SEMINOLES CLOSE OUT REGULAR SEASON AS THEY PLAY HOST TO MIAMI IN FINAL HOME GAME

Florida State, which has won two straight and 11 of its last 12 games against Miami, plays host to the Hurricanes on Saturday, March 9, 2024 at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles defeated the Hurricanes, 84-75 earlier this season on January 17, 2024 at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla. for their second consecutive victory in the series. Florida State has won 11 of the last 12 games against Miami – a streak that began with a 103-94 win on January 27, 2018 – in Tallahassee at the Donald L. Tucker Center. During the stretch of 12 games, the Seminoles have a 5-1 record at home and a 6-0 record on the Hurricane's home court at the Watsco Center. Following the Seminoles' game against Miami, the Seminoles travel to play in the ACC Tournament at the Capital One Arena in Washington, D.C (March 9-12, 2024). The Seminoles' opponent in their first game and the entire set seeds for the tournament will be announced following the conclusion of play on Saturday.

EIGHT SEMINOLES HONORED ON SENIOR DAY

As Florida State plays host to Miami in its final regular season home game, Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff will honor eight players who have played integral roles in the success of the Seminole program on Senior Day. The group will be honored at center court in the Tucker Center prior to the start of the game. The group includes Sola Adebisi, Cam Fletcher, Jaylan Gainey, Darin Green Jr., Josh Nickelberry, Isaac Spainhour, Max Thorpe, and Jamir Watkins.

HAMILTON TO BE HONORED BY NABC

Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton will be presented with the NABC Golden Anniversary Award on April 7 at the NCAA Final Four in Phoenix. The Golden Anniversary Award is presented annually to a NABC member who has devoted at least 50 years of outstanding service to the game of basketball. Hamilton will be presented with the award at the NABC Convention Champions Brunch in Phoenix the day before the Division I National Championship game. He will be presented with the award as the NABC also honors each of the regular season conference champions across all levels of college basketball.

HAMILTON LOOKS TO MOVE INTO FOURTH-PLACE TIE FOR ALL-TIME ACC REGULAR SEASON VICTORIES

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Miami looking to win his 192nd career ACC regular season game and move into a tie for fourth place in ACC history with former Maryland Coach Gary Williams (1990-2011). Hamilton began the season with 182 regular season ACC wins and with nine this season has 191 which puts him one victory behind Williams. Hamilton enters Saturday's game ranked as the fifth overall winningest coach in ACC history, the fifth winningest coach for ACC regular season victories, and the fifth overall winningest coach for total ACC wins (ACC regular season and ACC Tournament, combined).

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami having won an NCAA record of 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Clemson on February 14, 2018, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam earlier this season.

SEMINOLES ALMOST TURNOVER-LESS IN SECOND HALF AGAINST PITTSBURGH ON TUESDAY

Florida State committed one turnover and allowed Pittsburgh to earn only two points off of its turnover in the second half of Tuesday's game against the Panthers.

SEMINOLES FROM THE FREE THROW LINE AGAINST PITTSBURGH

Florida State made 24 free throws and shot .774 from the free throw line in its game Pittsburgh. The Seminoles' 24 free throws were two off of its ACC season-high of 26 free throws that it made against Virgina on February 10 and one more than they made at Louisville on February 3. The Seminoles have shot better than 73 percent from the free throw line in each of their last four games as are shooting a cumulative percentage of .766 (59 of 77) in those four games.

FLORIDA STATE ON SENIOR DAY UNDER LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami having won eight of its last nine Senior Day games. The Seminoles are 17-4 on Senior Day games since March 1, 2003, under 22nd-year head coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles are 2-0 against Miami on Senior Day under Hamilton with wins to close out the 2008 and 2017 home schedules.

FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI - THE LAST TIME

Cam Corhen and Primo Spears led Florida State with 16 points each as the Seminoles gained the 1300th win in program history as they defeated Miami, 84-75, on January 17, 2024 at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla. The monumental win was the sixth straight win in Coral Gables for the Seminoles. Darin Green Jr. scored the first basket of the game - on a customary 3pointer for the senior - and the Seminoles never trailed in defeating their in-state conference rivals. Florida State led by as many as 16 points in the second half. Florida State showed its dominance as it opened the game on Green Jr's first of two shots from beyond the arc during the victory. Both Corhen (11 points) and Spears (10 points) scored in double-figures in the first half as Florida State led 45-35 going into the locker room at halftime. The Seminoles earned seven steals in the first 20 minutes and nearly reached their season average of 9.2 steals in earning a 15-point first-half lead.

Corhen enters Saturday's game against Miami averaging a career-high 9.7 points and having scored a near career-high 242 points in fewer games (32-25) and fewer minutes played (763-510) last season as compared to this season.

Jamir Watkins: Defense Is His Calling Card

PITTSBURGH, Pa. – It's in the eyes of the opponent for Florida State's Jamir Watkins who is one of the best defenders in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Watkins enters the Seminoles' final regular-season road game at Pittsburgh ranked fifth in the ACC with a career-high 1.8 steals per game average, ranked 14th in the ACC with a career-high 0.9 blocked shots per game average, and ranked within the league's top 20 with a career-high 5.7 rebounds per game average.

Watkins enters Florida State's game against Pittsburgh having earned at least one steal in 11 consecutive games – each game since January 23 against Syracuse. He has earned 25 steals in the last 11 games and is averaging 2.3 steals per game during his steals streak.

How well Watkins and his teammates see into the Panthers' eyes will go a long way to the Seminoles' finding success during their only game of the regular season against Pittsburgh at the Peterson Events Center on Tuesday night at 9:00 p.m. The game between Florida State and Pittsburgh will be televised on ESPN2.

"Once I see that they are not certain what they want to do with the ball, then I know I've got them," said Watkins who has at least one steal in 24 of Florida State's 29 games this season. "As soon as I see the man I am up against isn't certain of where he wants to go with the ball because of how I am guarding him, I try to keep the ball in their weak side hand. From there, I see how well they can play with the ball in their non-dominant hand."

Watkins has looked into the eyes of many opponents this season and come away with a single-season career-high of 52 steals. He has earned his career-high of four steals in four different games this season including the Seminoles' most recent game against Georgia Tech. Watkins has earned multiple steals in 16 different games in his first season as a Seminole.

The opportunity to become a more complete defender is one of the main reasons Watkins chose Florida State after entering the Transfer Portal following his third year at VCU.

Under legendary Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his staff, Florida State has long been known as one of the best defensive teams in the ACC and the nation. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Pittsburgh ranked second in the ACC in team steals and third in blocked shots.

Watkins has always been a defensive-minded player and excelled in a system similar to the one that has made the Seminoles famous for their defense. He totaled 64 steals in two seasons and 61 games (1.1 spg) and blocked 23 shots in 25 games as a redshirt sophomore during the 2022-23 season.

"Florida State was a great fit for me when I decided to transfer from VCU," said Watkins. "Playing defense under Coach Ham and his staff is very similar to the system we played at VCU. The opportunity to become a better defender, and a better basketball player, was definitely one of the reasons I chose Florida State."

Hamilton is happy his leading scorer and rebounder chose Tallahassee as his basketball home.

"All of the defenses are being set to guard Jamir," said Hamilton. "He seems to always find a way to produce the numbers that give us a chance to be successful. You have to admire and respect that Jamir is one of those guys that finds a way to be the stable player in our system, and we seem to all play off of him."

Watkins, who currently leads the Seminoles in scoring, rebounding, and steals, while ranking second in assists, considers himself to be a complete player who can excel on both offensive and defense.

Offensively, he is ranked 14th in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 15.1 points per game scoring average. He has scored in double figures in a career-best 15 consecutive games entering Tuesday's game against the Panthers.

But it's on the defensive end of the court where he feels he thrives the most.

"I feel like I have a knack for the ball on defense," said Watkins. "I try to move my feet and guard the ball as well as I can. I feel that I have a good sense of where offensive players are trying to go. I think my defense keeps me on the floor, and my defense translates to my success on the offensive end as well."

Watkins counts on his high basketball IQ and desire to be disruptive as his best attributes as a defender.

"My sense and my knack for knowing where the basketball is, and where the opposing team will move the ball, are the two main things that have helped me become a good defender," said Watkins, who considers himself to be a strong on-ball defender.

"I play good off-ball defense, but I would say I am a better on-ball defender," said Watkins. "I think my ability to keep a player in front of me and guard him full court helps me on defense. In my mind, I tell myself that I won't be scored on."

As seen on Saturday against Georgia Tech, and throughout the season, Watkins has an incredible ability to quickly turn defense into offense. Watkins earned an ESPN SportsCenter top-10 play with a first-half steal near midcourt and an impressive dunk over the Yellow Jacket's defense on the road in ACC Play.

"Once I get a steal, all I am thinking about is putting the ball in the basket and helping my team," said Watkins. "If I can't get all the way to the basket, I want to make plays for my team so we can build energy, force turnovers, and continue to score."

Game 10 -- Florida State 91, North Florida 75

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Darin Green Jr. made a season-high six 3-point shots, and scored his season-high of 24 points - including the 1,500th point of his career - to lead Florida State to a 91-75 victory at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The win was the Seminoles' eighth consecutive victory over the Ospreys. Florida State is now 8-0 all-time against their neighbors from Jacksonville. Green has now scored 1,515 career points and made 331 career 3-point shots in his five-year career at UCF and Florida State. Green Jr. led four Seminoles in double-digit scoring with Jalen Warley (12 points), Primo Spears (12 points) and Baba Miller (10 points) putting the Seminoles over the 90-point plateau for the third time this season. He was tonight's leader for the Seminoles, scoring 24 points and adding two rebounds, one assist, and one steal.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - - Junior Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 shooting from the free throw line and sophomore Baba Miller scored a careerhigh 14 points to lead Florida State to an 87-82 win over Wake Forest at the Donald L.
