PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LUKE SUTHERLAND, LE MOYNE

6'7", 220 LBS.

GR., F, SYRACUSE, NY/WEST GENESSEE (SIENA/BRYANT)

After setting a new career-high with 35 points on December 9, Sutherland came back one week later with another explosive offensive performance, racking up a game-high 24 points in Le Moyne's 80-54 home win over Dartmouth. The Dolphins' first-ever NEC Player of the Week sank 4-8 shots from three-point territory and was 10-15 overall. Sutherland added four rebounds, three assists, a pair of steals and a block in the Dolphins' 26-point win. His 59 points over the last two games and 76 points over the last three contests are the most by a Dolphin since Nate Gause compiled 62 in the first two and 82 over the first three games of the 2014-15 season. The Syracuse, NY product leads the conference in free throw accuracy (.912), and ranks third in scoring (16.6), second in 3P made (2.6), fourth in 3P percentage (.452), and ninth in field goal percentage (.504) and blocks (0.9).

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

AARON "ACE" TALBERT, SAINT FRANCIS U

6'0", 185 LBS.

FR., G, WYANDANCH, NY/SCOTLAND CAMPUS (PA) (COMBINE ACADEMY (NC))

The third Saint Francis U player to claim NEC Rookie of the Week honors this season, Talbert registered a career-high 16 points in the Red Flash's 72-65 setback to Mount St. Mary's on Friday. He scored 14 of his 16 points in the second half to lead a furious comeback after the Red Flash trailed by 25 at intermission. His three-pointer with 1:27 to play cut the Mount lead to seven as SFU put up 50 points after the break. Talbert made 3-7 from long range and did not commit a turnover in 31 minutes. The Wyandanch, NY native has averaged 12.7 points over the last six games to raise his season average to 8.8 ppg, which ranks second on the Red Flash and third among conference freshmen. Talbert is second in the NEC in three-point percentage and tenth in field goal accuracy, boasting a 50.0 percent mark in each category. He joined the ranks of SFU players honored as Rookie of the Week winners this season, alongside Eli Wilborn, a two-time winner, and Bobby Rosenberger.

THE GAME

Stonehill enters Thursday night's matchup with Miami coming off of its first win since Nov. 9 against Army West Point. The 71-44 win over Hartford at Merkert Gym improved the Skyhawks to 2-2 at home. Stonehill travels to Miami with an 0-9 record on the road, set to play its tenth road game of the season in its 14th game. This is the first meeting in program history between the Hurricanes and the Skyhawks, with this being the second Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) opponent that Stonehill has played. In the Skyhawks first Division I season, Stonehill narrowly lost to Boston College, 63-56, on Dec. 13, 2022 at the Conte Forum. Over the past three games, Stonehill has allowed just 64.0ppg over the past three games, a +16.8 point difference from the 80.8 points per game the Skyhawks are allowing this season.

MEDIA INFORMATION

Thursday night's non-conference matchup at Miami will be broadcasted live on national television on the ACC Network as part of ESPN's family of networks. On the call are **DOUG SHERMAN** (play-by-play) and **DAN BONNER** (analyst) calling the action.

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES

The Hurricanes are 6-0 when playing from the comforts of the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla., most recently coming off an 84-77 win over La Salle on Saturday night. Miami is one of the best three-point shooting teams in the country, shooting an impressive 41.23% from long range this season. The Canes are fifth in free throw percentage in all of Div. I with a 79.67% clip from the charity stripe. Miami is ranked ninth in the country in effective field goal percentage at 58.2% while being 13th in field goal percentage, shooting 50.77%. Miami's Wooga Poplar leads the Hurricanes as one of three players at the Div. I level shooting over 50% from deep, as he's hitting on a 51.02% (25-49) clip.

LAST TIME OUT

EASTON, Mass. (December 17, 2023) - Stonehill College men's basketball ended its 10-game losing streak with a 71-44 win over the University of Hartford at Merkert Gymnasium Sunday afternoon. Sophomore Tony Felder (Brockton, Mass.) and fifth-year Pano Pavlidis (Queens, N.Y.) each tallied 15 points to lead all scorers. Sophomore Chas Stinson (Charlotte, N.C.) and Pavlidis corralled six boards each to lead the Skyhawks. Josh Petion led Hartford with 11 points and six rebounds, logging 23 minutes off the bench. Stonehill finished the game shooting 52% (26-50) from the field, its second-highest mark of the season. Hartford was held to just a 31.5% (17-54) shooting day. This was the first non-division I team on Stonehill's schedule this season and the first for the Skyhawks since a 92-45 win over Eastern Nazarene on Nov. 30, 2022, last season. Freshman Louie Semona (Cincinnati, Ohio) set a new career-high, scoring 10 points and knocking down two three-pointers for the third time in the last four games.

ROTATING CAST

The Skyhawks have already had seven different starting lineups through the first 13 games of the season. Nine different players have started for Stonehill, with only grad student Max Zegarowski and fifth-year transfer Pano Pavlidis starting all 13 contests. Stonehill started the season using three different starting lineups in the first three games before rolling out the same starting lineup for the next four games until junior transfer Shane O'Dell fell out of the lineup due to an injury at TAMUC on Nov. 20. Stonehill started the same five for the next three games before another injury, this time to senior Jackson Benigni, forced another change to the starting lineup.

ROAD WARRIORS

Stonehill enters Sunday's game playing its 10th game on the road out of its 14 games this season. The Skyhawks, currently 0-9 when traveling from Easton, Mass., scheduled 11 of their 15 non-conference games to be played on the road. The meat of the road schedule came in November as Stonehill played five straight games (Nov. 11-Nov. 26) away from Merkert Gym. During the five-game stretch, the Skyhawks played in four different states, Connecticut (at UConn, at Quinnipiac), Pennsylvania (at St. Joseph's (Pa.)), Kentucky (at the University of Kentucky), and Texas (at Texas A&M-Commerce). Florida will be the tenth and final state that Stonehill has played in this season.

TRANSFER TRIO

Stonehill saw three new faces join the team for the 2023-24 season through the transfer portal. Sophomore Tony Felder (Virginia Military Institute), junior Shane O'Dell (Saint Rose), and Pano Pavlidis (Hartford). Despite all three being newcomers, the trio has made an instant impact for the Skyhawks as Pavlidis has started all 13 games while Felder has started all but one and O'Dell has started in all five games he has played in, only missing time due to injury. Felder currently leads the team in assists while ranking third in scoring and steals per game. Pavlidis is first on the team in field goal percentage and rebounds per game. O'Dell is the team's fourth-best scorer and is second in field goal percentage.

TOUGH SLATE

Stonehill has picked up where it left off last season when it comes to assembling a tough non-conference slate, featuring three pre-season ranked opponents and two of the NCAA Final Four teams from this past March. They'll take on teams from the Big East (1 - #5 UConn), ACC (1 - #12 Miami), SEC (1 - #17 Kentucky), Big Ten (1 - Rutgers), A-10 (2 - Saint Joseph's (Pa.), George Washington), Patriot League (1 - Army), America East (3 - UMass Lowell, Binghamton, New Hampshire), and the MAAC (2 - Quinnipiac, Rider) leading up to their second season of NEC play. 11 of the Skyhawks 15 non-conference games will be played on the road.

RANKED RIGOR

Stonehill enters the season with three nationally ranked opponents from the AP/Coaches Preseason Poll, No. 6 UConn, No. 13 Miami, and No. 16 Kentucky. Prior to the 2023-24 season, the Skyhawks had never faced a nationally ranked Division I opponent in its programs history.

WINDY CITY WELCOME

The Northeast Conference announced on Tuesday that Chicago State University has accepted full membership to the Conference starting on July 1, 2024. Chicago State is set to join NEC charter members FDU, Long Island University, Saint Francis University and Wagner College, alongside Central Connecticut State University (admitted in 1997), Stonehill College (admitted in 2022), and Le Moyne College (admitted in 2023). The inclusion of Chicago State markedly expands the NEC footprint, now encompassing three of the United States' top 10 media markets: New York City (No. 1), Chicago (No. 3) and Boston (No. 8). Located on Chicago's south side, CSU offers 15 varsity intercollegiate athletic programs, all of which are sponsored by the NEC. The Cougars field seven men's teams and eight women's teams. Sports sponsorship at CSU includes men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and women's volleyball. Chicago State will be integrated into NEC athletic schedules beginning with the 2024-25 academic year. The Cougars will gain immediate eligibility to participate in all NEC championships and earn the conference's automatic qualifier to NCAA Championships. Founded in 1867, Chicago State holds the distinction of being the sole four-year Predominantly Black Institution (PBI) in Illinois as designated by the U.S. Department of Education. Boasting an enrollment of nearly 3,000, Chicago State ranks No. 1 in tuition affordability in the Chicagoland area and is in the top 4 percent nationally for boosting graduates' economic mobility.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

Stonehill was picked to finish ninth in 2022-23 prior to its first Northeast Conference season by the league's head coaches before they finished in a tie for second place as they went 10-6. This season, they were voted to finish in sixth place, three spots higher after their strong debut to the NEC in 2022-23.

MAD MAX

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI**

(South Hamilton, Mass.) Ranked second in the NEC by shooting 41.8-percent (70-167) from three-point distance this season, ranking third in the Conference with his 2.3 three-point field goals per game. His 197 three-pointers over the course of his career, including his time at Lynn and Franklin Pierce, would be good for seventh on Stonehill's all-time list. He has canned four-plus threes in 19 career games, with six last season, including six in the wins over Eastern Nazarene and LIU.

MILESTONE MAX

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI** (South Hamilton, Mass.) reached a personal milestone at St. Francis Brooklyn on February 4, 2023 with his layup to close out the first half scoring giving him 1,000 points in 86 career games played, including his time at Lynn and Franklin Pierce. Zegarowski scored eight points in five games at Lynn University in 2018-19, before playing 55 games over three seasons at former NE10 divisional foe Franklin Pierce University from 2019-22, where he scored 677 points, including 431 points in 2021-22 to help the Ravens to an NCAA Tournament bid. He has totaled 421 points in 34 games at Stonehill to give him 1,106 points in 94 career games.

250 FOR COACH KRAUS

Stonehill's win at LIU on January 20 marked the 250th game in charge for head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06**. In his tenth year at the helm of his alma mater, Kraus has posted a 146-127 (.552) career record and participated in his 450th game associated with the College (student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach) against Wagner on January 5. Kraus' now 273 games as a head coach at Stonehill ranks third all-time in program history behind Ray Pepin (312) and David McLaughlin (288).

FOREVER A SKYHAWK!

Stonehill's game against Wagner on January 5, 2023 marked the 450th game Stonehill head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06** had a role with the program including his time as a student-athlete (114) from 2002-06, assistant coach (90) between 2010-13, and head

coach (273) since 2013. Kraus has now had a role with his alma mater in 24.5-percent of the men's basketball games in the program's 74-year history. Stonehill has posted a 266-211 (.568) record over his combined 17-years at the College.

NEC DEBUT WINS

Stonehill is the sixth new Northeast Conference member to record a win in its NEC debut game after its 74-67 triumph at Sacred Heart on November 29, 2022. The Skyhawks join Merrimack (vs. Sacred Heart in 2020), Quinnipiac (at Monmouth, 1998), Maryland Baltimore County (vs Mount Saint Mary's, 1998), Rider (vs. St. Francis-Brooklyn, 1993) and Monmouth (vs LIU, 1986) in posting NEC debut wins.

LET'S MAKE IT TWO!

Stonehill is one of just four NEC newcomers to win their debut games on both the men's and women's side after the Stonehill women notched a 73-66 victory in their Conference opener at Central Connecticut State on January 5, 2023. Stonehill is the first since Quinnipiac won both openers in 1998, also joining Rider (1992-93) and Monmouth (1985-86).

NEC COACHING DEBUT

Stonehill's **CHRIS KRAUS '06** was among three head coaches a season ago to earn wins in their NEC debuts. The Skyhawks made their mark with a 74-67 victory at Sacred Heart.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

Stonehill posted its first three NCAA Division I wins in the State of New York, with its victories at Army West Point (11/12), against Holy Cross (at Fordham, 11/19) and at Binghamton (12/3). The Skyhawks have posted a 5-2 mark in the Empire State overall, including a 4-1 mark in true road games in the State after wins at St. Francis Brooklyn to complete the Brooklyn sweep with LIU.

NOT SO PATRIOTIC

Stonehill's first two wins in its inaugural NCAA Division I season were against Patriot League members with its 82-77 decision at Army West Point on November 12, 2022 and 81-79 victory over Holy Cross a week later on November 19, 2022 at Fordham's Tom Konchalski Classic.

HISTORY MADE AT HISTORIC PLACE

Stonehill couldn't have picked a more historic location for the first win in its NCAA Division I era, an 82-77 triumph over Army in West Point on November 12, 2022. The Skyhawks accomplished the historic win in just its third game since starting its transition to Division I status on July 1, 2022.

PROUD HISTORY

Stonehill won the Northeast-10 Presidents' Cup six times, finishing in the top three in the final standings 15 of the last 17 years. Stonehill was one of just ten institutions nationwide to receive the NCAA Division II Presidents' Award for Academic Achievement, recognizing athletic departments with an Academic Suc-

cess rating of 90-percent or better, each of the first ten years of the program's existence. The College ranks No. 98 in the category of National Liberal Arts Schools by U.S. News & World Report and No. 94 for the Best Value category.

HOOP HISTORY

Stonehill men's basketball earned 15 NCAA Division II Tournament bids over its history, the last was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. Stonehill were charter members of the Northeast-10 Conference, winning the first two tournament championships in 1981 and '82, finishing its time in the Conference with four postseason titles and six regular season championships.

TRUE TO HIS SCHOOL

Stonehill head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06** is one of 52 Division I head coaches in charge of his alma mater. Kraus has held a role for Stonehill for 476 games since 2002, which includes 114 as a student-athlete from 2002-06, 90 as assistant coach and now 273 as head coach. Kraus owns the distinction of having been part of NCAA Division II Elite Eight teams as a student-athlete (2006), assistant coach (2021) and head coach (2016).



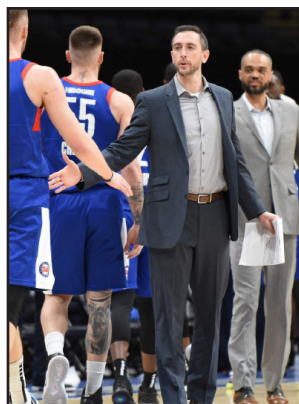
KARYS

TBT COACH

Stonehill men's basketball assistant coach, **JASON KARYS** and alum, **IVAN ALMEIDA '11** participated in The Basketball Tournament (TBT) over the 2022 summer. Karys was head coach of "The CRU", a team that while featured Almeida as a team member, comprised of former Valparaiso University men's basketball alumni including current Houston Rockets Summer League member, Eron Gordon (brother of Phoenix Suns shooting guard, Eric Gordon). Last year's appearance in the tournament marked the first ever for The CRU who were an eight seed took on number one seed, Gutter Cats as members in the Omaha Region.

A FEIN JOB

Former Stonehill men's basketball All-American **SHAUN FEIN** is currently serving as player development coach with the Los Angeles Clippers. Fein played two seasons at Stonehill from 1996-98 before transferring to Georgia Tech. The Barnstable, Mass., native is tied for ninth in program history with 156 three-pointers, finishing with 967 points in 56 games over his two seasons at Stonehill, helping the team reach the NCAA regional championship game in 1998.

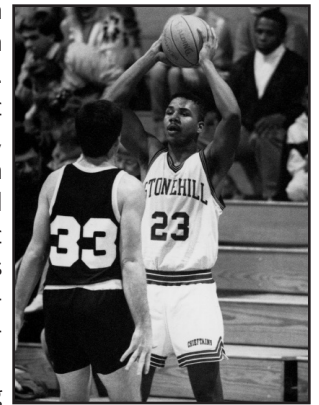
FAMILY BIG EAST TIES

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI'S** (South Hamilton, Mass.) twin brother, Marcus was a first team All-Big East selection at Creighton. The 2020-21 Big East Preseason Player of the Year currently plays for Vanoli Cremona of the Lega Basket Serie A, Italy's top professional league. He formerly played for the Long Island Nets, Windy City Bulls, and the Austin Spurs of the NBA G League. Max's older half-brother, Michael Carter-Williams is a former NBA first round draft pick and half-brother of both Max and Marcus. Carter-Williams won Rookie of the Year in the NBA in 2014 whilst playing for the Philadelphia 76ers. He has played for the Milwaukee Bucks, Chicago Bulls, Charlotte Hornets, Houston Rockets, and Orlando Magic in his NBA career. The veteran guard currently plays for the Capitanes de Ciudad de Mexico of the NBA G League.

Stonehill College takes great pride in the coaching career of Georgetown head coach **ED COOLEY**, Class of 1994. Cooley was a three-year captain at Stonehill, finishing with 795 points, 594 rebounds and over 100 assists in 107 career games played. He helped Stonehill to four NE10 Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals his senior year, when he ranked seventh among NE10 rebounding leaders with 7.0 per game.

Chris Kraus, Stonehill College Class of 2006 and a native of Toronto, Ontario, was named the 14th head coach of

the Stonehill men's basketball program in July, 2013. He is the first alumnus to direct the Skyhawks and is the first Canadian-born coach to take the helm of an NCAA men's basketball program.

Kraus, who will be the lone Canadian head coach at the NCAA Division I level as Stonehill begins its second year in transition as a member of the Northeast Conference, has maintained Stonehill's winning tradition over his tenure, leading his alma mater to a 146-127 (.552) record through nine seasons. In the Skyhawks first season in the NEC, Stonehill finished 10-6, coming in a tie for second place in the regular season standings. Kraus was named the NEC's Jim Phelan Coach of the Year Award by the Conference's nine head coaches in the teams first year as a member.

In eight years as a member of the the highly competitive Northeast-10 Conference, Kraus recorded an 87-77 (.531) clip with three NCAA Division II Tournament bids. The Skyhawks captured their third NCAA East Regional Championship in program history in 2016, advancing to the Elite Eight for the third time in the last ten years.

Kraus has played a part in each of the three Elite Eight appearances in Stonehill history, guiding the Skyhawks as a senior point guard in 2006, as an assistant coach under current Dartmouth College mentor David McLaughlin in 2012 and then full circle as a head coach in 2016. He is the only coach in NCAA Division II East Region history to guide a program to a regional title as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Kraus' student-athletes earned 13 All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, including Will Moreton, '20, a three-time All-NE10 selection, who was named the NE10 Player of the Year following the 2019-20 season. Ryan Logan '17, the 2013-14 NE10 Rookie of the Year and is the first student-athlete under Kraus to collect NABC All-District honors with second team honors as junior and senior. Moreton added NABC All-District first team and D2ADA All-East Region first team honors during his senior year, when he became the program's first All-American in 22

seasons with his spot on the Division II Bulletin fourth team in 2020.

Moreton collected CoSIDA Academic All-District I first team honors, joining Pierce Cumpstone, '16 and Monty Urmilevicius, '21 in earning the recognition under Kraus' leadership. The group also earned NE10 Academic All-Conference honors during his tenure.

Kraus has regularly seen his graduates go on to enjoy professional careers overseas, with Logan now playing in Sweden and Moreton in Spain, the most notable.

Stonehill posted a 19-10 overall record in 2014-15, finishing tied for second in the NE10 Northeast Division standings with a 14-7 mark in Conference play. While the Skyhawks fell to eventual NE10 Tournament champions American International College in the quarterfinal round, Kraus guided the program to its 13th NCAA Tournament appearance, and first since reaching the National Semifinals in 2012.

That season spurred Stonehill entering the 2015-16 campaign that would see the Skyhawks post a 24-9 record overall, including 15-6 in the highly competitive NE10 Northeast Division that would send four teams to the NCAA Tournament. It was the NCAA East Regional in Philadelphia, where the Skyhawks hit their stride, led by senior point guard and future assistant coach Carter Smith, '16 who earned Regional Most Outstanding Player honors. Stonehill won its third regional championship in program history, and a spot in the NCAA II Elite Eight in Frisco, Texas, with a pair of thrilling overtime wins as the Skyhawks knocked off three NE10 divisional rivals on their way to the regional title.

Stonehill has enjoyed a winning season in six of the eight seasons Kraus has been in charge. The Skyhawks posted an 18-11 mark, including 13-6 in the NE10 to finish second in the division, reaching the semifinal round of the NE10 Tournament. Stonehill was again poised for a strong NCAA East Regional run, before the Skyhawks' 15th NCAA Tournament bid was halted before the regional started by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Kraus earned his first career win with a 75-58 triumph over Georgian Court University in his debut as head coach and picked up his first NE10 victory with a 61-56 decision over Assumption College on December 4, 2013. He reached the 100-win plateau with the Skyhawks 78-70 win over Saint Michael's College on November 23, 2019.

Kraus took over the helm at Stonehill after serving as former head coach David McLaughlin's top assistant coach for three seasons. Stonehill averaged 20 wins over those three years, reaching the NCAA Tournament twice, including the 2011-12 season when the Skyhawks posted 25 wins and captured both the NE10 Tournament and NCAA Division II East Regional crown on its way to the national semifinal round at the Elite Eight.



As a student-athlete within the program from 2002-2006, Kraus was a member of the 2005-06 squad that won a program-record 27 games and earned the program's first regional championship and trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in Springfield, Massachusetts. Along with the team's national semifinal round run during his senior season, Kraus earned All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, was named to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team and with his play was amongst the nation's leaders in a number of statistical categories. He trained with the Canadian Senior Men's National Team from 2002-2005, and won a silver medal playing for Canada at the World Junior Championships in France in 1999.

After graduating from Stonehill in 2006, Kraus played professionally in England for London United before returning home to begin his coaching career. He was an assistant at Acadia University in Nova Scotia, Canada, where he assisted the team in capturing the AUS Conference championship and a berth in the national tournament. He then spent two seasons as the top assistant at Brandon University in Manitoba, Canada, helping the team earn back-to-back GPAC conference titles.

In addition to his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from Stonehill, Kraus was admitted to the Faculty of Education program at Brandon University and earned his Master's Degree in athletic administration from Endicott College in 2012.

Kraus and his wife, Ashley, also a 2006 Stonehill graduate and former women's tennis student-athlete, reside in West Bridgewater, Massachusetts, with son, Tanner (4), and daughter, Josephine (2).

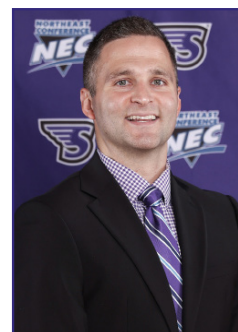
