ACC CHAMPIONSHIP STORYLINES & NEWS

- No. 3 seed Miami opens up its postseason against NC State at the 2023 ACC Baseball Championship at 7 p.m. on May 25.
- The Hurricanes headline Pool C, alongside No. 5 seed Duke and the ninth-seeded Wolfpack. UM plays Duke at 3 p.m. on May 26.
- Miami took two-of-three from the Wolfpack to begin ACC action before finishing conference play with a series win over Duke.
- The Hurricanes are 23-26 all-time in the ACC Baseball Championship. Miami has won one ACC Championship (2008).
- With fifth-year skipper **Gino DiMare** at the helm, Miami has posted the best conference winning percentage (.617) in the ACC.
- Under DiMare's tutelage, the Hurricanes have the third-best overall winning percentage (.663) among the 14 ACC programs.
- Seven Canes earned All-ACC accolades: 3B **Yohandy Morales** (1st team), RP **Andrew Walters** (1st team), 1B **CJ Kayfus** (2nd team), SS **Dominic Pitelli** (2nd team), **Gage Ziehl** (2nd team), **Blake Cyr** (3rd & All-Freshman team) & **Zach Levenson** (3rd team).
- For the first time since 2014, the Hurricanes closed out their regular season slate with six straight series wins.
- Miami is 11th nationally and lead the ACC with 106 home runs. The 106 homers are tied for the second-most in program history.
- UM has totaled 18 come-from-behind victories, tallying six wins when trailing after the sixth, including four walk-offs.
- The Hurricanes have qualified for the College World Series 25 times — the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). Miami's four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2023 will mark DiMare's 24th year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season – a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

In DiMare's four seasons at the helm of the Hurricanes, Miami has proved to be one of the top teams in the country, qualifying for the postseason in each year the NCAA tournament was held.

The 2022 Hurricanes earned a national seed and hosted a regional for the first time since 2016. Miami tallied a 40-20 overall record, leading the ACC with 20 conference wins. The Hurricanes were ranked as high as No. 2 nationally, notching a 14-game winning streak, which is the program's longest in eight years.

In a year that began with a series victory at preseason No. 1 Florida, Miami finished the regular season second in the ACC Coastal and returned to the postseason for the second time under DiMare's leadership in 2021.

During the shortened 2020 campaign, the Hurricanes went 12-4 and ended the year ranked fifth by Baseball America. A preseason pick to win the Coastal, Miami won all three contests in conference play before the COVID-19 pandemic shut down the season prematurely.

The Hurricanes had an impressive first season under DiMare, winning 41 games and qualifying for the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. Miami received the 46th postseason berth in school history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes amassed an 18-12 mark in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

Four All-America honorees have emerged under DiMare's watch – Chris McMahon (2020), Brian Van Belle (2020), Carson Palmquist (2021, 2022) and Andrew Walters (2022).

All four of those players garnered All-ACC recognition as well, joining Michael Amditis (2019), Adrian Del Castillo (2019, 2021), Raymond Gil (2019), Brian Van Belle (2019), Christian Del Castillo (2021), Yohandy Morales (2021, 2022), Anthony Vilar (2021), Jacob Burke (2022), CJ Kayfus (2022) and Karson Ligon (2022).

Since DiMare was elevated to head coach ahead of the 2019 campaign, 12 Hurricanes have been selected in the MLB Draft, including first-round pick Slade Cecconi in 2020.

DiMare's teams have excelled in the classroom as well, as 15 student-athletes have earned a spot on the ACC All-Academic team, with three players earning multi-year bids. Additionally, Christian Del Castillo was named an Academic All-American in 2021.

With DiMare as associate head coach, the Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins – first round, Willie Abreu – sixth round, Brandon Lopez – 10th round, Jacob Heyward – 18th round, Johnny Ruiz – 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.

DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by Baseball America, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman



All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks – all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.

UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by Collegiate Baseball and fifth by Baseball America prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster – the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife Denise and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

MIAMI OPENS ACC CHAMPIONSHIP

• After winning their final six regular season series, the Hurricanes are the No. 4 seed in the 2023 ACC Baseball Championship.

• Miami (37-18, 18-12 ACC) headlines Pool D, which also features No. 5 seed Duke (35-20, 16-13 ACC) and No. 9 seed NC State (35-18, 13-16 ACC).

• The Hurricanes will begin their postseason at 7 p.m. Thursday against the Wolfpack before wrapping up pool play at 3 p.m. Friday versus Duke.

HURRICANES HONORED BY ACC

• Seven Miami players received recognition from the Atlantic Coast Conference Monday afternoon.

• Third baseman **Yohandy Morales** and right-handed reliever **Andrew Walters** were named to the All-ACC First Team, while first baseman **CJ Kayfus**, shortstop **Dominic Pitelli** and right-hander **Gage Ziehl** garnered All-ACC Second Team honors.

• Meanwhile, second baseman **Blake Cyr** and outfielder **Zach Levenson** were tabbed to the All-ACC Third Team, with the former being among the 12 rookies pegged to the ACC All-Freshman as well.

• The Hurricanes' seven selections marked the most Miami student-athletes to collect conference distinction since 2016.

DON'T STOP THE ROCK

• For the first time since 2014, Miami closed out its regular season slate with six straight series wins.

• Dating back to a come-from-behind 5-4 win at then-No. 13 North Carolina on April 13, the Hurricanes are 17-6 over their last 23 contests, including a 9-2 mark in May.

• Since mid-April, Miami is hitting .318, led by junior third baseman **Yohandy Morales**, who is batting a team-high .477 over that stretch.

• Most recently, the Hurricanes took two-of-three from then-No. 16 Duke, highlighted by a 10-8 walk-off victory in 11 innings.

MIAMI MASHERS

• As of May 24, the Hurricanes are 11th nationally and lead the ACC in home runs (106).

• Miami's 106 homers are tied for the second-most in a single season in program history, matching the 2008 and 2010 Hurricanes. In 1998, Miami tallied 139 home runs.

• Six different Hurricanes have totaled double-digit homers for the first time in 25 years.

• Miami has circled the bases in 43 of its 55 games, totaling 32 multi-homer performances along the way.

• The Hurricanes are 33-11 when launching at least one home run and 26-6 when mounting two-plus jacks.

• 203-of-423 (48.0%) of the Hurricanes' runs have been plated by a homer this season.

• Sixteen different Miami players have left the yard, with freshman **Blake Cyr** blasting a team-high 16 round-trippers.

CARDIAC CANES

- Throughout the regular season, Miami notched 18 come-from-behind victories, including four walk-off wins.
- The Hurricanes have tallied six victories trailing after six innings and three wins when trailing after eight frames.
- Miami overcame a five-run deficit at then-No. 6 Florida and against then-No. 16 Duke, while rallying to win following a six-run deficit against then-No. 17 Virginia Tech on March 18.

MARK LIGHT MAGIC

- The Hurricanes closed out their best regular season at home since 2015, posting a 28-5 mark inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Across its 33 home games, Miami is slashing .318/.421/.583, outscoring its opponents, 303-143.
- With head coach **Gino DiMare** at the helm, the Hurricanes boast a 111-34 (.766) record at Mark Light Field.

YOYO MAKES US GOGO

- Junior **Yohandy Morales** is one of the most prolific hitters in the nation.
- Morales is third in the ACC in average (.395), tied for seventh in hits (81), tied for eighth in total bases (133) and 10th in OPS (1.116).
- The third baseman paces Miami in six offensive categories: average, hits, total bases, on-base percentage (.467), slugging (.649) and OPS.
- On May 20, Morales became the first Hurricane to reach 220 career hits since **Brad Fieger** in 2014.
- In the Miami record books, the two-time All-ACC selection is tied with **Zack Collins** and **Danny Matienzo** for sixth in career home runs.
- Throughout his career, Morales has had a flair for the dramatic, as 21 of his 42 blasts have either been game-tying, go-ahead or game-winning jacks.
- As a sophomore, the 6-foot-4, 225-pound slugger tallied a team-best 64 runs, 17 doubles, three triples, 18 homers, 59 RBI, 156 total bases and a .650 slugging percentage. He notched a .329 average, the third-best mark among the Hurricanes.
- During the 2022 Coral Gables Regional, Morales became only the fourth Hurricane all-time with a trio of homers in a single postseason game, joining **Lale Esquivel** (1998), **Kevin Brown** (2001) and **Scott Lawson** (2010).
- Following his star-studded sophomore season, he was chosen to represent his country as a member of USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team.
- As a rookie in 2021, Morales garnered All-ACC Freshman Team, *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America and Gainesville All-Regional Team honors after mounting a .284 average, 11 round-trippers and a .874 OPS.

STAY GOLDEN, YOYO

- Junior third baseman **Yohandy Morales** was among the 25 amateur baseball players selected as a semifinalist for the 2023 Golden Spikes Award, USA Baseball announced Monday.
- Miami has had seven different players named a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist since 2008.
- **Yonder Alonso** (2008), **Jemile Weeks** (2008), **Kyle Bellamy** (2009), **Yasmani Grandal** (2010), **David Thompson** (2015) and **Zack Collins** (2016) preceded Morales.
- Morales is aiming to become just the second Golden Spikes Award winner in program history. **Pat Burrell** won the award in 1998.

ARE YOU CYRIOUS?

- Freshman **Blake Cyr** has burst onto the college baseball scene in his debut season in the orange and green.
- As of May 24, Cyr is one of seven rookies in the nation with 16 homers and 57 RBI.
- The 5-foot-11, 190-pound slugger is tied for eighth in the ACC in RBI and ninth in home runs, leading all freshmen in the conference in both categories.
- Cyr paces the Hurricanes in homers and RBI, while hitting .312, which checks in third on the club.
- Only three Miami freshmen have hit more home runs than Cyr, with **Ryan Braun** (17), **Phil Lane** (17) and **Pat Burrell** (23) comprising the elite quartet.
- In Miami's 14-6 win over then-No. 6 Florida on March 4, Cyr finished one RBI shy of the Hurricanes' freshman single-game record set by **Randy Guerra** (8) in 1976.
- Heading into the 2023 campaign, the Windermere, Fla., native was ranked as the 11th best freshman in the ACC, according to D1Baseball.

COLLIN. JOSEPH. KAYFUS.

- Junior **CJ Kayfus** has built a reputation as one of the best hitters in the ACC.
- Following a sensational week against FIU and then-No. 17 Virginia Tech, Kayfus garnered ACC, *Collegiate Baseball* and Perfect Game/Rawlings Player of the Week accolades.
- The first baseman batted .750 (12-for-16) with three home runs, eight RBI and a 2.137 OPS, highlighted by his first career multi-homer performance and a career-high five RBI.
- The 2022 Hurricanes MVP led Miami with a .366 average, 87 hits, 38 walks, a .460 on-base percentage, 16 stolen bases and 27 multi-hit games.
- Within the conference, the All-ACC second team first baseman finished eighth in average, tied for eighth in hits, tied for ninth in stolen bases and 11th in on-base percentage.
- During his freshman campaign, Kayfus hit .298 with three homers and six RBI, playing in 40 games, including 10 starts.
- The Wellington, Fla., native was named to the 2021 All-Gainesville Team after hitting .308 across three contests.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIP NEWS & NOTES

FIRE ME UP, WALT

- Closer **Andrew Walters** has cemented himself as one of the top relievers in the country.
- Walters ranks among the nation's active career leaders in ERA (1.43, first), K/9 (15.3, first) and saves (23, 11th).
- His 23 saves are tied with **Jay Tessmer** (1994-95) for sixth in program history.
- Over his career, the Palm Bay, Fla., native has totaled 161 punchouts over 94.2 frames.
- Last season, the right-hander collected first-team All-America recognition from *Baseball America*, D1Baseball, Perfect Game and the NCBWA, while he received second-team plaudits from the ABCA/Rawlings and *Collegiate Baseball* last season.
- Walters was one of 10 finalists for the 2022 NCBWA Stopper of the Year award after pacing the ACC and finishing fifth nationally with 14 saves.
- The 6-foot-4, 222-pound hurler tallied a 1.65 ERA, 62 strikeouts and just six walks across 32.2 innings.
- As a freshman, Walters made 19 appearances, posting a 1.46 ERA that was the lowest among Miami pitchers with at least 10 outings.

THE MIDNIGHT EXPRESS

- An NCBWA Stopper of the Year finalist last season, **Andrew Walters** headlines the award watch list in 2023.
- The watch list features 56 of the sport's top relief pitchers. Relievers who are not on the midseason watch list still have an opportunity to be tabbed a finalist for the award.

DOMMY BARRELS

- One of the top defensive players in the country, **Dominic Pitelli** has flexed his prowess at the plate this season.
- The junior leads all ACC shortstops with 11 home runs and 50 RBI, tallying a .300 average.
- Pitelli is the first Hurricane shortstop to produce double-digit homers and 50 RBI since **Ryan Braun** in 2003.
- The 2023 All-ACC Second Team pick has launched two grand slams this year, pushing his career total to four, which trails only **Rick Montoni** (5) in program history.
- In the Hurricanes' three-game sweep at Duke last year, Pitelli became the first Hurricane ever to smack two grand slams in the same series.
- Across his first two years, the Miami native totaled a combined 12 homers and 59 RBI.

DOM'S THE BOMB

- Junior **Dominic Pitelli** was named one of 25 semifinalists for the 2023 Brooks Wallace Award.
- Presented annually to the nation's best all-around shortstop, Pitelli is one of three ACC players to make the list, joining Duke's **Alex Mooney** and Virginia's **Griff O'Ferrall**.
- Pitelli is looking to become the first Hurricane to win the prestigious award since its inception in 2004.

• The University of Miami players and coaches combined to selected outfielders **Dario Gomez** and **Zach Levenson**, infielder **Yohandy Morales** and right-handed pitchers **Alejandro Torres**, **Andrew Walters** and **Gage Ziehl** as 2023 team captains.

ARM FARM

• In January, the University of Miami completed construction on the Ruiz Family Strength and Conditioning Center, following a \$2 million gift to fund a cutting-edge strength and conditioning complex at Alex Rodriguez Park.

• The Ruiz Family Strength and Conditioning Center is an approximately 1,600-square-foot expansion from the old weight room. Through the generosity of the Ruiz family, the strength and conditioning facility more than doubled in size and features state-of-the-art equipment to provide Miami's student-athletes with a top-of-the-line training environment

• The enhancements include 30 yards of turf, five custom Sorinex power racks, five GymAware velocity based training devices, three Proteus motion units, three custom Sorinex Frankenhypers, three custom Keiser functional trainers, two sets of Hawkin Dynamics force plates, over 10,000 pounds of custom Sorinex dumbbells and bumper plates, custom AAE hurdles, Keiser cardio equipment and a custom Gatorade fueling station.

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

• Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

• Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth most**.

• Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5) and 2016 (#3) and 2022 (#6)**.

MIAMI IS #MLBU

• **Forty-one** Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.

• No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **307** players picked into the professional ranks - including six in 2022.

• Since 1991, UM has produced **202 draft picks** - 23 more than the next-highest ACC total (179, Clemson).

• Since **Gino DiMare** was added to the coaching staff in 1997, 154 out of 163 players (**94.5%**) have raised their stock in the draft since attending The U.
