THE GAME

- Coming off a dominant 45-20 win over Boston College in their regular season finale, the Hurricanes wrap up their second season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Thurs., Dec. 28 against Rutgers at the 2023 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium in New York, N.Y.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Drew Carter (pxp), Rod Gilmore (color) & Taylor Davis (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) & Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** booth for the 22nd season. **Radio Mundo 1210 AM** will also broadcast Miami's bowl game from New York.

THE SERIES

- Miami leads the all-time series against Rutgers by a perfect 11-0 margin; the programs were BIG EAST foes and played every year from 1993-2003.
- UM has not faced the Scarlet Knights since 2003, a 34-10 win by the Canes at the Orange Bowl. The upcoming bowl is the first neutral site matchup.
- **Mario Cristobal** coached tight ends and offensive line under Greg Schiano at Rutgers from 2001-2003, facing off against Miami three times there.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami wraps up the Year 2 of the **Mario Cristobal** Era on Thurs., Dec. 28 when it travels to New York City for the 2023 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl.
- The Hurricanes are coming off a dominant 45-20 win over Boston College in their regular season finale in Chestnut Hill, Mass. on Friday, November 24.
- 13 student-athletes were recognized with All-ACC honors, including first-team picks WR **Xavier Restrepo**, DB **Kam Kinchens** and K **Andy Borregales**.
- DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** was recognized with ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and was named a Freshman All-America by every outlet.
- Miami was the only school in the country to have a 247Sports Freshman All-America in all three phases: Bain, OL **Francis Mauigoa** and P **Dylan Joyce**.
- In addition to the above three first-team selections, the other all-conference honorees included: OL **Jalen Rivers**, OL **Matt Lee**, LB **Francisco Mauigoa** and specialist **Brashard Smith** (second team), WR **Jacoby George** and Bain were named to the All-ACC Third Team, while OL **Anez Cooper**, OL **Javion Cohen**, OL **Francis Mauigoa** and Joyce earned All-ACC Honorable Mention. Smith was additionally named honorable mention all-purpose.
- QB **Jacurri Brown** is projected to make his first start of the season and third of his career against Rutgers; he saw action in eight games as a true freshman in 2022, with his best outing coming in a road win at Georgia Tech, when he threw for three touchdown passes and rushed for 87 yards.
- George and Restrepo are one of six FBS duos and the only ACC duo to each record at least 850 receiving yards and 55 receptions this season. It is the only time that UM has had such a duo over the past 25 years; Restrepo was second in the ACC in receiving yards (993) while George was third (851).
- UM is playing in a bowl for the first time under Cristobal and the 45th time in history; Miami is 20-24 in bowls, with its last bowl win coming in 2016.
- Regarded as one of the nations top recruiters, and in his second recruiting cycle at Miami that ended on Dec. 22, Cristobal and UM - for the second straight year - signed the best class in program history, the top-ranked class in the ACC and top class in the state, according to 247Sports Composite.
- Cristobal, a double alum of the University, was named the 26th head coach in program history by school president Dr. Julio Frenk on Dec. 6, 2021.
- Cristobal returned home after spending the previous four seasons as head coach at Oregon, where he won two Pac-12 titles and captured a Rose Bowl.
- The second-year Miami head coach hired **Shannon Dawson** from the University of Houston as the team's offensive coordinator and **Lance Guidry** from Marshall as the team's defensive coordinator entering 2023. In total, there were new faces in seven of 10 assistant coach roles this past fall; in addition to Dawson and Guidry, Cristobal hired **Derek Nicholson** (from Louisville) to coach linebackers, **Tim Harris, Jr.**, (UCF) to coach running backs, **Kevin Beard** (Toledo) to coach wide receivers and elevated both **Jason Taylor** (defensive line) and **Cody Woodiel** (tight ends) from analyst roles.

QUICK HITS

HURRICANES GOING BOWLING IN NYC

- The Hurricanes will be going bowling for the first time under **Mario Cristobal** on Dec. 28, when they travel to New York City for the 2023 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl.
- The Hurricanes own a 20-24 record in bowl games all-time, and are making their second trip ever for the Pinstripe Bowl. UM fell in the 2018 Pinstripe Bowl to Wisconsin.
- Cristobal has a 3-3 all-time record in bowl games as head coach, and a 3-2 mark as a full-time head coach; he was named interim head coach for the 2017 Las Vegas Bowl at Oregon.

RESTREPO & GEORGE AMONG TOP DUOS

- WR **Xavier Restrepo** and WR **Jacoby George** emerged with breakout 2023 seasons, and are among the top-performing duos in the nation at wide receiver.
- George and Restrepo are one of six FBS duos and the only ACC duo to each record at least 850 receiving yards and 55 receptions this season.
- It is the only time that UM has had such a duo over the past 25 years; Restrepo was second in the ACC in receiving yards (993) while George was third (851)
- Restrepo was named to the All-ACC First Team, while George was a third-team pick.

"HURRICANE" BAIN NAMED ACC D-ROY

- One of the biggest reasons for Miami's strong defense in 2023 was the dominance of freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, who was named ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year at the conference's end-of-year banquet in Charlotte, where he accepted the award.
- Bain ranked first among defensive linemen with 37 total tackles, which included a team high-tying 7.5 sacks to go along with 9.5 tackles for loss.
- Bain, a Freshman All-America by every major outlet, was named one of five Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year finalists.

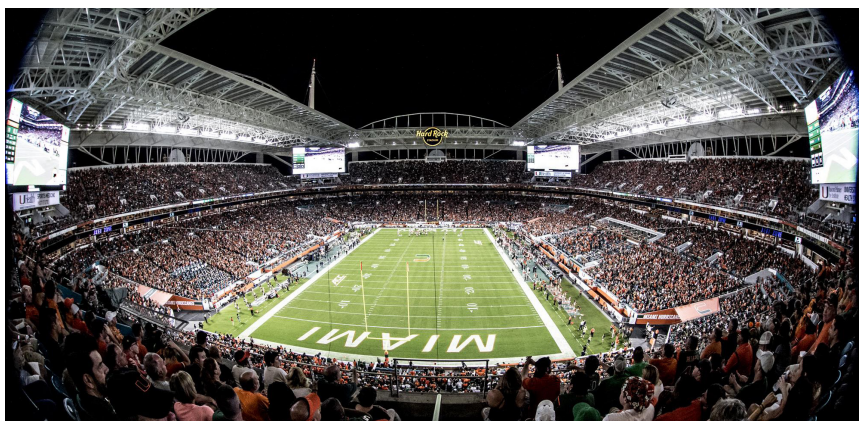

LB Francisco Mauigoa ranks No. 9 in the nation and No. 2 in the ACC with an average of 1.4 tackles for loss per contest so far this year; he leads the Hurricanes with 17 tackles for loss this season.

Miami reeled in its second straight top-10 recruiting class under Mario Cristobal's direction; the Hurricanes signed a class ranked No. 3 in the nation in the early signing period.

60

In a Nov. 11 game at FSU, Miami managed its fifth occurrence of allowing 60 or fewer net rushing yards in 2023 - tied for the most such games in the FBS this season, along with only two other teams: Air Force and Nebraska.

115

Mark Fletcher, Jr. rushed for 115 yards in the first start of his Miami career at NC State; it marked the first 100-yard game by a true freshman running back at Miami since Joe Yearby did so in 2014 vs. North Carolina (104 yards).

150

In Miami's game against FSU, Jacolby George became the third Hurricane this century to record at least 150 receiving yards and multiple receiving touchdowns on five or fewer receptions in a game, joining Phillip Dorsett (2014 vs. Arkansas State) and Santana Moss (2000 vs. Virginia Tech).

HURRICANES TO PLAY RUTGERS IN BAD BOY MOWERS PINSTRIPE BOWL

- Miami wraps up its second season under the direction of head coach **Mario Cristobal** on Thurs., Dec. 28 against Rutgers in the 2023 Bad Boy Mowers Pinstripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium in New York, N.Y.
- The Hurricanes and Rutgers used to face off as opponents in the BIG EAST Conference. UM is 11-0 all-time against Rutgers, its best record against any opponent, winning each game by at least 14 points.
- Miami is playing in a bowl game for the 45th time in history and is 20-24 in 44 previous bowls. As a head coach, Cristobal has totaled a 3-3 bowl record, including a win at Oregon in the 2020 Rose Bowl.
- The Pinstripe Bowl marks the first head-to-head meeting between Cristobal and one of his coaching mentors, Greg Schiano. Cristobal coached tight ends and offensive line at Rutgers from 2001-2003.
- Joining Cristobal on the sidelines in 2023 were seven new faces in full-time assistant coach roles, including both coordinators - offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson** from the University of Houston and defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry** from Marshall - who are both in their first seasons at The U.
- Miami's game vs. Rutgers is also slated for broadcast on 560 WQAM and Radio Mundo 1210 a.m.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI WRAPS UP REGULAR SEASON WITH WIN AT BC

- The Hurricanes used a 21-point second quarter to take control of the game and cruised to a win 45-20 win over Boston College at Alumni Stadium in Chestnut Hill, Mass. in its regular season finale Nov. 24.
- WR **Xavier Restrepo** hauled in six passes for 117 yards while WR **Jacolby George** had 89 yards on six catches with a touchdown. RB **Henry Parrish, Jr.**, led Miami with 111 rushing yards and two scores.
- Three different running backs had a touchdown rush and nine Hurricanes caught at least one pass.
- Miami was led defensively by LB **Francisco Mauigoa**, who finished with a team-high nine tackles, two tackles for loss. DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, had a sack and LB **Marcellius Pulliam** had an interception.
- The Hurricanes outgained the Eagles, 532-294. BC QB Thomas Castellanos threw two picks in the loss.

13 HURRICANES EARN ALL-ACC RECOGNITION IN CONFERENCE VOTING

- 13 Hurricanes were among those to be recognized with end-of-season all-conference football honors, the conference announced on Nov. 28. Miami was headline by three All-ACC First Team selections.
- WR **Xavier Restrepo**, DB **Kam Kinchens** and K **Andy Borregales** were all named All-ACC First Team. OL **Jalen Rivers**, OL **Matt Lee**, LB **Francisco Mauigoa** and SP **Brashard Smith** were selected to the All-ACC Second Team. WR **Jacolby George** and DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** captured third-team plaudits.
- Four others - OL **Anez Cooper**, OL **Javion Cohen**, OL **Francis Mauigoa** and P **Dylan Joyce** - were All-ACC Honorable Mention selections. Smith also added an All-ACC honorable mention as an all-purpose.
- In addition to his all-conference honors, Bain became the third Hurricane to ever win the ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year award, joining LB Sean Spence (2008) and DE Greg Rousseau (2019).

GUIDRY'S UNIT IMPRESSED IN YEAR 1 AS UM DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

- **Lance Guidry**, who was named defensive coordinator at Miami in February 2023, spent the previous two seasons as the defensive coordinator at Marshall. He was a Broyles Award semifinalist this year.
- Guidry made his impact felt in his first season as the defensive coordinator in Coral Gables. The Hurricanes rank No. 26 in FBS in total defense (324.1 yards per game), No. 13 in FBS in team sacks (2.92), No. 19 in FBS in tackles for loss per game (6.9) and No. 16 in first downs on defense (209).
- The Canes are one of just 11 teams in all of FBS allowing fewer than 100 rushing yards per game (97.1).
- Miami ranks No. 10 in the nation in rushing defense, and also rank No. 1 in the ACC in the category.
- In other categories, the Hurricanes rank No. 38 nationally in scoring defense (22.1 points), No. 27 in passes intercepted (12), No. 34 in third down defense (35.4) and No. 15 in fourth down defense (38.5).

IT STARTS IN THE TRENCHES: UM'S OFFENSIVE LINE PLAY WAS PIVOTAL

- One of the most important components to Miami's season was the impressive play of its offensive line. Miami started LT **Jalen Rivers**, LG **Javion Cohen**, C **Matt Lee**, RG **Anez Cooper** and RT **Francis Mauigoa** for all of its games, but Cohen and Lee will be missing the bowl to prepare for the NFL Draft.
- All five linemen earned All-ACC recognition, with Rivers and Lee picking up second-team honors.
- The group was recognized for its outstanding play when it was selected to the midseason honor roll for the Joe Moore Award, which annually honors the top-performing offensive unit in college football.
- Entering Week 13, the Hurricanes were one of only nine FBS groups to have started the same five OL.
- In a win vs. Clemson, the group had perhaps its best performance yet. With a freshman QB making his first start, the group did not allow a sack and helped total 211 rushing yards against an elite defense.
- Lee was named a candidate for the Rimington Trophy, honoring the top center, after a standout career at UCF. Cohen transferred from Alabama and was named an Outland Trophy candidate.

MORE ON THE WAY: UM REELS IN THIRD-RANKED '24 SIGNING CLASS

- Miami's 2023 recruiting class included 15 players ranked in the ESPN 300, including one of the top five, two in the top 20 and six in the top 100. With the regular season in the books, Miami was the only team in America to feature a Freshman All-America in all three phases of the game: DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, OL **Francis Mauigoo** and P **Dylan Joyce** were all recognized by 247Sports after the season.
- Five members of that group started on the road at Florida State in November: Bain, Mauigoo, DB **Damari Brown**, RB **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** and QB **Emory Williams**. Mauigoo started all 12 games.
- Bain was named a Freshman All-America by nearly every outlet and was also ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year. He was named a finalist for the Shaun Alexander Award honoring the nation's top freshman.
- The Hurricanes look to have added another talented wave for 2024; in the early signing period on National Signing Day on Nov. 20, Miami reeled in the third-ranked recruiting class by 247Sports.
- Miami signed a top-10 class in back-to-back years (2023, 2024) for the first time since 2004 + 2005.
- For the second straight year, Miami signed the top-ranked class in the state of Florida and in the ACC.
- UM was ranked behind Georgia (#1) and Alabama (#2) and ahead of Texas (#4) and Ohio State (#5).
- The Hurricanes' 27-member class included 15 defensive players, 11 offensive players and one specialist.

GEORGE COMPILED BREAKOUT YEAR, #3 IN ACC IN RECEIVING YARDS

- One of Miami's top performers on offense this season has been WR **Jacolby George**, who ended up blossoming into one of the conference's best performers in his first year as a full-time starter.
- George totaled 313 yards in his first two seasons (2021, 2022) but has 851 yards in 2023 - second-most on UM and third-most in the ACC. He also leads Miami in touchdown receptions (8) this year.
- The Lauderhill, Fla., native has been recognized as ACC Receiver of the Week twice this year, following games vs. Texas A&M and Florida State. In his game against FSU, he became the third UM player this century to record at least 150 receiving yards and multiple receiving TDs on five or fewer catches in a game, joining Phillip Dorsett (2014 vs. Arkansas State) and Santana Moss (2000 vs. Virginia Tech).
- Entering Miami's Sept. 9 matchup with Texas A&M, George had just one career touchdown catch in two-plus seasons. He had three alone vs A&M, becoming the first Cane to have three touchdown grabs in the same game since WR **Leonard Hankerson** did so against at Clemson on Oct. 2, 2010.
- George put together only the fourth game of three receiving touchdowns by an ACC player this year.
- The junior was named to the All-ACC Third Team after a standout 2023, averaging 70.9 yards/game.

NEW FACES AROUND IN 2023, BOTH ON THE FIELD AND ON SIDELINES

- Among the many storylines of the offseason was the revamping of the Hurricanes roster entering Year 2 under **Mario Cristobal** - both on the sideline with assistant coaches and on the field with players.
- Cristobal's first full recruiting class was the best-ranked class in program history according to the 247Sports Composite; UM's class was the top-rated group in both the ACC and in the state of Florida.
- The Hurricanes also brought in several transfers who started all 12 games; OL **Javion Cohen** (Alabama), OL **Matt Lee** (UCF) and LB **Francisco Mauigoo** (Wazzu) are included in the group.
- In total, the Hurricanes have 40 scholarship players who were not on the team in 2022, including a recruiting class featuring 24 true freshman, headlined by five-star offensive lineman **Francis Mauigoo**.
- The Hurricanes new look coaching staff includes seven faces who were not on the full-time staff as assistants a season ago; offensive coordinator **Shannon Dawson**, defensive coordinator **Lance Guidry**, wide receivers coach **Kevin Beard**, running backs coach **Tim Harris, Jr.**, defensive line coach **Jason Taylor**, linebackers coach **Derek Nicholson** and tight ends coach **Cody Woodiel**. Taylor and Woodiel spent the 2022 season as analysts on the Hurricanes staff, while both Beard and Harris are UM alumni.

BAIN SHINED IN 2023, AMONG FIVE FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR FINALISTS

- One of Miami's most impressive breakout players of the season has been true freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** Bain was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and Rookie of the Week on Oct. 23 after a dominant game vs. Clemson. He repeated as ACC DL of the Week honoree on Oct. 30.
- The freshman became the third Hurricane to win ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors, joining Greg Rousseau (2019) and Sean Spence (2008). He also captured third-team All-ACC honors.
- Bain was named one of five finalists for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year Award.
- A Miami native, Bain is tied for UM lead and is tied for fifth in the ACC with 7.5 sacks. He's second on the team in tackles for loss (9.5) and has totaled 37 tackles, which is tops among defensive linemen.
- In a 20T win over Clemson, Bain had the best performance of his young career - eight tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble. Bain was also named 247Sports True Freshman of the Week and hauled in Shaun Alexander Award Freshman of the Week recognition for his dominant game vs. Clemson.
- He outdid himself against Virginia, finishing with 2.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and seven tackles.
- According to PFF, Bain has more credited quarterback pressures this year (41) than many of the players considered to be the top defensive line prospects in college football ahead of the 2024 NFL Draft; there are only 33 players in all of FBS that have been credited with at least 40 pressures by PFF.
- Bain's older brother, Reggie, is a graduate assistant coach working with the offensive line on UM staff.

MAUIGOA DELIVERING DOMINANT YEAR IN MIDDLE OF MIAMI DEFENSE

- Linebacker **Francisco "Kiko" Mauigoa** has been one of UM's best performers since arriving after spending the first two seasons of his career at Washington State. Mauigoa has started all 12 games.
- Mauigoa ranks second on the team in total tackles with 70 and leads the Hurricanes with 17 tackles for loss. He also is tied for the team lead with 7.5 sacks, and has one interception and two forced fumbles.
- Mauigoa ranks second in the ACC in total tackles for loss and also ranks No. 9 in FBS in the category.

DAWSON'S OFFENSE RANKS IN TOP 25 IN YARDS PER PLAY IN YEAR 1

- **Shannon Dawson**, who was named offensive coordinator / quarterbacks coach at Miami in February 2023, spent the past four seasons at the University of Houston (2019-2022) before joining The U.
- Miami is No. 22 in FBS in yards per play at 6.51. Against FBS competition, UM is one of 31 in the nation averaging more than 6.0 yards per play (6.1). UM ranked No. 104 in FBS last season in yards per play.
- Miami rushed for 211 yards in a 20T win over Clemson on Oct. 21, marking only the 30th time a Dabo Swinney-led Tigers defense had surrendered 200 or more rushing yards in more than 200 games.
- Among other categories where Dawson's work has been clear: Miami ranks No. 28 in FBS and No. 1 in the ACC in completion percentage (64.9), and No. 25 in FBS and No. 2 in ACC in total offense (441.2). Miami is averaging than 70+ more yards per game of offense compared to last year's average (367.1).
- In Dawson's three seasons as quarterbacks coach with the Cougars (2020-22), Houston quarterbacks combined to throw 87 touchdown passes (13th nationally) behind a 65.3 completion percentage (19th) and 10,008 passing yards (21st). Dawson tutored signal caller Clayton Tune to a record-setting career. In 2022, Tune set the American Athletic Conference single-season TD passes record (40).
- Dawson's Cougars ranked eighth nationally in passing offense (314.0) in 2022, while Houston wide receiver Nathaniel Dell led the nation in receiving touchdowns (17) and receiving yards (1,398).
- Other impressive numbers: Houston ranked 15th nationally in scoring offense (35.6), 22nd in first downs offense (314), 23rd in passing offense (271.6) and 25th in red zone offense (.891) in 2022.

"FOURTH QUARTER PROGRAM" EFFECT: UM AMONG TOP IN 4Q SCORING

- When Mario Cristobal arrived to Miami in 2021, one of his first hires was strength & conditioning coordinator **Aaron Feld**. The duo's "fourth quarter" spring workout program has become a staple.
- In games involving only FBS teams across the country, the Hurricanes rank No. 21 in the nation in fourth quarter scoring at 8.5 points per game in 2023. Only 30 teams average more than 8.0 in 4Q.

RESTREPO EMERGING AS GO-TO WIDE RECEIVER IN AIR RAID OFFENSE

- While Miami's offense has impressed under OC Shannon Dawson, WR **Xavier Restrepo** has emerged as one of the nation's top wide receivers this season. He leads the Hurricanes with 74 receptions - including a career-high 12 catches in a start against Georgia Tech and 11 more vs. North Carolina. Restrepo ranks No. 27 in FBS in receptions per game (6.2) and tied for No. 27 in total receptions (74).
- In UM's game with Louisville, Restrepo (193 yards) recorded his fourth game of the season with at least 120 receiving yards. He became the only Hurricane over the past 25 years to record three such games within the first five games of a year - he also managed to do so vs. Texas A&M, Temple and GT.
- GT was the first game to have 10 catches since Mike Harley had 13 vs. Duke on Nov. 27, 2021. Restrepo is only the third Cane in the last five years to have 10 in a game, joining Harley and Charleston Rambo.
- Restrepo was an All-ACC First Team pick; he is closing in on Miami's sixth 1,000-yard season ever.
- Restrepo, who also paces the Hurricanes in receiving yards with 993, struggled through an injury-marred 2022 where he caught only 21 passes for 240 yards total, seeing action in just seven games.
- The fourth-year junior surpassed the 1,000 career yard mark at Miami vs. Georgia Tech- he has 120 career catches for 1,618 yards with nine touchdowns. He has started all 12 games at receiver in 2023.

KINCHEMS JOINS ELITE COMPANY, HAD 11TH CAREER PICK VS. LOUISVILLE

- DB **Kam Kinchens** became only the 12th player in Miami Football history to reach double-digit interceptions for a career when he recorded a pick in Miami's 20-6 loss at NC State in Raleigh on Nov. 4.
- He had his 11th career interception against Louisville; e is one of only eight active FBS players with at least 10 career interceptions and is the only junior to crack the list - all seven others are seniors.
- Kinchens is the first Hurricane since the iconic Sean Taylor (2001-03) to record at least 10 picks in a career. Taylor finished his career with 14. Before Sean Taylor reached 10, the previous player to reach the plateau was Ed Reed, who had 21 interceptions from 1998-2001. 21 still represents Miami's career record.
- Kinchens announced his intentions to skip the bowl game and prepare for the NFL Draft in December.

FLETCHER ONE OF ACC'S TOP ROOKIES, EMERGED AS RB1 BY END OF '23

- Running back **Mark Fletcher, Jr.** delivered a strong showing in the first start of his Miami career at NC State on Nov. 4. He rushed for a career-best 115 yards on a career-high 23 carries in Raleigh, N.C.
- For his efforts, Fletcher was announce as ACC Rookie of the Week by the conference on Nov. 7.
- Fletcher delivered another dominant outing against Louisville at home: 17 carries, 126 yards and 2 TDs.
- Fletcher recorded 115 rushing yards, 5.0 yards per rush and three receptions vs. the Wolfpack. The last UM freshman to match or surpass those numbers was Duke Johnson in 2012 at BC (135, 19.3, three).
- It marked the first 100-yard game by a true freshman at UM since Joe Yearby in 2014 vs. UNC (104).

BORREGALES CARRYING ON FAMILY'S LEGACY, NAMED TO ALL-ACC 1T

- Junior K **Andy Borregales** delivered another dominant season for the Hurricanes in 2023. Ranked as a preseason candidate for the Lou Groza Award, Borregales has tallied 55 career field goals on 66 attempts (83.3%), which ranks him as the eighth-most accurate among those with 50 attempts.
- Borregales was named ACC Specialist of the Week on Oct. 30 for a dominant game vs. Virginia. Borregales hit on three field goals of at least 45 yards - connecting from 47, 50 and 48 - and went 6-for-6 on touchbacks. He is the only kicker in 2023 with a game to have three field goals of at least 45 yards.
- Borregales, whose older brother Jose is the lone Lou Groza Award winner in Miami history (2020), is 21-for-25 on field goals this year. Only one of his misses this year is on a kick attempt shorter than 45.
- Borregales is one of 44 kickers in FBS with a 80%-or-better success rate this year - he is 26th in FBS (84.0%) in the category. He is one of only 17 kickers in the country with at least 20 made field goals.

UM DOMINANT VS. CLEMSON IN TRENCHES: RUSHED >200, ALLOWED <50

- Trailing 17-7 in the fourth quarter, the Hurricanes orchestrated an impressive comeback to top visiting Clemson, 28-20, in 2OT on Oct. 21. It was UM's first overtime win since a 4OT win at Virginia in 2022.
- The Hurricanes held Clemson to just 31 rushing yards on 34 attempts, while Miami gained 211 on 38 attempts (5.6 yard average). A suffocating defense also turned the Tigers over three times in the win.
- Clemson allowed 200 rushing yards for just the 30th time under the direction of Dabo Swinney.
- DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.** led the defensive front with eight total tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble. He was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week and ACC Rookie of the Week for his efforts.
- Starting in place of QB Tyler Van Dyke, QB **Emory Williams** delivered an impressive second half to help direct the comeback effort. Williams finished 24-for-33 for 151 yards with one touchdown.
- WR **Brashard Smith** had an 80-yard run that resulted in a TD, while RB **Ajay Allen** had 54 yards and the decisive touchdown in the second overtime period. WR **Xavier Restrepo** had seven catches.
- After Allen's touchdown run, Clemson featured a 1st & Goal on the 2-yard line in the second overtime but could not capitalize. LB **Corey Flagg, Jr.**, came up with the game-ending tackle on 4th and Goal.

- Miami announced that the Hurricanes football program would retire legendary quarterback Gino Torretta's No. 13 jersey. The jersey retirement ceremony took place at halftime vs. Louisville.
- The consensus first-team All-American capped an incredible 1992 season by becoming the second Hurricane to win the Heisman Trophy, while also earning the Maxwell Award, the Davey O'Brien Award, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Walter Camp Player of the Year, the Chevrolet Offensive Player of the Year, the Toyota Leadership Award and the Hitachi/CFA Scholar Athlete of Year Award.
- Two football players – WR Michael Redding III and DL Chantz Williams – currently wear No. 13 and will have a commemorative patch on their jerseys honoring Torretta. Miami's other retired jerseys are No. 10 (George Mira), No. 14 (Vinny Testaverde), No. 42 (Jim Dooley) and No. 89 (Ted Hendricks).

BRASHARD ONE OF NATION'S MOST DANGEROUS, IS 5TH IN FBS IN KOR

- Though he has only had 20 returns in his 12 games, WR **Brashard Smith** has made them count, ranking fifth in the nation in kickoff return average averaging 29.0 yards per return so far this year.
- Smith's 98-yard kickoff return TD vs. Texas A&M was his first kickoff return for a touchdown of his career
- Smith had an 80-yard run that resulted in a touchdown in Miami's 20T win over Clemson on Oct. 21.
- The junior speedster ranks No. 2 on Miami in all-purpose yards this season, including a season-high 168 at North Carolina. He totaled 150 yards in Miami's 20T win vs. Clemson and 66 against NC State.

BACK-TO-BACK OVERTIME Ws A RARITY IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL, AT UM

- Miami won back-to-back games in overtime this season, emerging victorious over Clemson in two overtimes on Oct. 21 and beating Virginia in OT on Oct. 28. It marked the first time in the history of Miami where the Canes played two overtime games in the same season - let alone back-to-back.
- UM became the first team since Georgia Southern in 2019 to win overtime games in back-to-back outings. UM was the first Power-5 team to do it since Northwestern won three such games in 2017.

ONE OF THE BEST FBS DUOS: KINCHENS + WILLIAMS A TALENTED PAIR

- Two of Miami's closest teammates on and off the field are two of its best players in safety pairing **Kam Kinchens** and **James Williams**. The two third-year players make up a highly talented duo.
- Williams delivered a dominant outing in UM's win over Virginia totaling a team-high and career-high 13 tackles in Miami's overtime win over Virginia. He leads the Hurricanes in total tackles this season.
- Kinchens was similarly dominant against the Cavaliers; the standout was named ACC Defensive Back of the Week after recording the second pick-six of his career. Kinchens returned the pick 29 yards for a TD.
- Kinchens recorded the 11th pick of his career vs. Louisville - just the 12th UM player to reach the mark.
- Kinchens, an All-American a season ago, was named to the All-ACC First Team in 2022 and 2023 after having 59 total tackles and a team-high six interceptions. He is a member of UM's leadership council.
- Kinchens average interceptions-per-game mark (0.30) is one of the best marks in all of
- The Miami native is one of only 11 players in all of FBS to have recorded 9 career interceptions.
- Another impactful player in his own right, the 6-foot-5 Williams made 10 starts and ranked second on the team with 58 tackles a season ago. Both players are South Florida natives and best friends.

BROTHERLY LOVE IN CORAL GABLES, SEVERAL WITH UM FAMILY TIES

- The Miami Hurricanes will feature a number of family ties on the sideline this fall across the roster.
- Newcomer OL **Francis Mauigoa** and older brother LB **Francisco Mauigoa** will feature prominently for Miami this season. Another set of newcomers have lined up on the same side of the ball, in freshman DB **Damari Brown** and junior DB **Davonte Brown**. The elder Mauigoa arrived from Washington State via the transfer portal, as did the elder Brown, who came to Miami from UCF. Both arrived in January.
- Two sets of twins populate the freshmen ranks, as well; Miami natives WR **Robby Washington** and LB **Bobby Washington, Jr.**, as well as QB **Riply Luna** and WR **Kolby Luna**, who are from Idaho.
- The older brother of freshman DL **Rueben Bain, Jr.**, one of the top-ranked freshman defensive lineman, is offensive graduate assistant **Reggie Bain**. In addition, the nephew of head coach **Mario Cristobal** - **Luis Cristobal, Jr.** - transferred to Miami from Georgia State prior to the season.

CANES HADN'T STARTED WITH THREE IN A ROW AT HOME SINCE 2013

- The Hurricanes had not started the season with a 3-0 mark at home since 2013. Coincidentally, during that early stretch, they also played a ranked SEC team (No. 12 Florida) and won in Week 2.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS: UM CONTINUES RUN OF SUCCESS AT HRS

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 16th season at world-class Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 1 vs. Miami-Ohio with a 38-3 win; UM holds a 16-0 all-time mark in home openers at the stadium, having outscored opponents 727-122 for an average margin of victory of 37.8 points in those 16 games.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 17 straight home openers since - each one since 2007.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a conference opponent in only three of its 20 home openers: Florida State twice (in 2004 and 2006) and Georgia Tech once (2009).
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has opened the season at home 19 times and is 17-2 in those games. The Hurricanes are 33-12 in regular season openers dating to 1979.

UM SIGNING CLASS, RANKED AS THE BEST IN HISTORY, MAKES DEBUT

- Miami's 2023 recruiting class included 15 players ranked in the ESPN 300, including one of the top five, two in the top 20 and six in the top 100. The Canes signed two players who were considered consensus "five-star" players by every recruiting service – UM had three five-star signees in the last eight classes.
- 15 players in the class made their debut, headlined by **Francis Mauigoa**, who started at right tackle.
- **Mauigoa** (#7) and **Samson Okunlola** (#18) represent two of the top 20 players that Miami has ever signed since 247Sports began their rankings in the year 2000. The Hurricanes signed five players who earned All-American Bowl invitations and five players who were Under-Armour All-Americans.
- 15 of Miami's freshmen joined the program for the spring and competed in spring practice.

THREE SELECTED IN DRAFT, MIAMI'S NFL STREAK CONTINUES IN 2023

- The selections of Miami defensive back Tyrique Stevenson (Chicago Bears, second round), tight end Will Mallory (Indianapolis Colts, fifth) and DJ Ivey (Cincinnati Bengals, seventh) extended the Hurricanes' streak of having at least one player picked in every NFL Draft since 1975; the fourth-longest FBS streak.

MIAMI PLACES THREE ON PRESEASON 2023 ALL-ACC FOOTBALL TEAM

- Among Miami's preseason honorees were DB **Kam Kinchens**, OL **Javion Cohen** and K **Andy Borregales**, who were all selected to the All-ACC Preseason Team in a poll of conference media. Kinchens enjoyed a breakout 2022, where he was selected to the All-ACC First Team and earned several All-America honors.
- During his time with the Crimson Tide, Cohen started 24 games and earned 2022 All-SEC second-team honors. Cohen started 14 games as a sophomore in 2021 and spent 10 games as a starter on 2022. Cohen was ranked as one of the top players in the transfer portal before arriving in Miami.
- A semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award in 2022, Borregales delivered another strong campaign for his hometown Hurricanes a season ago. The junior kicker converted on all 32 extra point attempts and went 17 for 20 on field goals, including a season-long 49-yard boot against Florida State. Borregales' older brother, Jose, is the lone Groza Award winner in UM history, winning it in 2020 in his lone season with the Hurricanes.

The pass to Blades was the first of six consecutive completions by Testaverde that brought Miami to PSU's 6-yard line. However, with 18 seconds remaining, Pete Gifopoulos ended UM's drive for the national title by intercepting a Testaverde pass at the goal line. The Canes finished with 445 total yards and 22 first downs while holding PSU to Fiesta Bowl record-lows of 162 yards and just eight first downs. But seven turnovers tripped the Canes on the road to the national title.

Sophomore QB **Steve Walsh** hit on 18-of-30 passing for 209 yards and two touchdowns. Senior fullback **Melvin Bratton** nearly broke a UM single-game receiving mark by hauling in nine catches for 102 yards before leaving the game with a knee injury. **Bernard Clark** stepped into the spotlight at middle linebacker and walked away with the game's MVP award after recording 12 unassisted tackles and 14 overall stops, while the defense limited OU to just 255 yards in total offense.

After Kaaya hit Richards, 48,625 fans watched the junior complete 18 of his next 20 passes, a streak that included a Miami bowl record-tying four touchdown passes. The Hurricanes (9-4) offense had strung together six straight three-and-outs and totaled just 31 yards over their first six drives, but something clicked for Miami after the Richards touchdown. Miami scored points on five straight possessions, including touchdown passes from Kaaya to **Malcolm Lewis**, **Braxton Berrios** and **David Njoku**. Kaaya's four touchdown passes matched Craig Erickson's performance in the 1991 Cotton Bowl.

Perry's 5-yard TD pass to **Michael Harley** helped the Hurricanes close to 37-34 with 5:39 left. MARIO CRISTOBAL

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (12TH OVERALL) | 12-12 | 73-71

Mario Cristobal has returned home to Miami.

Cristobal, who helped lead the University of Miami to two national championships in 1989 and 1991 as a standout offensive lineman, was named the University's 26th football head coach on December 6, 2021.

One of college football's most highly regarded coaches, Cristobal returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Oregon to three straight Pac-12 Conference championship game appearances and two Pac-12 titles. He is the only coach in the nation whose team has played in a Power Five conference championship game in each of the past three seasons.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Mario, his wife, Jessica, and their sons Mario Mateo and Rocco home to Miami," UM President Julio Frenk said. "Mario's legacy as a student-athlete at the U is well established. And the standard for competitive excellence that he and his teammates helped establish is one to which we continue to aspire. Our selection, however, was not one based in nostalgia for a proud past, but rather in a bold vision for a promising future."

"The characteristics that helped Mario excel as a national championship-winning player—drive, determination, and discipline—continue to propel his success as a coach. In Mario we have found a head coach who shares our belief in providing student-athletes with the very best opportunities to succeed on and off the field, and our commitment to winning at the highest level."

"My family and I are excited to return home to the University of Miami, which has been so instrumental in shaping me as a person, player, and coach," Cristobal said. "This program has an unparalleled tradition and an exciting future ahead of it. I can't wait to compete for championships and help mold our student-athletes into leaders on and off the field who will make our University, our community, and our loyal fan base proud."

Cristobal brings more than 20 years of FBS coaching experience to Coral Gables, including 10 as a head coach. He compiled a 35-13 record at Oregon, leading the Ducks to consecutive Pac-12 titles in 2019 and 2020. Oregon advanced to three straight conference championship games from 2019 to 2021 and earned bowl-game appearances in each of Cristobal's seasons in Eugene, highlighted by a Rose Bowl victory that capped a 12-win season and No. 5 ranking in the final Associated Press and AFCA Coaches polls in 2019. Cristobal was named the Associated Press Pac-12 Coach of the Year for his efforts that season.

Over Cristobal's first three seasons in Eugene, Oregon players earned 44 all-conference selections and 14 players were selected in the NFL Draft, including first-round selections in each of the past three drafts. With the selections of Kayvon Thibodeaux (2022), Penei Sewell (2021) and Justin Herbert (2020), Cristobal is one of only two active head coaches to produce top-10 picks in each of the last three drafts.

During his tenure as both an assistant and head coach at Oregon, two players—Noah Sewell and Thibodeaux—earned Pac-12 Defensive Freshman of the Year honors, and three players—Thibodeaux, Penei Sewell, and Tyrell Crosby—earned the Morris Trophy, awarded to the Pac-12's best offensive and defensive linemen.

Cristobal served as Oregon's co-offensive coordinator, run-game coordinator, and offensive line coach during the 2017 season before being elevated to head coach.

Cristobal's national title-winning pedigree isn't limited to his time as a player. At Alabama, where he served as assistant head coach, offensive line coach, and recruiting coordinator, he helped lead the Crimson Tide to the national championship in 2015 and a runner-up finish the following season.

During his four years in Tuscaloosa, from 2013 to 2016, five Alabama offensive linemen were selected in the NFL Draft and, with Cristobal's tutelage, the 2015 offensive line unit won the inaugural Joe Moore Award, given to the most outstanding offensive line unit in the nation.

Considered one of the country's elite recruiters and evaluators of talent, Cristobal, during his tenures at both Alabama and Oregon, helped assemble national top-15 recruiting classes eight straight years, with seven of those classes rated in the top 10. The 2018 class at Alabama produced three NFL first-round draft picks. At Oregon, he constructed the Pac-12's top-rated recruiting classes in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

Cristobal's move to Miami brings his coaching career full circle. A son of South Florida who played prep football at nearby Christopher Columbus High School, he launched his coaching career as a graduate assistant coach at Miami from 1998 to 2000 under head coach Butch Davis. He served as an assistant coach at Rutgers from 2001 to 2003 and then returned to Miami as an assistant coach from 2004 to 2006 under head coach Larry Coker.

In 2007, Cristobal was named head coach at Florida International University, becoming the first Cuban American head coach in FBS history. He inherited a struggling FIU program that had been winless the year before his arrival and, in just his fourth season, led it to the Sun Belt Conference title and a bowl-game victory. That season, 2010, he was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year. In total, he coached six seasons at FIU, from 2007 to 2012.

Cristobal, who played his Hurricanes career under coaches Jimmy Johnson and Dennis Erickson, was an All-Big East selection in 1992. He is a double-alumnus of the University of Miami, earning a bachelor's degree in business administration and a master's degree from the University. Cristobal was born in Miami on Sept. 24, 1970. He and his wife, Jessica, married in June 2006 and are the parents of two sons, Mario Mateo and Rocco.
