overall field goal, 3-point and free throws. The Buffaloes are fourth in the nation in 3-point accuracy at 41.8 percent, eighth in overall shooting (.516) and 11th from the line (.787). Colorado is the only program in the nation ranked in the top 11 in all three categories (through games of Dec. 6). The Buffaloes lead the Pac-12 Conference in all three as well.

Against Pepperdine, Colorado shot 57.4 percent (31-54), its third-straight game at 54 percent or better and sixth time above 50 percent in eight games. The Buffaloes had seven games at .500 or better in 35 games last season (6-1).

Colorado improved to 99-8 in the Tad Boyle era (since 2010-11) when shooting at least 50 percent.

Against Iona, Colorado shot 60.8 percent from the field (31-51), its best mark since shooting 63.3 percent (31-59) vs. Northern Colorado on Dec. 13, 2014.

Colorado's 54.5 percent shooting at Colorado State on Nov. 29 was its best in a true road game since shooting 58.6 percent in a win at Air Force on Nov. 24, 2018.

The Buffaloes also sport top 40 marks nationally in rebound margin (+10; 21st), assists (17.8 apg; 23rd), free throws made (18.0 ftmpg, 27th), scoring offense (83.8 ppg, 34th) and scoring margin (+14.1, 39th).

**INDIVIDUALLY SPEAKING:** Junior **KJ Simpson** tops Colorado at 19.4 points, 4.4 assists and 1.4 steals per game while ranking fourth in rebounding (4.5 rpg). He had 15 points, on 6 of 7 shooting, with four assists against Pepperdine.

Over the last three games, Simpson has shot 70.4 percent from the field (19-27).

Simpson scored a team season-high 30 points against Colorado State, hitting 9 of 13 from the field, including 3 of 4 from 3-point range, and a perfect 9 of 9 from the charity stripe. It was Simpson's second career 30-point game, just one point short of this 31-point performance at Stanford last season.

Simpson has made 41 of 45 from the line (.911) leading the Buffaloes in all three categories. He has made his last 14 from the free throw line.

Simpson was named to the Sunshine Slam All-Tournament Team, averaging 19.0 points and 6.0 rebounds in the two games in Daytona Beach. He led the Buffaloes with 23 points against Richmond and added 15 points and a season-best nine rebounds against Florida State.

On the Pac-12 charts, Simpson is third in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.2) and free throw percentage, fourth in scoring, seventh in assists, eighth in 3-point shooting (.452) and 13th in steals.

Senior **Tristan da Silva** is averaging 15.5 points and 4.5 rebounds while hitting 56 percent from the field and 46 percent from 3-point range.

Da Silva had a game-high 22 points in the win over Pepperdine, sporting a "perfect game" in the process. He was 5 of 5 from the field, including 2 of 2 from beyond the arc, and 10 of 10 from the free throw line. He's the only Colorado player since 1951-52 with at least five field goals and 10 free throws without a miss. Since the 1996-97 season, da Silva is the only Pac-12 player with those numbers and only one of 12 nationally. Da Silva had a 6 for 6 game from the

field against Oregon State in 2020-21, but went 3 for 4 from the line finishing with 15 points.

On the Pac-12 charts, da Silva ranks seventh in 3-point accuracy (.455), eighth in free throw percentage (.844), 12th in scoring, 13th in overall field goal percentage and 15th in defensive rebounds (4.3 drpg).

Freshman **Cody Williams** is third on the team in scoring at 14.0 points per game while shooting a team-best 62.3 percent from the field. He is coming off his second-straight 21-point outing, hitting 9 of 13 from the field against Pepperdine.

His initial 21-point effort came at Colorado State, scoring all 21 in the second half.

Over the last four games Williams is averaging 17.8 points while shooting 68.3 percent from the field (28-41).

Williams earned Sunshine Slam All-Tournament Team honors averaging 11.5 points in the two games in Daytona Beach. He registered the first of his now four-straight double-figure scoring games with a team-high 17 points against Florida State.

On the Pac-12 charts, Williams is sixth in field goal percentage and 18th in scoring.

Junior **Julian Hammond III** is averaging 9.9 points and is second on the team in assists with 20. He had 10 points, of 4 of 6 shooting, with four assists in the win over Pepperdine.

Hammond is shooting 75 percent from the field over the last three games (12-16). He had nine points, on a perfect 4 of 4 shooting, along with a season-high four rebounds at Colorado State.

Hammond is third in the Pac-12 in 3-point shooting at 48.1 percent and tied for 10th in overall shooting at 57.1 percent.

Senior **J'Vonne Hadley** averages 9.1 points per game while ranking second on the team in rebounding (6.1 rpg) and steals (10) and third in free throws made and attempted (21-25, .840).

On the Pac-12 charts, Hadley is 10th in free throw shooting, 11th in overall rebounds, 13th in defensive boards (4.4 drpg) and 14th in field goal percentage (.553).

Senior **Eddie Lampkin, Jr.**, leads the Buffaloes and ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in rebounding at 7.6 per game. Lampkin had 10 rebounds against Pepperdine, his third double-figure rebounding game of the season.

He had his first double-double in a Colorado uniform with 14 points and a team season-high 12 rebounds against Milwaukee. It was the seventh overall double-double for Lampkin who had six with TCU.

Lampkin is tied for third in the Pac-12 in offensive rebounds (2.5 orpg) and is eighth in defensive boards (5.1 drpg).

Senior **Luke O'Brien** is averaging 4.6 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. He's tied for the team lead in blocked shots with five and ranks fourth in steals (seven) and fifth in rebounding. O'Brien had a season-best four assists against Pepperdine which also matched a career-high.

**ABOUT THE HURRICANES:** Continuing the momentum from its Final Four run a year ago, Miami is 7-1 overall and ranked No. 15 in the latest Associated Press and USA Today Sports Coaches Top 25

polls. The Hurricanes have won their last two, including a 62-49 home win over Notre Dame in their Atlantic Coast Conference opener.

Like Colorado, Miami is off to a tremendous start offensively. The Hurricanes are averaging 84.6 points per game while shooting 51.3 percent from the field. Miami ranks second in the country in 3-point shooting at 42.5 percent and is also 10th nationally in 3-point defense, allowing opponents just 25.7 percent from deep. Overall opponents are averaging 69.5 points against the 'Canes while shooting 40.7 percent.

Junior guard Wooga Poplar leads the Hurricanes at 16.5 points per game and ranks fifth in the nation in 3-point shooting at 53.7 percent (22-41). Junior forward Norchad Omier tops Miami in rebounding at 9.8 per game while averaging 16.1 points on 57.7 percent shooting. Junior guard Matthew Cleveland averages 14.8 points on a team-best 64.8 percent from the field.

**THE SERIES:** This will be the second meeting between Colorado and Miami. The Buffaloes claimed the only other meeting, a 73-66 decision in Coral Gables, Fla., on Jan. 3, 1957. Colorado is 5-13 all-time against current ACC teams. This will be Colorado's second ACC opponent of the season, dropping a 77-71 decision to Florida State on Nov. 21, in the Sunshine Slam in Daytona Beach, Fla.

**IN THE POLLS:** Colorado was ranked in the first two Associated Press regular season polls, with a high of No. 18 on Nov. 20, the program's best since hitting No. 18 on Feb. 7, 2020. Colorado debuted at No. 25 in the first regular season Associated Press Top 25 Men's Basketball Poll released on Nov. 13.

It was just the second time since 1970 the Buffaloes appeared in the first regular season AP Poll. Colorado appeared in the exact same spot, No. 25, on Nov. 11, 2019; a season where the Buffaloes were ranked for a school-record 13 weeks, climbing as high as No. 16.

Overall Colorado has 57 all-time appearances in the AP Poll. The Buffaloes were second among teams receiving votes in this year's preseason poll. Colorado received five points in the latest AP Poll on Dec. 4.

Colorado made its lone appearance this season in the USA Today Sports Coaches Top 25 poll on Nov. 20, coming in at No. 21.

**AGAINST RANKED TEAMS:** Colorado is 0-1 against ranked teams in 2023-24 after falling to No. 20/21 Colorado State on Nov. 29. It was the first time the Rams were ranked in the 131 games of the hardwood edition of the Rocky Mountain Showdown.

Colorado's 25 wins over ranked opponents in the Tad Boyle era is by far the best in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 25-47, have accounted for 36 percent of wins over ranked opponents (69) since 1949-50.

**SHARING THE BALL:** Colorado enters the Miami game ranking third in the Pac-12 and 23rd in the nation in assists at 17.8 per game. The Buffaloes had 22 assists against Pepperdine, the fourth time reaching the 20-assist mark in eight games. The last season Colorado had four games with 20-plus assists was in 2020-21 - over 32 contests.

The last time the Buffaloes had something resembling the current run was four 20-plus assist efforts in a span of five games in December 2010. Colorado would go on to have seven games with 20-plus assists in that season, its last in the Big 12 Conference.

With 25 assists in the Milwaukee game, the Buffaloes dished out at

least 20 dimes in three-straight games, their longest streak of that nature since the first three games of the 2001-02 season.

Prior to that run, Colorado had three games with 20-plus assists over the previous 44 contests dating back to the 2021-22 season.

Colorado dished out 28 assists against Grambling State, the program's most since dishing out 29 vs Mercer on Dec. 22, 2005. It ties for the 19th most in a single game in team history.

Colorado has won 29-straight when dishing out at least 21 assists and has won 76 of its last 80 dating back to the 1996-97 season.

**1,000-POINT CLUB WATCH:** **Tristan da Silva** became the 39th member of Colorado's 1,000-point club after scoring 17 points in the win over Iona. He hit the 1,000-mark on a 3-pointer in the final two minutes of the first half (scored 14 of his 17 in the first period). He is currently 34th on CU's all-time list, 77 points away from reaching the top 30.

Simpson was named to The Almanac's Preseason All-Pac-12 Second Team and ranked as the 91st best player in the nation. Williams came in at No. 92 on The Almanac's Top 100 List.

**HONORING BURDETTE "BURDIE" HALDORSON:** Colorado is wearing a patch with the initials "BH" on their jerseys this season to honor Former All-American and CU Athletics Hall of Famer Burdette "Burdie" Haldorson who passed away on Oct. 13 at the age of 89.

As a senior in 1954-55, Haldorson led the Buffaloes to a 19-6 record, 11-1 in conference play and the Big Seven title by averaging 21.0 points and 13.8 rebounds per game (upping his averages from 16.7 and 9.0, respectively, from his junior season). He was a first-

team All-Big Seven performer for the second straight year and was named a first-team All-American. CU eventually went on to finish third in the nation, losing in the Final Four to eventual champion San Francisco and the legendary Bill Russell. The Buffs defeated Iowa in the then-third place game to match the '42 team for the school's still highest finish ever in the NCAA tournament.

**BOYLE MILESTONE:** Head coach **Tad Boyle**, in his 14th season, has 278 wins at Colorado the most in program history.

Boyle-led teams own nine of the 13 20-win seasons in team history, the top five single-season win totals and six of the top seven. With a record of 278-174 at CU, his 61.5 winning percentage is second all-time just behind Forrest "Frosty" Cox at 62.3 from 1936-50.

Boyle has 118 Pac-12 regular season wins ranking 19th in conference history.

**OPENERS:** Colorado improved to 86-35 (.711) in all-time season openers and has won its last eight. The Buffaloes are 12-2 under head coach **Tad Boyle** and 39-5 in overall season openers since 1980-81.

The Buffaloes are 97-24 (.802) all-time in home openers, have won

their last 16 and 22 of their last 23. Boyle's teams are 13-0 in home openers.

**PRESEASON POLL:** Colorado was picked to finish fifth in the annual Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll released Oct. 11. Arizona, which received 18 first place votes, was picked to win the league, followed by USC, UCLA, Oregon, Colorado and Arizona State.

**BUFFS SIGN HIGH RATED CLASS:** Colorado has put together another nationally acclaimed recruiting class as head coach Tad Boyle announced the signing of four outstanding prospects who signed their National Letters of Intent on Nov. 8.

Andrew Crawford (Littleton, Colo.), Felix Kossaras (Montreal, Quebec), Doryan Onwuchekwa (Dallas, Texas) and Sebastian Rancik (Bratislava, Slovakia) comprise Colorado's Class of 2024, a group that on Signing Day ranked 12th in the country by 247Sports, No. 16 by Rivals and No. 26 by On3.com.

All four members are labeled as four-star prospects and ranked as one of the top 100 players in the nation by at least one recruiting service. Three of the four are consensus four-star picks.

This is the third Colorado class in the last four seasons ranked in the nation's Top 25 by 247Sports and Rivals, including the 2023 Class slotted in at No. 25 and No. 13 respectively.

Crawford is a 6-foot-6-inch, 175-pound combo guard from Thunder-Ridge High School, who averaged just under 20 points along with 11 rebounds and six assists as a senior, earning Colorado Class 6A All-State First Team honors.

Kossaras, a 6-5, 180-pound, guard from Montreal, is in his senior season at Fort Erie International Academy in Ontario. He played internationally for Team Canada at the FIBA 2022 U17 World Cup in Spain.

Onwuchekwa is a 6-10, 235-pound center from Dallas. A consensus four-star prospect, he has helped Oak Cliff Faith Family Academy to three-straight Texas 4A state titles.

Rancik, a 6-9, 210-pound forward at JSerra Catholic School in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., averaged 16.5 points and 7.7 rebounds – along with 45 blocks – as a junior earning All-CIF-SS Division 1 and All-Los Angeles Times First Team honors.

BOULDER — Colorado's defense set the tone in the first half and the Buffaloes' offense came alive in the second Monday as CU rolled to a 75-57 win over Towson in the season opener at the CU Events Center.

The Buffs led by four at the half but exploded with a 17-1 run to open the second half and Towson never threatened again, as CU pushed its lead to as much as 28 down the stretch.

Colorado improved to 14-0 in home openers in the Tad Boyle era.

KJ Simpson led the Buffs with 22 points and Tristan da Silva added 13, all in the second half. J'Vonne Hadley added 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds and Luke O'Brien had seven points and seven boards.

Dylan Williamson led Towson with 15 points.

Colorado shot 52 percent from the floor, including 8-for-17 from 3-point range. The Buffs missed all seven attempts from beyond the arc in the first half but then hit eight in a row in the second half to build their lead.

CU held the Tigers to 35 percent shooting and had a 38-26 edge on the boards. The Buffs are now 85-6 under Boyle when holding an opponent to 40 percent or less shooting and having at least a plus-8 rebounding edge.

Colorado finished with 21 assists on 26 baskets, with the only downside of the night 16 turnovers.

"That was a good first game," Boyle said. "A tale of two halves, obviously. I thought we fought adversity in the first half offensively and came out in the second half and figured things out a little bit. I was really proud of our defensive effort that first 20 minutes. We really guarded at a high, high level and we did that pretty much the whole game. I'm really happy with this team's defense and rebounding."

HOW IT HAPPENED: Colorado led 28-24 at the half after the Tigers sliced a 13-point deficit to four with a late 11-2 run.

"It's not how we wanted to start offensively," Simpson said. "There was a lot of standing around and not moving the ball. But we got better in the second half."

Indeed, the Buffs needed just a few minutes after intermission to blow the game open.

After missing all seven of their 3-point tries in the first half, the Buffs drained eight in a row to start the second half. Simpson hit two in the first three minutes of the period and da Silva and O'Brien each hit one in the span as Colorado quickly rebuilt its lead to double digits, 40-24.

Towson never threatened again as Colorado steadily built its lead. Another da Silva 3-pointer pushed Colorado's edge to 20 less than six minutes into the period and the cushion ballooned to 28 with 5:26 to play.

Boyle had no gripes about the Buffs' defense in this one. Colorado held Towson to just four points in the first seven minutes of the second half and limited the Tigers to under 30 percent shooting for much of the period.

"We have a chance to be a really good defensive team," Boyle said.

Colorado's defense established the tempo early as the Buffs jumped out to a 14-4 lead in the first eight minutes. The Buffs forced a 6-minute scoring drought from the Tigers in that stretch and got six points from Simpson on the offensive end.

The Buffs continued to apply the pressure and with 6:39 left in the half, pushed their lead to 13 when an Eddie Lampkin Jr. bucket inside gave Colorado a 24-11 edge.

But CU's offense then went stagnant and Towson put together an 11-2 run, thanks in part to a handful of Colorado turnovers. A 3-pointer from Messiah Jones with 1:34 left in the half pulled the Tigers to within 26-22 and the two teams traded buckets in the final minute to send Colorado into the break with just a four-point lead, 28-24.

Along with eight turnovers in the opening half the Buffs also shot 0-for-7 from 3-point range.

BOULDER — From the very beginning Friday night, the Colorado Buffaloes made it clear they wouldn't set themselves up for another upset at the hands of Grambling State.

Instead, the Buffs avenged last year's loss at GSU with a dominating 95-63 win over the Tigers at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 2-0 while Grambling State dropped to 1-1.

A year ago, the Tigers shocked the Buffs with an 83-74 win in Grambling.

Friday, Colorado left no doubt that another upset wasn't in the cards. The Buffs built a 10-point lead six minutes in, extended it to 20 midway through the first half and had a 30-point cushion at the break, 50-20.

The second half proved to be more of the same. The Buffs extended their edge to as much as 34 early in the second half and GSU never came closer than 25 again.

Colorado put six players in double figures, led by 21 points from senior Tristan da Silva. J'Vonne Hadley added 17 points, Julian Hammond III scored 14. KJ Simpson had 12 points and Luke O'Brien and Eddie Lampkin Jr. each tallied 10. Hadley and Lampkin each had eight rebounds for Colorado and Simpson had a career-high eight assists and just one turnover while Hammond tied his career high with six assists.

TraMichael Moton led GSU with 26 points.

The Buffs dominated virtually every statistical category. CU shot 55.6 percent from the floor (35-for-63) while holding GSU to 38.9 percent from the floor (21-for-54). CU also finished with 28 assists and had a 41-24 rebound edge. Colorado is now 86-6 in the Boyle era when holding an opponent to 40 percent shooting or less and having at least a plus-8 rebound edge.

"I was pleased with everything except for the second half defense," said Boyle, whose Buffs outscored Grambling 45-43 after the break. "I thought we got a little soft."

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs were in control from the outset. CU jumped out to a 14-2 lead after six minutes, then bumped the margin to 20 when a Hadley three-point play gave the Buffs a 30-10 cushion with just under eight minutes to play in the half.

By halftime, Colorado's lead had been extended to 30 as the Buffs put three players in double figures en route to building a 50-20 edge at the break. Da Silva led CU in the first half with 16 points, Hammond — who hit his first three 3-point tries — added 11 and Hadley had 10.

The Buffs also delivered a clinic on sharing the ball and making the extra pass in the first 20 minutes. CU finished with 17 assists on 21 baskets in the opening half as Hadley and Hammond each had four assists. The Buffs also dominated the boards, finishing the half with a 25-11 rebound edge as da Silva and Lampkin each hauled down five boards.

"J'Vonne Hadley, I can't say enough good things," Boyle said of his do-everything wing. "His grit, his toughness, his hustle. He handles the ball, he passes the ball, he's just doing so many good things."

Defensively, the Buffs forced two four-minute scoring droughts from the Tigers in the first half and the offense took advantage.

Colorado continued the onslaught early in the second half, building the edge to as much as 34 and the Tigers never cut the deficit below 25 again.

Simpson, who scored 22 points in CU's opening win, turned his attention to making plays for his teammates and had five of his eight assists in the second half.

"KJ had eight assists and one turnover — that's phenomenal," Boyle said. "I talked to KJ before the season. There's gonna be some nights where you need to distribute the ball rather than shoot the ball and tonight was one of those nights. He made a lot of plays."

Da Silva's 21 points came on efficient 8-for-12 shooting and he also had seven rebounds and three assists.

BOULDER — Colorado put six players in double figures Tuesday and the Buffaloes celebrated their No. 25 national ranking with a 106-79 win over Milwaukee at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 3-0 while Milwaukee dropped to 1-2.

Colorado was dominant from the outset, building a double-digit lead four minutes in and extending the cushion to 20 by halftime. The Buffs then hit their first 10 shots of the second half to bump the edge to 30 and they led by as much as 38 down the stretch.

Guard KJ Simpson led Colorado with 23 points on 7-for-9 shooting and a game-high six assists while freshman Cody Williams scored 17 points to go with five rebounds and four assists. Eddie Lampkin Jr. had his first double-double as a Buff with 14 points and 12 rebounds, Tristan da Silva tallied 17 points, Julian Hammond III chipped in 14 and RJ Smith scored 11.

Zach Howell led Milwaukee with 15 points, all on 3-pointers.

Colorado surpassed the 20-assist mark for the third straight game, finishing with 25, and the Buffs shot 59 percent from the floor (37-63), including 13-for-20 from long range. Colorado has hit 31 of its 60 3-point tries thus far this season.

CU held Milwaukee to 37 percent shooting (27-for-73), but the Panthers did hit 11 of their 34 3-point tries. The Panthers also had 19 offensive rebounds for 18 second-chance points.

"We obviously shot the ball well — offensively we were as good as we've been all year tonight," Boyle said. "(But) with that being said, we still have a lot of room for improvement. Nineteen offensive rebounds given up is something that's not acceptable and we gave up 11 threes against a team that we knew was a good shooting team ... Those are the two areas I'm dialing in on because what I've got to do with these guys is make them understand that we can maybe get away with some things early in the season with our schedule that we're not going to be able to get away with as we move forward."

HOW IT HAPPENED: On this night the Buffs got away with just about everything they wanted. CU took control early and the Panthers were on the ropes for the rest of the evening.

Williams, CU's highly touted freshman, came back from missing Colorado's last game with an injury to score seven points in an early CU surge that gave the Buffs a 17-4 lead less than four minutes. Da Silva had two 3-pointers in the burst, including one that sparked a 10-0 run that finished with a thunderous Williams dunk.

CU also held Milwaukee scoreless for 3 minutes in the stretch.

Milwaukee did manage to temporarily narrow the deficit back to single digits but Colorado responded with another double-digit run. CU held the Panthers scoreless for another 3 minute stretch, Lampkin sparked an 11-0 surge with four straight points and Colorado pushed its lead to 20.

Four consecutive points from Simpson gave the Buffs a 37-17 edge midway through the half and the Panthers never seriously threatened again. Colorado kept the pressure on down the stretch and the Buffs took a 53-33 lead into the break.

Williams led CU with 13 points in the first half and Simpson added 11. Colorado shot almost 63 percent (20-for-32) in the half, including 7-for-11 from long range. The Buffs also had 12 assists — three each from Simpson and Williams — and Lampkin had five rebounds.

This is the best passing team we've had since I've been here, without a doubt," Boyle said. "The strength of this team is our depth and our quality depth. Twenty-five assists is fantastic."

The Buffs picked up in the second half where they left off in the first as Colorado hit its first 10 shots of the half to build its lead into the 30s. A Simpson 3-pointer seven minutes into the period gave the Buffs an 80-48 lead and they pushed the cushion to as much as 38 down the stretch.

CU hit the century mark with 5:29 still to play when an RJ Smith 3-pointer gave Colorado a 100-63 lead.

**DAYTONA BEACH, Fla.** — Colorado's **KJ Simpson** scored 23 points and the No. 18 Buffaloes survived a tough shooting night Monday to take a 64-59 win over scrapper Richmond in the Sunshine Slam semifinals.

Tad Boyle's Buffs, who jumped seven spots in the AP poll released Monday, improved to 4-0 while Richmond fell to 2-2.

The Buffs will next face Florida State in Tuesday's championship game at 2 p.m. (CBSSN) at Ocean Center.

Monday's game, CU's first away from home this season, wasn't decided until the final minutes.

Colorado led for the majority of the game, jumping out to a quick 6-0 lead and taking a 28-25 edge into intermission. But the Spiders wouldn't go away and took their second lead of the game, 44-42, with nine minutes to play.

The Buffs, though, responded with a quick 6-0 run to regain control. Richmond managed to cut the deficit to one point again before the Buffs finally put the game away. A **Tristan da Silva** basket with just more than a minute to play bumped CU's edge to five and following a pair of defensive stops, Simpson, da Silva and **J'Vonne Hadley** each hit two free throws to give Colorado a nine-point edge, 62-53, with 32 seconds remaining.

Simpson had three rebounds and a pair of assists to go with his 23 points, bolstered by a 9-for-10 effort from the free throw line. Da Silva added 15 points and eight rebounds while Hadley had six points and six boards.

Jordan King led Richmond with 23 points.

Colorado entered the game as the nation's leading 3-point shooting team (51.7 percent) and the sixth-best field goal shooting team (55.7 percent). But the Buffs struggled to find their shooting eye all night, finishing just 20-for-47 from the floor. They did, however, hit 21 of their 25 free throw tries while also holding a 32-26 rebound edge.

Richmond hit 23 of its 51 field goal tries but was just 5-for-20 from long range. **HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led 28-25 at the break and pushed the cushion to seven early in the second half on four Simpson free throws.

But the Buffs could never shake the Spiders. Richmond stayed within range and finally took its second lead of the game, 44-42, when King hit two of three free throws at the 9:07 mark.

Colorado answered with a 6-0 run, getting a Simpson 3-pointer and a Cody Williams layup in transition for a 48-44 lead.

But Richmond stayed within striking range and with just more than four minutes to play, cut Colorado's lead to one on a long King 2-pointer.

Colorado then pushed its lead back to five on a pair of free throws from Simpson and Hadley before Richmond narrowed the gap to three one more time.

CU's defense then stepped up. **Eddie Lampkin Jr.** forced a turnover, then found da Silva underneath with a beautiful pass. Da Silva rammed it home and Colorado had a 58-53 lead with 1:29 to play.

Colorado then recorded back-to-back stops and the Spiders had to foul. Simpson, da Silva and Hadley all hit free throws in the final 1:03 to keep the Spiders at bay and give Colorado the win.

Colorado jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead, sparked by a pair of buckets from Tristan da Silva.

But the Spiders answered with an 8-0 run to take their only lead of the half. Colorado endured a three-minute scoring drought that covered five straight empty possessions, including two turnovers.

CU finally ended the drought on a Lampkin bucket, then regained the lead when **RJ Smith** drained a long 3-pointer to give Colorado an 11-8 lead.

Richmond did manage to tie the game again at 13-13 before the Buffs took the lead on a Simpson 3-pointer. The Buffs then used a 6-0 run to take their biggest lead of the half, 22-15, on the heels of a **Cody Williams** steal and basket, two free throws from **Julian Hammond III** and a Lampkin basket inside.

But Richmond once again battled back to close the gap to two and Colorado led by just three, 28-25, at the break.

**DAYTONA BEACH, Fla.** — Colorado overcame a 10-point second-half deficit Tuesday to force overtime but the No. 18 Buffaloes came up short in the extra period, falling 77-71 to Florida State in the Sunshine Slam championship game.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 4-1 overall while the Seminoles improved to 4-1.

Cold shooting doomed the Buffs, as CU shot just 35 percent from the floor (20-for-72), including 5-for-20 from 3-point range. Colorado also committed 20 turnovers, which the Seminoles converted into 19 points.

The Seminoles shot 47 percent for the game (25-for-57), but were 15-for-28 in the second half and overtime, including 4-for-4 in the extra period.

**Cody Williams** led CU with 17 points on 6-for-10 shooting. Colorado's two leading scorers for the young season, **KJ Simpson** and **Tristan da Silva**, both suffered poor shooting nights. Simpson finished with 15 points on 5-for-22 shooting (1-for-6 from long range) while da Silva had eight points on 2-for-9 shooting.

FSU had four players in double figures, led by Jalen Warley with 19.

In a game that featured nine lead changes and 13 ties, Colorado held a 30-27 edge at the break. FSU used a 20-7 run early in the second half to take a 10-point lead, but Colorado quickly put together a 10-0 run to tie the game.

The Buffs fell behind again but used an 8-0 surge to regain the lead, only to go scoreless over the last 2:48 of regulation as FSU rallied to force overtime.

Florida State then scored the first nine minutes of the extra period to take control for good.

"We gave one away," a disappointed Boyle said after the game. "We were not very good. We knew Florida State was going to pressure, but when you have 20 turnovers against anybody, it's going to be hard to win. ... When something like this happens, it's hard to blame anyone but the coach. I've got to do a better job."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led 30-27 at the half but a cold start and some hot Seminole shooting from long range resulted in FSU taking a 10-point lead early in the second half. Florida State opened the period with a 20-7 run that included four 3-pointers and CU trailed, 47-37, less than seven minutes into the half.

But the Buffs rallied. Colorado put together a 10-0 run, capped by a Simpson 3-pointer, to tie the game at 47-47.

FSU then regained the lead, taking a 55-49 edge before Colorado staged another rally. **J'Vonne Hadley** sparked an 8-0 run with a pair of baskets and two da Silva free throws gave CU a 57-55 edge with 4:24 to play in regulation.

CU then took a 60-57 lead on a 3-pointer from **Julian Hammond III** before the Seminoles tied it with 1:15 on the clock — and that's how regulation play ended, with both teams coming up empty on offensive possessions in the final minute.

Florida State then took control early in the overtime, scoring the first nine points of the period and a CU rally in the final minute came up short. "Our guys battled, our guys competed," Boyle said. "It's not a toughness factor, it's not a competitiveness factor, it's not not being ready to play. It was just simply taking care of the basketball and taking great shots and the ability to finish and we weren't good enough with that tonight."

Shooting woes hounded the Buffs for nearly the entire game. CU was just 4-for-17 from the floor to open the first half and while the Seminoles were also having a tough time finding the bucket, FSU finally put together a 6-0 run to take an 18-12 lead with 7 minutes to play in the half.

But the Buffs finally found their shooting eye coming out of a timeout. Williams hit a bucket from the lane to start a 9-0 run that included a pair of Simpson buckets (both off feeds from da Silva), a Williams free throw and two charity tosses from da Silva.

With four minutes to go in the half, Colorado held a 21-18 lead, and they extended the margin to 23-19 on a **Luke O'Brien** dunk at the 3:31 mark.

Florida State rallied to tie the game at 27-27 before Hammond III drained a 3-pointer just before the halftime buzzer to give Colorado a 30-27 lead at the break.

**FORT COLLINS** — Colorado staged a furious second half rally Wednesday but the Buffaloes came up just short against No. 20 Colorado State, dropping an 88-83 decision at Moby Arena.

Tad Boyle's Buffs fell to 5-2 while the Rams improved to 7-0. The Buffs trailed by 15 at the half but cut the deficit to five early in the second half and were still within five in the final minutes, thanks to 21 second-half points from freshman **Cody Williams** and 20 second-half points from **KJ Simpson**.

But the Buffs could never completely close the gap as the Rams had an answer on the offensive end at every critical moment and held CU at bay down the stretch.

Colorado ended up shooting 54.5 percent from the floor (30-for-55), including a 20-for-29 second half (69 percent). The Buffs also had a 34-21 edge on the boards. But the Rams were 27-for-53 from the floor, including 9-for-22 from 3-point range, and they converted 15 Colorado turnovers into 17 points.

Simpson finished as the game's leading scorer with 30 points. Williams tallied 21 and **Tristan da Silva** scored 11.

Isaiah Stevens led five Rams in double figures with 20 points and he had 11 assists — five more than the entire Colorado team.

Defensively, Colorado failed to string together three stops in a row even once the entire game.

"Disappointing," Boyle said. "The second half we fought our tails off but we weren't good enough defensively all night long. We never strung together stops and that puts a lot of pressure on your offense. Our offense was good enough in the second half but not in the first half because they were the aggressors. Colorado State is good but that was really disappointing because that was a winnable game. It was a great college basketball atmosphere and we didn't do our part."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado trailed by 15 at the break, 41-26, after committing nine turnovers in the first half and shooting just 10-for-26 from the field, including 0-for-5 from long range.

The Rams, meanwhile, were 14-for-28 in the first period, including 7-for-14 from beyond the arc.

But the Buffs burst from the gate in the second half with a 22-12 surge to cut CSU's lead to 53-48 with 13:18 still to play. Williams fueled the surge with 10 points after a scoreless first half and Simpson added seven in the run.

"We switched some things offensively in the second half to get the ball moving side to side," Boyle said. "We have some success with it there."

But CSU pushed its lead back to double digits, building its cushion to 64-52 on four free throws from Stevens. Two of those came after a technical on Boyle, who was vehemently protesting a pair of questionable calls against Colorado.

But the Buffs didn't go away quietly. **Luke O'Brien** and **Julian Hammond III** hit buckets inside to cut the deficit to eight and a Williams basket with 6:13 to play shaved the CSU lead to six, 68-62, with 6:13 to play. Colorado then managed to stay within striking range over the next six minutes but could not come closer than five as the Buffs could not come up with steady defensive stops.

The Buffs pulled within five with just under a minute to play on a Williams drive but the Rams answered with a dunk to break CU's full-court press and a free throw to clinch the win.

Colorado started slowly but took a 10-9 lead seven minutes in when da Silva scored off a lob from Hammond.

But the Rams responded with a 10-0 run to take control and the Buffs had no answer. CU did manage to pull within five, 21-16, on a Simpson drive to the bucket but Colorado State reserve Joe Palmer drained a pair of long 3-pointers to push CU's deficit to nine, 27-18.

The Buffs shaved the deficit back to six when a Hammond basket with 2:41 left in the half cut CSU's cushion to 28-22.

But Colorado State closed the half on a 13-4 surge in the final 1:41, aided by a pair of Colorado turnovers down the stretch. Colorado's ninth miscue of the half came with just 2 seconds on the clock, leading to a CSU layup and 41-26 lead at the break.

**BOULDER** — Colorado built a big early lead Sunday and never let up as the Buffaloes rebounded from a loss to Colorado State to post a 91-66 win over Pepperdine at the CU Events Center.

Tad Boyle's Buffs improved to 6-2 overall — 5-0 at home — while the Waves dropped to 4-6.

Colorado put four players in double figures, with **Tristan da Silva** leading the Buffs with 22 points on 5-for-5 shooting. CU freshman **Cody Williams** had his second straight 20-point performance, finishing with 21 on 9-for-13 shooting, **KJ Simpson** tallied 15 points and four assists and **Julian Hammond III** added 10 points and four assists.

CU never trailed, jumping out to a 17-9 lead less than four minutes in, then using an 11-0 run to push the cushion into double digits. A **J'Vonne Hadley** bucket at the 8:02 mark pushed Colorado's lead to 38-18 and the Waves never cut the deficit below 20 again.

The Buffs dominated the stat sheet, shooting 57 percent (31-for-54) from the floor, including 7-for-13 from long range. CU held the Waves to just under 38 percent from the floor (24-for-64) and the Buffs had a 41-29 edge on the boards.

Colorado also finished with a 48-22 edge in the paint and the Buffs finished with 22 assists.

Houston Mallette led Pepperdine with 15 points while the Waves' leading scorer, Michael Ajayi, had just 13 points on 4-for-18 shooting.

"I challenged a couple of our guys I met with after the Colorado State game," Boyle said. "We had a team a couple years ago that didn't lose back-to-back games until late January, maybe February ... I think this team can be that kind of team in terms of their resolve and learning from the things that we don't do well and taking that into the next game. I thought we bounced back emotionally, we bounced back with the way we played and had some really efficient offensive performances tonight and some really good defensive performances."

**HOW IT HAPPENED:** Colorado led from the outset, taking a 17-12 lead less than six minutes in after a pair of offensive rebounds and buckets from Williams.

CU then put the game away over the next seven minutes as Hammond sparked a 23-6 surge to give the Buffs a 22-point lead. Hammond had seven points and three assists in the run, including a beautiful alley-oop pass to Williams for a thunderous dunk. Williams also had seven points in the run and with 7:19 to play in the half, Colorado held a 40-18 lead.

In his last four games, Williams has shot 68 percent from the floor (28-for-41) while averaging almost 18 points per game.

"We wanted to come out and be the aggressor," said Williams. "Our defense kind of dictated the game. We came out aggressive on offense, moving the ball. Just coming out with that intensity, that energy to start the game off really gets us going fast."

The Buffs didn't let up in the final minutes of the half. CU pushed its cushion to 29 points over the ensuing five minutes as da Silva caught fire. The Colorado senior had nine points over a five-minute stretch and his 3-pointer with 2:14 on the clock gave the Buffs a 29-point edge, 49-20.

The Waves did manage to cut the deficit down to 24 by halftime, but Colorado still held a comfortable 52-28 edge at the break.

The Buffs had an outstanding first half on the offensive end, shooting almost 63 percent (20-for-32), including 5-for-7 from 3-point range.

They also had a solid showing on the defensive end, holding Pepperdine leading scorer Ajayi to just 5 points on 2-for-13 shooting.

Colorado continued to dominate in the second half. The Buffs opened the period with a 10-0 run with Williams scoring five in the burst, then built their cushion to 34 when a Williams bucket gave Colorado a 64-30 edge less than two minutes into the half.

Pepperdine never mounted anything resembling a threat for the rest of the game as the Buffs kept their lead in the 20s for the remainder of the contest.
