FLORIDA STATE -- WINNERS OF FOUR STRAIGHT ACC GAMES - TRAVELS TO PLAY AT MIAMI

Florida State, which has won each of its last four ACC games against Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest, and Notre Dame, travels to play at Miami at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla., on Wednesday, January 17, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. It's the first of two games this season between the Seminoles and the Hurricanes as the first half of a home-and-home series between the two ACC schools from the state of Florida. Florida State plays Miami on Senior Day in Tallahassee at the Donald L. Tucker Center (March 9) on the final day of the regular season. The Seminoles enter Wednesday's game having won five consecutive games in Coral Gables with their victory in 2023 coming as an 85-84 victory. In addition to having won four consecutive ACC games, the Seminoles have won five of their last six games dating to a 91-75 win over North Florida on December 19 in Tallahassee. Following Wednesday's game against Miami, Florida State will play host to Clemson on Saturday, January 20 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

SEMINOLES STREAKING

Florida State enters its game at Miami on Wednesday having won four consecutive ACC games for the first time since January of the 2021-22 season when it won five consecutive ACC games against Louisville (79-70, January 8), Miami (65-64, January 11), at Syracuse (76-71, January 15), against Duke in overtime (79-78, January 18), and at Miami (61-60, January 22).

FLORIDA STATE'S DEFENSIVE EFFORTS DURING ITS CURRENT FOUR-GAME ACC WINNING STREAK

Florida State held Notre Dame to 58 points and to a .418 field goal shooting percentage in its victory in its road victory over the Irish on Saturday, blocked nine shots in its win over the Deacons on January 9 in Tallahassee, limited Virginia Tech to 74 points in its win over the Hokies in January 6 in Tallahassee and limited Georgia Tech to a .424 shooting percentage in its win over the Yellow Jackets on January 3 on its home court. Florida State has held three of its last four ACC opponents under its scoring average for the season in winning four consecutive conference games: Georgia Tech (72.8 for the season, 71 against the Seminoles), Virginia Tech (74.1 for the season, 74 against the Seminoles), Wake Forest (80.8 for the season, 82 against the Seminoles), Notre Dame (63.0 for the season, 51 against the Seminoles).

WATKINS LOOKING TO BECOME THE FIRST SEMINOLE TO LEAD IN POINTS, REBOUNDS, ASSISTS AND STEALS

Redshirt junior Jamir Watkins enters Wednesday's game against Miami looking to become the first player in Florida State history to lead the team in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. Through the first 16 games of the season, he is averaging a team-leading 13.0 points, a team-leading 5.9 rebounds, a team-leading 3.3 assists and a team-leading 1.6 steals. Watkins is the only player in the ACC who is leading his team in scoring, rebounding, assists, and steals.

WARLEY ONLY ONE STEAL SHY OF 100 FOR HIS CAREER

Junior Jalen Warley enters Wednesday's game against Miami with 99 career steals in the first 79 games of his career. He averages 1.3 steals per game and needs just one steal to reach 100 for his career. Warley has 10 steals in four career games against Miami, including three in two games between the teams during the 2022-23 season.

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Wake Forest having won an NCAA record 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Wake Forest on February 13, 2021, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE - NOTE II

Florida Stats is shooting .822 from the free throw line (37 of 45) in their last two games - victories over both Wake Forest (24 of 30) and Notre Dame (13-15). In both games the Seminoles have made more free throws (37) than their opponents have made (32). In the Seminoles' victory over Wake Forest, the Seminoles made 24 free throws and the Deacons attempted 21. In its road win on Saturday, Florida State made 13 free throws while Notre Dame attempted 11.

FLORIDA STATE KEPT NOTRE DAME OFF OF THE FREE THROW LINE IN VICTORY OVER FIGHTING IRISH

Florida State limited Notre Dame to 11 free throws in its victory over the Irish on Saturday at the Purell Pavilion on the Notre Dame campus. The three free throws attempted were the fewest generated by a Seminole opponent this season after North Florida attempted only 12 in the Seminoles' 91-75 win over the Ospreys on December 19 in Tallahassee. Notre Dame made just three free throws - they were two of three in the second half of the Seminoles' victory as Florida State was whistled for just eight second half fouls (and only nine in the first half).

SEMINOLES STEALING

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami ranked second in the ACC in steals with 147 and a 9.2 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled 10 steals in their victory over Wake Forest and nine on the road in their win over Maimi. Florida State is averaging 8.5 steals per game (34 total steals) during their current-four game ACC winning streak. The Seminoles have earned 10 or more steals in six different games and totaled a season-high 17 steals in their win over No. 18 Colorado in the championship game of the Sunshine Slam in Daytona Beach on November 21.

SEMINOLES KEEP CONTROL OF THE BASKETBALL AGAINST NOTRE DAME

Florida State committed only eight turnovers in its victory at Notre Dame on – its lowest number of turnovers in ACC play this season. Of those eight turnovers, only two came in the first half as Florida State held Notre Dame to just three first half points off turnovers in taking a 33-29 halftime lead. The Seminoles' eight turnovers against the Fighting Irish were their fewest in an ACC game since also committing just eight turnovers in an 89-76 win over NC State on March 5, 2022, in Tallahassee. Florida State committed only five turnovers in its 79-78 overtime win over Duke at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 18, 2022.

FLORIDA STATE CUTTING DOWN IN TURNOVERS - NOTE II

Florida State was charged with its ACC season-low of eight turnovers in its victory over Notre Dame. It marked the fourth time this season the Seminoles had committed fewer than 10 turnovers in a game with eight (their season low) coming against South Florida and Notre and nine coming against Georgia and Winthrop.

SEMINOLES ON THE DEFENSIVE BLOCKS IN WIN OVER NOTRE DAME

Led by a career-high three blocked shots by sophomore Baba Miller and two more by junior Jalen Warley, Florida State blocked its ACC season-high of seven shots in its win at Nore Dame. The Seminoles' seven blocked shots combined with nine steals, meant their defense took away 16 potential attempts to score points from Notre Dame's offense. Florida State has blocked 14 shots and earned 34 steals during their current four game ACC winning streak – taking at least 51 attempts at the basket by Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech Wake Forest, and Notre Dame.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST MEETING

Florida State's Matthew Cleveland made a well-contested 3-point shot at the buzzer to give Florida State an 85-84 win over Miami after being down by 25 points in the first half at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables on February 25, 2023. Cleveland's heroics came directly after a Jordan Miller 3-point shot off an inbound play that gave the Hurricanes an 84-82 lead. Cleveland then inbounded the ball to guard Jalen Warley and got the ball back as he crossed halfcourt before launching his second career buzzer-beating 3-point game-winning shot. The Seminoles' 25-point comeback is the largest in the history of the storied Atlantic Coast Conference. The Seminoles trailed by 25 (50-25) after Miller made a free throw to extend the Hurricanes' lead. The Seminoles committed one second half turnover, shot .667 percent from the field (21 of 31) and .833 from the free throw line (10 of 12) to earn their fifth consecutive win on Miami's home court.

Florida State held Notre Dame to 58 points – the fewest points it has allowed in a game this season. The Seminoles' limited the Fighting Irish to .418 shooting percentage and just 29 points in both halves of their road win. It's the fewest points the Seminoles have allowed in an ACC game since holding Pitt to 56 points on February 9, 2022, and marked the first time the they held an ACC opponent 58 points or fewer since limiting Georgia Tech to 58 points in a 71-58 win over the Yellow Jackets in a 71-58 win on December 31, 2019.

WARLEY IN DOUBLE FIGURE SCORING FOR THE FOURTH TIME

Junior Jalen Warley scored 10 points in Florida State's 67-58 win over Notre Dame to earn his fourth double-figure scoring game of his third season in Tallahassee. His season-high of 19 points came in Florida State's 77-71 win in overtime against No. 18 Colorado. Warley enters Wednesday's game averaging a career-high tying 6.8 points scored per game – he also averaged 6.8 points as a sophomore in 32 games.

Hamilton, Florida State Travel To Play at Miami

CORAL GABLES, Fla. – For most people, a trip to Miami in January would be exactly what the doctor ordered. The next 10 days sees daytime temperatures as high as 80 degrees, with only one day when it isn't expected to reach 70 degrees. On Sunday, the high is predicted to be 69.

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton doesn't care how warm it will be, doesn't plan to sit on the balcony outside his hotel room, and probably won't realize if the sun is shining or if there is rain falling from the sky.

For Hamilton, whose team has won four consecutive ACC games, Florida State's trip to play the Hurricanes at the Watsco Center at 7:00 on Wednesday, is a business trip. The game will be televised by the ACC Network.

"This is a business trip for me," said Hamilton who won 144 games as Miami's head coach from 1990-2000. "I won't visit with relatives, and I won't have lunch and dinner with friends. I stay focused on the task at hand. My son still lives down there so I probably visit with him for a few moments. Other than that, it's a business trip."

The business at hand is Hamilton's rapidly improving team which has won five of its last six games – a streak that includes four consecutive wins over Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest and most recently against Notre Dame on the road. The Seminoles begin play against the Hurricanes with a 4-1 record league play and in second place in the league standings. Only No. 6 ranked North Carolina with five ACC wins has more victories in the early part of the conference season than the Seminoles.

"We are still almost like a new team," said Hamilton. "We are still trying to find that right chemistry, that right rotation, that right substitution pattern. We are still searching and trying to develop that chemistry. We have pretty good playmakers, so we are making plays. We are playing better because we have some additional support, and those guys are making contributions. They have given us the opportunity to execute our system both offensively and defensively a little better than what it was early in the year."

As Florida State continues to become healthy, the Seminoles have prospered at both ends of the court because of their increased quality depth.

Defensively during their four-game winning streak, the Seminoles held Notre Dame to 58 points and to a .418 field goal shooting percentage in their victory over the Irish, blocked nine shots in their win over the Deacons, limited Virginia Tech to 74 points, and held Georgia Tech to a .424 shooting percentage in their win over the Yellow Jackets.

Florida State has held three of its last four ACC opponents under their scoring average for the season in winning four consecutive conference games.

Offensively, Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Miami averaging 78.2 points scored per game in its last four ACC games as compared to 76.7 points scored per game in its first 12 games of the season. In each of its five ACC games, the Seminoles have held a double-digit lead with its largest lead in an ACC game coming the second half of its victory over Georgia Tech (+17).

One of the aspects of the game Hamilton and the Seminoles have on their side is history. The Seminoles have won 11 of the last 12 games against Miami including five in a row at the Watsco Center. The teams split the home-and home series in 2023 with each team winning on the other's home court.

Hamilton also brings his history into the game as the third-winningest coach in the history of the Miami program. He led the Hurricanes to three NCAA Tournament appearances (1996, 1999, 2000) and to the school's first Sweet 16 appearance in 2000. He was named the Big East Coach of the Year in 1995 and 1999 and is the only Miami coach to win coach of the year honors while the Hurricanes were members of the historic conference.

Hamilton, who has earned ACC Coach of the Year honors three times at Florida State (2009, 2012, 2020), has fond memories of his time at Miami.

"I'm proud of the fact that the Miami program has grown and grown and grown every year," said Hamilton. "Coach Larranaga has done a tremendous job in taking the program to higher and higher levels. I get excited when I see the crowds and how passionate their fans are. That's what we tried to establish many years ago. It's really good to see that we played a little part in establishing one of the top programs in the ACC.

"I have to take my hat off to the fans, the school, the administration at Miami – they have given them the type of support needed – and I think it's going to continue growing."

While much of the nation is in the grips of lowest temperatures in recent memory, Hamilton and the Seminoles look to keep growing their win total in ACC play against the Hurricanes.

"The reason for the cold weather is the Jet Stream which is taking a tremendous dip across the central portion of the country, all the way to Brownsville, Texas which right now feels colder than New York City," said Janice Huff, FSU alumnus and Chief Meteorologist for WNBC in New York City. "Meanwhile Miami and most of Florida is on the warm side of the jet, which is like a fast-moving river of air in the upper atmosphere that separates cold and warm air above us.

Not that Hamilton will notice the weather on Wednesday as he sees playing Miami as an opportunity for his Seminoles on a business trip to south Florida.





TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Newcomer Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 18 points and led four Seminoles in double figure scoring as Florida State defeated Flagler College, 90-74, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Sophomore Baba Miller scored 16 points, while seniors Darin Green Jr. and Cam'Ron Fletcher scored 13 points each. Miller finished one rebound shy of a double-double as he added a game-high nine rebounds. Florida State's win over the visiting Saints came in its first of two exhibition games. Watkins, a transfer student-athlete from VCU, was perfect from the field (six of six) and the 3-point line (two of two), while pulling down six rebounds, leading the Seminoles with five steals and adding three assists. Watkins was in the starting lineup in his first game as a Seminole. He totaled nine points in each half. Watkins' five steals allowed the Seminoles to outscore Flagler in fast break points by a 20-13 margin. Miller also earned a stat-sheet stuffer set of statistics. In addition to his 16 points and nine rebounds, he totaled a game-high three blocked shots, and one assist. He shot the ball extremely well as he made six of nine field goals attempts including one made 3-point shot.

Game 5 -- Florida State 77, No. 18 Colorado 71 (OT)

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. - Florida State's Jamir Watkins scored a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds in earning tournament MVP honors as Florida State defeated 18th ranked Colorado, 77-71 in overtime, to win the championship of the 2023 Sunshine Slam at the Ocean Center. The Seminoles scored the first nine points of the overtime period and outscored the Buffaloes by a 17-11 margin in overtime to extend their ongoing NCAA-best streak of consecutive overtime victories to 14. Florida State has won each of its overtime games since a 101-90 double-overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Junior Jalen Warlev came alive in the second as he totaled 19 points - with 16 of his 19 coming after halftime. The Seminoles' point guard scored 11 second half points and five more in the overtime period. Warley led four Seminoles in double figure scoring with 19 points. He was followed by Watkins (18 points), Darin Green Jr (12 points) and De'Ante Green (10 points). This matchup had the feeling of a March battle with both teams playing hard on each possession on both sides of the court. There were nine lead changes and 13 ties before Warley scored on a jumper in the paint to give the Seminoles a 62-60 lead they would not relinquish. Warley was Florida State's (4-1) leading scorer for the first time this season and the second time in his career

Tucker Center. Hill scored 13 points during the game, but his final two were his most important as the Bulldogs gained the road victory. Darin Green Jr. led Florida State with a season-high 21 points as he made four of eight 3-point shots. Sophomore De'Ante Green totaled career-highs in two categories by putting up 14 points and pulling down nine rebounds in his first career start. The Seminole family honored Hugh Durham at halftime of the game. Durham played and coached at Florida State and is in the Seminoles' Hall of Fame. He also coached at Georgia. Durham coached both the Seminoles and the Bulldogs to their first NCAA Final Four appearances in school history. He is the only coach in NCAA Division I history who has been able to lead two separate teams to their first Final Four appearances. De'Ante Green enjoyed the most impressive game of his career as he came within one rebound of his first career double-double. He totaled nine rebounds with seven coming on the offensive glass and two coming on the defensive glass. He was Florida State's second leading scorer.

Game 10 -- Florida State 91, North Florida 75

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Darin Green Jr. made a season-high six 3-point shots, and scored his season-high of 24 points - including the 1,500th point of his career - to lead Florida State to a 91-75 victory at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The win was the Seminoles' eighth consecutive victory over the Ospreys. Florida State is now 8-0 all-time against their neighbors from Jacksonville. Green has now scored 1,515 career points and made 331 career 3-point shots in his five-year career at UCF and Florida State. Green Jr. led four Seminoles in double-digit scoring with Jalen Warley (12 points), Primo Spears (12 points) and Baba Miller (10 points) putting the Seminoles over the 90-point plateau for the third time this season. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Florida State's Primo Spears made two free throws and Taylor Bol Bowen added a third as the Seminoles scored the final three points of the game from the line and held off Virginia Tech, 77-74, to gain their second consecutive ACC home win on Saturday at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Spears hit two free throws with 1.2 seconds remaining in regulation to give the Seminoles a 76-74 lead. On the ensuing in-bounds pass, Virginia Tech attempted a full court pass that went untouched by the Hokies, giving the Seminoles possession under their own basket. A foul was called on Virginia Tech's Sean Pedulla which sent Bol Bowen to the line for two more shots. He made the first shot to give the Seminoles a 77-74 lead but missed the second giving the Hokies life. Hunter Cattoor grabbed the rebound of the missed free throw and was on-target but short on a game-tying shot. The Seminoles improved to 2-1 in league play. Florida State's Jaylan Gainey, Cam Corhen and Spears led four Seminoles in double-figures with 11 points each. Jamir Watkins and Darin Green Jr. scored 10 points each for the home team.

Game 15 -- Florida State 87, Wake Forest 82

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - - Junior Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 shooting from the free throw line and sophomore Baba Miller scored a careerhigh 14 points to lead Florida State to an 87-82 win over Wake Forest at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The victory over the Deacons was their third consecutive ACC victory and raised the Seminoles to 3-1 in ACC play. Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton rotated through 11 players with each of them scoring and three players scoring in double digits with Watkins (19 points), Darin Green Jr. (17 points) and Miller (14 points) all in double figures. The Seminoles outscored Wake Forest in both halves, shot .509 from the field (28 of 55), .538 from the 3-point line (seven of 13) and 80 percent from the free throw line (24 of 30). Florida State totaled 15 assists, 10 steals and five blocked shots as it handed Wake Forest their first loss since November 24 - a span of nine consecutive wins. It was also the first loss in conference play for the Deacons who entered the game at 3-0 in league play.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - Primo Spears led Florida State with 13 points and the Seminoles earned their first ACC road win of the year against the Fighting Irish of Notre Dame at

the Joyce Center, 67-58. Spears was one of four players to score in double figures for the Seminoles with Jalen Warley, Jamir Watkins, and Darin Green Jr. Florida State is now 4-1 in ACC play. Amongst the major snowfall in South Bend was a high-energy basketball game from the beginning with the Seminoles putting on the full-court pressure. In the first half, Florida State earned a nine-point run over a four minute span, were perfect from the free throw line, and had 10 offensive rebounds.
