DR. JULIO FRENK

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT
UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL
AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979

A fourth-generation physician whose paternal grandparents fled Germany in the early 1930s to build a new life in Mexico, Julio Frenk catalyzed his deep gratitude for the kindness of strangers into a lifelong mission to improve the health, education, and well-being of people around the world.

Dr. Frenk became the sixth president of the University of Miami in August of 2015. He also holds academic appointments as Professor of Public Health Sciences at the Leonard M. Miller School of Medicine and as Professor of Health Sector Management and Policy at the Business School.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, he was the dean for nearly seven years of the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and the T & G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Julio Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. There he pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal coverage, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for more than 55 million previously uninsured Mexicans.

He was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of its kind in the developing world. He also served as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy at the World Health Organization and as senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, among other leadership positions.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint Ph.D. in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan. He has received honorary degrees from ten universities. His scholarly production, which includes over 170 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, has been cited around 19.000 times.

He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, the U.S. National Academy of Medicine, and the National Academy of Medicine of Mexico. He serves on the boards of the United Nations Foundation and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. He has received numerous recognitions, including the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health, the Bouchet Medal for Outstanding Leadership presented by Yale University for promoting diversity in graduate education, and the Welch-Rose Award for Distinguished Service from the Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health.In 2017, he was elected as a member of El Colegio Nacional, one of the most prestigious groups of intellectuals, artists, writers, and scientists of Mexico.

Julio Frenk was born in Mexico City in December 1953. He is married to Dr. Felicia Knaul, a social sector economist, and has four children.

In summary, Dr. Julio Frenk has an extensive professional record spanning three decades and a career that has included leadership positions in all relevant aspects of public health and higher education: research, teaching, analysis of public policies, institution-building, international cooperation, and national public service. He has also been involved in various initiatives to reform higher education.



DR. MARVIN DAWKINS

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his 11th year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that role.

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and ACC.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports.

He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in American Behavioral Scientist (2012). He has published widely in these areas. Dr. Dawkins is coauthor (with Graham C. Kinloch) of the book, African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era (Praeger, 2000). His most recent publications include "African American Golf Clubs in the Early Development of Black Golf" in The Western Journal of Black Studies (2018) and "Challenges to Title IX: A Critical Race Perspective" in The Negro Educational Review (2019). Dr. Dawkins serves as the University of Miami's Faculty Athletics Representative to the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). He served as ACC President for 20172018. Dr. Dawkins is also a member of the Museum Committee of the United States Golf Association (USGA).



DAN RADAKOVICH

VICE PRESIDENT
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS
INDIANA (PA.), 1980

Dan Radakovich was named the 14th Director of Athletics in University of Miami history on December 8, 2021, returning to his graduate school alma mater as one of the nation's most decorated and successful college athletics administrators.

Radakovich, who most recently served as Director of Athletics at Clemson for nine years, launched his career at UM in 1983 as the Hurricanes' athletic business manager, an experience which charted a course that has now spanned seven schools and 30-plus years as a visionary leader in all aspects of college athletics.

"This is a significant moment for the future of athletics at the University of Miami," University President Julio Frenk said upon Radakovich's hire. "Dan is one of the most highly regarded athletics directors in the country. He knows Miami well, from his time at the U and at Clemson, an ACC peer. His proven success, and the success that Dan has helped enable for student-athletes in the classroom and in competition, is reflective of our values. He has the experience, the relationships, and the passion it takes to ignite and sustain excellence—the very core of our bold vision for the future of Hurricanes Athletics."

In his first six months in Coral Gables, Radakovich has worked with campus leaders to chart an ambitious course for Miami Athletics with respect to facilities, sport sponsorship, fundraising and staff development. He has hired two new head coaches (golf, rowing) and extended the contracts of five others. He has worked closely with new football head coach Mario Cristobal to ramp up recruiting, evaluation, sports science and creative resources. He has presided over a department that produced its 84th individual national champion (diver Mia Vallée); its first men's basketball Elite Eight appearance; its first ACC Tournament final appearance for women's basketball; its fourth women's track and field ACC outdoor title; its highest season-ending women's tennis ranking since 2013; and the rowing team's first CRCA poll ranking in program history.

Miami was one of just two schools (along with North Carolina) this past season to have its football team qualify for a bowl game, its men's basketball team reach the Sweet 16 and its baseball team host a regional. In addition, UM was one of just three schools (along with Michigan and Tennessee) to have its teams advance to the postseason in football, men's basketball, baseball, women's basketball and women's volleyball.

Radakovich is the immediate past President of LEAD1, which represents athletic directors at the Division I level. He was named 2017 SportsBusiness Journal Athletic Director of the Year after being a finalist in 2015. In 2014, Radakovich was one of 13 people, including one of only five FBS Directors of Athletics, to be named to first College Football Playoff committee.

At Clemson, Radakovich oversaw the most successful stretch in Tigers football history as the program won two national championships (2016, 2018), six ACC titles and made six College Football Playoff appearances.

Radakovich continuously led the Tigers athletic department to high achievements, both on the field and in the classroom, while developing significant upgrades in finance and facilities.

Clemson set a school record in the NCAA's most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) report, posting a 95 percent score, which also tied for first in the ACC amongst public schools. Eight Tigers programs earned perfect scores. Clemson student-athletes recorded nine semesters with

a 3.0 GPA or higher, including a record 3.57 GPA in the spring of 2020. Radakovich guided the department successfully throughout the pandemic, helping Clemson to reopen athletic operations, including safely hosting 112,367 fans at Memorial Stadium in 2020, third most in the nation.

In 2020-21, Clemson had its best finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup since 2007, finishing No. 36. Highlighting the athletic year, the football program claimed the ACC title and appeared in the College Football Playoff, the men's soccer program claimed the 2020 ACC championship, and the women's soccer program advanced to the Elite Eight. Additionally, Radakovich oversaw the development of the softball program at Clemson, which officially began in the spring of 2020. That program earned the ACC regular-season championship in 2021 and made its first trip to the NCAA Tournament. Clemson also made NCAA appearances in men's basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field and men's and women's golf.

During Radakovich's tenure, IPTAY, the school's fundraising arm, saw significant increases in contributions and he was instrumental along with the IPTAY Board of Directors in the Cornerstone Partner Program, which together has helped fund numerous investments in infrastructure and the student-athlete experience.

During the 2018-19 school year, Clemson won its second football national championship in three years, defeating Alabama 44-16. During the 2017-18 school year, Clemson became the first school in history to reach the College Football Playoff, advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament and host a baseball regional in the same season.

Since 2013, Clemson received approvals for more than \$200 million in facility improvements and increased spending on direct student-athlete development programs, including nutrition, mental health and professional development, by \$2.4 million. His department increased overall revenue from \$69 million in fiscal year 2014 to a budgeted \$131 million in fiscal year 2020. Littlejohn Coliseum opened to rave reviews following a \$63 million renovation. The Allen N. Reeves Football Complex opened in 2017, setting the standard for football facilities around the country. The Nieri Family Student-Athlete Enrichment Center opened as a state-of-the-art facility for student-athlete development in the classroom and community. The development, rebranding and expansion of football's P.A.W. Journey highlighted a best-in-class approach to preparation for life after their Clemson football careers.

Prior to his arrival, Radakovich amassed a wealth of experience serving in significant athletic administrative roles at Georgia Tech, LSU, American, South Carolina, Long Beach State and UM.

Radakovich came to Clemson from Georgia Tech, where he served as Director of Athletics for six years (2006-12). Prior to his tenure at Georgia Tech, Radakovich worked as a Senior Associate Athletic Director at LSU from 2001-06. He had many responsibilities that dealt with the football program and worked closely with then-head coach Nick Saban, including the year the Tigers won the national title in 2003.

From 2000-01 Radakovich was Director of Athletics at American University. Between 1994 and 2000, he served as Chief Financial Officer at South Carolina. He gained experience on the West Coast from 1989-94, when he was a Senior Associate Athletic Director at Long Beach State. Radakovich worked at The U from 1983-85 as Athletics Business Manager.

Radakovich, a native of Aliquippa, Pa., is a 1980 graduate of Indiana (Pa.), where he earned a bachelor's degree in finance. He was also a football letterman and student coach with the Crimson Hawk program, and he was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2021. He previously was enshrined into the Beaver County Sports Hall of Fame in 2008 and was recognized as a distinguished alumnus from Indiana in 2009.

Radakovich and his wife, Marcie, have two sons, Christian, a 2012 Georgia Tech graduate, and Grant, a 2015 Mercer graduate who was a tight end on Clemson's 2016 national championship football team.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS SWA

PENNSYLVANIA, 1998

Jennifer Strawley currently serves as the Senior Deputy Director of Athletics for the University of Miami, where she oversees all day-to-day operations of the department with all areas of the organization, outside of facilities and development reporting directly to Strawley. She works closely with the Director of Athletics on all department activities to ensure Miami is best positioned for success.

Currently serving as the department's second-in-command, Strawley works with the Director of Athletics, University leadership, and campus and community partners to support and advance the success of the Miami Hurricanes. She provides leadership for the administration of all of the 17 of Miami sports programs and the athletics senior administration.

Strawley, who served as Interim Director of Athletics from November 2021 through January 2022, is the sport administrator for football and women's basketball and also serves as the department's Senior Women Administrator.

Strawley has been at Miami since 2012 and played a key role in the hiring of several head coaches including current head coach Mario Cristobal. She was instrumental in the development of Miami's annual Celebration of Women's Athletics recognizing the achievements of Miami's female student-athletes while raising money to support women's athletics.

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC including serving on the NCAA Women's Basketball Oversight Committee, the NCAA Championships Finance Review Working Group, the NCAA Football Recruiting Working Group and the NCAA Men's Basketball Non-Scholastic Working Group. In addition, Strawley has served on the ACC Board of Directors as the chair of the ACC Senior Women Administrator group, the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee and the ACC

Football Schedulers Group. She also has served on the Board of Directors for Women's Leaders in College Sports and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to UM, Strawley concluded her second tour with the NCAA as the Director of Academic and Membership Affairs. In this role, Strawley was instrumental in providing leadership in the areas of academic governance and development of academic policy. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 2007-10. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and

diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the student- athlete reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees and task forces, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees, the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee, and the working group appointed to review trends in initial eligibility.

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. She was inducted into the William Tennent High School Athletics Hall of Fame in January of 2014. Strawley was named the Women's Basketball Coaches' Association Administrator of the Year in 2021.



JASON LAYTON

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS ST. LEO, 1999

Jason Layton serves as the University of Miami Deputy Director of Athletics, a position he took over in August 2017. He initially joined Miami in December 2014 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's marketing, digital strategies, communications, ticket sales, ticket operations, client experience, video production and broadcast departments.

Additionally, Layton has oversight of all departmental licensing matters, Hurricane Global Partnerships and serves as the department ACC Network liaison.

Since his arrival, Miami has seen exceptional growth in ticket sales and video production services in both content and broadcast with ESPN and the newly formed ACC Network.

Under his watch, Miami has seen an increased level of season ticket sales in football and men's basketball. Under Layton's guidance, Miami saw an unprecedented growth in football attendance during the 2016 season, as the Hurricanes totaled 42,000 season ticket holders and averaged 58,572 fans per game – the 27th-highest total in the nation and leader among all Power Five schools in percentage increase on a year-to-year basis (23 percent).

In addition, Miami sold out its entire 2015-16 and 2016-17 men's basketball season ticket allotment, marking the first time in Hurricane Athletics history that a team has sold out its entire season ticket allotment in back-to-back seasons.

Layton also serves as the primary contact for ESPN with the recent launch of the ACC Network, first in digital format in August 2016 and

building to the linear network in fall of 2019. Since 2015, Miami has produced over 200 live events on ESPN3/ACC Network Extra – a figure that ranks near the top of all ACC schools.

Layton, a Florida native, arrived in Miami after spending the 2013 and 2014 seasons at Colorado State University where he served as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing. During his time in Fort Collins, Colo., Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

Before his arrival at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled a variety of responsibilities from sales, marketing, ticketing and luxury suite operations to advertising, accounting, finance and purchasing. Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011. Layton received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Saint Leo University in Saint Leo, Fla.



SAVANNA WOOD

EXECUTIVE ASSOCIATE AD BRAND & MARKETING STRATEGY FLORIDA, 2015

Savanna Wood currently serves as the Executive Associate Athletics Director of Brand and Marketing Strategy.

In her current role at the University of Miami, Wood has oversight of graphic design, video content, broadcast, communications, digital strategy, consumer marketing and event presentation and is responsible for implementing a long-term digital roadmap strategy that drives innovation across multiple digital verticals in order to increase overall brand reach and achieve defined revenue goals.

Additionally, Wood serves as a liaison with the global partnerships team to implement and maximize partner activations, leads game day marketing operations and manages all athletics facility branding efforts.

Prior to arriving at UM, Wood led marketing, social and digital partnerships for Thrill One Sports and Entertainment – the leading global action sports firm – marketing and executing events in 27 states and four continents and building up brands in multiple across multiple areas of entertainment.

Before moving to California, Wood worked for the Jacksonville Jaguars (NFL) for six seasons – ultimately leading their digital and consumer marketing strategy, overseeing all digital properties and driving innovation and execution for more than 110 activating partners. Shirelle Jackson is the Executive Associate Athletic Director of Student-Athlete Development at the University of Miami. Jackson initially joined Miami as the director of student-athlete development in March 2014 and was promoted to assistant AD in July 2016. Jackson also oversees the Hurricanes' track and field and cross country programs.

Prior to joining the athletics department, Jackson spent the previous five years in various capacities in the College of Arts and Sciences at UM. In 2014, Jackson received the Department of Biology Excellence in Service Award, for her efforts with 800 + Biology majors.

Her initial position within athletics was a new role intended to enhance the athletic department's efforts to develop programming which will enhance the total development of our student-athletes. Under her vision and leadership that role has grown into an office

with two full time staff members and year round programming and leadership opportunities for our student athlete population. Due to the high level of community outreach, in 2018, the Miami Hurricanes earned the NCAA Helper-Helper Division I Community Service National Championship Award.

In addition to community service & outreach efforts, Jackson has been a featured panelist & speaker for the Women In Sports Forum, 2016 and 2018. She also served in the same capacity for Women Leaders in College Sports (formerly NACWAA) during their Institute for Administrative Advancement, 2019. In 2016, Jackson received the Women Leaders Nell Jackson Administrator of the Year Award for her efforts engaging student-athletes, department staff & campus partners with an inclusive environment.

Prior to arriving at UM, Shirelle was the director of athletic academic support services from 2005-08 at FIU, where she oversaw the management and operation of the school's academic support program for its 400 student-athletes. She also coordinated the academic and personal advising, class registration, tutors, study hall and study skills workshops. During her tenure at FIU, she saw her full-time staff increase from two to six and the student-athlete graduation rate improved by 16 percent.

She was the assistant director for student-athlete services for 11 months at Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. Her first athletics position was as assistant AD for student development from August 2002-July 2004 at Eastern Connecticut State.

Jackson was a two-year letter winner for the women's track and field team at Bowling Green. She received her bachelor's degree from Bowling Green in 1994 and her master's degree in counseling from Central Connecticut State in 1998. She is currently a doctoral candidate in higher education leadership at Nova Southeastern in Davie.

PAIGE YAROSHUK-TEWS

HEAD COACH

26TH SEASON (22nd as HC) | UCLA, 1996

An outstanding recruiter with unrivaled knowledge of the game and passion for teaching, the 2022-23 season marks the 26th illustrious year for Paige Yaroshuk-Tews with the University of Miami women's tennis team, including her 22nd as head coach.

The program's all-time winningest coach, Yaroshuk-Tews has turned the Hurricanes into a force nationally, leading Miami to the NCAA's Elite Eight in eight of the last 18 tournaments, the seventh-most quarterfinal appearances in the nation during that span. The Hurricanes have also made the Sweet 16 on 14 occasions during that stretch, one of eight programs to do so.

In her 21 years at Miami, Yaroshuk-Tews boasts an overall record of 396-138 (.742) and an ACC career record of 165-47 (.778). As a result of her unparalleled achievements, Yaroshuk-Tews was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 2012.

Yaroshuk-Tews' desire to make Miami a national title contender on a yearly basis has helped the program consistently flourish with all-conference and All-American talent. The Hurricanes have not only made the NCAA Team Championship in each of her years as head coach—excluding 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the postseason—but have also won at least one NCAA match every season. UM qualified for the ITA National Team Indoor Championships 12 straight years, from 2005-16, and was ranked in the top 10 at some point during the season in each of those campaigns, as well as during the recent 2022 season. Yaroshuk-Tews annually brings in some of the top prep talent, reloading year in and year out for a program consistently ranked among the nation's best.

Since taking the head coaching position for the women's tennis program at Miami in 2001, Yaroshuk-Tews has led the Hurricanes on an unprecedented run in Coral Gables, Fla. In total, she has directed Miami to 14 Sweet 16 berths, eight Elite Eight trips and an appearance in the 2006 NCAA final, the program's first since 1985.

Miami has hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Team Championship 14 times under Yaroshuk-Tews, including 12 straight years each from 2005-2016. The Hurricanes have turned in 19 straight ITA top-25 finishes, including 14 in the top 15. In nine of the last 16 completed seasons, Miami has ended the year in the top 10.

Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews has guided two players to NCAA Singles Championship crowns, as Audra Cohen won the hardware in 2007 and Estela Perez-Somarriba did so in 2019. Miami is one of just three schools with multiple NCAA singles titles in the past 15 tournaments, alongside Stanford and Virginia. Six Hurricanes have combined for nine semifinals berths during that stretch, with both totals the highest marks of any program since 2007. Three players have also combined for four finals appearances in that span, both second-most of any school.

Yaroshuk-Tews also helped a Miami duo reach in the 2022 NCAA Doubles Championship, a first for The U since 1988. It marked the third consecutive tournament the Hurricanes made the finals in either the singles or doubles event, as well as the sixth time in seven years Miami made the semifinals in either field.

Eighteen different Hurricanes have garnered a total of 37 ITA All-American honors under Yaroshuk-Tews, both program records for a coach. In 18 of her 21 seasons, at least one Hurricane has been named an All-American, with multiple players receiving the honor in 11 of them. Under Yaroshuk-Tews' watch, 19 Hurricanes have combined for 41 All-ACC distinctions and 31 Miami players have totaled 56 Academic All-ACC recognitions. In addition, four Hurricanes have totaled six ACC Player of the Year plaudits and four have combined for six ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors.

Most recently, Miami registered a 19-6 (10-3 ACC) ledger in 2022, advancing to the NCAA Team Championship Sweet 16 and finishing ninth in the country. It marked the team's best year-end ranking since placing eighth in 2013. The Hurricanes took down six top-25 teams, including five in the top 20, and reached the ACC Championship semifinals for the sixth time in a row. Daevenia Achong and Eden Richardson made it all the way to the NCAA Doubles Championship title match, the third pair to do so in program history, on the way to finishing sixth in the ITA rankings, claiming ITA All-America status and making the ITA Collegiate All-Star Team. Both players were First Team All-ACC honorees, played in the NCAA Singles Championship and finished top-50 nationally in singles, while Isabella Pfennig received Third Team All-ACC plaudits and took the No. 88 spot in the final rankings. Achong won both the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Award for Leadership & Sportsmanship and the ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award, while Alex Santos received ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year distinction. A program record six Hurricanes made the All-ACC Academic Team, as well.

The Hurricanes posted a 15-9 (8-5 ACC) mark in 2021, reaching the second round of the NCAA Team Championship and finishing No. 20 nationally. Miami earned two top-10 wins, knocking off eighth-ranked Virginia at home and sixth-ranked Florida State in the ACC Championship to reach the semifinals for the fifth consecutive time. Estela Perez-Somarriba logged a 24-3 singles mark on her way to reaching the NCAA Singles Championship title match for the second straight time and claiming ITA National Player of the Year honors as the country's top-ranked player. She finished her illustrious career at 165-26, good for the second-most wins in ACC history, and also earned ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, ITA Senior Player of the Year and ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award. She and Isabella Pfennig, who ended the year ranked No. 26 nationally, both garnered ITA All-America and All-ACC status, with the latter winning ITA Southeast Region Rookie of the Year. Two Hurricane duos competed in the NCAA Doubles Championship, each finishing top-30 nationally.

Miami notched a 6-4 (3-2 ACC) record during the 2020 campaign. The team did not play past February, as the season ended prematurely

due to the COVID-19 pandemic. All four of the Hurricanes' setbacks were against top-20 teams, including two in the top five, and the team also notched a top-20 road win. Estela Perez-Somarriba broke the program's career singles wins record, becoming Yaroshuk-Tews' fourth pupil to top the charts. The Madrid native, who won ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year and ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award plaudits, also peaked at first nationally and held the second position when play ended. No ACC postseason accolades were awarded due to the pandemic, but Perez-Somarriba did win her fourth ITA All-America distinction.

The Hurricanes logged a 19-8 ledger in 2019, finishing 9-5 in ACC action and falling one point shy of the NCAA Sweet 16. Miami posted five top-25 wins, including defeating ninth-ranked NC State, 4-2, to reach the ACC Championship semifinals for the sixth time in seven years and fourth in a row. Yaroshuk-Tews guided her team to the No. 20 spot in the final ITA rankings, the 15th top-20 finish in a 16-year period. Estela Perez-Somarriba won the NCAA Singles Championship title and went 43-5, claiming ACC Player of the Year, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, ITA All-America and ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award honors, while ending the season ranked second nationally. Freshman Daevenia Achong earned Second Team All-ACC accolades, as well as joined Perez-Somarriba and three other Hurricanes on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Miami posted an 18-8 mark in 2018, including an 11-3 record in ACC play. After a one-year hiatus, the Hurricanes again hosted the opening two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and advanced to the Sweet 16. Yaroshuk-Tews' team ended the season ranked No. 17 nationally, good for a 14th top-20 finish in a 15-year span. Estela Perez-Somarriba was named the ACC Player of the

Year and the ITA National Player to Watch, finishing with ITA All-America accolades, First Team All-ACC distinction, a 39-8 record and the fifth spot in the final ITA rankings. Sinead Lohan, who finished her career with the fourth-most singles wins in school history (130), became Miami's third four-time All-ACC honoree and won the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award.

Despite dealing with significant injuries throughout the 2017 campaign, Yaroshuk-Tews oversaw the team's 22nd consecutive NCAA Team Championship berth and 21st winning season in a row. The Hurricanes finished 13-12, concluded the campaign ranked No. 25 nationally and reached the second round of NCAA play. Miami had two First Team All-ACC honorees for the second straight year, as Sinead Lohan and Estela Perez-Somarriba both garnered the recognition. Perez-Somarriba, an ITA All-American, became the first Hurricane freshman to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, giving Miami a semifinalist for the third season in a row.

Yaroshuk-Tews, en route to ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year distinction, guided Miami to a 21-6 record in 2016, the team's 11th 20-win season in a 13-year span. The Hurricanes went 12-2 in the ACC for the third year in a row, finishing in second place, and reached the ACC Championship final for the sixth time in 12 seasons in the ACC. Miami advanced to the Sweet 16 for the 11th year in a row and ended the campaign ranked No. 10 in the nation, its 13th straight top-15 finish and eighth top-10 finish in the last 11 years. Sinead Lohan, Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang combined for a total of four ITA All-American distinctions. Wagner, the ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year, broke the program's career wins record, finishing with 134. The All-American trio combined for six ACC Player of the Week honors, with Wagner winning four, the most by anyone since 2012, to conclude her career with eight. Lohan went 40-6 in singles, tied for the third-most wins in a season by a Miami player, and became the seventh different Hurricane to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, including the sixth under Yaroshuk-Tews.

The Hurricanes went 18-7 in 2015 and finished second in the ACC at 12-2. Miami reached the Sweet 16 for the 10th year in a row and earned a 12th consecutive top-15 finish. The team also finished in the top four of the ACC for the 11th straight year, each one since it joined the conference. On an individual level, Yaroshuk-Tews guided both Sinead Lohan and Stephanie Wagner to ITA All-American honors. Both of them reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the third time ever—all under the direction of Yarosuk-Tews—two Hurricanes did so the same year. Wagner was also named the ITA National Player to Watch. UM set a program record with five nationally-ranked singles players in the year-end rankings and tied the top mark set the previous season with six different players ranked in either singles or doubles.

In 2014, Miami posted its sixth consecutive 20-win season and 10th in the last 11 years, finishing at 21-6, with a 12-2 mark in the ACC to tie for first place. The Hurricanes hosted the NCAA Team Championship first and second rounds for the 10th consecutive year and reached the NCAA round of 16 for the ninth straight time. Additionally, UM made the ITA National Team Indoor Championships for the 10th season in a row. Miami ended the year at No. 12 in the nation and two Hurricanes, Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno, earned ITA All-American recognition. Six different Hurricanes ended the season ranked in either singles or doubles, a new program record.

The 2013 season saw Miami win its first ACC Championship title, as the Hurricanes knocked off a trio of top-30 teams in Cary, N.C., including second-ranked North Carolina in the semifinals. Miami went on to finish 23-6, marking the most wins for the program since 2009 and the third-most during Yaroshuk-Tews' tenure. The season also marked the fifth consecutive trip to the Elite Eight for the Hurricanes, then the longest streak in the country. UM concluded the year ranked eighth, its fifth straight top-10 finish, and Yaroshuk-Tews was named the ITA Southeast Region

Coach of the Year, while her assistant coach, Alex Santos, was chosen as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

During the 2012 season, the Hurricanes advanced to their fourth consecutive NCAA Team Championship Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion Florida. Miami played host to North Florida and Utah in the first two rounds of the tournament, winning both matches, 4-0. In the Sweet 16, the Hurricanes exacted revenge on ACC foe North Carolina, winning 4-2 to erase the memory of a 4-3 loss to the Tar Heels in the regular season. Miami wound up ninth in the final national rankings, and Anna Bartenstein was named an ITA All-American, making it nine straight seasons Yaroshuk-Tews coached a player who received the honor.

In 2011, Yaroshuk-Tews led Miami on another deep run in the NCAA Team Championship, winning at home in the first two rounds before taking down Michigan in the round of 16 in Stanford, Calif. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked seventh nationally. Also in 2011, senior Bianca Eichkorn became the program's all-time winningest singles player (133 victories) en route to numerous All-America and all-conference honors. Among them, Eichkorn became the fourth UM player in the last seven seasons to be named ACC Player of the Year under Yaroshuk-Tews, who surpassed 200 career wins with Miami's NCAA-opening 4-0 victory May 13 against FIU. Anna Bartenstein was also named an ITA All-American in 2011, making it four straight years the Hurricanes had at least two players garner the accolade.

In 2010, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to the NCAA quarterfinals, a No. 10 final ranking and a 20-6 record, UM's sixth 20-win season in the last seven years. Miami also posted a 10-1 mark in ACC play to finish in second place. For the second straight year-the first time that happened since 1985-86-three Hurricanes earned ITA All-America honors, this time Bianca Eichkorn, Gabriela Mejia and Laura Vallverdu, who also won the Honda Sports Award. Vallverdu was an All-American in singles and doubles, giving Miami four All-America honors for the first time since 1988. Additionally, Vallverdu set the program record for singles wins (131) and became the fourth four-year All-American in program history and the first under Yaroshuk-Tews. Eichkorn and Vallverdu both reached the NCAA Singles Championship quarterfinals, the second straight year two Hurricanes did so after it had not previously happened in program history. Vallverdu made the semifinals, to become the program's first twotime semifinalist.

During the 2009 season, Yaroshuk-Tews claimed the ACC Coach of the Year award after leading UM to a 26-5 mark, its second-best record ever during the NCAA era (1982-present). The Hurricanes went 16-0 at home, captured the ACC regular season title at 10-1 and registered 12 consecutive victories leading into the ACC Championship final. Yaroshuk-Tews saw her team advance to the NCAA guarterfinals and concluded the season seventh in the country, its second best finish of the last 32 years. For the first time since 1988, three UM players were named ITA All-Americans, in Bianca Eichkorn, Julia Cohen and Laura Vallverdu. All three reached the NCAA Singles Championship round of 16, a first in school history. Cohen and Eichkorn became the first Hurricane duo to make the semifinals the same year, and Vallverdu finished as the second finalist in program history. In total, four Hurricanes played in the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the first time that happened, and four Miami duos were listed in the final ITA doubles rankings for the first time ever.

In 2008, Miami finished with a 17-6 overall mark, snapping a string of four consecutive 20-win seasons. The Hurricanes faced 18 ranked opponents and went 12-6 against them. UM hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship for the fourth straight year and reached a third consecutive Sweet 16. The Hurricanes' 6-1 win over No. 45 NC State April 12 gave Yaroshuk-Tews her 132nd victory to pass legendary Miami coach Ivan Duvenhage (1982-88) for the program record. Miami ended the season at No. 14 in the nation and Laura Vallverdu was named an ITA All-American.

During the 2007 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to a 22-7 mark, the team's fourth straight 20-win season and to the NCAA quarterfinals for the second straight season. Miami went 17-1 at home, with the lone loss against eventual NCAA champion Georgia Tech. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked ninth in the nation, their second straight top-10 finish. Audra Cohen and Laura Vallverdu were both named ITA All-Americans, making it three straight years UM had multiple honorees for the first time since 1986-88. Cohen went 42-2 in singles, became the first player in program history win the national title in the NCAA Singles Championship and was also the first to win the Honda Sports Award. She also won her second consecutive ITA National Player of the Year Award and ACC Player of the Year award, making it three straight years a Hurricane earned both accolades. It marked just the second time ever a school had three straight ITA National Player of the Year winners on the women's side, and Cohen was fifth women to win the award in back-to-back years. Cohen ended the season at No. 1 in the nation for the second year in a row, marking the third straight time a UM player finished first, and she was selected to the ITA All-Star Team as well. Three Hurricanes made the NCAA Singles Championship for the third time ever, and first since 1985. Yaroshuk-Tews reached 100 wins with a 6-1 win over eighthranked Baylor Feb. 3, becoming the third coach in program history to get to triple digits. Her assistant coach, David Anderton, garnered the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year award for his work with the team.

The 2006 campaign was a special one for the Miami program, as the Hurricanes advanced to the final of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time since 1985 and the second time ever. UM upset second-ranked Notre Dame in the quarterfinals and third-ranked USC in the semifinals. The impressive run came to an end in the championship match against two-time defending champion and top-seeded Stanford. The Hurricanes finished the season at 24-7 and shared the ACC regular season title for the second straight year. Yaroshuk-Tews' squad came up with big wins against some of the nation's best teams, going 5-3 against top-10 teams, including a 4-2 mark against opponents ranked in the top three. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked fourth in the country, their first top-five finish since 1987 and the fourth-best record in program history during the NCAA era (1982-present).

The same year, Melissa Applebaum and Audra Cohen were both named ITA All-Americans, making it back-to-back years the Hurricanes had a pair of honorees for the first time since the 1987-88 season. Cohen went 34-2 in singles and finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation, the second straight year a Hurricane took the top spot. She was named the ITA National Player of the Year and ACC Player of the Year, making it back-to-back years a Hurricane won both awards, and she was nominated for the Honda Sports Award. Cohen and Applebaum ended the year ranked second nationally in doubles and made the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Both of them were named to the ITA All-Star Team. Additionally, four Hurricanes made the year-end ITA rankings for the first time in 30 years.

The team flourished in 2005 under Yaroshuk-Tews, earning a 21-5 overall record, marking its second consecutive 20-win season. Miami went 9-1 in Atlantic Coast Conference play in its inaugural season in the league to tie for first place and also reached the ACC Championship final. The Hurricanes made the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships and upset fourth-ranked UCLA, 4-3. UM earned an automatic bid to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and fell to California in the second round to snap a 27-match home winning streak. The Hurricanes finished at No. 13 in the nation and both Audrey Bañada and Megan Bradley were named ITA All-Americans, the first time Miami had multiple players earn the honor since 1992. The pair also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship, the first Miami duo to do so since 1992. Bradley set a program record for singles wins with 44, finishing at 44-2 and winning 39 straight matches along the way. She won the ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships title, finished the season ranked first in the nation, made the ITA All-Star Team, and won ACC/UM Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year and ITA National Senior Player of the Year. Additionally, Bradley was the first Hurricane to win ITA National Player of the Year and the first to receive the ACC Player of the Year award. Her ITA national awards were the first by a Hurricane since 1991.

In 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to yet another successful season and earned her second BIG EAST Coach of the Year award. The Hurricanes finished with a 20-4 overall record and were ranked 15th in the final poll, the team's highest ranking since 1991. Miami made the BIG EAST Championship final for the 13th straight year—every one it participated in as a conference member—and won its eighth title. Half the titles and seven of the finals appearances came with Yaroshuk-Tews on the coaching staff. The Hurricanes were part of one of the biggest upsets in collegiate tennis history in 2004. They beat previously undefeated and top-ranked ranked Florida, 4-3, in the second round of the NCAA Team Championship in Gainesville, Fla. Miami had not defeated the Gators since the 1986 season. The Hurricanes advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1999 and defeated No. 11 Tulane, 4-1, to reach the Elite Eight for the first time since the 1986. Megan Bradley was named an ITA All-American, the first Hurricane to garner the honor since 1999, which was also the last time Miami won 20-plus matches. After the season, Yaroshuk-Tews was tabbed to coach the prestigious USA Tennis Collegiate Team.

During the 2003 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to a 17-7 record and an eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Team Championship. Her squad advanced to the second round of the tournament and finished the season ranked 23rd in the country, marking the program's first top-25 finish since 1999. The Hurricanes had two players—Melissa Applebaum and Megan Bradley—in the NCAA Singles Championship for the first time since 1992, and placed a pair—Applebaum and Bradley—in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the first time since 1997, both ending the longest droughts in program history.

In 2002, her first season as head coach, Yaroshuk-Tews guided the Hurricanes to their seventh BIG EAST Championship title and she was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year. The team finished with a 14-7 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time in three years. Half of Miami's wins came against ranked opponents that season and the Hurricanes had a player, Mari Toro, finish the season nationally ranked for the first time since 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews spent the 1998 and 1999 seasons as the assistant coach at Miami before being promoted to associate head coach for the 2000 and 2001 seasons. During that stretch, the Hurricanes won the BIG EAST Championship in both 1998 and 2000. In Yaroshuk-Tews' opening year on staff, UM had its first All-American–Lioudmila Skavronskaia–in three years, quickly ending the program's first two-year drought without one since its first two years of existence (1973-74).

Prior to joining the Miami staff, Yaroshuk-Tews worked at the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Player Development Headquarters in Key Biscayne, Fla., as a traveling coach with the top U.S. junior players. Before her USTA appointment, Yaroshuk-Tews played professionally in satellite and challenger events. A Miami native and Killian High School graduate, Yaroshuk-Tews stood out among Florida juniors. In the Girl's 18 Division, she held the No. 1 ranking in Florida and the No. 8 spot nationally.

Yaroshuk-Tews went on to star at UCLA, where she was a four-year letter winner and two-time ITA All-American. The Bruins made the NCAA Team Championship and finished in the top 15 all four of her seasons on the team, including a trio of top-10 finishes. She made an immediate impact as a freshman in 1993, playing No. 5 singles and No. 2 doubles for UCLA, who finished No. 13 in the nation. Her junior year, in 1995, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 3 singles and No. 3 doubles for the Bruins, who concluded the year sixth in the country after reaching the Elite Eight. Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews made the NCAA Singles Championship and finished ranked No. 78 nationally.

As a senior in 1996, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Bruins, who made the Final Four and ended the season ranked fourth. Yaroshuk-Tews won the PAC-10 Indoor and Outdoor Doubles Championships with partner Keri Phebus and achieved ITA All-America and All-PAC-10 honors in both singles and doubles. The Bruins' top tandem was ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation during the 1996 season and finished No. 3, while Yaroshuk-Tews achieved a singles ranking as high as No. 13 and closed at No. 21. She made the round of 16 of the NCAA Singles Championship and the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. In addition, Yaroshuk-Tews was honored with UCLA's "Champs Award," given to the school's most inspirational female athlete, and was named the team's Most Valuable Player. She was also appointed to the Rolex/ITA Collegiate All-Star Team.

Yaroshuk-Tews graduated from UCLA in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, while earning PAC-10 academic honors. She began UM's graduate studies program in elementary education during the spring of 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews is the daughter of Ernie and Carol Yaroshuk. Her father was a member of the University of Miami baseball team from 1961-63, and was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 1992. He holds the third-highest batting average (.448) in the program's single-season history. Yaroshuk-Tews and her father form the only father-daughter duo in the UMSHoF.

On Jan. 10, 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews was married to Scott Tews. The couple lives in Palmetto Bay, Fla., with their daughter, Emma, and son, Landon.

THIRD SEASON OF SECOND STINT | UNIV. TECNICA DE LISBOA, 2005

University of Miami head women's tennis head coach Paige Yaroshuk-Tews announced Dec. 1, 2020, the hiring of Alex Santos.

For Santos, who is the program's associate head coach, this is his second stint at Miami; he previously worked for Yaroshuk-Tews from 2009-13. Santos earned ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year recognition in his final season, before departing to become the head coach at Pittsburgh.

"I couldn't be happier to welcome Alex Santos back to the University of Miami women's tennis program," Yaroshuk-Tews said upon his re-hiring. "His attention to detail and work ethic are undoubtedly among the best in the country. He is a proven recruiter and our collective goals are to get this program back to national championship contention. Alex will be committed to this program and its success from day one and won't stop until our job is complete."

Most recently, in 2022, the second year of Santos' second stint, Miami went 19-6 (10-3 ACC), reaching the NCAA Team Championship Sweet 16 and finishing ninth nationally for the team's best year-end ranking since 2013. For his efforts, Santos won ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year distinction. The Hurricanes beat six top-25 teams, including five in the top 20. Daevenia Achong and Eden Richardson reached the NCAA Doubles Championship title match, en route to finishing sixth in the ITA rankings, claiming ITA All-America status and making the ITA Collegiate All-Star Team. Both were First Team All-ACC honorees, played in the NCAA Singles Championship and finished top-50 in singles, while Isabella Pfennig received Third Team All-ACC plaudits and took the No. 88 spot in the final rankings. Achong won both the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Award for Leadership & Sportsmanship and the ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award. A program record six Hurricanes made the All-ACC Academic Team, as well.

In his first year back at The U, Santos helped the Hurricanes post a 15-9 (8-5 ACC) mark in 2021, as they reached the NCAA Team Championship Round of 32 and finished No. 20 nationally. Miami earned two top-10 wins, beating eighth-ranked Virginia at home and sixth-ranked Florida State in the ACC Championship quarterfinals. Estela Perez-Somarriba went 24-3 on her way to reaching the NCAA Singles Championship title match and claiming ITA National Player of the Year honors. She also won ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, ITA Senior Player of the Year and ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Sportsmanship Award. Perez-Somarriba and Isabella Pfennig, who ended the year ranked No. 26 nationally, both garnered ITA All-America and All-ACC status, with the latter winning ITA Southeast Region Rookie of the Year. Two Hurricane duos competed in the NCAA Doubles Championship, each finishing top-30 nationally.

Santos initially came to Miami as a volunteer assistant in 2009-10 and then served as a graduate manager in the fall of 2010 before being elevated to a full-time assistant coaching position in the spring of 2011.

During his four years at Miami, Santos helped the Hurricanes to an 85-24 record that included a 36-8 ledger in ACC play and a 50-5 mark at home. The 85 victories are tied for the sixth-most in any four-year span in program history, with two of the five higher marks featuring three of Santos' seasons.

The Hurricanes not only won 20-plus matches in all four of Santos' seasons with the team, but reached the NCAA Elite Eight and finished in the ITA top 10 all four times. Their peak year-end ranking came in 2011 with a seventh-place finish. In 2013, Santos also aided Miami to the program's first ACC Championship title.

Santos left Miami after the 2013 campaign to become the head coach at Pittsburgh. He served in that capacity for six years, leading the Panthers to their first win over a ranked foe and guiding the program's first players to earn ITA singles and doubles rankings.

Off the court, Pittsburgh posted four consecutive perfect 1,000 Academic Progress Report (APR) scores during his tenure.

In August 2019, Santos accepted a position as the associate head coach at Baylor. In his lone spring with the Bears, he helped lead the team to a 10-2 mark during the abbreviated 2020 campaign.

A native of Oeiras, Portugal, Santos was one of the top-ranked junior players in his homeland. He graduated from Universidade Tecnica de Lisboa in 2005. He has experience working at tennis academies in both Portugal and Spain.



DIANA KHODAN

STUDENT ASSISTANT COACH

FIRST SEASON

Diana Khodan joined the University of Miami women's tennis staff as a student assistant coach in August 2022. A three-year letter winner for the Hurricanes, Khodan played for Miami from January 2020 through May 2022.

A native of Ivano-Frankivsk, Ukraine, Khodan tallied a 33-18 record in singles and a 31-18 mark in doubles during her collegiate tenure. She went 11-10 against ranked opponents, including 10-7 in doubles.

Khodan, a two-time All-ACC Academic Team honoree, played in the 2021 NCAA Doubles Championship alongside Maya Tahan. The two peaked at No. 14 in the ITA rankings and finished the year at No. 19 nationally after notching a 3-1 record versus top-10 foes.

Hannah White joined the University of Miami in August 2022 as an assistant athletic trainer. She works with the accomplished women's tennis program.

Prior to making the move to Coral Gables, Fla., White served as the head athletic trainer for Luling Independent School District in Texas for a year. Most notably, both players made the prestigious ITA DI Collegiate All-Star Team, earning two of the 10 spots (held by nine players) on the list. It marked the sixth time in Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' 21-year head coaching tenure that at least one Hurricane made the cut, including the third in a row. Achong and Richardson also picked up ITA All-America accolades in doubles, becoming the first Miami duo to do so since Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang in 2016. In doing so, thay extended Miami's ITA All-America streak to nine straight years, with 2022 the fifth during that span multiple Hurricanes made the cut. They were the 30th and 31st players, as well as the 13th unique doubles pair, in program history to receive ITA All-America status, notching the 70th and 71st total honors, including the 33rd and 34th in doubles.

Achong and Richardson also headlined Miami's All-ACC distinctions, with both players receiving first-team status and junior Isabella Pfennig collecting Third Team All-ACC plaudits. It marked the first time since 2016 (Sinead Lohan, Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang) that three Hurricanes tallied All-ACC honors in the same season and the first time since 2017 (Lohan and Wagner) multuple made the first team. Miami has now totaled 42 All-ACC accolades in the 17 years—excluding the COVID-shortened 2020 season—it has been in the league. Richardson is the 20th different Hurricane to make the list, while Achong and Pfennig are the ninth and 10th Miami players to earn multiple All-ACC honors.

Two Hurricanes totaled a combined three ITA regional distinctions. Achong won both the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award and the ITA Southeast Region Cissie Leary Leadership Award, while associate head coach Alex Santos was named the ITA Southeast Region Assistant Coach of the Year. It marked fourth time in the last five years a Hurricane has won the Ashe Award (Lohan in 2018 and Estela Perez-Somarriba in both 2019 and 2020) and the second consecutive year a Miami player won the Leary Award (Perez-Somarribà in 2021). For Santos, in the second year of his second stint with the Hurricanes, the recognition was the second of his career, as he won it in 2013, en route to taking the national accolade, in the last year of his first stay at Miami.

Six Hurricanes picked up All-ACC Academic Team plaudits: Achong, Pfennig, Richardson, sophomore Audrey Boch-Collins, third-year sophomore Diana Khodan and third-year sophomore Maya Tahan. Since the honors were started in 2006, this was the first time six Hurricanes made the team, eclipsing the prior record of five in both 2012 and 2019. Miami was one of just three schools with at least six designees in 2022, alongside Duke and North Carolina.

Richardson collected three ACC Player of the Week nods, doing so on Jan. 18, March 22 and March 29. Achong notched Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Award status for the second straight year. Both of them were ITA Scholar-Athletes, as were Boch-Collins, Khodan and Pfennig. As a group, Miami received ITA Academic Team recognition for the ninth time in 10 years and the eighth in a row.

2022 Final ITA Rankings NotesAs a team, the Hurricanes ended the year ranked ninth in the country, good for the program's highest final mark for the Hurricanes since 2013 (eighth) and first top-10 finish since 2016 (No. 10). It marked the ninth time in the last 16 completed seasons Miami has ended the season ranked top-10 and the 14th time in the last 18 full seasons it has taken a top-15 spot. The Hurricanes finished 15 spots higher than they were picked in the preseason poll (No. 24), good for, by far, the largest jump in Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' 21 years at the helm. Miami, one of five ACC teams to finish the season in the top 10, also garnered the top spot in the ITA Southeast Region rankings, its first time doing so since the regions realigned in 2010 and it became part of the Southeast.

Three Miami singles players ended the season in the national rankings, as first since 2016 when four did so. All three ranked top-100, with two in the top 50. Fourth-year junior Daevenia Achong finished No. 42, fifth-year senior Eden Richardson placed No. 46 and sophomore Isabella Pfennig took the No. 88 spot. All three finished top-10 in the ITA Southeast Region rankings, with Achong sixth, Richardson seventh and Pfennig No. 10. This was the first time since regional realignment a trio of Hurricanes ended in the top 10, as Miami last achieved the feat in 2009, its final year in the South Region, when Julia Cohen finished first, Laura Vallverdu placed third and Bianca Eichkorn came in ninth.

Two Hurricane duos received year-end rankings, including one finishing top-10. Achong and Richardson placed sixth nationally, their highest mark of the season, while third-year sophomores Diana Khodan and Maya Tahan checked in at No. 55. The former duo earned the best final ranking for a Miami pair since Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno took an identical spot in 2014. It was also the first top-10 finish since Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang placed eighth in 2016. Additionally, this is the first time a Hurricane duo has earned a top-six ranking at any point in a season since Wagner and Lina Lileikite held that position on March 24, 2015. Achong and Richardson also became the first Hurricanes to end with a top-50 spot in singles and a top-25 position in doubles since Wagner in 2016, as she placed No. 10 and eighth, respectively. Achong and Richardson also placed first on the final ITA Southeast Region list, becoming the second Miami tandem to do, joining Eichkorn and Anna Bartenstein in 2011.

HONORS, RANKINGS & NOTES

2022 NGAA Championships
The Hurricanes earned the ninth overall seed in the NCAA Team Championship, their top mark since taking the seventh spot in 2016. Hosting for the 14th time in the last 17 NCAA tournaments, Miami opened competition against No. 61 Stetson in Coral Gables, Fla., notching a 4-0 victory, moving the Hurricanes to 14-for-14 all-time in first-round home sweeps, all since 2005.

In the next round, Miami dropped the doubles point against No. 21 UCF, but rebounded to win all four completed singles matches on the way to a 4-1 victory. With the decision, the Hurricanes improved to 27-1 all-time at home in the NCAA tournament and won their 26th such contest in a row. In doing so, Miami advanced to the Sweet 16 for the 24th time, the ninth-most of any program, including the 14th time in the last 18 completed seasons and 13th in the past 16.

Miami traveled to Malibu, Calif., for the Sweet 16. There, it met eighth-ranked and eighth-seeded Pepperdine on its home court. The Hurricanes dropped a 4-0 match to bring their 2022 campaign to an end.

Two Miami players competed the NCAA Singles Championship in Urbana, Ill., as both Daevenia Achong and Eden Richardson made the cut. It was the 20th time in program history multiple Hurricanes took part in the event, including the sixth time in the last seven tournaments. Achong fell to Oklahoma's Layne Sleeth, ranked No. 10 and seeded No. 9-16, in the opening round, 1-6, 2-6. Richardson dropped a 2-6, 0-6 decision versus No. 36 Michaela Bayerlová of Washington State in the Round of 64.

One day after playing the singles tournament, Achong and Richardson teamed up to begin action in the NCAA Doubles Championship in Urbana. It marked the third straight time a Hurricane tandem played in the event after none did so the previous three years. To begin, Achong and Richardson defeated No. 34 Julia Adams and Ellie Schoppe of Furman, 6-2, 7-5.

In the second round, the Miami pair met second-ranked and second-seeded Fiona Crawley and Elizabeth Scotty of North Carolina, the latter of whom was a reigning NCAA Doubles Championship winner. Achong and Richardson became the first Miami tandem to reach the quarterfinals since Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno in 2014. They also became the first to beat a seeded pair in the event in three decades, as Paula Iversen and Mariette Verbruggen last did so in 1992 against No. 5-8 Laxmi Poruri and Heather Wells of Stanford. Additionally, it was the fourth win by a Miami duo against a top-four seed in the NCAA Doubles Championship, with the prior three all 1984-86 and the last coming via Lise Gregory and Ronni Reis against second-seeded Ann Hulbert and Gretchen Rush of Trinity (TX) on their way to winning the 1986 national title.

Achong and Richardson took down No. 11 Peyton Stearns and Allura Zamarripa in a lenghty 7-6 (7-3), 5-7, 1-0 (10-5) match that began outdoors and moved inside during the second set. In doing so, they denied Steans a triple crown of NCAA titles, as she claimed the team title with Texas and won the NCAA Singles Championship. They also became the sixth Miami duo to reach the Final Four, with each of the prior five doing so once per year from 1984-88. The last tandem to make the semifinals was Ronni Reis and Jami Yonekura, the 1988 runners-up. The duo also became the fifth in program history and first since Paula Iversen and Mariette Verbruggen from 1991-92, to log a total of three NCAA Doubles Championship wins as a pair, regardless of total appearances. The triumph also gave Miami a player or pair in the Final Four for the sixth time in the last seven NCAA tournaments, dating back to 2015.

In the semfiinals, the Hurricane team defeated No. 12 Ayumi Miyamoto and Lisa Marie Rioux of Oklahoma State, 7-6 (7-5), 6-2, to clinch a spot in the national championship with their third straight win over a higher-ranked foe. They became the first Miami pair to make the title match since Reis and Yonekura in 1988. Only three prior Hurricanes made it that far, as Reis did so with Gregory in 1986 (champion) and in 1988 with Yonekura (runner-up). Achong and Richardson became just the fourth tandem in school history—the other three were all in the 1980's—with four career wins in the NCAA Doubles Championship, joining Gregory/Reis (11-3), Ros Riach/Cathy Richman (7-3) and Reis/Yonekura (4-1). The finals berth gave Miami seven all-time, including five under 21st-year head coach Paige Yaroshuk-Tews, in an individual NCAA championship, teed with Texas for sixth-most all-time. It also extended Miami's streak in that category to three in a row, as Estela Perez-Somarriba won the singles crown in 2019, no tournament took place in 2020 and Perez-Somarriba made the singles finale in 2021. During that time, only Texas has even two such bids.

Richardson, the 2018 NCAA doubles champion at LSU alongside Jessica Golovin, joined UCLA's Lauren Fisher (2002 runner-up, 2004 champion) and Georgia's Marissa Catlin (1997 runnerup, 2000 runner-up) as the only players to twice make the NCAA doubles title match as an unseeded player; Catlin also lost in the final as the top seed in 1999. Additionally, Richardson became only the 24th individual to make the NCAA Doubles Championship finale multiple times, including the first to do so at two different schools. meanwhile, of the 17 multiple-time NCAA Singles Championship finalists, the only player to achieve that feat also did so once as a Hurricane, as Audra Cohen finished as the runner-up in 2005 at Northwestern and won the crown in 2007 at Miami.

Facing the nation's top-ranked and topseeded pair, Jaeda Daniel and Nell Miller of NC State, Achong and Richardson came up one win short of taking home the trophy. The Miami tandem dropped a 2-6, 5-7 decision in the national championship

Since the NCAA Singles Championship began in 1982, 30 Hurricanes have combined for 64 total berths in the field, posting an overall record of 98-62 (.613). At least one Hurricane has participated 36 of 40 years (all but 1996 and 2000-02), with multiple players doing so 20 times, including three competing on five occasions (1984-87 and 2007) and four once (2009). Six times (four players), a Hurricane has been seeded first and two of the nine No. 1 seeds to claim the title were Hurricanes. Of the four ACC players (30 total in NCAA history) to make multiple semifinal appearances through 2022, two were Hurricanes, including the ACC's lone three-time semifinalist. No tournament was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

In reaching the NCAA Singles Championship final, Estela Perez-Somarriba finished her career at 17-3 in the event, tied with Baylor's Zuzana Zemenova (17-3 from 2005-08), Stanford's Sandra Birch (17-2 from 1987-91) and Stanford's Patty Fendick (17-2 from 1984-87) for the most victories all-time.

She also became the 10th player with four Sweet 16 berths, alongside UCLA's Robin Anderson (2012-15), Cal's Jana Juricova (2009-12), Northwestern's Maria Mosolova (2008-11), Baylor's Zuzana Zemenova (2005-08), USC's Jewel Peterson (2000-03), San Diego's Zuzana Lesenarova (1997-2000), Duke's Vanessa Webb (1996-99), Ole Miss' Paloma Collantès (1996-99), Florida's Nicole Arendt (1988-91) and Stanford's Lisa Green (1987-90).

In addition, Perez-Somarriba became the 21st three-time NCAA quarterfinalist, including the fourth from the ACC, joining North Carolina's Sara Daavettila (2017, 2019, 2021), Virginia's Danielle Collins (2014-16) and Duke's Vanessa Webb (1996-98).

Perez-Somarriba also became the seventh three-time NCAA semifinalist, alongside Stanford's Nicole Gibbs (2011-13), Baylor's Zuzana Zemenova (2005, 2007-08), Stanford's Sandra Birch (1989-91), Stanford's Lisa Green (1987-89), Stanford's Patty Fendick (1985-87) and Trinity's Gretchen Rush (1984-86). Only Perez-Somarriba and Zemenova accomplished the feat in non-consecutive years.

Additionally, Perez-Somarriba became the 17th multiple-time NCAA finalist (first since Virginia's Danielle Collins in 2014 and 2016) and the 13th to do so in back-to-back years (first since Stanford's Nicole Ğibbs in 2012 and 2013). She joined Collins as the only players on the list to do so twice an ACC school.

Lastly, Perez-Somarriba joined Baylor's Zuzana Zemenova (2005-08) as the only players in NCAA Singles Championship history with four Sweet 16s, three Final Fours, two finals berths and a national title.

Since the NCAA Doubles Championship began in 1982, 31 Hurricane pairs and 42 individuals have combined for 36 total berths in the field, posting an overall record of 48-35 (.578). At least one Hurricane duo has participated 25 of 40 years, with multiple pairs doing so nine times, including three competing on two occasions (1983-84). No tournament was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Miami duo of Melissa Bolivar and Liat Zimmerman withdrew from the competition in 2012, while Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang did so in 2016.

Since the NCAA Team Championship began in 1982, Miami has made the field 36 of 40 years (all but 1990 and 1993-95) and posted an overall record of 57-36 (.613). Miami has made the NCAA finals twice, falling to USC, 6-3, in Oklahoma City in 1985 and dropping a 4-1 decision against Stanford on the Cardinal's home court in Stanford, Calif., in 2006. Additionally, the Hurricanes made the Final Four in 1986 and defeated Trinty (Texas), 5-4, in Austin, Texas, in the third-place match. No tournament was held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
