- After opening its 80th season in program history and inaugural campaign under the direction of J.D. Arteaga, Miami will host UCF for its first midweek in 2024. The Hurricanes swept NJIT during opening weekend, outscoring the Highlanders, 43-9.
- UM's 43 tallies match the second-most runs scored across its first three games, trailing only the 1988 Hurricanes (50).
- During Saturday's doubleheader against NJIT, Miami mounted 35 runs, the most scored in a single day in school history.
- The Canes lead the all-time series over the Knights, 24-9. Miami topped UCF, 7-3, in its most recent meeting a year ago.
- Last season, UM finished 10-3 in midweek matchups, including an 8-1 ledger at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Fleld.
- Miami will start its schedule with 19 of its first 20 games at Mark Light Field. UM's first road contest comes on March 12.
- Fifth-year senior right-handed pitcher Ben Chestnutt makes his season debut opposite UCF veteran righty Cade Boxrucker.
- In 2023, Chestnutt posted a 7-0 mark with a 5.71 ERA in 25 appearances, including five starts, in his first year at The U.
- The Hurricanes have 18 newcomers on their 2024 roster, joining the 17 returning letterwinners from last season.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series 25 times the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

THE HURRICANES' SKIPPER

UM Sports Hall of Fame Class of '07 No. 33 retired in '03 Winningest pitcher in program history (43)



J.D. Arteaga became the 10th head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2024 season.

Arteaga previously served as associate head coach in charge of pitching. Overall, 2024 will mark Arteaga's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff.

For the fourth straight year, the Hurricanes' longtime pitching guru groomed an All-American hurler in 2023. Right-hander Andrew Walters cemented himself as one of the most dominant closers in college baseball, after earning a spot as a finalist for the prestigious NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award the season prior. The unanimous All-America honoree headlined a Miami staff which featured four draft picks in the 2022 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Southpaw Carson Palmquist led the class as a third-round choice by the Colorado Rockies, while righty Alex McFarlane followed shortly as a fourth-round selection by the Philadelphia Phillies.

Arteaga developed another All-American in 2021, as Palmquist was a consensus All-America pick and earned first-team honors by the NCBWA and Perfect Game. The lefty headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team nod while also earning a place on the ACC All-Freshman Team.

Palmquist and right-hander Alejandro Rosario each were named Freshman All-Americans, while righthander Jake Smith was selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken by the Arizona Diamondbacks with the 33rd overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft.

McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round of the MLB Draft to the Colorado Rockies. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively, and giving Miami four pitchers joining the professional ranks.

The 2019 season featured the emergence of redshirt junior Brian Van Belle as a standout starter for the Canes. The right-hander earned All-ACC Second Team honors and was named to the All-Starkville Regional team to cap a season in which Van Belle led the Hurricanes in wins (10), innings pitched (95.1) and had the lowest ERA among starting pitchers (3.30). Right-hander Slade Cecconi earned Freshman All-America honors, while Evan McKendry (9th round, Rays) and Gregory Veliz (15th round, Angels) headlined four pitchers selected in the MLB draft.

In 2018, Arteaga guided right-hander Evan McKendry to a breakout season on the mound, where he led the Hurricanes staff in wins (seven) and strikeouts (114), as well as compiled a 3.52 ERA – second-best among weekend starters – while earning Third-Team All-ACC honors. Fellow right-hander Daniel Federman earned Freshman All-America honors, while four Miami pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft.

Jeb Bargfeldt, Miami's ace in 2017, was named to the All-ACC Second Team in his first season working under Arteaga. The left-hander finished the season 7-3 with a 2.28 ERA over 87 innings.

Arteaga, a standout southpaw during his own four years in the Miami rotation, helped guide the Hurricanes to their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under his direction as pitching coach in 2016, closer Bryan Garcia set the all-time saves record at Miami and became the first Hurricane to win NCBWA Stopper of the Year honors as the nation's top relief pitcher.

Garcia (sixth round, Detroit) and left-hander Danny Garcia (14th round, Seattle) were both selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. At least one Hurricane pitcher has been selected in the MLB Draft each year since 2004.

Arteaga recently coached left-hander Chris Diaz to ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year honors in 2014. Under his guidance, all four of Miami's starting pitchers in 2014 – Diaz, Bryan Radziewski, Javi Salas and Andy Suarez – were all drafted in the top 10 rounds of the 2014 MLB Draft.

Suarez, who elected to return to school and served as the staff ace on a 2015 team that qualified for the College World Series, was drafted in the second round (No. 67) overall by San Francisco in the 2015 MLB Draft. Arteaga helped lead Radziewski to Rawlings All-America honors in 2013 – the first for a UM player since 2010.

Two of the team's weekend starters, Radziewski and Diaz, ranked among the top three in ERA for all Atlantic Coast Conference pitchers in 2013.

Arteaga has tutored three recent first-round draft picks in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft - Carlos Gutierrez in 2008, Chris Perez in 2006 and Cesar Carrillo in 2005. Gutierrez was the 27th overall pick in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Twins after earning second team All-ACC honors. Perez, who came to Miami as a starting prospect, was aided by Arteaga in his transition to becoming one of the country's top closers. Carrillo started his career 24-0 as a Hurricane.

In addition to his work in converting Perez from a starter to a closer, he helped Kyle Bellamy in his transition from a traditional over-the-top throwing motion to a sidewinding delivery. The move had great rewards, as Bellamy recorded 16 saves and finished the 2009 season with a 0.97 ERA en route to numerous first team All-America honors.

Arteaga's 2008 staff boasted National Freshman Pitcher of the Year and Roger Clemens Award finalist Chri







Hernandez, who finished 11-0 with a 2.72 ERA while opponents hit just .223 against him. All three starters in 2008, Hernandez, sophomore lefty Eric Erickson and senior righthander Enrique Garcia combined to go 27-4 while the entire pitching staff combined for the fewest walks (187) in school history and eighth-most strikeouts (554).

His 2006 staff, composed almost entirely of first-time starters, recorded five shutouts, the most by a UM staff since the 1998 season. Miami also recorded the team's first postseason shutout on the road since 1976 with a 7-0 win against Ole Miss in the 2006 Oxford Super Regional.

Four pitchers from Arteaga's 2005 pitching staff signed pro contracts following the season, including the school's first pitcher drafted in the first round since the 1991 season, Carrillo. Arteaga also played a major role in Carrillo's career development and run at the NCAA record books. Carrillo, who was the 18th overall pick in the 2005 draft, ended with a career record of 25-3, was an All-American and a finalist for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Roger Clemens Award as college baseball's best pitcher in 2005.

The 2004 Miami pitching staff produced the best team ERA in (3.73) since the 2000 season (3.72).

Head coach Jim Morris named Arteaga the Hurricanes' next pitching coach on March 4, 2003, nine games deep into the season. Arteaga's style and approach to pitching was vital in J.D. Cockroft's development into the ace on Miami's 2003 club. Cockroft, a crafty left-hander, went 11-3 with a 2.72 ERA in a team-high 119 innings, including three complete games and one shutout.

Arteaga played for the Hurricanes from 1994-1997, helping UM reach the College World Series four straight seasons. He left Miami as the program's all-time wins leader with 43 and the all-time starts leader with 72. Arteaga ranks second for innings pitched in a career with 458.1.

He is also fifth on the all-time strikeouts chart with 343 career punchouts

Arteaga threw three complete games at UM and struck out career-high 11 batters on two different occasions (FSU, 4/16/95 and George Washington, 2/16/96). He posted an 11-3 record as a sophomore in 1995 and a 9-1 mark as a freshman.

Miami retired Arteaga's No. 33 on Feb. 5, 2003, prior to the season opener with Florida International. A 26th round draft choice by the New York Mets, Arteaga spent six seasons in the Mets' and Houston Astros' organizations. He had signed on with the Texas Rangers' organization in the spring of 2003, prior to accepting his post with the Hurricanes. He spent his last professional season with the Astros' Triple-A franchise New Orleans Zephyrs, compiling a 9-10 record with a 4.29 ERA in 15 starts and 42 appearances.

The left-hander came to the Hurricanes out of Westminster Christian in Miami. He won a career-best 12 games as a junior in 1996 (12-1) and came back to go 11-4 as a senior in 1997.

After six seasons in professional baseball, Arteaga earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Miami.

He is married to the former Ysha Schettini and the couple has a daughter, Ariana. The Arteagas' son, Ari, passed away in 2018 at the age of 16. The Ari Arteaga Foundation was founded shortly afterward to honor and memorialize Ari. Its mission is to spread Ari's spirit by helping children and families overcome obstacles they may face due to unforeseen hardships. The goal is to shine Ari's light on their path of need.

MIAMI WELCOMES IN-STATE FOE TO THE LIGHT

• The University of Miami faces in-state foe UCF for its lone meeting in 2024 and first of 12 midweek tilts this season.

• Miami boasts a 24-9 series lead over the Knights, including a 7-3 victory in its most recent meeting last year.

• In 2023, the Hurricanes went 10-3 in midweek games, higlighted by an 8-1 ledger at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.

• Fifth-year senior right-handed pitcher **Ben Chestnutt** will make his season debut, opposing UCF senior right-hander **Cade Boxrucker** Wednesday evening.

WEEKEND IN REVIEW: BREAK OUT THE BROOMS

• The Hurricanes began its first season under the direction of head coach **J.D. Arteaga** this past weekend, sweeping the NJIT Highlanders.

• Miami outscored NJIT, 43-9, capped off by a 16-0 shutout victory Saturday evening.

• The Canes' 43 tallies match the second-most runs scored across their first three games, trailing only the 1988 Hurricanes (50).

• During Saturday's doubleheader, Miami totaled 35 runs, the most scored in a single day in program history.

• Offensively, freshman **Daniel Cuvet** and sophomore **Jason Torres** led the charge, finishing a combined 16-for-26 with four home runs and 15 RBI.

• On the mound, junior southpaws **Rafe Schlesinger** and **Herick Hernandez** dominated, as Schlesinger recorded a co-career-high nine strikeouts over five frames in his first career start, while Hernandez struck out 10 batters across six no-hit inning in his Hurricane debut.

• With the sweep, Miami has won 18 straight opening weekend series, dating back to 2008.

CANES BASEBALL ENTERS 80TH SEASON

• The 2024 campaign is the 80th in Miami Hurricanes baseball history.

• The Hurricanes enter the season with a new leader, as **J.D. Arteaga** embarks on his first season at the helm of the Canes, after spending 21 years as a coach and a four-year Hall-of-Fame playing career in Coral Gables.

• Arteaga, who is the 10th head coach in program history, follows the footsteps of legendary skippers **Ron Fraser** and **Jim Morris**.

• The Hurricanes have accomplished a lot in advance of their 80th season: national championships in 1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001, 25 trips to the College World Series and an NCAA record 44 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

• Miami's program has also produced 56 All-Americans, while 66 different Hurricanes have gone on to play Major

ZIEHL ON THE BUMP

• Junior right-handed pitcher Gage Ziehl enters the 2024 season as one of the most highly-touted arms in the country.

• A year ago, Ziehl posted an 8-4 record with a 4.30 ERA and 100 strikeouts over 92 innings, earning All-ACC Second Team distinction.

 The 6-foot, 223-pound hurler paced the club in wins, innings pitched, and punchouts in his first season as the Hurricanes' ace.

• During his rookie campaign in 2022, the Macedon, N.Y., native made a team-high 30 appearances out of the bullpen, holding opponents to a .209 batting average.

• With the nod on Feb. 16, Ziehl became the first Hurricane to make back-to-back Opening Day start since ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year Chris Diaz in 2013 and 2014.

ZIEHL ON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

• Right-handed pitcher Gage Ziehl was among the 55 players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list, as announced by USA Baseball.

• Miami has had 16 different players named to the preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list since 2008.

 Chris Hernandez (2009-10), Zack Collins (2015-16) and Adrian Del Castillo (2020-21) each were two-time selections, while Yonder Alonso (2008), Jemile Weeks (2008), Rvan Jackson (2009), Yasmani Grandal (2010), Harold Martinez (2011), Peter O'Brien (2012), Andrew Suarez (2015), Carl Chester (2017), Chris McMahon (2020) and Alex Toral (2021), Carson Palmquist (2022) and Yohandy Morales (2023) preeceded Ziehl as preseason honorees.

• University of Miami Sports Hall of Famer Pat Burrell is the lone Hurricane to ever win the Golden Spikes Award, claiming the prestigious honor in 1998.

CYR ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

• Infielder Blake Cyr was among the 52 players named to the Bobby Bragan National Collegiate Slugger Award watch list for the 2024 college baseball season.

• The 52 players on the watch list represent a record 21 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.

• The Bobby Bragan National Collegiate Slugger Award (BBNCSA) is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity.

• The BBNCSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBNCSA expanded to a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. In 2020, the BBNCSA became a national award.

ARE YOU CYRIOUS?

• Sophomore Blake Cyr burst onto the college baseball scene in his debut season in the orange and green.

• A consensus Freshman All-American, Cyr was one of five rookies nationally with 17 homers and 63 RBI.

• Only three Miami freshmen have hit at least 17 home runs, with Ryan Braun (17), Phil Lane (17) and Pat Burrell (23) comprising the elite quartet.

• In Miami's 14-6 win over then-No. 6 Florida on March 4, 2023, Cyr finished one RBI shy of the Hurricanes' freshman single-game record set by Randy Guerra (8) in 1976.

• Heading into the 2024 campaign, the Windermere, Fla., native was ranked as the 22nd best sophomore in the country, according to Perfect Game

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

• Miami has 18 newcomers on the 2024 roster, with 12 freshmen, three transfers and three JUCO transfers joining the 17 returning letterwinners from a year ago.

• Freshmen hitters Daniel Cuvet, Antonio Jimenez, Jake Kulikowski and pitchers Nick Robert and Jordan Vargas figure to play key roles early.

• JUCO transfer Herick Hernandez, as well as transfers Lucas Costello, Drew Dwyer and JD Urso are expected to contribute from the start of the season.

 Head coach J.D. Arteaga also overhauled his coaching staff, bringing in Laz Gutierrez, Darren Fenster and Rob Cooper.

• Gutierrez returns to his alma mater after spending the past four years as the head coach at Nova Southeastern. Before coming home to South Florida in 2019, Gutierrez worked 13 years with the Boston Red Sox organiziation, helping the Red Sox win three World Series Championships (2017, 2013, 2018).

• Fenster comes to The U after 12 years with the Red Sox. During his time with the organization, Fenster groomed the next crop of major-league stars, helping the franchise win two World Series rings in 2013 and 2018.

• A Double Cane, Cooper rejoins the program after working the past 19 seasons as the head coach at Penn State and Wright State. Cooper's resume is also filled with international experience, as he has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

OPENING WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

NOT AN OLD MAN'S GAME

 The Miami Hurricanes welcomed back more than 101 alumni, who were introduced during pregame festivities at the annual Alumni Game on Sat., Feb. 10.

• Red Sox manager Alex Cora, World Series champion Jon Jay and 97-year old Larry Adams, who played for Miami in the late 1940s, were among the Hurricanes who returned home to Mark Light Field.

• Facing a talented alumni roster that included Cora, Washington Nationals prospect Yohandy Morales and fan favorites like Kevin Brown, among others, the Hurricanes beat the Alumni, 6-1.

 Junior left-handed pitcher Herick Hernandez retired the first 13 batters he faced, limiting the alumni to just one run on one hit across five innings.

• Senior outfielder Lucas Costello socked a solo shot in both the first and third frames, before the Canes plated a quartet of insurance tallies in the late innings.

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

• Miami made its second straight trip to the College World Series in 2016, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

• Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the secondmost of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the fourthmost of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth most.

• Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the top eight in eight seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5), 2016 (#3) and 2022 (#6).

MIAMI IS #MLBU

 Forty-two Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.

• No school in the ACC has had more players drafted than Miami, which has seen 313 players picked into the professional ranks - including six in 2023.

• Since 1991, UM has produced 208 draft picks - 26 more than the next-highest ACC total (182, Clemson).

• With 15 players taken in 1996, Miami has the most players selected in a single draft by any ACC school. (#1), 2015 (#5), 2016 (#3) and 2022 (#6).
