WEEKEND STORYLINES & NEWS

- The Miami Hurricanes continue their 80th season in program history and inaugural campaign under the direction of J.D. Arteaga, as the Hurricanes leave the Sunshine State for the first time in 2024 to visit the Notre Dame Fighting Irish.
- Miami started the season with 19 of its first 20 games at home, with the lone road contest at Florida Atlantic on March 12.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series over the Fighting Irish, 23-8, including a 7-1 advantage away from Coral Gables.
- Dating back to 2019, Miami has posted the best conference record in the ACC, boasting an 83-51 (.619) ledger.
- Junior right-handed pitcher Gage Ziehl (1-1 5.04 ERA) draws the start opposite right-hander Matt Bedford (1-3, 5.12 ERA) Friday.
- In his last outing against then-No. 15 North Carolina, Ziehl tossed the first complete game by a Hurricane since May 17, 2018.
- As of March 21, the Canes are tied for 11th nationally in home runs (42). UM has circled the bases in 18 of its 20 games.
- Daniel Cuvet is second in homers (9), slugging (.827) and OPS (1.322) and third in hits (33), among all Division I freshmen.
- In 2023, the Hurricanes tallied a 42-21 record, earning a top-10 seed in the postseason for the second straight year.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series 25 times - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (37). The Hurricanes' four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

THE HURRICANES' SKIPPER

UM Sports Hall of Fame Class of '07
No. 33 retired in '03

Winningest pitcher in program history (43)



J.D. Arteaga became the 10th head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2024 season.

Arteaga previously served as associate head coach in charge of pitching. Overall, 2024 will mark Arteaga's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff.

For the fourth straight year, the Hurricanes' longtime pitching guru groomed an All-American hurler in 2023. Right-hander Andrew Walters cemented himself as one of the most dominant closers in college baseball, after earning a spot as a finalist for the prestigious NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award the season prior. The unanimous All-America honoree headlined a Miami staff which featured four draft picks in the 2022 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Southpaw Carson Palmquist led the class as a third-round choice by the Colorado Rockies, while righty Alex McFarlane followed shortly as a fourth-round selection by the Philadelphia Phillies.

Arteaga developed another All-American in 2021, as Palmquist was a consensus All-America pick and earned first-team honors by the NCBWA and Perfect Game. The lefty headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team nod while also earning a place on the ACC All-Freshman Team.

Palmquist and right-hander Alejandro Rosario each were named Freshman All-Americans, while right-hander Jake Smith was selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken by the Arizona Diamondbacks with the 33rd overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft.

McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round of the MLB Draft to the Colorado Rockies. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively, and giving Miami four pitchers joining the professional ranks.

The 2019 season featured the emergence of redshirt junior Brian Van Belle as a standout starter for the Canes. The right-hander earned All-ACC Second Team honors and was named to the All-Starkville Regional team to cap a season in which Van Belle led the Hurricanes in wins (10), innings pitched (95.1) and had the lowest ERA among starting pitchers (3.30). Right-hander Slade Cecconi earned Freshman All-America honors, while Evan McKendry (9th round, Rays) and Gregory Veliz (15th round, Angels) headlined four pitchers selected in the MLB draft.

In 2018, Arteaga guided right-hander Evan McKendry to a breakout season on the mound, where he led the Hurricanes staff in wins (seven) and strikeouts (114), as well as compiled a 3.52 ERA - second-best among weekend starters - while earning Third-Team All-ACC honors. Fellow right-hander Daniel Federman earned Freshman All-America honors, while four Miami pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft.

Jeb Bargfeldt, Miami's ace in 2017, was named to the All-ACC Second Team in his first season working under Arteaga. The left-hander finished the season 7-3 with a 2.28 ERA over 87 innings.

Arteaga, a standout southpaw during his own four years in the Miami rotation, helped guide the Hurricanes to their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under his direction as pitching coach in 2016, closer Bryan Garcia set the all-time saves record at Miami and became the first Hurricane to win NCBWA Stopper of the Year honors as the nation's top relief pitcher.

Garcia (sixth round, Detroit) and left-hander Danny Garcia (14th round, Seattle) were both selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. At least one Hurricane pitcher has been selected in the MLB Draft each year since 2004.

Arteaga recently coached left-hander Chris Diaz to ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year honors in 2014. Under his guidance, all four of Miami's starting pitchers in 2014 - Diaz, Bryan Radziewski, Javi Salas and Andy Suarez - were all drafted in the top 10 rounds of the 2014 MLB Draft.

Suarez, who elected to return to school and served as the staff ace on a 2015 team that qualified for the College World Series, was drafted in the second round (No. 67) overall by San Francisco in the 2015 MLB Draft.

Arteaga helped lead Radziewski to Rawlings All-America honors in 2013 - the first for a UM player since 2010. Two of the team's weekend starters, Radziewski and Diaz, ranked among the top three in ERA for all Atlantic Coast Conference pitchers in 2013.

Arteaga has tutored three recent first-round draft picks in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft - Carlos Gutierrez in 2008, Chris Perez in 2006 and Cesar Carrillo in 2005. Gutierrez was the 27th overall pick in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Twins after earning second team All-ACC honors. Perez, who came to Miami as a starting prospect, was aided by Arteaga in his transition to becoming one of the country's top closers. Carrillo started his career 24-0 as a Hurricane.

In addition to his work in converting Perez from a starter to a closer, he helped Kyle Bellamy in his transition from a traditional over-the-top throwing motion to a sidewinding delivery. The move had great rewards, as Bellamy recorded 16 saves and finished the 2009 season with a 0.97 ERA en route to numerous first team All-America honors.

Arteaga's 2008 staff boasted National Freshman Pitcher of the Year and Roger Clemens Award finalist Chris



Hernandez, who finished 11-0 with a 2.72 ERA while opponents hit just .223 against him. All three starters in 2008, Hernandez, sophomore lefty Eric Erickson and senior right-hander Enrique Garcia combined to go 27-4 while the entire pitching staff combined for the fewest walks (187) in school history and eighth-most strikeouts (554).

His 2006 staff, composed almost entirely of first-time starters, recorded five shutouts, the most by a UM staff since the 1998 season. Miami also recorded the team's first postseason shutout on the road since 1976 with a 7-0 win against Ole Miss in the 2006 Oxford Super Regional.

Four pitchers from Arteaga's 2005 pitching staff signed pro contracts following the season, including the school's first pitcher drafted in the first round since the 1991 season, Carrillo. Arteaga also played a major role in Carrillo's career development and run at the NCAA record books. Carrillo, who was the 18th overall pick in the 2005 draft, ended with a career record of 25-3, was an All-American and a finalist for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Roger Clemens Award as college baseball's best pitcher in 2005.

The 2004 Miami pitching staff produced the best team ERA in (3.73) since the 2000 season (3.72).

Head coach Jim Morris named Arteaga the Hurricanes' next pitching coach on March 4, 2003, nine games deep into the season. Arteaga's style and approach to pitching was vital in J.D. Cockcroft's development into the ace on Miami's 2003 club. Cockcroft, a crafty left-hander, went 11-3 with a 2.72 ERA in a team-high 119 innings, including three complete games and one shutout.

Arteaga played for the Hurricanes from 1994-1997, helping UM reach the College World Series four straight seasons. He left Miami as the program's all-time wins leader with 43 and the all-time starts leader with 72. Arteaga ranks second for innings pitched in a career with 458.1.

He is also fifth on the all-time strikeouts chart with 343 career punchouts. Arteaga threw three complete games at UM and struck out career-high 11 batters on two different occasions (FSU, 4/16/95 and George Washington, 2/16/96). He posted an 11-3 record as a sophomore in 1995 and a 9-1 mark as a freshman.

Miami retired Arteaga's No. 33 on Feb. 5, 2003, prior to the season opener with Florida International. A 26th round draft choice by the New York Mets, Arteaga spent six seasons in the Mets' and Houston Astros' organizations. He had signed on with the Texas Rangers' organization in the spring of 2003, prior to accepting his post with the Hurricanes. He spent his last professional season with the Astros' Triple-A franchise New Orleans Zephyrs, compiling a 9-10 record with a 4.29 ERA in 15 starts and 42 appearances.

The left-hander came to the Hurricanes out of Westminster Christian in Miami. He won a career-best 12 games as a junior in 1996 (12-1) and came back to go 11-4 as a senior in 1997.

After six seasons in professional baseball, Arteaga earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Miami.

He is married to the former Ysha Schettini and the couple has a daughter, Ariana. The Arteagas' son, Ari, passed away in 2018 at the age of 16. The Ari Arteaga Foundation was founded shortly afterward to honor and memorialize Ari. Its mission is to spread Ari's spirit by helping children and families overcome obstacles they may face due to unforeseen hardships. The goal is to shine Ari's light on their path of need.

• The Hurricanes lead the all-time series over the Irish, 23-8, including a 7-1 advantage away from Coral Gables.

• Miami last visited Frank Eck Stadium in 2016. The Hurricanes won the lone meeting that year, as the first two games of the series were canceled due to snow.

• Junior right-hander **Gage Ziehl** (1-1, 5.04 ERA) takes the ball Friday opposite Notre Dame senior righty **Matt Bedford** (1-3, 5.12 ERA).

HAD THEM ON THEIR HEELS

• For the second straight weekend, the Hurricanes won a top-15 ACC series, taking two of three games from No. 15 North Carolina at Mark Light Field

• In the series opener, Miami run-ruled the Tar Heels, cruising to a 14-1 win.

• The Hurricanes scored in five of their six trips to the plate, pounding out 16 hits.

• Reigning ACC Player of the Week **Blake Cyr** led the charge with a three-hit performance, smacking a pair of two-run homers in both the first and second frames.

• On the mound, **Gage Ziehl** tossed the first complete game by a Miami hurler since **Jeb Bargfeldt** accomplished the feat vs. Boston College in a nine-inning contest on May 17, 2018.

• The Hurricanes secured the series Saturday in dramatic fashion, as junior second baseman **Dorian Gonzalez Jr.** delivered a walk-off home run to lift Miami to a 2-1 victory.

• Gonzalez's game-winning blast marked the Hurricanes' second walk-off and seventh comeback win this season.

• Starter **Rafe Schlesinger** yielded just one run on five hits across a co-career-long seven innings. The junior struck out five batters on a career-high 109 pitches.

• The Hurricanes couldn't complete the sweep Sunday, falling to the Heels, 18-6.

CARDIAC CANES

• Through its first 20 games, Miami has notched eight come-from-behind victories, including three walk-off wins against NJIT on Feb. 16, then-No. 15 North Carolina on March 16 and FIU on March 19.

• The Hurricanes have tallied six victories trailing after six innings, more than their entire win total in those situations from last year.

• On March 9, Miami overcame a nine-run deficit vs. then-No. 13 Virginia, scoring 13 unanswered runs. The come-from-behind win marked the Hurricanes' largest comeback victory since erasing a nine-run deficit against Tampa on May 13, 1992.

MIAMI MASHERS

- As of March 21, the Hurricanes are tied for 10th nationally in home runs per game (2.1). Overall, Miami is tied for 11th in total homers (42).
- The Hurricanes have circled the bases in 18 of their 20 contests, highlighted by an eight-homer barrage against LIU on Feb. 25.
- In the 22-5 victory vs. the Sharks, Miami smacked four blasts in the third inning, matching the school record for the most homers in a single frame.
- Meanwhile, the eight home runs were one shy of the school's single-game record set on April 2, 1979.
- Miami is on pace for 113 dingers during the regular season, which would rank as the third-most in school history.
- Last year, the Hurricanes totaled 122 homers, the second-most by a Miami team, trailing only the 1998 club (139).
- Eleven different players have left the yard, with freshman **Daniel Cuvet** blazing a team-leading nine round-trippers.

DANNY DINGERS

- Freshman **Daniel Cuvet** has quickly made a name for himself in the heart of the Hurricanes' lineup.
- As of March 21, Cuvet checks in second in home runs (9), slugging (.827) and OPS (1.322), third in hits (33), tied for fourth in RBI (27) and seventh in runs (25), among all Division I freshmen hitters.
- The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native started his career on a 17-game on-base streak, totaling a team-leading seven multi-RBI performances and 10 multi-hit efforts.
- Perfect Game tabbed Cuvet as the 17th-best freshman in the country prior to the season.

SCORCHING START TO SOPHOMORE SEASON

- With Miami losing more than half of its starting position players from a year ago, **Jason Torres** has taken the next step to fill the void.
- As of March 21, Torres is second in average (.457), tied for third in hits (37), sixth in OPS (1.320), eighth in slugging (.815) and tied for 10th in home runs (8), among all ACC hitters.
- The 6-foot-1, 228-pound infielder has reached base safely in all but one game this season.
- In 117 career at-bats, Torres is slashing .462/.504/.829 with 11 home runs and 35 RBI.
- The Hialeah, Fla., native was ranked as the 38th-best first baseman in the country, according to D1Baseball.

• Sophomore **Blake Cyr** has picked up where he left off after bursting onto the college baseball scene in his debut campaign last year.

• A 2023 consensus Freshman All-American, Cyr was tabbed the ACC Player of the Week on March 11.

• Cyr batted .500 (8-for-16) with three home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.682 OPS across the Hurricanes' 3-1 stretch, highlighted by a series win over then-No. 13 Virginia.

• The 5-foot-11, 188-pound infielder homered in three of the four games, including a go-ahead grand slam Saturday to cap off Miami's largest comeback victory since May 13, 1992.

• A native of Windermere, Fla., Cyr also scored eight runs, drew four walks and reached base safely 13 times, notching three multi-hit and multi-RBI efforts along the way.

• Last season, he was one of five rookies nationally with 17 homers and 63 RBI.

• Cyr is one of only four Miami freshmen to hit at least 17 home runs, with **Ryan Braun** (17), **Phil Lane** (17) and **Pat Burrell** (23) comprising the elite quartet.

• In Miami's 14-6 win over then-No. 6 Florida on March 4, 2023, Cyr finished one RBI shy of the Hurricanes' freshman single-game record set by **Randy Guerra** (8) in 1976.

• Heading into the 2024 campaign, Cyr was ranked as the 22nd-best sophomore in the country, according to Perfect Game.

CYR ON BRAGAN AWARD WATCH LIST

• Infielder **Blake Cyr** was among the 52 players named to the Bobby Bragan National Collegiate Slugger Award watch list for the 2024 college baseball season.

• The 52 players on the watch list represent a record 21 conferences around the country, including all five power conferences.

• The BBNSA originally started out in 2017 as an honor going to the top college hitter in Texas. In 2019, the BBNSA expanded to a regional award covering Division I programs in Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico and Oklahoma. In 2020, the BBNSA became a national award.

- The Hurricanes enter the season with a new leader, as **J.D. Arteaga** embarks on his first season at the helm of the Canes, after spending 21 years as a coach and a four-year Hall-of-Fame playing career in Coral Gables.
- Arteaga, who is the 10th head coach in program history, follows the footsteps of legendary skippers **Ron Fraser** and **Jim Morris**.
- The Hurricanes have accomplished a lot in advance of their 80th season: national championships in 1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001, 25 trips to the College World Series and an NCAA record 44 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Miami has also produced 56 All-Americans, while 66 different Canes have gone on to play Major League Baseball.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

- Miami has 18 newcomers on the 2024 roster, with 12 freshmen, three transfers and three JUCO transfers joining the 17 returning letterwinners from a year ago.
- Freshmen hitters **Daniel Cuvet**, **Antonio Jimenez**, **Jake Kulikowski** and pitchers **Nick Robert** and **Jordan Vargas** figure to play key roles early.
- JUCO transfer **Herick Hernandez**, as well as transfers **Lucas Costello**, **Drew Dwyer** and **JD Urso** are expected to contribute from the start of the season.
- Head coach **J.D. Arteaga** also overhauled his coaching staff, bringing in **Laz Gutierrez**, **Darren Fenster** and **Rob Cooper**.
- Gutierrez returns to his alma mater after spending the past four years as the head coach at Nova Southeastern. Before coming home to South Florida in 2019, Gutierrez worked 13 years with the Boston Red Sox organization, helping the Red Sox win three World Series Championships (2017, 2013, 2018).
- Fenster comes to The U after 12 years with the Red Sox. During his time with the organization, Fenster groomed the next crop of major-league stars, helping the franchise win two World Series rings in 2013 and 2018.
- A Double Cane, Cooper rejoins the program after working the past 19 seasons as the head coach at Penn State and Wright State. Cooper's resume is also filled with international experience, as he has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.
