OUICK HITS

AMERICA'S BEST BACKCOURT

There might not be a better shooting duo in the nation right now than Bensley Joseph and Wooga Poplar. Combined, the pair is shooting an electric 67.6 percent (23-34) from 3-point range. Miami is one of just two schools (Wyoming) with two players shooting better than 64 percent from beyond the arc this season. Poplar currently ranks 13th in the nation for 3-point field goal percentage, while Joseph checks in at 23rd.

BAHAMAS BOUND

Thursday's game against Georgia will be the Hurricanes' first ever regulation game played outside the United States as this is Miami's first trip to a tournament in the Bahamas. The Hurricanes have participated in numerous multi-team events in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands over the years, but never in a tournament hosted in the Bahamas.

ON THE BREAK

The Hurricanes tallied 20-plus fastbreak points for the second straight game Monday night, totaling 28 points in transition. Miami currently ranks ninth in the nation (first in the ACC) in fastbreak points, averaging 23.67 through three games. Conversely, Miami's defense is limiting its opponents to just 3.67 fastbreak points per contest.

LIGHTS OUT FROM THREE

4Yr Jr. | G | 6-0 | 185

Indianapolis, Ind.

For the third straight game, Miami knocked down 10plus threes in a game, going 13-for-21 from distance against FIU. This is the first time the Hurricanes' have connected on 10 or more threes in three consecutive contests since 2018-19 (12/10/10). As a team, Miami is shooting 50 percent from 3-point range this season, which ranks fourth in the nation and first in the ACC.

- Georgia is the first of two SEC teams 2 the Hurricanes will face in the 2023-24 regular season (Kentucky, 11/28).
- Five Hurricanes are averaging double-5 figure points this season-Cleveland, Joseph, Omier, Pack and Poplar.
- Norchad Omier sits in 23rd in the 23 nation in rebounds per game, hauling in 11.0 per contest this season.
- It's been 31 years since the 31 Hurricanes and the Bulldogs last played each other (12/22/92).
- Bensley Joseph ranks 41st in the nation in effective field goal percentage (80.4) per KenPom.

THE MATCHUP

- The Hurricanes are set to open the Baha Mar Bahamas Hoops Championship on Friday when they take on Georgia for the first time since 1992. Tip-off in Nassau is set for 3:30 p.m. and the game will air on CBS Sports Network.
- Miami and Georgia have squared off four times in program history, with three coming after the program rebirth in 1985. The Bulldogs hold a 3-1 advantage in the all-time series and have won the last two. Last time the programs met, Georgia came away with a narrow 69-67 win in Athens on Dec. 22, 1992.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Hurricanes outlasted the FIU Panthers, 86-80, Monday night at the Watsco Center for their third victory of the season. Miami shot 61.9 percent (13-of-21) from 3-point range, with three different Miami players connecting on three-plus 3-pointers.
- Bensley Joseph and Wooga Poplar each knocked down four 3-pointers in the game, while junior Matthew Cleveland went a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc. Norchad Omier led the Hurricanes in rebounding, hauling in 11 boards to keep his season average at 11.0 rebounds per game.

ON CLEVELAND TIME

- Junior Matthew Cleveland played his best game as a Hurricane on Monday, pouring in 23 points (8-of-10) to tie his career high in scoring. The guard went a perfect 3-of-3 from 3-point range and added seven rebounds and four assists to his stat line.
- Cleveland currently ranks second on the team in scoring (17.0), rebounding (6.7) and assists per game (3.7).

OFFENSE IS CLICKIN'

- The Hurricanes are averaging 91.7 points per game through three games and have eclipsed the 80-point mark in the first three contests of the season for the first time since 2015-16. Miami has started the season with three consecutive games of 80 points or more eight times in program history, including this season.
- Should they reach 80 points on Friday, it would be just the third time in program history that Miami has started the season scoring 80-plus points in four games.
- Miami's offense currently sits in ninth in the nation in effective field goal percentage (.645) and 16th in adjusted offensive efficiency (114.4) per KenPom.

JUST WOOGA THINGS

- Wooga Poplar continues to solidify himself as an elite shooter, connecting on four-plus 3-pointers for third straight game. Poplar is averaging 4.67 threes per game, good for third in the nation and first in the ACC.
- The guard leads Miami in scoring at 20.7 points per game and has yet to miss a free throw (8-for-8).

BIG-TIME BENZ

- Junior Bensley Joseph was just one block shy of the elusive 5x5 recording 15 points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 steals and 4 blocks against UCF on Nov. 10.
- He is just one of three Division I players (Chris Singleton, Syracuse, 2010; Michael Carter-Williams, FSU, 2008) to put up those numbers in the last 14 years. Joseph's 15 points, five steals and four blocks were also new career highs in scoring.

IN THE POLLS

- The Hurricanes rose to No. 11 and No. 12 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll and Associated Press Top 25 Poll, respectively, on Monday after going 2-0 in the first week of the season.
- Miami has appeared in 16 straight AP Polls and 17 consecutive Coaches Polls dating back to Dec. 12, 2022.
- Miami's second-place prediction in the preseason ACC poll marks the highest selection for the Hurricanes, since joining the ACC ahead of the 2004-05 season. The Hurricanes' five first-place votes is more than they received in every prior ACC preseason poll combined (two in 2022, one in 2017).

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- For the first time in program history, two Hurricanes earned Preseason All-ACC plaudits as fourth-year junior Norchad Omier was named Preseason First Team All-ACC, while fourth-year junior Nijel Pack picked up Preseason Second Team All-ACC honors.
- Omier, who was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022-23, averaged a double-double last season, tallying 13.1 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. Pack, the NCAA Tournament Midwest Region Most

Outstanding Player, scored in double-figures 22 times in 2022-23, averaging 13.6 points per game and shooting 40.4 percent from 3-point range.

 With the nod for Omier, Miami has now placed a player on the Preseason All-ACC First Team in each of the last four seasons.

LEGENDARY COACH L

- The Hurricanes' Final Four trip last season was the second of Jim Larrañaga's career, making him one of nine active DI head coaches with multiple trips. Coach L and Larry Brown are, per Stats Perform, the only coaches to take two different schools to the Final Four while seeded fifth or lower.
- Coach L, a 2023 Naismith HOF first-time nominee and UM Sports HOF 2023 inductee, is Miami's all-time leader with 255 victories. His eight 20-win seasons are the most by a Miami coach and 40 percent of The U's total (20).
- Coach L has led Miami to all five of its 25-win years, half its 12 NCAA berths, 11 of its 15 wins in the field, four of its five Sweet 16s, its two Elite Eights, its first Final Four, its two ACC regular season titles and its one ACC Tournament crown.

CONFERENCE CROWN

- Picked fourth in the ACC preseason poll, Miami went 15-5 in 2022-23 to share the ACC regular season title with Virginia and, for the second time ever, earn the No. 1 seed in the ACC Tournament.
- This was the third regular season league championship for the Hurricanes, joining a 2012-13 outright ACC crown and a 1999-2000 shared BIG EAST title.

WELCOME TO THE U

- Miami added five freshmen to the roster for 2023-24 season in Nick Cassano, Paul Djobet, Kyshawn George, Carson Mastin and Michael Nwoko.
- George and Nwoko have both represented their countries on the international stage. Nwoko helped Canada to a third-place finish at the 2022 FIBA U18 America Championship, while George played for Switzerland in the 2019 FIBA U16 European Championship Division B.

- > We will block out, rebound and run.
- > We will run for layups and open threes.
- > We will share the ball.
- > We will penetrate the defense.
- > We will create good shots both inside and outside.
- > We will attack the offensive boards.

WATSCO IS ROCKIN'

- Miami has seen unprecedented fan interest in the program under Larrañaga. In 2017-18, for the third straight season, the Hurricanes sold out their season-ticket allotment at the Watsco Center.
- The 2015-16 campaign marked the first time in UM history that any team sold out of season tickets. Across the last two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23, Miami recorded four of the five highest single-game student attendance marks in program history.

In his 12 seasons at the University of Miami, head coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to six NCAA Tournament appearances, including four trips to the Sweet 16. He has guided the Hurricanes to their first Elite Eight (2022), first Final Four (2023), first ACC Tournament title (2013) and first two ACC regular season crowns (2013 and 2023). Larrañaga has been named the Associated Press, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

The winningest coach in program history, Larrañaga has posted five 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to

do so even once – and seven in his career. He also has recorded eight 20-win campaigns at Miami and 14 in his career. In conference action, the Hurricanes have won nine or more league games in eight of 12 seasons, while prior to Larrañaga's arrival, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Hurricanes to 30 postseason victories, including 11 in the NCAA Tournament (six appearances), 13 in the ACC Tournament (13) and five in the NIT (two). He ranks top-30 all-time among Division I coaches with 725 victories, including eighth among active coaches. In 2023, Larrañaga was both inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame & Museum and named a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame first-time nominee.

Miami's 69 total road wins in the past 12 seasons are fourth-most among ACC teams during Larrañaga's tenure and its 114 total victories away from home also place fourth. During that same stretch, the Hurricanes are fifth in overall ACC wins (120), as well as fourth in both ACC road victories (48) and ACC Tournament triumphs (13), plus sixth in ACC home wins (72). In the six years prior to Larrañaga's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for ninth in ACC victories (36) and won just 10 total ACC road games. In nine of Larrañaga's 12 years, the team has finished higher in the ACC final standings than it was picked in the preseason poll, including placing multiple spots higher on seven occasions.

The Hurricanes have a combined 16 wins over Duke (8-9) and North Carolina (8-10) under Larrañaga, tied for the second-most of any team during his 11-year tenure, after going 4-31 versus those two programs before his arrival. Eight of those victories are by double digits and seven are on the road, the former the most of any team during that stretch and the latter tied for the most. Miami's 27-point win over the Blue Devils on Jan. 23, 2013, is the third-largest ever against the AP No. 1 team in the nation. It is one 31 victories over a top-25 foe under Larrañaga, including 13—five of which came in the past two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23—versus a top-10 opponent.

Miami has seen unprecedented fan interest in the program under Larrañaga. In 2017-18, for the third straight season, the Hurricanes sold out their season-ticket allotment at the Watsco Center. The 2015-16 campaign marked the first time in UM history that any team sold out of season tickets. Across the last two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23, Miami recorded four of the five highest single-game student attendance marks in program history.

From 2017-19, Miami was one of two ACC programs, alongside Duke, to have a player selected in each NBA Draft. Four total Hurricanes were picked in that span, including Lonnie Walker IV going No. 18 in 2018.

During the most recent campaign, 2022-23, Larrañaga guided Miami to its best year ever. The Hurricanes finished 29-8 (15-5 ACC), shared the ACC regular season title and earned their first Final Four appearance. Miami set or tied program records for overall, ACC, regular season (24), home (16), top-25 (seven), top-10 (three) and top-five (two) victories. The team ended the year third in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll, good for its best finish ever.

Seeded No. 5 in the Midwest Region, the Hurricanes knocked off top-seeded and No. 2/1-ranked Houston, 89-75, and second-seeded and No. 5/7-ranked Texas, 88-81, in a three-day span in Kansas City, Mo., to clinch their Final Four bid. They also knocked off seven teams with a combined 23 NCAA titles (including one vacated) during the 2022-23 campaign, including an eight-point road victory at North Carolina, a 22-point home win over Duke and a 16-point triumph over Indiana in the NCAA Tournament. The team lost by more than seven points just twice all year.

Larrañaga earned multiple significant achievements during the historic season. First, on Nov. 19, 2022, he led Miami to a 74-64 victory over his alma mater, Providence, in Uncasville, Conn., to become just the 35th coach with DI experience to reach 700 wins, including only the fourth to do so while in the ACC. On Dec., 21, 2022, he was named a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame first-time nominee. Following the season, on May 4, 2023, he was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame & Museum.

Numerous Hurricanes claimed major awards during the season, as well. Isaiah Wong became Miami's second ACC Player of the Year and sixth All-America, garnering NABC third-team distinction. He was also a finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Jerry West Award, among many other accomplishments. Jordan Miller received Second Team All-ACC status, while Norchad Omier picked up third-team plaudits. Nijel Pack won NCAA Tournament Midwest Region Most Outstanding Player honors, while Miller and Wong both tallied All-Tournament Team status.

The 2022-23 success followed another tremendous season the year before, as Miami, picked No. 12 in the ACC preseason poll, went 26-11 (14-6 ACC). Seeded No. 10 in the Midwest Region, the Hurricanes rattled off three straight victories to make the Elite Eight for the first time, including throttling second-seeded and No. 8/7 ranked-Auburn, 79-61, in the Round of 32, en route to finishing co-No. 16 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll.

Larrañaga set the program record with his 221st victory at The U on March 2, 2022, at Boston College, just weeks after a Feb. 9, 2022, triumph over Georgia Tech made him the first coach in NCAA history with 100 league wins at three DI schools and/or in three DI conferences. Kameron McGusty turned in one of the best years in program history, claiming First Team All-ACC, NABC First Team All-District 2, ACC All-Tournament First Team, NCAA Tournament All-Midwest Region and Senior CLASS Award finalist accolades.

In 2017-18, Miami played in its fourth NCAA Tournament in a six-year span, claiming the No. 6 seed in the South Region. The Hurricanes tied for third in the ACC and finished the season with a 22-10 mark, including an 11-7 record in conference play. The Hurricanes were nationally ranked for 15 weeks, reaching as high as No. 6 in the polls.

Freshman Lonnie Walker IV was named Honorable Mention All-ACC, becoming the first freshman all-conference honoree in program history. He also was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team. Miami earned road wins over then-No. 12 Minnesota and then-No. 9 North Carolina, the fourth straight year and the sixth time in Larrañaga's first seven seasons that the Hurricanes defeated two or more top-15 teams.

In 2016-17, Miami went 21-12 overall and claimed the No. 8 seed in the Midwest Region. It defeated three ranked teams, including two in the top 10. Davon Reed won the Skip Prosser Award and Larrañaga registered his 600th all-time win with a 72-46 triumph at

Pittsburgh on Jan. 14, 2017.

The 2015-16 Hurricanes played their way into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the second time in four seasons, and just the third time in school history.

In 2012-13, Larrañaga helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. At the time, he was the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

Individually, Shane Larkin earned the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the ACC All-Defensive Team and a Defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided the program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011), including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, as the Patriots defeated Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. Following that run, Larrañaga was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga built the George Mason program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned the CAA's first NCAA tournament at-large berth in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, its first-ever national ranking, its first-ever appearance in the Top 10 and its first wins over Top 10 teams.

Larrañaga served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79).

At Bowling Green, he made an immediate impact in his first season. In 1986-87, the Falcons were the nation's most improved team under a first-year head coach that took over a program with a losing record, posting a 15-14 record for an eight-game improvement over the previous season. Larrañaga went on to record a 170-144 mark in 11 years at Bowling Green, earning 1997 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year honors after leading Bowling Green to a 22-10 record, a conference regular season co-championship and a berth in the NIT. The 22 victories were the most by a Bowling Green team in 47 years and the 13 conference wins were the second- highest total in BGSU history.

Larrañaga's 170 victories at Bowling Green ranked second all-time on the Falcons' coaching list and he was only the second coach to record consecutive postseason appearances. Larrañaga led his squad to NIT berths in 1990 (18-11) and again in 1991 (17-13), the first time the Falcons enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances since the early '60s. Bowling Green won better than 60 percent of its games in Larrañaga's last four years, recording a 70-44 mark during that stretch. The Falcons finished fourth or better in the MAC in five of Larrañaga's 11 seasons and he is among the winningest coaches in MAC history.

Larrañaga received his first head coaching position in 1977 when he was named to the post at American International, a Division II program in Springfield, Mass. Taking over a team that had suffered through five consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, Larrañaga turned AIC into a winning program in his first year and compiled a 28-25 mark in two seasons.

Larrañaga's first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College from 1971-76, serving as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the

freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium

Äfter his two-year stint at American International, Larrañaga was reunited with Holland at the University of Virginia in April 1979. An assistant coach under Holland at UVA for seven seasons from 1979-86, he helped the Cavaliers reach the NCAA Final Four on two occasions (1981 and 1984), finish in the top five of the AP and UPI polls and average more than 24 victories per season. The Cavaliers were 169-62, won three regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championships and made four NCAA Tournament appearances in that span. Virginia also made a pair of NIT appearances, winning the NIT Championship in 1980. Larrañaga was on the staff during the careers of three-time National Player of the Year Ralph Sampson and NBA first-round draft choice Olden Polynice.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991
