

MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NEWS

- Miami continues its 80th season in program history and inaugural campaign under the direction of head coach J.D. Arteaga
- The Hurricanes open a four-game road swing, beginning at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday against Florida Atlantic in Boca Raton.
- Tuesday's tilt marks the second of four meetings between the two South Florida foes. FAU topped Miami, 6-4, on March 12.
- Miami leads the all-time series over FAU, 70-23. The Hurricanes have won six of its last 10 games against the Owls.
- UM left-handed pitcher Ashton Crowther (0-2, 5.71 ERA) draws the start opposite FAU righty Brandon Smith (1-1, 10.22 ERA).
- Gage Ziehl earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors on April 1. Ziehl tossed a complete game, punching out a career-high
- 15 batters against then-No. 3 Clemson. His strikeout total marked the most by a Hurricane since Bryan Radziewski in 2013.
- Sophomore first baseman Jason Torres is tied for 10th in hits (48) and ranks 13th in batting average (.440) nationally.
- Among Division I freshmen, Daniel Cuvet is tied for second in home runs (9) and third in slugging (.745) and OPS (1.230).
- In 2023, the Hurricanes tallied a 42-21 record, earning a top-10 seed in the postseason for the second straight year.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series 25 times the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only
- Texas (38). The Hurricanes' four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

THE HURRICANES' SKIPPER

UM Sports Hall of Fame Class of '07 No. 33 retired in '03 Winningest pitcher in program history (43)



J.D. Arteaga became the 10th head baseball coach in University of Miami history, elevating to the helm of the program prior to the 2024 season.

Arteaga previously served as associate head coach in charge of pitching. Overall, 2024 will mark Arteaga's 22nd year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff.

For the fourth straight year, the Hurricanes' longtime pitching guru groomed an All-American hurler in 2023. Right-hander Andrew Walters cemented himself as one of the most dominant closers in college baseball, after earning a spot as a finalist for the prestigious NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award the season prior. The unanimous All-America honoree headlined a Miami staff which featured four draft picks in the 2022 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Southpaw Carson Palmquist led the class as a third-round choice by the Colorado Rockies, while righty Alex McFarlane followed shortly as a fourth-round selection by the Philadelphia Phillies.

Arteaga developed another All-American in 2021, as Palmquist was a consensus All-America pick and earned first-team honors by the NCBWA and Perfect Game. The lefty headlined Miami's four All-ACC selections with a first-team nod while also earning a place on the ACC All-Freshman Team.

Palmquist and right-hander Alejandro Rosario each were named Freshman All-Americans, while righthander Jake Smith was selected in the sixth round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Angels and right-hander Daniel Federman signed a free agent contract with the Baltimore Orioles.

The 2020 Hurricanes featured a pair of All-Americans, as standout right-handed pitchers Brian Van Belle and Chris McMahon were both selected to Collegiate Baseball's All-America Second Team.

After the season, sophomore right-hander Slade Cecconi was taken by the Arizona Diamondbacks with the 33rd overall pick in the 2020 MLB Draft, becoming the 29th Hurricane to be selected in the first round of an MLB Draft.

McMahon, a junior right-hander, went in the second round of the MLB Draft to the Colorado Rockies. Van Belle and fellow right-hander Tyler Keysor signed free agent contracts following the shortened five-round MLB Draft, joining the Red Sox and Reds organizations, respectively, and giving Miami four pitchers joining the professional ranks.

The 2019 season featured the emergence of redshirt junior Brian Van Belle as a standout starter for the Canes. The right-hander earned All-ACC Second Team honors and was named to the All-Starkville Regional team to cap a season in which Van Belle led the Hurricanes in wins (10), innings pitched (95.1) and had the lowest ERA among starting pitchers (3.30). Right-hander Slade Cecconi earned Freshman All-America honors, while Evan McKendry (9th round, Rays) and Gregory Veliz (15th round, Angels) headlined four pitchers selected in the MLB draft.

In 2018, Arteaga guided right-hander Evan McKendry to a breakout season on the mound, where he led the Hurricanes staff in wins (seven) and strikeouts (114), as well as compiled a 3.52 ERA – second-best among weekend starters – while earning Third-Team All-ACC honors. Fellow right-hander Daniel Federman earned Freshman All-America honors, while four Miami pitchers were selected in the MLB Draft.

Jeb Bargfeldt, Miami's ace in 2017, was named to the All-ACC Second Team in his first season working under Arteaga. The left-hander finished the season 7-3 with a 2.28 ERA over 87 innings.

Arteaga, a standout southpaw during his own four years in the Miami rotation, helped guide the Hurricanes to their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under his direction as pitching coach in 2016, closer Bryan Garcia set the all-time saves record at Miami and became the first Hurricane to win NCBWA Stopper of the Year honors as the nation's top relief pitcher.

Garcia (sixth round, Detroit) and left-hander Danny Garcia (14th round, Seattle) were both selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. At least one Hurricane pitcher has been selected in the MLB Draft each year since 2004.

Arteaga recently coached left-hander Chris Diaz to ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year honors in 2014. Under his guidance, all four of Miami's starting pitchers in 2014 – Diaz, Bryan Radziewski, Javi Salas and Andy Suarez – were all drafted in the top 10 rounds of the 2014 MLB Draft.

Suarez, who elected to return to school and served as the staff ace on a 2015 team that qualified for the College World Series, was drafted in the second round (No. 67) overall by San Francisco in the 2015 MLB Draft. Arteaga helped lead Radziewski to Rawlings All-America honors in 2013 – the first for a UM player since 2010.

Two of the team's weekend starters, Radziewski and Diaz, ranked among the top three in ERA for all Atlantic Coast Conference pitchers in 2013.

Arteaga has tutored three recent first-round draft picks in the Major League Baseball Amateur Draft - Carlos Gutierrez in 2008, Chris Perez in 2006 and Cesar Carrillo in 2005. Gutierrez was the 27th overall pick in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Twins after earning second team All-ACC honors. Perez, who came to Miami as a starting prospect, was aided by Arteaga in his transition to becoming one of the country's top closers. Carrillo started his career 24-0 as a Hurricane.

In addition to his work in converting Perez from a starter to a closer, he helped Kyle Bellamy in his transition from a traditional over-the-top throwing motion to a sidewinding delivery. The move had great rewards, as Bellamy recorded 16 saves and finished the 2009 season with a 0.97 ERA en route to numerous first team All-America honors.

Arteaga's 2008 staff boasted National Freshman Pitcher of the Year and Roger Clemens Award finalist Chri







Hernandez, who finished 11-0 with a 2.72 ERA while opponents hit just .223 against him. All three starters in 2008, Hernandez, sophomore lefty Eric Erickson and senior righthander Enrique Garcia combined to go 27-4 while the entire pitching staff combined for the fewest walks (187) in school history and eighth-most strikeouts (554).

His 2006 staff, composed almost entirely of first-time starters, recorded five shutouts, the most by a UM staff since the 1998 season. Miami also recorded the team's first postseason shutout on the road since 1976 with a 7-0 win against Ole Miss in the 2006 Oxford Super Regional.

Four pitchers from Arteaga's 2005 pitching staff signed pro contracts following the season, including the school's first pitcher drafted in the first round since the 1991 season, Carrillo. Arteaga also played a major role in Carrillo's career development and run at the NCAA record books. Carrillo, who was the 18th overall pick in the 2005 draft, ended with a career record of 25-3, was an All-American and a finalist for the Dick Howser Trophy and the Roger Clemens Award as college baseball's best pitcher in 2005.

The 2004 Miami pitching staff produced the best team ERA in (3.73) since the 2000 season (3.72).

Head coach Jim Morris named Arteaga the Hurricanes' next pitching coach on March 4, 2003, nine games deep into the season. Arteaga's style and approach to pitching was vital in J.D. Cockroft's development into the ace on Miami's 2003 club. Cockroft, a crafty left-hander, went 11-3 with a 2.72 ERA in a team-high 119 innings, including three complete games and one shutout.

Arteaga played for the Hurricanes from 1994-1997, helping UM reach the College World Series four straight seasons. He left Miami as the program's all-time wins leader with 43 and the all-time starts leader with 72. Arteaga ranks second for innings pitched in a career with 458.1.

He is also fifth on the all-time strikeouts chart with 343 career punchouts

Arteaga threw three complete games at UM and struck out career-high 11 batters on two different occasions (FSU, 4/16/95 and George Washington, 2/16/96). He posted an 11-3 record as a sophomore in 1995 and a 9-1 mark as a freshman.

Miami retired Arteaga's No. 33 on Feb. 5, 2003, prior to the season opener with Florida International. A 26th round draft choice by the New York Mets, Arteaga spent six seasons in the Mets' and Houston Astros' organizations. He had signed on with the Texas Rangers' organization in the spring of 2003, prior to accepting his post with the Hurricanes. He spent his last professional season with the Astros' Triple-A franchise New Orleans Zephyrs, compiling a 9-10 record with a 4.29 ERA in 15 starts and 42 appearances.

The left-hander came to the Hurricanes out of Westminster Christian in Miami. He won a career-best 12 games as a junior in 1996 (12-1) and came back to go 11-4 as a senior in 1997.

After six seasons in professional baseball, Arteaga earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from the University of Miami.

He is married to the former Ysha Schettini and the couple has a daughter, Ariana. The Arteagas' son, Ari, passed away in 2018 at the age of 16. The Ari Arteaga Foundation was founded shortly afterward to honor and memorialize Ari. Its mission is to spread Ari's spirit by helping children and families overcome obstacles they may face due to unforeseen hardships. The goal is to shine Ari's light on their path of need.

SOUTH FLORIDA SHOWDOWN

• For the second time in 2024, the Miami Hurricanes will face the Florida Atlantic Owls with a midweek matchup Tuesday.

• The Hurricanes boast a 70-23 advantage over the Owls in the **all-time series**. Miami has won six of the its 10 meetings against FAU.

 Redshirt freshman left-handed pitcher Ashton Crowther (0-2, 5.71 ERA) makes his third career start, opposing Florida Atlantic right-hander Brandon Smith (1-1, 10.22 ERA).

TOE-TO-TOE WITH THE TIGERS

• Against then-No. 3 Clemson, the Hurricanes gave the Tigers all they could handle before dropping the series to one of the best teams in college baseball.

• In the opener Thursday, Miami mounted a 3-2 walk-off win, highlighted by junior right-handed pitcher Gage Ziehl and fifth-year senior catcher Jack Scanlon.

• Ziehl tossed a complete game, punching out a careerhigh 15 batters. The captain limited the Tigers to just one earned run across a 118-pitch masterpiece, becoming the first Miami hurler since Bryan Radziewski on March 23, 2013 to strike out at least 15 hitters in game.

• Following one of the greatest outings in recent Hurricanes baseball history, Ziehl was named ACC Pitcher of the Week, the league office announced Monday afternoon.

• Meanwhile, Scanlon delivered the Hurricanes' fourth walk-off of the year, smacking a two-run homer in the ninth. His first game-winning hit in the orange and green gave Miami its 11th comeback victory of the year.

• After its heartbreaking loss, Clemson rallied to edge the Hurricanes Friday, 3-2, before picking up a 7-0 win Saturday.

Prior to the three-game set, Miami had won 15

consecutive home conference series.

• The Hurricanes are the first team to win 15 straight home ACC series since Virginia accomplished the feat from 2009-2012

CARDIAC CANES

• Through its first 27 games, Miami has notched 11 comefrom-behind victories, including four walk-off wins against NJIT on Feb. 16, then-No. 15 North Carolina on March 16, FIU on March 19 and then-No. 3 Clemson on March 28.

 The Hurricanes have tallied eight victories trailing after six innings, more than their entire win total in those situations from last year.

 On March 9, Miami overcame a nine-run deficit vs. then-No. 13 Virginia, scoring 13 unanswered runs. The come-frombehind win marked the Hurricanes' largest comeback victory since erasing a nine-run deficit against Tampa on May 13, 1992.

• In one-run games, Miami has posted a 6-2 record, including a 3-1 mark in conference contests.

SCORCHING START TO SOPHOMORE SEASON

• With Miami losing more than half of its starting position players from a year ago, Jason Torres has taken the next step to fill the void.

• As of April 1, Torres is tied for 10th in hits (48) and 13th in average (.440) nationally. In the ACC, the 6-foot-1, 228-pound infielder ranks second in average and third in hits.

• The Hialeah, Fla., native has reached base safely in all but one game this season

• In 145 career at-bats, Torres is slashing .448/.487/.759 with 11 home runs and 41 RBI.

• Torres was ranked as the fifth-best first baseman in the country, according to D1Baseball.

DANNY DINGERS

• Freshman Daniel Cuvet has quickly made a name for himself in the heart of the Hurricanes' lineup.

• As of April 1, Cuvet is second in hits (42), tied for second in home runs (9), third in slugging (.745) and OPS (1.230), sixth in average (.396) and runs (30), and seventh in RBI (31), among all Division I freshmen.

• The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native started his career on a 17-game on-base streak, totaling eight multi-RBI performances and a co-team-leading 14 multi-hit efforts.

• D1Baseball tabbed Cuvet as the ninth-best third baseman in the country.

ARE YOU CYRIOUS?

• Sophomore Blake Cyr has picked up where he left off after bursting onto the college baseball scene in his debut campaign last year.

• A 2023 consensus Freshman All-American, Cyr was tabbed the ACC Player of the Week on March 11.

 Cyr batted .500 (8-for-16) with three home runs, 11 RBI and a 1.682 OPS across the Hurricanes' 3-1 stretch, highlighted by a series win over then-No. 13 Virginia.

• The Windermere, Fla., native homered in three of the four games, including a go-ahead grand slam Saturday to cap off Miami's largest comeback victory since May 13, 1992.

. Cyr also scored eight runs, drew four walks and reached base safely 13 times, notching three multi-hit and multi-RBI efforts along the way.

· Last season, he was one of five rookies nationally with 17 homers and 63 RBI.

• Cyr is one of only four Miami freshmen to hit at least 17 home runs, with Ryan Braun (17), Phil Lane (17) and Pat Burrell (23) comprising the elite quartet.

• In Miami's 14-6 win over then-No. 6 Florida on March 4, 2023, Cyr finished one RBI shy of the Hurricanes' freshman single-game record set by Randy Guerra (8) in 1976.

• The Hurricanes have accomplished a lot in advance of their 80th season: national championships in 1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001, 25 trips to the College World Series and an NCAA record 44 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

• Miami made its second straight trip to the College World Series in 2016, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

• Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the secondmost of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the fourthmost of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth most.

 Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the top eight in eight seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5), 2016 (#3) and 2022 (#6).

MIAMI IS #MLBU

• Forty-two Hurricanes have appeared in the MLB since 2000, the most among all ACC programs.

• No school in the ACC has had more players drafted than Miami, which has seen 313 players picked into the professional ranks - including six in 2023.

• Since 1991, UM has produced 208 draft picks - 26 more than the next-highest ACC total (182, Clemson).
