup off a steal in the closing minutes to close out the win.
- In the win over Georgia Tech, Robinson had four points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals. She had a clutch offensive rebound and converted the layup late in the fourth quarter to put the game out of reach. It was the sixth game this season she has had two or more steals.
- Robinson returned to the court against Duke and led the team with four assists and two steals. It was the fifth time she has led the team in assists.
- On Nov. 30 against #4/5 Ohio State, Robinson stuffed the stat sheet with eight points, five rebounds, a team-high four assists, career-high two blocks and one steal.
- In the final game in Atlantis against South Dakota State, Robinson had three steals and led the team with five rebounds and four assists.
- Robinson had one of the best games of her career against Gonzaga in the Bahamas. She tied a career high with five steals, all of which came in the first half of the game. She tied a career high with 10 points and added five rebounds and three assists.
- It was her play on the offensive side of the ball that helped the Cardinals win on the road against Belmont. She scored nine points, one shy of her career high, including the go-ahead layup with 1:45 left in regulation. She drew six fouls in the win, including the moving screen with 7.0 seconds left to give the Cardinals the ball back with a one-point lead.
- Robinson had another active game in the passing lanes in the win over IUPUI on Thursday. She had a team-high three steals to go along with four rebounds, three points and two assists. It was the first time in her career she has had three or more steals in back-to-back games.
- In the season opener against Cincinnati, Robinson had an all-around game with five points, six rebounds, three assists and tied a career high with five steals.
- Last season, Robinson played in 33 games and made her impact on the defensive end as she was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the second straight season. She was just one of two players in the league to be named to the Defensive Team in each of the last two seasons.

CC FROM THREE

Syracuse grad transfer Chrislyn Carr has been lethal from three-point range this season, leading the Cardinals from behind the arc as a scoring threat.

- Through 29 games this season, Carr leads the team with 75 three-pointers. She is shooting .467 percent from three and the next closest player has 40 made threes on the season. She leads the ACC with the .467 shooting percentage and it ranks fifth nationally. Her 75 threes are second in the ACC and rank 18th nationally. In ACC games this season, Carr leads the league with a .473 shooting percentage (43-91) from behind the arc.
- Carr scored 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the field and 3-for-4 from behind the arc on the road in overtime against #10 Notre Dame. It was the 17th game this season that she has shot 50 percent or better from three.
- In the home win over Clemson, Carr hit two threes and was one of four players in double figures with 12 points. She had a +23 plus/minus in her 28 minutes of action off the bench. She has had the highest plus/minus for the Cardinals in each of the four games during Louisville's winning streak.
- Carr scored 12 of her 14 points in the fourth quarter and was 2-for-5 from three in Louisville's 63-53 comeback win over Virginia on Feb. 9.
- Carr led the team with 17 points and was 5-for-9 from three in the win over #11/14 North Carolina. She tied a season high with five made threes and she has done it three times this season.

HEAD COACH JEFF WALZ

Head coach **Jeff Walz**, in his 16th season as a head coach, has compiled a 435-122 record as the Cardinals' leader. Walz and the Cardinals boast quite an astounding resumé that includes 11 trips to the NCAA Sweet 16, seven trips to the Elite Eight, four trips to the final four and two trips to the national title game. Overall, he has compiled a 37-13 record in NCAA Tournament games and ranks eighth all-time and fifth among active coaches with a 74.0 NCAA Tournament winning percentage. All of this for a program that had just four NCAA Tournament wins and had never reached a Sweet 16 prior to Walz being named head coach.



Walz is the all-time winningest coach in program history and averages 27.6 victories per season. He directed Louisville to a program-record 36 victories in 2017-18 en route to being named ACC Coach of the Year, 34 victories in 2008-09, 33 wins in 2013-14, 32 wins in 2018-19 and 29 wins in 2021-22.

The Cardinals have reached 20 wins 12 consecutive times and they have won at least 20 games in 14 of Walz's 15 seasons. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice, and UofL had just 10 20-win seasons in its 32 previous years.

Walz led Louisville to four consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles in 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021, and over that four-year span, the Cardinals went a combined 122-15, which marked the fewest losses and best winning percentage over a four-year period in program history.

From 2016-2021, he coached the ACC Player of the Year in five of six seasons as Myisha Hines-Allen won the award in 2016, Asia Durr in 2018 and 2019, and Dana Evans in 2020 and 2021. He also coached Angel McCoughtry to Big East Player of the Year honors in 2007.

After being hired as the Cardinals' head coach on March 27, 2007, the Bluegrass State native used little time to make a splash. His first year featured the program's first NCAA Sweet 16 and it culminated with Louisville earning the No. 12 ranking in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. For his efforts, Walz was named the WBCA Maggie Dixon Rookie Coach of the Year.

Prior to taking the reins at Louisville, Walz spent five seasons at Maryland, including his final season as the associate head coach in 2006-07. The season prior, he helped lead the Terrapins to a school-record 34 wins and the program's first national title.

Walz has four children: daughter Kaeley, son Jacob, and daughters Lola and Lucy. He married the former Lauren Lueders in September of 2012, and the couple resides in Louisville.

- Against her former team, Carr scored 14 points, hit two threes and set season highs with eight assists and five steals in the win over Syracuse.
- She led the Cardinals with 16 points and was 4-for-7 from three against #20/18 NC State. It was her second-straight game that she hit four threes.
- Carr recorded 18 points and had four threes to go with a team-best six assists and four steals in the win over Boston College.
- In the road win over Florida State, Carr scored 11 points and was 2-for-4 from three-point range.
- Carr was clutch down the stretch in the home win over Pitt. She scored 16 points, tied a season high with five made threes and had four assists. She hit a three with 48 seconds remaining to put the Cardinals in the lead, her second three in the final three minutes of the game.
- In the home win over Syracuse, Carr scored in double figures with 12 points and hit four threes.
- Carr took over in the road win over DePaul, leading the team with 21 points and a career-high 17 rebounds. Her 17 rebounds set a number of high marks including most rebounds by a guard in Louisville program history and second-most by a guard in the country at that point in the season. Her 17 boards were the most by a Louisville player in a game since the 2017-18 season.
- On the road against Bellarmine, Carr scored 13 points and was 3-for-6 shooting from behind the arc. It was the fourth time in her last five game she has scored in double figures. Carr also set a season high with seven assists and four steals.
- In the win over SIUE, she scored 14 points, shot 4-for-5 from three and had five assists.
- On the road against Middle Tennessee, Carr was one of three Cardinals to score in double figures with 10 points.
- Going up against the second Top-5 opponent of the season in #4/5 Ohio State, Carr scored 14 points, including four three-pointers. It was her second game in a row with four or more made threes.
- She led the Cardinals in scoring with 17 points in the win over Longwood on Nov. 25. She hit a season-high five three-pointers and it is the most made by a Cardinal in a single game this season. She hauled in a season-high seven rebounds and had five assists. Carr has led the Cardinals in scoring three times this season and they are 3-0 in those games.
- In the win over #3/5 Texas, Carr paced the Cards with a season-high 19 points and was 3-for-5 from beyond the arc. She also hit a season high eight free throws and was 8-for-10 from the charity stripe.

HVL 3.0

Hailey Van Lith has made a big impact for the Cardinals during the 2022-23 season.

- This season she leads the Cardinals with 19.0 points per game and is second on the team with 4.9 rebounds per game and 3.5 assists per game. The 19.0 points per game is third in the ACC and 26th nationally. She has scored 533 total points, a figure that is third in the conference and 17th nationally. She is 14th nationally in minutes per game (37.0) and 22nd in field goals made (191).
- In conference games this season, Van Lith is third in the ACC with 18.5 points per game. She ranks seventh in the league with 3.7 assists per game. She has scored 17 points or more in 13 ACC games and 20 points or more in seven ACC games this year.
- In the road win over Boston College, Van Lith led the team with 17 points and had four rebounds, three steals and two assists. She has scored 17 or more points in each of the last five games and had two or more steals in each of the last four games.
- Van Lith led the team with 19 points on 8-for-16 shooting and was 3-for-4 from three to go with a team-high six rebounds and tied a career high with five steals against #10 Notre Dame. It was her second-straight game shooting 50 percent or better from the floor.
- In the win over Clemson, Van Lith led the Cardinals with a game-high 19 points on 6-of-12 shooting and was 5-for-6 from behind the arc. She set a season-high with the five made threes.
- Van Lith was named to the Wooden Award Late Season Top 20, Drysdale Award Top 10 Watch List and Naismith Women's Player of the Year Midseason Team over the past few weeks. It is the first time in her career she was named to the Wooden Late Season List and Naismith Midseason Team. It was the third-straight year she has been named to a positional award Top 10 list.
- In the win over #11/14 North Carolina, she tied for the team lead with 17 points and added seven rebounds with a block and an assist.
- At home over Boston College, Van Lith led all scorers with 24 points and had six rebounds and two steals.
- In the road win over Florida State, Van Lith scored 20 points, set career highs in assists with eight and steals with five and had eight rebounds. She is the only player in the NCAA this season to have at least 20 points, eight rebounds, eight assists and five steals in a game.
- She continued to score at an elite rate against #13/13 Virginia Tech on the road. Van Lith led all scorers with 29 points to go with five rebounds, three assists and three steals. The 29 points were the second most she has scored in a game in her career.
- Van Lith led the Cardinals with 18 points, a season-high four threes and set a career high with seven assists in the home win over Pitt. Van Lith led the Cardinals in assists in five of her last six games.
- In the home win over Georgia Tech, Van Lith led all scorers with 24 points, shot 10-for-20 from the floor and had a team-high four assists and four rebounds. It was her third-straight game shooting 50 percent or more and the second time in her career she has shot 50 percent or better in three-straight games. She also scored 20 points for the third-straight game.
- On the road against Duke, Van Lith scored a game-high 23 points and was 11-for-21 shooting from the floor.
- Van Lith did it all in the win over Syracuse with a team-high 24 points and tied a career high with six assists to go with five rebounds and a block and just one turnover. It was her third-straight game

■ In the road win over DePaul, Van Lith scored 17 points and tied for the team high with five assists. It was the second game in a row that she had led the team in assists.

■ She tallied another 20-point game with a game-high 20 points in the road win over Pitt. She tied for the team lead with four assists.

■ Van Lith tallied a team-high 19 points in the road win over Bellarmine to go along with six rebounds and three assists.

■ In the win over Kentucky, she scored a team-high 21 points for her second-straight game with 20 or more points. She made 13 free throws against the Wildcats to set a career high. The 13 free throws are tied for fourth in program history for the most made in a single game.

■ Van Lith entered the Cardinal record book as she was the 32nd player in school history to eclipse the 1,000-point mark in the win over SIUE on Dec. 6. She led the team on the night with 21 points and tied a career high with six assists.

■ On the road against Middle Tennessee, Van Lith got her second-straight double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds. It is the first time in her career she has had a double-double in back-to-back games and the first time she has had 10 or more rebounds in consecutive games.

■ Against #4/5 Ohio State, Van Lith recorded her second double-double of the season as she recorded a team-high 20 points and 10 rebounds.

■ In the three games down in the Battle 4 Atlantis, she averaged 20.7 points, 4.3 rebounds and scored at least 18 points in each of the three games.

■ In the road win over Belmont, Van Lith had a game-high 25 points and hit crucial free throws down the stretch to seal the win for the Cardinals.

■ She followed up her 28-point performance in the opener with her second career double-double against IUPUI. She tallied 12 points and 10 rebounds and added four assists in the win over the Jaguars.

■ In the season-opening win over Cincinnati, Van Lith led the Cardinals with 28 points on 12-of-20 shooting. It was the fourth-most points scored in a season opener in Louisville history and the second-most points scored by an ACC player in their season-opening games this season.

■ Van Lith had several preseason recognitions as she was named to the Preseason All-ACC team, Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List and a second team Preseason All-American by The Athletic. She was also listed at No. 9 in ESPN's Top 25 Players List and it was the second-straight season she has made the Top 25. It was also the second-straight season she was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Watch List. She was also selected to the Naismith Award Women's Watch List for the third-straight season. She was named to the Wade Watch List on Nov. 30, the third national player of the year award watch list she has been named to this season.

ALL AROUND MJ

Florida State grad transfer Morgan Jones has made her mark on the Cardinals this season, impacting the game in multiple categories.

■ Jones had nine points to go with eight rebounds, one assist, one steal and one block in the win over #11/14 North Carolina.

■ In the road matchup against Wake Forest, Jones led the Cardinals with 15 points and added four rebounds, an assist, a block and a steal.

■ In her return to Tallahassee, Jones led the team with 25 points and 10 rebounds for her first double-double with the Cardinals this season. Both the points and rebounds were season-high marks and she shot a season-best .900 from the floor (9-10).

■ On the road against #13/13 Virginia Tech, Jones scored a season-high 19 points and led the team with nine rebounds on 7-of-11 shooting. Jones also had two assists and one steal against the Hokies.

■ In the win over Syracuse, Jones tallied 15 points and seven rebounds. It was the fifth time this season she has scored 15 points or more and third game with seven or more rebounds.

■ Jones continued to have success on the defense end in the win over Bellarmine. She had two blocks to go with eight points, five rebounds and two assists.

■ In the road win over Kentucky, Jones scored 12 points, tied a career high with four blocks and set a season high with eight rebounds. The four blocks are tied for the second most by an ACC player in a game this season. Seven of her eight rebounds were offensive boards, the most by a Cardinal player this season.

■ In the home win over SIUE, she scored 17 points, tied a season-high with four assists and set a career high with eight steals in just 17 minutes of action. Her eight steals are tied for the most by an ACC player in a single game and it is tied for sixth nationally. She is the first Louisville player to have eight steals in a game since Jude Schimmel had eight against Wagner on December 21, 2012.

■ Against #4/5 Ohio State, Jones scored 15 points for the second-straight game to go with six rebounds and two steals.

■ In the win over Longwood, Jones tallied 15 points and added four rebounds and a season-high four assists.

■ In the win over #3/5 Texas, Jones was one of three players with 18 or more points (18 pts.) and she added four rebounds, two blocks and two steals. It was the second game this season with multiple steals and blocks in the same game.

■ She scored in double figures with 12 points with four rebounds, one steal and one block against Gonzaga on Nov. 19.

■ Jones just played 19 minutes against IUPUI but made her presence felt with nine points, seven rebounds, two assists, two blocks and one steal. She had at least eight points, four rebounds and two

11TH-LONGEST TOP-10 STREAK IN AP HISTORY

The Cardinals were ranked in the Top-10 of the AP poll for 98-consecutive weeks dating back to the 2017-18 season. It is the 11th-longest Top-10 appearance streak in AP poll history.

VS. AP TOP 25

UofL went 10-4 against AP Top 25 teams last season, which is the most AP Top 25 wins in program history. Over the past six seasons, the Cards are 35-19 against AP Top 25 teams. So far this season, the Cardinals are 2-4 against ranked teams.

PRESEASON AP AND USA TODAY RANKINGS

Following the program's fourth trip to the Final Four last season, Louisville was ranked seventh in the 2021-22 Associated Press and fifth in the USA Today Coaches preseason polls. It marks the eighth consecutive season that Louisville has been ranked in the top 10 of the AP preseason poll and the 11th time in the past 12 years and the 12th time in Walz's 16-year tenure. Prior to his arrival, the Cardinals had never been ranked in the AP preseason Top 10.

blocks in each of her first two games with the Cardinals.

■ In the opener against Cincinnati, Jones tallied 14 points, four rebounds, three steals, three blocks and two assists. It was the first time in her career that she had at least three steals and three blocks in the same game.

OPPORTUNITY FOR OLIVIA

Olivia Cochran is set for a big role with the Cardinals in her third year at Louisville. She joins Van Lith as one of two starters returning from last season's Final Four team.

■ Cochran led the Cardinals with a team-high 12 rebounds in the home win over Clemson. It was the fifth game she has had 10 or more rebounds this season and the Cards are 4-1 in those games.

■ On the road against Wake Forest, Cochran scored in double figures with 11 points and led the Cards with six rebounds.

■ Cochran led the Cardinals with 11 rebounds against #20/18 NC State.

■ In the win over Florida State, Cochran tallied 13 points and eight rebounds. It was her ninth game in double figures this season.

■ Cochran led the Cardinals with nine rebounds with eight points, two steals and two blocks in the win over Pitt. It was the second game with multiple steals and multiple blocks.

■ She scored a season-high 15 points and added seven rebounds in the win over Syracuse.

■ Cochran tallied her third double-double of the season in the road win over Pitt. She had 11 points and tied a season high with 13 rebounds.

■ In the win over Bellarmine, Cochran led the Cardinals with eight rebounds and had five points, two steals and a block.

■ Cochran scored in double figures for the second-straight game and third time in the last four games against SIUE. She had 12 points on 6-of-8 shooting with five rebounds.

■ She led the Cardinals with a team-high and season-high 14 points against Middle Tennessee. It is the first time she has led the team in scoring this season and she added seven rebounds.

■ Cochran picked up her second double-double of the season in the win over Longwood on Nov. 25. She tallied 10 points and 10 rebounds and was one of six Cardinal players to score in double figures in the win.

■ She had a party on her birthday in the road win over Belmont. Cochran was a force on the boards and tallied a season-high 13 rebounds to go with 13 points. It was the second-straight game a Cardinal recorded a double-double. Cochran also led the team with three assists, including the assist on Mykasa Robinson's go-ahead layup with 1:45 left in the game.

■ In the win over IUPUI on Nov. 10, Cochran was one of four Cardinals to score in double figures (11 pts.).

■ Cochran was named to the Katrina McClain Watch List for the second-straight season prior to the 2022-23 season.

■ Cochran is coming off a sophomore season where she started 32 games and averaged 8.6 points and is the team's leading rebounder returning with 5.1 per game. In ACC play, ranked fourth on the team with 9.7 points per game, while pulling down 5.8 rebounds per game.

■ She scored in double-figures 11 times in 2021-22 and had 10 or more rebounds twice, including a career-high 13 in the road win over Georgia Tech.

LOUISVILLE PICKED AS LEAGUE FAVORITE IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

Louisville was selected as the ACC favorite for the third time in the previous four seasons. The Cardinals received 31 of the total 60 first place votes as four different teams earned first place votes in the Blue-Ribbon Poll. The Cardinals have won the ACC regular season title in four of the last five seasons.

CONTAINING TOP SCORERS

The Cardinals have been able to stifle some of the top scorers in the country this season, holding them below their season-averages.

■ Louisville contained Deja Kelly to 3-for-16 (.188) shooting with 13 points on Feb. 5. It was the third-worst shooting effort for Kelly at that point in the season. Kelly currently ranks fifth in the ACC with 16.7 points per game.

■ The Cardinals held Ta'Niya Latson to 11 points on 3-of-16 shooting (.188) in their matchup on Jan. 15. It was a season low mark in field goals and field goal percentage for Latson and the second fewest points she had scored at that point in the season. She currently ranks seventh in the country with 22.1 points per game.

■ Louisville limited Dyashia Fair to 13 points on 3-of-18 shooting (.167) on Dec. 29. It marked the fewest field goals made and lowest field goal percentage for Fair at that point in the season. She currently ranks 21st in the country and is second in the ACC with 19.9 points per game.

■ The Cardinals held Aneesah Morrow to 17 points on 6-of-24 shooting (.250) on Dec. 21. It was the second fewest field goals made in a game and the second lowest field goal percentage for Morrow at that point in the season. She currently ranks fourth in the NCAA with 25.5 points per game.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Cardinals are 9-5 in true road games this season and 61-12 since the start of the 2017-18 season. Louisville is third in the NCAA in road wins and fifth in winning percentage (.836) over that span. The nine road wins are second in the ACC and only trail Duke, who has 10 this season.

70-PLUS POINTS

The Cardinals are 77-3 in their last 80 games when they have scored 70 points or more, dating back to the 2018-19 season. UofL is 306-26 when surpassing the 70-point plateau under Walz.

50/50

Louisville is 8-2 this season when shooting 50 percent or better from the floor. Overall, they boast a 142-3 record when shooting 50 percent or better from the field under Walz.

ONE OF THE BEST IN THE COUNTRY

Louisville has been one of the best teams in the country since the start of the 2017-18 season. The Cardinals have totaled 171 wins and an .856 winning percentage. The 171 wins ranks fourth and the winning percentage ranks fifth in the NCAA during that span.

SUCCESS AGAINST UNRANKED TEAMS

Louisville is 181-9 in their last 190 games against unranked opponents. From 2015 to 2019, Louisville won 102 consecutive games against teams not ranked in the AP Top 25.

CHALLENGING NON-CONFERENCE SCHEDULE

Louisville went up against a number of tough opponents in their non-conference slate this season.

■ **NCAA Foes** - Eight of their non-conference opponents reached the 2022 NCAA Tournament and they also faced a team that made the WNIT semifinals (Middle Tennessee). In the Bahamas, the Cardinals went against South Dakota State, the WNIT Champions from a season ago. Of the 13 non-conference games, 10 were against either NCAA Tournament teams or teams that made the WNIT semifinals or farther.

■ **Second Round or Further** - Of the eight NCAA tournament teams from a season ago, four made it to the second round or further. Gonzaga made it to the second round before falling to the Cardinals in Louisville. Belmont reached the second round after upsetting #5-seed Oregon. Ohio State reached the Sweet Sixteen before falling to Texas. Texas made the Elite Eight before falling to NCAA Semifinalist Stanford.

■ **Away From Home** - The Cardinals were away from home for a majority of the non-conference slate. They played five true road games and had three games in the Bahamas for the Battle 4 Atlantis Tournament. The Cardinals were just one of two teams (South Carolina) in the Top-10 of the Preseason AP Poll that will play five true road games during non-conference play.

EXPERIENCE AND SCORING NOT A PROBLEM FOR THE CARDS

The Cardinals have seven new faces on the squad heading into the 2022-23 season but the team does not have an issue with experience or scoring. Of the 14 players on the roster, five are graduate students and four are juniors or older.

■ **Games on games on games** - Louisville has nine players on the roster that have played in 60 or more collegiate games. Five of those players have tallied over 100 career games with Liz Dixon leading the way with 155 games played. Mykasa Robinson (153), Morgan Jones (143), Josie Williams (134) and Chrislyn Carr (123) are the four other players with over 100 games played.

■ **Scoring Touch** - A number of Cardinals player have the ability to light it up from the floor. Five different players have tallied at least one 20-point game in their careers and three players have had 10 or more 20-point games. In total, there have been 67 20-point games by Cardinals players in their careers. Hailey Van Lith leads the way with 24, Chrislyn Carr is right behind with 18, Josie Williams has 11, Morgan Jones has 10 and Liz Dixon has had four.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

Louisville returns seven players from last year's team, brings in seven newcomers and had six departures, including honorable mention All-American Emily Engstler.

■ **Returnees** - In addition to the four players that have career starts, the Cardinals return Norika Konno, Merissah Russell and Alexia Mobley. Van Lith was named the 2022 Wichita Region Most Outstanding Player after having four 20+ point games to start the 2022 NCAA Tournament and was also named to the First Team All-ACC. Olivia Cochran started 32 of 33 games played last season and is the leading rebounder returning for the Cardinals. Robinson was one of just two players to be named to the All-ACC Defensive Team in each of the last two seasons. Dixon led the Cardinals for the second-straight season after shooting 57.3 percent from the floor while averaging 5.3 points and 3.1 rebounds per game.

■ **Newcomers** - Louisville brings in Florida State transfer Morgan Jones, Syracuse transfer Chrislyn Carr and Utah Valley transfer Josie Williams, along with four freshmen Zyanna Walker, Nyla Harris, Jalyn Brown and Imani Lester. Jones was a 1,000-point scorer during her career at Florida State and is a two-time WBCA Honorable Mention All-American and was named to the First Team All-ACC last season. Carr began her career at Texas Tech before playing last season at Syracuse. She led the Orange in field goal percentage last season (.440) and was second on the team in points per game (14.2). Josie Williams was First Team All-WAC in each of the last two seasons. In 2021-22, she was fourth in the NCAA and set a school record with 24 double-doubles after averaging 17.3 points

HAILEY VAN LITH AND MORGAN JONES NAMED TO PRESEASON ALL-ACC TEAM, NAISMITH AWARD WOMEN'S WATCH LIST, WOODEN AWARD PRESEASON WATCH LIST

Hailey Van Lith and Morgan Jones were both named to the Preseason First Team All-ACC, the conference announced on Oct. 13. The duo was also named as two of 50 on the initial Naismith Award Women's Watch List, that was announced on Nov. 4. They also got named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 Watch List, that was announced on Nov. 15.

■ **Van Lith** - Van Lith started all 34 games last season for the Cardinals and led the team in scoring with 14.4 points per game. In ACC Play, she ranked sixth in the league with 15.4 points per game, while shooting 45.7 percent from the floor, which ranked eighth. She reached double figures in 14 of 17 ACC games, including four 20-plus point performances and a 34-point game at Clemson. Van Lith was named a preseason All-American by The Athletic prior to this season.

■ **Jones** - She eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau in her last season at Florida State. She led the Seminoles with 13.8 points per game and she was named to the First Team All-ACC for the second-straight season. Jones was also named a second team Senior CLASS Award All-American and earned honorable mention All-American status from the WBCA for the second-straight year.

FIVE PLAYERS NAMED TO POSITION AWARD WATCH LISTS

Chrislyn Carr, Hailey Van Lith, Morgan Jones, Olivia Cochran and Josie Williams were all named to their position award watch list. Louisville is only one of three schools (Texas and Tennessee) that had a player named on each of the five positional watch lists.

■ **Carr named to Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List** - Carr comes to Louisville after spending the 2021-22 season at Syracuse. With the Orange, she started in all 29 games and led the team in field goal percentage (.440) and was second on the team in points per game (14.2). Prior to Syracuse, she began her college career at Texas Tech. While with the Red Raiders, she was named the 2019 Big 12 Freshman of the Year and was a two-time All-Big 12 Honorable Mention (2019, 2020). The Lieberman Award recognizes the top point guards.

■ **Van Lith named to Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Watch List** - Van Lith started all 34 games last season and led the team in scoring with 14.4 points per game. She earned First Team All-ACC honors and broke out during the 2022 NCAA Tournament. She tallied 20-plus points in each of the first four games of the tournament and was named the Wichita Region Most Outstanding Player. She was the only player in the NCAA Tournament to have four 20-plus point games and the next closest player only had two. She was named to the preseason All-ACC team and a preseason All-American by The Athletic. The Meyers Drysdale Award recognizes the top shooting guards.

■ **Jones named to Cheryl Miller Award Watch List** - Jones comes to the Cardinals after beginning her collegiate career at Florida State. While with the Seminoles, Jones was a two-time WBCA Honorable Mention All-American in her last two seasons and was also named to the All-ACC First Team in her previous two seasons. In her senior season with Florida State, Jones led the Seminoles in scoring (13.8) and was also named a second team All-American by the Senior CLASS Award. The Miller Award recognizes the top small forwards.

■ **Cochran named to Katrina McClain Award Watch List** - Cochran is one of two players returning that started over 30 games last season and is the team's leading rebounder returning. She averaged 8.6 points and 5.1 rebounds last season and it is the second-straight season she was named to the McClain Award Watch List. In the Elite Eight win over Michigan, Cochran scored six-straight points to extend the Cardinals lead to eight with just 33 seconds remaining. The McClain Award recognizes the top power forwards.

■ **Williams named to Lisa Leslie Award Watch List** - Williams comes to the Cardinals after beginning her collegiate career at Utah Valley. In her final two seasons with the Wolverines, she was selected to the All-WAC First Team both seasons. In her senior season, she set a program single season record with 24 double-doubles, which was tied for fourth in the country that season. She averaged 17.3 points per game and 12.4 rebounds per game in her senior season. The 12.4 rebounds per game were the second highest in program history for a single season and it ranked fifth overall in the NCAA last season. The Leslie Award recognizes the top centers.

MOST UOFL VICTORIES

UofL's 29 wins last year rank fifth all-time. The top eight and 12 of the 13 top win totals have come under Walz.

ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

UofL defeated Boston College 62-52 on Feb. 19 to reach 20 wins for the 13th-straight season and extend the program record. The longest run previously was three, achieved twice. The Cards have won at least 20 games in 15 of Walz's 16 seasons. Prior to Walz's arrival, Louisville had just 10 20-win seasons in its history.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UofL went 16-0 at the KFC Yum! Center last season, marking the first time they have finished undefeated at the KFC Yum! Center. They finished the regular season a perfect 14-0 at home. Two other times, Louisville finished undefeated at home. In 1996-97, they were 11-0 at home and 20-9 overall and in 2000-01 they finished 13-0 at home and 19-10 overall. In 2013-14, they won their first 17 games at home and finished 18-2. The Cardinals program record for consecutive home wins is 21 games, a streak that spanned over three seasons. Over the past six seasons, Louisville is 86-6 at home.

BEST FANS IN THE COUNTRY

Last season, Louisville averaged 8,361 fans at the KFC Yum! Center, which topped the ACC and ranked fourth in the country. The 8,361 fans per game would rank eighth in ACC men's basketball. For 12 straight seasons, they have led the ACC and ranked in the top five in the country in attendance. They had a season-high 12,167 fans vs. Kentucky. It marked the largest attendance since they had 12,193 vs. Miami on Feb. 7, 2019.

NCAA TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

Louisville has been one of the most consistent teams in the NCAA Tournament over the past four seasons. Louisville is the only program in the country to be a No. 1 seed in three of the last four full season. The Cardinals are just one of two teams (UConn) to make the Elite Eight in each of the past four tournaments. Louisville is just one of five programs (UConn, Stanford, South Carolina, Notre Dame) to make four or more Final Fours in the last 15 seasons.

WALZ IN THE BIG DANCE

Walz boasts a 37-13 record in NCAA Tournament games. He is eighth all-time in winning percentage and 5th among active coaches. He has directed UofL to a pair of national runner-up finishes (2009, 2013), four Final Fours (2009, 2013, 2018, 2022), seven Elite Eights (2009, 2013, 2014, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022), 11 trips to the Sweet 16 and 13 NCAA Tournaments. Walz is one of five active head coaches to make four or more Final Fours.

She competed against Team USA and former Cardinal Emily Engstler.

■ **Canada** - Last spring, Merissah Russell competed for the Canadian National Team at the FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup 2022 Qualifying Tournament in Osaka, Japan. She had two points in the 86-79 loss to Japan and then had five points in the 96-64 win over Bosnia and Herzegovina.

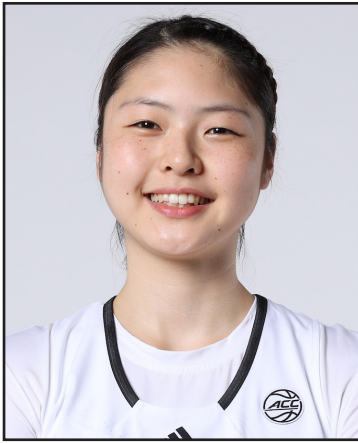
